REDFORD — The Planning Commission delayed a decision to amend the township zoning ordinance to include a high rise classification because three of nine commission members did not attend Thursday's public hearing. A petition signed by 3,000 persons was entered in opposition.

REDFORD — Subcommittee hearings of the Senate Elections Committee attracted only two of an expected 50 township clerks. As expected, testimony condemning the 1966 Republican primary election in Redford was heard. Sen. Anthony Stamm said he, too, had doubts about the security of Shoup voting machines, but that legislative correction would not be considered. He contended the complaint should have gone to the county prosecutor.

LIVONIA — An attorney defending a Negro client in Municipal Court here requested a change of venue on the grounds that racial prejudice in Livonia raises the probability his client will not receive a fair and impartial jury trial. The attorney termed policies of segregation in all-white Livonia a parallel of racism "as is practiced, or is being attempted in Dearborn." Visiting Judge John Seiler, of Wayne, in denying the motion, raised in his decision the question, "What if all whites in Detroit charged with a crime asked to be tried only in all-white communities?"

FARMINGTON — Township Supervisor Curtis H. Hall disclosed that the Oakland County Equalization Board has recommended a 1968 tax factor for the township of 0.93, giving property owners a tax break of seven per cent against assessments. Approval of the Board of Supervisors and State Tax Commission still is needed.

FARMINGTON — Glenn Swindler, president of the Oakland County Homeowners and Taxpayers Association, carried his bid for a public hearing on the 1969 county budget into Farmington Tuesday in the latest of a series of appearances before local organizations. Supervisors have denied his request for a hearing until after tax allocation issues are settled.

FARMINGTON — Eighty-five persons met Wednesday under the banner of the New Farmington Committee to discuss civil rights issues. Goal of the organization was defined by its chairman as being the ultimate racial integration of the Farmington area.

LIVONIA — The Board of Education has instructed its administrative staff to explore ways to "improve upon children's understanding of differences of attitudes toward each other" as a contribution toward "dealing with the social issues of our time."

Old Landmark Passes

Another old landmark soon will be missing from Main Street.

After holding forth for 60 years on North Main, hard by the rail crossing, the Plymouth Lumber Company is passing from the scene after helping to write a bright page in the city's history right after the turn of the century.

"Just couldn't keep up in our present economy", Dave Mathers, the head of the company explained, "and the change in the attitude of the builders". Looking around the old place as he spoke, Dave pointed out that great changes have taken place in the lumber and building business.

"THERE WAS a time, or so I thought", he confided, "that quality and service were the most important factors in the

success of any business. It's not so today.

"In our present economy, the large builders have turned to economic prices and are using the cheapest of lumber. So, even with a building boom, we no longer could make it."

While in the process of closing out inventory for the past month it wasn't until this week that the decision was finally made to liquidate the assets and retire from business. The stock, or what is left of it, is being moved across the street to the McLaren Company, which has been a competitor for years.

In announcing the decision Mathers recalled the start of the Plymouth Lumber Company.

"My father, Charles Mathers, came here from Marshall, Michigan in 1908. At the same time his brother, Frank, went

to Jackson. Each of them opened a lumber yard and Frank still is doing well.

ASKED HOW he got into the lumber business, Dave smiled and answered:

"I graduated from the University of Michigan in 1937 with a major in business and immediately talked to my Dad about buying some of the business. I did. Then, in 1938, Dad died and I took over. What's more, I've been here ever since."

Dave has seen many changes of Main Street in the past 30 years and he recalled a few of them.

"Our old front office was unique" he said, "and in the good days we took half of the old Markham property where they manufactured air rifles."



Nation-Wide Telephone Strike Idles 895 In Plymouth Plants

Joining in the first nationwide strike against the Bell Telephone Company in 21 years 895 employees walked off jobs at Michigan Bell and Western

Electric, its subsidiary, Thursday afternoon.

Included in the group—all members of the Communication Workers of America—were 355

employees of Michigan Bell, 80 installers from Western Electric who were working at the new phone building on Ann Arbor, and 460 employees of the

distributing house at Western Electric who refused to cross the picket line.

The Communication Workers have been dickering on a nation-

wide basis for a new contract for some time and have rejected the latest offer of an eight per cent increase earnings, but the distributing house em-

ployees contract does not expire until September.

WHEN THE walkout began promptly at 3 p.m. members of the supervisory departments immediately manned the switchboards in the hope regular Bell service would be maintained.

Meanwhile, Bell officials asked customers to exercise patience under the strike conditions with the hope that the dispute soon would be settled and service returned to normal.

Ironically, the strike hit at a time when Michigan Bell is coming down the home stretch in equipping its new building to handle all long distance calls and other services in the area.

John R. Peard, local manager of Michigan Bell, stated that he had no idea of how long the dispute will last. Bob Hayman, of Western Electric, likewise, was non-committal in discussing the length of time the service would be interrupted by the strike.

Shortly after the walkout started Peard, speaking officially for Michigan Bell, issued the following statement:

"Members of the Communications Workers of America have walked off their jobs at Michigan Bell and have begun picketing the company's work locations throughout the state."

"MICHIGAN BELL Management people are manning the switchboards and we expect that the handling of calls will be substantially normal. However, we urge that customers dial their own long distance calls whenever possible."

"The strike was called by the Union after five weeks of bargaining failed to produce

Plymouth Township Planners Again Spurn Requests For Apartment Zoning

The Plymouth Township Planning Commission still is wrestling with the knotty problems of apartment house zoning.

The area developers and realtors met the planners head on last Wednesday night and when the verbal skirmishes were ended three requests were denied, one tabled and another withdrawn. Not a single request was granted.

Among the tabled requests, was that of Stewart Oldford and Sons, Inc.

Oldford's application asked that property on the south side of M-14, between Beck and Ridge Rd., known as the Pino Farm—be changed from R-1-E

(country estates—one acre minimum) to R-1-H (country homes—half acre minimum.)

THE DEVELOPER had a unique plan for the property which

would allow the topography to be kept in its original state as much as possible.

The parcel is hilly and contains many trees along with flat areas where he claims houses

On sections of the acreage where houses could be constructed, after a great deal of leveling and filling in, Oldford said he would leave it as a park or green belt area.

IN OTHER ACTION, the commission flatly denied a request to rezone property on the south side of Ann Arbor Rd., between Eckles and the proposed I-275

expressway from R-1 (one family residential) to R-2-A (garden apartment residential). The petitioners, Northfield Homes, Inc. and Sutton Homes, Inc., were told that too many parcels of land were being rezoned for multiple dwelling units and the request was being denied for this reason.

The companies had proposed to build townhouses along the expressway's proposed route. Another Oldford application was held in abeyance until after a public hearing May 4 on the new subdivision ordinance 14.

In this case, Oldford asked that property on the north side of M-14, between Sheldon and McClumpha Rd., be changed from R-1-S (suburban residential) to R-2-A.

TWO OTHER zoning requests also were tabled Wednesday night.

Application No. 82, from Stanley Denski, was removed from the agenda at Denski's request. He had asked that property on the north side of Ann

Hearing Date Set

After months of discussion and debate, Plymouth Township Planning Commission has set May 4 for the first public hearing on the proposed new subdivision ordinance—Ordinance 14.

Arbor Rd., between Gold Arbor and Southworth Streets, be changed from R-2 (two family residential) to R-2-A.

An application filed by Jane Ann Lyons was tabled until more information could be furnished by the petitioner.

The request was that property on the north side of Ann Arbor Trail, between Sheldon and McClumpha Rd., be changed from R-1-S to R-2-A.

Symphony To Open Membership Drive

The Plymouth Symphony Society, which helps support the only orchestra of its sort in the western suburbs, will conduct its annual membership drive next month.

The most intense part of the campaign will be May 5-11, proclaimed as Symphony Week.

With the goal of "good music for everyone," the Symphony Society contributes to three different musical programs in Plymouth:

FIRST, it helps to sponsor six free concerts a year by the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra on Sunday afternoons in the high school. (The season's final one, incidentally, is April 28 when the soloist will be pianist Benning Dexter.)

Second, it co-sponsors (with the PTAs) the Detroit Adventure Excursions in music concerts in Plymouth elementary schools. Detroit Symphony musicians perform for school audiences, providing many youngsters their first introduction to serious music.

Third, it offers scholarships for advanced summer music training for outstanding high school musicians to study at Schoolcraft College, Eastern Michigan University and the National Music Camp at Interlochen.

A VARIETY of memberships will be solicited from families, businesses and civic organizations.

Patron membership is \$50 and up; sustaining, \$25; supporting, \$15; active, \$10. Donations are amounts less than \$10.

Contributions are tax-deductible and may be mailed to: Plymouth Symphony Society, P.O. Box 99, Plymouth, Mich. 48170.

Several members of the society's board will be working on the campaign. Dr. Robert Petersen is general chairman and civic organization solicitor; Mrs. Charles Childs will handle family memberships; Richard Merriam will be in charge of industry, and Dr. David McCubrey will cover business.

Robyn Merriam Dies Suddenly

Robyn "Bob" D. Merriam, supervisor of Northville Township for the past five years, died suddenly of a stroke Wednesday evening in St. Mary Hospital, Livonia. He was 68.

Services for Mr. Merriam, who was an engineer for Wayne County for 33 years and a Northville Township Trustee before becoming supervisor in 1963, were conducted Saturday in the First Presbyterian Church of Northville with Rev. Lloyd Brasure officiating. Burial was made in Glen Eden Cemetery, Livonia.

Mr. Merriam's term of office was due to expire in November of 1970 and Township Clerk, Mrs. Eleanor Hammond, said that the board will have to appoint someone to fill the vacancy until a special election can be held.

As supervisor of Northville Township, Mr. Merriam was automatically a member of the Wayne County Board of Super-

visors. He was serving on the committee investigating alleged mismanagement of the Northville Training School.

The supervisor was born June 1, 1899 in Dougherty, Okla., which is 90 miles south of Oklahoma City. When he was still a young boy his family moved to Charlevoix where he later graduated from high school.


He was a corporal in the Marines in World War I. He graduated from the University of Michigan Engineering College in 1924 and soon after began work with the county.

He is survived by his wife, Lida Jane Merriam, of 18910 Beck Rd., Northville; three daughters, Mrs. Margery Eaton of Florida, Mrs. Sally Newton of Ohio and Mrs. Betsie Chapman of Belleville; one sister, Mrs. Floyd Selby of Oklahoma; one brother, Archibald of Oklahoma; 11 grandchildren and one great grandchild.

agreement on new wage contracts.

"A company offer valued at \$10.2 million over an 18-month period was rejected by the Union bargaining team. It amounted to 7.5 per cent increase, the largest wage offer ever made by Michigan Bell. Additional fringe items negotiated in 1966 to become effective with the new agreement, would have brought the package to \$11 million, representing a total increase of 8.2 per cent.

"Under the rejected offer Michigan Bell's 18,200 bargained for employees would have received increases of from \$4 to \$15 a week."

City Ponders New Offer For Industry

Interest in the city's industrial park on Plymouth which has been dormant for quite a while was re-kindled during the past week.

The new interest came when the city received an offer from Leon Vercruysse to purchase the property as the site for a manufacturing area of 14,000 square feet, plus 2,000 square feet of office space.

It was pointed out in the offer that the proposed building would be valued at approximately \$100,000 and that several prospective tenants were looking toward Plymouth as sites.

The amount of the offer for the one and one half acres was not disclosed.

Under the terms of the City Charter the land can not be sold unless it is put for bids.

This is going to be done according to the approval of the Commission that also stipulated that any contract would have to include starting dates for construction and also contain dates for operation of the facilities.

Once before the city was involved in a deal for part of the industrial park area—and the plan backfired when Wheel Truening decided to forego plans for operation on the site.

New City Park Awaits Approval Of County

Plans are under way to establish a new park in Plymouth—provided the Wayne County Road Commission will look with favor on the project.

The new park would be at the intersection of Ann Arbor Road and Ann Arbor Trail and it is being designed as a wooded area to help beautify one of the entrances into the city.

The project was presented to the City Commission last Monday night by the Plymouth Jaycees as one of its major projects of the year.

Considerable work has been laid out for the establishment of the park. This will include 2,100 yards of land fill and the purchasing and planting of the trees and shrubs.

The entire cost was estimated

at \$4,700 by the Jaycees, who later revealed that the cost to the city would be nil inasmuch as much of the land fill was being donated and that the public asked to join with the various service clubs to provide the trees.



Suburbanites Ask Rumor Control Units

Establishment of rumor control committees in suburban communities was recommended by a conference of 22 suburban officials and the Wayne County Board of Supervisors Thursday.

These would aid in the work already begun by an out-county rumor control center located in Westland and the Detroit rumor control center, according to a county board spokesman.

AMONG THE suggested projects for such committees would be preparation and distribution of a letter similar to one drafted by Southfield Police.

That letter urges that in the event of civil unrest that citizens (1) remain calm, (2) stay in their homes, (3) let police handle it, (4) buy a dog, not a gun.

Other duties of such committees would be to check rumors telephoned in by citizens and give a factual reply.

This is being done now from the out-county rumor control center, 3100 Henry Road, Westland. Citizens calling 761-6800 receive replies based on checks with various county police agencies.

It was set up, more quickly than planned, on the night Dr. Martin Luther King was assassinated. That first shaky weekend 4,000 calls were handled.

OBSERVERLAND communities of Livonia, Redford Township, Westland and Plymouth Township were represented at the conference by municipal authorities. Farmington township's newly-created New Farmington Committee was represented by Larry Pontius, although Oakland County was not an intended participant.

From Livonia, Police Chief James Jordan, Police Captain Dennis Swift and Public Safety Director Donald Nicholson attended.

Redford Supervisor Aldrick Bellafre and Police Chief Edwin Gleza were there. So were Westland Mayor Thomas Brown and Police Chief Garrison Clayton. Plymouth Township Director of Public Service Paul J. Albright attended.

John Canfield, board of supervisors chairman and Mayor of Dearborn Heights, and Mel Ravitz, Detroit councilman on the board, called the conference.

Views of suburban officials were aired and means of the county aiding local community efforts were offered.


Among the latter, it was revealed that a \$200,000 federal grant is being sought to finance training programs for persons involved in coping with white suburban fears.

If granted, the money will be used to establish programs at the University of Detroit and Wayne State.

Another conference is possible in the near future.





Senate OKs Kuhn Bill On Security

The State Senate has given 27 to 9 approval of Sen. George Kuhn's bill to set up a State Internal Security Council.

If passed by the House and signed by the governor, the bill would set up a nine-man group to meet monthly "to keep abreast of all subversive activity, either planned or contemplated, which would tend to undermine the health, welfare, and public safety," said Kuhn.

The West Bloomfield lawmaker, whose district includes Farmington, Livonia and Plymouth, said:

"We learned from last summer's riots the necessity for the utmost coordination and planning by all law enforcement agencies to effectively combat any future unrest."

"The last crisis proved to be a 'comedy of errors'...The protection and security of public utilities, such as electrical plants, communications, water, gas, etc., are also of prime concern."

Members of the Internal Security Council would include the governor, state police commissioner, National Guard commander, state attorney general, two senators and two representatives.

Panfishing Picks Up In Area

Panfishing is beginning to pick up in southeastern Michigan as the weather warms, according to reports from the State Conservation Department district office in Pontiac.

A few—but good-size—bluegills are being taken at Oxbow, Pontiac, Alderman, Big and Union lakes in Oakland County.

Medium perch were taken on the Huron River at Flat Rock. The Huron and Clinton rivers are getting heavy pressure for rough fish.

Pike season hasn't started yet, and the regular trout season begins April 27.

The Conservation Department warns that woods are dry and forest fire hazards great. Outdoorsmen should check with the department before starting open fires, and should also take precautions to prevent grass and forest fires.

E. Indian To Speak On Non-Violence

Dr. Vyas Thirtha, of Hyderabad, India, will address the Livonia Citizens for Better Human Relations at a meeting at 8:30 p.m. Sunday, April 21, in St. Timothy United Presbyterian Church, 16700 Newburgh.

His topic will be "Non-Violence: Faith in a Course of Action."

Dr. Thirtha is a professor of educational sociology at Osmania University in Hyderabad and received his doctorate at Stanford University. Currently he is a consultant on India and Southeast Asia for the Wayne County Intermediate School District.

coming in faster for the fifth renewal of the Merri-Bowl Lanes-Observer Newspapers mixed doubles tournament than ever before. It has an estimated first prize of \$2,500. That was the announcement from Tournament Director Mac Goldman as he pointed to the Saturday, May 4 opening and indicated there are still a few gaps on the schedules for the first weekend.

The fifth annual tournament opens on May 4 and continues through Sunday, June 23. It is the first time that tourney officials delayed the opening until after the Lenten season. The tourney operates under a 70 per cent handicap not to exceed 120 pins per game for a team. Eighteen games constitute a league average and tournament officials will accept 1967 summer league averages. Entrants, other than those governed by the Detroit Bowling Association and the Detroit

Women's Bowling Association, may be required to provide an affidavit of all league averages signed by the league secretary or the city association secretary. The tourney will operate on the same time schedule each Saturday and Sunday with bowling at noon, 2 p.m., 4 p.m., 6 p.m., 8 p.m. and 10 p.m. The dates, for which entries are being accepted now at Merri-Bowl and for which many choice times are still available, are as follows:
SATURDAYS -- May 4, 11, 18 and 25; June 1, 8, 15 and 22.
SUNDAYS -- May 5, 12, 19 and 26; June 2, 9, 16 and 23. There will be only two squads on May 5, due to previous commitments, with bowling at 8 and 10 p.m.

Those who know, can't say enough about what Bishop has contributed to keeping the community calm and peaceful.

Unquestionably in Observerland there have to be numerous Bishop proteges who remember how Sam would boot them around on Northwestern field.

WHEN SAM WOULD assert himself, you'd get mad... but not for long. You couldn't stay angry at him very long.

The Old Guard around Northwestern High and Northwestern Field plan a big shindig at Roma Hall in Livonia on May 9.

"It'll be a double festivity," says Farmington's Cotton, who is on the committee-helping to stage the event.

"For one thing, we want to honor Sam Bishop and really thank him for what he's done for the community and each of us individually. Secondly, we are looking forward to May 9 as a reunion for Northwestern High alumni."

INSIDE CITY HALL

The council will probably have again on its agenda Monday the resolution by Councilmen Robert Nash and Jerry Raymond involving the proposed purchase of 9.01 acres from the Fairway Farms and Swim Club for the city's federal subsidized parks and recreation program.

Members of the council have had almost two weeks for afterthought concerning various aspects of the proposal after tabling it at their April 10 meeting.

THERE ARE signs of more reflective moods in the hallways of council politics after a warning by Councilman Edward Milligan, leader of the opposition to the purchase in its present form, that the Nash-Raymond bill if passed could expose the council to the taxpayer's suit or a grand jury.

In his concern of council ending up in court or under investigation, Milligan is especially critical of an amendment tacked to the Nash-Raymond resolution by Councilmen Peter A.

Ventura and Rudolf Kleinert which threw out a \$4,000 an acre ceiling for the property recommended by two appraisers who have been retained by the city for a \$16,000 fee to appraise all land purchases involved in Livonia's park and recreation program.

Milligan, joined by Councilman Raymond and Council President Edward H. McNamara, tried unsuccessfully to block passage of the amendment but were defeated when Kleinert and Ventura were

joined by fellow Councilmen Nash and Robert McCann whose coalition vote rejected the appraisals on the swim club property.

THE COALITION'S action is viewed by other councilmen as a precedent that leaves future appraisals in the park land acquisition program on shaky grounds.

It also could attract a jaundiced reaction from the Federal Housing and Urban Development agency (HUD) which

only recently pledged the city \$828,000 in matching funds to augment the \$1.6 million set aside from a \$4.4 million bond issue passed by Livonia voters for park and recreation land acquisition and development.

"It puts us in an almost indefensible position," Council President McNamara explained in commenting on the rejection of the appraisal. "In effect, we tell the Federal Government we haven't enough money for our parks and recreation program and then we turn

around and reject any limit of what we'll spend for property."

The swim club property at 16225 Levan Rd. is one of 17 sites already approved by HUD.

But instead of \$4,000 an acre for the 9.01-acre club property as recommended by the city-hired appraisers, the move by the Ventura-Kleinert coalition gives free rein to the Nash-Raymond resolution which, in essence, proposes to pay the club an average of \$6,183.73 an acre.

AS IT READ when it was

tabled at the April 10 Council meeting, the Nash-Raymond bill authorizes the purchase of the property at a price of \$45,723.30, plus \$8,991.43 for reimbursement to the club of a proportionate share of a special paying assessment, and another \$1,000 for prorated city, school and county taxes.

The total of \$55,714.73 provided in the special bill also

includes reimbursement to the club of interest paid on a land contract for the property.

As appraised, the \$55,714.73 figure would have been in the neighborhood of \$36,000.

If that lifted the eyebrows of some councilmen as indicated by Milligan, it might well stir up indignation over preferential treatment by a spend-thrift Council.

Local Waters Stocked With Trout

By TIM RICHARD
Phoenix Lake, near Plymouth
this year joins a growing list

of southeastern Michigan
waters that have been stocked
with trout by the State Con-
servation Department.
The trout fisherman doesn't
have to travel into the northern

reaches of the state to try for
what is widely considered the
tastiest, warriest and sportiest
of all fishes.

Besides Phoenix Lake, 20
lakes, five ponds and three
streams, all in Oakland County,
were stocked with trout last
year, according to Stephen C.
Swain, district fish biologist
at the Conservation Depart-
ment's Pontiac headquarters.
Opening day is Saturday,
April 27. (A limited trout and
salmon season opened on cer-
tain specified waters April 1.)

PHOENIX, however, will get
a lot of local attention.
Part of the Middle Rouge
River, Phoenix Lake was
poisoned last fall to kill the
predominantly rough fish supply
and in October was re-stocked
with 7,000 rainbow trout.
The rainbows, four or five
inches long at the time, should
in many cases have reached
the legal creel limit of seven
inches by opening day.

Phoenix Lake is unlikely to
be a trout lake permanently.
The trout aren't expected to be
able to reproduce there, and
eventually the lake will be re-
stocked with bluegill and bass
as the permanent population.
Meanwhile, it's illegal to fish
there until the opening day of
April 27.

SIX OTHER lakes have been
poisoned and re-stocked so that
they will be single species trout
lakes this year. All of the others
are in Oakland County. Their
names and locations:
Chittenden Lake, Pontiac

Lake Recreation Area.
Cooley Lake, Union Lake vil-
lage.

Foley Lake, Pontiac Lake
Recreation Area.
Hartwig and Minnie Lakes,
both in Holly Recreation Area.
Upper Trout Lake, Bald
Mountain Recreation Area.

FIFTEEN "two-story" trout
lakes were stocked last year.
These lakes have a resident
warm water fish population, but
they also have a cool strata of
water capable of supporting
trout. These lakes are:
Cedar Island, Cemetery,
Crescent, Crotched, Deer,
Elizabeth, Horseshoe, Little
Silver, Orchard, Oxbow,
Reed, Schoolhouse, Square,
Teepie and Union.

Magnolias Can Thrive In Northern Gardens, Too

Magnolias are synonymous with southern gardens, and the name conjures up visions of belles in hoop skirts. However, there are magnolias that grow in the north, too, and they are now proudly displaying their beautiful blooms. These look like huge pink or white tulips; that's why some people call these magnolias tulip trees. They are really saucer magnolias, magnolia Soulangiana.

SEVERAL VARIETIES are available, with flowers ranging in size from five to 10 inches in diameter. The inside of the petals are generally white, but the outside color ranges from palest pink to deep purple pink and even wine-red. The flowers are so large and are born so profusely, even on very young trees, that small trees often bear a little overburdened. The trees age gracefully, though, and develop a spreading crown. Old trees have an elegance and beauty that is hard to match. Less well known, is the star magnolia which blooms a couple

of weeks ahead of the saucer magnolia. It has smaller, more delicate flowers that are composed of long ribbon-like petals of white or pale pink. The leaves, which appear after the flowers, are long and narrow and serve later in the season to distinguish the tree from the saucer magnolia which has broad leathery leaves.

MAGNOLIAS SHOULD be planted in spring. Although they thrive in this

area, they are a little difficult to transplant. They should be moved with a ball of earth around the roots. Even if moved carefully, large specimens may take several years to adjust to the change and begin blooming again. Magnolias prefer rich, slightly acid soil that is well-drained. A sunny location is desirable, but the roots should be kept cool in hot weather. This can be accomplished by mulching.

California Poppies Gayest Of Flowers

Certainly one of the gayest flowers for any garden is the California poppy. There are both single and double forms and the older limitations of color to yellow and orange have long since been outgrown. Indeed, such a color mixture as Mission Bells makes one wonder how such diverse colors can have been bred from just two.

Since most gardeners are familiar with the single-flowered form. It has the same dainty, fern-like foliage but the many petals make its appearance more imposing.

California poppies grow quickly and easily from seeds sown early in the growing season where they are to bloom. They are really perennials but

are treated, in gardens, as hardy annuals. They will stand considerable cold, sometimes self-sow even in the Northern states, and, if plants are protected in autumn from freezing winter weather, they often will grow again the second spring. Seeds are available in mixtures of single-flowered forms, like that called Sunset, in semi-double forms like Monarch or Mission Bells, already mentioned, and also in double form, though almost always a few semi-double flowers will be found in plants grown from a mixture labeled "double". In California, as well as some other West Coast states, California poppies have been widely used for roadsides; planted by simply scattering the seeds.

African Daisy Adds Color

An attractive, daisy-like flower from Africa is easily grown in American gardens and furnishes something a little different from the ordinary, both in the garden picture and for cut flower use.

Call it Cape Daisy, African Daisy, Cape marigold or Star of the Veldt—all are common names for this plant.

The variety pictured is called Glistening White. Blooms may be 3 1/2 inches across with glossy white petals centered with shining black. Yet these appear on plants only 4 to 6 inches high. Another variety, Salmon Beauty, has salmon-pink flowers, but new hybrid forms also are available, these in mixed colors which include yellow, salmon, rose and apricot as well as white. The hybrids grow a foot tall. This flower loves heat and

sun, therefore may solve problems for many gardeners with these conditions.

The blooms start to appear early; continue for a long season. Plant the seeds where you want the flowers and thin seedlings to allow ample growing space.

Star of the Veldt is handsome in rock gardens, may be used in borders or places where low edgings are desired.

Set up rigid family smoking rules for safety's sake, advises the Institute for Safer Living. See that they are obeyed. Thoughtless family and guest smoking habits account for the largest number of residence fires each year. Rules should include no smoking in bed, and safe disposal of cigarettes and matches.

Green Thumb Tips

If you had a planting of sweet alyssum in your garden last year, gently remove the browned skeletons of last year's plants and don't disturb the soil underneath. Chances are excellent that this annual has self-seeded and that soon innumerable seedlings will sprout to bloom in the same place.



Voices And Sounds Of A New Spring





Michigan To Go On Daylight Time

MICHIGAN -- Like it or not, Michigan will again this year be on Daylight Saving Time for six months.

The time change occurs at 1 a.m. Sunday morning, April 28, when clocks are to be moved ahead one hour. That, according to law, is the moment when the switch is to be made officially from 1 a.m. Eastern Standard Time to 2 a.m. Eastern Daylight Saving Time.

LANSING -- The State Administrative Board has broadened its efforts to eliminate discrimination practices in employment among bidders for state contracts.

In a resolution adopted Tuesday, the board said it would rely on the State Civil Rights Commission to check for compliance with non-discriminatory employment requirements among prospective bidders before contracts are awarded.

DETROIT -- The American Insurance Association said Tuesday that the 1967 summer riots in Newark and Detroit resulted in \$80 million property loss. The association estimated loss in Newark at \$15.9 million and in Detroit at \$64.1 million.



Adler Happiness: Presidents, Moms

Richard Adler had the flu and felt terrible. Richard Adler was unhappy with the lecture and wanted a "lavaliere" microphone he would wear. Richard Adler, composer-lyricist, addressed the Northville Town Hall last Thursday and was charming, candid, humorous. "Musical Comedy, the Composer and His Songs" was to have been the topic of Adler's lecture, but the man of "Pajama Game" and "Damn Yankees" fame spoke "from the heart" about whatever came to mind.

ADLER DEVOTED a major portion of the hour to describing the first presidential gala he was asked to produce for the late President John F. Kennedy.

"It was in 1962, and when I picked up the telephone and was told by one of those nasal-voiced operators that the White House was on the line, I was sure it was one of my many bizarre friends playing a prank."

But it was really President Kennedy's voice on the other end, summoning him to Washington without further explanation.

When he arrived in the capital, Adler, admittedly a

nervous man, began to have dramatic day-dreams of his purpose there. "He wants me to be a spy," Adler thought, as visions of daring escapades behind the Iron Curtain flashed through his mind. He came to grips with reality as President Kennedy outlined the huge birthday salute to be held in Madison Square Garden for an audience of 20,000 Democrats—and then asked Adler to produce it.

For six and a half years Adler was away from Broadway, and in that time he arranged

seven "presidenticals" that were to earn \$11 million in campaign funds for Presidents Kennedy and Johnson.

THE CLOSEST ADLER'S audience got to music was in the last 10 minutes of the program, when, despite a raw throat, he sang a medley of his famous songs—"Whatever Lola Wants," "Rags to Riches," "Steam Heat," "Hey, There!," "Everybody Loves A Lover," "Bernando's Hideaway" and "You've Gotta Have Heart."

THE COMPOSER became serious at the Meadowbrook Country Club luncheon following the lecture.

He began to talk about his new play "Mother's Kisses" scheduled to open in New York this November, but the subject of mothers led Adler, who is both father and mother to two teen-age boys, into a serious vein.

"I viciously hate what is going on in this day and age with our young people," he said.

"Why do our young people feel that they have to resort to drugs like LSD, 'pot' and 'grass'?" he asked. "They feel they must experiment in these adventures into nothingness. Hippies invaded Central Park last weekend. They think they're great. They smell."

"We're experiencing a revolution in this country—a good revolution. We're making changes with a minimum amount of bloodshed. Detroit was small compared to the millions of lives that could have been lost—but it's shocking that we must learn humility by seeing our leaders shot down in the streets," he said.

ADLER HOPES "Mother's Kisses" will bring a little happiness to people. "There is not one note of rock and roll in the entire play," he said. There was applause.

"The play takes place in 1949—in that beautiful era between World War II and Korea. We made a mistake, at first, and tried to update it to 1968, but it didn't work."

"What we had 20 years ago has passed us by—the beauty, the kindness, the sympathy—we don't even know what we once had," he said.

HE THEN ANSWERED questions about critics and the theatre, but refused to divulge the cast of his forthcoming play or sing a few bars of "I Want to Kill My Mother," the play's unfinished lead song.

"I'm honest," he said, as he confessed his hope for a "hit."

Then as if to assure himself, more than his feminine audience, he remarked: "After all, Mothers are here to stay."

FBI Seeks Galt As Killer Of Dr. King

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — The FBI Wednesday night charged Eric Starvo Galt with conspiracy in the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. In the first mention of a conspiracy in connection with the April 4 assassination, the FBI said the alleged plot also involved a man Galt described as his brother.

Galt was charged with conspiring to violate Dr. King's civil rights. A charge of murder was also filed by the State of Tennessee against Galt.

Galt has not been apprehended, and an FBI agent in Birmingham declined to comment on whether the FBI considered itself closer to an arrest than before Galt was officially named in the case.

The gross national product climbed by \$20 billion in the first three months of the year to a seasonally-adjusted rate of \$827.3 billion, also a record.

The industrial production figures rose in March this year six-tenths of one percentage point to a record level of 162.1 per cent. This is compared to March, 1967 when the figure stood at 156.4 per cent.

MEMPHIS, Tenn.—Agreement was reached last Tuesday between the city's 1,300 garbage collectors and the city which ended a 65-day-old garbage strike that had drawn Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. to Memphis to march on behalf of the strikers, who were predominantly Negro. Dr. King was killed there on April 4.

The pact calls for a 10 per cent an hour wage increase May 1 and another five cents an hour Sept. 1 plus union recognition and dues checkoffs. Sanitation workers were making \$1.65 to \$2.10 an hour when they walked off their jobs Feb. 12.

MORRISTOWN, N.J.—Robert Wright, 18, of Dover, was issued four traffic tickets and had his car taken away by police in Victory Gardens last week. Apparently undaunted, police said,

BALTIMORE, Md.—Four men, including two clergies, were convicted by a federal jury last week of mutilating government property by pouring blood on draft board records.

The defendants admitted on the witness stand they participated in pouring blood, some of it human, from plastic bottles on selective service files at the U.S. Customs House Oct. 27. But they defended it on the grounds of their motives, protesting the war in Vietnam.

OF DINING AND FINE WINE

Leftovers become a thing of the past when wine assumes a fundamental place in the kitchen and in your recipes.

This week you have a homework assignment, and it should prove interesting, fun and tasty. Food and wine have been going together for many years, and smart women know that with a little imagination good marriages do result.

In response to several requests for wine recipes, cooking techniques using wine, and what wines to use in cooking, the following is submitted in "good taste."

SHERRY, MADEIRA, marsala, chablis, burgundy, rhine and port type wines are the most widely used wines in "traditional" wine cookery. Exotic dishes, gourmet extravaganzas and famous chefs all require the same basic wines for cooking.

When in doubt about which wine to use for an occasion, a good rule to remember is to use the wine you are serving with the meal in your food preparations. Roast beef, for example, deserves a red wine, and what a delicious au jus or gravy results if a few tablespoons of burgundy are added to the drippings before the sauce is started.

Sauces and gravies for all meats are begun in the same manner if meat drippings are available. First, pour off and save all excess oils and juices, leaving the crumbs and solid drippings. Now add the red wine (1/2 cup per pint of gravy) and boil away as you stir...proceed with normal procedure.

The alcohol evaporates, but the wine flavor remains as a subtle reminder in the total taste.

BASTING A FOWL and light meats with white wine or sherry, while roasting or baking, leaves a golden brown crust, luscious drippings and a full, rich flavor. You don't always have time or the need for a gravy when serving fowl and the basting technique requires only a half-cup of wine for a

large bird and your good judgment will regulate future requirements.

So much for the classic method of preparation...one may take a short-cut by simply adding wine to the finished sauce, a tablespoon-at-a-time, until the desired flavor is obtained.

How about using a splash of port wine in your next fresh fruit cocktail. You need not marinate the fruit overnight with the port, but if time permits, the result is superb. Figure one tablespoon of wine per serving.

Ever have the urge to dress-up scrambled eggs some Sunday morning but, alas, no "new" ideas? This week add one teaspoon of sherry, marsala or madeira wine to your batch of eggs before cooking. Use one measure for every two eggs.

SHERRY is the most versatile cooking wine, and a 16% sherry will keep for some time, so keep a bottle or decanter handy in your kitchen.

Try sherry parfaits for dessert and make a sherry whipped topping for the kids using a California walnut on top instead of a cherry. Dip the ice cream and place in a tall parfait glass or tumbler and add one tablespoon of sherry, dry or cream type, then spoon on the topping and add the nut. Crunchy topping is made by adding chopped walnuts to the topping, flavored topping results by adding sherry.

You should be getting hungry about now. Step into the kitchen, open a bottle of rhine wine, fully chilled, break out the Bugles or Daisies or chips and enjoy a snack with this fast recipe called Rhine wine dip. Carol and I like this one, and we give it to you with the permission of the test kitchens of the Great Western Winery in Hammondsport, N. Y.

Combine the following ingredients using an electric mixer and then refrigerate. One 8-oz. package of cream cheese, one teaspoon minced onion, two teaspoons horseradish, one teaspoon Worcestershire sauce and 1/4 cup New York state rhine wine.

FLOYD McGRUFF
Publisher
McGriff
Is Dead

Floyd McGriff, crusading newspaper publisher and head of a suburban newspaper group of eight publications in this area, died April 18 at the age of 78.

Born in Indiana, Mr. McGriff began his newspaper career in 1912 with the United Press in New York. He later joined INS and in 1918 went to England for Hearst where he re-established and became the chief of the European wire service for the Hearst family. He covered the last of the news of the war to end wars, President Wilson's historical trip to England, the peace conferences of Versailles, and before leaving the island kingdom was presented to the royal family in Buckingham Palace.

In an adventurous newspaper life that spanned over half a century, Mr. McGriff wrote history on the scene as a reporter, from Dr. DeBothezat's first helicopter flight in 1922 to the treachery of America's Russian allies at Tehran and Yalta.

He suffered a serious heart attack in 1947 but returned to the newspaper business seven months later, and his epitaph in the world of newspaper people was in a statement made by a member of his family after his death: "He wouldn't have been happy retired."

Surviving are his wife, Ruth; a daughter, Mrs. Jean Fox; a son, Jack; and five grandchildren, Jo Anne Fox, Susan Fox Neuharth, John Fox, Scott Assiff MacGriff, and Patrice Kaleel MacGriff.

U-M Devises Self-Taught News Course


ANN ARBOR--The first in a series of projects to create self-instructional units for journalism has been developed at The University of Michigan.

Designed to teach the formal structural rules of headline writing, the program was originated by Prof. Robert Bishop of the U-M journalism department and later jointly developed by the journalism department and the Center for Research on Learning and Teaching.

The program, which is intended for college students above the freshman level, currently consists of a 75-page booklet and a two-page ruled sheet for writing samples. Results from tests at the high school and college level indicate that students using the self-taught program learn at least as well as students who are taught by an instructor.

Such positive results have stimulated work on a programmed guide to help students to familiarize themselves with the conventions and use of the joint wire service stylebook, and a program to teach the principles of layout and design of new pages.

The journalism department is also now seeking funds for an expanded program for the incorporation of new tools into journalism instruction. Plans include the construction of self-instructional materials for news writing, design and layout, and copy editing.

A College President Defends Today's Student

KALAMAZOO -- Today's college generation must not be judged solely by the appearance of some students, Kalamazoo College President Weimer K. Hicks said in a recent article.

In defense of the current college generation as a whole, Dr. Hicks emphasized that the student with somewhat different appearance is still in the minority. The percentage is considerably lower than the casual campus visitor realizes.

In fact, said Dr. Hicks, "today's youth, though we abhor the appearance of some and regret thrusts of others, still are perhaps more concerned about basic concepts of life than college students of an earlier vintage."

"We have created for them a world in which hope is illusory and faith is difficult. And amid it all, they turn their major thrusts in support of vital issues which gives me encouragement for the future."

To understand the college student of today, Dr. Hicks continued, "one must realize that we live in a chaotic age. We have witnessed change in almost every facet of life. The patterns and traditions of the past have been eroded, frequently leaving a void. The effect upon students has been profound."

They are "understandably concerned" when they examine the status quo of our nation, Dr. Hicks stated. "What has happened in the world of values, moral and social? The time-honored moral code of a Judeo-Christian heritage is being challenged. And in the religious world? Has the Mother Church adjusted its program to the needs and interests of youth?"

"And in the educational world? We have urged today's student to think and have not suppressed his ideas. So, he is brighter, more worldly-wise, more intellectually sophisticated. Consequently, he reaches out for complete freedom, absolute permissiveness -- no rules at all, or at least only rules he makes himself."

There is little wonder, said Dr. Hicks, that many students when they survey the status quo, respond differently. But, he cautioned, "one errs badly if he concludes that the response of youth is entirely negative."

"No previous generation with which I have been associated was more interested in service to mankind," Dr. Hicks observed. The Peace Corps is but one example, he noted. "We commend our young people for their attitudes toward equality and integration. Their attitude toward the underprivileged is equally commendable."

"These same students are crying out vigorously against war. I lament the direction many of their demonstrations have taken. In fact, I cannot condone the abuse which they have meted out against public servants and platform speakers. I likewise deplore the illegal tactics of the draft card burners."

"But the right to speak freely is inherent in a democracy. I will defend the right of students to dissent as long as that privilege is given to others with whom they do not agree."

"We must remember that the wheels of democracy grind slowly. Change only takes place when a ground swell of voice expresses opposition. Thus, step by step, an impact is made. In reality, today's youth are pursuing the democratic means in trying to answer a problem which confounds them," Dr. Hicks declared.

"In the perplexities of the hour one is tempted to lose faith, particularly in young people who seem so different from their older brothers. The youth of the day are not the first to be berated. There has always been a generation gap. Yet somehow, in some way, each generation of students has managed to come through."

Radio Club Forms In Plymouth

A new Amateur Radio Club is being formed in Plymouth and the leaders are looking for more members, especially between the ages of 18 and 21.

Happiness comes in different ways as the Detroit Tigers are finding out.

Consider the scene in their clubhouse Thursday after the Tigers blanked Cleveland, 5-0, as a forerunner to a nine-game road trip which started in Chicago Friday night.

For the Tigers as a team, beating Cleveland meant their sixth straight victory after losing the season's opener to Boston.

It also meant the best Tiger start since 1961 when Detroit lost the first game, then won eight in a row.

The triumph over Cleveland also landed the Tigers into a tie with Minnesota for first place after the Twins suffered their first loss of the season when nipped by Washington.

FOR LIVONIA'S Joe Sparma, who kept Cleveland away from the plate, the victory enabled him to notch No. 1 of the season.

And then there was veteran outfielder Al Kaline, who celebrated his playing in game No. 2,000 as a Tiger by slapping his first homer of the season.

The roundtripper upped his career total to 305, one under the all-time Tiger mark of 306 set by Hank Greenberg.

"It's nice to have contributed something for a change," declared Kaline who has been in a slight slump this spring.

Girl Swimmers Smash Records In Illinois

Eight-year-old Nancy Merritt, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Merritt, 11415 Norborne, Redford Township, helped smash two swimming meet records in a three week period. Swimming for the Garden City Parks and Recreation Swim Club, coached by Mrs. Jewel Cook, Nancy and three other eight-year-olds broke two meet records at Hinsdale, Ill., on March 16.

Laura Kloote and Karl Santo, of Livonia, and Cindy Brown, of Westland, swimming with Nancy, broke records for the freestyle relay and the medley relay.

Nancy placed fourth in the 100 individual medley and sixth in the 50 yard breaststroke.

Then in a meet in South Bend, Ind., the four swimmers, in "eight and under" competition broke meet records again in the two relays.

Nancy placed first in the 50 breaststroke and sixth in the freestyle, back and butterfly.

Only three other Tigers have played in more than 2,000 games. Ty Cobb engaged in 3,033 to lead the way.

KALINE HAD company in slugging a homer Thursday. Wonderful Willie Horton, off to his finest season ever, socked his second in as many days to get the Tigers off to a 1-0 lead in the second inning.

In the fourth inning hits by Bill Freeman and Jim Northrup made it 2-0. In the fifth Dick McAuliffe and Kaline rapped back-to-back homers. In the seventh Horton singled over McAuliffe with the fifth Detroit run.

Horton was hitting .404 when the Tigers hit the road.

Sparma allowed seven hits and didn't walk a man. He admitted he was happy, but he'd be happier if Livonia city officials would do something about paying Vargo Avenue where the Sparmas live.

THURSDAY'S BATTLE followed on the heels of another dramatic Tiger finish which enabled Detroit to squeeze past the Tribe, 4-3, on Wednesday.

Cleveland regained the lead in the top of the tenth and then came more Tiger hysterics.

There were two out again and now there was Al Kaline on first. The batter was Willie Horton and knuckleball ace Eddie Fisher was hurling for Cleveland.

The count read one ball and two strikes.

Fisher served up a knuckler. Horton swung -- and that's all. The ball landed in the lower seats in left field.

THE TIGERS spoiled the home debut of the defending American League champion Boston Red Sox last Tuesday when they coasted to a 9-2 triumph.

Earl Wilson became the first Tiger starter to win a game as he held the Sox to four hits, three of them in the first two innings.

Bing Wins Berth On All-Stars

Graduating rookies in the National Basketball Association who might be squirmy about the so-called sophomore or second-section jinx, can take heart from the 1967-68 feat turned in by Dave Bing of the Detroit Pistons.

Bing's No. 2 year with the Pistons was capped with the announcement he had been named to the NBA's official All Star team along with Jerry Lucas and Oscar Robertson of Cincinnati, Wilt Chamberlain of Philadelphia and Elgin Baylor of Los Angeles.

The selections were based on a poll of sportswriters and sportscasters in the 12 NBA cities and made Bing a triple all-star for the year. He previously had been named on a similar "dream" quintet selected by the league's players for The Sporting News and before that he had been honored with a starting spot on the East team in the NBA's annual All-Star game.

Thus, few honors escaped Bing in his second campaign with the Pistons.

He became the first guard in more than a decade to capture the league's scoring championship as he flipped in 21.42 points for a 27.1-point average.

BING ALSO ripped apart the Pistons and Cobo Arena record books. His point output eclipsed the previous team high of 2,001 produced by George Yardley a decade ago. So did the 37 points he came in the final half of the sixth game of the playoffs against Boston.

The 37-point half also constituted a record for Cobo Arena as did the 22 points he drilled in during the third quarter of the game.

The month-by-month story for Bing showed that he started slowly averaging only 24.3 points per game in October. Then he jumped to 29.7 in November and registered 26.9 in December, 28.3 in January, 26.2 in February and 25.6 in March.

Bing enjoyed his greatest success against Baltimore, averaging 32.3 points vs. the Bullets. He clicked at a 30.6-point clip against Chicago and 30 each against San Francisco and Cincinnati.

Against other teams Bing averaged: Seattle 29.9 points; San Diego 26.1; St. Louis 25.9; Boston 24.9; Philadelphia 24.4; Los Angeles 24.0 and New York 22.1.



The Top Side Of Life

What you now read was scribbled on April 10, the day after the funeral for Martin Luther King Jr. It was written to be printed April 21. A nation prays that by that date things will have returned to normal.

"Normal" may not be such a good time to return to however. After all, it was a normal day in this country when Dr. King was murdered, just as it was a normal day in November, 1963, when

John F. Kennedy was murdered.

PERHAPS, IT WOULD be better if we hoped for something more than normal. If we can't do that, then, for the time being, we should go on weeping.

It is right that we go on weeping because once again a "free, democratic, Christian" nation unveiled its true personality; one so mixed, so confused, that hate and love, guilt and grief, wrong and right, seem inseparable.

The event which called forth this latest unveiling was the assassination of Dr. King. But that act only revealed the Evil which has long been hidden in every man's heart.

IT IS MORE THAN THE Evil of a single assassin. His deed was no less than the logical conclusion of our insistence that there is only one RIGHT way for this world to be governed; all else must be destroyed.

It was more than the Evil of a single gun-shot. Even that was the secret wish of every man for whom forgiveness is outrageous.

It is Evil which darkened the words of the unceasing eulogies, hiding midst sincerity and tears so that self-righteous satisfaction with pretty words sometimes became more visible than the attempted expression of the depth of loss.

Evil also made harsh the voices of the news media as reporters vied with each other to be first with the worst.

AND WHAT ABOUT the people's mourning? The people's grief? What about the people's guilt? Has the mourning ended by now so that the confessions may begin?

Is it not Evil that hides guilt in mourning, disguising it as grief? Will we ever recognize our fingerprints on the rifle?

This is our nation, is it not? Our free, democratic Christian society produced the assassin. His was a twisted mind. But who twisted it? And how many more minds and lives are now being twisted in a society which too often seems neither free nor democratic nor Christian?

The death of Martin Luther King Jr., the death of John F. Kennedy, the deaths of nameless riot statistics: All of these have become God's word of wrath, judging a civilization in which Cain still murders Abel.

W.H. AUDEN, the poet, wrote the right words for this time: Darkness and snow descend; The clock on the mantelpiece Has nothing to recommend, Nor does the face in the glass Appear nobler than our own As darkness and snow descend On all personality.

Joseph, Mary, pray for us Independent embryos who, Unconscious in another, do Evil as each creature does In every definite decision To improve; for even in The germ-cell's primary division Innocence is lost and sin, Already given as a fact, Once more issues as an act.
