



Eighty-eight civic, business, industrial, educational and political leaders will discuss the future of the Plymouth Community in an unusual open forum Wednesday (tonight) in the auditorium of the Junior High East at 8 p.m.

The forum, arranged by School Supt. Russell Isbister, is an exploratory meeting, an idea sharing affair in which complete freedom under guided leadership will bring out some critical thinking on the general theme of "What does the future hold for the Plymouth Community?"

There are two subjects on which reams of copy have crossed the desk lately which I have deliberately avoided like a mole with measles.

One is the zealous effort of those involved in spreading birth control, which I have always thought belonged to God-and the other is people-discrimination.

After I read about the grease Howard K. Smith got into when he tried to spread free advice, pills, etc. among the ADC folks in Chicago - it seems the "to each" policy is the best for that subject.

The subject of people-discrimination cannot be so easily disposed of: It is America's biggest sociological war today. It retards progress - it is destructive it has to be solved in the next few years or the United States of America will shrink from a world power to a shriveled, international-problem racked nation. We all can't just "cotton" to everyone. But I want our European neighbors to look over here and know we are not just reading out of our law books, or mouthing brotherhood-that the law states no discriminationin jobs, housing, schooling, etc. and by golly that's the way we live it.

Oh, the (pore-mental-trash) are always with usbut other nations have their blackguards too-everywhere. Let us have OUR government and real leaders, men of integrity and law abiding.

There will be a lot of weeding out of these men (and women) in the next few years-I'm not dis-

You have only to read the book or see the picture (which followed the book to a "T") "To Kill a Mockingbird"-to see how far we have come in not too many years — it's a big problem so it takes a long time. As long as we have men like "Atticus" around (and we do) we'll make it.

This is Harper Lee's first book - people of her community had so much faith in her message and her ability to tell it—they chipped in one thousand dollars enabling her to write the book. Please expose yourself to the wholesome philosophies of this simple and beautiful book-philosophies upon which our country was established and has flourished.

His older sister, Louisa, had married Phineas Wilson and they settled nearby. At a later date the Wilsons moved to the ancestral property which has now seen five generations of this same family.

The property is now greatly reduced from the original 40 acre patent. The block exends from Minton to Westfield on Middlebelt, with picturesque rolling terrain and majestic old trees, some of which are 914 feet around.
