

## **Ballot Draws** 48% Turnout

Sixteen hundred and twenty-nine voters went to the polls in Plymouth Township Tuesday and to no one's great surprise overwhelmingly turned down the proposed charter for the City of Plymouth Heights by a 45 to 1 ratio.

Unofficial tabulations listed 1,589 votes against the charter and only 35 for.

Also on the ballot were the names of three men who were seeking various positions should the new city be formed. Since the charter was defeated, the three candidates will have no city to run. There were also a number of write-in votes for the 13 positions

The 1,629 who voted Tuesday represented 481/2 percent of the 3,356 who were eligible to vote on the charter and candidates. Those close to the election were surprised at the large turn-out, for it had been feared that voter apathy might result in a small total.

Electric heat is an advanced and superior concept of home comfort. Here are some of the questions we've been asked about it.

#### WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE?

The four most widely used types are illustrated below. Because electric heat is built in, there is little interference with living space.

#### IS IT SAFE?

It's as safe and troublefree as electric light. Electric heat devices work very much like your toaster does. However, most of them operate at relatively low temperatureswithout glowing wires.

IS IT EFFICIENT? The heat produced by electric systems is usable heat; practically none of it is wasted within the heating equipment itself. Electric heat is just about as close to 100 percent efficiency as it's humanly possible to get.

#### IS IT EXPENSIVE TO INSTALL?

In general, the original cost of an electric heating system is less than that of any other type of quality equipment. Actual installed cost will vary according to type of heating unit used, home size, method of home construction and additional insula-

A good time to install electric heat is when illding a new home. But it's also very onomical to install it when home alteraflons or additions are being made. Wiring s no problem. It's figured as part of the job.

#### CAN I PUT IT IN JUST ONE ROOM?

Yes, and economically, too, as indicated above. Typical examples: when you're add-ing a new room, finishing an upstairs, closing in a porch or breezeway. Electric heat is especially valuable when the new living space is a long way from the central heating system, or when the central system is already working to capacity. Another good time to use electric heat is when you have a hard-to-heat area.

#### CAN I PUT IT IN THE WHOLE HOUSE? Yes, you can switch the whole house over to electric heat. In this case, additional insulation will be required, plus storm sash and storm doors all around.

For greatest heating economy and summer comfort, regardless of type of heating system, good insulation pays off. Industry-established standards for this area for insulation thickness is not less than 6" overhead; 35%" in outside walls; 2" alongside and partially under concrete floor slabs. Floors above basements also need insulation.

WHAT DOES IT COST TO USE ELECTRIC HEAT? Various factors, including family living habits, affect operating cost, so a hard-and-fast answer is impossible. A rough rule of thumb is 25¢-28¢ per square foot of heated space, annually. But there's little need to s. An electric heating contractor can calculate actual first cost and operating

cost quickly and accurately. Electric heat will cost more. But the cost will probably not be as high as one would imagine. Like any quality product, you pay more for electric heat but you get more In June 1959, Detroit Edison added a new, lower step to the residential electric rate. Now, kilowatt-nours of electricity over 150 per month cost 2¢ each, gross, instead of 21/4t-an 11 percent reduction.

#### DOES IT NEED MUCH SERVICING?

No. There are no moving parts in the electric heating systems discussed here except in the forced air units where fans or blowers are used. Fans are not high velocity, so they are long lasting also. An added advantage of electric heat, depending upon the type, is its completely silent, or very quiet, operation.

#### WHAT MAKES ELECTRIC HEAT BETTER?

FLEXIBILITY-Each room has its own thermostat. So each remains at the temperature you choose without affecting other areas. Temperatures can be raised or lowered in any room without overheating or chilling the rest of the house. Just a touch on the proper thermostat does it.

SPEED-When a thermostat is adjusted to call for more heat, the response is fast! In the systems described here, the heat source is right in each unit-only inches away instead of many feet.

EVEN HEAT-There will be very little temperature difference between floor and ceiling. And, wherever possible, electric heat (except ceiling cable, of course) is installed in outside walls. Then there is a curtain of warm air between the cool wall and window surfaces and room occupants. This fends off chilling drafts.

CLEANLINESS-Nothing is burned to make smoke, soot or fumes. Air currents will carry only whatever dust may have been introduced by other means. Nor are large quantities of outside, potentially dusty air drawn into the house to support combustion. Result: walls, draperies, furniture and floor coverings stay clean longer.

ARE THERE OTHER TYPES OF ELECTRIC HEAT? Yes, the flexibility of electric heat makes it applicable to many basic systems. For example, there are electric warm air and wet heat systems.





#### BY PAUL CHANDLER

Early in December, long before any other candidates had emerged, I decided to run for the Republican nomination as Regent of the University of Michigan, provided it was approved by local GOP officials.

A conference was arranged with the 17th District Chairman, Robert Sornson, and the former chairman, Darrell Berry. Both greeted the idea enthusiastically. Sornson "encouraged" me, provided specific advice as to people to contact for advice and help, and "wished me all the luck" in the world."





AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 86 OF OR-DINANCE NO. 183, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE USE AND OPERATION OF VEHI-CLES ON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH, MICHIGAN, TO PROVIDE A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF AND TO RE-PEAL THE TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, NO. 99, AS AMENDED AND ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES CONTRAVENING THE PROVISIONS

ORDINANCES CONTRAVENING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE," AS AMENDED.

Section 1. Section 66 of Ordinance No. 183, entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE USE AND OPERATION OF VEHICLES ON THE PUBLIC HIGH-WAYS WITHIN THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH, MICHI-GAN, TO PROVIDE A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF AND TO REPEAL THE TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, NO. 99, AS AMENDED AND ALL ORDINANCES CONTRAVENING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE," as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Rules and Regulations Governing the Use and Occupancy of State Lands Other than State Parks and Recreation Areas

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Commission of Conservation by the provisions of Act No. 17, Public Acts of 1921, as amended, the following rules and regulations are hereby made and adopted concerning the use and occupancy of state lands other than state parks and recreation areas administered by or under the control of the Department of Conservation.

It shall be unlawful

It shall be unlawful.

To enter, use, or occupy state
lands for any purpose when said
lands are posted against such
entry, use, or occupancy, as determined by the Director of
Conservation.

2. To camp for more than 20 days without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.

6. To anchor or leave unattended overnight at designated public fishing sites unless the owner's name and address, in legible letters, is affixed to the boat.

To store or leave boats, fish shanties, camping equipment, or other property for more than 20
days without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of

mission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.

To leave unburied refuse and rubbish, including tin cans, bottles, and fish offal, or to deposit same in streams or lakes. Garbage pits or other receptacles

tles, and fish offal, or to deposit same in streams or lakes. Garbage pits or other receptacles must be used where available.

To build a fire without proper provision to prevent spreading, or to leave said fire without extinguishing same.

7. To remove, destroy, mutilate, or deface posters, notices, signs, or markers of the Department of Conservation, or of any other agency of government.

2. To post, place, or erect signs, to place or distribute advertis-

3. To post, place, or erect signs, to place or distribute advertising material, to erect a fence or barrier; to construct or occupy improvements, or to enclose state lands, without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.

9. To use state lands for a commercial purpose without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.

10. To graze state lands without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.

These rules and regulations shall be in force and effect until May 1,

PENALTY

Violation of any rule or failure to perform any act set forth in the rules in punishable by fine of not more than \$100 and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the gounty jail for not more than 90 days, or by both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

These rules are to take effect Pebruary 14, 1961, supersede, and repeal R299.301 governing the use and occupancy of state lands as contained on page 1929 of the 1954 Administrative Code.

Because the eye is so complex, its intricate parts be come differentiated early the unborn child. Three months before a baby is born he is blinking his evelids and is moving his eyes much as he will when he begins to explore the world of light in few weeks.

However, vision needs tim for growth after birth. A child's eves must be devel oped for all the wonderfu working together with th brain can perform. At birth the part of the eye on which clearest vision depends is no fully developed. Only time brings about development. As if these practical func tions were not enough, eye baby is born with blue eyes But, the color will change by

he is destined to be brown his mouth, as if he didn' velops hand-eye coordination when his eyes can guide h

hand or foot. You can watch your child build what optometrists call his space world. As would expect, he is the cen-ter of it. At first, he has little yond arm's length. Slowly, the space expands. He learn what and where the object are that his eyes see. This is a developmental process in-volving not only his eyes, but his whole being.

Eye doctors point out that baby first explores this ex-

panding world with his right hand, foot and eye. Then, in turn, will come a period of concentration on the left. Soon, this cycle is repeated and growth and development take place.

Optometrists find that for the first few months, one eye may be turned under the nose or "crossed" as it is com-m only described. At this time, baby is using the other eye. There is nothing to be concerned about at this time.

### Have a Good Breakfast, Says **Health Chief**

Does your breakfast help to give you as much energy and buoyant health as it should, Dr. Joseph G. Molner, City-County Health Commissioner, asks?

Your breakfast should contain one-fourth to one-third of the entire food requirements.

An adequate breakfast for everyone is im-portant for starting the day fast as a means of helping to make a better school record is backed by a number of studies. Students who had a good breakfast turned out more work, were quicker in their reactions and did not tire as easily as children who

A good breakfast should in-clude fruit, milk, cereal, enriched — and butter or margarine. An egg should be included three to five times or hot dish should be in-cluded. Breakfast can be made an appetizing meal and have more variety than the average breakfast provides. Teenagers need more food than children or adults because their rate of growth is faster — for them an egg five times a week is desir-

Even in families in which the mother works and must leave before the children have their breakfast, advance planning can provide for their needs. With fresh fruit or fruit juice in a covered container in the ice box and with milk, bread, softened butter and a choice of cereal, even a very young child can manage his own breakfast on a "do-it-yourself" basis. The secret of success here is that there must be advance plan-ning to have the food in the right place and the child.

Dr. Molner says, "A hun-gry child cannot learn as well as he should and like a hungry adult he is at a disad-vantage in his relationships with others, so send him to school with a good breakfast, eaten without rush or ten
