## today's hot line

**REDFORD** — Redford Township civic leader John C. Raeside found his home ablaze and virtually gutted, firemen methodically attempting to squelch flames in the rafters and his wife distraught Thursday. A gas heater in a rear addition was blamed initially. Raeside is a member of the Redford Union school board, chairman of the township appeal board and was a member of the Wayne County Community College Districting Committee.

**REDFORD** — S/4 Jerry Shore, 20, was awarded the Bronze Star for heroism under fire in Vietnam. During a battle in the Vietnam Highlands he ignored bullets and a disabled truck's explosive cargo to dash for the driver and carry him to safety.

**LIVONIA** — Livonia's primary Monday will find a couple of councilmen and an ultra-conservative citizen as well as the incumbent seeking the two nominations for mayor for a place on the April 1 ballot. Five men want the two nominations for clerk, including the incumbent, and a woman is among the 11 candidates for eight places on the council ballot. But estimates are for only 13,000 votes out of a 38,000 registration.

**LIVONIA** — A group of Livonia neighbors have gone to the rescue of Mrs. Sidney (Rhoda) Niss, 35-year-old mother of three suffering from total kidney failure. Mrs. Niss was told by specialists in November that nothing could be done to save her life because of present overcrowded artificial kidney facilities in Michigan. Neighbors hope to raise \$15,000 which would mean one year of life for Mrs. Niss on an artificial kidney home nursing unit. Donations may be sent to the Rhoda Niss Kidney Fund, care of Mrs. Frank Brennan, 20215 Brentwood, Livonia.

**FARMINGTON** — A 28-day strike by Local 540 of the U.A.W. at the Farmington Township manufacturing plant of Futurmill, Inc., ended with the workers' ratification of a new three-year, five-month contract providing hourly wage increases plus increased fringe benefits. The company will resume full production Monday. Futurmill is a manufacturer of cutting tools. More than 100 employees were involved in the walkout.

**FARMINGTON** — Wayne County Prosecutor William Cahalan and Farmington Police Chief Robert Deadman both minimized the need for civilian arms in separate speeches dealing with possible civil disorders in the months ahead. "I don't have a gun in the house and never will have," declared Cahalan in emphasizing that law enforcement should be left to those trained for the job.

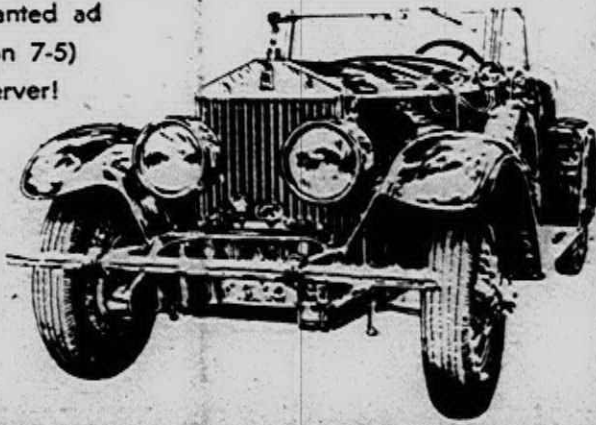

# Plea For Added Police Protection Stirs Township

The subject of adequate police protection in Plymouth Township came up again Tuesday with a plea for better police from Carl Pursell, president of the Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce. Pursell said he was presenting his case as a resident of the township, to the Township Board and claimed, "Police protection in Plymouth Township should be a top priority issue."

At the present time, the Township's police protection is the responsibility of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department and the Michigan State Police. Only one or two police cars are in the area at any time and Township residents have complained that police have been too slow when responding to their calls.

Pursell's plea is the latest in a long list of complaints residents have voiced from time to time.

He asked the board, "How much is security and safety worth? What price should the individual be willing to pay for a reasonable hope of being safe in the streets and having his property secure in his home or business establishment?"

CITING A report he compiled, Pursell pointed out that, with each year the Township gained more people, the number of complaints to the Wayne County Sheriff's Department and the State Police has risen sharply.

These two enforcement agencies cover Plymouth Township. In 1963, total complaints in Plymouth Township were 1,783 while in 1967, the number of complaints jumped to 3,961, he said.

Quoting a letter from the Sheriff's Office, Pursell continued, "Presently, nine officers are assigned to maintain two one-man vehicles from 7 a.m. until dark and one two-man vehicle after dark to police Northville and Plymouth Townships. In addition to these cars, vehicles assigned to Hines Park and other districts are utilized in emergencies as back-up service."

Pursell went on, "A quick check of the work activity of the Redford Post of the State Police covering Plymouth Township in 1967, indicates 101 complaints were received."

HE SAID that the State Police commander told him it is estimated that the average length of time to respond to a call would be 10 minutes or less.

trustee, interrupted Pursell long enough to say what was needed was educating the Township people to call the State Police more often and, this way, the State Police would step up their protection in the Township.

"My purpose," continued

Pursell, "is to present some current data concerning our own township. Statistics concerning other nearby communities reveal even greater problems."

"I would think we would be negligent in our responsibilities

to let this matter lie dormant even though it is a costly item and we know there is a unification study in progress with the City of Plymouth. I don't believe we can afford to wait."

Pursell concluded by offering four alternative solutions.

HE SAID the Township could request additional Wayne County Sheriff protection, request additional Michigan State Police protection, create a Plymouth Township Police Department or create a joint authority or possible temporary com-

tractual agreement with the City of Plymouth.

"In light of the unification study in progress, possibly a contract with the City of Plymouth might be the most feasible," Pursell added.

State Police and state and national experts could be persuaded to act as advisors, he continued.

"As I understand it, a bill has been enacted to permit a city and township to enter into such contracts or authority."

The concerned township resident concluded with, "I believe our township residents would support this increased cost and I am hopeful that we can consider this matter in the immediate future."

THE TOWNSHIP board's response to Pursell's lengthy report was mixed with apathy and anger.

John McEwen, Supervisor, his voice cracking with resentment, immediately replied, "Wayne County Sheriff's Department has done an adequate job." He said he was satisfied with the Sheriff's handling of the township and could see no need for any action by the board at this time.

Ralph Garber, trustee, caustically commented, "I think this is just another attempt to bring up plans for unification between the city and township."

However, Trustee Dick Lamberbach, who had chaired a leadership conference committee that studied the question of adequate police protection in the township in 1965, was of the opposite opinion.

"The township board has expressed no interest in this subject. The board should take a leadership role," he said.

TRUSTEE GENE Overholt said, "We can't stand still on this issue."

"I think we should take some initiative and at least find out the time required for the sheriff's department to respond. This is the only true way you're going to show what kind of service is provided in the township."

Treasurer Elizabeth Holmes, although saying she thought the sheriff's department was doing an adequate job also said that if anyone should happen to call them during a shift change there would be a half-an-hour wait before anyone would arrive.

Mrs. Holmes claimed that the sheriff's department told her, "I'm sorry lady, but you'll have to wait a half-an-hour because it is shift change."

The subject appeared to be a "hot potato" among the board members and viewpoints were tossed back and forth for more than an hour but no definite conclusion was reached.

SEVERAL TIMES McEwen tried to end the discussion but was cut short by other comments from board members.

Overholt was the most outspoken and demanded some action. He said it was up to the board to investigate the issue and not wait until a crisis arose or public pressure forced it to do something.

Overholt, with clenched fist, brought home his point by saying it was up to the board to make the first move since it was, after all, the leader of the township.

McEwen ended the discussion by recommending that the board take a wait-and-see attitude.

He said that the board should await the results of the unification study.

## Donald Tripp Appointed To Fill Vacant Post On School Board

Donald Tripp has been appointed by the Plymouth School Board to fill the vacancy left by the death of former vice president Carl E. Schultheiss.

The appointment was made at the board's meeting Monday night.

Tripp is an engineer for Chevrolet. He was chairman of the Citizens Committee that planned Plymouth High School #2.

He is currently president of the Gallimore School Parent-Teachers Association.

The board made the appointment in a separate session a half hour before the regular meeting.

Board President Esther Hulsing said that the board found the decision terrifically difficult to make.

She said the board members interviewed three persons, all of whom seemed qualified for the job and "probably made the selection on Tripp's general over-all background."

Besides chairing the citizen's committee he was very active in civic affairs in Rochester.

**Old Resident Of Plymouth Dies Suddenly**

Plymouth lost one of its oldest residents Thursday when Arthur G. Griffiths died suddenly on his 57th wedding anniversary in St. Mary Hospital, Livonia. He was 95.

For years he was well known through the area as a golfer. Surviving him are his wife, Lynette K. Griffiths, one daughter, Mrs. Betty Jane Borso of Ann Arbor, and two grandchildren.

Services for Mr. Griffiths were held Saturday, Feb. 17 in the Schrader Funeral Home at 1 p.m. with the Rev. Canon David T. Davies officiating. He was buried in Detroit.

He was born on Oct. 29, 1872 and in 1925 came from Detroit to Plymouth. He lived at 1212 W. Ann Arbor Trail.

A memorial has been established at the Shady Trails Camp at the University of Michigan Speech and Hearing Camp or contributions can be made to Northwestern University Scholarship Fund.

on Saturday morning, March 30, and the entire day will be spent knocking on doors in the various areas in Wisconsin to further Romney's cause.

The actual cities where the campaigning is to be done have not yet been selected, but it will be a "hard sell" effort.

## Plymouth Schools Stay In Black

The Plymouth School Board has established an impressive 12-year record of always keeping its books in the black and 1968 will prove no exception.

"Although this year's labor negotiations came before the 1967-68 budget was prepared and before salaries were set, the board still was able to come close to actual expenditures," Mel Blunk, business superintendent, commented.

He added that, for the first time, the Board has asked with a recommendation from the ad-

ministration, to have a mid-year review of the budget.

First, Blunk's office reviewed the 1967-68 budget of \$5,086,434 and recommended an increase of \$37,452 which had been figured from various categories.

The Board, then, countered with another revision and increased Blunk's figures for an additional \$23,316, which brought the revised budget to \$5,147,202.

This final revision was approved by the board at its regular meeting Monday.

Actually, Blunk explained, even though the old budget, approved last August, had been increased \$60,768 it did not bring the school district close to red columns.

The board has an estimated \$1,578 surplus. Blunk said that the estimated receipts for the 1967-68 school year will total \$5,148,781.

Therefore, this year, as in the past, the school board has maintained its policy of spending only the money it has available, he emphasized.

## Dream Nears Reality

## Township To Join In Hockey Arena Plan

The much discussed ice hockey arena that is to serve as a permanent memorial to the Plymouth Centennial moved another step toward realization this week—but possibly at a new site.

Hopes that the building could be erected in the not too distant future came when the Township officials agreed to join in a plan to establish a recreation authority for the purpose of constructing a "joint community center."

According to a statement released by Mayor James Jabara, of the City of Plymouth, and Township Supervisor John McEwen, both governing boards agreed to direct their attorneys to research the legal aspects for the formulation of such an authority and the various means of financing this initial project and other recreational facilities.

One of the major topics of discussion at the meeting was the possible location of the proposed center. It has been known

for some time that the School authorities could not provide more than two and one half acres at the present high school and that was not sufficient.

As a result a site committee was formed with Township Trustee Louis Norman as chairman. The other members of the committee will be City Commissioners George Hudson and Robert Smith; Township Trustee Gene Overholt, and Robert Hayman, chairman of the Centennial Committee.

The estimated cost of the

proposed structure that will include a hockey arena and an all-purpose building, has been placed at \$660,000.

With these cost figures the City Commission went on record asking the school board and the township for help. Several weeks ago the school officials approved participation in the plan and now the township also has joined in the effort.

This will make the arena—wherever it is built—a community project.



# Farmers In Township Win Zoning Skirmish

A resolution stating that the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees feels that the agricultural district should be maintained in the proposed new

township zoning map, was approved Tuesday.

The Township Planning Commission is currently revising Ordinance 14--the zoning ordinance--and arguments have been raised that, since the township is becoming more heavily populated, agricultural land should be eliminated from the map.

Farmers in the far western end of the township have protested that as soon as their property is rezoned to residential, as proposed, their taxes will jump too high.

AS OF NOW, the ordinance provides that any parcel of land

more than five acres, although zoned residential, will be regarded as agricultural.

However, the objection lies in the rezoning because it is believed by the farmers that zoning affects the value of land and consequently the taxes.

The resolution was proposed

by Board Trustee Ralph Garber, who is also a member of the township planning commission.

The resolution passed 4-2 with two trustees, Dick Lauterbach and Gene Overholt, casting negative votes.

They said they opposed ap-

proving the resolution now and would rather have the board withhold any type of action until the joint meeting between the board and commission.

Garber has been the one board member pushing the issue and claims that the township, by rezoning agricultural land to

residential, will be hurting some township farmers who still make their living by tilling the soil.

The date for the joint meeting referred to has not been set.

## Model Homes Target Of Thieves

Wayne County Sheriff's Department reported five breaking and enterings in homes in Plymouth Township--all within a

five day period. Three happened in broad daylight.

On Feb. 5, two model homes that were only a block apart were forcibly entered.

One model, at 39542 Ann Arbor Trail, was broken into at 12:54 p.m. and had its family room ransacked but nothing was reported missing. The other model, which was reported entered at 12:54 p.m. too, at 39520 Ann Arbor Trail, had a kitchen table and four chairs stolen.

Two more thefts from homes were reported on Feb. 6.

The first occurred at 4:30 p.m. at 9142 Redbud. A witness told the Sheriff's Department that he saw three men take the carpet from the house. The carpet was reported to be worth \$150.

On the same day the second breaking and entering took place at 13059 Beacon Hill Drive. This was by far the most daring of the entire group because of the amount stolen and the time of day, 11:30 a.m.

The Sheriff's said that a \$400 electric range, a \$100 sump pump, a \$25 vacuum cleaner and a \$10 tub were stolen.

The fifth breaking and entering occurred Feb. 10 at 42520 Postiff and two rolls of carpet worth \$300 were reported missing.

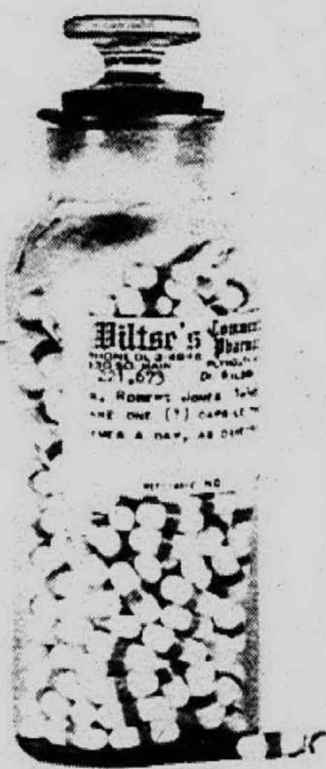

## ORDINANCE NO. XXVI-B

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. XXVI, KNOWN AS THE FIRE PREVENTION CODE FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH

THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

PART I. That Ordinance No. XXVI, known as the Fire Prevention Code of the Township of Plymouth, is hereby amended by amending Article 1, Section 1.5 by the addition of the following subsection (h)

h. FIRE HYDRANT REGULATIONS. It shall be unlawful for any person to open, use or in any manner disturb or interfere with any fire hydrant or other apparatus located within the limits of the Township of Plymouth, without having first obtained permission therefor. Any person other than members of the Fire Department or department of Public Works desiring to make use of any fire hydrant shall apply to the Township of Plymouth Water Department for the permission to do so, setting forth the name, business and residence address of the applicant and the location for which permission is desired. All applicants shall deposit with the Township of Plymouth Treasurer the sum of \$25.00 and shall not use or interfere with any hydrant except by the use of tools approved by the Department of Public Works and in accordance with the directions given the applicant by the Department of Public Works. Said directions shall be so printed on the reverse side of the permit copy issued to the applicant. Any damage resulting from the use of such hydrant shall be charged to the applicant and deducted from the sum deposited. Said deposit shall not be returned to the applicant until the hydrant shall have been inspected, and the applicant shall pay an inspection fee of \$2.50 during normal Township of Plymouth office hours or an inspection fee of \$5.00 for hours before or after normal Township of Plymouth office hours, plus any fee imposed by the Water Department of the Township of Plymouth for water use. Permits issued shall be for a period of 24 hours only. Agricultural and Commercial uses are exempt from the fees herein established but not Water use charges or the requirement to obtain a permit during the Summer months. Any person failing to comply with the provisions as set forth shall forfeit said deposit and be subject to the provisions of Section 5--Penalties of the Ordinance No. XXVI, known as the Fire Prevention Code of the Township of Plymouth.

PART II. CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED. Any ordinance or parts of Ordinances in conflict, herewith, are hereby repealed.

PART III. EFFECTIVE DATE. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and are hereby ordered to take immediate effect and be in force from and after the earliest date allowed by law.

PART IV. ADOPTION. This Ordinance was adopted by the Township Board of the Township of Plymouth, Michigan this 13th day of February A.D. 1968.

# 'Let Us Reason Together' Should Become Slogan Of Area Officials

There is a quotation from the Bible that has recently found its way into the political arena in one manner or another.

It is: "Come, Let Us Reason Together."

The quotation is one of the rocks on which the president has built his administration and now it has moved closer to home — much closer.

During the past fortnight the City of Farmington and Farmington Township officials have agreed to meet quarterly and discuss mutual problems. These two areas have been at loggerheads on many matters, but now are going to attack the problems on a general front of "What is good for the community."

The Farmington groups have set a fine example and one which the officials in the Plymouth area could well follow.

For years on end they have been almost at each other's throats, each vying for some selfish goal.

Meanwhile, Plymouth problems go unsolved.

Time after time efforts have been made to have the two factions join forces — but to no avail.

Little more than a year ago, after much haggling, they did agree on a unification study to be made by the Citizens Research Council of Michigan. But since then they have gone no further.

Even some of the things that were mutually agreed upon as problems by the City of Plymouth and the Township have been cast aside to await results of the unification study.

## THERE'S SAFETY IN NUMBERS



It mattered little that some of the problems are becoming more acute. The officials go their separate ways, each firm in the conviction that they are right.

This is dangerous for the simple reason that life and limb can be at stake.

The latest example was furnished at the Township Trustees' meeting during the past week when Carl Pursell, an interested citizen,

made a fervent plea for more adequate police protection. This type of plea has been heard from the Township residents for months—but no action is taken.

And this, despite the fact that both factions agreed at the Schoolcraft Leadership Conference last Spring, to have our representative in the state legislature foster a move to amend a bill permitting contractual agreements between neighborhood police departments.

The bill was amended quickly. But no action has yet been taken to strengthen the police protection in the Township — or in the city for that matter.

Why not?

The residents have a right to know.

Garbage, drainage, fire protection and water are just a few of the other problems, along with a recreation program, that need study promptly. Each of these affect the entire Plymouth area — not just a single segment.

Yet, there is little attempt to sponsor a meeting of the minds on both sides to arrive at solutions that would be beneficial to all citizens.

Occasionally, both sides have met on such things as sharing the cost of building an ice arena or selling sections of water main. In such cases they jockey for position, not for the benefit of all concerned. They can be likened to groups that pay close attention to pennies while dollars are going out the window.

For many persons new to Plymouth, the differences of the two groups is amazing for they see no dividing line separating the city from the township. To these persons it is one unified area known as Plymouth.

The day may come when this unification will become a reality.

But, in the meantime, to solve problems, the officials of both sides would do well to follow the old quotation:

"Come, let us reason together."

## Congressman Esch Reports

# Proposed Tax Misses Mark

Last week the Administration unveiled its proposal for a foreign travel tax program designed to ease the nation's balance of payments deficit. My initial reaction to the provisions is negative and passage of the bill in its present form is unlikely. However, the House Ways and Means Committee is likely to report a modified version of the bill which may receive Congressional approval.

The present proposal would place a graduated tax on travelers going abroad who spend more than \$7 per day. Taxation on expenditures between \$7 and \$15 a day would be taxed at 15% and expenditures over \$15 per day would be taxed at 30%. The Administration has also proposed a permanent 5% tax on airline tickets—the same rate at which domestic airline travel is already taxed. The existing \$100 duty free exemption will be reduced to \$10 per person.

MY FIRST reservation to the program stems from its limitation on the traditional freedom of movement and travel accorded to all American citizens. I hold that freedom of movement is basic to the values of a free people—a belief that is in direct conflict with the President's proposal. The understanding, tolerance, and vast scope of educational experiences gained through international travel are self-evident and are values which should not be overridden without full consideration of their importance.

At first glance one might assume that the tax is designed to cut down on the pleasure travel spending of a wealthy

few, but the effect of the bill will be quite the contrary. The additional taxation will impose few limits on those who travel on unlimited funds. The ones who will be hurt the most will be the retired couples, school teachers, students and middle income workers. Families who have saved for years to visit relatives in foreign countries may find costs prohibitive. The \$7 exemption will cover little more than hotel accommodations for most travelers and even the limited budget traveler will be confronted by a 5% tax on the already high cost of transportation and at least 15% in taxes on most of his additional expenditures.

FURTHER DOUBTS about the appropriateness of the program arise when the possibility of retaliatory steps by foreign countries is considered. If other countries were to restrict U.S. travel or raise tariff barriers, any savings would be wiped out and the balance of payments could be even further damaged. Additionally, this would alter our basic foreign policy of lowering international trade and travel barriers and emphasize a new trend toward isolationism.

# Bank Loot: \$250,000

A TALL COUPLE wearing stocking masks and brandishing .38 caliber revolvers terrorized six employees and robbed a Bronx, New York bank of an estimated \$250,000 last week. They escaped in a garish yellow car parked near the Bank of Commerce branch, in the style of reminiscent of the Bonnie and Clyde gang of the 1930's.

TOBACCO LOBBYISTS in Washington successfully harassed Post Office and high Washington officials over a poster to be stuck on the sides of mail trucks. The poster was supposed to have read, "100,000 doctors have quit smoking cigarettes. Maybe they know something you don't." Now it will include the clause 100,000 doctors are an "estimate based on surveys by National Opinion Research Center and U.S. Public Health Service."

SEN. JOHN L. McClellan (D-Ark.), the Senate's most widely known crime fighter, revealed last week that his hat had been stolen--at the White House. The senator said he doubted that it had been taken by mistake because it hadn't been returned.

YEAR-AROUND operation of public schools would be permitted under an Ohio Senate-approved bill passed last week. Sponsors predicted senate approval of house changes in the measure that failed to win support and enactment in three previous legislative sessions.

THREE MEN, who had been convicted and sentenced to life in prison on murder charges, were vindicated last week when a Philadelphia medical exam-

iner said the man who was supposed to have been killed as a result of an armed robbery really had died of a heart attack. The three men, however, remained in prison.

DEMOCRATIC SEN. Stephen M. Young of Ohio ripped into a former political rival, Republican Rep. Robert Taft, Jr., asserting he "has the Taft name and the backing of the Taft family fortune but not much else going for him." Young was criticizing Taft's recent call for the resignation of Sen. J. W. Fulbright as chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.

A NON-PROFIT organization, the Theater Development Fund, says it has received a \$200,000 federal grant for its program to help sagging Broadway shows which it feels would succeed if kept open long enough.

ADMINISTRATION sources predict President Johnson's forthcoming health message to Congress won't recommend adding the cost of prescription drugs to the medicare program.

GARBAGE and rubbish began to pile last Monday in Memphis, Tenn. when 1,130 sanitation workers walked off their jobs. Public Works Director Charles Blackburn said the strikers are asking the city that the pay of laborers be raised from \$1.80 an hour to \$2.35 and the rate for truck drivers be boosted to \$3.

A NEW TABLOID New York City daily publication, containing only columns and political cartoons, is scheduled to reach the newsstands March 11. Jerry Finkelstein, publisher of the New York Law Journal and the Civil Service Leader, announced the plans for the paper last week.

STOKELY Carmichael drew catcalls and heckling as well as cheers when he brought his Black Power message to a predominantly Negro audience of students at Roosevelt High School in Washington. During his hour-long talk, many of the 600 students left.

ENACTMENT by the American Bar Association of proposed restrictions on news coverage of the court and the police station would contribute to increasing the alarming growth of crime in this country, said David N. Schutz, president of the Associated Press Managing Editors Association. Schutz said that approval of the "Rearden Report" by the ABA would come at a time when more news should be printed about crime instead of less, so that added public support for improved law enforcement might be obtained.

## McKinney Addresses Graduates

The "critical component" of the great restlessness troubling our nation is not technology, but the performance capabilities of individual men and women. "Man's fate will depend on how he develops and deploys human resources," was the challenging prediction presented to graduating seniors of the Dearborn Campus of the University of Michigan.

Harold C. McKinney Jr., executive secretary of the State Human Resources Council and administrative aide to Gov. George W. Romney, addressed the assembled graduates and their guests in ceremonies at the Ford Central Office Building auditorium on Saturday.

McKinney insisted that dependence on the individual is greater today than ever before in history. "The great battleground of our time is not science and technology - it is the mind and spirit of man who will control that technology for good or for evil," he warned.

The Dearborn Campus granted 71 degrees in ceremonies presided over by William E. Stirton, director of the Dearborn Campus and vice president of the University of Michigan.

Degrees were awarded in all three divisions of the Campus, with the Business Administration Division granting slightly more degrees than the Literature, Science and the Arts or Engineering Divisions.

With these degree recipients the Dearborn Campus has now graduated approximately 1,100 students since becoming operational in 1959. Dr. Stirton has directed operation of the Campus during this entire period, but he has announced plans to retire in June.

Her American "sister," Cyndie Wilkins, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Wilkins, 26137 Middle Belt, was just as surprised as her NFH classmates when she learned from Yvonne that many Finnish people have brunette coloring.

IN EVERYTHING else besides her name Yvonne is as Finnish as her home which is in the countryside near the small city of Porvoo, 50 kilometers (20 miles) from Helsinki.

Farmington and its subdivisions are something entirely new to the Scandinavian girl.

### Boy Rescues Men In Angola

A 12-year-old Angolan boy is credited with saving two grown men by leaping Tarzan-style on the back of a marauding lion and killing the beast with a hatchet. The men were mauled and clawed after they attacked the lion in a village cattle corral. The boy was uninjured.

"So few people live like this at home," she explains. "We either live in town or in the countryside like I do."

Farmington teenage girls are also something entirely new to Yvonne.

"Girls are more lively here," says Yvonne. "They're always going - seldom home. Then, almost all your girls drive, so they meet more. Usually we just meet on Saturday at home, even though Saturday is a school day."

ONE OF THE first things Yvonne noticed her first day at school here was the bright colors on the girls going to classes down the NFH halls. "I get amazed at all the colors you have here -- how you combine colors like pink and red. That wouldn't go at all at home," she notes.

Yvonne shouldn't have been too surprised at American girls' clothes because she is able to buy Seventeen, the teenage fashion magazine, at home. It costs \$1 or four marks in Finland. Here the magazine sells for 50 cents.

Because winters begin so early in Finland, Yvonne expected to find cool weather when she arrived here in July and didn't bring light clothing or

a bathing suit with her. A friend of Cyndie's came to the rescue with the loan of a bathing suit.

WHERE NORTH Farmington is labeled a "high school," the exchange student's school at home is called a "gymnasium." Yvonne will attend the gymnasium for two more years when she returns home and plans to go on to the university to become an English teacher.

Her school day here is much like it is in Finland, but she does think the lunches at NFH could do with some variety. "We have almost the same food every week," she comments. And this is no news to her Farmington classmates.

UNLIKE MOST of her fellow exchange students, this girl from Finland has yet to make a long distance call home.

She gives a shy shrug when asked why she hasn't and hastens to say that she has seen a member of her family since coming to the United States.

That was her brother, Dino, who is a ski instructor this year at a Vermont resort.

With his name, Dino is the same kind of Finn with a difference his sister is.

## Praises Teens For Dimes March Help

asked us, 'Do you take boys with long hair?' We took everybody who wanted to help. That boy brought us over \$600. There were boys and girls of all sizes, colors, and family income brackets who pitched in and worked together. I am bursting with pride for them."

Mrs. Dawood's teen program is designed to give young adults a community service project that will (1) help them learn to coordinate and organize; (2) give teens an opportunity to know and work with their neighbors; (3) teach them how to get along with people; and, (4) develop leadership and responsibility.

# UN-Hanoi Talks Bear Little Fruit

## WORLD ROUNDUP

UNITED NATIONS Secretary General Thant conferred for more than an hour last week with Mai Van Bo, Hanoi's chief representative in Europe, and then discussed Vietnam and the Middle East in separate long meetings with President Charles de Gaulle and Foreign Minister Couve de Murville. In spite of the talks, observers maintain a pessimistic view of the results. North Vietnamese sources would only say that the information had been transmitted to Hanoi. Meanwhile, in the United States, Secretary of State Dean Rusk declared that all explorations so far showed that Hanoi had rejected American terms for entering negotiations.

THREE MOSCOW intellectuals are circulating a petition appealing to the intelligentsia to speak out in protest against Stalinism, which they say is "slowly but surely" being restored in Russia. The petition criticizes "inhuman reprisals" against intellectuals who have spoken their minds and have recently been sentenced to long prison terms in a series of court trials.

THE U.S. AIR Force said a 22-year-old English girl was so fond of American airmen she lived three weeks in a barracks at the top secret nuclear bomber base in Lakenheath, England. "She was like a mother to us," said one of her former barracks mates. "We are investigating," announced tightlipped Air Force brass. Officials refused to reveal the girl's identity, but said she was forever banned from all U.S. Air Force bases in Britain.

PIERRE CARDINAL Veillot, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Paris, died Wednesday of cancer only eight months after Pope Paul VI elevated him to Cardinal. He was 55.

A NORTH VIETNAMESE major general, the second ranking Communist officer in South Vietnam, apparently was killed in Saigon fighting, a police official said. A South Vietnamese national police spokesman said identification experts were "80 per cent certain" that a body found on the outskirts of the city was that of Maj. Gen. Tran Do.

NORTH KOREA charged last week that the operations of the USS Pueblo were "part of premeditated aggressive maneuverings of U.S. imperialism for a new war in Korea and Asia." The radio in Pyongyang, said "all documents and data obtained show beyond doubt" that the Pueblo was engaged in "hostile acts" and "carried out espionage" when it was seized Jan. 23.

ISRAELI PREMIER Levi S&H Catalogs Are Available At Demerys

Introduction of the 1968 S&H Green Stamps merchandise catalog containing over 1,900 items began February 15. This is the earliest that the annual catalog has been made available to stamp savers in recent years. The 180-page Ideabook will be available at all three Demerys stores: Farmington Rd. at 12 Mile in Farmington, Woodward at Hamilton in Birmingham, and Woodward at Milwaukee in Detroit.

Eschkol said if Jordan continued its armed provocations along the Jordan River, Israel would be forced to take measures to halt them. Eschkol warned Jordan that Israel would not tolerate such acts.

THE CANADIAN dollar showed some signs of recovery last week following the speculative walloping it took in foreign exchange last January. The dollar rose from its January value of 91.75 United States cents to 91.98 cents.

THE THAI government, smarting under recent criticisms of its policies by visiting newsmen, has decided to take "strict measures" against

foreign correspondents, a spokesman announced last week. The measures were not spelled out, but they are believed to include tougher visa regulations.

U.S. FIGHTER bombers shot down two MIG 17 jets Wednesday, blasted three North Vietnamese airfields and lent a hand to U.S. Marines trying to drive diehard Communist holdouts from the walled Citadel of Hue.

CHINESE SCIENTISTS have been criticized by a Communist government paper for "a cold and indifferent attitude toward revolution and research." The leading power in the

field of science and technology has not yet been seized. Scientists previously had been immune from the cultural purge.

EXTREME LEFT-WINGS Syrian regime Army officers have dismissed 108 Army and security officers from within the politically desiccated Syrian Army. The cause of the conflict was not clear.

NIGERIAN BIAFRANS are talking peace but still making counterattacks against the government in the seven-month long civil war. The government claims it has beaten back the Biafrans in its attempt to take over a large university town.

Government sources said that before peace talks can start they must see firmer signs that the Biafrans are willing to talk peace.

BRITAIN'S BOARD of Trade said the country's trade position is improving, and the trade gap created by more imports than exports narrowed to a deficit of \$74.4 million.

EIGHT ARAB saboteurs and an Israeli soldier were killed last week in occupied territory on the west bank of the Jordan River in a clash which also involved Jordanian machine gun fire across the river.

THE JAPANESE Foreign

Ministry lodged a formal complaint against a rocket drill by a U.S. Navy ship that it said imperiled a 19-ton Japanese fishing boat. The ministry said the drill violated established rules.

MAE MARSH, who was Flora, the little sister in D.W. Griffith's silent screen classic "The Birth of a Nation", died of a heart attack at the age of 72.

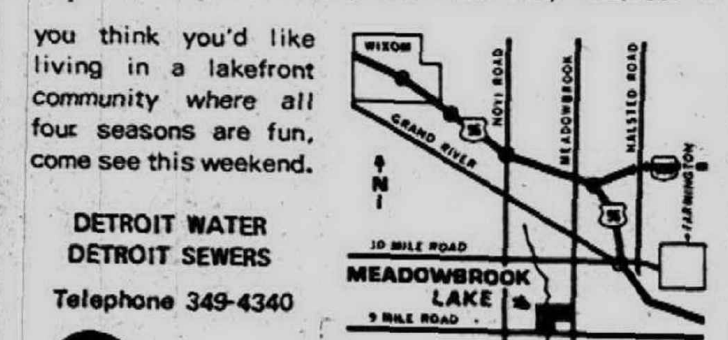

# Campaign Opens For Private School Aid

MAIL SUPPORTING proposed state aid to non-public schools has been streaming in to the Michigan governor's office and the Senate majority leader's office this past week. By Thursday, well over 20,000 letters were received by the governor's office. Assistants to Emil Lockwood (R-St. Louis), Senate majority leader, said that since each piece of mail is answered, this recent deluge has put a strain on the leader's mail budget.

ROBIN LYNN JOHNSON, eight-year-old step-daughter of a Williamston policeman, died at a Lansing hospital after she was struck in the head by a .38 caliber bullet, Williamston Police Chief John Peter said. Peters said the shooting was apparently accidental, but he was continuing his investigation.

DR. LEIF HOUGEN was fired as West Bloomfield superintendent of schools by a 4-3 vote Wednesday night by the Board of Education. Board members refused to disclose publicly their reasons for the decision to end the superintendent's contract June 30, when it is slated to expire.

MICHIGAN STATE University President John A. Hannah criticized the "radical dissenters of our day" who try to bring about change by challenging the law. Hannah's comments were included in his annual "State of the University" address delivered at a faculty convocation in East Lansing. He also cited what he called inadequacies in state support for MSU.

TWO FIRES RAGED out of control in downtown Lapeer last Tuesday night, one destroying a quarter of a city block and leaving about 40 persons homeless. While firemen fought this blaze another fire broke out four blocks away. Four

firemen were overcome by smoke but were not injured seriously. No other injuries were reported. The two fires destroyed a restaurant, bar, and second floor apartments and leveled a gas station and snack bar.

THE QUESTION of state and federal aid to non-public schools has apparently become one of the delicate underlying issues in the race to fill the vacant State Senate seat in the 23rd District. Both Gary Byker the Republican candidate, and Chester J. Harmsen, say voters appear concerned over the issue. Neither candidate, however, claims to be using the issue as part of his campaign.

STATE SEN. MILTON ZAAGMAN (R-Grand Rapids) has introduced a resolution which would require chairmen of standing and special committees to report every two months the entire expenditure of Senate funds for out-of-state travel. The reports would be made to the secretary of the Senate on a form provided by him and would be printed in the Senate Journal.

STATE INSURANCE Commissioner David Dykhouse has predicted group auto insurance plans will become popular in Michigan as a result of an attorney general's opinion. Atty.-Gen. Frank Kelley ruled that Michigan law permits low-

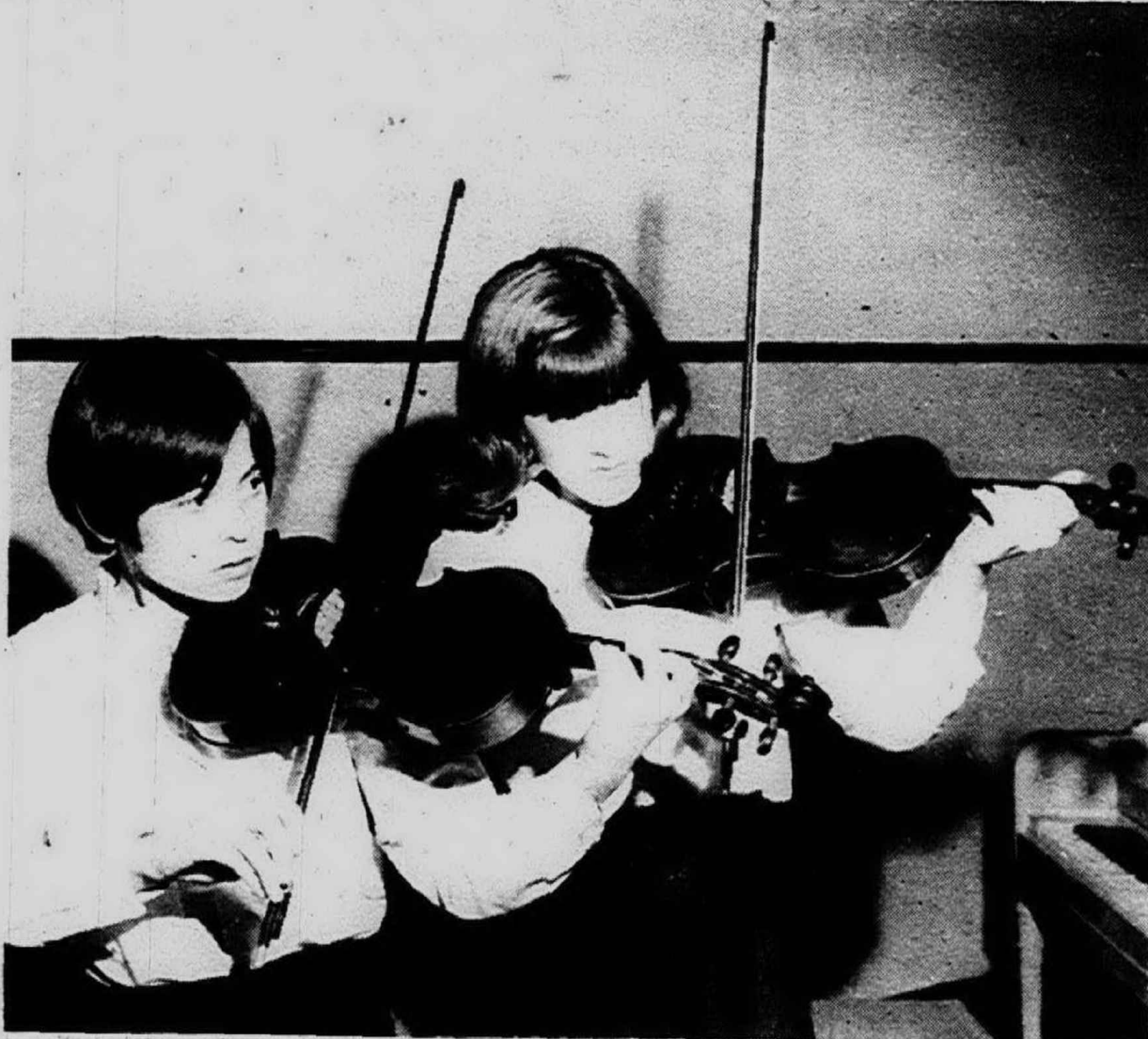

## observing sports

What's the University of Michigan Daily trying to prove?

First the U-M student paper slams into the fact that athletes on the Ann Arbor campus have been receiving special concessions — like free movie tickets and discounts on clothes — from area merchants.

Then, the paper turns on Michigan State with similar charges.

The net result is that both schools now are conducting investigations.

So is the Big Ten.

When it's all over, the conference may slap Michigan and MSU on the hands. But the real culprits actually are the "well-meaning" merchants who have doled out the "gifts" to the athletes at the two schools.

Somewhat, these are the people who should get tagged with a penalty, although they will escape.

**THEY'RE A LOT** like the so-called good folks who every year try and pass out illegal awards to high school athletes in Michigan.

Men who run sandlot baseball teams or golf tournaments or ping pong meets just don't seem to understand the State Association code which prescribes that no prep athlete may accept any award worth over \$5 . . . and the award must be limited to a medal, badge, letter, or something like that.

A \$4 baseball mitt or sweater is OUT.

Yet, there are those who think they are smart. They try to beat the law and figure that they can get away with giving a jacket, a set of golf clubs or as once was the case, a set of fishing equipment.

**THE STATE ASSOCIATION** and Charles Forsythe, the veteran director, don't hop around with snooping noses. But when they hear of such violations, they act.

Who suffers?

The youngsters who took the gifts and their high school teams. More than once a prep team has been forced to forfeit a victory because a prep accepted an illegal award . . . and more than one boy has been barred from competing in high school action because he took something he shouldn't.

As long as there are sports, those involved are bound to get special treatment.

It makes no difference what the level of competition — grade school, high school, college or professional . . . people like to do something extra for athletes.

This has to be the real story of what has been happening at Michigan and Michigan State and likely at a hundred other colleges around the country.

To have an All American and his date attend your theater, or lunch in your restaurant or shop in your store for a tie has to mean something to the merchant.

The whole thing strikes of jealousy, perhaps, although we suspect that many an editor on the Michigan Daily graciously has accepted free tickets from the same shows where they insist the athletes have gone without paying a nickel either.

**POT SHOTS:** Good friend Duke Fisher at J. L. Hudson's passes along the word that the giant department store will televise this year's State Class A basketball finale into the Detroit area. On the same night, fans here also will be treated to the NCAA cage finale via the tube.

In case you're wondering, the annual cage classic begins in Michigan on March 4. The pattern of play remains unchanged from the past — districts, regionals, quarterfinals, semifinals and finally the state finals. The windup again takes place at Michigan State.

It's ironic that Livonia's Alex Delvecchio is enjoying his best season with the Red Wings, but the Wings are having one of their worst years in a long time.

Thurston High has rated among the top five in wrestling this season in the state.

## Suburbanites Help Make Poodle Most Popular

In Farmington about a year ago, this newspaper found, from a veterinary's records, that the poodle was not only the most popular purebred dog, but that poodles were more numerous practically than the omnipresent mongrel.

Livonia Kennel Club shows have drawn more poodle entrants than any other breed. And the poodle is the most popular purebred in America with about 30 per cent of the 1967 registrations, says Berkeley Rice, writing in The New York Times Magazine.

RICE, AUTHOR of the forthcoming "The Other End of the Leash" (Little, Brown & Co.), finds that the poodle is more than simply fashionable.

It is a small dog, and "it is a 'people dog' at a time when pets are becoming increasingly humanized." He quotes a vet: "They're probably the most sociable animal alive."

In his New York Times Magazine article, Rice quotes a Cape Cod poodle grooming shop owner as saying: "They HAVE to be kept clean. Most of them sleep with their owners. You find almost everybody with a poodle lets the dog sleep on or in the bed."

Until the 1920s, the poodle was in danger of becoming extinct in America. Rice says fashionable society considered the poodle sissy, decadent, useless.

THE MAN WHO made the toy poodle (5-10 pounds) popular is Count Alexis Pulaski, 73, who came to America from Russia in 1926.

In recent years, Pulaski has been at odds with the AKC and

the Poodle Club of America. The clubs are horrified at his breeding of parti-colored poodles.

Originally, Pulaski points out, the poodle was an aristocrat's hunter, but as the aristocracy aged it came indoors and brought the poodle with it. Rice quotes him:

"Then the French came in and started clipping the poodle to look like a lion. Can you imagine that stupidity? They shaved his back and let the hair grow out around his head until he looked like a mop. And those stupid asses in the Poodle Club, in 1885, they made that monster—the lion clip—the standard..."

"It feels to them that when they hang on the tail of a dog clipped like a lion that they are aristocrats."

PULASKI PREFERS the Dutch clip with a pantaloons effect for the dog's legs.

"The poodles of today have deteriorated because people are breeding for form and for show, not for character or temperament. These Poodle Club people are not breeding to the best dogs. The word 'pet' is a derogatory term for them," Pulaski is quoted.

"You should try to breed for temperament, willingness to please, and a radiation of charm to become a member of the family."

## An Expert Writes... Of Dining And Fine Wine

Smart hosts and hostesses alike are ever alert to ways of lowering the high cost of entertaining. Today liquid refreshments make up the lion's share of the party dollar and often when it comes time to foot the bill you must really put your foot down. You aren't getting enough smiles per gallon.

A sharp businessman might analyze his financial position more closely than say his party checkbook yet it is good business to apply office hours know-how to after-hours planning.

Everyone likes to go first class and why not? Beverage preferences today run the gamut from soda pop to 12-year old Scotch with all the in-between budget breakers.

LET'S ASSUME naturally enough that your parties are fun whether at home or in your favorite restaurant. Guests are more flexible when dining-out for a restaurateur has a superb inventory and the home bar and wine cellar is not designed to compete.

Now...do you offer martinis, manhattans or other cocktails regularly before dinner is served and perhaps open a bottle of the appropriate wine during and finish the evening with cigarettes and a liqueur? Hmm? If so you are the American "meat and potatoes" host.

Today wines of all types permit a greater flexibility for entertaining than ever before and nearly always more flexible on your purse. The five wine classifications or types are: Appetizer (apertif), white table, red table, sparkling and dessert wines.

When planning an evening using only wine as refreshment figure one fifth per guest for the evening. Sound like a lot, it's not when spread over several hours and beginning with an apertif wine.

Sweet Italian Vermouth on the rocks with a silver dollar size piece of California orange peel broken and singed (flame of match) over the drink is worth a dollar a drink in a New York restaurant. At home this Vermouth as Orange Flambe' will cost you 15¢ to make. A vodka of gin martini will cost easily twice that and not be as "romantic".

You needn't serve both a white and red wine with your meal as your menu may warrant one or the other. Figure 7-9 oz. of wine per person and remember...25.6 oz. in every fifth. So if wine sells for \$2.56 a bottle it costs you 10¢ an ounce or 30¢ per drink as you should pour an 8 oz. all-purpose wine glass slightly less than half full so that one may swirl the wine in the glass easily.

McDermott, 27, had retired four years ago after capturing the lone United States gold medal in the same event at Innsbruck.

He had done little skating until he started preparing to defend his title here.

Many laughed at his chances. McDermott laughed back.

THE ODDS against his doing anything here swelled when he had to wait until the last group before he could toe the mark.

By that time, the course was rough and also the ice was sloppy because of the sun.

For his performance, McDermott received a silver medal, the fourth fashioned by an American in the Games.

When it was all over, McDermott announced he was retiring. This time, he said, there'd be no more comebacks.

Meantime, Czechoslovakia pulled off a major upset in hockey, downing Russia, 5-4, to create a first-place tie for first place. Canada also was in the three-way deadlock for the top slot with a 5-1 record similar to that of the Czechs and Russians.
