### Here's Opinion That Swayed Township Vote

Following is the recommendation given to the Board of Trustees by Plymouth Township Attorney Ralph Cole on the plea made by the Human Relations Committee for an open housing ordinance. ED. NOTE:

I am going to confine my remarks to legal implications of such an ordinance. To go back just a little in history, when the Michigan Constitutional Convention was meeting to draft a new constitution for Michigan, they felt that the matter of civil rights deserved mention and deserved some augmentation and implementation of civil rights.

They put into the 1963 Michigan Constitution an Article 5, Section 29, that created a civil rights commission to attempt to safeguard civil rights, whatever they might be, and whoever may have them, whatever form they might take. The civil rights commission was to augment and help to enforce those civil rights.

Subsequently a statute was passed by the legislature of the State of Michigan, carrying out, augmenting and implementing the work of the constitutional convention, setting forth authority of the civil rights commission, what they may do and how they may do it. Those are all matters of record.

To get to the question of whether or not a Township may adopt such an ordinance, I would like to point out that the opinion of the attorney general was directed to the question of whether or not a city could adopt such an ordinance, and his conclusion was that a city could enact such an ordinance.

I am not going to say that a township may not adopt such an ordinance, probably a township could legally adopt such an ordinance. A township

could also adopt an ordinance which would say in effect that no one is to be excluded from this hall on the basis of color, race, religion or creed or so on.

What would be the purpose of such an ordinance, that is the law already. You don't need an ordinance for a thing like that. You could enact an ordinance saying that if you went down to a gas station and bought five gallons of gas, it would be against the law if he sold you less than five gallons. I think a township could enact such an ordinance as that, but you don't need that; it is a law already. If you go down and ask the filling station to buy five gallons, he has to sell you five gallons. The Township Ordinance is not going to change the law one particle.

ABOUT 100 YEARS AGO, three amendments were made to the United States Constitution. They rose out of the Civil War, and they had to do with the emancipation of slaves. They had to do with the creating of the rights of people and the enforcement of those rights, and the prohibition against states infringing on those rights, whatever they might be. And, so, I say, we all have rights. The new statute implements the civil rights commission and intends to enforce and safeguard those rights.

In that connection, I would like to point out, that in some countries, not everyone can buy property, not everyone can own a part of that country. We do not have these prohibitions. Anyone can buy real estate or other property, if he can find a seller, and if he has the wherewithal to buy it. The opposite side of the coin should be equally valid, that the owner should have the right to sell or not to sell, and he should not have to explain why he doesn't want to sell or why he didn't. He should not have to do that. I think that is one of the rights that we all have. I suspect that when they got in this recent civil rights thing, someone decided that property owners did have such rights, right to refuse to sell, for any reason

## Township Board Unanimously Rejects Plea For Open Housing

Acting on the recommendation of its attorney, Ralph Cole, the Board of Trustees of Plymouth Township has unanimously rejected a plea of the Human Rights Committee to enact an open housing ordinance.

In making his recommendation, Attorney Cole pointed out that both the Constitution of the United States and the new

Constitution of the State of Michigan, which sets up a Civil Rights Commission, make it unnecessary for any local unit of government to adopt such an ordinance.

It was the second time that the plea for such an ordinance had come before the Board, but the first time that a vote of any kind had been taken on the subject.

WHEN THE request of the Human Relations Committee was made originally it was the belief of the Board of Trustees that the township did not have the power to enact such an ordinance and, if enacted, had no way of enforcing it.

Subsequently, the Human Relations Committee, represented at the meeting by Dr. Donald Davies, obtained an opinion from Attorney Frank Kelley stating that a city had the right to enact such a code.

Reinforced with this opinion the Human Relations Committee renewed its request to the township and Dr. Davies spoke in behalf of the request.

DR. DAVIES pointed to the fact that the City of Plymouth had such an ordinance on the way to its third reading and that it behooved the Township to do the same thing.

He offered the argument that it was time that the rights of all people were protected and that no minority group should be discriminated against. He made a fervent plea and then rested his case with the Board.

Only three others in the sparse gathering spoke on the subject.

E.A. Rice, a resident of the Township, pointed out that the people have rights under the constitution and he quoted from amendments 9, 10 and 14 and emphasized that under these terms no state shall make or enforce any law to abridge any right of the people.

Irwin Nichols, of West Ann Arbor, spoke in favor of open housing and the need for legislation that would end the so called discrimination.

James Taylor, a Plymouth realtor, informed the Trustees that he saw no need for an open housing ordinance. He emphasized that the new state constitution set up the Civil Rights Commission and that body could do the job.

WHEN PUBLIC statements were concluded, Township Supervisor John E. McEwen asked Attorney Cole for his opinion and recommendation.

"I am fully aware of the opinion given by Attorney General Frank Kelley," he stated, "stating that cities have the right to adopt an open housing ordinance. But he didn't say anything about townships. I know that Ann Arbor has adopted such an ordinance. So has Flint. And just the other evening Huntington Woods, I understand, did the same thing. But these are all cities. And I know of no Township that has so acted."

Attorney Cole then went into great detail explaining the rights guaranteed under the Constitution of the United States and the new state constitution in Michigan.

"With such guarantees granted in the constitution on both the national and state level," he went on, "I see no reason for such action in the township. This is not a matter for local option. It is much too important for that."

ATTORNEY COLE further pointed out that, in his opinion, the enactment of local open housing ordinances would bring about a condition of chaos. He informed the Board that rules and regulations on this important question could differ on opposite sides of the street where such streets are on the border of a community.

He stressed the fact that the guarantees in the constitution, giving citizens the right to go to court for protection, plus the fact that the Civil Rights Commission was set up for the same purpose.

"Therefore," he said, "I am recommending to this Board that you do not enact a so-called open housing ordinance. When it becomes the law of the state it will become the law of the township."

On hearing this recommendation Trustee Dick Lauterbach moved, with the support of Trustee Gene Overholt, that the recommendation be accepted. It carried without a dissenting vote.

### City Set For Vote Monday

The big moment for the Plymouth City Commission will arrive Monday evening.

It will be the moment when the final vote is taken on the proposed open housing ordinance. And because of the interest throughout the city, a goodly gathering is expected to be in the commission chamber.

One of the largest gatherings ever to attend a commission meeting heard the first reading of the ordinance several weeks ago and many of them are expected back for the final.

IT IS BY prior arrangement that the final vote will be taken. This arrangement was made two weeks ago when it was learned that Commissioner James Houk was to be out of the city and Mayor Jabara agreed that no vote would be taken until he returned.

Last Monday evening an attempt was made to force a vote on the feelings of the Commissioners when Commissioner Robert Smith asked that the Commission adopt a resolution such as was done in Highland Park, and forward it to the legislature asking the state law makers to adopt an open housing code.

When this motion was offered Commissioner Arch Vallier protested, claiming that it had been agreed not to take final action until the full membership of the Commission was present.


Commissioner Smith allowed his motion to stand, and it was voted down, 5 to 1.

THIS FINALLY set the stage for ultimate action Monday night.

Just how the commissioners will vote is anyone's guess. But it has been hinted that a move to place the matter on the ballot for a spring referendum may be taken. It also has been hinted that some changes may be made in the proposed code Monday night before the vote.

Some folks close to the commissioners also have hinted that the township action in rejecting a plea for an open housing ordinance may have an effect on the voting.

At any rate the big moment will arrive Monday night--and there should be no guess work after that.

### Ice Arena Up For Decision

The question of whether the City of Plymouth will have a community center for recreation is expected to be answered Monday night at the regular meeting of the City Commission.

The Centennial Committee, which was named last spring to develop plans for a permanent memorial of the anniversary, made its final presentation last Monday night and it was looked upon with favor in many quarters.

The Center, if adopted in its present plan, would contain a hockey rink with ample seating capacity, plus a multipurpose room for other activities, and a swimming pool, badminton and tennis courts for outdoor programs.

TOTAL COST of the complex has been estimated at \$688,000, most of which could be financed by revenue bonds. The question of financing, however, is the bone of contention among the commissioners.

Several of them, lead by Commissioner Arch Vallier, are opposed to any financing plan without a working agreement that includes the city, township and the school district.

The committee pointed out that a feasibility study revealed the need for such a facility in this area and that many of our young hockey players can obtain accommodations to practice in other areas only at such hours as 2 o'clock in the morning.

If approved the center will be constructed on one end of the present high school athletic field.

### Wilburn Bailey Dies Following Auto Crash

Wilburn N. Bailey 56, of 285 Fair, Plymouth, died in University Hospital, Ann Arbor, Thursday after being critically injured in an auto-train accident in Ann Arbor Oct. 22.

Bailey's wife, Virginia, 54, is still in University Hospital and is expected to recover. A car, driven by Ross Spencer, 66, of Detroit, in which Bailey and his wife were riding, was struck by an 82-car train at the Pontiac St. crossing.

BAILEY WAS sitting in the front passenger seat and his wife was sitting in the back next to Spencer's wife, Donna, 46.

Both of the Spencers were taken to the hospital and both were released shortly after.

The car was hit on the right side by the train, shoving the auto off the tracks and ripping the gas tank away. The tank was found 50 feet from the scene of impact. More than 20 cars passed through the crossing before the train was able to be halted.

ANN ARBOR police said that all crossing signals were operating at the time.


Services for Mr. Bailey will be held Dec. 4 at 10 a.m. in Schrader Funeral Home. He will be buried in Riverside Cemetery.

### Esch Plea Improves Air Mail

Action by Congressman Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) has brought about a Post Office Department pledge of better air mail service for the Plymouth area.

Esch initiated an official Post Office investigation after receiving a complaint from Mr. Lauren R. Januz of Ivywood Lane. Mr. Januz stated that air mail special delivery letters from his employer in Chicago took up to four days to arrive in Plymouth.

The investigation included a two-day check of air mail from Chicago and resulted in the discovery of an irregularity.

that he might have or for no reason.

Then this thing was switched around from method of enforcing rights over into creating another right, that is the right of a person buying a piece of property and forcing the owner to sell it when the owner had some misgivings and didn't want to sell to a certain person.

The civil rights commission is another one of those administrative agencies, you and I or no other voter or tax payer has anything to do with the members of the civil rights commission, except to pay their salary, nothing to do with their selection, with their tenure. Someone else does that. The voters don't. And when you create a such a commission as that, designed to look for certain things, that is the very thing, of course, they are hired to do and that is the thing they are going to be concerned with and perhaps be overzealous about it. The thing to be feared in any civil rights commission is that they might be so overzealous in trying to protect the rights of one group of individuals, they will trample on the rights of others which will be just as bad or worse.

**ANOTHER MATTER THAT** has occurred to me is this: There has been a lot of agitation to try to induce, bludgeon local municipalities into enacting such a civil rights ordinance. I don't know of any townships that have enacted such. There may be some. There have been some cities: Ann Arbor was one of the first. Flint has one of recent date. I think Huntington Woods enacted one a day or two ago, an evening or two ago.

But, this whole idea of trying to have the local municipalities enact such ordinances seems to me may be doing the thing just exactly wrong. It seems to put it on a local option basis, as if this were trivial, as buying liquor by the glass. These rights, whose ever rights, which ever side of the scene — are so deep-seated and so hard come by, and over such a long period of time, they should not be, should not depend on any local option.

The law is the law and the rights of people, they have been set forth in the constitution of the United States, and constitution of the states and laws of Michigan. And those things, those laws, those rights are the rights of every state of the union, all 50 of them, in every county of this nation, every city, every village and township of this nation. That is the law, and why each local municipality should enact a separate ordinance of its own is just beyond me. I cannot see the purpose of it at all.

I hear a bill has been presented to the Michigan Legislature, called a "fair housing act". It is the same thing, fair housing act, open housing, or whatever you might call it, it is part of the whole civil rights matter, and it appears that such a statute will be enacted. The terms have not been agreed upon.

There is quite a lot of difference of opinion in Lansing, and the last I heard was that a group, selected from each of the two political parties met with the governor and sort of ironed out their differences and tentatively agreed on the form of some amendments to such an act. I think they are to meet again on December 12.

When the State of Michigan makes such a law, it will be the law in the City of Plymouth, and Township of Plymouth, and in every city, village and township in this state. Why each one should attempt to enact such an ordinance will just add to the confusion.

**ANOTHER REASON WHY** I can't see the benefit in a Township enacting such an ordinance as this — it is provided in the 1963 Michigan Constitution, Article 5, Section 29, which creates the civil rights commission. It is provided there that nothing, in that provision shall hinder or prevent any person who feels that his civil rights have been trampled upon from going into court and enforcing those rights.

I think that is very important, and there is nothing new about it. That provision just recognizes that these rights exist and the courts are the place to go for the enforcement and the safeguarding of those rights. But they felt it was important enough to set it out specifically in that amendment.

I won't bother to read the whole thing. This is what I am talking about: "Nothing in this section shall be construed to diminish the right of any party to direction and immediate legal or equitable remedies in the courts of this state."

The courts of this state, who are entrusted with the enforcement of peoples' rights, guaranteeing them it is specifically stated here that the civil rights act or any other statute will not take away from anyone who feels that his civil rights have been trampled upon, or he has not been treated properly, nothing will prevent him from going into the courts for the protection of those rights.

That is an enormously important thing. I think the whole thing is so important, it should not be dealt with on a local option basis. Therefore, I am recommending to this Board that you do not enact a so-called open housing ordinance. When it becomes the law of the state, it will be the law of this township.

Zoning Code Improved  
By Township Planners

It's a slow and tedious process, but the Township Planning Commission is moving steadily toward a final draft of Township Ordinances 13 and 14, dealing with subdivisions and zoning.

The Planning Commission met in a special meeting Wednesday and hashed out differences in wording for Ordinance 14 commonly referred to as the zoning ordinance.

Ralph Cole, township attorney, testified before the commission and gave his legal opinion on various aspects of different sections of the ordinance.

Cole said that the ordinance must be able to be enforced effectively by the township and the revisions suggested by him were made from the standpoint of making the ordinance stand up, if challenged, in court.

In other action, the Planning Commission granted a building permit for an industrial building on lot No. 8 in Gould Industrial Park on Ann Arbor and Lilley Roads.

Ovidone Corporation, a local precision tool and gauge manufacturing firm, is relocating from its present location on Ann Arbor Rd. in the city.

They are expected to be in the park by next March. No estimate of construction costs was available.

Bud Gould, developer of the park, said that about 40 per cent of the land has been sold in the park to date and a lot more construction will be started next year.

Gould estimated that when the 100 acre industrial park is fully developed it will be valued between \$10 and \$15 million.

**James Shannon Dies In Tempe**  
James Grover Shannon, former resident of Plymouth, died recently in Tempe, Arizona.

Shannon was engaged in business in Plymouth as a finance manager from 1947 until 1957 when he moved to Arizona.

# Pearl Harbor Anniversary Recalls Start Of Present Unrest In World

Next Thursday — December 7 — will mark the twenty-sixth anniversary of one of the darkest days in American history and a day from which the world has not yet recovered.

It is the anniversary of the quiet Sunday morning on which the Japanese launched their sneak attack on Pearl Harbor, virtually ruined the United States Pacific fleet, and helped to bring about conditions on the globe for which no remedy has yet been found.

It was the day that caused the late president, Franklin D. Roosevelt, to stand up in the halls of Congress and say, "This day shall live in infamy."

# A Salute To Plymouth

To the Editor:

I noted with interest the letter of the Plymouth Township resident who supported the idea of Plymouth Township remaining a separate entity and even made the proposal that the City join the township.

In February, 1967, when we purchased our home in Lake Pointe Village, I wanted no part of any City and we purchased in Plymouth Township because we thought that township living would be less expensive. Oh how we were mistaken!

We didn't know how efficient and well-managed the City of Plymouth was, I, for one, will

support and actively campaign for the annexation of Lake Pointe Village into the City of Plymouth, and hopefully the entire township to be merged into the City. When you stop to consider what the township is lacking that which the City residents get—for less taxes--the answer is simple.

True, the township has the biggest share of the industry and a good bit of retail business. But, if you'll stop to analyze the reason you'll find that the City doesn't have the expansion room. If the City had all of the space that the Township did it too would have expanded--and could have been

even more aggressive in its expansion because of what it could offer industry.

We pay high taxes in the township and what do we get? No street lights, inadequate police patrol (it is well over 2-3 months since I last saw a sheriff's squad drive down our street), poor street maintenance (drive Haggerty Road some day and you'll see what I mean), 55¢ per 1000 gallons for water a volunteer fire department that causes us class 9 fire insurance rates (highest there is in Michigan), duplicity in government that could be avoided if the township merged with the City and thus eliminate a few payroll checks.

We also get poorer mail service (how'd you like to get your mail delivered at 3 p.m.? Air

mail special delivery from Chicago takes 2-4 days to reach Lake Pointe Village), and we desperately need traffic signals at Schoolcraft and Northville Roads (ever try to make a turn at this corner at 4:30 p.m.), inadequate traffic patrol (when I complained to the sheriff's police that teenagers were driving at excessive speeds on our street I was told that they were "too busy to patrol residential areas"), and a garbage dump adjacent to our neighborhood.

If you want continuation of township government this is your choice. But, whether the City of Plymouth merges with Plymouth Township or Plymouth Township merges with the City of Plymouth economies in government can be effected

and we can get better representation in our governing body by eliminating duplicating personnel and buying in larger quantities. Instead of having political appointments in the City government we can have Civil Service appointments chosen on merit rather than political contacts.

By merging the township and the city we can unite as one group working toward one common goal—a better Plymouth

community. Under the present goal the township and the city are at constant odds. Under one system we'd have one goal. And a side benefit would be a representative on the Plymouth city council—a needed voice we don't get in township government. Put the proposal on the ballot, I'm not the only one that feels this way.

## GOLDEN TOUCH OF HOSPITALITY

**Bake A Continental Cake**

If you should go searching for cake recipes in Europe, you would find that many of them call for a mixture of wheat and another flour. Very often the second flour is corn flour, the continental name for what we in America call corn starch. We discovered a delicious cake using corn flour in Switzerland. It was a marble cake baked in a tube pan and like many European cakes, is served warm without any frosting. Warm or cold, this cake is good.

### Continental Cake

1 1/4 cups sifted flour  
1 cup corn starch  
3 teaspoons baking powder  
1/4 cup sugar  
3 tablespoons cocoa  
3/4 cup margarine  
1 cup sugar  
4 egg yolks  
1 cup milk  
4 egg whites

Sift flour, corn starch and baking powder together. Thoroughly blend 1/4 cup sugar and cocoa. Cream margarine and 1 cup sugar in mixing bowl; beat in egg yolks. Mix in sifted dry ingredients alternately with milk, beginning and ending with dry ingredients. (Batter may appear slightly curdled.) Divide batter in half. Stir sugar-cocoa mixture into one portion, blending well. Beat egg whites until soft peaks form when beater is raised. Fold half into each portion of batter. Drop batters alternately by teaspoonfuls into greased 9-inch tube pan. Bake in 350 degrees F. (moderate) oven until cake tests done, about 1 hour. Serve warm or cooled. Makes 1 (9-inch) tube cake.

## What Happens If A-Ship Is Wrecked?

**NEW YORK**—If a nuclear-powered ship were involved in a collision, could its reactor be protected?

What is the most economic size of a modern cargo ship? Possible answers to these questions were presented by two University of Michigan faculty members at the annual meeting of the Society of Naval Architects and Marine Engineers.

The professors, from the department of naval architecture and marine engineering, are George L. West Jr. and Harry Benford.

Prof. West presented his paper on "Some Aspects of Nuclear Safety and Ship Design." A former student of his, Lt. Edwin J. Roland of the U.S. Coast Guard, is co-author.

Their paper dealt with the

many factors that must be considered when designing a safe shipboard reactor installation. In addition to the usual safety considerations found in a land-based reactor, they explored the problem of protecting the reactor against possible damage in a collision.

Prof. Benford's paper "On the Rational Selection of Ship Sizes" took up the problem of specifying the most economic

size for a cargo ship.

The problem, he explained, is complicated because the cargo that is likely to be available in any given trade route is likely to have long-term upward or downward trends complicated by seasonal fluctuations.

His studies show that optimal ship size is surprisingly insensitive to fairly large changes in such factors as design speed.

# School Bargainers Hail Faster Aid Effort

The Michigan Legislature is moving to avoid the kind of "cliff-hanger" school openings the public witnessed here in August and September.

To the sound of applause from school chiefs and teachers' negotiators, the State Senate Appropriations Committee will begin hearings Dec. 5 on next

year's state school aid bill. What happened in 1967 was that the fiscal year began July 1, but the Legislature didn't pass the school aid bill until July 12. The unhappy twin results: Officials couldn't adopt final budgets, and teachers couldn't reach collective bargaining agreements until all the monetary facts were at hand.

In some cases, including a few in this area, contracts weren't ratified until just before school was to open; in nearby areas, schools failed to open on time.

The theory is that the sooner the school aid bill is passed, the sooner school boards can pass the budgets, and the easier it will be to negotiate contracts.

And that's good news, particularly at Schoolcraft College,

Plymouth and Farmington school districts.

PLYMOUTH'S recently retired superintendent, Russell Isbister, would like to see the state aid bill passed early enough so that negotiations with teachers could be completed by the first of April.

"When 40 per cent of your operating budget is in doubt until after school's out in June," Isbister said, "it's extremely difficult for a board of education to fix an operating budget."

Earlier passage of state aid, he said, will also enable school boards to fix the amount of voted millage they will need and go to the taxpayers for more, if necessary.

And the number of school districts running deficits this year, because of the lateness of state aid, is "frightening," he added.

Because of the amount of time school districts must

spend in collective bargaining, Isbister said, there may result a "drift toward area-wide or state-wide bargaining"—something that neither boards nor teachers want.

Plymouth school district negotiated a one-year contract with teachers in August. Isbister began work on bargaining, retired June 30 and turned the reins over to a new man, James Rossman, to finish.

AT SCHOOLCRAFT College, Howard Kahn, administrative assistant to the president, can list practically all the dates of the school aid bill's steps through both houses of the Legislature, and he called the new speed-up "encouraging news."

The college and the Faculty Forum, bargaining agent for instructors, reached agreement Aug. 23. It was ratified in the next couple of days, and fall classes started Aug. 28. That one-year pact was the

first ever negotiated at the college.

Kahn pointed out that "we were a half-month into the new operating year without knowing what our state aid would be."

Despite the "cliff-hanger" at Schoolcraft, other colleges had even worse luck. Macomb and Lake Michigan community colleges failed by weeks to open on schedule.

Anthony V. Rizzo, geography instructor who heads the Faculty Forum bargainers, said he "couldn't blame the board for being timid" about writing a new contract until the aid

bill was passed. One of the ill effects of the state-caused delay, Rizzo pointed out, was that Schoolcraft lost 18 faculty members "because they were not sure of what was going to come out of negotiations. That's unfortunate. We lost some good people."

WILLIAM KLOOTE, a Plymouth resident, is executive secretary for the education associations of Farmington and Bloomfield Hills.

In Farmington, teachers attended orientation sessions

Sept. 5, opened school the 6th and ratified a new one-year contract on the morning of the 7th.

In Bloomfield Hills, however, school started 14 days late. "I'm sure it would have been helpful if the state aid bill could have been passed sooner," said Kloote.

Negotiating during the summer session was particularly hard, he said, because "it's difficult to pull teachers together then to get an expression of opinion. They have other jobs, or they're traveling, or

Rizzo, the Schoolcraft faculty bargaining chief, said that teachers there could, if necessary, have been contacted by mail during the summer for ratification of a proposed contract. The difficulties and cost, however, are obvious.

And so on Dec. 5, the Senate Appropriations Committee, headed by Republican Frank D. Beadle of St. Clair, will get to work on the aid bill some three weeks before the new session of the Legislature is to start, and nearly seven months before the next fiscal year begins.

It hardly seems possible that another year has drifted by and we are once again faced with the annual task of selecting gifts for our families and friends.

There are many efficient and well organized women that have the situation well in hand with neatly wrapped packages hidden away on closet shelves. Then there are those of us who plan to plunge into it with all the zeal we can muster on December 23.

Whether you are an early shopper or one that grabs purse and parka and dashes downtown on Christmas eve, the Crescendo group of the Plymouth Symphony Society has a perfect gift idea--"Melody of Menus" for those on your Christmas list who love to cook.

THIS FAT little cook book with its blue wallpaper print cover is packed with some mighty interesting recipes and they are all from the kitchens of Plymouth women.

Coffee balls, nut chews, pud-die cake, Texas onions, Patri-cian potatoes, and rutabaga cus-tard are just six of the 250 recipes gathered and compiled by the Crescendo women.

If you find an old pot or pan for that antique collector on your gift list put "Melody of Menus" on top of the package--it features recipes that are more than 100 years old and

have been included in the spirit of Plymouth's Centennial year.

Mrs. Jack Wilson, Mrs. John Koehler, and Mrs. Joseph Kovach, all Crescendo members, felt that just giving a few recipe titles wasn't really following the true spirit of Christmas giving and have graciously offered to share their recipes with you.

**UNTOSSED SALAD**--Jo Wilson

In the bottom of a bowl (glass is pretty) put about 1/2 head of shredded lettuce, 1/2 package cooked and cooled frozen peas or French style green beans, some shredded carrot, seedless green grapes or small pine-apple chunks, thin sliced onions, then "glops" of mayonnaise. Sprinkle with 2 or 3 table-spoons of sugar. Repeat. Pre-prepare about 3 or 4 hours before serving. Refrigerate. Cut about 3/4 pound of bacon into inch squares and brown. Drain on paper.

**FLOATING ISLAND PUNCH**--Martha Koehler

1/2 cup sugar  
1 cup water  
6 ounce can frozen lemon juice  
1 quart of ginger ale (for champagne punch substitute champagne)  
1 quart sparkling water (or white grape juice)  
3-6 ounce cans frozen orange

juice  
ounce bottle maraschino cherries and juice  
1 orange sliced thin  
1 pint of lemon or orange sherbet  
Ice cubes (approximately one tray)

Heat sugar and water until sugar dissolves, cool. Combine fruit juices, gingerale, spark-ling water and fruit. Add syrup. Pour into punch bowl. Add ice cubes. Drop in sherbet by spoonfuls or in small balls using ice cream dipper.

Serves 20 to 25.

**MAMA'S COOKIES**--Irene Kovach

1/2 pound butter  
3/4 cup sugar  
2 eggs  
1 tablespoon whiskey  
2 cups flour  
1 teaspoon baking powder  
Rind of one lemon

Cream butter and sugar well. Add two egg yolks with rind of lemon and whiskey. Beat well. Add flour and baking powder. Roll cookies out on a floured board to 1/4 inch thickness. Beat with a fork 2 egg whites, 1/2 cup sugar and 1/2 cup chopped walnuts.

Brush on top of cookies before baking (a little red or green food coloring may be added for the holidays) grease and flour cookie sheets.

Bake 8 to 12 minutes, just until edges show a little brown-ing. Dough may be refrigerated overnight.

have a Christ-centered, Bible teaching, missionary minded church.

Several years later, in September 1937, the church's name was changed to Calvary Baptist and its location to a store building at North Mill and Hardenburg.

IN APRIL 1943, the church found its third home in a new basement building located on West Ann Arbor Trail where the Adams Furniture House now stands.

### They Clothe The World's Children

Mrs. Matthew Krump of 11429 Gold Arbor will enjoy again this year her part in an international charity called the "Pope's Warehouse."

The Pope's Warehouse is the Catholic Church's annual clothing drive for the needy children of the world.

Church attendance grew and with it the pressing need for additional space. In 1953 a Lodge Hall nearby was rented to provide additional educational facilities and ground was broken two years later in the late fall of 1955 for a sizable addition to the church.

During the next ten years it became increasingly evident that a larger structure was the only answer to the church's overcrowded condition.

In July 1964 plans were completed for a new church with educational facilities and a nine and one half acre site was

chosen at 43065 Joy Road.

PATRICK J. CLIFFORD, the present pastor was born in Oakville, Canada, of an Irish mother a Scottish father. He came to Plymouth in 1949 from Detroit where he has been Director of the Christian Service Center.

The Center's function in those days of war and war production was to work with the youth left alone in the housing projects of the city.

"It was wild," said Rev. Clifford describing his work among the undisciplined youth of that era.

When asked if the situation has changed much in 20 years he said, "The problems today are very similar—the children have no sense of stability."

"If we can give our children two things—love and security—we would have a lot less juvenile delinquency."

REV. CLIFFORD explained the kind of security needed, "A child comes home from school to an empty house with a problem that to him is as big as any facing the United Nations—and there is nobody to listen."

"Did you ever watch a child at play? He is concerned with what is at hand, he is concerned with NOW. He will play on the teeter-totter, then go to the swing, then the sand pile."

"An adult is concerned with what has happened or what is going to happen and finds it difficult to understand the 'NOW' world of a child."

The Cliffords have two married children, Dan a resident physician in internal medicine at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor, and Patricia, a University of Michigan nursing school graduate living in Bellevue, Washington.

OPEN OCCUPANCY and

racial tension dominate today's news and Rev. Clifford had this to say regarding them, "Our church does not participate in politics. However, if all people who attend the churches of the world would put into practice what the Bible teaches we wouldn't have our racial problems."

"Legislation is needed just as when the auto was first invented—but the mere making of laws will never remedy any problem unless people have it in their hearts to consider others."

"Christianity is not a matter of one Sunday each week—we

have to go out and 'live' it. If we don't people will look at a person who attends church regularly and see no advantage in it."

THE BAPTIST religion is an independent one. One of the distinctive characteristics of the Baptists have no hierarchy, no centralized control of religious activity, no headquarters, or regulations.

As Rev. Clifford puts it, "This is IT. Our local congregation rules it, runs it, and is responsible for it."

Perhaps because of this, Baptist missionary interests span the globe with schools, dispensaries and churches in the inner most regions of Mexico, to the far out frontiers of Africa.

In the past eight years Rev. Clifford has visited missions in 24 countries and is able to give first hand accounts of the work being done among the peoples of the world.

Just a year ago Rev. Clifford went around the world in less than 80 days—leaving Detroit for San Francisco on September 26 at 4 p.m. and arriving home at 4 p.m. on December 2—exactly 68 days, to the hour, later.

The missions of Japan, Hong Kong, Philippines, Thailand, West Pakistan, Lebanon, Jordan, Egypt, Cyprus and Kenya, all gave Rev. Clifford

new insight into the life of a missionary in the field.

IT WAS ON A boat in Hong Kong harbor that Rev. Clifford discovered just how small the world really is.

Delighted to find himself seated next to an English speaking woman amidst all the Chinese dialects, he introduced himself and informed her that he was from the United States—Michigan to be exact.

She, too, had at one time lived in Michigan and when Rev. Clifford asked what city she told him near Kalamazoo and then astounded him by saying, "You had a lot more hair then and it was red."

To his astonishment he discovered that the lady seated next to him amid the welter of a Hong Kong harbor, had once attended Rev. Clifford's services in his church in Kalamazoo!

As he traveled, Rev. Clifford asked the needs of each individual mission enabling his congregation here to participate in missionary aid.

In Kenya they needed antibiotics, in West Pakistan the missionary family's children needed shoes.

THE CONGREGATION of the Calvary Baptist Church does not exchange Christmas cards.

"We have a very talented member of our congregation, Stephanie Sanocki, who by the way was just named Best Girl Citizen of the Year, who makes us a very large Christmas Card that we can all sign and keep on display."

"The money that would have been spent on cards is collected to aid the missionary work." Last year the children of the missionary family serving in West Pakistan got their shoes. This year another equally needed contribution will wing its way to some remote spot on the globe.

# Big Families Find Strength In Numbers

Their insignia shows mother and father and six children, all in a row.

Their membership rolls list 83 couples with more than 600 children among them.

Their reason for being can be expressed in three E's--for economics, empathy and education--while their income tax statements would have to be heavy on the D--for deductions.

These folks are members of the Large Family Club of Farmington, Livonia and Southfield. Formed last spring, the organization has found itself burgeoning at an amazing rate, both in numbers and in ideas.

THE CLUB--the parents involved, that is--meets once a month in the basement of Our Lady of Sorrows Church in Farmington. It's one of the few spots around that is big enough. Also about once a month, there's a social event to involve both parents and children. And these get-togethers have led to varied cooperative ventures.

MEMBERS found they had so many ideas to exchange at the rather short monthly meetings that they decided to write some of them down.

So evolved a huge bulletin board, with all kinds of notices. Information also could be disseminated in a newsletter, so a four-page one went into publication, with Louise Sidlosky of Farmington as editor.

Some parents found it was hard for both to get away for the meetings. No babysitters who wanted to take on the care of five or six children, even for an evening.

But other parents had teenagers to spare, and who knows better than a teen from a big family how to take care of another big family? So was born a babysitting exchange.

AT THE first few social gatherings, mothers found themselves exchanging recipes that would feed a lot of people. Now Lenore Semploski and Joan Zott, both Farmington graduates of Marygrove College with majors in home economics, are going to edit a cookbook with

the emphasis on large-quantity dishes.

Eileen Bandoni, of Farmington, is compiling a list of housekeepers for members who need them. She knows it takes a special kind of person to take over in a household with five or more youngsters, but points out that such a job might not be as difficult as many think.

Big families, she said, tend to produce cooperative children and discourage picky eaters--by sheer necessity.

THEN THERE'S a file of sewing patterns being compiled by Phyllis Mahinske. Right now, the stress is on patterns for pajamas, robes and doll clothes for Christmas, but Mrs. Mahinske should soon have a complete set of patterns for all types of garments in all sizes. The club also is working out an exchange of trading stamp books, and a box is set out at each meeting for exchange of mail coupons.

Plans are going forward to work out means of large-quantity discount buying for club members. So far, the big item is detergent at a cut rate.

THE EDUCATION part of the three E's is a two-fold one. Speakers are invited to meetings to give members information on timely matters of special interest to them. And the club hopes to do some educating on its own--to convince the community that a large family is, more often than not, a well-disciplined and cooperative one. Membership in the organization is limited to families with at least five children. A headcount indicates the biggest number have six youngsters.

The club's membership included just one set of triplets--year old girls named Carol, Cheryl and Cynthia who make up half the six-child family of Bruno and Cecilia Walczak.

There are nine sets of twins in seven families. The ones with two sets each are Ray and Ruth Esper, with 17-year-old girls and three-year-old boys, and Paul and Helen Burger, who have boys, 4, and a boy and girl age 2.

# Education Advances Far Beyond Three R's

## School District Plans Farming And Park Program

Like the wind swept shifting dunes of any great desert, theories of education become altered and modified as one

generation assumes the roles of the last.

Possibly, theories dealing with "how to teach the three

r's" haven't changed since the turn of the century. In most places, children still arrive at school—usually a nice square

brick building—early in the morning and don't leave until late in the afternoon.

The only time these young-

sters will get a breath of fresh air is at recess, when they are allowed relief from some teacher's monotonous, droning voice.

However, in the short span of only two or three more years, this old philosophy of education may be changed by

the Plymouth Board of Education.

James Rossman, superintendent of Plymouth schools, has a dream that is taking shape in the new high school soon to be built.

Rossman's idea is to incorporate the school into an educational park.

He said that the park and the school would work closely together. They would complement each other and one would give something to the other that it couldn't have of itself.

The school building will be tucked into the park complex which will be made up of a farm, a small forest, possibly an amphitheater, picnic grounds, and, of course, athletic fields for the high school students and Little League games.

The superintendent explained that the park is being designed for total community use.

However, he added, its primary function is as an introduction to learning. "Simply reading about something doesn't give understanding of what that something really is," he said.

When a child witnesses a cow being milked and realizes that milk doesn't come from bottles, the child will fully comprehend what a cow and milk is when he reads about them in a text book.

The educator added that the park also would give children

an appreciation and link with the past. They could learn about early farm life and the evolution of farm production through new scientific methods.

"We would be giving youth a chance to get closer to nature," he commented.

"The park wouldn't be for high school students alone," he said.

Pre-school children and young elementary children could visit the park and be conducted on tours by high school students, according to Rossman.

The park also could fit into a community recreation program where a family could have a picnic in the wooded area, visit the farm—which would act as a domestic zoo—while their older youngsters played Little League baseball nearby.

Eventually the park would be replaced by three other high schools that are planned for the site. These would be built as they were needed.

Rossman added that the district anticipates nine high schools in its boundaries when the area finally reaches its school district population saturation point.

However, if the park proved valuable before it is replaced another similar park could be created at another high school location, he stated.

## City of Plymouth - Ordinance No. 332

ORDINANCE NO. 332

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A DEPARTMENT OF PURCHASES IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH, MICHIGAN, CREATING THE OFFICE OF THE CITY PURCHASING AGENT; SETTING FORTH THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE CITY PURCHASING AGENT; ESTABLISHING PURCHASING PROCEDURES; AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF ITS PROVISIONS.

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

Section 1. Short Title. This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Purchasing Ordinance of the City of Plymouth, Michigan."

Section 2. Definitions. For the purposes of this Ordinance the following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations shall have the meaning given herein. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

- (1) "Chief Administrator" is the City Manager of the City of Plymouth.
- (2) "City" is the City of Plymouth, Michigan.
- (3) "City Commission" is the council of the City of Plymouth.
- (4) "City Purchasing Agent" or "Agent" is the Purchasing Agent of the City of Plymouth.
- (5) "Contractual Services" shall mean and include all telephone, gas, water, electric light and power service; towel and cleaning service; insurance; leases for all grounds, buildings, office or other space required by the using agencies; and the rental, repair or maintenance of equipment, machinery and other city-owned personal property. The term shall not include professional and other contractual services which are in their nature unique and not subject to competition.
- (6) "Supplies" shall mean and include all supplies, materials and equipment.
- (7) "Using Agency" is any department, agency, commission, bureau or other unit in the City government using supplies or procuring contractual services as provided for in this ordinance.

Section 3. Establishment of Office of Purchases. There is hereby established in the Department of Assessor-Treasurer an Office of Purchases.

Section 4. City Purchasing Agent. The City Purchasing Agent shall be the head, and have general supervision of the Office of Purchases. The Agent shall perform all duties required of a department head by law, and shall have the powers and duties prescribed by this Ordinance.

(1) Scope of Purchasing Authority. The Agent shall have the power and it shall be his duty:

- (a) Purchase or Contract. To purchase or contract for all supplies and contractual services needed by any using agency which derives its support wholly or in part from the City, in accordance with purchasing procedures as prescribed by this Ordinance and such rules and regulations as the Agent shall adopt for the internal management and operation of the Office of Purchasing and such other rules and regulations as shall be prescribed by the Chief Administrator and the City Commission.

(a-1) Exceptions prohibited. The authority of the Agent to negotiate all purchases for all using agencies shall not be abridged by excepting any particular using agency. (a-2) Unauthorized purchases. Except as herein provided, it shall be unlawful for any City officer or officers to order the purchase of any supplies or make any contract within the purview of this Ordinance other than through the Department of Purchasing, and any purchase ordered or contract made contrary to the provisions hereof shall not be approved by the City officials, and the City shall not be bound thereby.

(2) Other Powers and Duties. In addition to the purchasing authority conferred in subsection (1) above and in addition to any other powers and duties conferred by this Ordinance the Agent shall:

- (a) Minimum Expenditure. Act to procure for the City the highest quality in supplies and contractual services at least expense to the City.
- (b) Encourage Competition. Discourage uniform bidding and endeavor to obtain as full and open competition as possible on all purchases and sales.
- (c) Rules and Regulations. Establish, and amend when necessary, all rules and regulations authorized by this Ordinance and any others necessary to its operation.
- (d) Purchasing Analysis. Keep informed of current developments in the field of purchasing, prices, market conditions and new products, and secure for the City the benefits of research done in the field of purchasing by other governmental jurisdictions, national technical societies, trade associations having national recognition, and by private businesses and organizations.
- (e) Forms. Prescribe and maintain such forms as he shall find reasonably necessary to the operation of this Ordinance.
- (f) Vendors' Catalog File. Prepare, adopt and maintain a vendors' catalog file. Said catalog shall be filed according to materials and shall contain descriptions to materials and shall contain descriptions of vendors' commodities, prices and discounts.
- (g) Bulk Purchase. Exploit the possibilities of buying "in bulk" so as to take full advantage of discounts.
- (h) Federal Tax Exemptions. Act so as to procure for the City all Federal Tax Exemptions to which it is entitled.
- (i) Cooperation with City Clerk. Cooperate with the City Clerk so as to secure for the City the maximum efficiency in budgeting and accounting.
- (j) Disqualification of Bidders. Have the authority to report to the City Manager vendors who default on their quotations, who fail to follow specifications, or who provide inferior quality. The City Manager may disqualify irresponsible bidders from receiving any business from the municipality for a stated period of time.

Section 5. Capacity of Agent. The Agent shall enforce the written specifications adopted.

- (1) Agent's Duties. It shall be the duty of the Agent:
  - (a) Classification. To classify all the supplies used by the various branches of the City government.
  - (b) Standardization. To adopt as standards the minimum number of qualities, sizes, and varieties of supplies consistent with the successful operation of the City government.
  - (c) Specifications. To prepare and adopt written specifications of all such standard supplies.
- (2) Effect of Adoption. After its adoption, each standard specification shall, until revised or rescinded, apply alike in terms and effect to every future purchase and contract for the supply described in such specification.
  - (a) Exception. The Agent, with the approval of the City Manager, shall have the authority to exempt any using agency of the City for use of the supply described in such standard specification.
- (3) Consultation with Using Agencies. The Agent shall consult with the heads and other officials of the using agencies

to determine their precise requirements and shall endeavor to prescribe those standards which meet the needs of the majority of such agencies.

- (4) Nature of Specifications. All specifications shall be definite and certain and shall permit of competition.
  - (a) Exception. Provided, however, that the provisions of this subsection shall not apply to non-competitive types and kinds of supplies.

Section 6. Requisition and Estimates. All using agencies, either by or with the authorization of the Head of the Department under which the using agency operates, shall file with the Agent detailed requisitions or estimates of their requirements in supplies and contractual services in such manner, at such time, and for such future periods as the Agent shall prescribe.

(1) Unforeseen Requirements. A using agency shall not be prevented from filing, in the same manner, with the Agent at any time a requisition or estimate for any supplies and contractual services, the need for which was not foreseen when the detailed estimates were filed.

- (2) Revisory Power in Agent. The Agent shall examine each requisition or estimate and shall have the authority to revise it as to quantity, quality, or estimated cost; but revision as to quality shall be in accordance with the standards and specifications established pursuant to this Ordinance.

Section 7. Encumbrance of Funds. Except in cases of emergency, the Agent shall not issue any order for delivery on a contract or open market purchase until the City Clerk shall have certified, after pre-audit, that there is to the credit of the using agencies concerned a sufficient unencumbered appropriation balance, in excess of all unpaid obligations, to defray the amount of such order.

Section 8. Prohibition of Interest. Any purchase order or contract within the purview of this Ordinance in which the Agent, or any officer or employee of the City is financially interested, directly or indirectly, shall be void, except that before the execution of a purchase order or contract the Commission shall have the authority to waive compliance with this Section when it finds such action to be in the best interests of the City.

Section 9. Competitive Bidding Required. All purchases of, and contracts for supplies and contractual services, and all sales of personal property which has become obsolete and unusable shall, except as specifically provided herein, be based wherever possible on competitive bids.

Section 10. Formal Contract Procedure. All supplies and contractual services, except as otherwise provided herein, when the estimated cost thereof shall exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000), shall be purchased by formal, written contract from the lowest responsible bidder, after due notice inviting proposals. All sales of personal property which has become obsolete and unusable, when the estimated value shall exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000), shall be sold by formal written contract to the highest responsible bidder, after due notice inviting proposals.

(1) Notice Inviting Bids.

- (a) Newspaper. Notice inviting bids shall be published once in at least one official newspaper in the City and at least five days preceding the last day set for the receipt of proposals.

(a-1) Scope of Notice. The Newspaper notice required herein shall include a general description of the articles to be purchased or sold, shall state where bid blanks and specifications may be secured, and the time and place for opening bids.

(b) Bidders' List. The Agent shall also solicit sealed bids from all responsible prospective suppliers who have requested their names to be added to a "Bidders' List" which the Agent shall maintain, by sending them a copy of such newspaper notice or such other notice as will acquaint them with the proposed purchase or sale. In any case, invitations sent to the vendors on the bidders' list shall be limited to commodities that are similar in character and ordinarily handled by the trade group to which the invitations are sent.

- (2) Bid Deposits. When deemed necessary by the Agent, bid deposits shall be prescribed in the public notices inviting bids. Unsuccessful bidders shall be entitled to return of surety where the Agent has required such. A successful bidder shall forfeit any surety required by the Agent upon failure on his part to enter a contract within ten (10) days after the award.

(3) Bid Opening Procedure.

- (a) Sealed. Bids shall be submitted sealed to the Clerk and shall be identified as bids on the envelope.
- (b) Opening. Bids shall be opened in public at the time and place stated in the public notices.
- (c) Tabulation. A tabulation of all bids received shall be posted for public inspection.

(4) Rejection of Bids. The Agent shall have the authority to reject all bids, parts of all bids; or all bids for any one or more supplies or contractual services included in the proposed contract, when the public interest will be served thereby. Any bid rejected shall be reported with reason therefor to the City Manager.

(5) Award of Contract.

- (a) Authority in Agent. The Agent shall have the authority to award contracts under \$1,000, and recommend to the City Commission the awarding of contracts involving expenditures over \$1,000, within the purview of this Ordinance.

(b) Lowest Responsible Bidder. Contracts shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. In determining "lowest responsible bidder," in addition to price, the Agent shall consider:

- (b-1) The ability, capacity and skill of the bidder to perform the contract or provide the service required;
- (b-2) Whether the bidder can perform the contract or provide the service promptly, or within the time specified, without delay or interference;
- (b-3) The character, integrity, reputation, judgment, experience and efficiency of the bidder;
- (b-4) The quality of performance of previous contracts or services.
- (b-5) The previous and existing compliance by the bidder with laws and ordinances relating to the contract or service;
- (b-6) The sufficiency of the financial resources and ability of the bidder to perform the contract or provide the service;
- (b-7) The quality, availability and adaptability of the supplies, or the contractual services to the particular use required;
- (b-8) The ability of the bidder to provide future maintenance and service for the use of the subject of the contract;
- (b-9) The number and scope of conditions attached to the bid.

(c) Award to Other Than Low Bidder. When the award is not given to the lowest bidder, a full and complete statement of the reasons for placing the order elsewhere shall be prepared by the Agent and filed with the other papers relating to the transaction.

- (d) Tie bids.
  - (d-1) Local vendors. If all bids received are for the same total amount or unit price, quality and

service being equal, the contract shall be awarded to a local bidder.

(d-2) Outside vendors. Where subsection (d-1) is not in effect, the Agent shall award the contract to one of the tie bidders by drawing lots in public.

(e) Performance bonds. The agent shall have the authority to require a performance bond, before entering a contract, in such amount as he shall find reasonably necessary to protect the best interests of the City.

(f) Prohibition Against Subdivision. No contract or purchase shall be subdivided to avoid the requirements of this Section.

Section 11. Open Market Procedure. All purchases of supplies, and contractual services, and all sales of personal property which has become obsolete and unusable, of less than the estimated value of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars shall be made in the open market, without newspaper advertisement and without observing the procedure prescribed by Section 10 for the award of formal contracts.

- (1) Minimum Number of Bids. All open market purchases shall, wherever possible, be based on at least three competitive bids, and shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder in accordance with the standards set forth in subsection (5) (b) of Section 10 above.

(2) Notice Inviting Bids. The Agent shall solicit bids by (a) direct mail request to prospective vendors, or (b) by telephone, and/or (c) by public notice posted on the bulletin board of the City Hall.

(3) Recording. The Agent shall keep a record of all open market orders and the bids submitted in competition thereon, and such records shall also be open to public inspection.

Section 12. Petty Expenditures Revolving Fund. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the City Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, Three Hundred dollars (\$300.00), which shall be known as the Petty Expenditures Revolving Fund. From this Fund may be paid purchases not in excess of Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) each, made by the heads of using agencies for incidentals with the approval for the Agent.

- (1) Accounting. At the end of each month, the Treasurer shall render to the City Manager a statement showing the actual expenditures for each using agency so made out of such Petty Expenditures Revolving Fund, and said revolving fund shall be reimbursed for such expenditures in the same manner as other expenditures of such using agencies are paid.

(2) Rules and Regulations. The Treasurer shall promulgate rules and regulations for use of the Petty Expenditures Revolving Fund.

Section 13. Emergency Purchases.

- (1) By Agent. In case of an apparent emergency which requires immediate purchase of supplies or contractual services, the City Manager shall be empowered to authorize the Agent to secure by open market procedures as herein set forth, at the lowest obtainable price, any supplies or contractual services regardless of the amount of the expenditures.

(a) Recorded Explanation. A full report of the circumstances of an emergency purchase shall be filed by the Agent with the City Manager. In cases of expenditures exceeding \$1,000, a full report of the circumstances of the emergency purchase shall be filed by the City Manager with the City Commission, and shall be entered into the minutes of the Commission and shall be open to public inspection.

(2) By Head of Departments. In case of actual emergency, and with the consent of the Agent, and the approval of the City Manager, if available, the head of any using agency may purchase directly any supplies whose immediate procurement is essential to prevent delays in the work of the using agency which may vitally affect the life, health or convenience of citizens.

(a) Recorded Explanation. The head of such using agency shall send to the Agent a requisition and a copy of the delivery record, together with a full written report of the circumstances of the emergency. The Agent shall forward a copy of the full written report of the circumstances of the emergency with the City Manager. In cases of emergency expenditures in excess of \$1,000, the report shall be filed with the City Commission as provided in sub-section (a) above.

(b) Emergency Procedure. The Agent shall prescribe by rules and regulations the procedure under which emergency purchases by heads of using agencies may be made.

Section 14. Inspection. The agent shall inspect, or cause to be inspected, all deliveries of purchases to determine their conformance with the specifications set forth in the order or contract.

- (1) Inspection by Using Agency. The Agent shall have the authority to authorize using agencies having the staff and facilities for adequate inspection to inspect all deliveries made to such using agencies under rules and regulations which the Agent shall prescribe.

(2) Tests. The Agent shall have the authority to require chemical and physical tests of samples submitted with bids and samples of deliveries which are necessary to determine their quality and conformance with the specifications. In the performance of such tests, the Agent shall have the authority to make use of laboratory facilities of any outside laboratory.

Section 15. Surplus Stock. All using agencies shall submit to the Agent, at such times and in such form as he shall prescribe, reports showing stocks of all supplies which are no longer used or which have become obsolete, worn out or scrapped.

- (1) Transfer. The Agent shall have the authority to transfer surplus stock to other using agencies.

(2) Sale. The Agent shall have the authority to sell all supplies which have become unsuitable for public use, or to exchange the same for, or trade in the same on, new supplies.

(a) Competitive Bidding. Sales under this Section shall be made to the highest responsible bidder and in conformance with Section 10 or Section 11 hereof, whichever is applicable.

Section 16. Cooperative Purchasing. The Agent shall have the authority to join with other units of government in cooperative purchasing plans when the best interests of the City would be served thereby.

Section 17. Penalties. Any officer or employee violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to warning, suspension or dismissal.

Section 18. Separability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 19. Ordinance repealed. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 20. This Ordinance shall become operative and effective on the 12th day of December A.D. 1967.

## Stronger Fire Code Adopted In Township

The Trustees of Plymouth Township have approved several amendments to the fire code which will make it stronger and provide better protection.

At the suggestion of Paul Albright, director of public safety, it was ordained that all buildings, and every part thereof, in a multiple complex, shall be within 300 feet of a fire hydrant by direct road or drive access and that such hydrant be located immediately adjacent to a public or private roadway and not to exceed 20 feet therefrom.

It also provides that all large

single unit buildings more than 100 feet in length or width or located more than 100 feet from a public roadway, shall have supplemental fire protection provided, consisting of a six inch minimum water main with a triple hydrant, gate and gate well, so located as to provide protection within 300 feet maximum from the furthest point of the building.

Albright had made the recommendation for either adopting the suggestions as a part of township policy or amending the ordinance. The trustees then agreed that the township interests would be better served by amending the ordinance.

## ORDINANCE NO. XXVI-A

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. XXVI, KNOWN AS THE FIRE PREVENTION CODE FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH.

THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

PART I. That Ordinance No. XXVI, known as the Fire Prevention Code of the Township of Plymouth, is hereby amended by amending Article 1, Section 1.5 by the addition of the following subsection (g):

- g. All buildings, and every part thereof, in a multiple building complex shall be within 300 feet of a fire hydrant by direct road or drive access. Said hydrant to be located immediately adjacent to a Public or Private roadway, and not to exceed a distance of 20 feet therefrom.

All large single unit buildings over 100 feet in length and/or width, or located more than 100 feet from a public roadway, shall have supplemental fire protection provided consisting of a 6 inch minimum water main with triple hydrant, gate and gate well, so located as to provide fire protection within 300 feet maximum from the furthest point of the building. Said hydrant shall be so located as to be within 200 feet of a drive having access to a public roadway.

In lieu of paragraph one and two above, where said hydrant would be so located, and at a distance greater than 20 feet from a public and/or private road, underground piping, not less than 4 inch in size with Fire Department Connection located not more than 30 feet from a hydrant and extending to an area within 200 feet of any portion of a building with fire department riser not less than 30 inches above ground level will be permitted.

Such modification to paragraph one and two as will not constitute a distinct hazard to life and property as determined by the Director of Public Service of the Township of Plymouth, or any representative acting under specific orders or direction of the Director of Public Service may be considered, provided however, that in no case will the 200 foot minimum under paragraph one and/or two above be extended beyond 400 feet and in no case will the 200 foot minimum under paragraph three above be extended beyond 300 feet.

PART II. CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED. Any ordinance or parts of Ordinances in conflict, herewith, are hereby repealed.

PART III. EFFECTIVE DATE. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and hereby ordered to take immediate effect and to be in force from and after the earliest date allowed by law.

PART IV. ADOPTION. This Ordinance was adopted by the Township Board of the Township of Plymouth, Michigan this 28th day of November A.D. 1967.



oil boom town in the early 20's, the play tells the story of the Flood family and their difficulty in learning to live among "all kinds of people."



# A Space Age Plant Comes To Suburbia

## Fast-Growing Omni Spectra's Third Home Is In Farmington

The space age crept into Farmington without fanfare last June when the curiously named Omni Spectra Corp. opened a new manufacturing plant in which men talk seriously of how to communicate with "the man on the moon."

Just as important is how the astronauts who first land on earth's only God-given satellite will convey signals back to this planet.

It is the microwave components and instruments perfected and manufactured by Omni Spectra personnel which will help make this possible, just as they already have shared in the success of the Early Bird communication satellite, the Apollo and Surveyor spacecraft and other space probe devices.

Primarily, Omni Spectra serves the aerospace industry, and its customers run the full gamut of the microwave electronics field.

WHILE DAY-TO-DAY functions of its 200 employees appear no more spectacular than many technical manufacturing processes, the end use of their coaxial connectors, adapters, cable assemblies and other microwave parts carry a glamor born of mankind's never-ending probe of the unknown—in this case outer space.

The 33,000-square-foot plant of Omni Spectra, Inc., on Hallwood Ct., not far from I-96 and Halstead Rd., is the third the fledgling company has occupied since its birth in March 1962. It outgrew its first Detroit facility in 1965, moving then to Southfield, but soon that, too, was inadequate.

Now occupying an 11-acre site with room for expansion, Omni Spectra considers the Farmington plant one of permanency. The company also recently opened a research and development laboratory at Scottsdale, Ariz., where the purpose is to develop new Omni Spectra products, augmenting work being done here.

This trio added two co-founders who could bring to the company financial and manufacturing experience. Harold C. Ward and Rodney E. Christian, and because their roots all were in Michigan they saw no reason to set up shop elsewhere—nor do they now.

Bryant now is president of Omni Spectra and the others are vice presidents except for Christian, who no longer is with the organization. McHenry is in charge of sales, Cheal of engineering and Ward is secretary-treasurer. Walter E. Haines is vice president for manufacturing.

TOGETHER THEY HAVE BUILT a diversified engineering and production staff that brought together not only microwave engineers and technicians, but mechanical engineers and designers with production experience as well.

This wide range of skills has achieved well-balanced product designs compatible with both quantity production and good electrical performance.

The present plant is 10 times the size of their first on Puritan Ave., and this year's gross sales to the company's more than 400 customers will exceed \$4 million.

In addition to a sales network which blank-



The center was built to help practicing engineers and scientists keep up with developing theories and new engineering tools, materials, and processes.





### training sessions.

A microwave course for technicians, to be conducted by Schoolcraft College, is under study.

"This is a rapidly advancing technological field and to do our proper job all of us in Omni Spectra must stay abreast of every new development," says Dr. Bryant. "The training and seminar programs which we sponsor is our investment in the future."



## Broncos Will Miss Big Dale

KALAMAZOO.—Senior Dale Livingston of Plymouth has turned into one of the most exciting football players at Western Michigan University in a decade.

His punting and place-kicking have captured the imagination of the Bronco fans and have earned for him a rare honor among specialists--stardom.

AFTER BEING discovered in an intramural kicking contest, Livingston played in his first varsity game on Oct. 2, 1965 against Miami. He punted 33 yards on his first varsity kick but he started coming into his own in the next game.

Although Western lost 21-17 to Bowling Green, Livingston booted a 28-yard field goal in the first quarter, the first of his varsity career.

In the next game, his toe was a factor as his 42-yard field goal in the third quarter helped Western earn a 10-10 tie with Kent State. He won the next game when his 17-yard field goal with four seconds left defeated Toledo, 3-0. His

punting also was sharp with an average of nearly 43 yards on six kicks, including a 61-yard effort.

AGAINST MARSHALL, he set a Mid-American Conference and school record with three goals to help the Broncos to a 17-14 victory. His 45-yard effort in the second period set a school record and his 24-yard boot came with only 3:15 left to win the game. As a punter he averaged 50 yards on two kicks.

He booted a 38-yard field goal in the 17-6 victory over Ohio University and in the closing game of the season he kicked a 21-yarder to help the Broncos beat Montana, 17-14. He also had a 52-yard punt in the game.

HIS 1965 SHOWING was only a warmup for 1966. In the season opener against Lamar Tech, the chunky Bronco



booted a 30-yarder in the last 13 seconds to give W.M.U. a 16-14 victory. He also averaged 46 yards on six kicks, including efforts of 46, 42 and 58 yards. In the 31-14 triumph over Central Michigan, he had a 32-yard field goal and a 50-yard punt.

Livingston had another good punting day in the 26-7 loss to Miami, averaging 41.1 yards on six kicks, including boots of 53 and 65 yards.

The following week his toe was again the difference as his 23-yard field goal in the third quarter turned out to be the winning margin in the 16-14 victory over Bowling Green.

THE DATE Oct. 15, 1966 will always be remembered both by the Broncos and Livingston. In the first quarter against Kent State he unleashed an 86-yard punt, a league and school record, to get W.M.U. out of a

jam. He had a 51-yard punt in the second period just before kicking a 36-yard field goal with only 12 seconds left in the half. The field goal turned out to be the difference as the Broncos scored a 23-20 victory.

His toe was again the difference the following week in the 14-13 triumph over Toledo. He uncoiled a 77-yard punt in the third period and again provided the winning margin as his extra point with 1:33 left again turned out to be the difference.

In the 35-23 victory over Marshall the following week, he had punts of 48 and 47 yards and a 22-yard field goal. He averaged 41 yards on five kicks against Xavier, unleashing efforts of 45, and 44 yards while against West Texas State he had kicks of 52, 45 and 45 yards.

LIVINGSTON IS JUST as sharp as ever in 1967. When the Broncos scored a 24-14 opening game victory over Miami, the husky senior again was a factor. He set a school record of 48 yards with a third-period field goal and punted for a 44.5-yard average on seven kicks, getting away boomers of 49, 53, 52 and 52 yards.

You can always expect the unusual from Livingston and the Miami game was no exception when the Broncos booted shocked the crowd of 22,000 by carrying the ball the first time he has ever done so in his three-year varsity career.

The carry was set up on a fourth down and eight situation on the Broncos 32. Livingston went back to punt but surprised the crowd and head coach Bill Doellittle by keeping the ball and running around left end for a 19-yard gain and a first down. On the next play, the Broncos scored a touchdown.

"As it turned out I looked pretty good," said Livingston after his unexpected trip, "but if I hadn't have made it I guess I'd have looked pretty stupid."

# Tax Hike Can Curb Inflation

An increase in federal taxes is the best hope of keeping inflation within acceptable limits in 1968, a Princeton University economist suggested last week at the 15th annual conference on the Economic Outlook.

Speaking at the University of Michigan, Prof. Albert Rees said the prospects for 1968 are for further acceleration of wage increases, encouraged by further tightening of labor markets, additional increases in consumer prices, and rising corporate profits.

There is little prospect that this acceleration can be checked by repositioning of wage guidelines, he added.

WAGE SETTLEMENTS during 1967 have been appreciably larger than during the corresponding part of 1966, according to all statistical indicators, the Princeton economist said.

There has also been an apparent increase in union militance and willingness to strike, especially in the public sector, he noted.

The key wage settlement during 1967, Rees said, has been between Ford and the UAW, which provides large initial wage increases, moderated by change in the cost-of-living escalator clause.

Wage increases have been larger in 1967 than in 1966, despite the sluggishness of the economy early this year, because labor markets have remained quite tight and because of the delayed effects of the acceleration of the rise in the Consumer Price Index, which began in mid-1965, he explained.

"PERHAPS THE MOST important area of policy that will affect the behavior of wages is tax and expenditure policy," Rees said. "An increase in federal taxes or decrease in expenditures, or a combination of the two, would contribute to checking wage increases by a number of routes.

"It would limit the direct pressure of demand on labor markets, and it would act indirectly by limiting the rise in the Consumer Price Index and the rise in corporate profits. The prospects for substantial expenditure reduction in areas that are not of pressing social importance do not look very bright."
