Rail Crossing Problem To Become Worse

The railroad crossing problem that has plagued Plymouth for years and is charged with the strangulation of business area is going to get worse-much worsebefore it gets better.

This is the opinion expressed by Buford Nash, general manager of the C&O. who stated tersely:

"We are at our wits' end trying to figure ways and means to meet demands that are almost beyond realization because of increased production along our routes."

'We have been asked to prepare to double our service in some areas, including Plymouth," he stated, "and you have no idea what that will mean."

As an example, he cited the Ford Motor Company with plants in Wixom, Wayne, Plymouth, Livonia and Westland.

"Ford has let it be known that it is two months behind schedule because of the strike, and it is natural that production will

be stepped up for this model year.

"Aside from Ford Motor Co., we also have the other plants in the Plymouth area-Evans Products, Whitman-Barnes, Barnes-Bibson-Raymond, Burroughs plus the big Chevrolet plants in Livonia," he continued, "and they also will be demanding service. This means shuttling and shifting cars and all of this will affect the crossings.'

Within the next year there will be other plants in the Plymouth Industrial parks and the big Allied Products Co. will be in business in Livonia.

While all of this means increased business it also is almost frightening to contemplate, according to the railroad of-

This increased business is certain to make the rail crossings more hazardous and this, too, is admitted by the railroad

Within the past fortnight there have been two cases of motorists running into trains in the Plymouth area. In one of these Bob Willoughby, prominent Plymouth businessman, was badly injured.

"It is a rather peculiar thing," Nash explained, "but more people are running

into our trains than are being hit by them.

"For some reason, today the motorists are paying less attention to flashers and warnings than ever before. Even more of them are sneaking their way across the tracks when the gates are down. So, accidents are bound to happen in greater numbers when crossing traffic increases."

Many areas, including Plymouth, have been studying plans to eliminate the crossing with overpasses and underpasses. These are proving to be too costly with funds now available.

It has been estimated that an overpass on Main Street would cost \$1 million.

"I think the entire bill is not only unnecessary, but unconstitutional", he said, "and while I am too old to canvass the city myself, I am opposed to the ordinance."

In order to have the issue placed on the ballot it will be necessary to obtain 520 signatures -- which is 15 per cent of the vote cast for the governor of the state of Michigan in the last state election.

"This should not be too difficult," Deyo explained. "Some time ago, for an activity at Kellogg Park, more than 800 signatures were obtained in several days."

Among those who insisted from the start that the open

housing matter should be placed on the ballot were City Commissioners Arch Vallier and George Hudson.

"The people should have a say in this matter," Commissioner Vallier pointed out at each meeting, but he was outvoted 4 to 3, in the final show-

If a sufficient number of signatures are obtained they must be filed with the City Clerk and certified. Then, the way will be cleared to have the people vote on the bill at the spring election.

In order that there will be no mistaking his opposition to the open housing bill now before the state legislature, Rep. James Tierney (D-Garden City) who represents the Plymouth area, stated his position again on Monday before leaving for the capital where formal action is expected shortly.





Educator May Seek Dem Post

A Garden City school official seeking the state chairmanship of the Democratic Party, got his campaign off to a limping start this week.

Floyd Mattheeussen, 37, asstant to the superintendent Garden City schools, said he would seek the job being wacated by Zolton Ferency.

Open Housing Up For Vote In Legislature

The state legislature reconvened Tuesday to consider two major items of legislation; the open housing bill and lower court reorganization.

The open housing bill, now in revised form, is causing intense interest both in Michigan and throughout the country. Observers report that chances for passage of the open housing bill are about even.

The bill would prohibit discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion or national origin in the sale or rental of living quarters. The original bill has been tied up in committee ever since its introduction at the opening of the special legislative session.

The compromise measures includes two major changes-1. The power to set fines and damages against violators would be placed entirely in the courts, rather than with the Michigan Civil Rights Commission; 2. The exemption originally written into the bill covering religious institutions has been eliminated.

Backers of the bill argue that it is a moral necessity and that it would advance integration that would lessen the danger of racial tensions and the riots they produce. Opponents contend that the measure would violate constitutional rights to

sell property, that it would reduce property values, and would lead to crime in the streets.

Legislative leaders, including House Speaker Robert E.

Waldron (R-Grosse Pointe) and Senate Majority Leader Emil Lockwood (R-St. Louis) predict that the bill, which has the backing of numerous business and labor groups, will pass.

The lower court reorganization bill, which is intended to carry out provisions in the 1903 Michigan Constitution, would replace the justices of the peace system with a special series of lower courts. Passage of the measure is said to be doubtful at this juncture.

A DETROIT GROCER, Albert Olshansky, who ran stores in some of the city's toughest neighborhoods, died Sunday morning. He had been shot through the head by a young Negro, who tried to hold up Olshansky's store, Albert's Food Market, at 12002 Martindale.

The bandit threw the grocer to the floor during the hold up, pulled a pistol, and when Olshansky tried to get up, shot him in the head.

STERLING TOWNSHIP voters rejected Saturday a bid to make their community into a city.

Half of the Township's 13,000 registered voters turned out to vote in a special election on a charter which would have created Sterling Heights, supposedly the state's second largest city in land area. The charter was defeated by around 900

Sterling Township's boundaries are M-59 on the north, Hayes Road on the east, Fourteen Mile Road on the south, and Dequindre Road on the west. The proposed city's would have been the same.

MICHIGAN AFL-CIO president August Scholle, 63, was hospitalized over the weekend with an ulcer condition.

Doctors said that his condition was good, although the longtime state Democratic power faces surgery to correct the bleeding vicer which cropped up while Scholle was attending the national AFL-CIO convention in Miami.

MICHIGAN SCHOOL administrators who have been lobbying in Lansing to get more than \$100 million increase in appropriations next year to meet their needs have been given a cold

shoulder by state legislators on the Appropriations Committees. The annual battle over state aid to schools started last week with a long session between school officials and legislators. The schoolmen were told they would have to document

their requests for money in much greater detail than in the past. The \$100 million estimate was submitted by Nick A. Ianni, chairman of a special committee representing the Michigan Association of School Administrators and the Association of Intermediate School Administrators.

DETROIT -- Prominent Detroit industrialist Ernest C. Kanzler died in Ford Hospital. He was 75. Kanzler was vice president of Ford Motor Co. during the 1920's and from 1928-57 was president and chairman of the board of the Universal CIT Credit Corp. and a director of Bendix Corp and the Detroit Lions. He was at one time chairman of the Metropolitan Detroit Building Fund and headed the Wayne County Republican Finance Committee. His Michigan home was in Grosse Pointe Farms.

Rescind Earlier Hike In Tuition

Students, residing within the boundaries of the five-communities that comprise Schoolcraft College, will have a chance to celebrate Christmas a bit earliar than most this year as a result of a stunning, surprise action by the Board of Trustees reducing the tuition fees for residents by \$1 per hour.

It was only a matter of slightly more than three months ago that the Trustees approved a resolution raising the tuition fees for resident students by \$1 per hour and those for nonresidents by \$1.50 per hour.

Inasmuch as classes had started when the action was taken in mid-September, the increases weren't to take effect until the start of the winter semester. Matter of fact many students already have enrolled for the second semester and have paid their fees.

The action came as a bombshell shortly before adjournment of the bi-monthly meeting last Wednesday.

Kenneth Lindner, vice president in charge of Business Affairs, had just completed an hour-long presentation, including numerous slides, on the trials and tribulations involved in drawing up the budget before it finally goes to the Trustees for approval and discus-

It was a very interpretative program and Lindner appeared to have made a deep impression on the Trustees.

Chairman Harold Fischer thanked him for the program and indicated it would help the Board in planning for the budget next summer.

THEN VICE CHAIRMAN Mrs. Jane Moehle, of Plymouth, who was a bitter opponent of the increase in tuition fees for resident students, dropped her bomb with a motion that the Trustees rescind the September action and drop the \$1 per hour increase immediately.

The motion received immediate support from Secretary Paul Mutnick, of Clarenceville, who also was an avowed opponent of the resident student fee hike, and was open for discussion of the stunned Trustees.

Fischer called for a vote on the resolution and it passed by a 5 to 2 margin with Clark Oldenberg, of Garden City, ab-

THE "YES" VOTES were cast by Mrs. Moehle, Mutnick, James Boswell and Dr. George Martin, of Livonia, and William Secord of Northville. The "Nays" were from Fischer and Sam Hudson of Plymouth.







Pour into an 8-inch springform pan lined with graham cracker crust; sprinkle crumbs on top. Let set 6 to 12 hours; serve. To vary, pan may be lined with slices of angel or sponge cake rather than graham cracker crust. Yield: 12 servings.

1 1/2 T. unflavored gelatin

1/4 c. cold water 1/2 c. scalded milk

1/2 c. sugar

1/2 t. vanilla 1/8 t. salt .

2 c. whipping cream

12 marshmallows 1/2 c. candied green and red cherries or mixed candied

fruits 1/2 c. broken nutmeats

Soak gelatin in cold water for 5 minutes, Add scalded milk; stir until dissolved, Add sugar, vanilla and salt; stir well. Set in cool place until mixture begins to thicken. Fold in whipped cream, diced marshmallows, cherries and nutmeats. Pour into mold rinsed in cold water; chill for several hours, Yield: 4-6 servings.

1 lb. shredded coconut 1 lb. chopped dates

2 c. pecans 1/2 c, candied cherries

1/2 c. candied pineapple 2 cans sweetened condensed





Romneyites Set For Challenge From Durant

Gov. Romney's militants in the silk stocking 14th district of the Grosse Pointes are recruiting troops to fight off a Dick Durant conservative rebellion at the Republican National Convention. Durant, the conservative pillar of the Grosse

Pointes, figures as a delegate against Romney for the nomination.

The pro-Romney group believes a Durant extravaganza against their tiger on the convention floor would be damaging nationally.

ITS FOUNDERS ARE Arthur Sherman, Jr., chairman, Byron Bischoff, vice chairman and Walter Koppy, secretary. Koppy claims the group has 200 members and connections with the official Romney Associates.

"I personally have been in touch with everyone concerned, the Romney Volunteers and Romney Associates," he said. "We have letters from Travis Cross and others of the official staff.

"And we have letters from Gov. Nelson Rockefeller and Gov. John Chafee, the only two Republican governors actively supporting

"We are recognized by the official Romney groups, though Romney himself has not encouraged us. But he knows what we're doing. We're not fully organized yet to promote the governor's national campaign.

Koppy said the group is volunteer, receiving small contributions. The largest was \$50 from a lawyer who bought a supply of "Romney in '68" lapel pins.

He said he and others in the group would like to play a role in the New Hampshire and other preferential primaries.

"I feel there has been little done to promote the governor nationally, or even here in Michi-Koppy said. "This is his home base."

NOW, HE SAID, it looks like Durant will go to the national convention with an anti-Romney voice from his home state. The Grosse Pointe group wants to take the sting out of Durant's words with a pro-Romney voice of their own. So far, Koppy said, the group has spent about

\$2,000 on bumper stickers, lapel pins and other campaign items. Koppy said there are 300 to 400 Romney

volunteers clubs around the nation and several in Michigan, including the Highland Park Romney Volunteers. Koppy said his group is recruiting every-

where, from other states, from around the state and from the suburbs. He said volunteers can contact the organization by writing to Byron Bischoff, 5250 Kensing-

ton, Detroit. Another political name is vice chairman of the group. She is Doris Ann Brucker, daughter-in-

law of former Gov. Wilbur M. Brucker.

"We should be mobilizing now," he said.



Industrial Pollution Cited

In one rainy 24-hour period last year, the state Water Resources Commission made three types of studies of the water degradation by industry along the Middle Rouge River.

The results prompted the WRC to cite industrial waste discharge, along with storm water overflows, as the two major causes of spoilage of the Rouge as a fishing, boating, scenic and ice skating spot.

Four firms were the subjects of 24-hour, intensive studies on Sept. 20-21, 1966. The firms and the WRC's findings are: HALLER Division, Federal

Mogul Corp., on Northville Rd., Northville Township--"An oil film was observed on the water surface from this discharge, and oil deposits were evident along the banks of the outfall

The WRC stops there, without detailing any action by itself or the plant.

Just when such a hearing will be held wasn't revealed in the WRC report, a 59-page, sometimes technical pamphlet sent to the Observer Newspapers this week.

THE 31-MILE Middle Rouge begins in the Walled Lake region of Novi Township, flows south through Northville and Plymouth, and then turns east through southern Livonia, Westland and Garden City and joins the main branch in Dearborn Heights, 12 miles above the Detroit River.

Much of the land along the river was acquired by the Wayne County Road Commission during the 1930s for parks and flood retention.

The WRC report cites five sources of the river's worsening water situation and gives rundowns on what is being done about it.

1. EROSION

Subdivision development in Oakland County is blamed as the source of water running off bare soil. The eroded soil makes the river both turbid and discolored.

The cause is "careless construction practices by subdividers." The suggested solution is "incentives, either positive or negative, that would encourage contractors to be more careful in such matters as stripping the cover off large tracts of land, sodding steep slopes, etc.

3. SEWER DIVERSIONS

The big interceptor sewers in the lower part of the Middle Rouge basin carry both sanitary wastes and storm runoff water.

These combination sewers have "diversion gates which open when flow reaches a predetermined volume. This occurs during moderately heavy rainfall. . . A combination of storm water and raw sewage is allowed to be diverted to the Middle Rouge."

The WRC mentions two of these 17 diversion gates which have sent their water into the river: A ditch west of Hammill and Schoolcraft roads, in Plymouth Township; and a ditch at Merriman Rd. in Garden

Since the study, more than half the overflow problem has been stopped, says the WRC. It quotes the Wayne County Road Commission as saying the heights of dykes in the diversions have been increased in order to make certain more of the waste water goes into the Detroit sewage treatment plant. i

The City of Livonia is credited with constructing separate sewer systems in new areas, which "will reduce the amount of sanitary wastes being discharged to the river."

4. INDUSTRIES

Although the WRC report isn't accusatorial in tone, it does name names, pointing out that its data were obtained from flow measurements and waste samples on Sept. 20-21, 1966.

paid for food by consumers have risen more than 40% in the last 20 years, the prices farmers receive for their products are 2% lower than they were in 1947. According to recent studies conducted by the House Agriculture Committee, the farmer now receives only 38 cents out of every food

THE FARMER'S economic problems are not all natural. Some are government created by an administration which appears to be systematically discriminating against the farmer by erring in estimates of supplies and other maneuvers. Only a few months ago farmers were told by the government that surpluses are mounting and that production must be cut back. Along with that comes another sag in prices received on the

One recent encouraging sign was Senate passage of the "Agriculture Producer Marketing Act of 1967" which is similar to a bill I introduced in the House. This legislation will allow farmers to join together in voluntary agricultural marketing programs and to bargain together for fair prices on their products. Collective bargaining has long been an accepted procedure in other aspects of the economy, and early House consideration of this bill would lead to equal rights in this area for the farmer.

I am also concerned about the great number of people leaving farms throughout the nation. One hundred twenty-two thousand farms went out of business in 1966 and the Department of Agriculture predicts that 82,000 farms will go out of business during 1967. More than four million people have left the farm since 1960. This not only causes hardship and difficulty in the rural areas of our nation, but complicates the already complex problems of our overcrowded cities by pouring more and more population into their faltering econ-

The long range solution to this problem might be the attraction of small industry into rural areas to provide jobs and employment opportunities without requiring long-distance moves to the major cities. I have introduced legislation to establish a Commission on Balanced Economic Development to explore this subject in great detail and determine what steps can be taken to encourage greater disbursement of population and job opportunities.

Farm Crest Farms Due To Pass On

The Farm Crest Farms, long a stopping place for those interested in dairy products, will become a thing of the past in Northville Township if the Township Planning Commission approves a request for rezoning the property for development of single family homes, apartments, a shopping center and an office-business center.

The Farms, located on Six Mile Road in Northville Township, on the north side at Bradner Road, has been limping along for the past three years after a disastrous fire that destroyed the dairy unit barns and left only the retail store standing.

Since that time there has been conjecture that the acreage would be turned into a large real estate development. The rumors became fact a week ago when the Thompson-Brown Company presented preliminary plans.

The plans call for a total of 568 dwellings including 91 single family units, 91 residentmultiple units, 386 apartment units and a total of 20 acres for professional office and commercial buildings.

"In George Romney, the American people have a great leader; a man of destiny; a man who will restore the confidence of the people in themselves through a resurgence of the people's confidence in their government and in the principles upon which their government was founded."

Really! The rank and file of the GOP are too intelligent to swallow that type of rhotoric

swallow that type of rhetoric. So are the voters.

EVER SINCE Kennedy the country and the politicians have been talking about "style" in government. JFK had the style and he never talked about it.

Exclusive of style or lack of it, Romney reminds one of a modern Don Quixote. He gets our sympathy, but not our support.

Republicans have come back from the ideological blahs to the point they're ready to legitimately challenge Democrats nationally and restore past glories in Michigan.

It is a sort of political flu that afflicts the overconfident and the dreamers who think they can do it themselves . . . Without little people like

you and me who go to the polls on election day.

Republicans learned after the Goldwater debacle that the major purpose of a political party is to win elections, and it is the duty of those they elect to indulge in philosophy.

It is a lesson Michigan Democrats are re-learning in agonizing steps. The fellows back in PHC Corner in 1958 preached at Gov. Williams he couldn't be touched, that re-election would be unani-

There was the governor on election night thanking his slate for "pulling me in with them."

GOV. ROMNEY'S first campaign for governor was outside the party. In some outstate towns there were separate headquarters-Romney headquarters and Republican headquarters.

There is the recollection of a series of conversations with former State Senator Edward Hutchinson, now in Congress from the Chicago Tribune Belt of southwestern Michigan. The theme:

"Republicans out of office are cannibalistic; they destroy anyone with a yen for the executive office. So, the next Republican governor has to be bigger in public acclaim than his party.

"Before you can afford to be a statesman, you've got to be a politician. Then, after you're governor, you can indulge in philosophy."

THE REPUBLICANS, of course, were taken over by Romney after his 1962 win. He IS the party in Michigan and, should lightning strike for him nationally in 1968, the whoosh of a collapsing balloon will be heard as far north as Lake Superior.

He will leave behind him a very good man, Lt. Gov. William

G. Milliken whose political future may be stunted by years in the shadow. Aside from him, Republican choices other than Romney are zero.

Democrats, out of office since Romney came on the scene as governor Jan. 1, 1963, are beset with internal problems, some of them philosophical.

They need a new state chair-man now that Zolton Ferency has quit, and the only name in sight is Sander Levin. He maybe won't win every election, but nobody will sleep much until he does.

Nationally, Republicans are coming back under the chairmanship of Ray Bliss, who would trade the philosophers for one doorbell puncher any day of the week.

And give change, and maybe green stamps.

And nationally, the seers say this Republican development is a contribution to a continuing twoparty system, a resurgence of the warp and woof of the political

In Michigan, the Democrats have got to come back, too, sublimating if possible the internal issues and winning elections again. Politics, it is said, is a game of cat and mouse.

An Executive Wonders About The 'Bad Image' Of Business

"I CAN MAKE THE

TRIP IN HALF THE TIME BECAUSE

With sponges in hand, let us shed copious tears for the plight of American business, as outlined by O.N. Miller, chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Standard Oil of Cali-

It's not that business isn't making profit, or that business isn't being socially responsible. Brother Miller argues, rather, that "the image of business held by a considerable segment of the public does not flatter the genuine article.'

In the November issue of Michigan Business Review, published by the University of Michigan Graduate School of Business Administration, Miller laments:

"Professionals - people earning \$10,000 a year or more — are at the forefront of criticism of business. These affluent peoplegovernment executives, educators, doctors, clergymen, social workers and others — . . . view private enterprise with unreasoning suspicion."

He is disturbed about a Harvard University study which showed that "88 per cent of all college students would decline to go into business as a career. Business 'stifles initiative,' these young men and women told the poll takers."

Miller figures business ought to be able to show itself in a more favorable light because "American business has developed its advertising and public relations methods into high arts."

It would be sad to contemplate a nation without private enterprise, agreed. But as for business being unfairly given a bad "image," I must demur. Business has a bad "image" precisely because it is generally poor - not good - at public relations.

WHAT THE PUBLIC knows about business comes from two main sources - advertising and

PLASTIC TOYS ARE SO LIGHT ...

Let us pass over ordinary commercial advertising since it is aimed at selling products rather than selling the public on the nobility of businessmen.

Let us begin instead with the kind of ads that young peoplethe kind Mr. Miller is talking about in the Harvard study often read, namely, the help wanted ads. Let us see what kinds of opportunity for initiative and creativity are offered in these ads, which are among the better offers in one day's paper:

"Controller to \$17,000. Accounting degree. C.P.A. experience helpful . . .

"Are you looking for a better opportunity? If so, come in and talk to us at --- Realty. We have increased our sales staff . . ." "Credit specialist, \$575. For

major appliance manufacturer. Degree or wholesale credit experience . . "Inside order desk sales, \$600

Junior cost clerk, future, \$600 . . . Junior general bookkeeping clerk, to \$600 . . . food sales rep., \$600-plus . . . pharmaceutical sales trainee, \$650plus . . ." "Paint chemist . . ."

That is a fair sampling of some of the better offers. Anyone see any room for creativity?

If the ads are truthful, then business either "stifles creativity," at worst, or doesn't want to hire it in the first place, at best. Maybe this is why so many apparently normal kids are trying to join the Peace Corps or hippie colonies.

IN A NEWSPAPER office, you receive hundreds of news handouts a week from business and government.

Those that are best prepared, most laden with information, most nearly like newspaper style and truest sounding are those submitted by government agencies, politicians or colleges.

Those that are most blatantly self-serving, most poorly written and phoniest come from business. Not all business P.R. is bad, but a lot of it is.

There are reasons. First, business doesn't al-

ways hire good P.R. people. Businesses tend to pick up persons either with no news gathering experience, or the less competent people who had gone no place in journalism and weren't likely to. The politicians had a greater tendency to hire top-notch reporters.

Second, once they've hired P.R. men, politicians will have the sense to respect their judgment and let them use it. The ordinary

business P.R. release, however, has been edited and re-editedyou can tell it a mile away-by a horde of executives who have no idea what a good news story is.

The businessman wants a news story written to sound like advertising, and he wants a lot of personal "puff" in his releases. He doesn't listen when the P.R. man tries to tell him the stuff won't be printed or, if printed, won't be

IF YOU COVER a strike for a newspaper - and this observer has covered an uncounted number - you quickly discover that a third to half of businessmen are real dopes in the P.R. game. That's not a majority, but it's a frightening minority.

Typical case: A picket line appears in front of a plant employing 600 people. Call the union. The union says its contract ended at midnight, it has been negotiating umpteen days, it has 500 members in the plant, and they want such-and-such benefits.

Call the plant manager. His secretary says he's in conference. Leave a message for the manager to call you. He doesn't call. Call him back. His secretary says he's in conference and she isn't sure he'll want to make a statement. Tell her his plant is one of the

biggest in town, it's closed down, the union has told its side, and you're sure the manager won't be foolish enough not to give his fellow townspeople a reasonable explanation of the situation.

But you're wrong. The plant manager IS foolish. He won't make himself available to a reporter. So you go to press telling the union's side of the story and adding: "The plant manager could not be reached for comment." That's more than bad P.R.

That's a lack of courtesy. And that's business. -Tim Richard

WALKING THROUGH the stores, I was struck by the enormous number of teen agers.

A lot of the kids were shopping in couples. The boys generally wore blue jeans and nylon ski jackets, but they had the same tolerant and half interested air that older men wear when they are being taken around shopping by their wives.

The girls had wonderful long hair, mostly blond. I like long hair, and the girls looked great. I thought of Christmas angels for a while, and then decided that wasn't entirely accurate.

JUDGING FROM the crowds in the stores, there's nothing wrong with the economy. Despite the Ford strike and the Detroit newspaper shut-down, people were out shopping with plenty of money to spend.

The retailers report that sales this year are up around seven per cent over last year, and some say that they're doing even better.

They also say people are buying more expensive, higher quality stuff than in the past. They seem mildly surprised at this, as if they didn't know that Observerland is a darn high income area.

You bet it is. And people out here have too much good taste to put up for long with the incredible amounts of plastic garbage you see being palmed off on the public as the real stuff.

Christmas, in one sense, is the plastic season.

IT'S ALSO THE buying season. I don't want to sound the usual prudish call about let's get away from the commercial aspect of Christmas and get back to the higher things. After all, people will make what they want to out of the season, and all the high minded exhortations aren't going to do much good if people don't accept them.

But somehow I was reminded of the old spoof on the Christmas carol that goes, "Hark the Herald Tribune sings, advertising glorious things."

Saw a game in one of the shopping centers, called "Acquire." It seemed to fit part of the Christmas season, although the point crossed my mind that it might better have been called "Avarice."

BUT THERE'S MORE to this season than just buying. Children, mainly.

It was in a store in Plymouth. General goods, like a dime store. Not fancy, but nicely decorated.

And there was this man. Tall; thin; about 25 or 26. He was carrying his son in his arms in that way nervous and proud young fathers all carry their babies. He was standing under the arch

of glittering tinsel, all gold and silver and green.

And his son was looking. Craning his head from side to side, as his father held him up to get a good look.

The baby's mouth was open in wonder and joy, and his eyes were as big as the whole world.







HOLLY-

THE CHRISTMAS GREEN Holly is the traditional green of Christmas. Its origin goes back many centuries and it is said that the spiney green leaves, with their bright red berries, represent the crown of thorns Christ wore on the cross. Food Costs Rising 2-3 Per Cent

Consumers can look forward to a 2 to 3 per cent increase in retail food prices during

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's national food situation report indicates that while the demand for food is expected to dontinue upward, supplies are not expected to increase. And continued increases in nonfood prices are expected to cause raised marketing costs that ultimately will be reflected in etail food prices.

In 1967 consumers spent 4 per cent more for food than they spent in the previous year, while their disposable income increased 7 per cent.

As a result, the percentage of income spent for food declinto about 17.7 per cent from the 1966 figure of 18.3 per cent.

RETAIL FOOD prices in 1967 averaged about 1 per cent above those of 1966. Prices averaged lower for eggs, poultry and pork but higher for dairy products and fish. Lower prices for processed citrus fruits, cofsee, and fats and oils were more than offset by higher prices for potatoes, fresh Aruits, sugar and sweets, and cereal and bakery products.

Restaurant food prices this year averaged about 5 per cent more than 1966.

Food expenditures for 1967 will probably total about 96 1/2 billion -- 3 1/2 billion more than the previous year. Most of the gain is due to an increase in volume of purchases. The per capita food consumption increased about 1 1/2 per cent or 12 pounds more than 1966, but little change is predicted for 1968.

PART OF 1967's increased food consumption resulted from an increase in the donation programs. USDA direct food distribution programs alone accounted for about 1 pound of the 12-pound consumption in-

Although milk production totaled about the same as a year earlier, consumption of fluid milk and most other dairy prodacts was lower than in 1966. Per capita consumption of all fruits in 1967 was well above that in each of the previous four years. The increase was primarily caused by the large citrus crop last winter.

Holiday Plants Need Plenty Of Loving Care

gift plants can bring pleasure not too dry. for months after the holiday season ends.

Since most pot plants are greenhouse--grown under almost ideal conditions, moving them to the flower shop and then dry. into the home may have an adverse effect on them.

G.M. Fosler, University of Illinois ornamental horticulturist, suggests that you make growing conditions as much like those in the greenhouse as possible, especially if you plan to rebloom the plants.

HOUSE TEMPERATURES affect the length of time a flowering plant will remain attractive. Poinsettias are especially sensitive. Drafts, too cool or warm temperatures, sudden temperature changes, dry atmosphere, improper watering, dim light -- all are conditions that can cause loss of leaves and withering of bracts, which are the showy colored structures we call flowers. The flowers are the yellow parts tucked down in the center of each whorl of bracts.

Some of the newer poinsettia varieties retain their leaves and bracts remarkably well and may remain attractive for several months.





Answer Queries About Fair Housing Proposals

ordinances have been adopted in several Michigan cities and after the State Legislature reconvenes, the Lansing body will attack a proposed State Fair Housing Law.

In light of the enormous concern that has been expressed by Michigan residents during lieve pressure on specific the last few months over such legislation, a group has formed to study the matter and called itself the Fair Housing Coordinating Committee.

Among the major groups represented on the Fair Housing Coordinating Committee are the Michigan Council of Churches, Michigan State AFL-CIO, Michigan Catholic Conference and Michigan Chamber of Com-

The committee has contended that there is a great deal of misinformation about the nature and effects of fair housing ierislation.

Thus, it concentrated its efforts on compiling results of studies made in cities and states where fair housing laws have been in effect for some time.

THE FINDINGS of this intensive survey have been used to answer frequently voiced misconceptions and questions about fair housing legislation. A sampling of those questions

and answers compiled by the _committee follows. 4 - Is there really any need for this kind of legislation?

A - Nearly 1 million citizens of Michigan suffer the humiliation and frustration of knowing that their housing choice is extremely limited - not by their ability to pay, but because they were born with cark skins, In housing, discrimination is the rule rather than the exception.

The few Negroes who have acquired housing on an unrestricted basis have often had to use extraordinary means. The ordinary channels through which the average citizen seeks and acquires housing are closed to non-whites.

Q - Isn't fair housing forced housing?

A - No. Nobody can force you to sell or rent your property against your will. The only requirement of open housing laws is that persons who decide to sell or rent and who publicly offer housing for sale or rent must deal with those who respond without regards to the prospective buyer's religious affiliation, nationality, or the color of his skin.

Q - Suppose a prospective buyer or tenant is engaged in a disreputable occupation. Or suppose I know he wants to turn my single-family home into a rooming house. Or suppose he simply can't afford my asking price. Must I sell or rent to someone like that?

A - No. You may reject any prospective buyer or tenant for these and many other reasons, but not for religion, race, color or national orgin,

Q - But what about my rights? Shouldn't I have the right to dispose of my property in any way I see fit?

A - Yes; within limits. Property rights are not an absolute. Zoning laws restrict the uses to which you can put your property.

Building, health and safety codes require that you construct and maintain your property in accordance with legal standards. A fair housing law would affect your property only after you make known your intention to cease to own or occupy it.

Q - What about my neighbors? If I sold my house to Negroes the neighborhood would change and my neighbor's property values would go down.

A - First, property values are not related to race, but to supply and demand, Values decline, for example, if there is a sudden increase in the number of houses for sale in a given area, because greater supply usually means lower prices.

This could happen if your neighbors were to panic and leave the neighborhood all at once, property values are much more likely to increase in the long run than decline in integrated neighborhoods. A fair housing law prohibiting "block busting" tactics by real estate agents who promote panic selling would help stabilize

property values. Secondly, fair housing legislation does not lead to mass movements of minority groups

(The following was written by Farmington High School student Michael Cohen as an explanation of the Jewish holiday of Chanukah, which begins this year on Dec. 26.)

During the last week of this month, the Jewish people throughout the world will celebrate the festival of Chanukah (pronounced ha-noo-ka),

Chanukah is the Jewish Festival of Lights. It commemorates the reconstruction of the Temple after it had been destroyed by Syrian oppressors in the year 165 B.C.E. Upon recapturing the Temple, the Jewish people, led by Judah Maccabees, rebuilt and cleansed the Temple and made it ready for services to worship.

The word Chanukah, often spelled Hanukah in modern day, means dedication. The holiday is called the 'Feast of Lights" because the Chanukah candles are lit for each of the eight days the holiday is celebrated.

The candles are in commemoration of the miracle which occurred when the Maccabees rededicated the Temple for use.

THE STORY goes as follows: After cleansing the Temple and removing all of the idolatrous objects that had been left by the Syrians, one unpolluted cruse of oil was found. By all standards in the days, only enough oil was left to turn for one day. Yet, a miracle happened. The small cruse of oil burned for eight days. This miracle symbolizes the survival of the Jewish people and

Judaism throughout the ages. Chanukah is observed on the 25th day of the Jewish month of Kisley. This month corresponds with the month of December. The first candle is lit on the evening before the 25th day of Kislev. One candle is added each night until eight candles are burning. The candles are lit at sundown each night.

THE KINDLING of the candles is the most significant phase of the holiday and is observed with the greatest solemnity. The entire family is present when the candles are lit. The candles are in a special candle holder called a Menorah.

A Shamash candle is litfirst. This candle is the one which is used to light the others, and is lit first each night. The Shamash candle holds a center hold above the other eight. The candles are lit from right to left. This is because the Hebrew language is read from the right to the left.

AS THE CANDLES are lit. several short blessings are recited in Hebrew. The main blessing is translated into English: "Blessed art Thou, O Lord our God, King of the Uni-





U.S. Uses A-Blast For Major Industrial Test

States conducted Sunday its first underground nuclear test for purely industrial purposes.

The blast, equalling 26,000 tons of TNT, was set off deep beneath the ground in New Mexico in an effort to free natural gas believed trapped in rock formations.

The energy from the thermonuclear explosion was expected to vaporize and fracture the rock formations, forming a large underground gas reservoir. Iff successful, the technique could be used to recover oil, copper and other minerals in the U.S. and abroad.

The test marked the first joint experiment undertaken by government and industry to use nuclear technology for economic development. The U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, the Department of the Interior and the El Paso Natural Gas Co. sponsored the \$4.7 million pro-







Lewis Cass, candidate (Democratic party) for president in 1848, ran against Zachary Taylor, "Ol' Rough and Ready," a Whig and probably the best

War (1846-48). William Henry Harrison, "Ol' Tippe-canoe," was the Whig candidate for president in 1840 against Martin Van Buren, a Jackson Deniocrat. Harrison won but died of pneumonia in 1841 (on April 4 to be exact, one month to the

day after his inauguration). When Cass ran, the Democratic Party lost because it was split between the regular candidate, Cass, and Martin Van Buren, who ran on the Free Soil Party ticket. The most unusual thing about Taylor's victory was that he ran on no issues and let his personal charisma win for him:

cerned about individuals and their need to recognize who they are and what society is doing to their lives.

GOING

Man with all his ability to create, to think big, is actually growing smaller as automation and technology constantly dwarf his puny actions. Not only is man becoming smaller in his thinking, but his rapacious actions on his fellow man are becoming more violent and callous. Regard for others' feelings is a lost art, Kick, scratch, claw your way to a better monetary position in life. Who you kick or injure in the process is immaterial.

Mr. Terkel's stringent summation of our sick society cuts deep and gives you an uncomfortable moment or two as he penetrates the veneer all of us wear to exist in this barbinfested world.

And yet 'This Amazing Grace" is flecked (as is life) brightly with shafts humorous-wild and funny, at times. Victor Buono takes to these moments marvelously. His bulky hugeness vanishes quickly as he sails through air gracefully to be the loony Mordicai Brown, a pack of dogs, a sly general. Infectious humor pervades all of this amazingly provocative play to give it added warmth and beauty.

The duality of the entire dramatic situation is what really fascinates and puts Terkel in the ranks of Harold Pinter and Edward Albee. Even though the story on the surface may be about an elderly woman with two sons, one huge (Vic tips the scales at 350), the other, good-looking and fairly glows as the all-American clean-cut boy. The other story is as basic as Adam and Eve.

SINCE THE play takes place on Easter Sunday, the symbolism rings loud and clear. The rejected son is the Christ figure. Charley, his beautiful brother is the betrayer, the Judas offering instead of the 30 pieces of silver, a more inflated \$300.

Formal religion takes a verbal beating at first hearing. As you begin to understand what Terkel is really saying, you discover his deeper, more spiritual message.

Turkel would have us return to the grandeur of man, infinite wonder of man's bigness, his ability to rise up and face nature's destrictive forces.



Changes In Open Housing Explained

"What we've done is simple. We have beefed up protection for the respondent in discrimination complaints without reducing the scope of the commission's authority, without deleting the teeth."

That was Michigan House Speaker Robert E. Waldron's comment on recommendations of a bipartisan group of leaders to revise the open housing bill to strenghthen property owner's rights.

The committee report and recommendations were submitted to Gov. George Romney last week. He had dispatched the group to revise the bill, now pending in the House of Representatives.

Wipe out "blockbusting" by forbidding real estate representatives from using scare techniques about the changing racial composition of neighbor-

Prohibit 'testers' from the Civil Rights Commission (CRC) from filing bias complaints. assess fees and costs against

Require those who complain of discrimination to file a formal complaint within 90 days instead of one year.

Conspicuously absent from the revised version is a provision sought by many to allow homeowners to sell property themselves and to discriminate in doing so if they wish. An attempt to tack on the 'lawn sign" amendment failed in the committee Tuesday.

The bill still allows a homeowner to sell to whomever he wishes on a private basis.

Other changes approved included provisions to exclude those who wish to rent or sub-Among the committee's rec- let for no more than a year, ommendations were those to: such as professors going on sabbatical leave; to exclude owners of duplexes if they do not publicly advertise the property, and to eliminate payment of damages by the state to a person against whom an injunction was issued if the matter was later dropped.

Nature Begins Yule Preparations Dec. 22

ANN ARBOR -- Nature be- of the whole year." gins her Christmas preparations on Dec. 22, the first day of winter, according to University of Michigan astronomer Hazel M. Losh.

Winter will arrive officially at 8:17 a.m. that Friday, the shortest day of the year. There will be only about nine hours of sunlight.

Prof. Losh explained that the earth is actually closer to the sun now than during summer. but the seasons are determined by the degree of tilt toward or away from the sun.

*THE DATE of Christmas is believed to bear some real relation to the sun and the winter solstice, since this Christian celebration is thought to have been set to agree with the earlier pagan festival attendant upon the rejoicing in the turning northward of the sun at the winter solstice, and the promise of the return from the cold bleak temperatures to warmer weather," she said.

"For Christmas decorations, the eastern sky will be ablaze and host to some of the striking and colorful constellations

Among the stellar displays will be the constellation Auriga, the large five-sided figure highlighted by a bright yellow star. Capella. This constellation will appear to rise in the northeast around sunset. The Pleiades, followed by

the rest of Taurus (the bull), will appear to rise at about the same time as Capella.

FOLLOWING THE asension of Capella, "mighty Orion, with his splendid array of bright stars, will appear on the horizon."

Gemini, the heavenly twins, will appear in the northeast. Sirius, the "dog-star," is the brightest in the heavens and will rise in the early evenings around Christmas time. "This brightest star has been watched, admired, and revered from time immemorial," Dr. Losh said. "It was the Star of the East pointed to by 'Three Wise Men' of Orion.

"Turning to the other direction, the Northern Cross (Cygnus) in the west may be seen to splendid advantage on Christmas Eve."

> The Episcopal proposal, however, does not go quite so far in its use of contemporary English as the English translation of the Catholic mass now in use in the United States and other English-speaking nations.

> AFTER LONG discussion, the authors of the Episcopal liturgy note in their explanation of the service, they decided to retain "Thou," "Thee" and the archaic verb forms that accompany those pronouns in sentences addressed to God.

> Otherwise the service is "you" throughout, and the complex sentences the Elizabethans loved have been broken down into the simple declarative sentences endorsed by modern stylists.

> THE EPISCOPAL Church is making a determined effort to ensure that the proposed liturgy gets a thorough trial during the three years it is authorized for use and that laymen have ample opportunity to offer considered criticism of it.

Bishop William F. Creighton of Washington circulated guidelines to his clergy this week that stressed his expectation the service would be widely tested in congregations of the diocese.

According to the airline statistical tables, we logged some 4995 miles since last we punched this typewriter on the home front.

From Detroit to Chicago to Seattle to San Francisco to Los Angeles to Detroit - all in something like 14 hours of actual travel time!

Fantastic to say the least, when the pilot on United's hop from Seattle to San Francisco tells the passengers we are humming along at a speed of 685 miles per hour.

On any trip, one is bound to see some interesting sights.

There's the trip to the Space Needle in Seattle, a close-up ride past Mount Rainier in Washington, the beauties of the San Francisco Bay area, the lakes carved into our mountains, the Sunset Strip in Hollywood, Rhonda Fleming cheering against the Pistons.

But what impressed us most was looking at - and hearing about - the Astro turf football field they have in Seattle.

Astro turf, they say, one of these days will do away with grass. It will save us the chores of cutting the lawn, watering it, and still seeing it turn yellow and brown during the hot, summer days.

The "turf" is what they installed at the Astrodome in Houston when they found that ordinary grass wouldn't work.

Up in Seattle's schoolboy stadium, the results have been astounding, the director of the city's prep athletic league told a group of sports writers.

"It's worth the money alone not to have the field show a single mark of wear," the gentleman said, "after we have played 40 games and held 22 prac-

On most gridirons you know, the grass is churned up after a few games or two, especially when games are played in the wet and mud.

On Seattle's Astro-turf field, it makes no difference what the conditions are, the field always remains perfect.

"We did have one slight rip," the prep head said.
"It easily was fixed and now it's impossible to tell where it happened."

But what excites the Seattle athletic folks more is the marked effect the new turf has had on reducing the number of injuries.

"We have not had a bad knee injury or ankle injury suffered by any player yet this season," the gent in charge continued.

"A year ago our kids suffered nine very bad knee injuries, not to overlook some bad ankle in-

The feeling is that with the uniformity of the field, with no bumps and overall smoothness, a player is less apt to get his foot stuck and then cracked when hit by a rival at the same time.

We bring up the matter of Astro turf strictly as a suggestion for area officials who may be thinking of fixing up their football fields or building new

Until we saw it ourselves, we only had heard nice things through remote sources. But now that we have seen it, we really believe in the great values that come from installing Astro turf.

POST-TRIP THOUGHTS: Miles no longer mean a great deal. You cover some 5,000 miles in the air and the total time you're aloft is around 14 hours.

The trip home from Los Angeles takes just 31/2 hours and if you think that's fast, folks in Seattle, where they are building the supersonic jets, tell you that one of these days coast to coast trips will require under two hours.

The most impressive sight from an airplane window has to be the approach over the San Francisco Bay . . . looking out at the University of California through one window and down at what used to be Alcatraz on the other side.

The difference in the weather also "gets" to you. The guys back home tell you it's cold and snowy like. But as you talk via the long distance phone, you sit in shorts and haul in 70-75 degree sunshine. It gets you wondering, why live in the cold country? But maybe if you had to sweat it out the year around, you wouldn't be happy either.

As the old saying goes: There's no place like home. And there isn't - the mortgage payments and all other costs, notwithstanding.



Reports On Research In Thailand

ing assignments in Thailand have been undertaken by two University of Michigan laboratories and date back to 1964. Several contracts or subcontracts from Defense Department agencies have covered this work.

These facts are part of a report on 'Projects of the Willow Run Laboratories Involving Assignments in Thailand" which was released by the University Monday.

The report was prepared by a subcommittee of the faculty Committee on Research Policies.

The report on Thailand makes no recommendations on University policy, but simply sets forth the facts of the University's work relating to that country. A full report from the faculty committee on research policies, including recommendations for the future, is expected late in December.

University of Michigan participation in military research. especially classified military research, was questioned by the "Michigan Daily," the student newspaper, earlier this fall. The topic has been under discussion by faculty and stu-

"The Thailand projects have been and are conducted by two separate laboratories -- the Infrared Physics Laboratory and the Geophysics Laboratory," the report explains.

"The classified aspects of the research are descriptions of the precise nature and effectiveness of the remote sensing equipment developed before and during this set of studies

and the nature of the infrared 'imagery' projected. In addition, the purpose and the technical details of a contract currently held by the Geophysics Laboratory are classified."

The activities in Thailand grew out of surveillance research which began in University laboratories in 1953. An important aspect of this work has been "infrared reconnaissance which provides 'images' of distant objects by sensing the heat radiated from them and from their environments," the report explains, U-M scientists first found that they could identify, with airborne sensors, such things as crevasses under deep snow and various types of ice or open water.

RESEARCH IN Greenland, Iceland, North Africa, Italy, and various areas of the United States revealed usefulness of this method of aerial surveying for such things as mapping geological and hydrological characteristics, deer herds, agricultural crops, salinity and drought conditions, lava flow, soil characteristics, and currents in large bodies of water.

In 1964, the Advanced Research Projects Agency (ARPA) of the Defense Department requested U-M to "engage in studies in Thailand using infrared methods and invited Cornell University Aeronautical Laboratories to participate using more common photographic methods," the report relates. ARPA was interested in applying infrared and photographic reconnaissance techniques to problems raised by guerrilla

Data collected by University researchers in this work in Thailand in 1964 and 1965 is still being analyzed in the Willow Run Laboratories, and has been studied by a geographer. forester, and meteorologist as well as by those interested in military uses, Monday's report says. A final report on the analysis is to go to ARPA this month.

THE MAXIMUM NUMBER of Michigan people in Thailand at any one time for this project was 13, with the average tour of duty there being about six

In 1965, as part of the same project, four Michigan staff members began teaching Thai personnel a variety of subjects so that they could continue the research on their own. An informal course was also given

Late in 1965, the Thai government requested U.S. help in developing its own laboratory for research and training in infrared reconnaissance. This request was approved by the U.S. State and Defense departments and Congress.

Because of its competence in this field of technology, the University of Michigan was invited to provide the assistance. This project began in March 1966 and is scheduled to end March 15, 1969, the faculty report states.

Michigan's work consists primarily of training Thai personnel, in classes in both Thailand and Ann Arbor, Nine Thai military officers received two months of instruction in Ann Arbor in the summer of 1966. The Thais have used infrar-

Research Work Is Costly

ANN ARBOR -- Research expenditures at the University of Michigan during the 1966-67 year totaled almost \$60-million. This was an increase of 14 per cent over the previous year, when the research volume passed the \$1-million per week rate for the first time.

In a 1966-67 summary, A. Geoffrey Norman, U-M's vice president for research, pointed out that much of the support for research continues to come from federal government agencies. Federal funds for the past year amounted to \$45.8 million and accounted for 77 per cent of the total.

University funds supplied \$5.6 million and other support came from industry, private foundations, health organizations, and other sources.

DR. NORMAN emphasized that almost all the federal funds for university research must be justified in terms of its contributions to the sponsoring agency's specific mission. It is simply not the case, he said, "that the federal government provides undesignated funds to colleges and universities to foster the development of their research activities."

Dr. Norman stressed that "the university per se does not perform research. Rather it is the individual faculty members or groups thereof that develop projects which find support from sponsors. The total expenditure volume, therefore, is the summation of many projects that vary greatly in size and duration and in numbers of individuals involved."

HE NOTED that more than 3,700 students, about equally divided between graduates and undergraduates, took part in the projects active in the past

Funds for research purposes are primarily awarded on a competitive basis, Dr. Norman pointed out that the evident success which U-M faculty members have in obtaining financial support for their research projects is a recognition of their competence, stature and performance.

Although the funds provided the U-M during the past year. in their beds". . .again and from the defense agencies amounted to almost 30 per cent of the total expended, this percentage has been steadily declining as the federal research support base has been expanded.

THE SINGLE LARGEST sponsor was the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, which provided \$15.7 million, largely from the biomedical programs of the National Institutes of Health. Other substantial sponsors were the National Aeronautics and Space Administration with \$5.2 million and the National Science Foundation with \$3.6 million.



Senator Hart has predicted of Commerce estimated perthat funeral prices will drop sonal expenditures for funeral with the advent of something and burial services at an averrelatively new in that industry -- age \$988. And that was back price advertising.

Hart's prediction, made on the Senate floor, was prompted by the recent Justice Department suit which charged the sociation with coercing undertakers to keep them from advertising their prices.

"This is a subject with which I am most familiar," Hart said. "The Antitrust and Monopoly Subcommittee, which I am honored to chair, held extensive hearings on the antitrust aspects of the funeral industry.

"FUNERAL SERVICE is big business -- exceeding \$1.6 billion a year. Competition in the industry, according to testimony presented to the subcommittee, was choked off because undertakers couldn't advertise their prices to the public.

"Why? Because strong, influential associations felt that it was 'unprofessional,' that it somehow wasn't right to advertise the 'cost of dying.'"

Hart said that for many people, the cost of a funeral was the fourth largest expense that would be incurred during their lifetime.

"ONLY A HOUSE, a ear, and a college education will cut a bigger hole in most famin 1963.

"Now, when a man buys a home or a car or selects the college he can afford to send his children to, he has the time National Funeral Directors As- to shop and has a good idea of what it will cost him.

"But certainly a grieving family doesn't have the time-or even more important, the will--to shop around for the best price.

"In time of sorrow, a bereaved family wants to make sure their departed has the very best service they can afford. They will not question cost because of their emotional state and out of fear of diminishing the solemnity of the oc-

"And I would say that 95% of those people who make funeral arrangements don't realize that even the cost of the casket they purchase can determine what they will pay for the rest of the funeral expenditures."

HART SAID THAT many funeral directors in the country do provide and are willing to provide -- at reasonable costs-the same services that many people are being greatly overcharged for. But the problem ily budgets. The Department is, how do you find them.

Airliners Hit Hard By Birds

engines. The plane had hit a flight of geese, which were flying at 9.500 feet when they collided with a United Airlines DC 6 last month near Saginaw, Mich. None of the 58 passengers was hurt, but the plane looked as though it had been

Holes in the wing were up to 10 inches wide. The cowlings on all the four engines were dented. So were parts of the

This was not an unique accident. In 1966, commercial airlines reported 470 bird strikes. The Air Force totaled more than 800. According to the military, the Air Force damage bill from birds totals \$10 million a year.

THE UNITED AIRLINER was lucky in its brush with these geese. Others have not been. In 1960, an Eastern Airlines plane crashed in Boston when birds clogged its engines, Sixty-two persons were killed.

A United Airlines plane was downed near Ellicott City, Md., in 1962, killing 17 persons. In 1964, astronaut Theodore C. Freeman was killed when his jet struck a goose near Houston, Tex. Last year, an Air Force plane and an Army helicopter were downed, killing three

Several things are being done. The Federal Aviation Administration puts out advisories warning pilots of bird migrations. Radar is used to track them in flight, and aeronautical engineers are developing protective devices for engines.

BUT EXPERTS agree the only real solution lies in moving the birds away from airports since this is where most bird strikes are reported. So far, there is little sign that man is winning this battle.

The number of birds is increasing at many major airports. So is the total number of bird strikes.

One reason for the 'bird explosion" in the face of scientific countermeasures is man's own dirty habits, particularly his use of garbage dumps which, like airports, are often situated in outlying areas.

According to a report issued in July by the Interior Department's Bureau of Sports, Fisheries and Wildlife, the gull, which thrives on garbage, is the greatest single cause of

At Boston's Logan Airport, site of the Eastern Airlines disaster in 1960, the gull population is as great as ever, and the amount of food available in the area has not changed since 1964. This is true, the report said, even though one garbage dump was covered, insecticides were used and bird scare devices put into use.

AT NEW YORK'S Kennedy Airport, 21 bird strikes were reported last year. A survey showed again the only way to cut the bird population was to cover garbage dumps, drain ponds and marshes and employ scare devices.

The bird story is the same at many other major airports. Washington, D.C.'s National Airport reported 16 bird strikes last year. Chicago's O'Hare hac

Despite continuing efforts, most experts agree there is no final solution to the birc problem. One scientist put if this way: "All that can be achieved is a statistical solution -- a reduced probability of a collision."


