### Bulletin

## observerland

**FARMINGTON** — The U. S. Department of Interior granted the City of Farmington \$20,000 this week to assist in purchase of 10 acres on Drake Rd. for development of a neighborhood park. City Manager John Dinan told the City Council funds now make it possible to acquire the land either by negotiation or condemnation.

**FARMINGTON** — Township Supervisor Curtis Hall has predicted the average tax increase for township property owners in 1968 will be approximately 18 per cent following reassessment of all of the area's 18,000 parcels.

**REDFORD** — Prominent Redford businessman, playwright and civic leader Anthony J. Sansone suffered fatal injuries in a Florida auto accident Monday. His wife, Jean, is reportedly recovering after surgery at Miami Baptist hospital for critical injuries. Their car jumped a highway divider and became involved in a three-car crash. Mrs. Sansone is believed to be the only survivor.

**REDFORD** — Police are searching for a man in his early 20's who shot a Redford Township gas station attendant about 2 a.m. Tuesday after walking in, talking with and robbing 51-year-old Elmer Parks. Parks survived. He was shot once while kneeling on orders from the assailant. The bullet entered just below his right eye and exited from his right cheek.

**LIVONIA** — Livonia's runoff election April 1 will see Mayor Harvey W. Moeke opposed by Council President Peter A. Ventura, who ran more than 3,000 votes behind Moeke in Monday's primary. City Clerk Addison Bacon led all candidates for nomination, swamping his own opposition and second runner Robert L. Allison almost 5 to 1. Three incumbent councilmen led the eight nominees for four council seats, with a woman among the first five. About one-third of the 37,950 registered voters cast ballots.

**WESTLAND** — The City Council received a report that while it should continue to hire private contractors to collect garbage and rubbish, companies "are pricing themselves out of business" and cities will be forced to go into the rubbish pickup business themselves.

## McKeon-Vallier Feud Breaks Out In Open

The long smoldering feud between City Commissioners James McKeon and Arch Vallier over the city water problem broke into the open at the Commission meeting Monday night with a series of charges and counter charges the like of which hasn't been heard in the legislative chambers in many a moon.

Like most explosions, this one ignited suddenly, during a discussion over selection of a date for the special election on the open housing amendment.

Commissioner McKeon took exception to Vallier's plea that no time should be lost and that the election date should be set as soon as possible.

McKeon countered by asking City Attorney Charles Lowe if the election had to be

confined to the housing ordinance or whether other items could be placed before the voters at the same time.

"I'd like to set a date far enough away," Commissioner McKeon stated, "so that we could study some other matters—particularly the water problem. And I'd like enough time so that we could do our homework."

Then with a wry smile he added, "You know, colored water is a problem in the city, too."

Commissioner McKeon then charged that 25 months ago he and Mayor James Jabara had asked for a water study and they have yet to have a report.

That ignited the bomb and Vallier, who is chairman of the Water Commission, shot back:

"Commissioner McKeon was asked to

serve on the water committee and refused. Now, he's asking for reports."

"I never refused to serve," McKeon countered, "but when there isn't a meeting for three and four months at a time, there is no committee."

Then looking squarely at Vallier he went on:

"Sure, you are the chairman—but you've never called a meeting of the committee. All I ever hear from you is I think this, or I believe this—there never is a report of the committee. You make it a one-man operation."

With voice raised high Vallier fired — "I will bring in a report when I am ready to bring it in. And not because of your pressure."

"There are a lot of problems yet to be

## PEA Negotiator Tells Of Goals

With negotiations already underway between the Plymouth Board of Education team and that representing the Plymouth Education Association, bargaining agency for the professional staff, the Observer interviewed Ray Homer, head of the PEA team, about his thoughts and his group's goals this year.

It will be recalled that negotiations continued through July last year before the teams finally reached accord on money matters.

Homer, who has Bachelor and Master degrees from Eastern Michigan University, has had 12 years teaching experience at the high school level. He is the president-elect of the PEA with responsibility for the salary package.

Following are the questions asked Homer and his answers as head of the PEA team.  
QUESTION: You've had considerable experience in negotiations. Do you anticipate any difficulties in negotiating an agreement this year?  
ANSWER: "Negotiations are always difficult, even under the best of circumstances, but we reached agreement on the contracts in '66 and '67, and I'm hopeful that we will work it out again—without the difficulties experienced in some other communities."

QUESTION: "Outside of the salary question, which areas cause you concern?"

ANSWER: "The most sensitive question is class size. Some of our class sizes are not conducive to a quality program. Plymouth teachers, and teachers generally, are not anywhere as militant as one might expect from all the news about strikes last September. Teachers do not want to be exploited as far as compensation is concerned, but just as important to teachers is the opportunity to do a professional job of teaching. Nothing is more discouraging to a conscientious teacher than

overloaded classrooms. They make it impossible to provide the educational experience and the individual attention that so many of our young people need. Teaching reading in an overloaded classroom is especially damaging to students having difficulties and this overloading creates problems at every level thereafter."

QUESTION: "Would you list other areas of concern?"  
ANSWER: "Teachers would like a greater voice in curriculum development, teacher evaluation, raising professional standards, and hiring practices. Of course, we won't get everything."

## Albright Gets Added Duties

Plymouth Township Public Services Director Paul J. Albright has been appointed as Township Civil Defense Director in conjunction with his other duties.

The post has been vacant since the death of Matt McLellan, former civil defense head and chief of the DPW and building inspection department.

## City To Supervise Garbage Pick - Up

Although the contracts have not yet been signed the City of Plymouth is going into the garbage collection business as a means of solving a problem that has plagued the City Commission for years.

Agreeing in principle with the report of the Garbage Committee, the City Commission, without a dissenting vote approved a contract calling for Stanley Denski, the present collector to act as an agent of the city beginning March 1.

Under the terms of the new pact, which Denski has agreed to, according to Commissioner Arch Vallier, chairman of the committee, a new rate scale has been set that is more equitable.

"But, more than that," Vallier pointed out, "it gives the city the authority to impose the littering laws and we will handle all future problems with the commercial agents and the residents."

Heretofore, Denski collected the garbage on his own, but at rates approved by the city.

UNDER THESE FEES, he was paid according to the water meters. For example, if an apartment house had only one water meter, he received 90 cents for each three units.

A new plan also has been worked out for business places in the downtown area. Flat fees have been established on the basis of three or five pickups each week.

Here are the terms of the new pact:

a. The City of Plymouth will pay the Contractor 90 cents a month per each three (3) dwelling units that exists in an apartment complex over ten (10) units in size. This will provide for one pickup per week. It will be up to the apartment owner or management to provide sufficient containers on the premises for his tenants to accumulate refuse, in order that collection can be provided once a week.

b. In exchange for this, the contractor agrees to enter on to all apartment complex premises where it is physically possible to do so, and make the collection at vantage points on the premises, as arranged by the management, rather than to try to insist on management of

the apartment complex placing containers at the curb for pickup.

2. For Commercial collections, the City agrees to the offer of Stanley Denski to provide five day pickup, or three day pickup, to the locations as outlined in his letter of December

10, 1967, for monthly charges as follows:

It will be up to the property owner whether he is to receive three-day or five-day pickup. It will be understood, however, that the City will enforce the anti-litter ordinance, and if a commercial establishment is keeping his refuse in unsuitable

## Open Housing Vote Scheduled For April 29

After discussing the subject for more than an hour Monday night the City Commission finally decided by a vote of 5 to 2, to place the much discussed open housing ordinance on the

ballot at a special election on Monday, April 29.

The Commission acted after City Clerk Gene Slider presented 610 certified signatures on the 39 petitions that had

been circulated by the voters who protested the adoption of the ordinance last December 4. The vote at that time was 4 to 3, with Mayor James Jabara, and Commissioners George Hudson and Arch Vallier opposing it.

Under law, the City Commission had 30 days in which to act on the certified petition. Once action was taken the Commission had to set an election date not sooner than 40 days nor longer than 90 days.

When given the details of the law the Commission engaged in a long, drawn out discussion.

Commissioner Vallier asked that action be taken as quickly as possible.

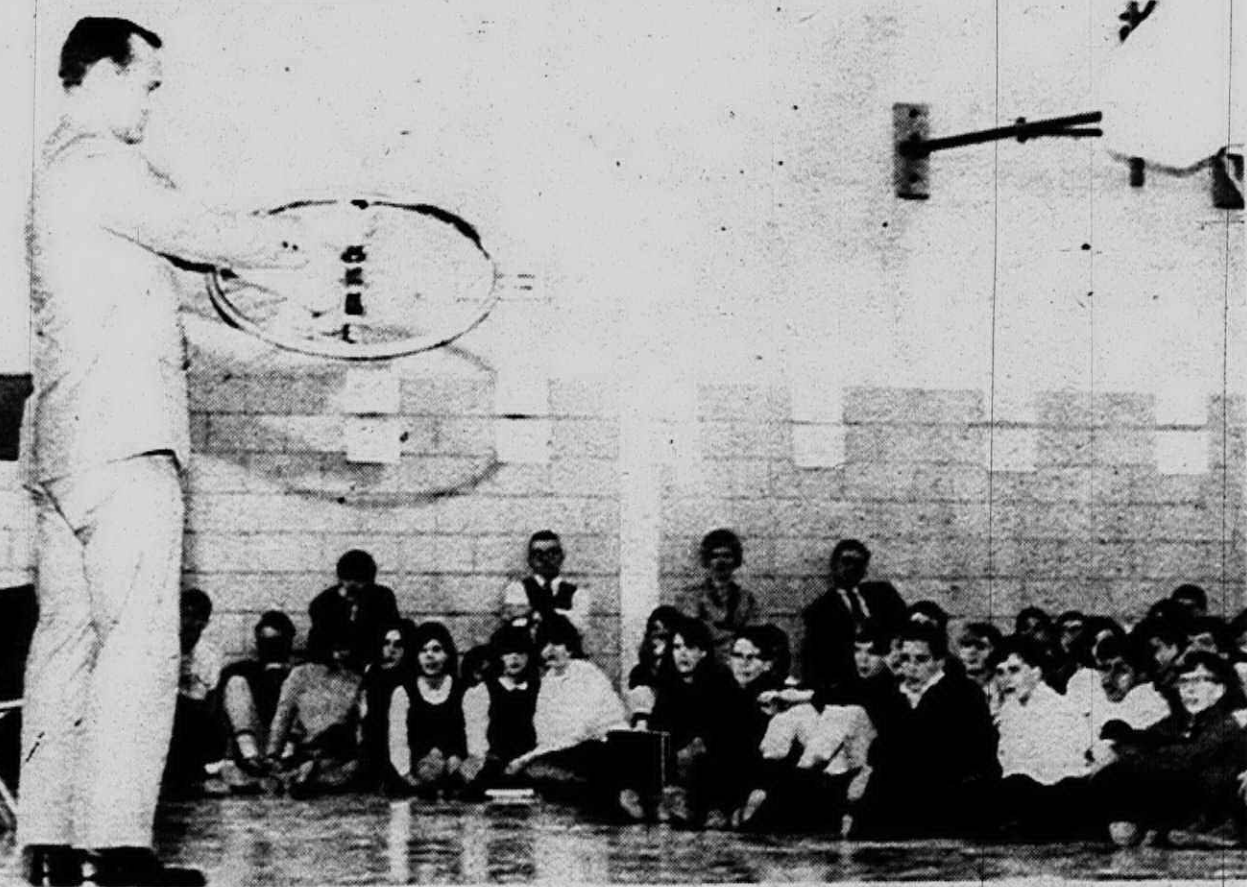
"I don't need to tell you why we should take immediate action," he said, "You all know why—and I'm not going to say any more."

Only a few minor property damage accidents were reported over the week-end in the Plymouth area.

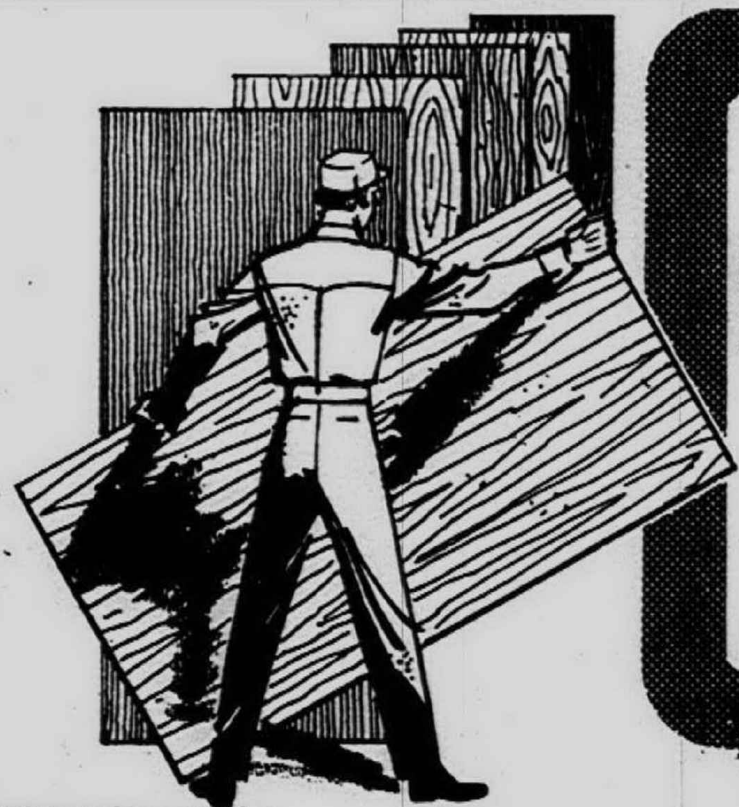
The Wayne County Sheriff's Department and the Plymouth City Police reported that it was one of the quietest week-ends of the year.

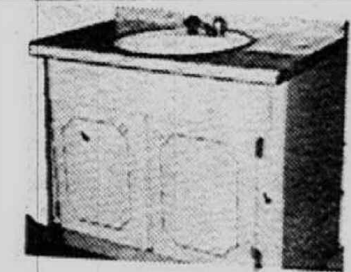

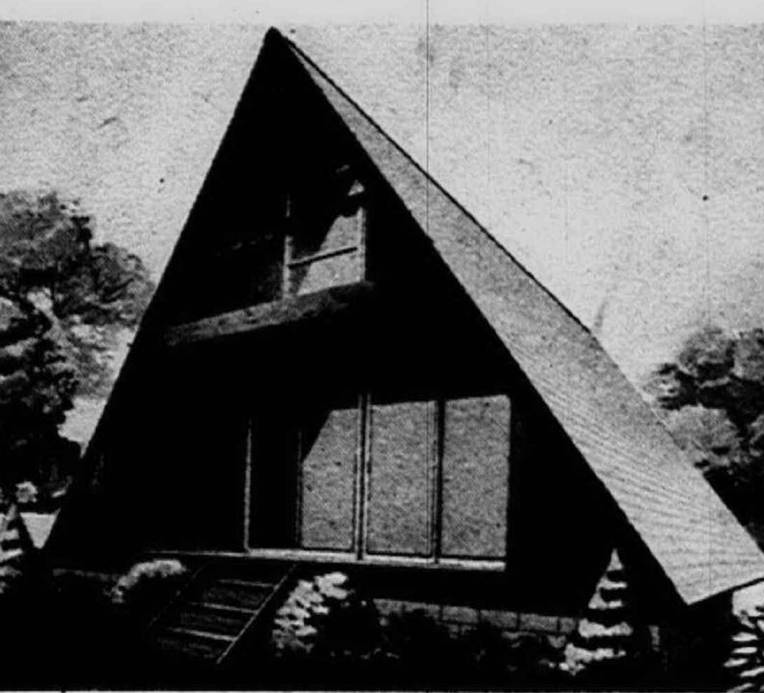

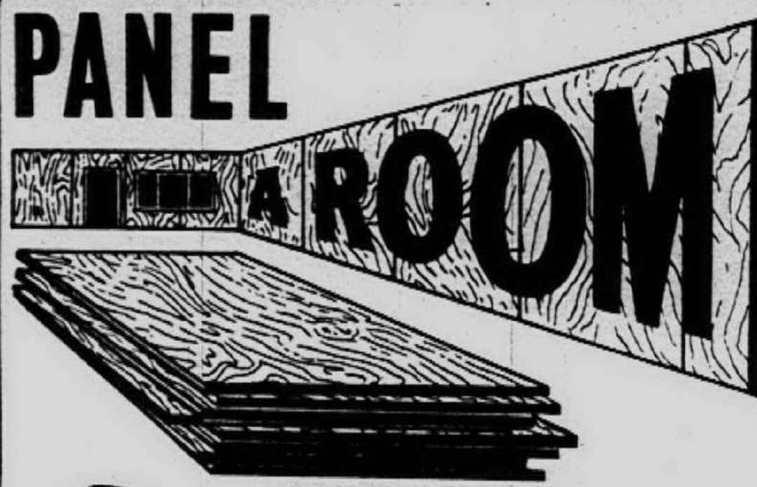

## New Draft Regulations Hit By Education Chief

MORE THAN 50 per cent of Florida's teachers resigned Monday in a bid for higher pay and more money for education. Some of the state's 67 county school systems planned to try operating with substitutes, supervisory personnel and teachers who have not resigned. Others have had to shut down completely. As the crisis came to a head, Gov. Claude Kirk begged teachers not to "desert your children."

PRESIDENT Lyndon Johnson announced that under new Selective Service regulations only graduate students in medical or dental schools or those in at least their second year of higher schooling will be granted deferments. In response to Johnson's announcement, President Logan Wilson of the American Council in Education urged "the administration and Congress to consider a system of random selection at the earliest possible moment" to spread the impact of the decision over all ages and classifications of draft eligibles.

ALEXANDER TROWBRIDGE was the third presidential cabinet official to announce his resignation. When he steps down as Commerce Secretary, he will leave President Johnson with three new faces on his top level advisory staff for the election year.

WILLIAM COLEMAN, 36, has been arrested on a 12-count first-degree murder charge after being accused of intentionally setting a fire that killed 12 Moberly, Mo. tavern patrons. Fire Chief Leroy Willis said Coleman did it "as a grudge" because he was barred from patronizing the tavern.

AUTOMOBILE insurance on a payroll deduction plan may be coming to Ohio. Continental National American Insurance group of Chicago has submitted the plan to the Ohio State Department of Insurance. The state agency has challenged the plan and will have public hearings where the company is expected to furnish an explanation of finer details March 4 and 5.

THE AMERICAN Bar Association's top-drawer Board of Governors recommended the adoption of new guidelines limiting what the public may know about pending criminal cases. The controversial restrictions—which would be imposed on police, judges, and lawyers as well as reporters and editors—will go before the ABA's House of Delegates.

VICE-PRESIDENT Hubert H. Humphrey, urging draft-law revisions, said, "It's the non-student that really gets hooked in this one and really gets

hooked up." The man who is not in school, Humphrey declared, is "the one who really has the problem," for students, knowing their rights under the law, "have really less to complain about Selective Service than most other people."

SEN. EVERETT McKinley Dirksen (R-Ill.) announced he will seek a fourth term—saying he did not want to leave his spot in a crisis that is "more serious than we think."

PRESIDENT Johnson has named Frank Pace Jr., former secretary of the army and former director of the budget bureau, to be chairman of the new Public Broadcasting Corp. The Public Broadcasting Corp. was set by the Legislature last Nov. 7 to provide financial assistance for noncommercial educational television and radio broadcasting.

A COLLECTION of 87 documents from the Revolutionary War period, including 51 identified as letters written by George Washington, has been discovered in a Vermont home and entrusted to the library of Union College in Schenectady, N.Y. The college said the collection contains a host of documents signed by prominent figures of the period including John Adams, Benedict Arnold, Alexander Hamilton, John Jay, Benjamin Franklin, George Clinton, Nathaniel Greene, John Hancock, Thaddeus Kosciuszko, Charles Lee, Israel Putnam, Edmund Randolph and Philip Schuyler.

THE NATIONAL Safety Council announced that fatalities from firearms and poisonings in homes increased in 1967 in spite of the lowest yearly homes-accident death rate per 100,000 persons dropped from 15.1 in 1966 to 14.4 in 1967—an all time low. Home firearm accident deaths reached 1,600 last year—an increase of 7 per cent over the 1,500 fatalities in 1966.

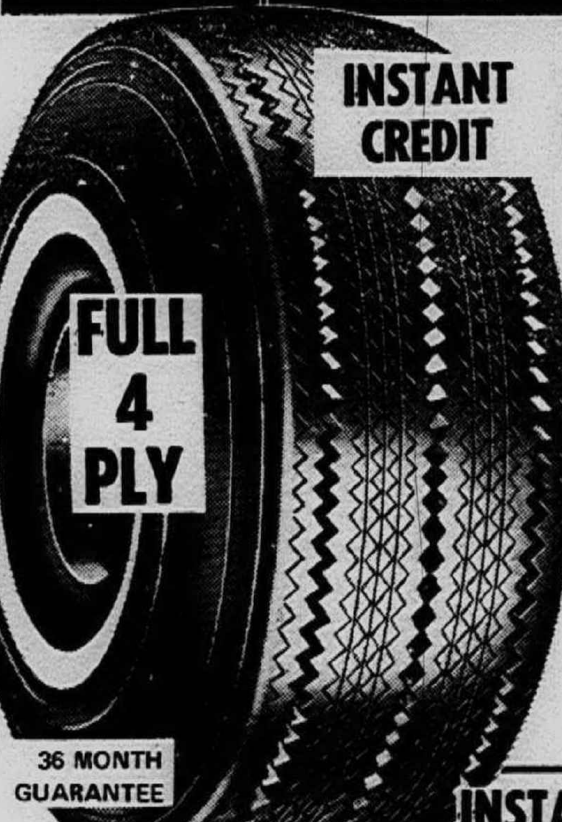

# Vandals Smash Car Windows

## Hit 100 Autos In 3 Areas

Three Observerland communities' police departments were baffled Monday after more than 100 broken car windows were reported over the weekend.

Redford Township, Livonia and Westland residents' autos and homes were the victims of vandalism which, in general, began Friday and seemed to taper off Sunday night.

Police said they have no leads so far. Apparently someone drove along residential streets shooting out windows, with pellet guns.

THE SOUTHEASTERN portion of Livonia--south of Plymouth Rd. and east of Middle Belt--was the hardest hit of the three areas with 70 incidents in a four-day period.

Livonia police said that complaints began to trickle in Thursday and became heavier during the weekend.

Three complaints involved house windows.

Police said the hardest hit street was Clements Circle, where eight cars were struck.

Livonia Police also said that instances of this kind of vandalism occurred last year, about the same time and in the same part of the city. However, no connection was drawn between the two cases.

REDFORD TOWNSHIP Police reported that 22 broken window complaints came to them over Saturday and Sunday and were centered in the south end of the township.

No homes were marred. Police said that seven complaints were turned in Saturday and 15 Sunday.

They said the hardest hit was the Presbyterian Village Subdivision where seven cars were damaged.

EIGHTEEN complaints were received by the Westland Police Department. The north end of that city seemed to be the focal point of the window breakings.

Between Friday, and Sunday, 15 auto windshields, two homes and one medical office were hit, police were told.

The streets involved were Melvin, Gladys, Gary, Liberty, Hubbard, Merriman, Perrin and Carrousel.

Westland police said that, as near as they can determine, most of the window breakings occurred during the day.

In all three areas, police could give no indication of why it happened or who did it.

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH and Plymouth Township, which weren't involved this time, were hit by similar blasts three years ago.

At that time, more than 28 cars were damaged throughout the Plymouth community--all apparently by pellet guns. Police never did solve the incidents which happened at just about the same time of the year as in this case.

## McDonald Promoted By Chevy

The appointment of F. James McDonald as Director of Manufacturing Operations of the Chevrolet Motor Division, a new position, was announced Monday by E.M. Estes, general manager.

## State PTA Head Honor Two Men In Area Blasts Private School Aid Bill

THE PRESIDENT of the Michigan Congress of Parents and Teachers will fight proposals for additional state aid for non-public schools. A.B. Haist, of Saginaw, called the proposal "another step in a concerted effort which began in 1964 and which has continued annually under the leadership of a well-organized private interest group."

He cited the 1964 passage of a bill to provide public school bus service for private school children, the 1965 Auxiliary Services act, and the 1966 Tuition Grant bill for private universities. "This is a well-organized, shrewd and thus far effective operation by a group with apparently at least enough money to do the job they feel is necessary," Haist said.

RECENT STUDENT PROPOSALS for a greater voice in academic and financial affairs of the University of Detroit were met at week's end, the university said, by:

1. Creation of a student-faculty-administration board to study rights and responsibilities of students, faculty, and administrators.
2. Organization of Students for Quality Education (S.Q.E.) an informal group devoted to utilizing existing student-administration channels "to achieve continuing improvement in the academic climate of the University of Detroit." S.Q.E. had signed up more than 200 supporters by Friday afternoon.

## State And Local News Round Up

The dispute broke out when students picketed in protest of a heavy U-D tuition increase. Their demands included better campus security and dorm maintenance, a voice in faculty hiring and merit pay decisions and a representative on the budget committee.

An official U-D publicity statement began by saying the issues were resolved, but in the 12th paragraph U-D President Malcolm Carron, S.J., said: "It should be made clear that I have agreed to none of the demands. . . I have agreed to the creation of a vehicle to sustain that (student) interest."

GOV. GEORGE ROMNEY, swamped by the greatest organized mail campaign in Michigan history, has ordered his staff to abandon all efforts to answer the flood of letters promoting state aid for non-public schools. The governor's office alone has received well over 20,000 letters in the last two weeks on the issue. State senators and representatives have also been deluged by mail.

THE BILL TO REORGANIZE Michigan's lower court system was reported out of the House Appropriations Committee last week with a cut in the proposed salaries of the judges from \$20,000 to \$15,000. The lower court bill would establish a new system of district courts to replace the present justices of the peace and municipal judges.

MRS. ELLA KOEZE, longtime Republican party worker in Michigan, announced her retirement as national committee-woman effective at the end of the GOP national convention in Miami Beach. State GOP Chairman Elly Peterson is expected to succeed Mrs. Koeze.

INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS, such as Wayne County Intermediate, will be given a new power to establish building authorities if a bill passed in the House last week is approved by the Senate.

THE SELECTIVE SERVICE announcement Friday that graduate school deferments, with the exception of medicine, dentistry and related fields, will be discontinued, threatens to have a large effect on graduate students and teaching assistants in Michigan Universities. Michigan State University's dean of advanced graduate studies, Dr. Jacob Vinocur, predicted that MSU could lose some of its most promising scholars as a result of the change.

THREE MASKED GUNMEN escaped with nearly \$4,000 from a Lansing Wholesale Grocery firm last weekend after locking 19 employees and customers in an empty truck. Police freed the 19, who were not injured, after about 45 minutes. In addition to money taken from the firm, 15 of the victims were also robbed.

THE NAMES OF seven Michigan servicemen killed in the Vietnam War have been released by the Defense Department. Included is army Spec. 4 Gerald A. Tucker, of Dearborn Heights.

## Honor Two Men In Area

Two men who saved the life of a heart attack victim on a farm on Six Mile Rd. were given National Safety Council awards for heroism today in ceremonies at the Thunderbird Inn in Plymouth.

The two are Henry J. Clark, a Northville farmer and Louis R. Schomberger, of South Lyon, a Consumer Power Co. employee.

Charles Fox, whose farm is at 7808 Six Mile Rd., was stricken as he and Clark started the late afternoon chores. Clark started mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.

SCHOMBERGER, passing by enroute to buying a side of beef from Fox, joined the fight for his life. Schomberger had undergone emergency training as part of a Consumers Power Co. program.

Schomberger gave Clark instructions on resuscitation and himself performed closed chest heart massage. Together they revived Fox.

Schomberger was presented the President's Medal and Clark the President's Certificate.

Northville City Manager Frank Ollendorff and John B. Simpson, vice president of gas operations, were among the dignitaries at the presentation luncheon staged by Consumers Power Co.

## Forum Charges College With Unfair Acts

Charging negotiations with the administration team has reached an impasse for the second consecutive year, the Schoolcraft College Faculty Forum negotiating team has been forced to file unfair labor practice charges with the Michigan State Labor Mediation Board, according to Chairman Tony Rizzo, head of the faculty group.

Rizzo indicated the charges had been filed with the Mediation Board last week, contending that the administration team has refused to bargain in good faith and is continuing to refuse to bargain a Master Contract.

Schoolcraft College Vice President John Brinn, head of the administration team, was unavailable for comment Tuesday morning.

The unfair labor practices complaint was received in the offices of the State Mediation Board in the Cadillac Square Building in Detroit Monday. The case has been assigned to Trial Examiner Joseph Bixler who is expected to set a date of hearing in another week or 10 days.

HOWARD KAHN, assistant to President Dr. Eric Bradner, stated that he had no knowledge of the filing of charges with the mediation board.

"As of Monday afternoon," Kahn said, "The administration team hadn't heard of the action. We went through this same kind of procedure about 17 times a year ago and it looks as if the same tactics are being started again."

Kahn is not a member of the administration team but part of his assignment is that of handling public relations and publicity for the college.

IN A RELEASE to The Ob-

server Monday afternoon, the Faculty Forum team charged that the Board of Trustees representatives will not enter into negotiations until the Faculty Forum is prepared to meet its unilaterally determined conditions on how to negotiate. The release indicates the Board team has demanded that the Faculty meet nine conditions before negotiations, one of which would have the Faculty sign away its right to bargain--a right guaranteed by Michigan law.

## Area Republicans Are Warned 'This Is Year For Alarm'

From the other side of the Roma Hall banquet room came the sounds of loud dance music, laughter and singing.

But the tone of the Lincoln Day banquet of the 19th District-Wayne Republicans was somber.

"A year ago, on a lecture tour at Michigan colleges, I said there was reason for concern. This year there is reason for alarm."

The speaker was Fulton Lewis III, conservative documentary film-maker and successor to his late father as a network radio commentator.

HE'S A MORE polished speaker than his father, but his approach to national politics is the same.

There's an overriding contempt for the U.S. State Department ("lace handkerchief diplomacy"), a disgust at Ivy League colleges (76 per cent of surveyed freshmen, he said, believe there is a "constitutional right" to be financially cared for by the federal government) and a heavy shower of facts from non-establishment sources (e.g., Otto von Hapsburg and a brother-in-law who is a military commander in the Vietnam theater).

Yet after a gloomy recitation of the state of affairs, Lewis said Republicans have reason for hope. Teen Republican clubs have three times as many members as the left-wing Students for Democratic Action; Young Republicans for the first time outnumber Young Democrats; and President Johnson is beatable.

SOME 200 OF the party faithful paid \$10 a head for the smorgasbord dinner with an Italian accent.

The party faithful seemingly included a number of non-partisan Livonia city candidates, one of whom managed to have his wife and himself called to the telephone over the public address system.

LEWIS' MAJOR criticism of U.S. foreign policy is that "there are no long-term objectives."

containers, or is allowing it to be strewn on the ground, or allowing it to be blown throughout the downtown area, he will be ticketed for this practice.

3. Business refuse will be picked up from alleys or from private properties as the practice in the past has been. It is to be understood that the Contractor will agree, where it is possible for him, to drive his truck into an alley, or private way, he shall do so to make the collection. It is also agreed that the Contractor will continue to carry sufficient insurance to enable him to do so.

4. It is agreed that the normal ordinary user of refuse with under 300 gallons of refuse accumulation per week shall continue to be able to dispose of his refuse at no charge.

5. It is agreed that where a charge is to be made, it will be made on the basis of that outlined in the letter of December 10, 1967, with a \$13 per month minimum, three-day pickup charge, where necessary, and a \$22 per month minimum five-day pickup charge. Charges would be based on volume collected. Occasional excess of volume by individual merchants is allowable, if it happens infrequently. See also Analysis of Commercial and Industrial Refuse Collections With Proposed Charges and Comments.

6. The City will do all billing of any charges levied against merchants. For this service, the City will deduct 10 per cent of the billing collection. The City agrees to provide the contractor with his money as earned, and any customer in arrears will have the bills certified to his tax rolls, if necessary.

Our recent hearing on the effects of Selective Service draft policies toward graduate and junior college students visibly demonstrated the need for immediate Presidential clarification. Unless such action is taken soon these institutions of higher education face a disastrous situation.

The emergency stems from new Selective Service policies that may result in the drafting of up to 50 per cent of first and second year graduate students this year. The policies are based on Congressional changes in the system which sought to eliminate graduate school as a draft haven. But administrative interpretation of the new law is seriously en-

dangerous essential educational programs.

I AM CONCERNED about the effect on the future of our society caused by the interruption of graduate programs already started by many young men. Our social sciences are becoming increasingly important, but it now appears as though promising students will be interrupted in the middle of their academic careers. Indications are that they will be less likely to complete their education if it is interrupted for a two year period. Non-medical science students will also be affected and the nation will suffer from the lack of young engineers, physicists, bi-

ologists, and other researchers.

As was pointed out in the hearing, the consequences of the new draft policy on the increasing need for more teachers could be staggering. The nation can ill afford to close down teacher training programs but may be forced to if enrollments are cut severely by the draft.

Current policies are also discriminatory against students from low income families and those from disadvantaged homes. Two year occupational programs may be their only chance for higher education and they should not be penalized because their parents are unable to support them through an entire four year bachelor's degree program. Yet Selective Service Director Hershey has ruled that they are not eligible for student deferments.

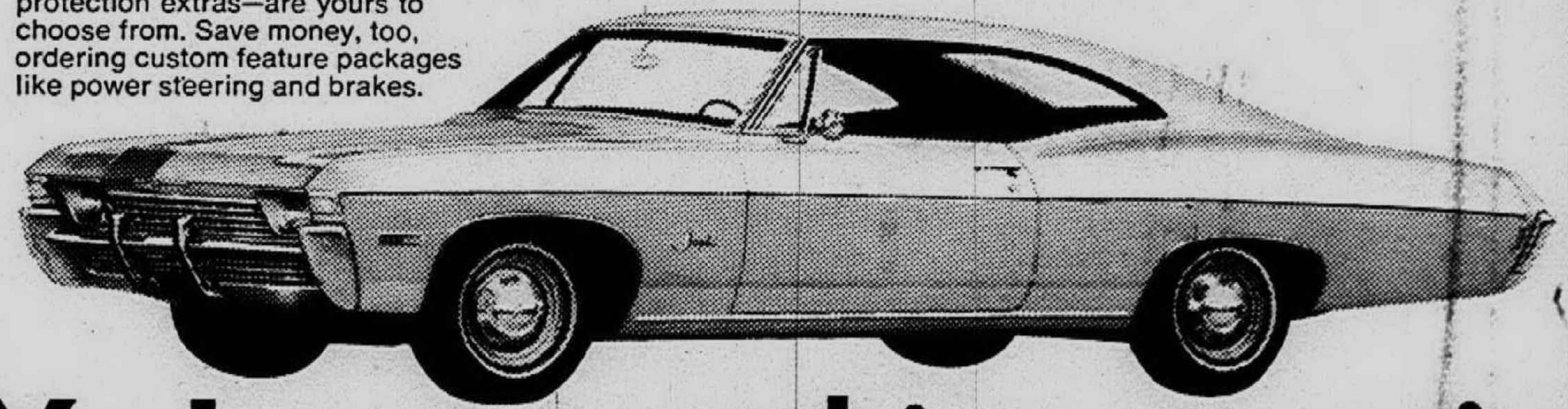

## Kuhn, O'Neil Hedge On School Aid Issue

James F. O'Neil and George Kuhn are two suburban office holders who usually have strong views.

But on the issue of whether non-public schools should get state aid, they're hedging. O'Neil, a Republican from Livonia, is a member of the State Board of Education. Kuhn, a West Bloomfield Republican, represents several Oberlin communities in the State Senate.

TENS OF THOUSANDS of letters have poured into the offices of Gov. Romney and top legislative leaders, all seeking aid under the so-called "voucher" system—in which a check would go to a non-public student rather than directly to the school. Individual legislators are to be the next target of the barrage (see an earlier story on the Public Affairs Page, 10E).

"I'M COMPLETELY open-minded," said O'Neil. "There's a need to study all the facts."

"We (the State Board) had the spokesmen for Citizens for Education Freedom (CEF)—the group boosting the aid idea—in to explain their side. We're going to hear the opponents in a couple of weeks."

"The opponents seem to feel that to give this kind of aid would encourage more private schools. They point out that the state constitution provides for 'public schools,' not 'general education.'"

"I've said before that this would be a controversial issue. The State Board of Education insisted on bringing non-public schools into the study of all school financial problems, a study that was issued last month."

"PAROCHIAL schools have 330,000 students, or about 15 per cent of the two million pup-

ils in Michigan," O'Neil said. "In the fall of 1966, the parochial schools wanted to cut their pupil-teacher ratios. This added 20,000 or 25,000 students to the public schools."

And in further defense of the non-public schools, O'Neil pointed to the State Board-funded study which showed that non-public schools are doing a better job of integrative education at the elementary level in the inner city than are the public schools.

He estimated that 80 to 85 per cent of the non-public pupils are enrolled in Catholic schools and the bulk of the rest in Lutheran and Christian Reformed ("Dutch") schools.

SEN. KUHN called himself "open-minded and sympathetic" on the issue.

Kuhn said he will begin his own study of non-public schools with tours of two of them in the district this week.

## U.S. Approves New Livonia Bank Facility

# Joy-Hix Homeowners Buck Apartment

When the Livonia City Coun-

cil convenes Monday night, Feb. 26, it will face a group of angry residents armed with 139 petition signatures and plenty of determination.

Mayor Harvey Moelke was on hand at a meeting of 40 of the property owners at the home of Keith Locke, 38705 Northfield, Monday night. The residents oppose multiple dwellings.

Homeowners in Livonia's new Arbor Estates Subdivision and on Hix Rd. in the Joy-Hix Rd. area, face the possibility that 107 apartment units and a shopping center, complete with discount store, will be constructed immediately adjacent to their properties.

THE LAND in question, currently zoned R1 (residential) and C1 (light business), occupies the

northwest corner of Hix and Joy Rds., extending to Pere Rd. on the west. Eighteen Northfield Ave. residents have their yards abutting on the site.

Rose Hill Investment Co. wants this plot rezoned to R7 (multiple dwelling) and C2 (general business).

When the petition for rezoning came up before the Planning Commission in September and again on Nov. 1, the request was denied.

Rose Hill has requested a re-hearing on the decision. The Commission has gone on record

## Rezoning Asked For Apartments

A petition for rezoning of property on Ann Arbor Trail, west of Wayne Rd., for the proposed site of a \$1 million-plus apartment project, will be taken up by the City Council at its study meeting tonight at 9 p.m. in Livonia City Hall.

The Southwest Livonia Property Owners Association on Jan. 23 filed counter petitions in the City Clerk's office with 260 signatures, opposing the project.

The petition for rezoning from commercial to multiple dwelling was filed by attorneys for Michael and Vivian C. Berry, of 232 North Vernon, Dearborn. Berry is a Wayne County Road Commission member.

The apartment plans have had opposite receptions from two City Planning Commissions.

On Nov. 17, 1964, the then City Planning Commission, composed of Robert R. Whitehead, James Cameron, Donald Heusted, Charles Walker and Raymond Tent, voted 4-1 in favor of it. Heusted cast the only opposition vote.

But on Feb. 15, 1965, it was unanimously voted down by the City Council. Present at that meeting, and all voting no, were Councilmen Peter A. Ventura, Daniel Allen, John Dooley, James R. McCann, and Rudolf R. Kleinert. Councilman Edward H. McNamara was excused from the meeting and Councilman John Daugherty was absent.

Following the Council rejection, plans for the apartment project were abandoned by Detroit builder and developer Melvin B. Rosenhaus, president of the Mel Construction Company.

The second petition for rezoning was filed on behalf of the Berrys with the City Council Aug. 8, 1967, and referred to the City Planning Commission. The latter on Oct. 10 reversed the former City Planning Commission's 1964 decision and denied the Berry petition by a vote of 6-2.

Walker and Tent, members of the former commission, this time changed their vote to that cast by the majority. Heusted voted against it, also, the same vote he had cast before. Other planning commissioners voting with them, and new to the commission since the 1964 decision, were Marvin O. Moser, Donald Pollack, and Harry Wrightman.

Voting for the petition to rezone were Commissioners John Ward and Minerva K. Singer. Myra Chandler was absent.

as recommending the petition be denied. It is now up to the Council, which in the past nine months has consistently approved multiple dwellings.

MAYOR MOELKE stated his total rejection of apartments by saying, "I don't feel they are an asset to a community, and I am

thoroughly against them." The mayor has had to face a council which can sometimes override his veto.

According to the mayor, Rose Hill attempted to negotiate with the city by attempting to offer a parcel of its land for a park site in exchange for a rezoning approval.

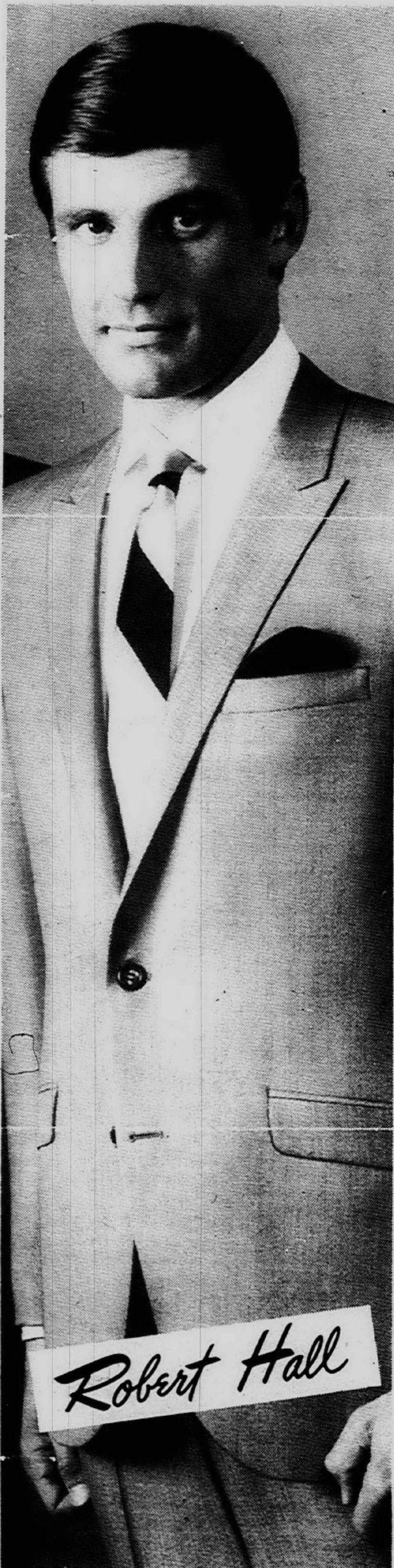

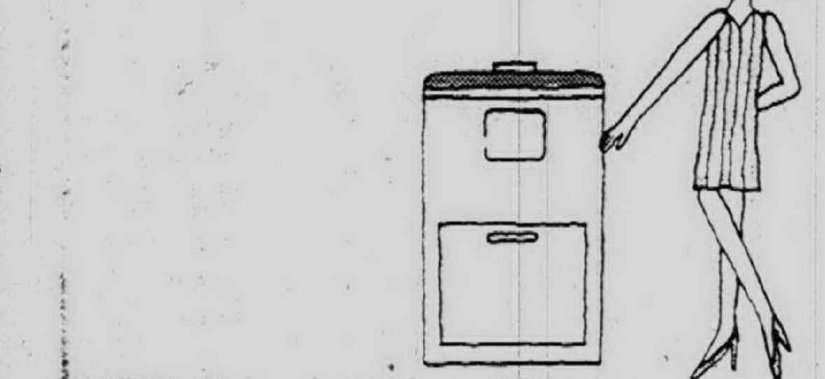

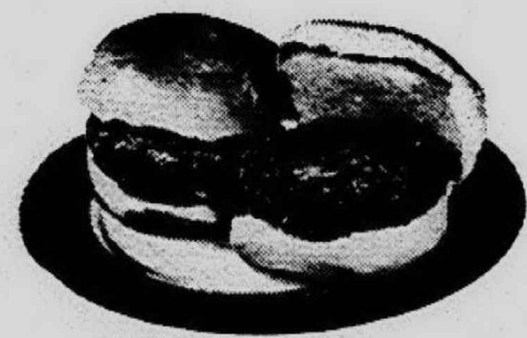

# Year Round School Bill Studied By Lawmakers

A new legislative bill, if passed, will encourage school districts to adopt the 12-month school plan, according to State Board of Education member James F. O'Neil.

O'Neil, a Livonia Republican, said the bill aims at passing out state school aid on the basis of the average daily enrollment throughout the school year.

The present law distributes aid on the basis of a single enrollment figure—the number of pupils enrolled as of the fourth Friday of the school year, sometime in October.

WHAT'S THE difference? The present law provides a flat figure. There is no incentive, O'Neil said, for school districts to adopt the year-around plan.

The new bill, by looking at average daily enrollments would provide more aid to schools which attempt to operate on a regular basis in the summer, too.

The bill, which has O'Neil's endorsement, will be introduced by State Rep. James Farnsworth, an Allegan County Republican.

O'Neil, a champion of the year-around plan, holds that the nine-month school year with a summer vacation is a vestige of the farm days and represents a partial waste of school facilities.

HE POINTED to several developments which show that his idea is catching on.

One was the Ohio Senate's passage last week of a year-around school bill. The House must concur in the Senate version for final passage.

Another was the adoption of the year-around plan by Atlanta and six neighboring school districts. Combined, they enroll one-third of Georgia's pupils, O'Neil said.

Hail to the champions!!  
It was taken for granted that Bentley High would capture the 1968 basketball championship of the Suburban Six League but even Coach George Fefles didn't realize his team had clinched the crown in the one-sided 72-46 victory over Allen Park Friday.

## Falcons' Rally Nips Stevenson

It's been repeatedly said: "No sports attraction is finished until the final siren sounds."

Take Friday night's Farmington-Stevenson basketball battle in the Interlakes Conference.  
After one quarter, it was strictly Stevenson. The Livonians led, 16-7.  
It was 32-16 for Stevenson at halftime and Stevenson still commanded a 13 point edge after three periods.

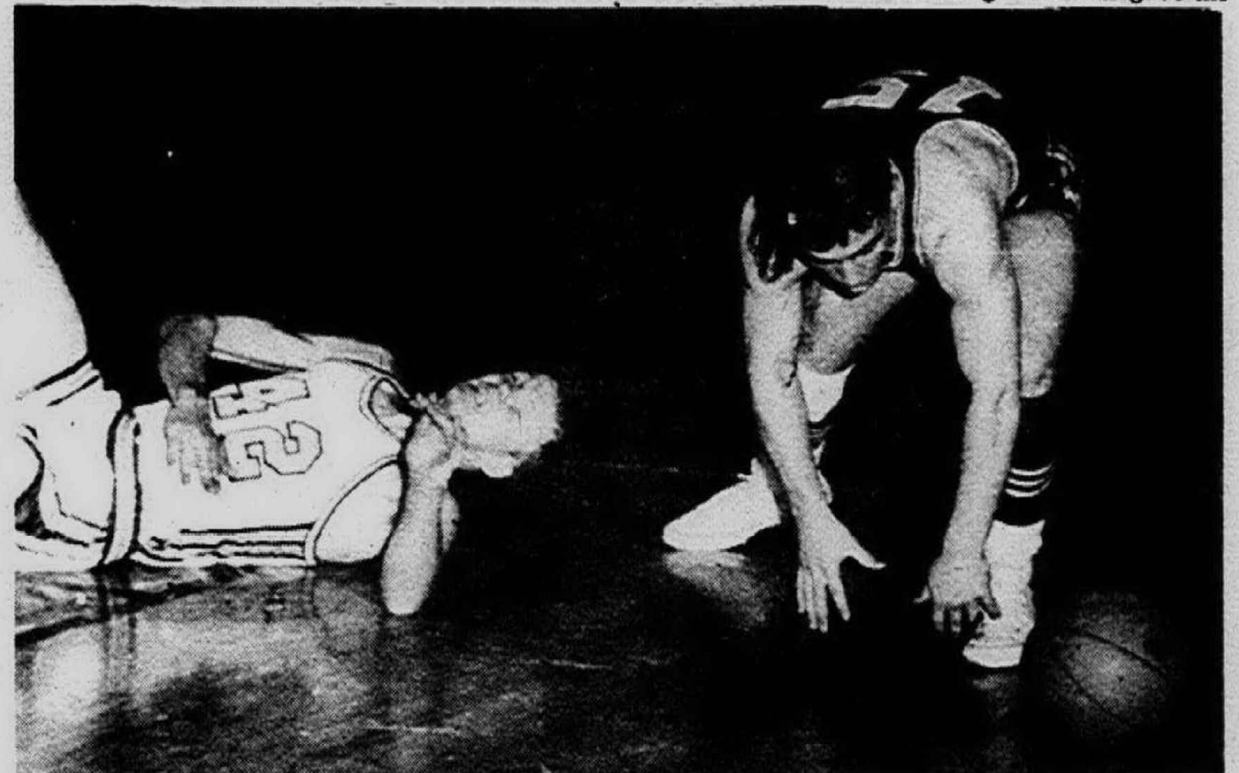
eight-foot jumper hit on two free throws with a second to go for the payoff.

Across the way, Coach George Van Wagner of Stevenson scratched his head. He was mystified.  
"We knew exactly what they would do," he explained. "It was part of our game plan to work against a press."  
"We had men clear, but somehow we just couldn't get the ball to the right man."  
"As a result, we were the victims of costly steals."

A tie for the top spot," said the affable Fefles after watching his rangy club perform in lackadaisical style against the much smaller Parkers.

"We still have two games to play and Trenton has lost only twice. It meets Redford Union at home tonight and Trenton is rough to beat there."

It wasn't until hours after the game that Fefles learned RU had upset Trenton in its belated bid for second place in the standings and thus gave the

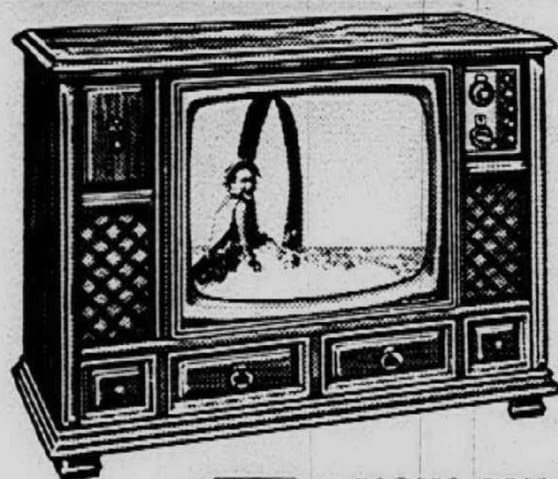

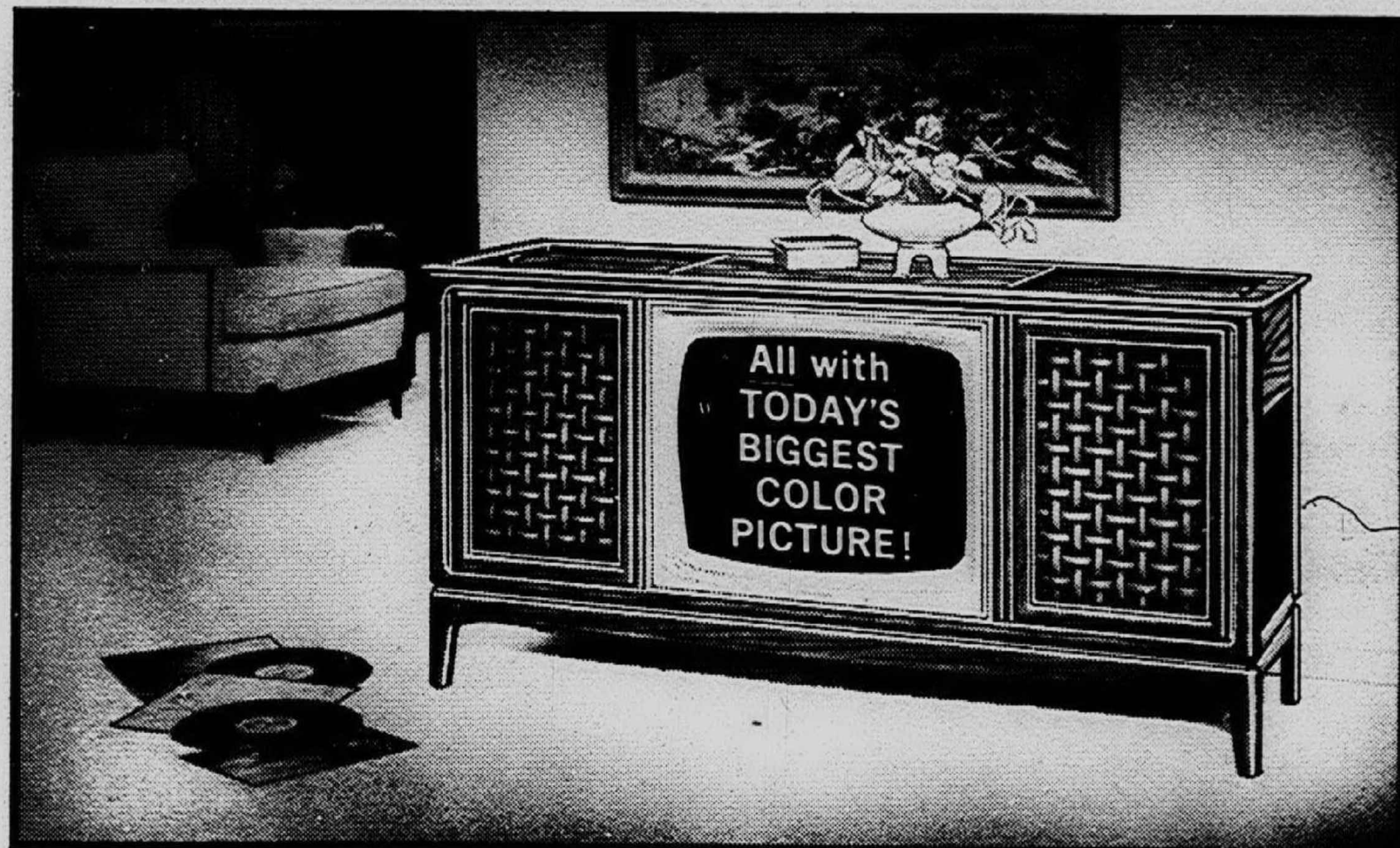

# Computer To Help Draft Budget

Garden City's new municipal budget for the fiscal year beginning April 1 will have a new look.

That will be provided through heavy use of a city-owned computer, which will revise numerous accounts and have exact figures for department heads within two hours, said City Clerk-Treasurer William Oppen.

The clerk also said that he has already received proposed budgets from city administrators and the "next step is to get all the figures down and then meet with the City Council."

Following that, wage and salary requests from the city employees' union will be compiled and a balanced budget compiled and then presented to the council, which will then hold a series of meetings with

its department heads.

NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN the union and a city representative started last week and it is hoped that a settlement on a new contract can be reached well before the March 31 deadline for approving the new budget.

Oppen, who will mark his first anniversary in the clerk-treasurer's office April 1, said that use of the \$37,000 computer, installed last August, will allow him to keep daily inventories, running accounts of the payroll, accounts receivable and accounts payable, and assuring that each department lives within its own budget.

Although the first year of the use of computers in setting up a budget will be the most difficult, Oppen said that the city will save funds in future years through use of a properly operated budget.

He also pointed out that a city charter change concerning a change in the fiscal year would have no immediate effect if voters approve the change in the April 9 special election.

on the state, county, and school levels.

If the fiscal year is approved by the voters, the City Council would have to stretch out its 1968-69 budget to a 15-month period, ending June 30, 1969, instead of the usual March 31 date.

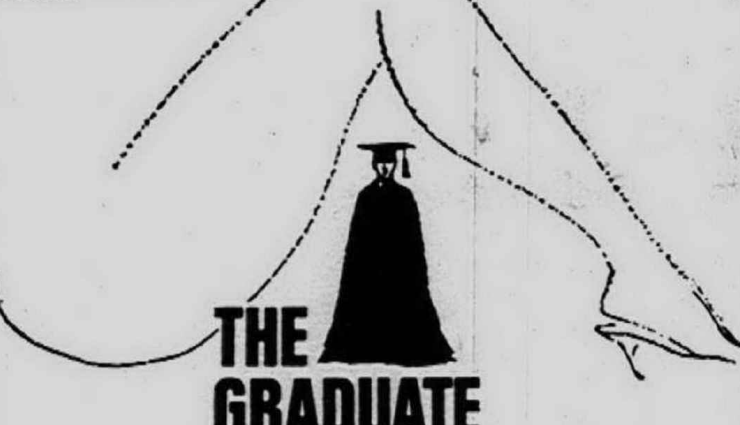

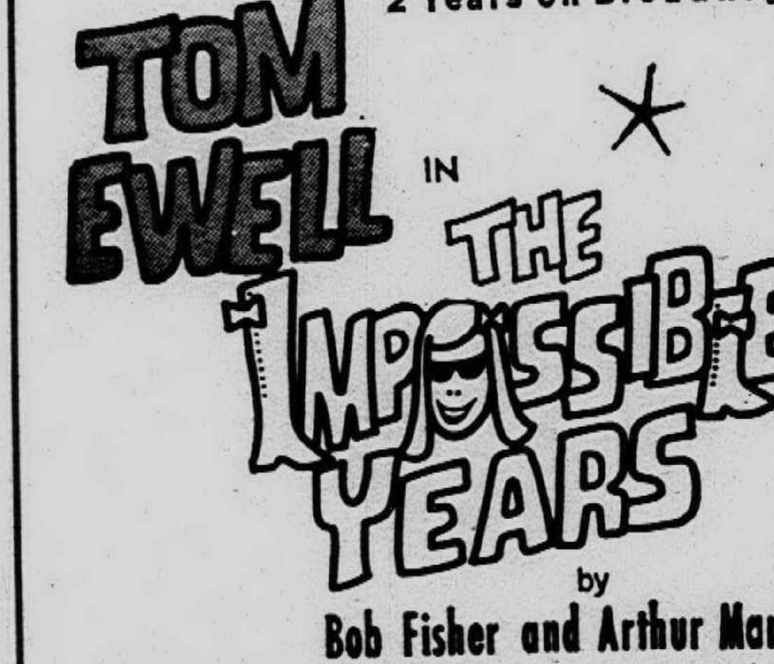

Felix Fibich will interpret the world of Sholem Aleichem through dance. His dances, which he has choreographed himself, are carefully researched, incorporating the venerable gestures and movements which were so much a part of the dance culture of the Eastern European Jews.

In addition, Fibich will include in his presentation some of the ancient Yemite and the modern Israeli dances.

A workshop has been scheduled for Sunday, March 3, from 11 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at the Jewish Community Center, to be conducted by Fibich. It is open to a limited number of participants who are interested in learning more about Yiddish folk dancing.

HIGHLIGHT of the Piccolo program will be the costumed presentation of the folk opera, "A Goat's Tale," based on the humorous folk stories of Sholem Aleichem.

Included in the program will be a concert of classical and Broadway selections in a unique musical.

Cast of the opera includes Evelyn Orbach, director of the Detroit Opera Theatre and Piccolo Opera Company, in the role of the Goat, and Leslie Eltzen as Yenta, the Goat Keeper.

The Festival runs from Feb. 25 through March 10 and honors the creative and performing arts.

# New Commission For Women Is Launched

A new commission to protect the rights of women on the job in Michigan is being launched officially this week. Gov. Romney was set to put his signature on the legislation sponsored by State Sen. Lorraine Beebe, whose district includes Redford Township.

It provides a state commission with 15 members to deal specifically with the problems that confront women in the working world—problems like discrimination when they apply for jobs and the difficulties they may encounter training for jobs, developing skills and continuing their education.

32 completed its passage through the Michigan State Senate and House.

"I'm interested in seeing women have equal opportunity in jobs—especially in the professional fields."

She added that she had noticed that in direct competition with men "for some reason or other the woman doesn't get the job."

\*\*\*

THE ONLY WOMAN in the

Senate also said she hoped the commission would give women interested in getting involved in the business world an agency with official status to which they could go for help.

"One of the things this com-

mission can do," added Sen. Beebe, "is make women aware of the many professions they can get into."

The 15 members of the commission will be appointed for

three-year terms by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate.

THIS NEW commission is an outgrowth of a study committee set up by Gov. Romney in 1964 to study education.

Two weeks ago my boss wrote in an editorial that he thought we in the suburbs should stop talking about the possibility of racial violence in our neighborhoods.

I nodded sagely in agreement, wished vaguely that he had suggested something more concrete in the way of counter-action, and let the matter slip from my mind.

Until a few days ago. Then I heard some of the most sensible people I know, with some inflammatory suburban literature in front of them, speaking of acquiring guns and determining escape routes "just in case."

So I'll use this space where I usually try to be clever, to state emphatically the feelings of one suburban housewife and mother.

They are simply this -- that one thing we can do in a crazy world is refuse to be a part of deliberately-planted hysteria; that one thing we can believe, and teach our children by our actions, is that people of all races are just people, though there are extremists of both kinds who would have us think otherwise.

Of course I love my children and would do anything to protect them.

But I am convinced that getting us to turn our neighborhoods into arsenals is just what the extremists hope to accomplish, and that if we oblige we're asking for exactly the kind of horror we want to avoid.

We all wish there were more we could do to cure the ills of the world. But we don't have to add to them.

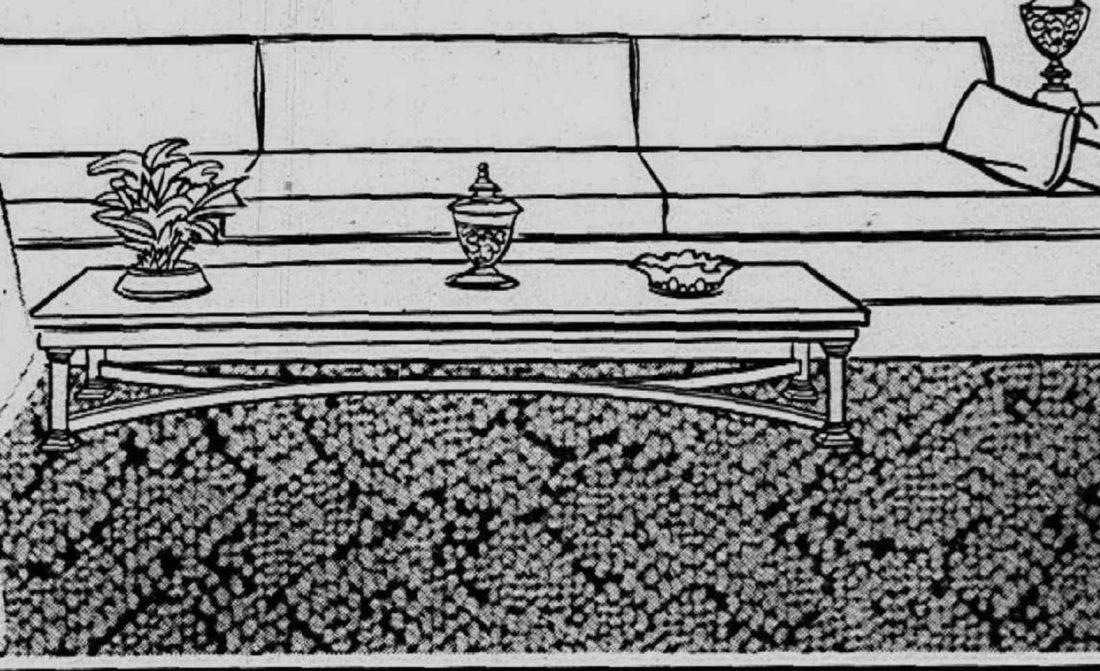

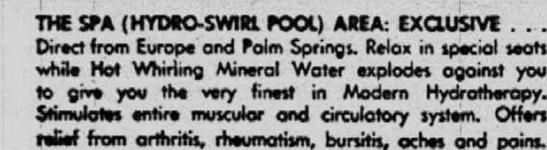

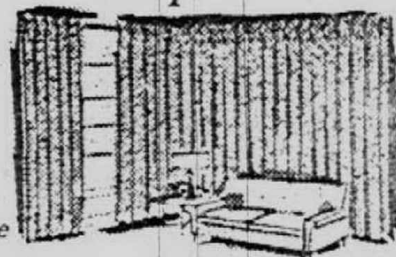

A lady who has viewed this educational scene from just about every angle imaginable thinks that college students have a lot to offer college administrators in the matter of giving a fresh viewpoint.

And Mrs. John Moehle—student, ex-counselor, and college board members—also hopes that youths who are completely honest with themselves join in campus protest intellectually, fully aware of the whole picture and willing to accept their responsibilities.

"By and large," says Jane Moehle of Plymouth, "college students today are a serious bunch, and they're subject to a lot of pressures that just weren't there for students of earlier generations."

IN HER OWN experience, Mrs. Moehle has plenty of know-how on what makes the college student tick.

There were her own college days, at the University of Cincinnati. Later, there were teaching and counseling positions, one at a school of nursing where she was the only non-nurse on the staff.

"I found that so interesting," she said, "that I seriously considered getting further training that would include some medical background."

Instead, though, she went to the University of Illinois as assistant dean of women for five years, and left there to marry Jack Moehle, a financial analysis man for the Ford Motor Co.

AFTER A TIME in Redford Township and a few years outside of Michigan, the family settled in Plymouth, and Jane was in on the original citizens' committee that made plans for Schoolcraft Community College. She now serves on its board of trustees.

And in the last year or so, with six-foot son Bill now 13 and a busy junior high student and daughter Mary Elizabeth at the advanced age of 11, Jane Moehle has returned

to school as a full time student.

She is working at Wayne State University toward her Ph. D. in college administration with an eye on an eventual position in community college work.

HER CURRENT PROJECT, with most of the classroom work completed and the doctor's thesis still ahead, is learning German, to meet the requirement of proficiency in two languages.

"And I'm finding it just plain hard work," she said, "For the first time in my life, I'm experiencing academic difficulty, and I know it will make me a lot more sympathetic with students who are under tension to improve their grades."

JANE IS ANXIOUS to get the German study behind her and move on to the fascinating thesis she has in mind.

She would like to take some of the research that has been done in industry, to see what happens to a person's behavior when he feels himself in an unjust situation, and apply it to the field of education.

"The results of the research in industry are incomplete but already rather surprising," she said, "and I am anxious to see how it might apply to teachers

at all levels. The findings should have interesting implications, for instance in the field of teachers' labor unions."

UNIVERSITY LIFE, of course, has changed drastically since Jane's student and counseling days, and she finds student movements and campus policies now a whole new world.

Removal of late night restrictions for coeds, for example, seems to be the result of completely different attitudes on the part of both students and administrators, she believes.

"I don't remember feeling particularly restricted when I was a student and had to be in early," Mrs. Moehle said, "but I understand that students now do feel that way."

SHE FIGURES they must learn before they reach the university campus that more freedom means more responsibility, and that they must accept the consequences of their behavior.

"Students have the responsibility to be scholars," Jane added, "and that means they must know they can't ruin their health with late hours and alcohol and drugs."

"The responsibility for keeping good health, practicing intelligent behavior and accepting moral consequence has to be instilled in the family and carried on by the student himself."

Jane has set herself a target date of January, 1969, for completion of her degree work. After that, plans are indefinite.

But there's no question that colleges and students will remain a big part of her life. Which can't be anything but good for all concerned.

# Coffee Cake Is Healthful

By JOYCE TOTTON

Although the science of nutrition is complicated, you do not need to make a deep study to know what foods to eat. Nutrition researchers have translated their findings and knowledge into simple guides for food selection.

The guide most commonly accepted today is called the Daily Food Guide, or "Basic Four." During World War II a nutrition guide called the Basic Seven was developed.

Later the seven food groups were rearranged into the simpler pattern we follow. Build meals around these four important food groups, dairy foods, meat, vegetables and fruits and breads and cereals.

SINCE COFFEECAKES belong in the Bread and Cereal group, let's find out how many servings we need from this group daily.

Four or more servings are recommended daily. A serving is one slice of bread or half or three-quarters of a cup of cereal. Use enriched or whole grain products.

Choose from breads, cooked and ready-to-eat cereals, cornmeal, crackers, grits, spaghetti and macaroni, noodles, rice, quick breads, and other baked goods if made with whole-grain or enriched flour.

Foods in this group supply valuable amounts of protein, iron, several B vitamins, and food energy.

Cereals cooked and served with milk, and breads made with milk, are improved in quality of protein as well as in quantity of protein, minerals, and vitamins.

KOFFEE KLATCH KUCHEN  
2 T. butter  
1 pkg. refrigerated biscuits  
1/4 c. orange marmalade  
1/2 c. pecan bits  
1 egg  
1/2 c. sour cream  
1 T. sugar  
1/2 t. vanilla

Melt butter in 8-inch pan. Separate biscuits and coat each with butter in pan. Arrange in single layer in same pan. Spoon marmalade in center of each biscuit. Sprinkle with pecan bits. Bake at 450 degrees for 10 min. Beat egg; add sour cream, sugar and vanilla. Beat until smooth. Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees. Remove biscuits from oven. Spoon sour cream mixture over the top. Return to oven for 20 minutes. Cut into squares and serve warm. Yield: 9 servings.

CREAMY APPLE TOPPED CAKE

Sift together;  
1 1/2 c. flour  
1/2 c. sugar  
3/4 t. cardamom  
1/2 t. soda  
1/2 t. salt  
Add 1/2 c. brown sugar  
Cut in 1/3 c. shortening until its very fine  
Blend 2/3 c. buttermilk with 1 unbeaten egg. Add to flour mixture. Beat well. Stir in 1/2 c. nuts, chopped.  
Place in 8 x 8 x 2 inch pan that has been well greased and slightly floured.  
Bake at 350 degrees for 40 to 45 minutes.

APPLE SOUR CREAM TOPPING

Combine--  
1 c. applesauce (sweetened)  
1 T. brown sugar  
1/4 t. cinnamon. Spread over top of partially baked cake.

Blend--  
1/2 c. sour cream  
2 T. brown sugar  
1/2 t. vanilla  
Spoon over applesauce mixture. Bake 15 minutes longer. Place under broiler to brown. Serve warm.

QUICK COFFEE CAKE WITH SOUR CREAM

3 c. flour  
1 1/2 t. soda  
1 1/2 t. baking powder  
3/4 t. salt  
3/4 c. butter  
1 1/2 c. sugar  
1 1/2 t. vanilla  
3 eggs  
1 1/2 c. sour cream  
1 can apple pie filling

Sift flour, soda, baking powder and salt together and set aside. Combine butter, sugar and vanilla; beat until creamy. Beat in eggs, one at a time. Add flour mixture alternately with sour cream and mix well. Spread half the batter in a greased 13 x 9 x 2 inch pan; add half of apple pie filling. Repeat with batter and filling.

TOPPING  
2/3 c. brown sugar  
1/2 c. white sugar  
1 1/2 t. cinnamon  
1 1/2 c. chopped walnuts  
Combine ingredients and spread over filling. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.

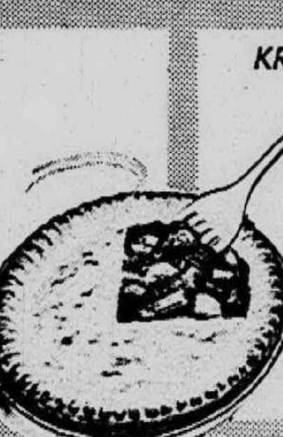

The cleaning of catch basins was continued on Roe Street and the storm sewer on Elizabeth Street between Roe Street and Ann Arbor Trail was bucketed out.

Fee Reduced  
For Vendors  
In Township

Itinerant food vendors are now allowed to ply their wares in Plymouth Township for a fee of \$25.

Previously, the fee had been \$100, but it was reduced by the board of trustees on the advice of Township Attorney Ralph Cole.

Cole told the board that, for some time--and for some unknown reason--vendors had been charged only \$5 for their license.

Clerk Helen Richardson stated that when she assumed office and it came time for vendors to renew their yearly licenses she charged them \$100.

Mrs. Richardson said that she charged \$100 because that was what the ordinance stated.

One vendor, Cole said, took the township to court because of the larger fee when he had been paying only \$5.

Cole then remarked that he knew the case would not be heard for quite some time and that the angry food vendor had agreed to pay a \$25 fee.

In other words, he said, the vendor is willing to comply with the ordinance for \$25 and not \$100.

In light of this, and the fact that while the case was pending in court other vendors have been operating without licenses, the board agreed to reduce the fee.

## This Young Man Is A Shaker

There is a tale concerning the personnel director of a large company who advertised for someone with 20 years of experience for an administrative position — and he had to be under 30.

You can't have everything in picking a new administrator but the Wayne Community Board of Education, whose district includes most of Westland, had the best of everything last week when it named 29-year-old Timothy Dyer, assistant principal for one and a half years at Wayne Memorial High School, to principal of the new Adlai E. Stevenson Junior High School.

THERE WERE 16 candidates for the position, which opens in September, and Dyer's age and relative lack of experience in administration were against him but the Board accepted the recommendation of Supt. Harry Howard.

However, two Board members, P. R. Biebesheimer and Myron Becker, cast dissenting votes, a rarity in personnel actions among governmental bodies.

Their objections to Dyer were based on age and lack of administrative experience.

Normally, this would be a valid point. Stevenson Junior High will have 52 teaching stations and 1,200 students in a \$3.5 million building.

Not only will the principal have the anticipated problems which come from the size of the school but innumerable other problems caused just by the fact that it is a new school with a new staff and curriculum.

On paper, the task should be assigned Excedrin Headache Number 25.

But administrators, like most persons, are different and talents and capabilities also vary.

AT LEAST TWO teachers and administrators in other school districts outside of Wayne have told this writer that formal experience shouldn't be stressed too heavily.

"I know a teacher with 19 years of background who still behaves like a first year teacher," said one person from an Oakland County district.

An administrator, who has considerable experience in taking part in the selection of new principals, commented on a recent appointment over Board members' objections: "We already have too many housekeepers. Our new man is not a housekeeper."

He hit the center of the issue.

Principals should do more than make sure the building doesn't burn to the ground and the faculty doesn't hold a mass demonstration outside the school protesting the country's Vietnam policy.

Tim Dyer, despite his less than three decades on earth, has accomplished personally and professionally more than many middle-aged persons.

Anyone who has had any contact with him knows what kind of a job he can do.

THE FACT THAT many of his teachers at Stevenson Junior High will be older may actually prompt those persons to give him a bit more respect, if for no other reason than that he had to compete against older and more experienced persons for the position.

As the sign said when posted last year in the Garden City School Board office:

"This is the age of the doers and the shakers."

Westland students who attend Stevenson Junior High and their parents should be grateful that Mr. Dyer is a doer and shaker, not a housekeeper.

## CAN WE AFFORD TO ECONOMIZE ?



## From the Publisher's Desk OBSERVATION POINT

Lately it has become fashionable to criticize the police.

Just look at what they're called in our everyday slang: cops, dicks, bulls, fuzz. The mocking bumper stickers reading "Support Your Local Fuzz" appeared last year in California and rapidly spread to various college campuses across the country. Kids lounging on a street corner make surly remarks when a police cruiser drives by.

But take it from a reporter who has covered the police beat and has seen the police at work: They do a darn fine job, perhaps the toughest in this country, for remarkably little money and with a great deal of loyalty.

And the communities they serve ought to realize it.

THINK, FOR A moment, about what goes into a policeman's job. He has to have physical courage and skill, and a lot of it. For we expect a police officer to walk into a barroom fight and come out on top. We expect him to be able to face down a man with a gun or, if necessary, disarm him so he doesn't hurt an innocent citizen.

A police recruit spends a lot of time learning how to protect himself and others. He learns more about the use of his pistol than 500 of Mayor Moelke's gun schools could teach, and as a result I'd much rather be around a police officer with a gun than anyone else.

Because he knows how to handle himself, you usually don't find the policeman prone to the kind of insecure boasting to which so many people fall prey. They're nice guys to talk to, and generally they're pretty sensible.

POLICEMEN CAN'T be dumb,

either, at least not today.

Perhaps the stereotype of the stupid cop in the big city was applicable 50 years ago, but it certainly isn't now.

Investigation of crime is no simple matter. For example, most criminals know that fingerprints exist, so they wear gloves. This means that the policeman investigating a crime has to go to other techniques.

In an era of organized crime and the professional criminal, the police have to track down men who consider their life's work to be breaking the law. Being outside the law, they can take advantage of techniques — electronic bugging, intimidation, even violence — which are not available to the police.

Which means the police have to use their brains.

THE REAL PROBLEM is that our police officers work in precisely that area of human behavior where things are at their most difficult: in conflict situations.

A speeder is in conflict with the law; it's a police officer's responsibility to stop him. A husband and wife are in conflict; a policeman is expected to calm them both down. A criminal is in conflict with society; the police are charged with finding him and making sure he doesn't continue to trouble people.

A policeman, by definition, works always at the razor's edge of life.

AND HE DOES IT at a salary which is pitifully low, considering the qualifications for a police recruit.

Good men cost money. Often, the money just isn't there.

## Homer Martin - A Populist Passes

All there was was a paragraph in Time Magazine's obituary column. Yet in his day he was one of the most widely cussed and discussed men in the nation.

He was Homer Martin, once a Plymouth resident. He died a few weeks ago in Los Angeles of a heart attack at the age of 66. The magazine didn't say what he was doing there.

He was a man before his time and after his time.

THE WORLD knew him as the first president of the United Auto Workers union at the time of the violent sit-down strikes in Flint.

Martin came out of a small college in Missouri and was ordained a Baptist minister. But he was canned as pastor of a suburban Kansas City church because his sermons were too pro-labor. A lot of people didn't like organized labor in those days, in 1932.

So Homer Martin went to work in a Chevrolet plant. He didn't know much about factory work, and he didn't know much about unions then, but he got active in organizing anyway. In 1934 Chevy canned him as a trouble-maker.

Martin became a full-time union organizer.

There were a lot of auto workers unions, and the American Federation of Labor set up a council to pull them all together. Martin was appointed vice president. When the United Auto Workers was organized as a separate union in 1936, Homer Martin was its first president.

MARTIN LED THE UAW out of the skilled trades-oriented AFL and into the industry-oriented Congress of Industrial Organizations. A union like the UAW logically belonged there.

Martin asked General Motors to bargain on an industry-wide basis rather than on a plant-by-plant basis. It was a pretty radical idea at the time, and William Knudsen, then GM's executive vice president, said no.

So in the latter part of 1936, the Flint sit-down strikes began. GM, the courts, the newspapers — all held this was an invasion of private property. Homer Martin responded with another radical notion: That the job is the work-

ers' property, and that GM was guilty of confiscating their property.

The fight was long. It was bitter. But to make a long story short, today there is virtually industry-wide bargaining in the auto industry.

BUT MARTIN HAD internal troubles.

There were factional fights within the UAW. Martin hurled charges around and tried to suspend members of the executive board.

The board in 1939 organized its own convention with representatives of 300,000 UAW members; Martin had his own convention with representatives of 60,000 members.

Martin was ousted, and the Reuther boys were in. That was the end of Homer Martin's career in big labor.

HE SURFACED publicly in the 1950's as a candidate for the Republican nomination for Congress in the old 17th District, which then included northwest Detroit, Redford, Livonia, Plymouth and Northville.

This writer remembers Martin from the campaign—a wiry man with the tone of an evangelist, fighting the battles of labor, the farmer and the small businessman, blistering Walter Reuther and giant business.

He wasn't so much a Republican as a Populist of the rural midwest school. Reuther and big business were here to stay. There was no use blasting them, and he lost.

His last appearance in the public eye was during the milk producers strike in Livingston County around 1960. It was never very clear how he happened to wind up in the middle of it. Perhaps it was because there was a fight and apparent social injustice. Homer Martin loved a fight and hated what he considered social injustice.

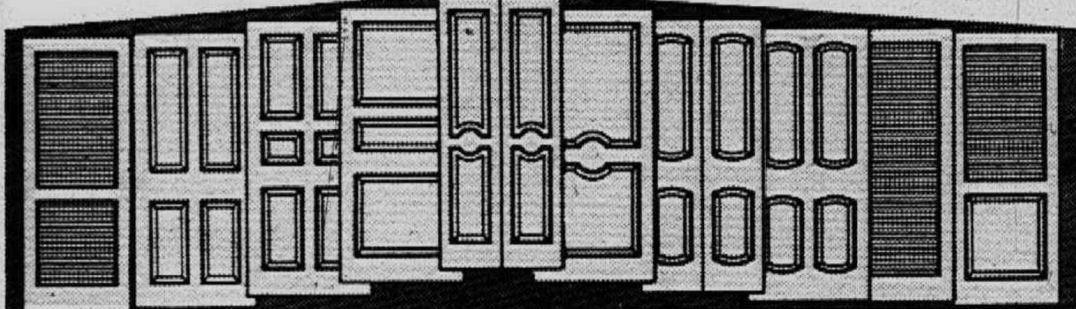
In the months ahead, you may hear an inordinate amount of thunder and lightning coming from the heavens. That'll be Homer Martin.

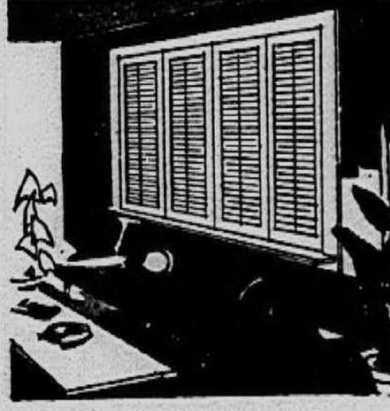

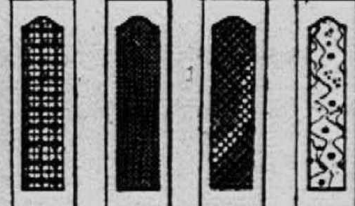

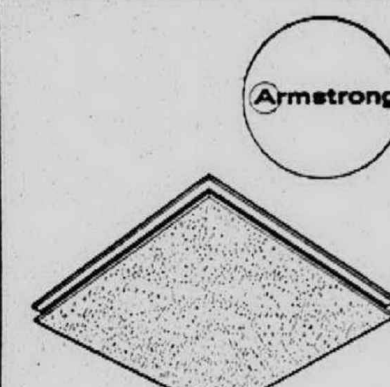

thing we ask for, but I think boards of education in general are eventually going to decide that it is in the best interest of education to involve teachers on a partnership basis in these areas."

QUESTION: "Will your de-

mands on salary and improvements in teaching conditions require an increase in taxes?"

ANSWER: "I hope not! At this time we do not know what improvements in state aid are going to be provided by the legislature acts; we have to operate in the dark, so to speak. Mr. Rossman knows as much as anyone on that subject and I think that we will not get deeply involved in the economic package until we know how much money is available."

QUESTION: "Have you determined the cost of your salary proposed for this year?"

ANSWER: "It wouldn't be fair to the Board or the teachers for me to be specific at this time. I will say that our opening move will have to leave the necessary flexibility for negotiations, and if the Board's negotiations are realistic in their proposals, we'll reach agreement as we have in the past."

QUESTION: "What do you mean by realistic?"

ANSWER: "There are a number of factors. For example, investment per pupil, class size, state equalized valuation, cumulative earnings, ability of the community to support education, and other settlements. The Detroit settlement will start AB teachers at \$7,500 next year. We recognize that there are other considerations, but I think it would be unrealistic to expect Plymouth to accept less than Detroit teachers."

QUESTION: "Last year you met in executive session and the general public received little information about negotiations. Do you think the public has a right to know what is going on?"

ANSWER: "I think we can do a better job of keeping the public informed, especially in areas of agreement—perhaps joint press releases on a regular basis. In communities where they negotiate in a goldfish bowl, it seems to add to the difficulties. I think the public is more interested in having school start on time in September than in the details of 'how agreement was reached.'"

QUESTION: "What will happen if agreement has not been reached by the time school is scheduled to open?"

ANSWER: "The legality of withholding services as opposed to involuntary servitude is being considered by the Michigan State Supreme Court in the Holland Case. The State Legisla-

## Symphony Extends Ehrling's Contract

Sixteen Ehrling's contract as music director and conductor of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra has been extended through April, 1972.

Ehrling's contract was scheduled to expire in April 1969. He has held the post since December 1963.

Symphony President Robert B. Semple said that the Symphony's executive committee unanimously agreed to extend Ehrling's tenure.

The president said Ehrling has "stimulated a fresh enthusiasm" for music in the area and that "we will be continually enriched through having a man of such stature."

Since Ehrling's appointment to the Detroit podium, the Orchestra has been expanded from 90 to 103 members, the average number of Symphony concerts each year has increased from 150 to more than 200, and the Symphony season has grown from 29 to 47 guaranteed weeks.

## Paray Slates Concerts

Paul Paray, conductor emeritus of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, will return to Ford Auditorium to conduct a pair of Symphony subscription concerts on Thursday and Saturday, Feb. 22 and 24, at 8:00 p.m.

The performances will be the first of nine Paray will conduct while on a four-week visit to the Symphony.

He last appeared with the Orchestra in February and March, 1967.

The program for February 22 and 24 will feature Schubert's Symphony No. 9, C major ("The Great"); Dukas' "La Péri"; and Rimsky-Korsakov's Suite from "Shegouratshka."

He will also conduct subscription concerts on Feb. 23, March 2, 7, 14, and 16; a portion of the Wayne State University Centennial Concert on Feb. 25; and a Windsor concert with the Detroit Symphony on March 10.

Paray's Detroit appearance follows his guest conducting engagement with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. After his appearance here, he will lead the American Symphony Orchestra in concerts at Carnegie Hall, New York City.

Paray was conductor of the Detroit Symphony from 1951 to 1962. During that time, he conducted 204 subscription concerts which included 781 performances of individual works in addition to many more tour and special concerts.

Fresh from successes at international festivals and competitions, the films represent outstanding directors of the new generation. "Film Power" is part of a new concept in film presentation, sponsored by the Theatre Arts Department in association with New Line Cinema Corporation of New York.

The objective is to provide a channel for the finest in contemporary film-making for discriminating audiences.

ONE OF THE executives of New Line Cinema is Robert Shaye, whose parents, Mr. and Mrs. Max Shaye, reside in Franklin. Shaye is also a director of films, and his short "Image" will be on the March program.

Featured in the Feb. 22, 23 and 24 program will be "The End of August at the Hotel Ozone." This is a full-length dramatic film by Czechoslovakia's 33-year old director Jan Schmidt. A combination of science-fiction and allegory, it is a sample of life following an atomic World War III. No one remains except a band of eight savage young women and their matron-leader. Schmidt has given "Ozone" the spare style of a Kafka fable, presenting viewers with unadorned reality.

"Hotel Ozone" was recently presented to sell-out audiences in New York by Lincoln Center and The Museum of Modern Art during a Festival of New Czechoslovak Cinema. As a prelude to "Hotel Ozone," two new prize winning short subjects, one from Denmark and the other from the U.S., will be shown:

"Summer War" offers a wry treatment of a reserve soldier on summer maneuvers; "Dodge City" presents terse images of children at playtime and people in death-pain.

Cumulatively, these films have been presented at the Edinburgh International Film Festival, the San Francisco International Film Festival, the Oberhausen International Film Festival, the Locarno International Film Festival and the Venice International Film Festival.

NONE OF THE films in the "Film Power" series have been shown in Detroit. The three film programs at the museum auditorium will allow filmgoers to see top quality cinema that they may be denied because of certain commercial considerations of regular film exhibitors and distributors.

The March 21, 22 and 23 "Film Power" program features "Vall (the Witch of Positano)" by American director Sheldon Kocklin. The heroine, an orange-manned Australian painter living in Positano, was once a Paris existentialist showpiece. She sounds freakish, but on film she exerts an unmistakable and delicate originality. Short films with this feature are "Image," "Flora" and "Brunner's" directed by Robert Shaye, Benjamin Hayen and David Blenstock respectively.

April 18, 19 and 20 "Film Power" presents the full-length "Martyrs of Love," by Czechoslovakian Jan Nemic. The film concerns the dreams and disillusionments of young people confronting the Establishment. The short films are "Homo Ludens" (Sweden -- A.O. Karlung) and "Apprenticeship" (Czechoslovakia -- Dusan Hanak).

## 'Fertilizer' Pollution Hits Lake Michigan - Sen. Hart

Lake Michigan is suffering from a kind of pollution far more serious and complicated in the long run than sewage, toxic chemicals or oil slicks, according to U.S. Sen. Philip Hart.

### U-M Professors Receive \$46,075 Carnegie Grant

ANN ARBOR -- Two University of Michigan professors have been awarded a one-year grant of \$46,075 by the Carnegie Corp. of New York for inter-university research on residential undergraduate study units.

The project's co-directors, Theodore M. Newcomb, professor of sociology and associate director of the University's Residential College, and Donald R. Brown, professor of psychology and research associate at the U-M Center for Research on Learning and Teaching, have already collaborated with researchers and officials at several universities which have launched residential colleges.

Five schools are now participating in the study, although it is hoped that as many as 10 others will join later.

Hart, a Michigan Democrat, uses a recent newsletter to point to the severe problem of "nutrient pollution."

"EVEN THE BEST waste treatment plant does not return pure water back to the streams and lakes. . . . Treatment plants simply reduce sewage into non-toxic chemicals," says Hart. "And back into the lake goes nitrogen, phosphates and potash--a combination that any home gardener recognizes as a superb fertilizer."

"This fertilizer generates a great algae growth, first in the waters along the shore and finally deeper and deeper into the lake--an algae growth that is already beginning to slime the beaches of western Michigan. "Overabundant algae carries two dangers: it can make beaches unpleasant for bathing and, in dying and rotting in the water, it begins to soak up oxygen needed to sustain fish."

"GLACIAL LAKES, like Michigan, begin with water as pure as desert sand--and just as sterile. Little by little, nutrients dribble in, allowing plant and fish life. As more nutrients come in, algae eventually overpowers a lake. It fills up with dead plant life and other sedi-

ment, eventually turning into a swamp.

"Even at the present fertilization rate, Lake Michigan will not be a swamp for many thousands of years. But the fact remains that we have done more to age the lake in the past 20 years than nature could have done in the next 1,000."

"If we are to slow down the aging process, we must cut down on non-toxic nutrients. It's unlikely we can ever fully remove all three of the chemical elements that make up fertilizer, but that's not really necessary."

"If we remove just one--the phosphates--then the other two, nitrogen and potash, will lose much of their effect. A consistently effective way to take phosphates out of treated sewage has not yet been found, but scientists are getting close."

"When we do get a workable system, it will mean a new round of sewage treatment construction, new local taxes, new federal appropriations, new problems for industry, new political debates on the virtues of economy."

"Water pollution control just isn't easy work. It can generate all sorts of unpleasant things like tax levies, factory shut-downs, and complaining letters to politicians."

Second District Congressman Marvin L. Esch has demanded that President Johnson answer 14 questions on the Pueblo incident and on the war in Vietnam.

The Ann Arbor Republican asked for clarifications about conflicting reports, charging that "The people are losing faith and confidence in the face of great differences between what is said and what appears to be happening."

The text of his questions, contained in a letter which he made public, follows:

1. WAS THE PUEBLO in international waters when she was seized? Had she previously intruded on North Korean territorial waters? There was direct conflict in the U.S. position between the first statement by Ambassador Goldberg before the United Nations that we had "never" intruded on Korean territorial waters and the subsequent doubts raised by Secretaries Rusk and McNamara on Feb. 4. If there was serious doubt, as reflected in the Rusk-McNamara statement on Feb. 4, why did we take a categorical stand before the United Nations indicating otherwise? Does this not lessen our stature among other nations and reduce our ability to deal with them on a basis of mutual trust?

2. IT HAS BEEN reported that there were a number of clear warnings that action of this type might be taken by the North Koreans. In light of this, what action was taken to prevent this incident? Were contingency plans made to handle a renewal of hostilities in Korea?

3. THERE HAVE been seemingly contradictory statements by Ambassador Goldberg and Secretary Rusk regarding the Pueblo. What is the truth?

4. A child birth education film will be shown at 8 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 23, in the Wyandotte General Hospital Nurses' Home Main Lounge. The Childbirth Preparation Association will sponsor the film entitled "Birthday."

nature and frequency of communications between the Pueblo and American sources before and during the capture. What was the exact nature of those communications from the first approach of the North Korean patrol boats until the docking at Wonsan Harbor?

4. It has also been charged that high government officials with decision-making power were not informed of the crisis until the capture was a fait d'accompli. What provisions are made for delegation of authority to protect our forces, or to assure that decision-making officials are promptly informed?

5. There has been considerable concern regarding the valuable monitoring and top secret equipment aboard this vessel. Were provisions made to destroy sensitive equipment? Have any efforts been made to prevent the North Korean government from conducting salvaging operations at the site of the seizure or have we attempted to salvage the equipment ourselves--both to protect the secrets it may contain and to prove the location of the seizure?

6. IS THERE any definite evidence to connect the Pueblo incident with the greatly stepped up Viet Cong activity and attacks? Was this an effort on

the part of the Communists to divert our attention and to sap our strength in Vietnam?

7. Is there any information that further Communist aggression and incidents are to be expected in other SEATO nations?

8. Do you envision any changes in policy regarding the protection and armaments and deployment of other intelligence ships?

There are also serious questions regarding the stepped up Communist activity in South Vietnam, the Viet Cong capture of a number of provincial capitals, and the apparent failure of the Thieu government to maintain the stability of South Vietnam.

1. TO WHAT degree does the current crisis in South Vietnam reflect the lack of political and military stability? How could our previous assessments, including your optimistic account in your State of the Union address, be so inaccurate?

10. Why do discrepancies in casualty figures continue to exist? What assurances do we have that the number of "enemy" killed does not include South Vietnamese civilians? Are we to believe Defense Department spokesmen in Vietnam

who have consistently maintained that the casualty figures were actual body counts or Mr. McNamara's admission that they are only our best estimates under battle conditions?

11. Has there been a direct effort to minimize the civilian casualties during the past several days? What action is being taken to relieve the suffering and hardships of South Vietnamese and restore the confidence of the people in the ability of the government to defend them?

12. THE SUMMARY trial and execution of a non-uniformed Vietnamese last week is appalling to the American conscience. In what way are we working with the South Vietnamese government to demand that the Geneva Convention articles regarding prisoners of war be observed? I fully recognize that there are atrocities perpetrated upon American military personnel and Vietnamese civilians by the enemy, but do not believe that this gives us the license to commit or condone willful atrocities of our own or of the South Vietnamese.

13. Reports of widespread corruption, extensive black-market and dealings and failure of the government to heed the need for social reform are

commonplace and have not been contradicted. There is also deep concern about the failure of the Thieu government to commit its own troops to battle and the extensive practice of South Vietnamese young men avoiding military duty by bribing their way out. These problems have grown worse, not better, through the four years of the war.

EVANS Leases 100 Rail Cars

## Evans Leases 100 Rail Cars

The Building Products Division of Evans Products Company, which recently took delivery of 100 specially-equipped box cars on lease from the United States Railway Leasing Company, has increased the lease order by an additional 100 cars.

The new 50 foot, 70-ton insulated box cars will be equipped with Hydra-Cushion under-frame and Superior double plug car doors and 75 will be equipped with Evans' new "Air-Pak" pneumatic bulkhead. The remainder will be equipped with Evans' DF-B bulkheads and Evans' adjustable sidewall fillers.

The cars to be constructed at Evans' plant in Plymouth, with delivery for March and April, will be used to transport the company's plywood, hardboard, and other building materials.

## Rainmaking Now Possible

On July 14, 1890, Congress appropriated \$2,000 for the Department of Agriculture to experiment in the "production of rain." Tests in the Washington area using explosives sent up by balloons or kites provoked nothing but complaints from angry residents.

More tests were made in Texas, and in 1891 an additional \$7,000 was appropriated; a year later \$10,000 more was made available. Still no success.

Cloud seeding was tried from 1947 to 1949 by the U.S. Weather Bureau. But not till just recently was there any really favorable result. This was from the National Science Foundation, which said five years of research had proved the feasibility of atmospheric seeding as a rainmaking tool.

# In Bad Weather, Students Gripe About EMU Food

The feeding of 4,100 students at Eastern Michigan University is a \$2,443,000 operation which has its highlights and its side-lights.

David Stockman, director of housing and food services at EMU since 1960, points out:

"Nothing is much more individual than taste, and each student has had at least 18 years of conditioning to certain foods and their preparation. 'You can't say we make it like mother makes it, but we do all we can to make it palatable.'"

MENU MONOTONY is one of the greatest hazards of mass food serving, Stockman says. "Some students would prefer to have a more lavish menu while others would rather have less and pay less. There are some items which would be tasty to a few, but they can't be phased into mass feeding. Food may have quality and be well prepared, but by the fourth time it is served, it may be monotonous."

Instead of varying the food, the service sometimes varies the way it is served by holding unannounced "special events" at which Food Service personnel

wear Italian dress to serve an Italian meal, use of chop sticks instead of silverware for a Chinese dinner and Coney Island and pizza parties.

"WE ALMOST CAN predict when the food will taste bad," Stockman says. "The reaction to meals almost can be plotted by the weather. When the weather is bad, the food appears to be also. And when there is stress on the students, at the time of finals especially, there are more complaints about the food."

At the time of finals, a continental breakfast is often served. Instead of having to report for breakfast at 8 a.m., the students are allowed to have coffee, doughnuts or orange juice at any time up to 9 a.m. The Food Service has an annual budget of \$2,443,000.

OF THE \$447 a student pays each semester for room and board, one-third goes for food. The average cost for a breakfast for a student is 47 cents; for lunch, 83 cents; and for dinner, \$1.06.

Students are allowed to eat as much as they want of everything except the main entree.

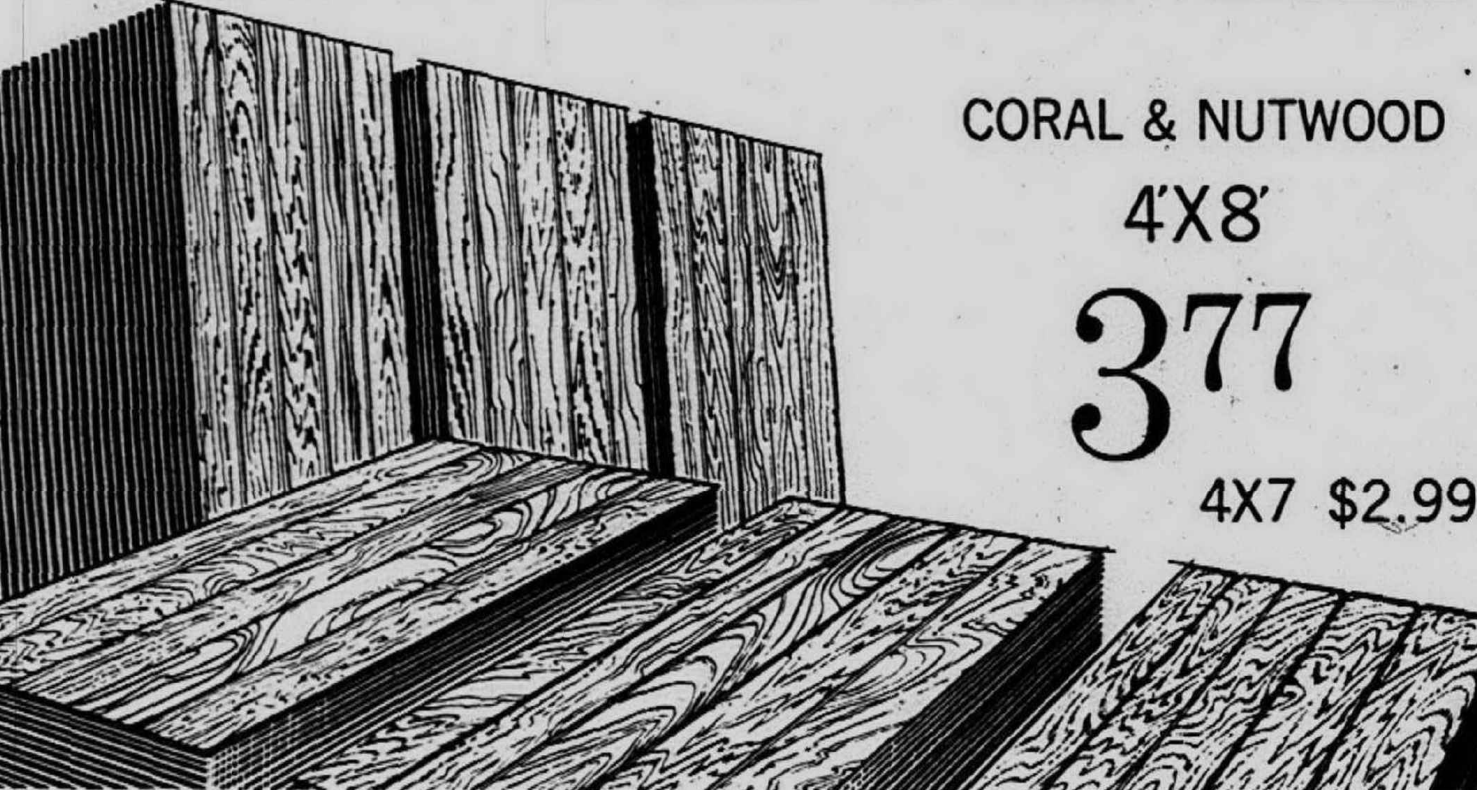
However, they have two choices of entree. The students also are allowed to take fresh fruit and brownies from the dining areas, but they cannot take individual boxes of cereal or wrapped crackers, because at the end of one period, housing officials found these items hoarded and uneaten in the dormitories.

There are food committees in each of the dormitories, and the food service takes surveys of what students like and don't like. On a check list, they are asked whether they would like to eat a certain food more than once a week and can write in additional items and comments.

IN THE NEWER units, students make their own toast and get freshly made coffee from a machine which makes coffee only at the rate it is being served.

There is more to the mass feeding of students than the serving of food, Stockmansays. Color and space is used in the dining rooms to make them harmonize pleasantly. Music is piped in, and the use of carpet in the dining areas is being studied. An entire hall can have a pizza party if the Food Service is notified in advance.

# U-M Eliminates Coeds' Curfew

Regents of The University of Michigan have approved on a one-term experimental basis the elimination of curfew requirements in University residence halls for women students receiving written parental permission.

On the same basis, and subject to guidelines set out by the Board of Governors of Residence Halls, the Regents approved policy changes to permit students in each housing unit to determine the hours during which members of the opposite sex may visit in dormitory rooms.

The same policies were extended to fraternities, sororities and other University-affiliated housing units.

APPROVAL OF the changes, which had been recommended by the faculty-student Board of Governors, followed an open hearing on the subject and considerable discussion by the Regents and university officers. The Regents said they regard the move as a step toward encouraging mature, responsible self-government. They stressed that the policy changes are experimental, and that they will be carefully administered by the residence halls staff.

The changes approved by the Regents follow:

"Effective immediately, Regents of the University of Michigan authorize on an experi-

mental basis for the current term, a policy which grants to freshman women who secure written parental permission an exemption from the curfew requirement.

"Residents of individual housing units may determine by a democratic process the hours of visitation by members of the opposite sex, such policy to be carried out within the guidelines established by the Board of Governors, these guidelines to include:

- "(a) the proper balance of academic, literary aspects of Residence Halls life;
- "(b) the maintenance of good taste;
- "(c) the meticulous safeguarding of the rights of minorities;
- "(d) the utilization of the experience and advice of the educational staffs of the houses."

THE REGENTS specified that the housing units are to file with the director of university housing their visitation and enforcement rules and policies immediately upon their adoption.

They also instructed the Board of Governors and other responsible members of the University administration to make a complete review of the experimental policies at the close of the term.

# Sweden Eases Taboos; Then Things Really Happen

Sweden has eased most of its sexual taboos in the last few years and now they are wondering where these leniencies are leading them.

The divorce rate is climbing, the number of out-of-wedlock pregnancies has soared and the amount of pornographic literature has increased proportionately with heightened preoccupation interest in sex.

"It used to be that marriage led to children," a Lutheran churchman said. "Nowadays, children lead to marriage."

Social workers estimate that every third bride goes to the altar pregnant.

Peddlers of pornography are becoming bolder all the time. Published estimates put their annual turnover at \$8 million to \$10 million.

NEARLY EVERY Stockholm street has shops with windows crammed with booklets and pictures. The portrayal of a naked female no longer seems to be enough. Photos now are more explicit.

Movies show extended nude sequences. Afternoon papers particularly are heavy with sex stories, nude pictures and sex advertisements.

Some sample ads: "Homosexual club for men and women"; "Are you looking for uninhibited women eager for sex? You'll find them in the . . . Club." Ads from "professional models" give telephone numbers.

A commission is studying laws that broadly prohibit all publications and pictorial matter offensive to "propriety and decency." This principle, Justice Ministry officials say, is open to wide interpretation because of changing public attitudes. But 39 pornographic publications have been confiscated this year, against none last year.

IS THIS flood of pornography and open discussion about sexual freedom damaging Swedish youth and the family structure?

Psychologist Aake Edfeldt says: "During a certain period of youth, pornographic literature and photos are the normal form of sexual experience. In my view, it is a symptom of the fact that sexual instruction in the schools hasn't advanced fast enough, that it isn't sufficiently realistic. Instruction is limited too much to books on biology."

Sex education is compulsory from the age of 7. The teaching manual is under review. One issue is what children should be taught about contraceptives.

"There's no doubt our children have much greater freedom in sexual matters than ever before," commented a Swedish father, "but at the same time, if it's a comfort, they also know how to take better care of themselves than ever before."

There WAS an old tradition in Swedish rural society of getting married only after a child was on the way. Some Swedes say a tradition is tied to the housing shortage. If a baby is expected, the time on the waiting list can be reduced by a year.

Illegitimate children are officially called "born out of wedlock," with equal rights to adequate care, training and education. The mother has the right to be called "Mrs." and she and her baby are considered a family.

Over the last decade, the rate of such births is said to have been between 8 to 9 per cent. During 1965, the highest annual incidence of venereal disease was recorded since a 1919 law to combat it went into effect.

Officially say prostitution is declining and has little influence on the disease rate.

Compared to other European countries, the divorce rate is relatively high—one divorce every six to seven marriages. Statistics indicate the rate may be increasing.

## Chilly Weather . . . Hearty Tuna Pie



Rough textured shredded wheat crust gives this tuna pie a most attractive appearance. It provides extra nourishment, too, for breakfast cereals make contributions of protein, important B vitamins, essential minerals, and food energy. # Consumers Power Will Become Michigan Corporation April 9

Consumers Power Company announced today that it proposes to change its corporate domicile to Michigan from the State of Maine. The proposal will be presented to the shareholders at the annual meeting April 9, and also requires approval of various governmental authorities.

An application for authorization to organize a new Michigan corporation was filed late yesterday with the Michigan

Public Service Commission. The Company was incorporated in Maine in 1910.

In its application to the Public Service Commission, the Company said the change in corporate domicile from Maine to Michigan was appropriate at this time, and in the public interest. It added that all of Consumers Power Company's utility properties, operations, and business properties are located in the State of Michigan.

Since 1915, the Company has done business in Michigan as a foreign corporation, with its business being subject to Michigan laws, and its services, rates and charges, security issues, and other matters have been subject to regulation of the Michigan Public Service Commission.

THE COMPANY SAID the change of corporate domicile

would relieve Consumers Power of the burden of paying franchise taxes in the State of Maine, currently amounting to \$132,550 annually, and would eliminate the expense of maintaining a statutory office in Maine.

The company also cited that the change of domicile would promote better understanding of Consumers Power Company by state and local governmental authorities, and by its customers, shareholders, and the public generally.

Also, that the change of domicile would exempt the Company from duplicative regulation by the Federal Power Commission, and the attendant expense of this, in connection with the issuance of securities by the Company.

THE APPLICATION to the Public Service Commission asserted that the Company's business and operations in Michigan would continue, after the proposed incorporation in Michigan, without change in name, business, properties, ownership or management, and with continued regulation by the Michigan Public Service Commission.

Consumers Power Company's service area covers more than 30,500 square miles in Michigan's Lower Peninsula, with electric service to more than 1,000,000 customers in 61 of the 68 counties, and gas service to more than 750,000 customers in 37 counties.

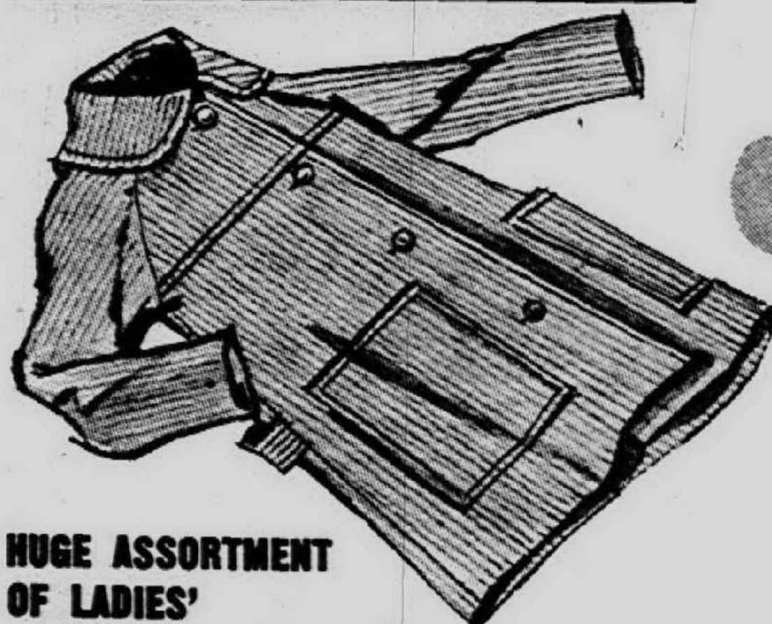

# If Wallace Splits The Presidential Vote...

## Electoral College And House Could Both Be Deadlocked--Griffin

An unprecedented political fight could hit the U.S. after this presidential election, all brought about by the candidacy of Dixiecrat George Wallace.

U.S. Sen. Robert Griffin, R-Mich., explained how in his Lincoln Day speech last week before Oakland County Republicans.

The essence of Griffin's analysis is that (1) Wallace could hurt Republicans in the South, (2) he will take away Johnson votes in Northern cities, (3) no candidate may get a majority of the electoral college, (4) the election could be tossed into the U.S. House of Representatives, and (5) the House itself may be unable to get a majority of the 50 states behind one candidate without a lot of "wheeling and dealing" with Wallace.

Here is the text of Griffin's remarks:

"The candidacy of George Wallace is a development which must be taken seriously, particularly by Republicans.

"It now appears that Wallace will be on the ballot in all but two of the 50 states. He will win the electoral votes of at least four or five Southern states--electoral votes which might otherwise go to the Republican presidential candidate.

"With George Wallace on the ballot, it should be obvious that the so-called 'Southern strategy,' which misguided too

many Republicans in 1964, can have no place whatever in Republican thinking for 1968--not if we really intend to win...

"The real battlefield, then, of the 1968 election will be right where it has been throughout recent history--in the large industrial states of the North.

"If we are going to win in 1968, the best strategy for Republicans is to nominate a ticket that can run a good race in the big cities of the North. Of course, Wallace cannot win there, but his candidacy may turn out to be a real advantage for Republicans in the North. He will probably draw off 15 or 20 percent of the votes in the big cities, perhaps more. Most of those are votes that normally would go to the Democratic candidate.

"By drawing off even 10 percent of the votes or less, the Wallace candidacy can shift all of the electoral votes of a close Northern state from one major party to the other.

"UNLESS THE '68 election turns in to a landslide, one way or the other, there is a real and rather frightening possibility that George Wallace will achieve a major objective of his candidacy--to throw the selection of the next President into the House of Representatives for the third time in history.

What If There's A Deadlock?

"From your study of government, you will recall that to be elected President, it is not enough for a candidate to receive the largest number of votes in the electoral college; he must receive a clear majority of the electoral votes.

"The more electoral votes gathered up by Wallace, the greater the likelihood that neither of the major candidates will receive a clear majority--in which event the President would be selected by the newly elected House of Representatives from among the top three candidates who receive electoral votes.

"In this day and age, when there is so much talk about 'one man-one vote,' most Americans would be shocked if they stopped to realize how the selection in the House would actually be made.

"If and when such a ballot is taken, each Representative will not have one vote. Instead, the Constitution provides, in such a situation, that each state shall have one vote.

"This means that the State of Nevada, with one Congressman, would count as much as Michigan with 19 Congressmen.

"Consider the situation where the delegation in the House from a particular state

happens to be evenly divided--half Republicans and half Democrats (and this is the case now with Illinois, Oregon and Montana). Presumably, the people of such a state would end up with no voice at all in the final selection.

THE PARTY WHICH happens to control a majority of all the seats in the House of Representatives is not necessarily the party which would be able to select the next

President. For it is altogether possible that the minority party in the House could be in a position to control the vote of 26 of the states...

"It is altogether possible, assuming that some votes go to Wallace, that neither of the major candidates would receive the necessary 26 votes to have a clear majority.

"I'm sure it doesn't take much imagination to visualize the 'wheeling and dealing' that could go on in smoke-filled rooms if such a situation should actually develop. Would one of the major candidates make a deal with Wallace and his supporters? What would be the price?

"Of course, it is just possible that the House of Representatives might deadlock, with none of the top three being able to get the necessary 26 votes to become President. In that case, the Vice President of the United States would be selected by the

Senate (each Senator having one vote) from the top two candidates for that office--and then HE would be installed as President.

"If all this suggests to you that our whole electoral college system is a bit archaic and in dire need of reform, I would hasten to add my wholehearted agreement.

"AT THE PRESENT time, the Democrats control the delegations of 29 states, Republicans control only 18 states, and three states have delegations that are evenly divided.

"But the outlook is not quite as bleak as it might appear. There are seven states where Republicans can take over control of a state delegation by winning just one additional Congressional seat. And, there are a number of other states where Republicans can take control by winning two additional seats in the state. (You will recall that in Michigan we picked up five Congressional seats in 1966.)"

## For Non-Public Schools Aid-Seekers Tell Strategy

Area meetings to encourage more mail to lawmakers kicked off "phase two" Thursday for the Redford School District in its role of an extensive, highly organized effort to get state aid for non-public schools.

The "mail-in" is part of a statewide concerted plan aimed at influencing Lansing lawmakers who are now preparing an education grant bill that would put \$21 million in state funds into private school education next year.

CHIEF BACKERS of the proposal, known as the Brown-Traxler bill, are the Citizens for Educational Freedom (CEF) and the Michigan Association of Non-Public Schools.

At a kick-off session Thursday night, Rev. Thomas J. McAnoy, CEF regional coordinator of the drive, traced the progress of "phase one" for the 60 parents who attended the meeting, sponsored by the Our Lady of Loretto School Board.

During "phase one," more than 70,000 hand-written letters have flooded the Capitol, according to Father McAnoy, who is principal of the new Bishop Borgess High School in Redford Township.

Phase two will concentrate on mail to district state senators, representatives and key legislative committees, he explained.

Redford Rep. John Bennett reportedly already has received 400 letters urging passage of the bill when it is introduced, Father McAnoy reported.

Besides the "mail-in," CEF tactics in the Redford district will include participation in a

series of public forums to be held throughout the area. Grants to parents eliminates

### Social Security

## Medicare Benefits Gets A Boost

Editor's Note: This is the sixth in a series of articles by Sam F. Test, Social Security District Manager in the Detroit-Northwest Office, telling what the Social Security amendments of 1967 mean to you and your family.

Here are some of the more important improvements in the medicare program under the social security amendments signed by President Johnson on January 2, 1968.

PAYMENT FOR DOCTOR BILLS: Medicare beneficiaries whose physicians prefer to bill them directly instead of billing medicare will no longer have to pay the bill and get it re-imposed before they can collect medicare payments.

Under the old law, if the doctor did not want to submit his bill to medicare, a medicare beneficiary had to pay the bill and get it itemized and re-imposed in order to claim payment from medicare.

Now, beginning January 1, 1968, all the patient needs to send in with his request for payment is an itemized bill, even if he has not yet paid the doctor. If the doctor's office will fill out the bottom part of the standard Request for Payment form, this will serve as the itemized bill.

MORE HOSPITAL DAYS COVERED: Beginning January 1, a person covered under the hospital insurance part of medicare will be eligible for 60 additional days of care partly paid for by medicare.

This is a "lifetime reserve" that you can draw upon if you have used up the 90 days in a "spell of illness." During these additional days, your medicare will pay all but \$20 a day of your covered hospital expenses.

As before, a "spell of illness" does not end until a 60-day period has passed during which you were not a patient in any hospital of skilled nursing home. When a spell of illness ends, you again become eligible for up to 90 days of hospital insurance benefits.

The 60-day reserve, however, is a lifetime reserve, and none of it is replaced after you use it.

SERVICE IN NON-COVERED HOSPITALS: Also, the medicare program may now make partial payment of bills for treatment before January 1, in hospitals not participating in the medicare program.

If you had to pay a hospital bill because you were treated in such a hospital, it may be possible for you to be reimbursed, if the hospital meets

certain minimum standards, i.e., it is licensed as a hospital; has a full-time nursing service; and provides medical care under the supervision of a doctor.

During the first year of medicare some hospitals were not able to take part in the medicare program, and others have not chosen to take part, for one reason or another.

A special provision for payment in emergency cases helped many people, but there were some hospitals which did not qualify even under the emergency provisions. And some people covered by medicare and admitted to these hospitals when there was not medical emergency provision mistakenly believed that medicare would pay their bills.

If you were a medicare beneficiary between July 1, 1966, and December 31, 1967, and could not earlier get payment under medicare for a stay in a hospital that did not take part in medicare, ask the hospital or your social security office to help you apply for benefits.

MORE BILLS PAID IN HOSPITAL: Starting April 1, the medical insurance part of medicare will pay the full reasonable charges of radiologists' and pathologists' services while

you are a hospital inpatient, if you are enrolled for medical insurance. Under the old law, medicare paid only 80 percent of the charges after the \$50 deductible had been met.

Under the old law, if you were in a hospital or extended care facility and were not eligible for hospital insurance payments--because you had used up all your hospital insurance benefit days, or because you did not enter the extended care facility within 14 days after a hospital stay of at least three days--services such as X-rays and laboratory services were not covered by either hospital or medical insurance.

As of April 1, medical insurance will cover such services if you are in a hospital or extended care facility. These services would ordinarily have been paid for as part of your doctor's bills if you had not been in the institution.

PHYSICAL THERAPY PAYMENTS BROADENED: Another change in the medicare program provides payments for physical therapy under medical insurance, in your home or elsewhere, if it is furnished by an approved hospital, clinic, rehabilitation center, or public health agency.

# Kuhn Opposed To Offices Call Lansing For A Dime

State Senator George W. Kuhn wants to make it possible for any Michigan citizen to be able to call his legislators in Lansing for only a dime.

Republican Kuhn of West Bloomfield Township, Oakland County, as an alternate proposal to a bill sponsored by Democratic Senator Raymond Dzendzel, of Detroit, and Senator Emil Lockwood, Republican St. Louis, which would provide individual offices for the 38 members of the Senate in their home districts.

THE BILL, which passed the Senate 19-11, and is now awaiting House consideration, would allow each senator \$18,000 annually to set up such home offices and staff them with two aides.

It would cost the Michigan taxpayers at least \$700,000 a year.

"But if all 110 state representatives wanted home offices, too," Kuhn told The Observer, "it would cost the taxpayers approximately \$3 million a year."

The senator objected vehemently to the Dzendzel-Lockwood bill. "There certainly are more important areas of greater needs for our money. Mental health, education, and police and law enforcement have the highest priority today and should be met first."

"This is another by-product or result of what happens in

government when we get a state income tax without any controls or limitations. And, it's one of the reasons I also opposed the state income tax last year.

"People are getting tired of government increasing taxes at all levels, whether national or state or local, and having no voice in the matter of how the tax dollars are being spent."

Under Kuhn's counter proposal, a telephone system would be inaugurated allowing citizens anywhere in the state to call their senator or representative at the State Capitol in Lansing for a dime, or the price of a local call.

"IT'S A MATTER OF the telephone company providing a public service at no expense to the State of Michigan," he explained. "We're in the exploratory stage with telephone officials now."

"There's already 156 cities connected to Lansing by a dime telephone call, and they're as far away as Escanaba and Gladstone in the Upper Peninsula."

"It seems to me it makes a lot more sense for any of our 8 million citizens to be able to telephone their senator or representative direct then spending millions for home offices and to which they'll have to go to if they want to talk with their legislators."

Kuhn, one of the 11 senators, all Republicans, who voted

against the home office resolution, said he wouldn't have such an office even if it were provided.

"I'd have little or no time to spend in it," he said.

The home office bill by Dzendzel and Lockwood is but another in a long list of expenses the legislators have tapped the taxpayer for in recent years.

Years ago a state senator or representative got \$3 a day, or

a little over a \$1000 a year. Today he has a private office at the Capitol in Lansing, draws a salary of \$12,500, and a \$2,500 tax-free expense allowance, and is the recipient of numerous other stipends, financial and otherwise.

Voting against the home office bill with Kuhn were Republicans Frank Beadle, N. Lorraine Beebe, Harry DeMaso, James Fleming, Harold Hungerford, Robert Richardson, Gordon

Rockwell, John Toepf, Milton Zaagman, and Charles Zollar. Supporting the bill were the following Republicans and Democrats: John Bowman (D), Basil Brown (D), Gilbert Bursley (R), Arthur Cartwright (D), Roger Craig (D), Dzendzel, James Gray (D), Jerome Hart (D), Garland Lane (D), Lockwood, L. Harvey Lodge (R), Joseph Mack (D), John McCauley (D), Stanley Novak (D), and Charles Youngblood (D).

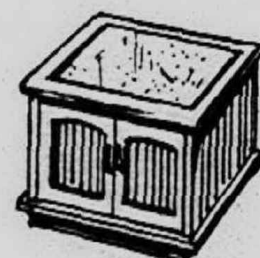

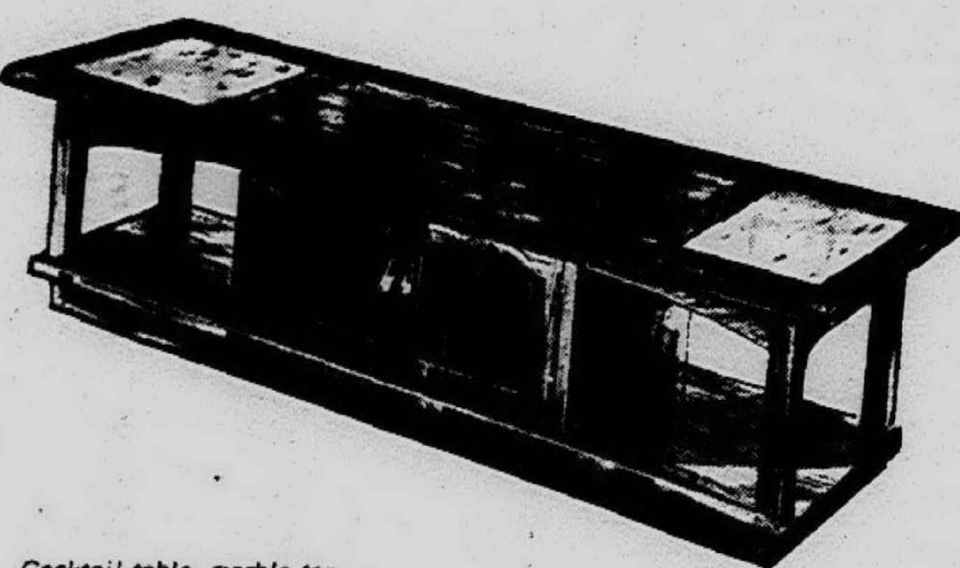

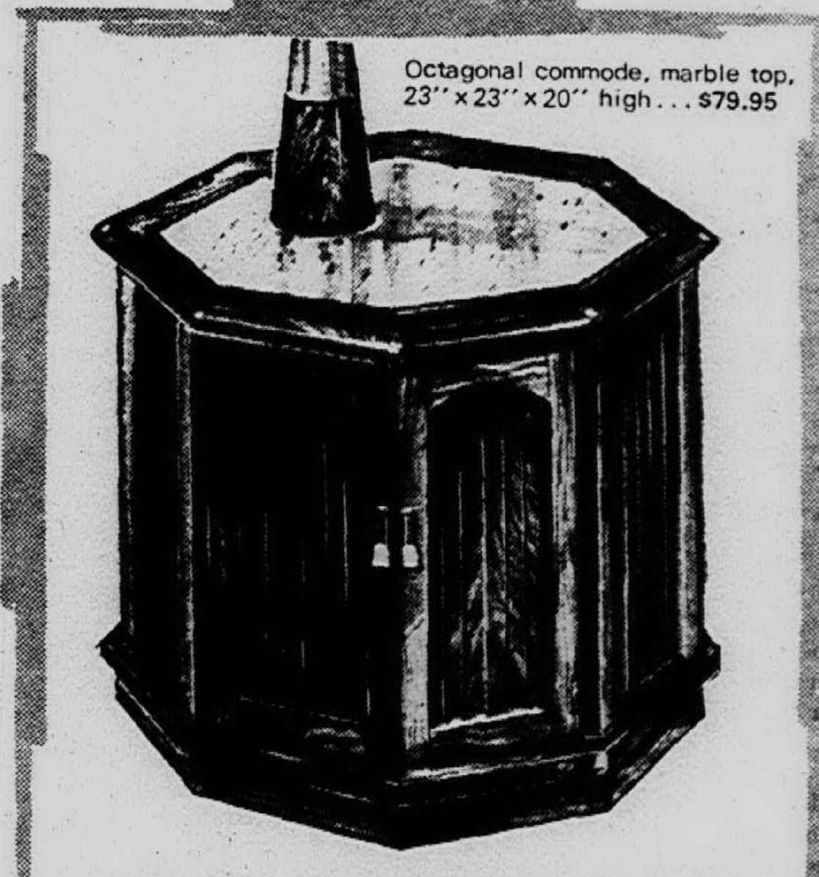

# Forget Dream, Attract Industry, Westland Told

Westland should direct its efforts in attracting new industries toward immediate land development and solicitation of many small firms instead of having "dreams" of becoming a research center and the hopes of a large company locating here must be tempered.

This was the highlight of a report given to Westland Mayor Thomas Brown by a private plant location consulting firm.

Theodore L. Doman, of T.L. Doman Associates in Birmingham, wrote Brown that to realize the benefits of industrial development, "the present well-organized development efforts of Westland must be scaled to practical efforts."

"Dreams of Westland becoming a research center and the hopes of a large company locating here must be tempered," advised Doman.

"Serious efforts should be directed toward immediate development of the land and solicitation of many smaller companies allied with the Detroit area's primary activity, auto manufacturing, metal fabricating, and industrial distribution."

DOMAN ALSO POINTED OUT in his two-page report that he has outlined a practical evaluation of the industrial potential of the city.

"It is not a theoretical or academic approach but a short, sound analysis of what Westland can offer to industry and what the benefits of industrial

development can be to the community," Doman said.

With 800 acres now zoned for industrial use, about 600 would actually be available for development after considering the needs for roads and easements, Doman said.

The total investment potential for new industry in the city is about \$160 million of which \$9 million would be in land value; \$47.5 million in buildings and \$103.5 million in machinery and equipment.

WITH THE ASSESSMENTS to be pegged at half of the market value, or \$80 million and using the city's current tax rate of \$10.30 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation; \$45 for schools; and \$9.80 for the county, the development would result in the following tax benefits:

\$824,000 for city income and \$3.6 million for the school districts.

The city revenue would be enough to pay 103 policemen or firemen each year; pave 4.5 miles of 30 feet streets; build a 40,000 square foot building or acquire land for parks and recreation; or reduce the bonded indebtedness on water and sewer facilities.

For the school districts, the developments would be enough to pay 450 teachers (at an average of \$8,000 per teacher); or pay local costs for 12,000 pupils at \$295 per year; or build and equip a new high school; or provide advanced teaching and educational aids.

Doman also said that 9,500 new jobs

that would be created by the future development would also benefit business and stimulate future growth of Westland to a marked degree.

"They will create a payroll of \$76 million, much of which will be spent locally for new homes, furnishings, personal goods, autos, and recreational services," he said.

STRESSING THE IMPORTANCE OF seeking out many smaller firms rather than pinning the city's hopes on a huge industrial complex, the consultant said:

"It is much better to have ten smaller companies actually located in Westland than to lose the single large national company that may never have been a prospect at all," he pointed out.

In stressing the city's good points, Doman said that Westland "is equal or superior" to other communities in the areas of providing good residential areas, fine schools, recreational facilities, and excellent commercial services.

The city government is progressive with competent administration and future planning activities. The tax structure is fair and moderate," he said.

Concerning the city's transportation advantages, Doman pointed out that the proposed I-275 freeway and the existing I-96 freeway gives Westland an advantage for north, south, and east-bound movement of goods, although the freeways have given neighboring cities the same advantage.

# There Are Are Some 'Ifs' Home-Building? It May Be Good

In a statement coinciding with his installation as president of the Builders Association of Metropolitan Detroit, Gilbert B. Silverman, president-partner in the firm of Holtzman & Silverman, Detroit, is optimistic about single home and apartment house construction in the metropolitan area during the year. He qualifies this, however, with an "if" or two. Here is the statement:

"If we can keep control of some of the things that are involved--manpower supply and the availability of financing, with interest rates allowed to fluctuate so that big investors will be encouraged to participate in home and apartment financing, I believe 1968 will be one of the better years in the construction business."

"There are a number of legislative matters coming up at Lansing that are of great concern to us, and our association needs liaison with the Michigan Association of Home Builders so that we can know at all times what

is happening in the legislature.

"WE NEED to encourage the development of manpower to assume the responsibility of keeping our various programs moving toward completion in every area of our industry, which means single homes, apartments, co-ops and condominiums, and various types of construction for business and industry."

"This year will see our association move into its new quarters at Northland, that office building being now under construction. I feel this relocation of our headquarters will bring all of us closer together for the work we have to do."

"We need an even stronger program to explain our zoning needs."

"Our image before the public is extremely important. We must find ways to produce lower cost housing under the government programs in-

tended for the elderly and the poor. We must help in the finding of suitable locations and we must produce good low-cost housing if we are to fulfill our role as builders for all segments of our society."

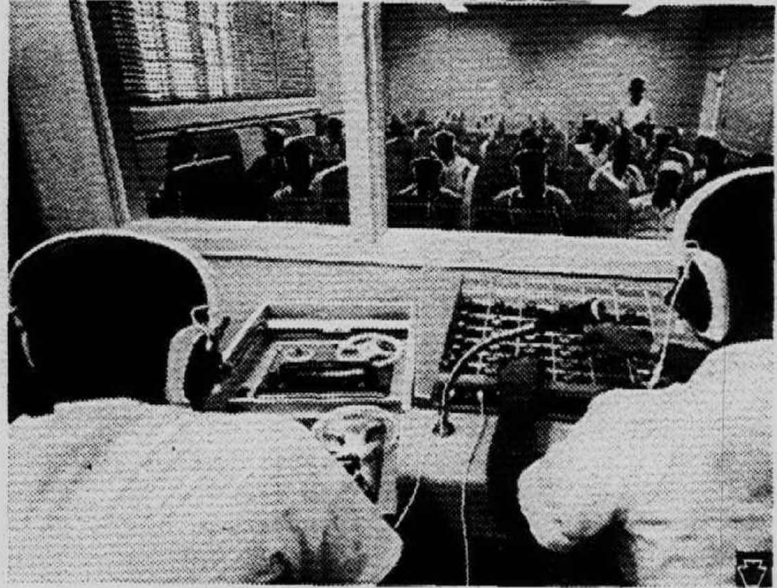

# Sees Need For Committees To Decide Heart Transplants

Select committees may be needed to make difficult moral questions in future heart transplants, says a University of Michigan professor of psychiatry and law. And he says those committees should exclude doctors.

Dr. Andrew S. Watson, of the U-M Medical and Law schools, believes that the role of the physician will have to be clearly defined. He foresees "considerable legislative change" in the future.

Social, moral, and legal issues have come to the forefront since Dr. Christian N. Barnard, South African cardiac surgeon, performed the first human heart transplant.

"WE ARE FACED with a myriad of perplexing questions that will have to be answered," according to Dr. Watson. "The prospect of more clinical transplant trials by surgical teams calls for defining the physician's role. Who gets the transplanted organ? Whom do you let die, whom do you let live? "This latter question is critical. Can we leave it up to the doctors to decide?"

Dr. Watson thinks not, especially in cases where only one patient may receive the organ that several may need.

"The doctor's role probably will be limited to recommending which patient needs the transplant surgery or the use of a kidney machine. It is likely that a committee drawn from the community at large ultimately will make the decisions which would then reflect judgments on social and community values."

DR. WATSON suggests that the committee be broadly representative of the social organizations--legal, economic, political, religious.

"Such a social committee would see that all procedures in the medical situation would adhere to legal and social stipulations. Its members also would have to be sure that the medical profession would not inappropriately 'use' people."

The committee's function would be to take a request for an organ from the physician. The committee members would know of organs available from potential donors, as well as of persons who need vital parts.

Some sort of rank-ordered lists would have to be maintained, with data on blood types and other medical information to assure proper matching, Dr. Watson theorizes.

"The question of whom to save becomes paramount...it eventually gets into the area of philosophy. Do you save a person because of his importance to the community? His wealth? How does age fit into the picture? Who is 'most important' to society or the community depends on a variety of factors. These, essentially, are moral questions, not medical ones, and should be outside the discretion of the physician."

ANOTHER QUESTION to be resolved in transplantation also focuses on the physician. Should the doctor who determines when a donor is dead be a member of the team which transplants the organ to the living patient? Probably not, says Dr. Watson.

The lawyer-physician notes a confusing legal situation which often involves more than the patient who requires an organ. State statutes now differ greatly in regard to organ bequests.

(At least one possible donation of a heart has been reported by the press as being blocked when relatives refused to comply with the wishes of the would-be donor, although the wife agreed to the donation.)

"New legislation will be a future necessity. As the law now stands in many states, after a person dies the immediate next of kin has the legal right to dispose of the body as he desires, even though a will sets forth different wishes of the deceased.

For example, if a man dies many miles from a medical center, even though he has designated in his will that his body parts be donated for research or transplantation, his immediate family may consider the donation too much trouble or too expensive, or they just may not wish to do it," Dr. Watson points out.

In the case of a donor who remains alive after transplantation, such as in a kidney operation, formal documents must be signed and witnessed and all parties must understand the meaning of their action.

THE "UNDERSTANDING" of the individual manifests an interesting aspect of the traditional patient-doctor relationship.

"With the advent of science in medicine, there has been a gradual emphasis on mechanization of diagnostic procedures, pushing emotional factors aside. This has resulted in doctors losing certain skills in human relations," Dr. Watson notes.

"The current attention in medical school curricula revision recognizes that our future doctors need to know how people react to illness, to understand why patients may be afraid, etc."

"Hopefully, the physician will come to understand the scope of the emotional problems that may be involved...the kinds of skills the old family physician intuitively possessed."

INHERENT IN transplantation procedures is the necessity for the physician to "sell himself" to the patient, the U-M professor asserts.

"The doctor has to win his confidence, to establish a warm relationship psychologically, and obtain his consent to the operation. This can be a delicate situation. The unconscious image the patient has of his doctor can be most important. The doctor who simply processes the patient as an object will arouse his anger. Similarly, the physician who tends to act godlike will not be likely to have good rapport with his patient."

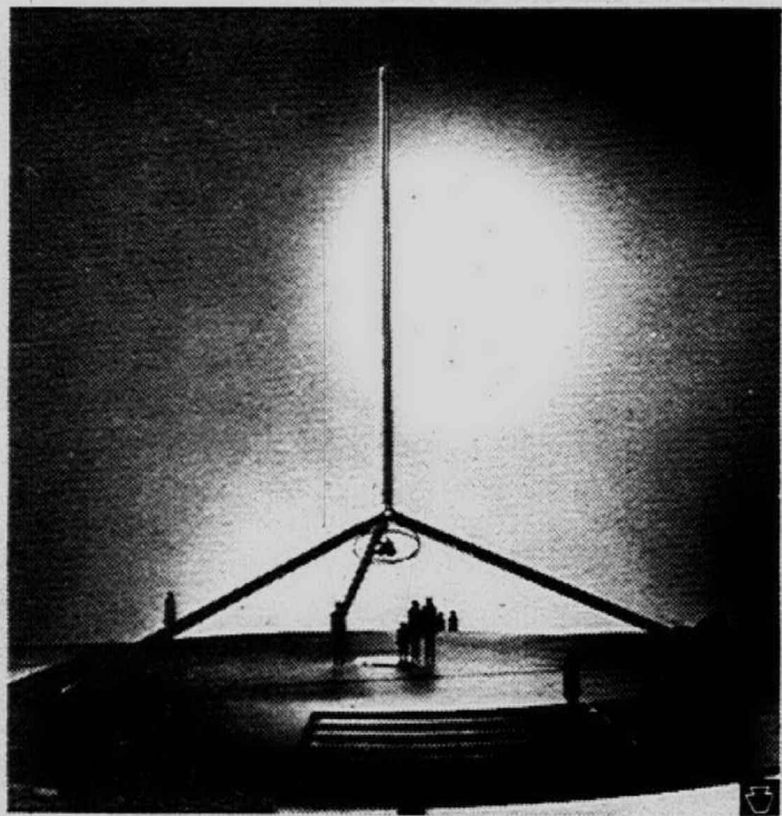

Topics which will be discussed include "Animal Habits and Behavior," "Preserving Our Natural Resources," "Snakes and Their Relatives," and "Exploring Low Temperatures with Liquid Air."

## Peace Corpsman Has Rare Disease

ANN ARBOR--A 23-year-old former Peace Corpsman is recovering at the University of Michigan Hospital from a rare jungle disease which has cost him a portion of his left leg.

Doctors say he represents the first documented case of mycobacterium ulcerans in the United States, and one of few white people who have contracted it anywhere.

The patient, Robert Funk, of Bryan, O., was struck by the disease while on Peace Corps duty in Enugu, Nigeria, in March 1966.

Returning home, he entered the hospital at Bryan, and was transferred to University Hospital in June 1966. The disease mainly affects the skin and subcutaneous tissue, but had progressed so far that in August 1966 U-M doctors amputated his left leg below the knee.

LAST SEPTEMBER, Funk enrolled at Ohio State University to begin training as a veterinarian. He re-entered the U-M Hospital December 19, with a flare-up of the original disorder, and underwent minor surgery to remove local areas of recurrence.

## Economists Neglect Long-Run

DR. McCracken, professor of business administration and a former member of President Eisenhower's Council of Economic Advisers, noted that the 1966-67 period also has had its good points--one of them being the lesson that "guided by a more explicit game plan, economic policy in reality and in the textbook may begin to look more like the same thing."

The economy during 1966 and 1967 has had reasonably full employment, while gains in output and real incomes have also been impressive. And there was no real recession.

Still, there is deep unease about our economic situation, "a growing awareness that we must do some fresh thinking about three major areas of economic policy."

"The 7-1/2 per cent per year average increase in the minimum wage since 1961 obviously is part of the explanation for the fact that non-white teenage unemployment rates today are even higher than in the recession year of 1954."

McCracken suggested approaches which may help alleviate the problem.

The negative-income-tax approach clearly suggests itself and does not price work out of the market, he said.

Economic policy during 1966-1967 probably has concentrated too much on the short-run view at the expense of long-range goals.

Family Planning Pays Off

Almost 500 fewer babies were delivered at the State University-Kings County Medical Center here in 1967 than in 1966.

Dr. Louis M. Hellman, chairman of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, attributed the drop to the growing success of the Family Planning Clinic. The clinic began in 1958 with three patients and now serves more than 10,000 women a year.

Last year 5,525 babies were born as compared with 6,023 in 1966. This decline in births is significant, Dr. Hellman pointed out, in light of the special problems of the patients who have their babies at the center.

Almost every woman is poor and underprivileged; most know little or nothing about birth control; and many have had six or more children by the age of 25. Three quarters of the patients are Negro and most of the remainder are fairly recent arrivals from Puerto Rico, according to the physician.

THE FAMILY Planning Clinic is an "emergency service in the battle against unwanted children, deepening poverty, and mounting hopelessness," maintains Dr. Schuyler G. Kohl, who heads it and is also professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology.

Poor people should not be pushed further downward, the doctor observed, because information and the means to limit family size are not available to them.

Pregnancy in this low-income population often is not a benign event, Dr. Kohl pointed out, emphasizing the importance of the Clinic's work. The maternal death rate for these patients is three to four times the national figure; infant mortality is 20 per cent higher than the national rate; and premature births occur twice as frequently as they do with higher income mothers.

"Almost all the women who die on our maternity service die of complications following illegal abortion," Dr. Kohl declared, "and illegal abortion is the common method of birth control used by our patients."

EIGHTY PER CENT of the women who now deliver at the Center seek out family planning instruction and contraceptives, Dr. Kohl noted.

They do so "regardless of religious background."

These statistics refute the popular notion that poor women are the least motivated, the least educable, and the least accepting to long-term birth control services.

Every patient who comes to the Center for a prenatal check-up is informed about the availability of family planning services. Doctors, nurses, nurse-midwives, medical students and social service workers discuss future childbearing desires with the patient.

If she is interested an appointment is made, immediately, for her to attend classes where she will learn about male and female anatomy, reproductive physiology, and the various methods of contraception, including rhythm. Patients are encouraged to ask questions and to join in informal discussion.

The patient's needs and wishes are considered when contraception is prescribed. About 60 per cent of women prefer the pills; about 40 per cent choose the intrauterine device (IUD).

One by-product of the program is that twice as many women now return for check-ups after their babies are born. "Because of this, we have detected and treated 25 women with early cancer of the uterus, and have uncovered other conditions requiring care," Dr. Kohl said.

Firm Bids \$7.5 Million On I-96 Mile

LANSING—Greenfield Construction Co., Livonia, and C.A. Hull Co., Inc., Walled Lake, have submitted a joint low bid of \$7.5 million for construction of nearly a mile of I-96 Freeway in Detroit, the State Highway Commission announced.

The project, between Warren Ave. and Myrtle St., includes grading, paving, relocation of utilities, and construction of retaining walls and four bridges, two at railroad crossings, one for pedestrians and one for vehicles.

Scheduled completion date is Dec. 31, 1970.

The Greenfield and Hull bid totaled \$7,521,623.30.

# Merged Railroad Shows Profit Dip During 1967

The affiliated Chesapeake and Ohio/Baltimore and Ohio railroads, the only railroads to issue a Flash Annual Report on the first working day of the new year, reported consolidated earnings for 1967 of \$52.3 million, equal to \$6.02 a C&O common share. In 1966 consolidated earnings were \$66.1 million, or \$7.61 a C&O common share.

Total operating revenues for C&O/B&O were \$809 million, compared with \$813 million the previous year. Merchandise revenues were \$469 million, almost the same as in 1966, while coal and coke revenues rose by \$4 million to \$283 million in 1967. Expenses, taxes and other charges

increased to \$757 million, from \$747 million in 1966.

The report, signed jointly by Cyrus S. Eaton, C&O board chairman, and Gregory S. DeVine, C&O/B&O president and chief executive officer, told shareholders that 1967 revenues "held at reasonably satisfactory levels in spite of the slower pace of the economy and nation-wide work stoppages on the railroads and in major industries."

"On the other hand, the costs of doing business, particularly wage rates, rose sharply. As a result, consolidated net income was down, in spite of what was accomplished in a vigorous cost-control program."

"C&O's annual dividend of \$4 was paid for the 11th consecutive year," the report said, adding that "at the same time, future earning power was strengthened by substantial expenditures to build up the C&O/B&O." The affiliated railroads were improved in the year by capital expenditures of \$179 million.

FOR 1968, "an encouraging rise in revenues is foreseen—but coupled with a troubling continued increase in expenses. From a quickened economy in 1968 and intensified C&O/B&O marketing efforts, an increase of about seven per cent in total freight revenues is expected."

However, new demands for increases in wages already presented by the labor organizations exceed those granted in 1967," the report said, and "still higher prices for materials and supplies can be expected."

The report noted that "while a possible rate increase to help offset these rising costs must be weighed by the industry, C&O/B&O believe that any substantial long-term improvement in railroad earnings must come from the increased use of new equipment, facilities and technology to improve efficiency even further, and from railroad mergers and affiliations that permit major cost reductions as well

as improve efficiency."

For new equipment and still more capital improvements, the report said C&O/B&O expect to invest about \$130 million in 1968.

"Passenger train and miscellaneous revenues declined by \$7 million," the report said. "Of this reduction, \$6 million resulted from fewer riders (although C&O/B&O conducted a vigorous promotional and advertising campaign) and the loss of mail which the Post Office diverted to trucks and airplanes."

Total passenger revenues came to \$28 million, but the final outcome was a direct deficit, on an avoidable-

cost basis, of \$13 million, up from \$8 million in 1966.

"NET INCOME in this mixed year, as a result, was \$52.3 million, less than in 1966 and 1965, but higher than in any of the years 1960 through 1964," the report said. "Working capital and cash and short-term investments, while down, were at satisfactory levels at 1967's close."

Among improvements in 1967 were an \$8 million cargo pier at Newport News, Va.; a \$3.5 million piggyback terminal at Forest Hill Yard in Chicago, and a \$1.2 million automobile preparation terminal near Washington.

Hutton predicted a bright picture for 1968. "Savings flows have been strong for 15 months and while interest rates are near their all-time peaks there seems to be a slight settling down in the economy.

## Commonwealth Gain Is 28 Per Cent In '67

Bank of the Commonwealth's consolidated net operating earnings for the year of 1967 aggregated \$5,650,935, or \$4.19 a share. This was a 28 per cent increase over 1966 earnings of \$4,413,034, or \$3.27 a share, it was reported today by Donald H. Parsons, chairman, and George W. Miller, president.

A change in accounting practice adopted in 1967 has been reflected retroactively to 1966, which reduced 1966 net consolidated operating earnings from \$4,619,019, as previously

announced, to \$4,413,034. The restatement represents a reduction of 15 cents per share from the previously announced \$3.42 to \$3.27 per share.

Assets totaled \$1,094,607,217 at Dec. 31, 1967, as contrasted with \$873,918,991 at the year-end 1966, an increase of 25 per cent. Year-end deposits totaled \$976,817,594, compared to \$771,022,307 a year earlier, or a gain of 27 per cent.

Earnings for the fourth quarter of 1967 were \$2,128,674, or \$1.58 per share, an increase of 26 per cent.

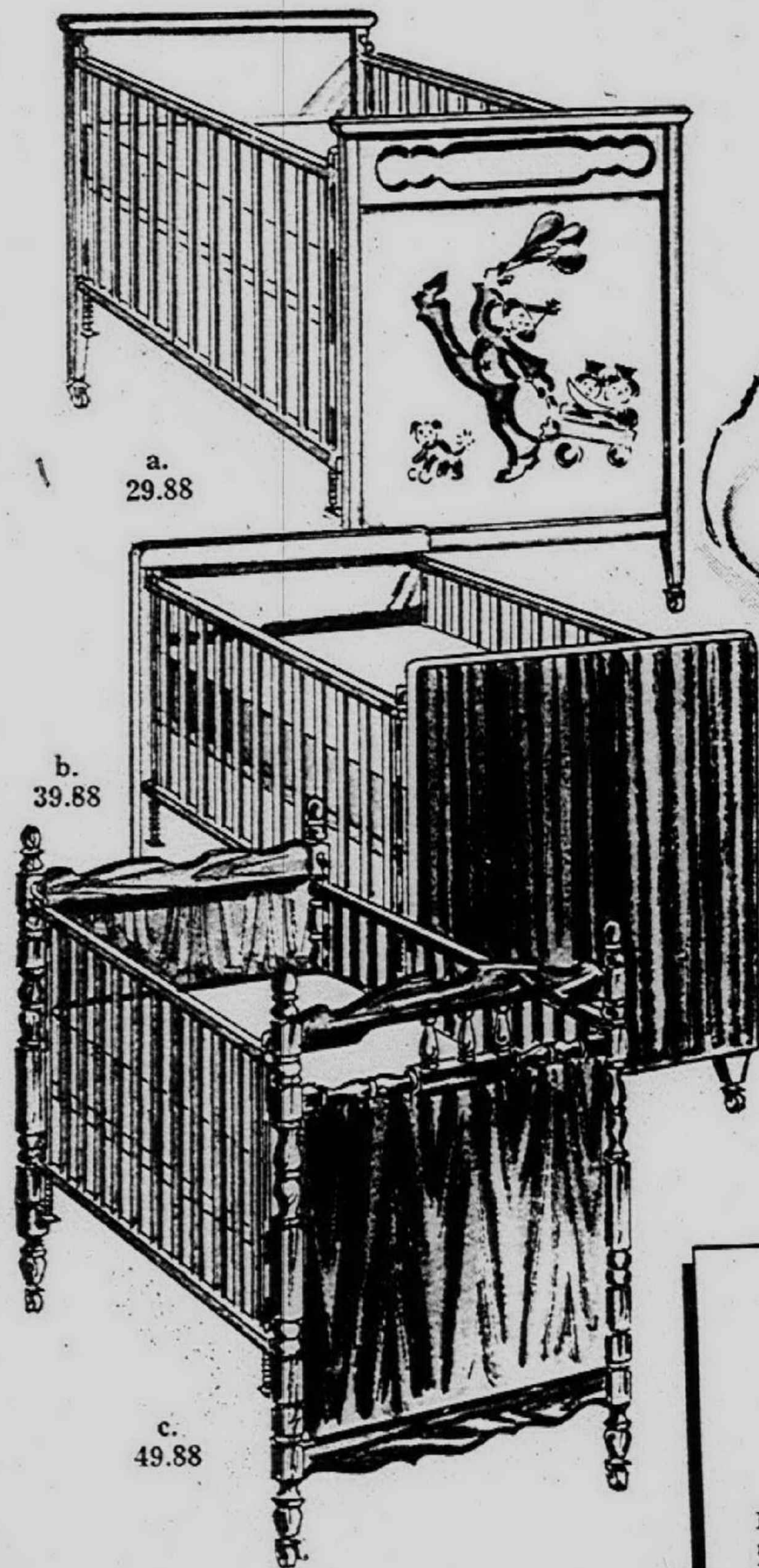

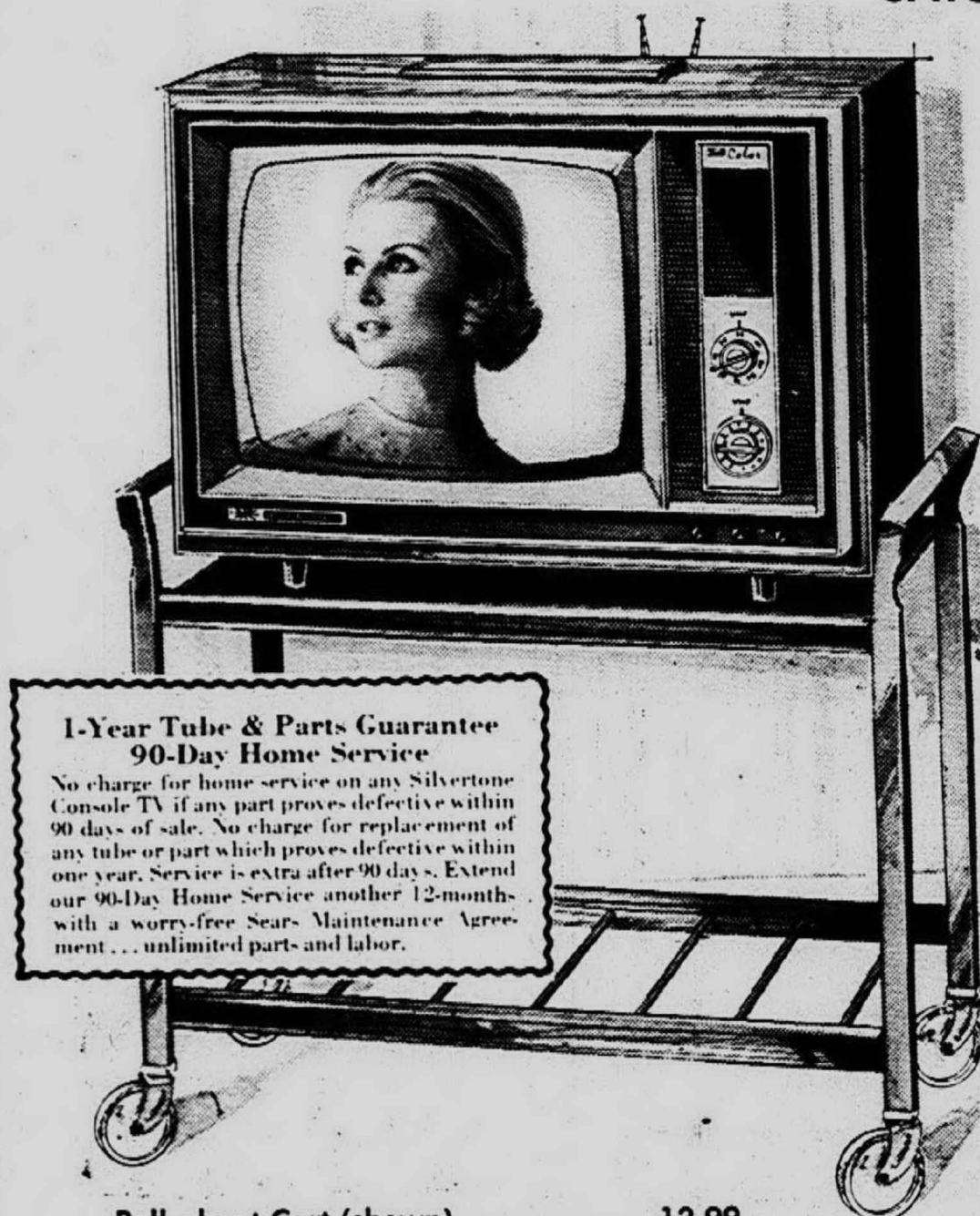

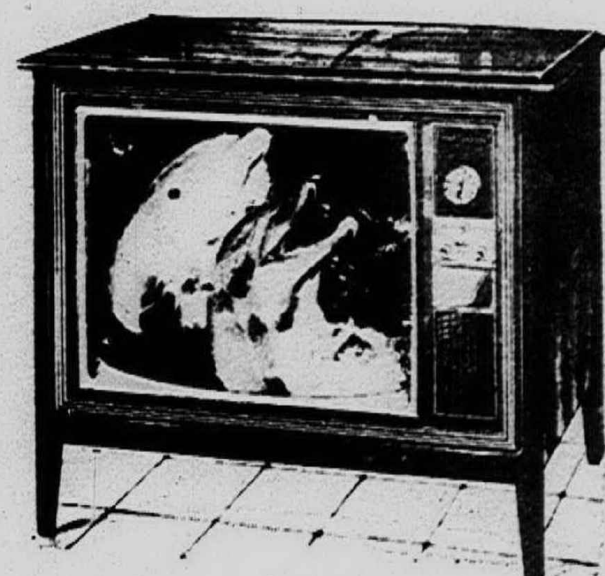

# Packard Workers Faced Social Alienation

So long as the American economic system is committed to producing winners, it must also take the consequences of having losers.

Some of the consequences of being a loser are detailed in a new book, "Economic Failure, Alienation, and Extremism", published by the University of Michigan Press.

The book focuses on the experiences of more than 300 Packard Motor Car Co. employees after the Detroit plant closed in 1956.

It is the work of Michael Aiken, sociologist at the University of Wisconsin; Louis A. Ferman, research director of the Institute of Labor and Industrial Relations, and associate professor of social work, University of Michigan; and Herold L. Sheppard, social scientist at the W.E. Upjohn Institute.

WITH RAPID technology and economic changes continuously reshaping the nature of work, the plight of the Packard employees could be that of any American worker today or tomorrow," the authors point out.

"Their experiences reflect problems and issues faced by American society in the 1960s: economic failure, social alienation, social participation, and political extremism."

The loss of work is viewed as weakening the individual's social and emotional link to main social currents. The authors say job displacement may result in:

1. Depletion of financial resources and reduced contact with relatives or friends because the worker cannot reciprocate his social obligations.
2. Temporary or permanent loss of social relationships in the work situation that have provided effective support and functional aid.
3. Loss of contact with one of the primary social institutions, the labor union, through which the worker gains a sense of competence or influence in the control of his environment.
4. Erosion of a useful work role that has given the individual a sense of social identity.
5. Redistribution of wage-earning responsibilities within the family, which may result in a drastic readjustment of role expectations and behavior of the family members.

A job at Packard was regarded as a career by the Poles, Slavs, Italians, Germans, and Negroes who went to work for the company in the early years, the authors found.

At the time of the shutdown in June 1956, some 49 per cent of the Packard workers had 26 years or more service with the company. Even before unionization, the company had gone out of its way to offer advantages to its workers--including above average pay, separation pay, insurance plans, informal seniority. Many employees felt "bereaved" by the news of the shutdown.

When the study was begun in 1957, a total of 260 respondents had averaged slightly more than 10 months of joblessness. Only 45 per cent of the sample was actually re-employed at the time.

The close link between finding a job and the extent of social participation is important, the authors note. "To withdraw from contact with friends and relatives is to reduce one's opportunities for reemployment." The results of such social alienation are detailed in the book's analysis.

EMPLOYMENT INSECURITY tends to be reflected in a wide range of a worker's activities and relationships, the authors emphasize.

"If a worker's experiences have been bad and if he blames the American political and social institutions for his plight, it may be difficult for him to continue to believe that life is worthwhile or that these institutions are viable," the book states.

The Packard workers had lost what many of them referred to again and again in the study as "a good place to work."

## Movie Encourages Use Of Safety Belts

General Motors has produced a new motion picture to encourage motorists to protect themselves with the lap and shoulder belts which are now standard equipment on each passenger car manufactured in the United States.

The film is "UFO," for "Unrestrained Flying Objects," and stars four safety test dummies which demonstrate the protection the belts can provide in the event of a collision.

The full-color, 14-minute film recreates some of GM's safety development and test procedures which, with other studies, have shown that motorists have a greater chance of escaping injury or death in a crash if they are held securely in place inside the car.

"UFO" WAS DEVELOPED as part of General Motors' continuing campaign to encourage the use of passenger restraints.


In addition to GM employees the film will be made available shortly to schools; driver education classes; television stations; traffic safety organizations; law enforcement agencies; civic, fraternal and similar groups and to the general public through the General Motors Film Library.
