

WALTING TICKET FOR OVERTIME PARK TO

A Violation Is A Violation Even During Holiday Season

In answer to complaints from many quarters, Plymouth Police Chief Robert Corrington has emphatically denied that there is a special drive on to issue parking tickets during the holiday season.

'There is absolutely no basis for such a charge as that". he said, "We are here to see that the law is obeyed and we never are concerned with sea-

Some of the complaints came to the office of the Chamber of Commerce from businessmen in the area who charged that the writing of parking tickets was hurting their business at the holiday season.

It was pointed out in some of the complaints that many areas show leniency during the holidays by issuing a ticket that carries a warning only, a wish for a Merry Christmas from the city.

"That might be done in some places," Chief Corrington stated, 'but it isn't being done

"So far as the Police Department is concerned a violation is a violation and will be handled as such."

The Chief did point out, however, that there has been an increase in the number of parking tickets written during the past two months.

"We had 224 moving violations in November and 412 parking tickets. This was up considerably from October, which was way below average."

"These tickets were issued in the ordinary course of events. There is no drive on -- and never has been."

Robert Korabacher has been Township starting Dec. 1, 1967. to sign building permits. The Board of Trustees made Department of Buildings and the appointment to fill the vacancy left by the death of the former department head Matthew McLellan.

It was only natural that the conversation at lunch the other day centered around the announcement of the C&O Railroad Co. that increased activity would add to the rail crossing problem throughout the area.

During the discussion several unusual accidents were recalled - accidents where people drove right into the trains, or escaped serious injury just in time by some almost miraculous

'The best one I can recall," Don Sutherland, the scholarly-looking accountant, remarked, "is the one they tell of Clyde Smith out at the crossing near Napier and Five-Mile Road, and it re-

sulted in one of the worst accidents we ever had around Plymouth

"According to the story as it has been told, Clyde was working in the field with his father almost a half century ago. Taking a bit of respite, he looked about and saw two trains approaching each other.

" 'Look, Dad,' Clyde called, 'look at those two trains coming in opposite directions. They can't pass.' And his dad answered, 'Guess they can't There's only one track.

'With that," according to Don, "the trains hit head on and more than 30 lives were lost. At that time it was one of the worst tragedies we had around here-and I think it still is looked upon as the worst.

HOW ABOUT THIS ONE?

Ralph Cole, Plymouth Township Attorney, who has spent quite some time in the area, then spoke up and said, "When you speak of unusual accidents at the crossings, here's one

"Some years ago my wife was driving and for some reason or other failed to see the train approaching. It wasn't traveling very fast. But it hit her car, pick it up on the 'cow catcher' and started to drag her along the line

Then, with an attorney's penchant for detail he continued:

"It dragged her across 365 ties—one for each day in the year

"Luckily, she retained her composure and at one point stood on the running board of the car

trying to decide if it would be safe to jump. "She decided it wouldn't, so she just took her seat in the car and rode until the train stopped. "Never heard of another case such as that,"

he smiled now that the passing of the years has caused it to be looked upon as a humorous happening instead of a near tragedy.

Livonia doesn't boast a downtown area, let alone a downtown park. But that hasn't eliminated the Municipal Tree and the official lighting.

The large lawn in front of the Livonia City Hall has been decorated and is a thing of beauty in the darkness of night. More than that, the official lighting, to go through the formality of ushering in the Christmas season, always draws a host of people.

Cities such as Kalamazoo and the little town of Marshall have done great jobs with the yuletide spirit and decorations. But Plymouth?

PLYMOUTH IS A COLON-IAL community and proud of its history and heritage.

One feels even greater pride after a visit to Greenfield Village. There is a carding mill on the Village Main Street that was erected in Plymouth.

When Henry Ford was a boy he accompanied his grandfather on many trips to Plymouth with raw wool to be made into "rovings" for his mother to spin into yarn on the wheel at home.

That carding mill was erected in our community more than a century ago!

Standing on the corner of Christie and Main Street in the Village we find the Plymouth House--not from Plymouth, Massachusetts, or Plymouth, England -- but from our own colonial community.

The house was built in the middle of the nineteenth century and was chosen by Ford to represent the typical midwestern home.

CHRISTMAS 1967 is fast approaching and many of the Village houses are decorated for the season with holiday trimmings that reflect and echo the. Christmases enjoyed in homes' of earlier times.

"Christmas at Greenfield Village" will feature a visit to Clinton Inn, a 19th century stagecoach stop where hot ci-

der, and Christmas cookies will be served as the air is filled with favorite carols from an old tinkling music box.

An enchanting Christmas exhibit "Toys and Dolls" will be on display in the museum. This exhibit includes playthings from another long-ago era and highlights a group of more than

100 dolls recently acquired by the museum.

There are dolls in the collection that resemble famed people in American history--Betsy Ross, Mrs. Herbert Hoover and Charlie Chaplin. There is even a Shirley Temple doll!

Some older dolls wear original dresses, while others are attired in period costumes to give our children an idea of what people wore in the 'olden days."

An operating train of the nineteen twenties and wooden athers made for their children tell the story of Christmas morning in a bygone era.



MISS CASEY was the principal speaker. She analyzed the community's growth and its cultural needs, emphasized the library role in public life -- and the future needs of Livonia libraries, which now have only 70,000 books for 103,000 residents. Bien and the commission now are aiming at one book per capita, hope eventually to







More Than Pollution'

State Agency Finds Middle Rouge Water

'Degraded' By Silt, Fertilized Weed,

Oil Films, Industrial Chemicals

The water problems of the Middle River Rouge are more serious than just pollution. The problems involve what the state Water Resources Commission calls "degradation."

The man on the street thinks of bad river water as that in which bacteria from sewage is present. He knows this bacteria is dangerous to his health; he knows that oxygen dissolved in the water is used by the bacteria, and that the oxygen is no longer available to fish.

THAT, OF COURSE, is going on in the Middle Rouge. But so are a lot of other serious things-damage by silt, weeds, oil films,

They're spelled out in the Water Resources Commission's recent report on "Water Quality Evaluation of the Middle River Rouge Basin."

A stream, says the WRC, may recover from the oxygen-consuming effects of organic wastes, but there are other

The Middle Rouge flows south from the Walled Lake area in Oakland County through Novi, Northville and Plymouth. Then it turns east through Livonia, Garden City and Westland, joining the main branch in Dearborn Heights.

The river's main use is recreational. The basin's population was 190,000 in the last census and is expected to grow to 230,000 by 1980. The steeply-graded river carries off one-third of the total rain and snow that fall in its basin.

IN THE NORTHERN reaches of the Middle Rouge, in Novi, water running off the bare ground in new subdivisions clouds the river with silt.

This silt reduces the amount of light that can filter through the water, and so the plants in the water can't grow and give off oxygen. Silt also blankets the stream bottom and

kills the eggs of fish. Silt discolors the water so that it isn't pretty. But that's only a minor effect, in scientific terms.

DOMESTIC WASTES in the water do

"The water quality of the Middle River Rouge, particularly in its lower reaches, is seriously degraded . . .

"Heavy use is made of the river and adjacent land areas. Recreational uses are of prime importance. These uses will probably increase in the future, and a higher quality of water will be required to meet the standards set for these uses."

They contain phosphorus and nitrogen compounds - in other words, they are fertilizers.

"When these substances are present even in small amounts," says the WRC, "they can trigger massive growths of aquatic plants such as have been observed in the Middle Rouge during the summer season.

Excessive growths of vegetation are unsightly, often interfere with boating and fishing, impart tastes and odors to water. When they die, (they) add a substantial organic load to the stream."

Under darkened sky conditions, moreover, weeds will take oxygen from the water, rather than give off oxygen. When oxygen is depleted, there is less for fish and less to handle the load of domestic wastes.

"OIL IS ONE OF THE MAJOR pollutants which on occasion finds its way to the river," the WRC continues.

"In most cases, oil in a river originates from stormwater drainage and/or industrial discharge." (A number of plants, most notably Ford's Livonia transmission and chassis plant, were named in this category, although Ford is credited with taking steps to

"Damage caused by oil includes river bank spoilage, destruction and injury of waterfowl, fouling of boats and fishing gear, and damage to aquatic life.

'Oil films may interfere with the gas exchange of organisms, coat bodies of fish and birds, impart a taste to fish flesh, exert a direct toxic action on some organisms as a result of water-soluble components, and in-

terfere with fish-food organisms and the natural food cycle.

'Oil from surface films adheres to clay particles, settles to the bottom, and there remains a source of pollution. It may be stirred up to float again or may leak toxic principles.

'Oil waste has, in past winters, restricted normal ice development on some impoundments so that they could not be safely used for ice skating."

SUSPENDED SOLIDS from industrial or municipal wastes cause problems similar to those of silt.


They may kill fish and other aquatic life by clogging their respiratory passages; they blanket the stream bottom, killing eggs, young and food organisms; they screen out light needed for a healthy aquatic environ-

"They carry bacteria and decomposing organic wastes to the bottom, thus aiding oxygen depletion. And by deteriorating the stream's appearance, they reduce its recrea-

IN ONE RESPECT, the WRC report doesn't go as far as it could.

This newspaper, in a story and picture page last summer, showed graphically that trash dams the current, creates stagnant pools and collects floating debris and scum.

Lower court reorganization, mandated by the 1963 Michigan constitution, died in the House Thursday 17 votes short of the 74 needed in a climactic rollcall.

Regional legislators split 3

Reps. Louis E. Schmidt (R-Livonia), Raymond Baker (R-Farmington) and Richard A. Young. (D-Dearborn Heights) voted for the package and Reps. James Tierney (D-Garden City), John Bennett (D-Redford) and Vincent Petitpren (D-Westland) voted against it.

THE BILL hit the floor with more than 100 amendments and Rep. Donald O. Holbrook (R-Clare), its sponsor and chairman of the House Judiciary Committee said it was beyond repair.

The number of judges per district would vary from 1 to 62; based on district population. All judges would be elected at large except in Wayne, Oakland, Macomb and Kent, In those counties, 1 to 30 would be elected from each election division.

The district courts would offenses not involving felonies have limited jurisdiction in civil. criminal and traffic cases. In civil actions, the court would have exclusive jurisdiction in cases up to \$1,000 and equal jurisdiction with circuit courts in cases up to \$5,000.

District courts would cover misdemeanors, ordinance and charter violations and traffic

or high misdemeanors. It would handle examinations in all criminal cases.

Under the constitution, the bill is dead for the remainder of the special session.

Manufacturers Bank Aims At Stock Dividend

This would give the shareholders an additional share for each. 10 shares presently outstanding.

It is the board's intention to continue the present \$2 annual dividend on the increased number of shares.

If the stock dividend is approved by the shareholders at their annual meeting on Feb. 20, and by the Comptroller of the Currency, it will increase the Bank's common stock from \$15,539,840 to \$17,093,820.

The proposed stock dividend will be accomplished by a transfer of \$1,553,980 from "surplus" to "undivided profits" and subsequently a transfer of this amount from "undivided profits" to the bank's capital account.

Christmas Tree, Toys Cause Injuries

Potentially dangerous toys and Christmas tree hazards will -cause several hundred American children to suffer needless eye injuries during the coming holiday season, reports the National Society for the Prevention of Blindness.

On behalf of the Society's annual nation-wide Safe Toy Campaign, John W. Ferree, M.D., executive director of the NSPB, warns parents that 17 per cent of the more serious injuries to children's eyes are caused by missile-type toys such as pellet guns, dart guns, air guns, bean shooters and many toys with rubber bands such as sling shots.

"Parents should also be alerted against buying seemingly harmless toys having protruding points, sharpedges, detachable parts or those made with flammable or plastic materials that shatter," says Dr.

AS PART of the seasonal Safe Toy Campaign, the Society recommends that:

·Christmas trees, not made fire-proof by approved chemical sprays, should be kept in water to prevent drying and causing fire hazards.

·Christmas trees should be kept away from heated radiators or fireplaces.

·All electrical wiring should be double-checked for shorts that can cause sparks and

· All tree decorations should be unbreakable and nonflam-

MORE THAN 40 per cent of the accidents causing visual impairment in the U.S. today occur in the home, reports the National Society. According to latest data from the Public Health Service's National Health Survey, this represents a greater number than the combined number of at-work and automobile accidents in which eye injuries are sustained.

The Society emphasizes that good eye-safety habits and attitudes should be practiced in the home not only at Christmas time but all year round. Aerosol spray cans containing many different pressurized liquids such as insecticides, deodorants, antibiotics, oven cleaners, paint, and hair fixatives, should be kept out of reach of children at all times.

IT HAS BEEN recently found that these liquids, if accidentally sprayed into the eye, can cause severe corneal damage.

The National Society for the Prevention of Blindness, Inc., founded in 1908, is the oldest voluntary health agency nationally engaged in the prevention of blindness through a comprehensive program of community services, public and professional education and research.

You, as prospective home buyers or sellers, are assured of quicker and more complete information concerning the purchase and sale of real estate. Here's how it works:

Let's suppose you are looking for a home in Livonia. Tell your salesman your requirements: a ranch-style home, brick construction with three bedrooms, garage, fireplace, swimming pool, in the \$25,000 price range. The salesman reaches for his telephone and asks, the computer what's available that meets these specifications, using the touch-tone dial to tap out his requirements in code. The computer searches its memory and within seconds reports orally to the salesman with a list of numbers corresponding to the houses that meet the customer's requirements. The salesman over to his houses that meet the customer's requirements. The salesman goes to his file, pulls the cards containing the photos and descriptions of the properties in question. You decide which ones you're interested in and arrange with salesman for a personal inspection.

The computer also aids in the listing of properties to be offered for sale. Broker B, for example, has a client who is being transferred from Detroit to Cleveland by the company he works for and consequently must sell his home — as quickly as possible. The customer has no idea what a fair market price for his home might be; however, stored in the computer's memory is complete information about what other comparable houses in that area have sold for during the past year. Broker B queries the computer and is instantly supplied with a list of similar houses and their selling prices within the immediate area.

Sterling Elegant Yule Gift

Serving pieces in sterling silver are likely to be some of the most-wanted items on a woman's "wish list" at Christmastime.

The multi-purpose pieces are often the loveliest in a sterling set, and they add the final touch of beauty to a table set with gleaming sterling place settings and fine china and crystal.

Without them, a hostess finds that she has to "make do" with other flatware--and this expedient can lend a particularly jarring note to holiday and party meals when tables are set with special care.

THE SERVING pieces in every sterling flatware set range from items, as small as the dainty lemon fork to the 17-inch wedding cake knife (an ideal Christmas present, incidentally, for the bride-to-be.)

In between, there are many times, small and large, each an example of the consummate artistry and skill that goes into the making of every piece of sterling silver.

If the lady you have in mind already owns some sterling flatware, it's easy to learn the identity of the manufacturer and the pattern.

The manufacturer's name is always stamped on the back of every piece of sterling; sometimes the pattern name appears also, but if not, an admiring comment on the pattern or a casual inquiry into its name is usually all that's needed.

Often in the case of the new bride or young homemaker, the sterling pattern she owns will be listed at the gift registry of her favorite jewelry or department store. Here, a complete record is kept of the pieces which she's already received and those which she still needs.

THE FOLLOWING serves as a brief guide to some of the handy serving pieces which make excellent Christmas gifts:

5-Minute Car Wash Gets Faster

How quick is a quick car ash? That's a question asked y many who used to rinse mud and salt off their cars for a 25-cent investment at coin operated auto wash establishmengs.

The five-minute auto wash las become about as scarce as the five-cent cigar, according to Michigan Department of Agriculture weights and measures supervisor Clyde Cottom.

He says that after checking consumer complaints, it appears that most coin operated car washes have timers that ieliver less than the five minutes that many customers have relied upon.

"IF YOU WANT five minutes of car washing, you'd better check the signs closely to see If that's what is offered," Cottom recommends. "Otherwise, chances are that you'll get something less."

One meter recently checked delivered only slightly more than three minutes of water pressure for the quarter put in the coin slot.

Is this illegal?

Not if the time is not posted and delivered otherwise, Cottom says. People have just grown to assume that they're getting five minutes, partly due to previous advertising by the car wash businesses.

COTTOM SAYS that shaving the time allowance by even one minute from the previous fiveminute allowance can double the cost of a car wash to the consumer, since it then may require 50 cents to get the dirt

But, he adds, there is no law broken unless a customer is short changed on actual advertised time.

The Michigan Department of Agriculture is responsible for checking the accuracy of weighing and measuring devices used in commerce in Michigan, The law is administered by the weights and measures section of the department's Food Inspection Division.

Making Car **Bodies Like** Tying Steel

Anyone who has tried to wrap a bulky, odd-shaped package, holding the wrapping paper with one hand, twirling and tying the ribbon or string with the other, has some idea of the coordination necessary to hold and fasten together the steel body of an automobile.

Body construction is one of the first steps in automobile assembly, as performed thousands of times daily in plants throughout the country. The body structure must be strong and durable, and all parts must fit together precisely.

Ford Motor Co. assembles its car bodies in most plants with the help of massive holding fixtures, something like the extra pair of hands needed to wrap a gift package.

The fixture, or "buck," is loaded with the floor assembly, body sides, consisting of door frames and rear quarter panels (fenders), roof and cross members that tie the whole structure together. Most of these basic components are shaped from Ford-made steel.

Operators clamp the pieces together to form the framework of a car body, then propel it into the giant fixture where locking arms swing into position to hold the body both square and rigid. Skillful welders bond the pieces together into a single unit with hundreds of sturdy spot welds.

Ford pioneered an assembly innovation called the pivoting pillar welding fixture, further refining the traditional "buck," With this device, once the clamped body structure is in the buck, massive steel arms pivot upward and inward toward the body, strong "wrists" swing in and powerful fingers grip the steel body parts.

When the body is firmly and positively held, automatic welding guns race along the wheel housings and rocker panels, or lower body side rails, performing about 100 precision welds in less than one minute.







Doctor in the Kitchen®

Does the aerospace age influence nutrition concepts? Will we change our food habits by reason of aerospace exper-

These and other questions arise naturally as a result of the intense interest in the health and safety of our astronauts. Whether we sympathize with or deplore the race to the moon and to other planets, we are united in the wish that the men who risk their lives and sacri-

fice their days to the success of these missions, shall be kept

safe and well.

IT IS OBVIOUS that aerospace ventures demand a high degree of fitness in the broadest sense--mental, physical, emotional and spiritual. This is not attainable with anything less than the highest possible level of nutrition. The longer and more venturesome the mission, the greater will be the need for fitness, and therefore for

adequate feeding. When Admiral Byrd went to the Antarctic, there were feeding problems. Not only was it important to have sufficient quantity and variety to assure freedom from deficiency diseases, but the question of storage and the prevention of spoilage had to be solved.

IT WAS MY good fortune at that time, through the American Medical Association, to try out a number of dehydrated foods on one of our family trailer trips to the Canadian woods. Dehydration was not new, of course -- American Indians knew how to "jerk" meat -but large-scale processing was an experiment. Today we take dehydrated mixes of all kinds as a matter of course.

flights poses a new problem; much food is provided in tubes or in bite-size solid form, since liquids are impractical. Here again we are not dealing with an entirely new concept, but we are seeing great advances and developments.

Providing food of adequate nutrient value and good taste in small and manageable form under new conditions is a challenge for the space program. It will probably result also in new products for everyday use by the grounded majority of the human race.

PERHAPS THE most important influence of aerospace nutritional advances, if we have the wit to capitalize on it, will be the effect it may have on our children and young people. When your little astronaut dons his plastic helmet and says, "Mother, I'm hungry," you have a golden opportunity to induce him to eat nutritionally balanced meals, like an astronaut.

Just as thousands of young men ate carrots in the hope of improving their eyesight to get into the Air Force--a vain hope, by the way -- so may our adolescents be motivated to eat like an astronaut.

Already we see indications of how products used in aerospace are offered commercially for use in our homes. This can become a tremendous influence on our dietary habits. Since aerospace nutrition is scientifically based, it should be highly beneficial.

. A survey conducted by one of Michigan's 36 eligible private colleges-Lawrence Institute of Technology in Southfieldshows that nine out of ten of the high school seniors and parents queried did not know about the direct payment program and/or the need to apply eight months in advance.

Sentors may obtain the tuition grant applications from the eligible private colleges and at their high schools. Or they may write to the Michigan Higher **Education Assistance Authority** in Lansing.

The student has only to indicate on the application the college he or she expects to attend full time. Registration may be at a later date.

The tuition grants go directly to the students - not to the colleges - and are given on the basis of effective family income, taking into account the number of children in the family and other factors.

For example, a family of four may have an income of \$8,500 but after permissible deductions, have an effective income of only \$4,350 which would qualify the student for \$350 per year under the tuition grants

The State law was passed in June 1966 when only entering freshmen were eligible. Each year the program is being expanded until in 1970 all undergraduate and graduate students will be covered.

News Round Up

U.S. SENATOR Eugene J. McCarthy (D-Minn.), who is seeking the Democratic nomination for President against Lyndon Johnson in 1968, recently suggested that the United States conceded some area of South Vietnam to the Viet Cong in an effort to shorten the war. The statement brought immediate fire from Eugenie M. Anderson, a U.S. representative to the U.N., who said that 'you don't begin to negotiate with the Communists from a position of weakness if you want to negotiate seriously"

SENATE PASSAGE of a \$14.2 billion federal aid-to-education bill was the largest aid-to-education authorization in history. Southern senators had been stalling the measure until the administration pledged to revise procedures for cutting off funds to segregate schools. The Senate passage sent the bill to a conference with the House, where further attempts to water down antisegregation procedures are expected.

IN A:366 TO 26 VOTE, the House slashed federal spending \$4.1 billion this year, and in another separate vote of 326 to 62 the House boosted the salaries of postal workers six per cent and of other federal workers 4.5 per cent. The second bill includes proposed raises in postal rates that would raise first-class rates from five to six cents and air mail stamps from eight to ten cents. Speedy acceptance by the Senate is expected.

GEN. LEWIS B. HERSHEY, Selective Service director, is apparently the temporary winner over the Justice Department, which has accused him of using the draft as a punitive measure to punish anti-war demonstrators, Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark is sure that the tactic is of questionable constitutionality. Hershey's view of the law is due for the first of what may be a string of court tests within the next month.

GENERAL MOTORS Corp. and the United Auto Workers Union failed to agree on a national contract on the union-imposed bargaining deadline of midnight Dec. 14. This does not mean, however, that strikes will follow because Walter P. Reuther, union president, said there won't be any strikes until after the first of the year if a national agreement was not reached by the first date. Union representation and loss of jobs through automation seem to be key factors holding up any final agreement.

ACCORDING TO THE HOUSE Committee on Un-American Activities, there are an estimated 150 members in the Ku Klux Klan of Michigan. The report placed the state as one of 18 states in which the KKK remains "a vehicle of death, destruction and fear." The report cited as the reason for latest gains in national klan membership as the riotous situations in northern cities.
