Spring lamb with a special herb dressing is as traditional with the English as bowling on the village green. This fine old-



julce and heros points up the A lamb shoulder usually weighs between two and one-half and three and one-half pounds. This makes an ideally sized roast for three or four people.

Prepare Lamb for Stuffing

Form a pocket in the lamb shoulder for stuffing by cutting around the blade bone with a snarp slender-bladed knife. Care should be taken not to cut through the outer covering of fat. The thin paper-like covering called the "fell" should not be removed. The meat is juicier and cooks in less time if it is left on. The fell does not affect the flavor.




