# Near to Head Renewal Project

## Sharpshooters Hit Target With New Plymouth Range

The occasional crack of a rifle shot is the only indication from outside that Plymouth's old Knights of Columbus Hall is now a sharpshooters' rifle range.

But once inside you'll find a complete ten-lane target practice area set up for Plymouth's young people.

Last week the new home of the Plymouth Police Youth Club opened officially and already plans have been made for a Junior Rifle League match, scheduled for next Saturday.

Some of the men who sponsored the club, including Police Chief Ken Fisher, Lamott Whitehead and John Olendorf, have worked with members of the Plymouth Gun Club and other civic-minded citizens since January to whip the old building into shape for the boys.

"The club had been running for around seven years," Olendorf, who is the club's rifle division director, said. "We formerly used the Brown Building which was torn down last fall to expand the city parking lot. Since then the club's been somewhat inactive."

Normally, Olendorf said, the club provides practice space and instruction for 50 to 60 rifle shooters and 80 to 100 active archery fans.

An instruction course for youngsters—both boys and girls—over 12 years of age will begin April 2 for seven weeks. "Classes are limited to 20," Olendorf said, "and boys and girls who are interested in enrolling should contact me at GL 3-5019."

The class will teach basic marksmanship and firearm safety. After youngsters have completed the course, they're eligible for National Rifle Association competition shooting.

"We've always done real well in competitions," Olendorf pointed out. "In 1959 and 1960 we won the state championship and we were the winning team in 1961 in competitions at Akron, Ohio."

The match next Saturday is for the Southeast Michigan Division of the Junior Rifle League. Eleven teams will participate and shooting will get underway at 8 a.m., lasting until 5 p.m. Plymouth boys and girls will participate throughout the day, and the public is invited to view the match.

"We like to feel that if the kids get through the course," Olendorf commented, "they learn something about firearm safety and they get something out of it, even though some never show up again at the range." The course won the club training award from the National Rifle Association last year.

For practice shooting, the range is open Saturdays and Monday and Tuesday evenings after 7 p.m. and interested boys and girls are invited to attend a practice. "Archery hasn't really started here yet," Olendorf said, "but the equipment for this sport should be set up soon."

## Downtown Buildings Toppled

Demolition work was nearly complete today at a site in downtown Plymouth where a new office building will rise soon.

Seven buildings at the northeast corner of Main St. and Penniman are being razed to make room for the building—to be named "Colonial"—and four stores.

Final clearing of the rubble will be finished in about three weeks, and shortly after that construction of the new building will begin. The Plymouth office of First Federal Savings and Loan Assn. will be housed in one of the new buildings. Target date for completion of the project is by the end of 1962, according to First Federal president Hans Gehrke, Jr.

The buildings which are coming down were among the oldest business places in the city. Included among the businesses which occupied them were the Plymouth Cab Company, Stark Realty Co., the Ashland Service Station, Pride Cleaners, Louis Shoe Repair, Red's Barber Shop, McConnell Barber Shop and a Marine Corps recruiting service.

At least one of the businesses, Pride Cleaners, will move into a building next to the Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce headquarters.

The project, city officials pointed out this week, will help change the face of the downtown business district along with the proposed face-lifting of Kellogg Park. Service Clubs have proposed—and have won approval from the City Commission—a project for spending more than \$100,000 to be collected from private contributions, to revamp the whole park which faces the business district.

A "sunken garden" effect, with a performing shell and space for art exhibits, would be included in the face-lifting, according to backers of the project.

## Liquor License Approved

A new Class C Liquor License for Plymouth Township was approved by the Township Board last Tuesday for a bowling alley now under construction on Plymouth Road.

Target date for finishing Plymouth Bowl is May 1, company treasurer Finlay MacQueen told the Township Board. "Construction is progressing rapidly," he said.

The Board's action asked the State Liquor Control Commission to approve "above all others" Plymouth Bowl's request to obtain the license.

In other action, the Board accepted the resignation of Claude Rucker, who has served on the Township Planning Commission since May 15, 1957. He told the Board he had resigned "due to

change in working hours" which meant he was "unable to attend meetings." The Board accepted his resignation with regret and thanked him for his service.

Plans to draft a tentative agreement with the City Commission to transfer homes in Green Meadows Subdivision from City to Township water supplies were discussed after 45 of 50 questionnaires sent to homeowners were returned with favorable replies.

At a special meeting March 8, the Board voted to rezone Garland Riverside subdivision and Park Entrance Estate subdivision one and two from R-2 to R-1 and to rezone four and five in Palmer Acres subdivision from R-1 to P.O.

## City Clerk Gets Director's Post

City Clerk Joe Near will head up Plymouth's new urban renewal program.

Appointment of the veteran city administrator to supervise the big project was made Monday night at the City Commission meeting. An annual raise in salary of \$500 was made concurrent.

Notification of Near's appointment will be sent immediately to Federal government Urban Renewal authorities in Washington, according to City Manager Al Glassford. Appointment of a director was necessary before work on the project could begin.

Near's duties will include supervising the renewal project that will change the face of Mill Street north of Ann Arbor Trail. The project is designed to eliminate the part-industrial, part-residential character of Mill Street and make it all industrial.

## Bingo's Back in Plymouth

Bingo returned to Plymouth this month after an absence of nearly two years—and as long as local sponsors "follow the rules" it won't be stopped.

Police Chief Ken Fisher voiced this opinion after a letter from Wayne County Prosecutor Samuel Olsen outlining regulations on bingo games was received.

Olsen's opinion came as the Veterans of Foreign Wars post in Plymouth began running Thursday night games.

According to Fisher, as long as no "admission charge" or "compulsory donation" is made, the game will not be disturbed. "There can be no hint that a donation of any set amount is required to play the game," Fisher said. "Once there is, it has been established that the game is illegal."

Fisher said the opinion was based on Olsen's letter which outlined the stringent rules. "I want to emphasize," he said, "that no collections or admissions can be made. And donations must be made on a completely voluntary basis. It would be wrong, for example, to ask for a 'one dollar donation in order to play.'"

Among the most important jobs for the new director will be helping to re-settle residents who now live in the area. By early summer residents will begin to be contacted regarding acquisition of their property and by July or August this part of the job should be finished.

The Federal government will pay \$200 to residents for moving expenses. "If we make the first offer for the property in, say, April," Ed Hustle, Urban Renewal Agency representative, told the City Commission last January, "we can have cash for you in May." With negotiations completed by July, razing of existing buildings might begin as soon as August, he said at that time.

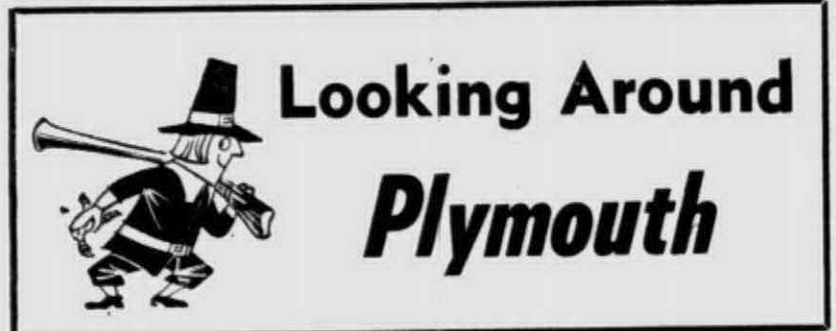
"Every effort will be made to relocate families in similar living conditions to their present homes," according to the Commission.

Near's appointment was approved Monday with two dissenting votes, after the Commission had met previously in a committee-of-the-whole session to discuss appointment of a director. Voting against his appointment were Commissioners Richard Wernette and William Hartmann.

"I believe that Mr. Near is fundamentally an accountant," Hartmann said. "I think we should have someone versed more in the lines of urban renewal. It's nothing personal."

Joe is as fine a man as ever breathed air in Plymouth." Commissioners voted unanimously to hire two additional employees for City Hall—a bookkeeper and a clerk at a total expense of \$8,000. The two will assist Near in his clerk's duties so he will be able to spend more time on urban renewal work.

In other action, the Commission held a public hearing on a project to pave Hartmann St. between Evergreen and McKinley and announced estimated cost of the paving, curbs, gutters and driveways at \$17,684. Cost to residents will be \$10 a foot and \$50 for driveways. Four taxicab spaces downtown were approved and a two-foot overhang on a building at Ann Arbor Trail and Forest—to "colonialize" it according to its owner—was approved subject to architectural drawings.

## FACTS and OPINIONS by Paul Chandler



Time is running short for the Constitutional Convention, and the taxpayers still are waiting in vain for something significant to happen in the tangled mess of Michigan taxation.

Many citizens, particularly those in the suburbs, have been nursing the belief that one of the two leading issues at the Convention would be a comprehensive overhaul of the State tax machinery, with the dismantling of its autocratic State Tax Commission, its farcical assessment process, et. al.

The other "big" issue was to have been reapportionment of the house and senate, and it is certain that this latter problem ultimately will be given rapt attention. But taxation may be brushed under the rug.

No one yearns for a change in the tax processes more than our local elected officials, in particular the Plymouth city commission and the Redford township board. Both have been brutally, and unfairly victimized by the utterly undemocratic "equalization" process, wherein the State Tax Commission arbitrarily raises assessments.

Then, when a complaint is offered, the Commission replies that it has "no staff and no funds" to investigate or rule on complaints; hence, the original figures stand. Go to court at that point? There is no tax court in Michigan, just the appointed "State Tax Commission", from whom there is no appeal, over whom the voters have absolutely no control, and for which there has been no alternative plan yet offered by the Convention.

Among other things, the new Constitution will have missed its mark by a mile if it doesn't contain some machinery to guarantee that property assessments are made on an equal basis, upon one and all, across the entire State. Today there can be as much as a 500 percent differential in the value put on the same kind of property, depending on whether it sits in Livonia or So. Township.

If and when the Constitution does get to the ballot, suburban voters will be out of their minds if they approve it, unless it does contain language which will repair our taxation injuries.

## Bank of Livonia Merger Is Halted

In what could be a major policy stand to halt the "swallowing" of independent suburban banks by big Detroit downtown banks, a proposed merger of the Bank of Livonia and the National Bank of Detroit was disapproved in Washington last week.

If approved, stockholders of the Bank of Livonia would have enjoyed a "profit" of \$12 per share, in an exchange of stock. Bank of Livonia stock stood at a price of \$33 and National Bank stock at \$45.

James J. Saxton, comptroller of the currency in Washington, announced the negative decision. Advising against the merger had been the Michigan Banking Commission, the Federal Reserve Board of Governors, and the Justice Department.

## PHS Band Rated Tops

Plymouth High School's band won the highest rating possible Saturday in a district band and orchestra festival held in the high school gymnasium.

"Ratings of one—the highest in the competition—were given to the band," Director James Griffith said after the Saturday morning performance.

The band played "Bandwagon March" by Moore and "Pagant" by Persichetti.

Participating in the music festival besides Plymouth were bands from South Redford, Taylor Center, Grosse Pointe, Trenton, Bentley in Livonia, Wayne Memorial High, Garden City High, Belleville, Ann Arbor, Highland Park and Dearborn. All are classified as "AA" bands. In addition, bands from Class A schools, including Inkster High, Ypsilanti High, Willow Run High, Catholic Central High and Romulus High participated.

Judges at the event included Norman Dietz, Central Michigan University; Leonard Falcone, Michigan State University; Nelson Hauenstein, University of Michigan; and Leonard Meretta, Western Michigan University. The festival, an annual event,

was sponsored by the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association.

# Bentley Cagers Lose Last Under Bentley

"So long coach... we'll never forget you."

This would be an appropriate chant around Bentley High School this week with the words going out in the direction of Bob Bentley, basketball coach for the last five years.

Bentley has coached his last Bentley cage quintet. When next winter's basketball action starts up, Bentley will be in charge of the players at Livonia's new Franklin high school.

But he has left behind a record at Bentley which will be hard to duplicate.

In each of his five years as Bentley's cage boss, Bentley produced a district Class A champion. His cagers either shared or won outright Suburban League titles four times.

The end for Bentley as Bentley's coach came last Friday night in the regional finals in the Bentley gym. Bentley (team and coach) bowed to Pontiac Central by a 58-42 score.

All of which gave Pontiac Central its fourth regional crown in six years and the right to play in this Wednesday night's quarterfinals.

The experts had figured the Pontiac team would beat Bentley. As runnerup to powerful Saginaw in the Saginaw Valley League, Pontiac Central came to Bentley with a quintet boasting considerable more experience and height.

"They sure gave us our problems tonight," declared Art Van Ryzin, the Pontiac Central coach after the game was over. "This was a good Bentley team. But with our taller boys and our success in forcing them to shoot from

the outside, we finally were able to pull away."

The Bentley players did a good job of slowing down the pace for the better part of two and a half quarters. But after enjoying a 24-19 halftime edge, Pontiac Central outscored Bentley, 14-8, in the third period and the rest became easier for the Oakland County delegation.

Rudy Ransom, a 6-2 forward, proved the chief thorn in Bentley's side. He fouled for 10 baskets and three foul shots for 23 points. Paul Brown and Ed Williams each had 10 for the winners.

Although scoring only five points, Otto Kennedy "killed" Bentley on the boards. The six-six Kennedy controlled matters, especially on Pontiac's defensive board.

Greg Maples bowed out with a 17-point effort for Bentley. Bill Bollin notched 11 and so

did Lannie Carrie.

Pontiac Central had a 24-15 edge in field goals, but Bentley made 12 out of 14 free throws to 10 of 21 for the winners.

Three nights earlier, Bentley had disposed of Pontiac Northern, 62-52, in the first game of the regionals.

The score was tied four times and changed hands four times before the Livonians went ahead to stay with 5:37 to play in the second quarter. Bollin hit for three throws, Carrie and Vern Bergman each a basket and Mapes a free throw as Bentley stormed from a 20-21 deficit to lead 28-23 at half-time.

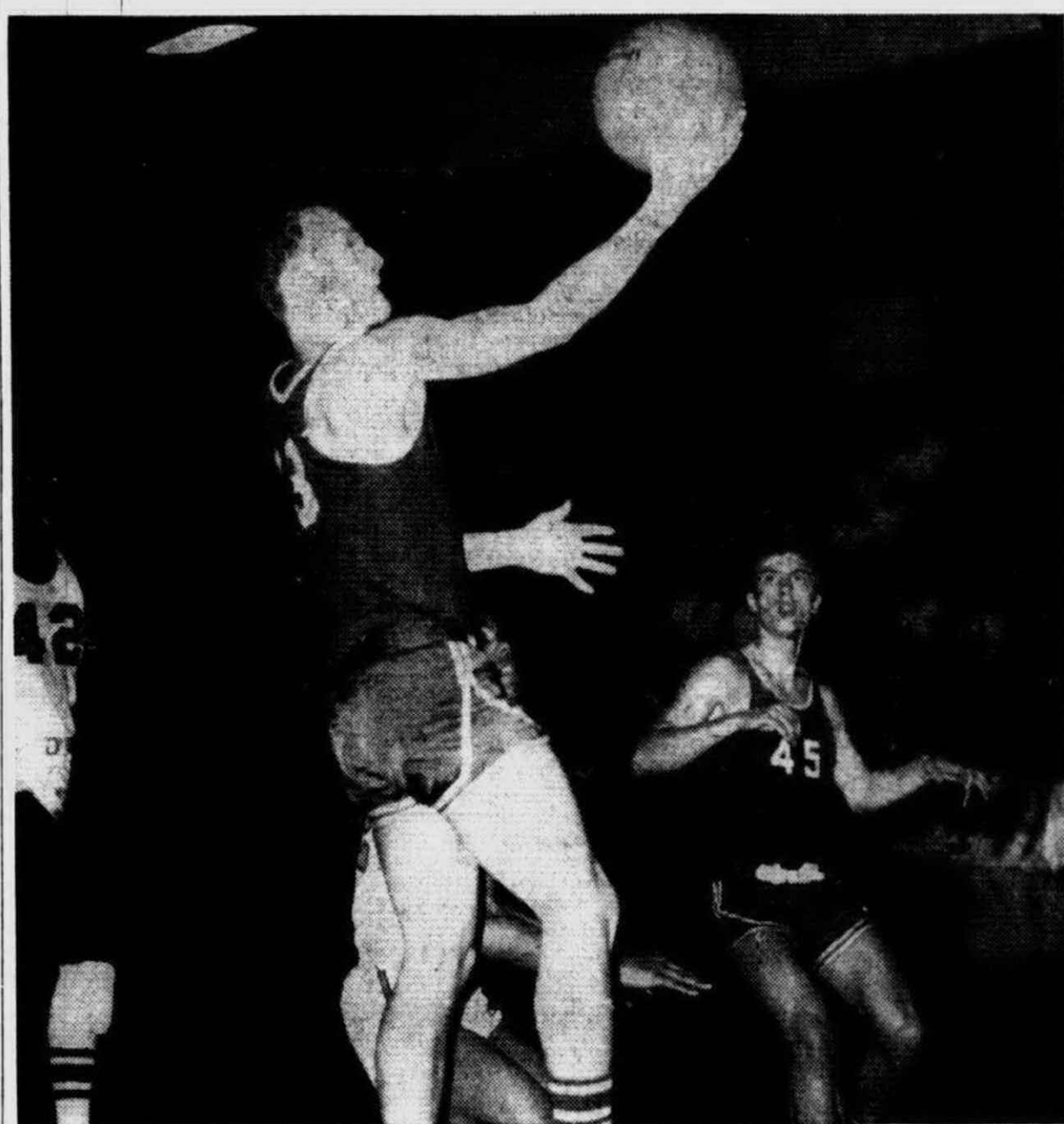
At the start of the second half, a Pontiac Northern hoop cut the differential to three points. But five straight Bentley baskets—two by Carrie and one each by Bergman, Steve Powers and Mapes—

helped shoot the Livonians into a 46-28 command by the three-quarter mark.

In the fourth period, Bentley built up a 19-point bulge as Carrie sank two of the only three shots the Livonian tried in the quarter. In fact, Bentley didn't attempt a field goal in the final five minutes as Pontiac Northern fouled in hopes of getting the ball. The strategy backfired for Northern because Bentley marksmen coolly knocked in 12 out of 14 charity tosses.

Carrie grabbed off individual scoring honors. He sank 11 out of 19 from the floor and picked up six free throws for a 28-point total, far above his season's average of 12.5.

Bollin meshed 12 points and Mapes 11 in what proved the last game Livonia Bentley would win under the coaching of Bob Bentley.

## SPORTS OBSERVER

You've missed something if you never have taken in one of the state high school basketball finals at Michigan State University's Jenison Field House in East Lansing.

The spectacle defies adequate words—at least we don't think that this typewriter can tell the full story of the more than 25 championships we've covered over the years.

On the eve of another trek to the home of our alma mater and the 1962 state prep cage championships, our thoughts wander back to those thrilling moments of by-gone years on the Jenison Field House court.

We suspect that our No. 1 thrill came on the night when a boy turned man to lead Detroit St. Andrew to the State Class B championship in the early '50's. The boy was Frank Tanana, then 18 and now a member of the Detroit Police Department.

Then, as now, St. Andrew coach Nap Ross spent his summers scouting for the Cleveland Indians. Four days before the state finals were to come off, Ross received orders to report to the Indians' training camp in Florida. He tried to explain about his team. The Indians wouldn't listen.

So Ross took off and St. Andrew authorities hired an adult substitute for Ross in name only. The "real coach" for them would be Tanana, who had just been honored as all-star for the second straight year.

Tanana might have buckled under the strain of having to lead the Flyers, both on and off the floor. But he didn't. And St. Andrew rolled on to make state prep history, becoming the first school to win a state crown two years running in different classes.

The most exciting finish we ever saw at East Lansing? Well, there were two.

The first came in 1952 when Highland Park, trailing Holland by 12 points with 1:45 left, tied the count with a couple seconds left, then went on to annex the decision in overtime to gain the next day's finals. George Lee, presently with the Detroit Pistons, performed on the Parkers that season.

And then there was the '59 Class A finale in which Lansing Sexton struck from a 17-point deficit with half the fourth period gone, to pull even with Hamtramck and force an overtime.

In the extra session, Hamtramck nudged ahead with less than 30 seconds to go. Sexton came down court. The seconds skipped past... Five, four, three, two...

Brian Ferguson had the ball under the Cosmo hoop. He was surrounded to the point he couldn't possibly get a shot off. So everybody thought.

Now, there was a second left... Ferguson literally threw the ball up at the hoop. It struck the rim, bounced once... as the gun went off... bounced again... and then a third time, before finally dropping neatly through to give Sexton a one-point win. It was unbelievable to say the least.

There was another overtime "A" final which left an imprint. This one took place in 1958 when Detroit Austin turned back Benton Harbor, 71-68.

Dave DeBusschere led Austin to the title. The Benton Harbor star was Chet Walker. DeBusschere and Walker both were unanimous all-star prep choices and made the All American school-boy teams.

Today the names of DeBusschere and Bradley again are in the basketball headlines. Both have been honored on collegiate All-Americans.

And what about the 1954 "A" title scrap between Flint Northern and Muskegon Heights? This one, too, went overtime.

The Heights won the tip at the outset of the overtime, went down the floor and took a shot which miscued. Northern took over and stalled for 2:45. At that moment, Frank Manley, a guard, drove for the basket. The referee's whistle tooted. There was a foul!

But the referee contended that Manley had charged a Heights' defender. The latter youngster walked to the end, dropped in the try and the championship went to the Heights.

Arguments raged for weeks on whether Manley charged or was fouled. The official pictures never told the story. By coincidence, perhaps, they were blurry when it came to the point of the questionable call.
