

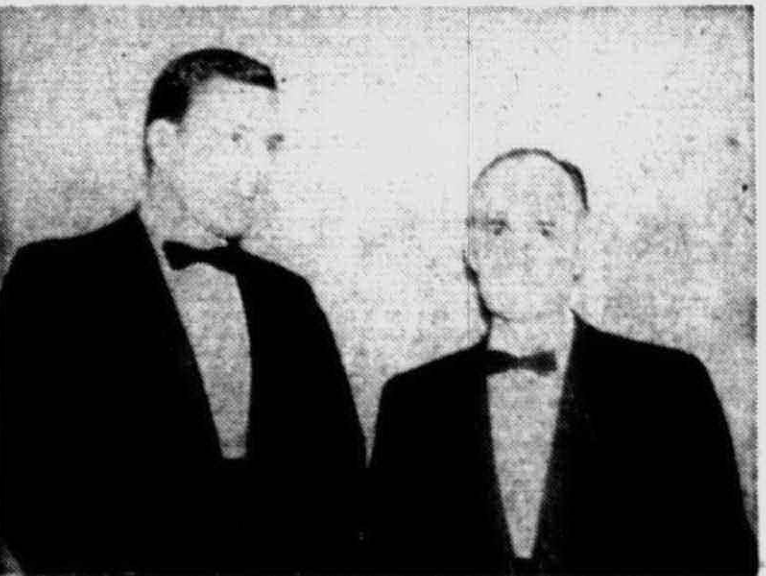

Plymouth Police Blotter

Close to \$1,000 worth of radios and television sets were lifted from a Plymouth appliance store Saturday night by unidentified thieves.

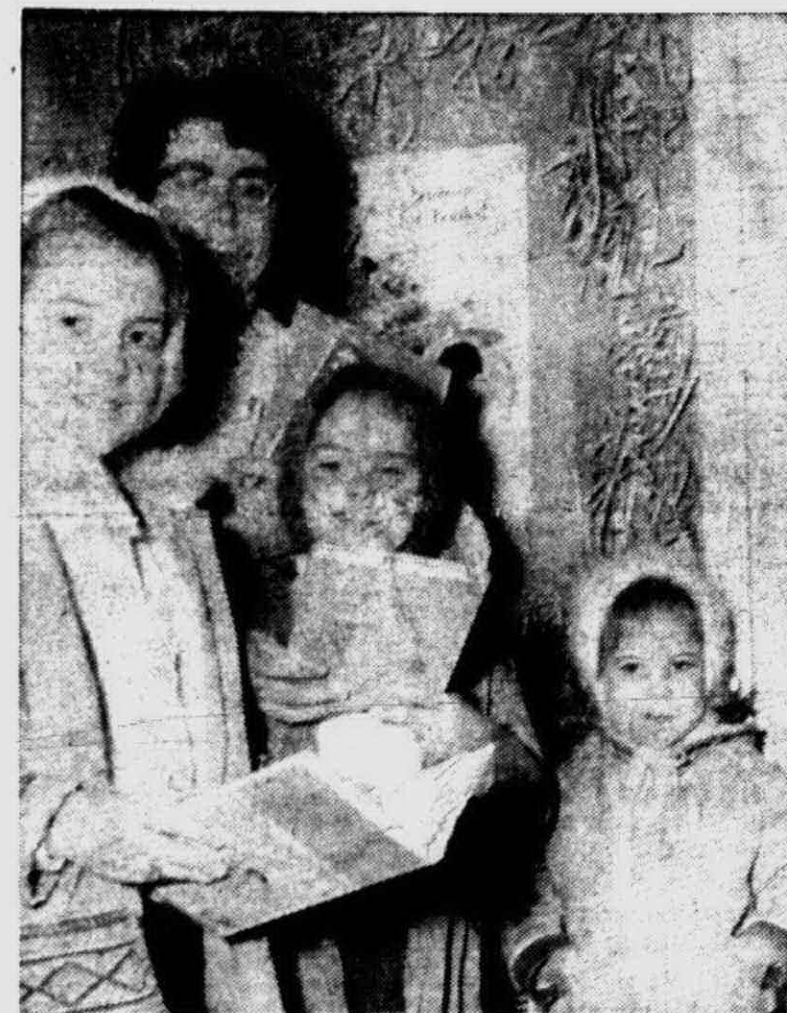

Another half a million dollars is soon to be added to the Livonia tax base, this newspaper has learned, with the construction of an assembly and packing plant on Schoolcraft Road, just east of the Plymouth Township line.

It will be raised by Febble, Inc. which packages parts for Ford Motor Company. The building will have 20,000 square feet of working space.

Exact location is between the railroad tracks and Schoolcraft, just east of the Centri-Spray plant.

Livonia's Mayor and Council showed by action an awareness of the importance of this kind of growth, incidentally. To satisfy the plant's requirements, a zoning boundary had to be moved 100 feet northward in the area. This was done by the city fathers with an absolute minimum of fuss and muss and total absence of controversy from "neighbors" or anyone else.

While the matter is far from decided, if our information is accurate the "leading" location for the proposed Community College for this area appears to be a site in Plymouth Township, hard against the Livonia line.

This is open land south of Ann Arbor Road, just west of Washington School, all of which is generally near the Newburgh area.

It makes it relatively convenient to Garden City, along with the Plymouth and Livonia districts.

Another huge expansion "on the drawing board" involves Madonna College.

Plans are in the works there for a four million dollar expansion of Madonna, the new buildings to go up at Levan and Schoolcraft roads.

News of this project became public when the architect petitioned the city government to provide sanitary sewer service there.

Many leading Plymouth and Livonia citizens are involved in a lay movement to raise funds for Madonna.

Three Named to Planning Board

Angle parking on Main Street in downtown Plymouth appeared to be doomed this week following a meeting of the City Commission Monday which heard plans for new municipal parking development.

City Commissioners were told that the remodeling job now being done on the Municipal Parking Lot—which includes the razing of four buildings to expand the lot—will boost the number of auto spaces from 140 to 240.

At the same time, the Commission heard a warning that the 45-degree parking on S. Main Street, opposite Kellogg Park, was a "traffic hazard" and "dangerous."

Commissioners indicated that after Christmas—when the expansion job is finished on the Municipal Lot—angle parking would be dropped on Main St. The area now accommodates 18 autos; changing it to parallel parking

would drop the number to nine.

Members of the Commission said that Main St. is "heavily congested" after 4:30 p.m. daily because the space taken up by cars parked at an angle infringes on driving lanes. "There are more accidents caused on Main St. because of cars backing out blindly than by any other reason," one Commission member said.

In other business Monday, the Commission gave its approval to the appointment of a new member of the City Planning Commission, Fred J. Beitner. Charles Engstrom and Sidney D. Strong were re-appointed to the Commission. Terms of all three will expire on Dec. 1, 1964. Ada Murray was re-appointed to the Zoning Board of Appeals.

A hearing on Penniman Ave improvements was set for Dec. 18 and City Manager Al Glassford was authorized to obtain property needed for the project by purchase or condemnation. No residents showed up for hearings on special assessment rolls for sanitary sewers on N. Main St., or for paving on Evergreen and McKinley streets.

Commission members said, they'd react favorably to an application by Eric Caplan to operate two new taxicabs on Plymouth streets. Caplan told the Commission he plans an operation either from his residence or from property near the Mayflower Hotel.

Three licenses are available for taxicabs in the city.

Glassford reported that a Civil Defense test fallout last week "worked very well" and said that 30 different people were notified in five to six minutes.

Assurances were received from City Attorney Ed Draugelis that Plymouth was adequately covered with liability insurance. The assurance came after notification that municipalities in Michigan are now liable for claims. The state is the fourth in the Union to so rule.

Deny Zoning For 'Center'

Members of the Plymouth Township Board failed to approve action of the Planning Commission Tuesday that would have allowed construction of a new shopping center near Haggerty and Five Mile Roads.

Owners of the five acre parcel of land at the intersection had proposed construction of a small grocery store as the center's first unit. "Depending on the success of this and one or two other units," the property owners' attorney, Ed Draugelis said, "more stores would be erected."

Board members called the proposal "spot zoning" and would not second Treasurer Elizabeth Holmes' motion to concur with the Planning Commission's recommendation to re-zone the land to C-1. It's now zoned residential.

"We might as well fire the whole Planning Commission," Mrs. Holmes told Board members after there was no support. "If we aren't going to accept its recommendations."

Board members indicated, however, that they'd reconsider the action at a later date.

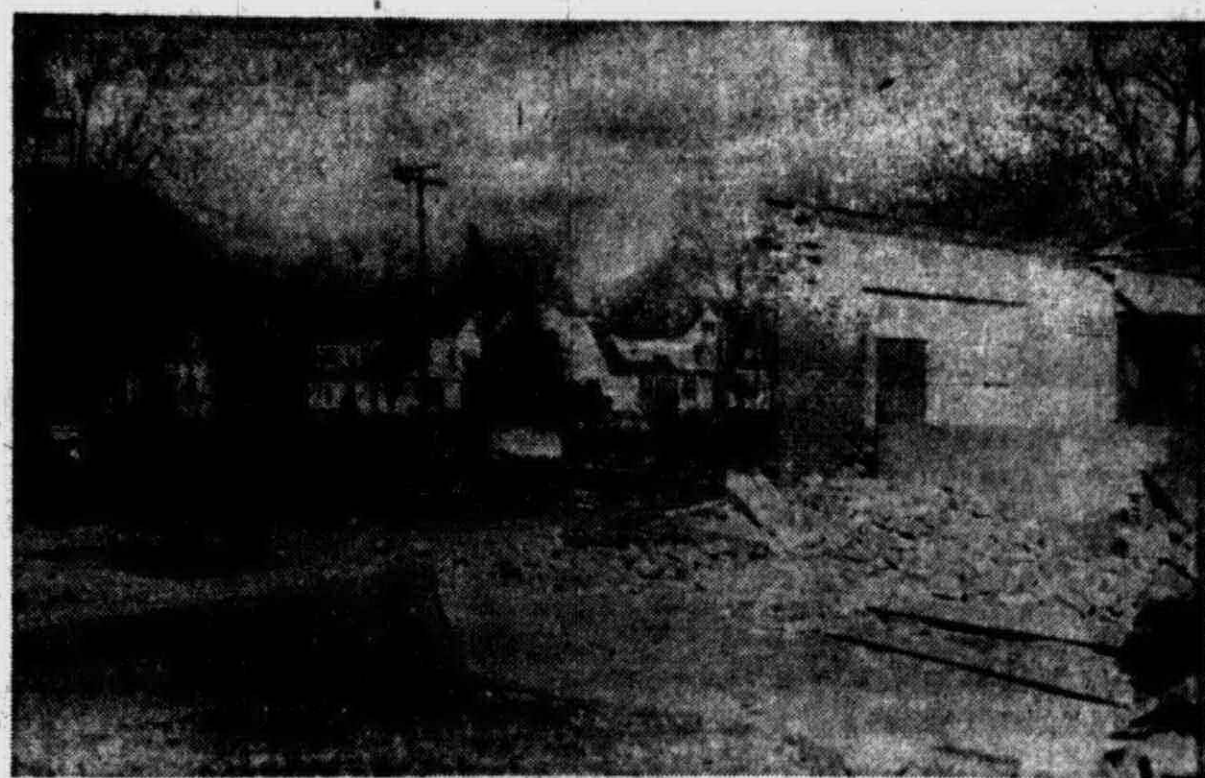
In other action, Supervisor Roy Lindsay was directed to obtain estimates of costs for ornamental street lights for Lakepointe Village after Village homeowners requested information on lighting.

Rev. Edward W. Castner, associate minister of First Presbyterian Church, will deliver the sermon and Mrs. George Griggs will present a vocal solo.

Al Glassford. Cost of the project, which includes paying off some land contracts, approaches \$120,000. Being razed are two commercial structures and two houses. Contractor Stan Cline-Smith is doing the work.

LOOKING AROUND Plymouth

Plymouth's water tower is newly covered with a coat of paint—but sign-painting vandals are still at work throughout the city. Monday night, City Commissioners discussed how to cope with the situation. They heard reports of signs being painted on commercial buildings and street signs, all of them carrying a reference to Plymouth High School students. "We can't hold the whole class responsible," one Commissioner said. Others disagreed.

As if signs weren't enough trouble, the pigeons have come home to roost hereabouts. They're plaguing the water tank and nearby storage sheds. City Manager Al Glassford reports it'll cost \$150 to trap them per month for at least a year. "The problem is still unsolved," he said. One City Commissioner proposed a bounty on 'em. Glassford or the Commission would appreciate suggestions.

Plymouth Township will soon be getting a new, full-time Superintendent of its Department of Public Works. Township Board members Tuesday authorized the hiring of a Township resident, Mr. McClellan, for the post. McClellan will be a working superintendent and will be in charge of the Joy Rd. Sewer Pumping station and other Township DPW facilities. He'll assume his duties at the first of the year.

The Children's Aid Society, a Torch Drive agency, provided service to 18 children from Plymouth in 1960. J. Carl Alderdyce, president of the western Wayne planning division of United Community Services, announced that local residents may call TE 1-1600 Community Information Service with any questions about services available for particular needs.

Some 4,000 residents of Northwest Detroit and Wayne County may lose hundreds of dollars in social security benefits if they do not file an application by January 31, 1962. The people who stand to lose these benefits are still working and past the age of 65. Mr. Baltuck of the Detroit Northwest Social Security Office said today that many of these people may still be under the impression that earnings of over \$1200 per year would cause them to lose all of their benefits. Baltuck pointed out that recent changes to the social security law make it possible in some cases for a family to receive some benefits even though the worker has yearly earnings of as much as \$4497.

Baltuck urges residents of Redford, Livonia, and Plymouth who are 65 years of age and over who are working and have not filed an application for Social Security Benefits to contact the local social security office at 18500 Grand River Avenue, Detroit 23, Michigan. Those who are single earning less than \$3000 and married persons earning less than \$3600 should contact the office. Workers over 65 with children under 18 years of age should also contact the office if their earnings are as much as \$4497.

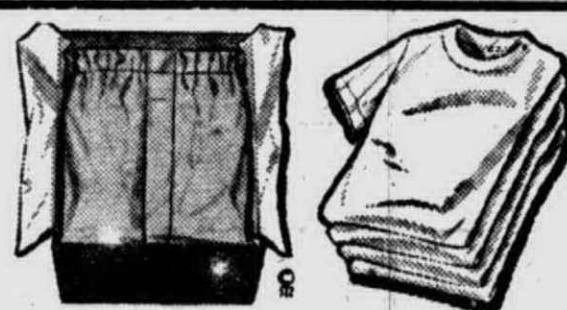

They are interested in growing, in new volunteers and in expanding their services. In this case "they" are 100 volunteers who serve the Plymouth State Home and Training School.

Their auxiliary began approximately two years ago, the first of its kind in America to work with retarded children.

Although it began informally, the women are dead serious about their work and about extending the services presently underway. Mrs. Jonathan Goldsmith, a personal friend of the Plymouth State Home and Training School, were taking one day about the work of the hospital and how it would soon be bulging. In addition to the 170 young children in its care there were 320 older ones soon to be transferred because the Farmington Branch was being closed. They discussed some of the needs of the hospital and how ideally it could be improved.

Out of this conversation grew Mrs. Goldsmith's idea of starting a volunteer group to assist the Doctor and his staff in their work.

The first meeting attracted 57 women and soon is membership grew to 100 contributing from 650 to 900 hours per month to the hospital. Women are taken on tour of the home before they are accepted as volunteers. There is also a 60-day probation period to see that they are compatible with each other.

In addition to working toward bringing the child to his fullest possible development, the auxiliary members are also striving to bring a greater understanding to

parents.

To this end Library facilities were offered. Mrs. Blanche McNamara, a professional Librarian, set up a reference and case-history library for parents and hospital personnel to use.

There is also a Medical Records Division, Lend-Aid, who work directly with the children, bathing and feeding babies, supervising play, taking children to clinic or dentist's office. A new division, is Special Services.

If a woman comes to the hospital specially trained in any one field her talents are put to work in the area where she is qualified. "For instance" Volunteer Service Coordinator Mrs. E. J. Zeglen explained, "we have a dental technician who works daily in a dentist's office in this capacity. On her day off she comes to us and assists our dentist."

Not only the enthusiasm of a volunteer is necessary to make an idea grow as this one has, it takes cooperation down the line. The Auxiliary has received this from its many members as well as staff personnel. In addition there must always be a spark-plug.

In the case of the Auxiliary of the Plymouth State Home and Training School the spark-plug is its President, Dorothy Arnold of Williams Street in Plymouth. A peppy grey-haired lady, with merry blue eyes that speak of love of people, a good sense of humor and an enthusiasm for doing.

Plymouth can be proud of this state institution that is in its midst and of the auxiliary that makes it a warmer place because of their presence.

off the whole business of publishing a newspaper and taking up easier tasks, the reasons could hardly be more similar than those which Paar put down in Look:

"I myself have tried to be scrupulously honest in stating my beliefs and impressions. But you've got to fight so hard for this right to speak freely. You've got to take so much abuse if you practice this privilege.

"If you don't believe me, let any union member who is reading this article—any little guy in a union—get up and say a few unpleasant truths about the big shots who run it. He'll see how far freedom of speech gets him; or try sometime at the next PTA meeting. "May I be the first to tell you that we are not as free as we think we are. Each generation must fight for it anew, for there are boobs who wish to take it from you.

"There should be more controversy in our land, more questions asked, more debate, more who are curious. These should also be more compassion for others with different views. But most of all, we need more honesty with ourselves. When I read or hear the insincere mouthings of some of our politicians, it makes me ill. They all talk as if they think they are going to become statues. Too many of them are not statemen, but merely winners of local beauty contests."
