**FARMINGTON** — Negotiations between the Farmington Education Association and the Farmington Board of Education remained stalled this week after a midnight bargaining session Wednesday. Both sides charged that the other side was "not realistic" as the issue centers on the pay scale for the district's teachers.

**FARMINGTON** — The New Farmington Committee will sponsor a "teach-in" on the cause and cures of racism today (Sunday) in the Farmington Junior High School. Beginning at 1:30 p.m. a variety of panelists will participate in the workshop sessions.

**LIVONIA** — A special drive for registrations for this year's elections, waged through the week by 80 volunteers working evenings in 29 schools, didn't get the results expected. The average was about 200 per evening, or a total of 1,000 out of the estimated 8,000 to 10,000 who haven't voted in two years and must get back on the books if they want to vote in the presidential election in November.

**REDFORD** — There'll be 20 persons vying for the Democratic party's nominations in the August 6 primary election — seeking the right to run for six local offices in the November general election. Three slates are represented, one favorable to current township Democratic club chairman Joseph Patchett, another to former chairman Nate Banks and another to former chairman Robert Brang.

**REDFORD** — Bids taken by Wayne County on three special assessment sanitary sewer projects came in well over 10 per cent higher than cost estimates, at \$308,104 compared to estimated \$265,000. The township board started procedures to take new bids Monday.

# City Commission Enters Police Wage Negotiations

In an effort to relieve the impasse that has developed in wage negotiations with the police and firemen the entire City Commission is going to delve into the problem behind closed doors sometime during the coming week.

"If we can, we will try to do it on Monday night," Mayor James Jabara stated, "but we

also have scheduled a special meeting and a study period in which we are going to discuss the district court set-up and may not get around to it."

The Mayor did emphasize, however, that the wage negotiations would be taken up just as soon as possible in the hope that an agreement can be reached.

Entry of the entire Commission into the negotiations was decided upon following the appearance of Carl Berry, President of the Police and Firemen's Association, before the legislative body last Monday night.

At that time he reported the impasse and asked for the Commission's intervention in

the hope for a favorable settlement.

IN MAKING his plea, Officer Berry contended that the top figure offered would leave the City of Plymouth the lowest of the surrounding areas that have negotiated new agreements.

The entire argument in the negotiations now is centered

around the economic issues, with the city offering a seven and one half per cent increase and the officers demanding 14 per cent. Reduced to dollars and cents it is the difference between \$8402 and \$9,000, annually.

"We have tried to compromise," Officer Berry stated, "by giving up most of the fringe

benefits in our meetings with City Manager Dick Blodgett and City Clerk Gene Slider, the city's negotiators, "but the city hasn't budged and claims that the seven and one half per cent is the most we could expect."

Questioned by Commissioner James McKeon, who claimed that the city's offer was sweetened from a starting point of three per cent to the present seven and one half per cent, Officer Berry explained that the police and firemen had not only given up fringe benefits, but that the 14 per cent demand also was flexible.

THIS WAS the first intimation that the police and firemen would move from what had been considered a "firm" stand.

With this opening, the Commission decided to enter the session and offer help to the negotiating team.

The Police and Firemen are basing their demands on the fact that the surrounding communities, with exception of Plymouth Township, are above the city's offer.

They point to the fact that Westland is paying \$9,100, Livonia \$9,200 and the City of Detroit \$10,300 in several steps over the next two years. Plymouth Township recently agreed on \$8,000.

Officer Berry pointed out that the work of the police and firemen in the City of Plymouth is just as dangerous as it is in the other communities and that the men should be paid accordingly.

"THE FRINGE benefits given up by the men," Mayor Jabara pointed out, "amounts to very little in dollars and cents, and that the big argument is over the difference in the salary."

Meanwhile, Commissioner McKeon has stated that the time has come to upgrade the qualifications for both police and firemen in the city.

"The work has changed considerably in recent years," he explained, "and with the civil disorders and the fires, looting and riots during the past year the demands are a great deal different."

"If we are going to pay the top wage, we should have the type of people in the future who are trained for this kind of work."

These are some of the things that are certain to be discussed in the closed door session with the entire Commission.

### Dems Support Wage Demand Of City Police

The Second District Democratic Organization has agreed to support the Plymouth police and firemen in their negotiation for an annual \$9,000 salary.

Meeting over the week-end the Dems., through Robert E. Dwyer, the chairman, voted this support on the grounds that the attraction and retention of quality Police and Fire Department personnel is directly related to the pay schedule and that sub-standard wages for public employees is bad economy and not in the public interest.

"We have little doubt that a majority of Plymouth's residents share this opinion," the official statement stated and was signed by Billie Bidwell, Secretary.

### Area Leaders Study Court Bill

Where will the new district court be located—in Northville or Plymouth?

How about the magistrates? These and a lot of other questions that have been bothering Plymouth area officials are expected to be settled during the coming week when the area administrators meet with members of the state legislature and the men who sponsored the bill.

All five areas — City of Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Canton Township, Northville and Northville Township—are to be represented at the study meeting.

### Schools Name Study Group For Buildings

To keep abreast of the costs of construction and any innovations that may help cut them, the Plymouth Board of Education has appointed three men to a newly created Citizens' Facility Construction Advisory Committee.

The three are Donald R. Bidwell, president of Bidwell Masonry, Inc.; Frank J. Kallin, in charge of facility environmental control for Ford Motor Co.; and Eugene P. Light, vice president of Cunningham-Limp Co. of Birmingham.

The board took the action in light of skyrocketing costs of the new Plymouth High School. This facility was in danger of not being completed due to estimates being nearly a million dollars short of the mark.

"This group will advise the board on trends in construction designs, materials and methods, especially as they affect the costs of future Plymouth school buildings," the board stated.

These three men are initial appointments to the committee

and additional members may be appointed as needed. "The Plymouth community is fortunate to have the advice of these citizens who are unusually well qualified and recognized as leaders in the construction industry," continued the board.

"It is intended that this committee will assist the board and its architects in identifying technological and economic changes in construction to insure maximum value in the future school building construction programs," the board concluded.

### Township Planners Deny Request For Haggerty Road Gas Station

After a lengthy discussion, the Plymouth Township Planning Commission Wednesday night denied the construction of a Marathon service station on the southwest corner of Haggerty and Ann Arbor Rd.

Residents of Arbor Village and Salem Square subdivisions attended the meeting in force and soundly protested the proposed gas station.

The corner already is zoned commercial which is appropriate zoning for the gas station, but according to township Ordinance 14—subdivision ordinance—the planning body must grant approval for the building of any gas station.

Thomas Rathemill, speaking for the Arbor Village Home Owners Association, argued the proposed service station would increase traffic, and that there already was another gas station one mile east of the corner. Rathemill pointed out that of the eight gas stations in the area four are closed and he did not want to see this happen again, especially near the subdivision.

THE HOME owners' spokes-

man added that the township in the past year and one half has denied similar requests on the opposite corner and Rathemill said he could see no reason for not doing the same this time.



Wendell Smith of Plymouth, former president of the Plymouth Jaycees, State President and national vice president during the past year, was elected National President Friday at the annual convention in Dallas, Tex.

Kenneth Cash, speaking for homeowners in Salem Square, said he could present signatures from 145 area homeowners who don't want the gas station.

"I would go on record that I am against this gas station and I want the commission to consider my opinion," Cash concluded.

At this point the commission was ready to deny the construction of the gas station but Robert Gaberman, attorney representing Marathon Oil Co., stated if the gas station is denied without a proper public hearing he would have no recourse but to tell his company that it was turned down for "unsound reasons."

Nevertheless, the commission felt that the concerned residents had presented a good case and denied the request.

IN OTHER action, the commission granted rezoning of property located on the south side of Five Mile Rd., between Sheldon Rd. and Beck Rd. from residential one-acre to general manufacturing.

The commission denied a re-

The two Republicans vying for the party's nomination are

Harold Berquist of 31225 Sheridan St., and Gregory Pillon, 29850 Cambridge St.

Tierney, of 5633 Arcola St., was first elected to the house in 1964 when the Democrats with the help of President Johnson's landslide in the national election, gained control of the state House and Senate.

Two years ago, Tierney ran for a second term and, despite a Republican comeback, squeaked out a 700-vote margin victory over Plymouth Republican John Tripp.

Tierney is also the only one of the five candidates who has held public office in the community.

zoning request from single-family residential to multiple unit zoning of property west of Haggerty Rd. and north of Ann Arbor Trail.

Denial was voted on the recommendation of the planning consultant, W.C. Johnson who said the area could better be developed with single-family homes.

The planning body, on a split vote, granted permission to Consumers Power Company to build a gas regulator station on the west side of Beck Rd. midway between Ann Arbor Rd.

and Ann Arbor Trail.

Commissioners Ralph Garber and Charles Childs voted against approval of the regulator station but were outnumbered.

## Seven Enter Township Primary Race For Two Trustee Seats

Five Republicans—including one incumbent and two relatively unknowns—and two Democrats will be seeking the two expired Plymouth Township trustee terms in the August 6 primary election.

The post held by Dick Lauterbach is vacant due to his moving out of the township to teach school in northern Michigan.

Incumbent Republican trustee Louis J. Norman, 53, of 41681 E. Ann Arbor Trail, Plymouth Township, filed at the last minute for re-election.

Norman has been a trustee for nearly 20 years. Two other prominent township Republicans, Russell A. Ash, 44, 47192 Stonecrest Court, current chairman of the Township Planning Commission, and Maurice M. Breen, 35, of 41121 Greenbrook Lane, member of the Planning Commission also have filed petitions.

James R. Brown, 43, of 47111 Ann Arbor Trail, and James E. Lewicki, 32, of 15209 Lakewood, are the remaining Republicans on the ticket.

**FORTY-TWO-YEAR-OLD** Irving W. Rozian, 13925 Beck Rd.,

Democrat, and head of the industrial sciences group, College of Engineering, University of Michigan, has filed.

The other Democrat, John M. Murawski, 39, of 41020 Greenbriar Lane, is in production control for the Crown Zellerbach Corp. Gaylord Container Division.

Rozian was a two-term chairman of the township planning commission during his five years with that body, from 1962 to 1967.

Both men are party trustees and precinct delegates.

Robert Dwyer, chairman of the 2nd Congressional Democratic District in Wayne County, expressed confidence the two men—who are running in a traditionally Republican stronghold—have an excellent chance of winning.

Rozian and Murawski released a combined statement concerning their seeking the township offices.

"We have three major reasons for seeking office as trustees of Plymouth Township:

"THE POLITICAL life of any community is healthier for the presence of an active loyal opposition. Single party government is seldom responsive to the diversity of needs and views of the public.

"There is a difference between the Republican and Democratic Parties. In a century of unprecedented growth and change, the Democrats have consistently accepted the responsibility for constructive change in response to human needs.

"Plymouth Township and the Plymouth community are in a critical phase of municipal development which requires leadership and familiarity with science and engineering as well

as law and administration.

"We have had a continuing interest in making this a fine community for people as well as business and look forward to the opportunity to serve."

Three other Republicans have turned in petitions for the post of constable.

They are Phillip Truesdell, 14565 Shadywood, Donald J. King, 41151 Micol Drive, and Fred K. Clement, 40569 Pine-tree St.

ALTHOUGH IT appears that no other elected post will be contested this August the three top township officials have filed, just in case.

John D. McEwen, supervisor, whose post isn't due to expire until 1970, said that he, Clerk Helen Richardson and Treasurer Elizabeth Holmes have all placed themselves on the ballot.

McEwen explained that although he has received semi-official word that the three positions would not expire this year, the supreme court could reverse the current thinking and cause them to run for re-election.

If things remain as they are, then neither of the officials will even have to appear on the ballot.

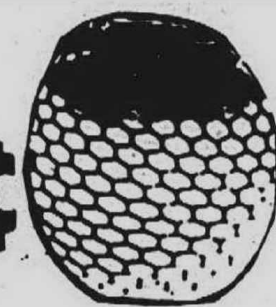

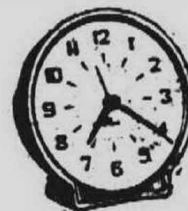

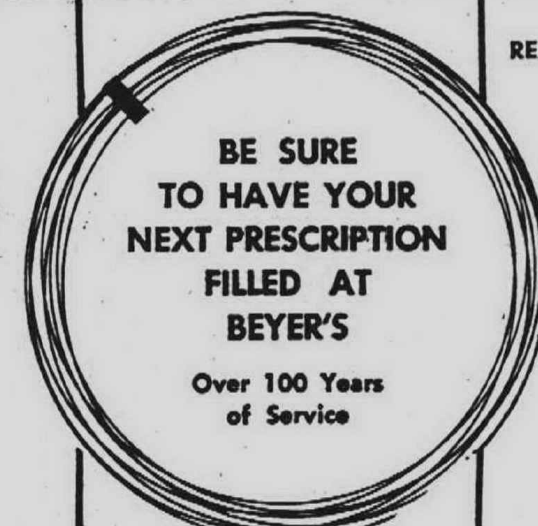

## The Stroller...



It's too bad that more people do not attend the meetings of the City Commission—especially on those evenings when public hearings are scheduled. There is no better—or more interesting—entertainment in town.

The Stroller dropped in for a short visit last Monday night and there were times he just could not believe what he heard.

He entered the legislative chamber in the midst of a serious discussion on the re-zoning of a parcel of property on Hamilton in close proximity to the DSI building and the railroad.

Seated in the hall were many of the hard-working folks who live in the neighborhood. They had come to learn what was going to happen and to protect their holdings.

At the moment the discussion revolved around a change in zoning from M-2 (heavy manufacturing) to M-1 (light industry) . . . a change most anyone would appreciate who lived close to large factories.

But not these people, surprisingly. They demanded to look at maps, drawings and everything that could be furnished to help them make up their minds.

It was when they asked for the floor that the surprises came.

### SHE'S HAD ENOUGH TRUCKS

One woman defiantly told the Commission she wanted the property left as it is "because there are enough heavy trucks on the road now."

When informed that light industry may lessen the number of heavy trucks, she countered, "yes, but there'll be more of the lighter kind. That would be even worse."

It was pointed out that most of the change was being asked to establish conformity . . . and not leave small sections isolated.

"Never mind the conformity," one of the complainants shouted, "Just let the thing as it is."

When a former city official arose to try to clarify the reasoning behind the request and explained that the change to light industry would possibly mean nothing more than a large storehouse on the property, he was greeted with—

"Who owns it?"

"No one owns it yet," the official answered, "It isn't even built. We're just asking for the zoning change so it can be built."

In the end, the folks who came to complain walked out . . . happy that they had spoken their piece. Little did they know that before they reached home the Commission had given second reading to an ordinance to grant the zoning change.

### SILENCING A HERO

On another occasion — this time at a public hearing on a proposed assessment for street improvement — a chap took the floor and, pointing his finger right at the Commissioners, asked—

"How much money do we get each year from the gas tax?"

Informed that the amount varies, but that the records were open to anyone who called at the office, he shot back, "Give me a figure — a hundred thousand, two hundred thousand, fifty dollars, or what — give me a figure."

The City Manager obliged with an estimate and the man arose to his feet again.

"How many years have we been getting it?" he asked.

He caught the Commission off guard for a moment, but he was told that it was about 20 to 25 years.

"All that money for so many years," he countered, "and not a damned cent spent on my street. Spend some of it now and cut out the assessment—I am entitled to a share on my street."

With that he sat down. But in another instant he was up again.

"How much gas and weight tax are you counting on this year?" he asked. "And how are you going to spend it?"

"It's all right here in the proposed budget," City Manager Blodgett answered.

"Where can I get a copy?" the gent asked.

SILENCE IS PUZZLING

There was a bit of whispering among the commissioners, for the budget hadn't been made public at that time.

"You can take this copy here," the complainant was told, "if you will sit here and study it."

"You bet I will," he answered and almost raced up to the official commission table.

Eagerly he took the book, walked across the room, and sat in the corner for the better part of an hour, while some of the others in the chamber whispered, "if he can find anything in those figures he's doing good. Only an accountant could make sense out of them."

Finally, our friend got to his feet, shrugged his shoulders, walked over to the Commission and dropped the heavy budget book on the table and walked out.

He said nary a word. In fact, he hasn't been heard from since.

But he did provide one of those entertaining moments that usually happen at Public Hearings in the Commission Chamber.

As Art Linkletter often has said, "People are funny." Wonder what he'd think if he attended a Commission meeting in Plymouth.

# Commission Denial Of Peace March On Fourth Raises Many Questions

The Plymouth City Commission drew a very fine line last Monday night when it rejected a request from a group known as the Plymouth Citizens for Peace and Equality to stage a peaceful march and demonstration in protest of the government's policy in Viet Nam.

The group, consisting mostly of teenagers of recent high school vintage, sought permission to stage the demonstration either one-half hour prior to the annual Jaycees July Fourth parade or a half-hour following the Jaycee event.

In rejecting the request, the Commission pointed out that it had granted the use of Main Street exclusively to the Jaycee organization and that, after granting such a permit, felt it would not be fair to ask them to share the day with another group.

Meanwhile, the anti-war group explained that "by granting us the requested parade permit you are demonstrating the attitude in keeping with the 4th of July Independence celebration by demonstrating that the City of Plymouth supports our constitutional right to dissent . . . a basic American liberty guaranteed to all citizens of the United States of America."

IT SO HAPPENED that neither W. Edward Wendover nor R. Tracy Ketchman, who represented the Citizens for Peace and Equality, are residents of the City of Plymouth and that fact, alone, may have helped to influence the Commission decision. But the request did bring to light some interesting questions . . .

Can the City Commissioners give exclusive rights for the use of city streets to anyone?

Does the City Commission have the right to reject a request for a peaceful demonstration—especially on July Fourth.

HE HAS HIS HANDS FULL . . .



What is the real meaning of the July Fourth celebration?

Although he later voted against granting the permit, Commissioner Peter Schweitzer made a strong point for the anti-war group.

"Isn't the real meaning of the July Fourth celebration a demonstration of dissenters?" he asked.

"Weren't our forefathers dissenters when they broke from English rule because they didn't like the policy in those days?"

# Once Proud P&A Theater Now Is Forgotten

The January fire that gutted the Penniman building destroyed one of Plymouth's oldest landmarks, and left a second, the P&A Theater, in danger.

There are but a few old-timers left who can remember the war years, 1914-1919. Those were the years that this building—known as the Penniman Allen building—was built.

Few of the hundreds of spectators who watched while firemen fought smoke and stubborn hidden flames billowing through a maze of halls, closets and small rooms knew of the historic heritage of the building.

## Shifting Population Poses School Problem

Growing and shifting populations cause many problems for the community involved—not the least of these problems are those thrust upon school districts.

The Plymouth Community School District, is experiencing a dilemma as a result of the area's quickly changing population.

Bus schedules have been thrown out of whack, attendance lines are no longer equitable because some schools receive more than their capacity of children.

Therefore, school's attendance lines must be changed to meet the new needs of the district.

School district officials say that the problems of shifting attendance boundaries differ in

scope from secondary to elementary levels.

BILL HARDING, assistant superintendent of schools on the secondary level, explained what criteria he considers when changing children from one area to another.

"The first and possibly most important consideration," said Harding, "is to try and have all the children attending any one school within walking distance of his or her school."

By having "walkers" in the school eliminates the need for buses and the attending money for transportation.

"Most of the time this money can be used for something else, possibly more important," he added.

When there is a need to bus children to a school "can you make the division lines so kids can be bused to school and not by a school."

In other words, Harding commented, we try to avoid having children being transported to school by passing another school during the route.

"This is bad planning," said Harding.

"Another consideration is we try for common boundaries."

THIS WAY THE older brother can supervise his younger brother or sister and keep an eye on them while going and coming from school.

The last important consideration is always to try and have both sides of a street going to the same school.

Harding explained that school officials believe that children tend to play with other youngsters across the street rather than youngsters in the house against the back yard.

What the attendance lines try and accomplish is having playmates go to school together.

Harding concluded that these are some of the most important reasons for figuring new attendance lines and that elementary schools try to follow the same pattern—in general.

Of course, he added, there are eight elementary schools while there are only three middle schools and one high school.

Prior to his promotion Roberts was a membership counselor in the Club's Lincoln Park-Allen Park Division for eight years.

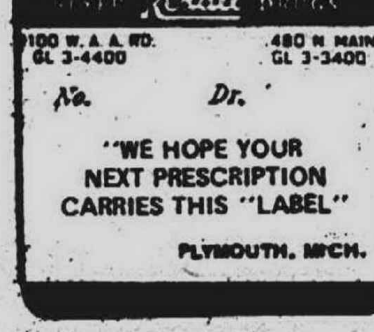
A native Detroit, he attended public school there and was graduated from Cooley High School in 1938.

many standing. "As the happy throng of people entered the building they were delightedly surprised at the beauty and the completeness of the interior. Many were heard to remark: 'Isn't it beautiful,' and 'Why, I never dreamed it was anything like this,' and other similar expressions," the Mail story noted.

"No one was disappointed in the new theatre. It more than met their fondest expectations. Everybody had a feeling of pride and satisfaction in the fact that Plymouth had at last been provided with a playhouse that has no equal outside of the largest cities in the state; and prouder still of the public spiritedness and generosity of Mrs. Kate E. Allen, to whom Plymouth is indebted for the handsome theater and adjoining auditorium."

THE THEATER that so impressed Plymouthites 50 years ago was left seriously threatened by the fire.

Engineers for the city and the insurance companies dis-

agree on the building's safety. The city feels the building is unusable; the insurance company engineer says it is.

The fire that gutted the old dance hall-auditorium next door was successfully contained. But a common wall between the two was damaged to the danger point, city engineers report.

In May, 1966 community leaders talked of saving the old theater; the community had long wanted a home for its 22-year old symphony orchestra, as well as a theater group.

The Plymouth Theatre Guild leased the theater for a four-day production of the "Farmer's Daughter," a loosely adapted musical that drew enthusiastic audiences.

The Guild made full use of the theater's stage riggings, plaster side lights, tapestries and dressing rooms.

Earlier in 1966 the Guild discovered these things, and beneath the dust and dirt of 50 years they found a beautiful theater.

A committee was named to find a way to save the aging building, but the group's work virtually was swept aside with the flames last winter.

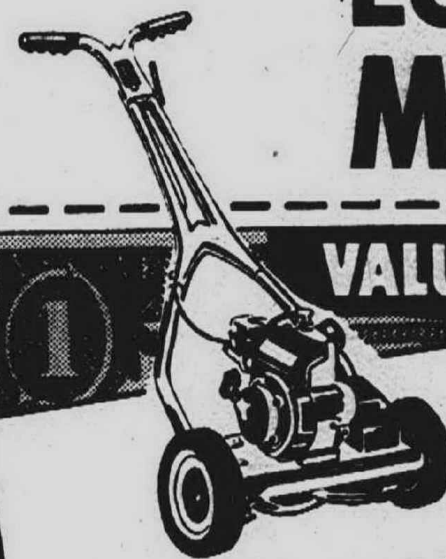
Now the theater, once "one of the finest in the Midwest," sits empty, its ancestry of no real help in saving it.

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES - REGULAR MEETING

June 11, 1968

The meeting was called to order at 8:05 a.m. by the Supervisor. All members were present. Mr. Overholt moved that the minutes of the Regular Meeting of May 28, 1968 be accepted as written. Seconded by Mr. Garber and carried unanimously.

Mr. Garber moved that the Board authorize the payment of said List of Bills in the Grand Total of \$13,572.32. Seconded by Mr. Norman and carried unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS - Report from Herald Hamill and John McEwen on the procedure for handling the Northville Road Sewer Project.

Mr. Hamill came before the Board with a proposed sewer program in the Township covering seven locations. He explained his estimated costs, discussed rights-of-way, potential customers, and with drawings showing the routes to be followed. Following this the Board discussed extensively the several proposals presented by Mr. Hamill, and more specifically the areas which are hazardous due to pollution, in an effort to ascertain the emergency areas that must be served. Also, in this discussion the Board covered the financing of this program. The following four areas were determined to be the emergency areas to be served: Byron Trunk from existing East side of Sheldon Road, west 80'; Hamill Avenue from Northville Road to Bradner;

Bradner Road from Hamill Avenue north and south.

It was noted that funds for their construction were available. Thereupon, Mrs. Holmes moved that the Board accept the engineer's estimate of costs for the extension of sanitary sewers in these four areas, and authorize Mr. Hamill to request construction permits and advertise and offer these projects for construction bids. Seconded by Mr. Norman and carried unanimously.

PAUL J. ALBRIGHT - Proposed Liquor Control Ordinance.

This matter having been tabled at the May 28, 1968 meeting of the Board, it was again discussed, and in response to a request for comments, Mr. Albright stated that the revenue received would be assigned to the General Government Fund, and that the State does not question the use of this money, provided the Ordinance is enforced in a proper manner. Following the reading of the communication from the Wayne County Drain Commission by Mrs. Richardson, and discussion by the Board, the following resolution was adopted on a motion by Ralph Garber and supported by Gene Overholt.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township of Plymouth entered into an Agreement with the Board of County Road Commissioners of the County of Wayne, Michigan, relative to the construction and maintenance of a storm sewer facility within the Board's right-of-way on Joy Road, between Haggerty Road and the Koss Drain in the Township of Plymouth, Wayne County, Michigan, a copy of said Agreement is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that John D. 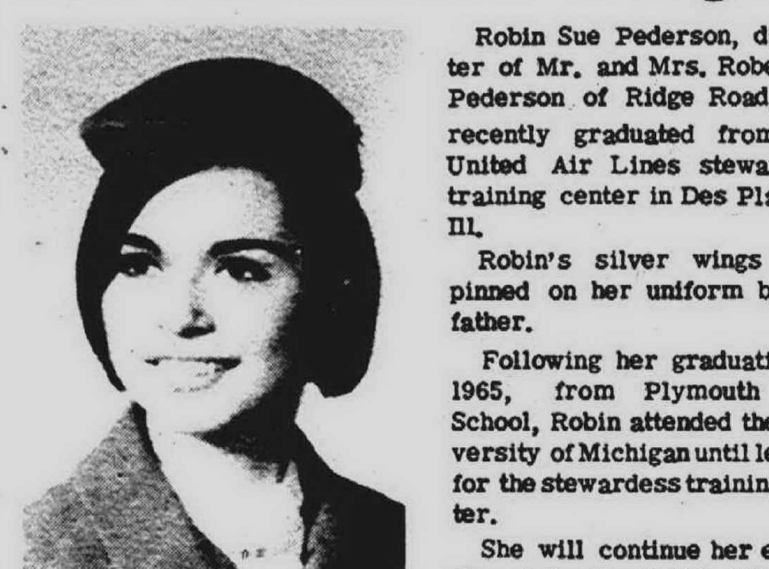

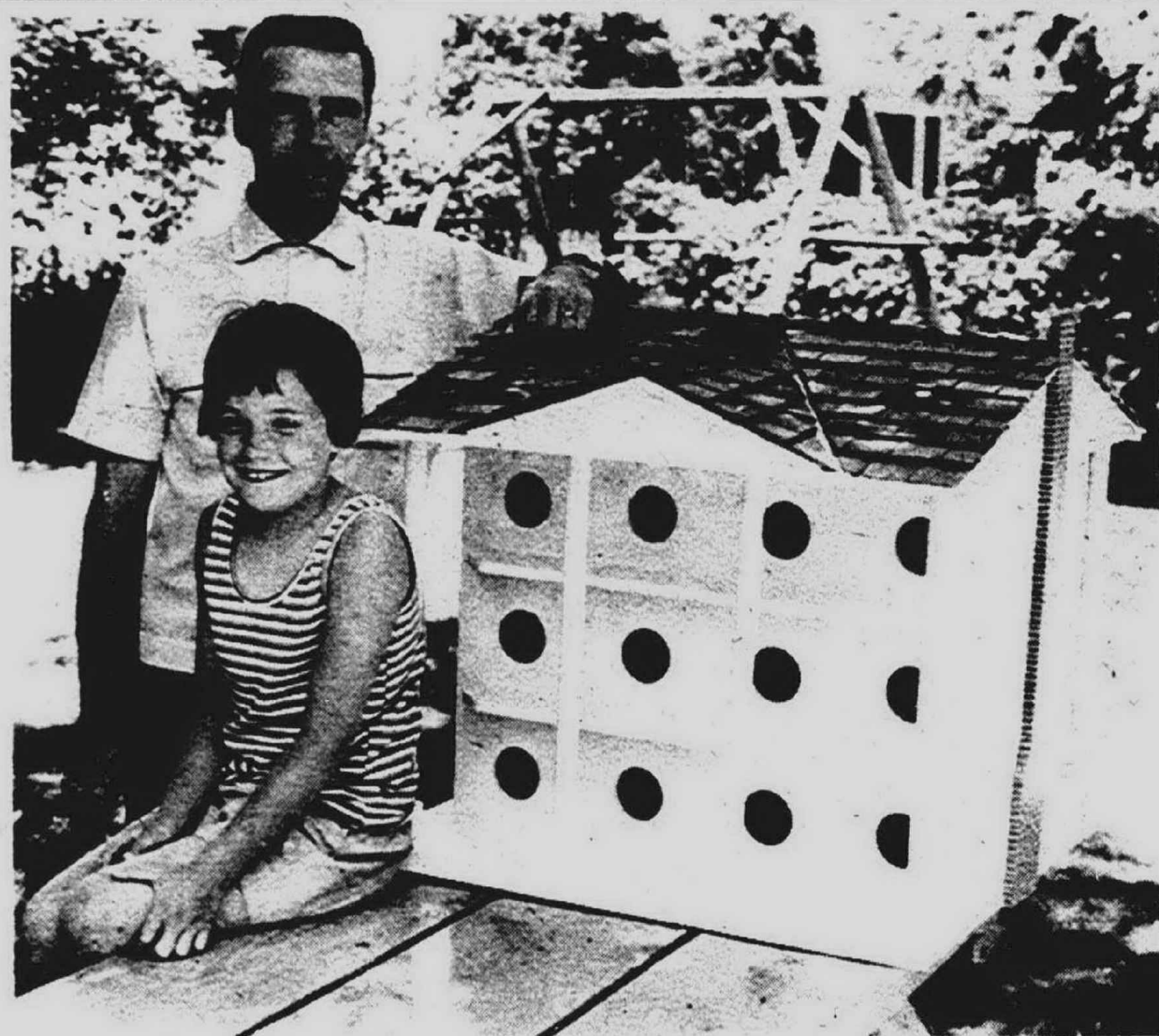

## Congressional Races

# Dems To Compete In 2 Primaries

By TIM RICHARD

Democratic voters will have a choice in two of the three suburban congressional districts in the Aug. 6 primary.

There's a two-man contest in the 19th District Democratic primary and a three-man fight in the 2nd District.

None of the incumbent congressmen—Republican Marvin Esch of the 2nd, Democrat William Ford of the 15th and Republican Jack McDonald of the 19th—has primary opposition.

Filing deadline was Tuesday afternoon.

FIGHTING FOR the chance to take on McDonald will be Ron Mardiros, a Livonia businessman and Democratic Par-

ty leader, and Gary Frink, former congressional aide and an attorney who lives in Waterford Township near Pontiac.

McDonald, former Redford Township supervisor, is seeking a second term after unseating incumbent Democrat Billie S. Farnum in 1966. Farnum is now working with the Democratic National Committee but maintains his Michigan residence.

It's a young man's race, McDonald is 36, Frink 35 and Mardiros 37.

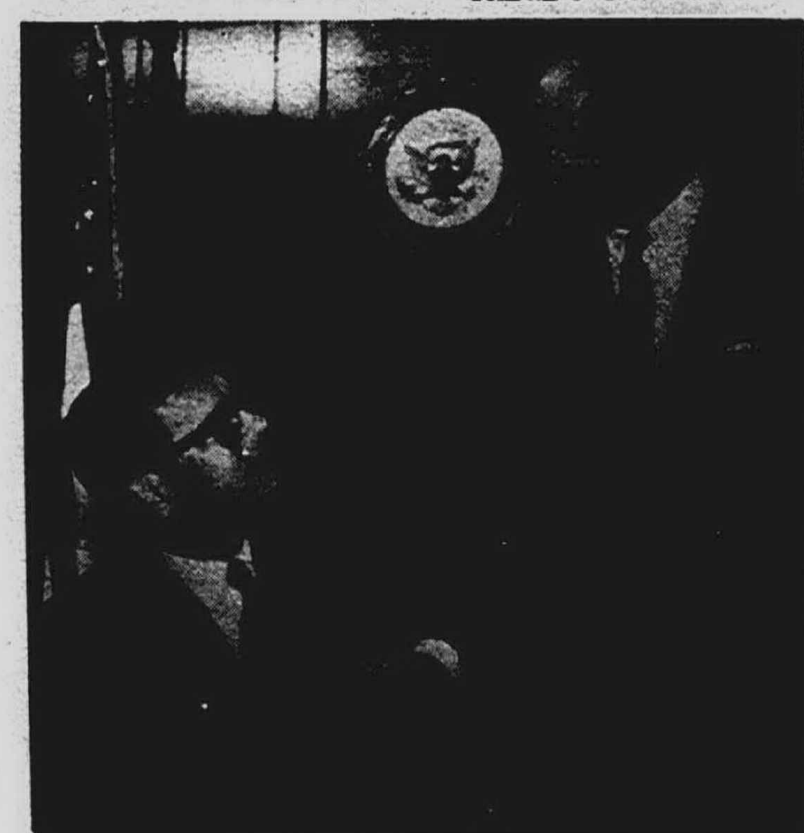
The 19th District includes the local communities of Redford Township, the City of Livonia, and Farmington city and township.

THREE DEMOCRATS want the chance to take on Esch, an Ann Arbor resident and former state representative and college instructor seeking his second term.

The man to beat in the Democratic primary will be Weston E. Vivian, Ann Arbor industrial executive who was defeated after one term by Esch in 1966.

A. Jerome Dupont, a 29-year-old Ann Arbor attorney, is a "peace" candidate with many supporters from the university town's hippie subculture. Third candidate is John H. McDermott Sr., retired veteran who lives in Howell and is party treasurer in Livingston

County. The district includes Plymouth city and township.

Ford, seeking his third term, filed unopposed in the Democratic primary. He is a former Taylor Township justice of the peace and Constitutional Convention delegate.

Lone Republican candidate is John F. Boyle, an educator who lives in Westland.

The district includes the local communities of Garden City, Westland and Canton Township.

## U.S. 'Kills, Maims' — Mardiros

Characterizing the U.S. as "a society that kills and maims both at home and abroad," Ron Mardiros last week formally launched his bid for the Democratic nomination for Congress in the 19th District.

Mardiros, 37, Livonia businessman, former charter commissioner and party leader, spoke to some 200 persons in a local restaurant.

He said the assassinations in recent years of national leaders "are a logical outgrowth of a society that kills and maims both at home and abroad."

Coordinating committee for the party included Ron Hecker, Alan Dipher, George Peterson, Paul Endicott, Walter Studley, Pat Bardocz and Frank Blackford.

## Melnik Endorses Frink

Eugene P. Melnik, who is opposing incumbent State Rep. John Bennett for primary election on the Democratic ticket, announced this week that he is endorsing Democratic 19th Congressional District aspirations of Gary Frink, Waterford.

Melnik, 37, of 9006 Hazelton, Redford, is making his third attempt for state representative. In 1964 and 1966 he ran as a Republican and was eliminated in the primaries.

Co-founder and present member of the supervisory board of the C. and S. Credit Union, Melnik is a 15-year employee of General Motors Fisher Body as a trim fabricator.

He is a member of UAW Local 174 and the AFL-CIO Committee on Political Education (COPE).

Melnik studied law and psychology at Arizona State College; is active in several fraternal organizations and is a member of the Redford Township police reserve.

Redford Democratic Club Chairman Joseph Patchett, however, has been close politically to Ron Mardiros, Frink's opponent in the congressional primary.

## Jackson OKs Open Housing

JACKSON -- The Jackson City Commission has approved an open housing ordinance by a 5-3 vote and has also put its stamp of approval on a proposal establishing a community relations department.

Under the open housing ordinance, fines of up to \$100 and jail terms of 90 days can be imposed on persons who practice discrimination in the sale or rental of housing.

In creating a department of community relations, the commission also approved the hiring of a full-time director. The department's purpose will be to establish communication between white and black residents of the community.

## New OCC Faculty Gets 31 Pct. Hike

Agreement has been reached by the Oakland Community College Faculty Association and OCC administration for a contract for 1968-69, effective July 1, William Stuart, chief negotiator for the Association, and W.H. Nikkel, representing the

College administration, announced jointly. The contract was ratified by the Faculty Association on June 17 and by the Board of Trustees at its regular meeting on June 18.

"The Faculty Association is

pleased that a fair and equitable agreement has been able to be effected prior to the end of this contract year," Stuart, who is an assistant professor in political science at Orchard Ridge Campus, in Farmington, said.

For the 185 faculty members, the increase will amount to a total of \$370,000.

In addition, the college will assume the faculty portion of hospitalization insurance, which will amount to approximately \$50,000.

PRINCIPAL ITEM in the new contract is an approximate across-the-board adjustment of \$2,000 which increases the beginning salary for instructors with a master's degree from \$6,500 to \$8,500.

"This represents an increase of 31 per cent," Nikkel said, "the first major salary increase since the college opened in September, 1965."

OTHER ITEMS in the new contract include a sabbatical leave policy which can be requested at the beginning of the faculty member's fourth year of service, the recognition of an Academic Senate, and the replacing of a five-year contract by a continuing contract provision, effective at the beginning of the fourth year of service.

# Weekly Band Concerts Thing Of Past In Most Communities--Not Plymouth

There was a time, perhaps a generation back, when most every city and town in Michigan had a weekly band concert during the summer months in the central park or bandstand in the heart of the business district.

It was the high spot of the week's activities and gave all in the area a chance to meet, socialize, eat popcorn and peanuts and ice cream, and enjoy the martial tunes of the volunteer bandmen.

The tunes may not have been the best, but they were the best for the musicians who were playing because they loved it. There wasn't any pay, one weekly practice and then the concert, generally on Thursday or Friday night.

Then came the automobile, better roads, and the band gradually faded out of existence, principally because the volunteer

musicians had other things to do and the audiences became smaller and smaller.

At about the time community bands were fading in most places, such an organization was revived in the City of Plymouth — and the Plymouth Community band will play the first concert of its 10th season Thursday night in Kellogg Park starting at 8 p.m.

The opening concert features Plymouth's own Sharon Sprague playing a piccolo solo with the band, "Concert in C Major" by Vivaldi.

The program opens with an old familiar John Philip Sousa march, "Stars and Stripes Forever."

The remainder includes: "National Emblem" march, "La Comparsa Carnival Procession," "The Royal Welsh Fusiliers" by Sousa, "On The Square," highlights from

"HMS Pinafore," "Bethsheba," "Trombone Blues," "Robinson's Grand Entree March," and closes with "On The Mall."

Just as the bands of the past were made up of volunteer musicians, so is the Plymouth group. The bandmen, all playing because they want to keep in the swing of things, practice on Wednesday evenings in the bandroom at Plymouth High School.

The practice facilities are furnished by the Plymouth Community Board of Education, and when the thermometer soars into the high 90s, the neighbors can hear the tunes — the group moves outdoors under the direction of Conductor James Griffith.

Matter of fact, it was principally through the efforts of Griffith, who was in his first years as PHS band director, that the concerts were first started 10 years ago.

**GRIFFITH STARTED** with members of his own high school group and then invited any others who desired to play to report for the practices. Much to his amazement, the musicians came from as far as 40 miles away to get a chance to "leave off some steam" and keep their lips and wind in top shape.

The musicians reported with their trombones, drums, cornets, clarinets, bassoons, flutes, french horns and every type of instrument needed for a band.

Some were members of Plymouth High bands of past years, some were musicians with other high school bands in the surrounding area, and some came from as far away as New Hudson, Ann Arbor, Flat Rock and Grosse Pointe to play in the concerts.

They don't have any fancy uniforms. Most come attired in white shirts and dark trousers and the feminine members in white blouses with dark skirts or slacks. The concerts aren't one bit formal — the crowd gathers early around the portable bandstand, dragging park benches or bringing their own camp stools and chairs.

The crowd may not be large for the opening number, but once the first tunes are heard — and they can be for blocks around the downtown — then the kiddies and their parents start streaming in from all directions. It's concert night, and they all come to take advantage of the outdoor music which continues over a period of six weeks.

There was a time when the City Fathers contributed to a fund to sustain the band and concerts, but then came a disagreement, and the financial support was dropped.

For a time, it appeared as if the Plymouth Community Band would disappear from the scene as others had in most every section of the state.

**THAT'S WHEN THE PLYMOUTH** Community Federal Credit Union came to the rescue. Manager and Treasurer George Lawton was told of the difficulties and was instrumental in getting permission of his board to make an annual contribution of \$1,200.

Over the years, it is the Credit Union support that has kept the band and the weekly summer concerts going.

The only paid member of the group is Director Griffith; all others donate their time and services.

The bandmen come from all walks of life. There are doctors, engineers, accountants, nurses, housewives, teachers, electricians, professional musicians and students from the Plymouth High marching band.

They participate in the activities during the annual Fall Festival, march in the July 4 parade and present two winter concerts. Proceeds of the latter are used to finance the activities of the band and for four half-scholarships to summer music camps.

In addition, the group has presented joint concerts with bands from Belleville and Farmington and the Ford Chorus. It has presented concerts at St. Francis Boys Home in Detroit and Northville State Hospital and programs at the annual Miss Plymouth contest conducted by the Jaycees.

During the Plymouth High football season when Griffith is busy with the PHS band, Keith Burton and Clayton LeRoue share duties in directing the community group.

# McCarthy Wins NY Primary, Jolts HHH

ALBANY, N.Y. — Senator Eugene J. McCarthy jolted New York Democratic forces by overpowering Humphrey and Kennedy delegate slates while a McCarthy supporter scored an upset victory in a three-way Senate race.

Partial returns slowed by hand-counting of paper ballots gave McCarthy 51 of the 123

convention delegate slots at stake. Kennedy delegates won 20 while Humphrey backers had one.

The voting trend indicated McCarthy would maintain the wide lead in delegates. McCarthy hailed the results as one of his greatest victories.

The surprise Senate primary victor was Paul O'Dwyer, a for-

mer city councilman and brother of the former mayor of New York City. He defeated Eugene H. Nickerson, county executive of Nassau County.

WASHINGTON — The U.S. General Accounting Office has rejected a challenge to the legality of two new Army contracts for production of M16 rifles.

In a report to a special House subcommittee, the GAO said the Army could legally ignore price in determining which of four firms should receive the contracts.

Contracts for 240,000 rifles were awarded to Hydra-Matic Division of General Motors, Ypsilanti, and Harrington and Richardson Co., Worcester, Mass. The GM contract had a ceiling price of \$56 million and Harrington and Richardson had a \$42 million ceiling.

The Army's action was challenged after disclosure that Cadillac Gage of Warren was prepared to supply the rifles for ceiling prices of about \$37 million.

The Army said its selection was based on those firms "which will afford to the government the highest degree of confidence in their ability in meeting and exceeding the accelerated schedule." The Army told the firms not to submit price data until requested.

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court dramatically underscored Negro rights in housing and education while handing two important victories to the policeman on the beat.

Negroes won a resounding victory when the Court ruled that a law dating back to 1866 bans racial discrimination in the sale and rental of housing.

Earlier in the term, the Court prodded lagging school desegregation by ruling out "freedom of choice" plans now in use throughout most of the South if more effective means are available to eliminate separate schools.

In the area of law enforcement, the justices: approved police eavesdropping, provided it is carried out under proper court orders; ruled policemen can stop suspicious characters in public places and frisk them for dangerous weapons, if reasonably necessary under the circumstances.

OTTAWA — The Canadian-U.S. agreement to combine forces for the air defense of North America was born in political strife 10 years ago and the issue has cropped up again in Canada's national election campaigns.

T.C. Douglas, leader of the New Democratic party, claims the North American Air Defense Command (NORAD) is an obsolete concept and that Canada could find better uses for the \$140 million it spent this way last year.

Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau says Canada should emphasize a continental defense role rather than participation in NATO. His statement seemed to discount any

Canadian initiative on NORAD if he remains in power.

SAN FRANCISCO — Two New Jersey doctors propose that the nation's police forces abandon unwarranted high-speed chases because of a high risk of death or injury to the participants and bystanders. They claimed more than 500 persons are killed each year in the U.S. as a result of police "hot pursuits."

On the basis of their study, the physicians said at least 25 per cent of chases ended in death and 70 per cent resulted in an accident, many of them serious.

PORTLAND, Maine — Actor Gary Merrill, a proven success at drawing people to the box office, was not very successful in drawing Maine voters to the polls to vote for him.

The 52-year-old Vietnam critic finished last on the Republican ballot in primary voting for the state's 1st District congressional nomination.

WEST PALM BEACH — A 21-year-old coed from San Jose State College in California has been picked National College Queen. She is the first Negro to win the 14-year-old pageant. Valerie Dickerson, 5-feet-

3 and 111 pounds, won the title and \$10,000 in prizes in competition with 49 other girls representing U.S. colleges.

Representing Michigan in the pageant was Virginia A. Kurnz, 21, of White Lake Township, Oakland County. Miss Kurnz is a junior at Eastern Michigan University.

NEW ORLEANS — Clay L. Shaw has asked a federal court to bar District Attorney Jim Garrison from prosecuting him on a charge of conspiring to murder President John F. Kennedy.

Shaw also asked the three-judge court to rule that the

Warren Report be made "valid and binding" on every court in the nation.

Shaw's lawyers argue that Garrison's sole motive in prosecuting the 55-year-old retired businessman is to provide himself with a forum for attacking the Warren Commission.

LONDON — A June 27 hearing has been scheduled on the U.S. government's application to return James Earl Ray to Tennessee for trial on a charge of murdering Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Ray's attorney, Roger Frisby, indicated that the 40-year-old escaped convict would fight

extradition. British extradition hearings usually last a day or two, and the magistrate generally gives his decision as soon as he hears all the evidence.

SAN FRANCISCO — The Board of Supervisors has passed a gun law requiring registration of all firearms sold or transferred within San Francisco.

Registration will involve a \$2 fee with a receipt like an automobile registration slip. Violators would be subject to a \$500 fine or six months in jail, plus confiscation of weapons.

# Russians Launch New Unmanned Satellite

MOSCOW -- Another phase in the Russian space program got under way this week when they launched an unmanned satellite, Cosmos 227. The Cosmos was reported orbiting approximately 145 miles above the earth. The typical announcement form said "it was for continued space exploration."

MILAN -- Italy's central industrial area was rocked by an earthquake sending Milan and Turin residents into streets. The early morning "shock" was

measured at 4 or 5 on the 12-degree Mercalli scale.

The Milan area in Northern Italy includes a fifth of the population and most of its industrial wealth.

HONG KONG -- This British colony has been threatened by 10,000 Red Chinese who demand reinstatement on their jobs. The laborers quit last year at the peak of the Communist-anti-British campaign.

## WORLD ROUNDUP

SAIGON -- US Military commanders have denied charges by British scientists that a gas used by the U.S. in Vietnam

had killed at least 350 persons.

Dr. Stephen Rose, London University scientist said: "We have documentary evidence that it has caused the deaths of at least 350 people in Vietnam. If it is used as a grenade thrown into a confined space, then the concentration increases and quickly reaches lethal proportions."

BERLIN -- Spokesmen for West Germany's biggest political party, the Christian Democratic Union, called for

stronger measures by the allies to counter East Germany's restrictions on travel through East Germany to Berlin.

President Johnson confirmed US support of West Germany in his statement, "the goal of a German people united in peace remains as firm as ever."

SAIGON -- After a cease fire order and assurances of protection, 121 enemy soldiers turned themselves over to the allies in the biggest Viet Cong surrender of the war.

Broadcasting through loudspeakers, South Vietnamese marines had surrounded the enemy three miles from Saigon. "We want to surrender, but we are frightened you will execute us", they called out.

The marines ordered a cease fire, and the soldiers came out over a period of an hour. Most of the North Vietnamese carried guns and were wounded.

JERUSALEM -- Shots were fired by both Israeli and Jordanian forces across the Jordan

river truce-line this week, according to an Israeli military spokesman. The Jordanians opened fire first, according to Israel. The Arabs claim they killed or wounded about 15 Israeli soldiers in a raid in the Israeli-occupied portion of the Jordan valley.

LONDON -- United seamstresses rejected a settlement and are continuing their revolt against the Ford plant in suburban Dagenham. Company officials are button-

holed by the striking women and said they may have to send 594,000 male workers home. The women demand equal wages with men and until they get it, this English Ford plant will not be stitching seat covers.

LONDON -- After a 45-day fight for life, British heart transplant patient, Frederick West, died. This leaves only five surviving heart transplant recipients. West's death was caused by "an overwhelming infection" according to doctors.

## Local Reserve Company Drills On Prisoners, Riots

More than a 1,000 Army Reservists, including members of 300th MP Command and the 603 MP Company G, of Livonia, have returned home after two weeks of field exercises at Fort Gordon, Georgia.

Military police units from eight states completed "Brown Thrasher III", practicing prisoner of war operations.

The Reservists also observed riot control demonstrations, a full-fledged course which has been attended by police officers from major cities throughout the United States.

The 300th would become a key command organization in the event of mobilization because there are no MP-PW commands in the active Army.

THE IMPORTANCE of this type of unit was established at Joje Do, Korea, when thousands of prisoners rioted and seized the camp.

The 300th and its subordinate

units only train together during their annual field exercises. During the last two weeks they acted as aggressors, insurgents, civilian protesters and guerrillas actively providing real harassment for training.

The citizen-soldiers put into practice the classroom instruction which they received at weekend reserve meetings throughout the year.

### Receives NSF Grant

Oakland University is the first school in Michigan to receive a National Science Foundation grant under NSF's Departmental Science Development Program.

The \$570,000 grant, which dwarfs all previous grants received by Oakland University for academic programs, was accepted at the Rochester campus by the Michigan State University Board of Trustees.

Oakland proposes to accel-

erate its development of the graduate program in systems engineering, one of ten fields in which master's degrees are offered at Oakland University.

With NSF and the University sharing the cost, the group of six professors presently active in systems engineering will be enlarged to ten. A significant number of graduate assistantships will be made available and a hybrid computer facility installed.

# News Considers Publishing

Hope for a settlement of the 219-day strike of Metropolitan Detroit daily newspapers appeared dimmer than ever Friday after a meeting of the union officials with publishers of the Detroit Free Press and Detroit News.

The unions had asked for the gathering, and there was some indication the session might bring a settlement.

Neither side had much to say after the meeting with the exception that it had netted absolutely nothing.

Later, officials of the Detroit News let it be known that they were considering the possibility of setting up crews made up of supervisory personnel with the thought of trying to publish a paper.

There was no official confirmation, and the News publishers refused to say anything more than that "we are studying such a possibility."

In the meantime, the last minute proposal of Mediator Dr. Nathan Feinsinger for an economic package of \$30 for a 36-month contract with an additional \$1 per month for the final three months is still

before the unions. The publishers agreed to the proposal, but it was flatly rejected by the unions shortly after Dr. Feinsinger made it Sunday at midnight.

In the Legislature, two conservative Republican state senators, George Kuhn of West Bloomfield and Robert Hubert of Troy, asked the union membership to vote on the Feinsinger proposal and threatened to introduce legislation to force an end to the strike if there were no settlement.

LANSGING -- Former Vice President Richard M. Nixon will bring his campaign for the Republican presidential nomination to Lansing on June 26. Gov. George Romney, who will head the state's delegation to the Republican National Convention, made the announcement.

Nixon originally had been scheduled to make the appearance June 7, but canceled it because of the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy.

LANSGING -- Despite a Supreme Court decision to the

contrary, Michigan will continue refusing welfare aid to children whose mothers are having extramarital sex relationships, according to R. Bernard Houston, director of the Department of Social Services.

The Supreme Court recently declared that Alabama, and by implication all other states, cannot strike children from the welfare rolls because a man cohabits with the mother.

The Department of Health, Education and Welfare said it would issue promptly a regulation pamphlet telling states how they must comply with the ruling.

LANSGING -- Gov. George Romney and Atty. Gen. Frank Kelley have filed a joint petition in Ingham County Circuit Court, requesting a grand jury investigation of allegations

concerning the State Highway Department.

Romney and Kelley originally sought to have the State Court of Appeals name one of its members as a grand juror to conduct the Highway Department probe.

PORT HURON -- The arrest of the son of former Michigan Gov. John B. Swainson on a charge of selling marijuana to an undercover agent last November was kept silent until this week because of an investigation of any further illegal narcotics activity, according to St. Clair County officials.

"He was treated just like any other person arrested," said Lt. Chris Swartzendruber of the State Police intelligence section. "There was no special consideration because he was Swainson's son."

LANSGING -- Atty. Gen. Frank J. Kelley has ruled that Michigan State University Vice President Philip J. May's private dealings have resulted in a conflict of interest.

While these private business

interests should not be allowed to continue, Kelley said, it would be unfair to punish May for past conduct.

Target of the criticism of May is a \$1.2 million East Lansing office building in which May's wife, Viola, holds a substantial interest and is leased in large part by the IBM Corp., a major supplier to MSU.

Kelley's office said opinions requested on possible conflicts involving MSU Trustee C. Allen Harlan and MSU President John A. Hannah would be ready soon.

LANSGING -- The State Administration Board has authorized the state to borrow \$70 million to help meet the first school aid payments for fiscal 1968-69.

Some \$20 million of the total will go for school aid advances in "hardship cases," while the other \$50 million will be needed for the regular school aid payments.

This second early expenditure was necessitated by the state Legislature when it moved the date for issuance of those payments from Aug. 25 to Aug. 1.

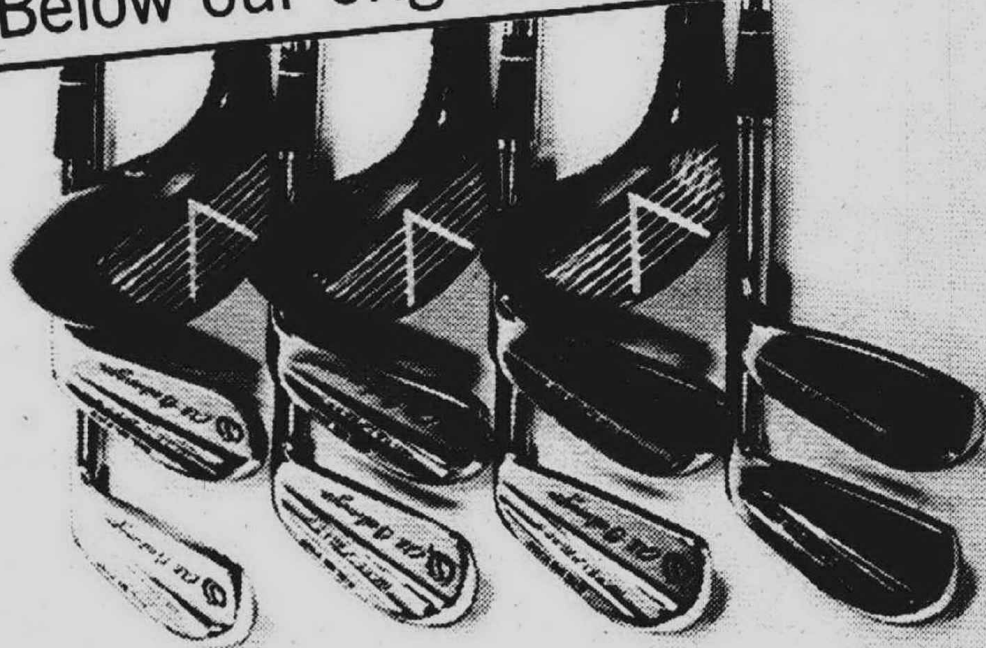

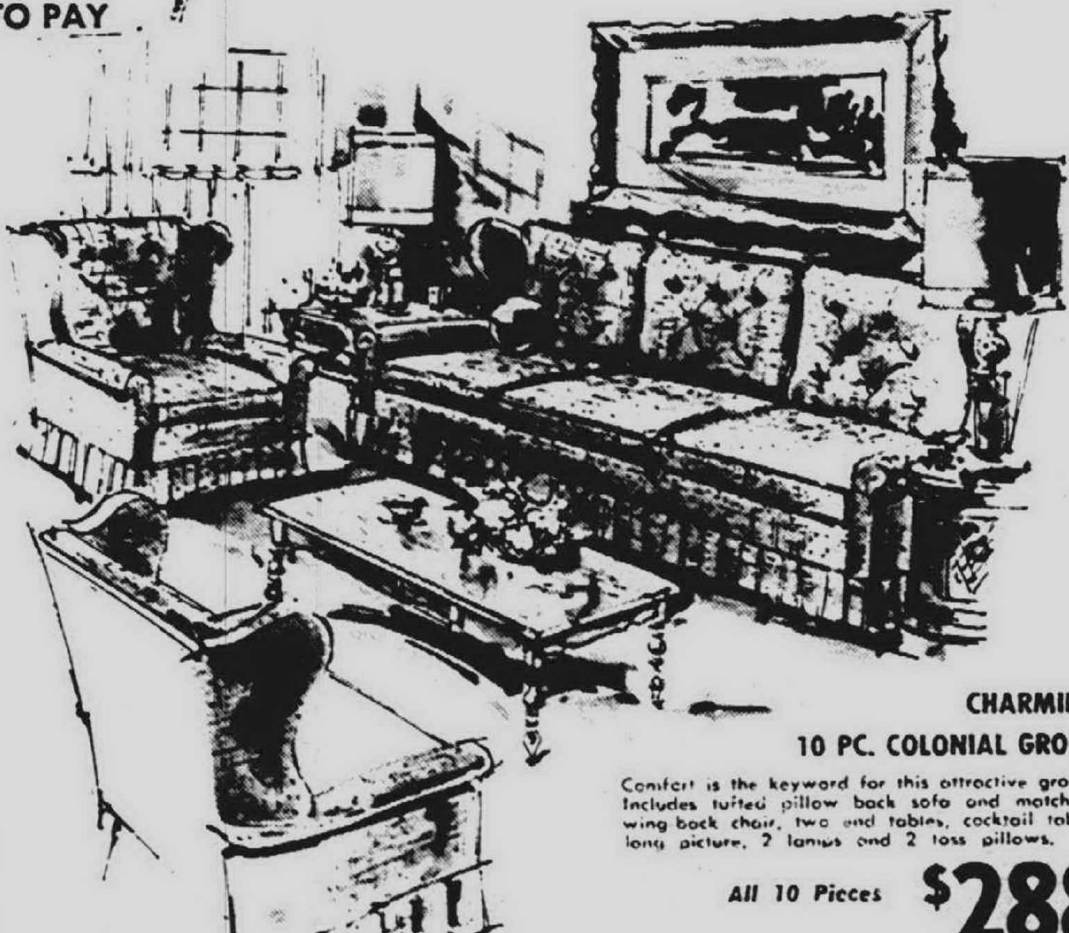

## MEA Settles 3 School Contracts

Teachers in Cherry Hill, Huron and Grosse Ile school districts have become the first of 26 Michigan Education Association units in Wayne County to complete contract negotiations for the 1968-69 school year.

The Cherry Hill Education Association, the first to withhold services last fall, ratified the new contract at the end of May and is ready for the opening of school in September, 1968.

THOSE MEA units in Wayne County still unsettled are Van Buren, Crestwood, Dearborn #7, Dearborn #8, Fairlane, Flat Rock, Garden City, Grosse Pointe, Lincoln Park, Livonia, Nankin Mills, Woodhaven, Northville, Plymouth, Redford Union, River Rouge, Riverview, Romulus, Southgate, South Redford, Trenton, Wayne and Wyandotte.

"Last year at this time, there was a larger percentage of units settled in the Metropolitan area," Richard Croll, MEA Metro Area Center director, said. "In view of this, we have encouraged all local association units to proceed with negotiations even though classes have been dismissed for the

summer," he continued.

Croll and Richard Gray, the other Metro Area Center director, indicated most of the school board negotiating teams in Wayne County have been reluctant to move ahead with the contract talks and make some meaningful progress.

"ALL LOCAL UNITS have been instructed to request mediation and fact finding immediately, where there is a lack of progress at the negotiating table," Gray said.

# 3 Tigers Cinches To Land On All-Star Team

The first phase of announcing the squads for the annual All-Star baseball game—to be played this year at Houston on July 9—comes this week with the announcing of the starting lineups.

Choices, to be made by the

players, coaches and managers themselves, will include all but the pitchers.

The pitching staff will be named later by the two managers—Dick Williams for the American League and Red Schoendienst for the National.

It's almost a cinch that two members of the league-leading Tigers will make the first contingent.

Bill Freehan again will be the American Legion catcher while Willie Horton will be picked in the outfield along

with Carl Yastrzemski of Boston and Frank Howard of Washington.

WHEN WILLIAMS gets around to picking his pitchers a few days later, he'll start with the Tigers' Denny McLain, who has emerged as the

league's No. 1 pitcher.

Williams also may consider Earl Wilson of the Tigers, despite the fact Wilson's 5-4 record isn't as impressive as some of the others in the league. The fact Wilson was out of

action almost a month with a heel injury has hurt his mark. But he appears to be back in the groove, having starred in his two starts since returning to action. Last Tuesday he went most of the way in downing the Boston Red Sox,

2-1. Pat Dobson came on to finish up in the ninth when Wilson tired. As for McLain, he came up with his 12th victory against only two losses on Thursday when he waltzed past the Red

Sox, 5-1, allowing only three hits. It's almost a cinch, that barring an injury or illness between now and July 9, McLain will start for the American League for the second time in three years.

## New Boats, Drivers To Bid For Gold Cup

New boats and drivers will dot the fleet of unlimited powerboats Monday when qualifying trials open on the Detroit River for the \$63,500 Gold Cup Race, the richest in its 64-year history.

Five new \$35,000 three-point hydros will be among the 15 entries attempting to make the select 10-boat field for the race, billed as the Ken-

tucky Derby and Indianapolis of boating, to be held June 30. Three rookie drivers will be included in the eight driver changes, the biggest shift of throttle jockeys in recent times.

Billy Schumacher and Miss Bardahl, the defending Gold Cup and National champions, and veteran Bill Muncey in the Miss U. S. will be the targets of the

newcomers. Schumacher won the Wisconsin Cup Race a week ago to capture his seventh victory in 10 starts with Miss Bardahl. The orange and black checkered Seattle-entry has posted the fastest lap, heat and race speeds of the season.

MUNCEY WILL BE after his fifth Gold Cup victory, a feat accomplished only by the immortal Gar Wood and J. M. Wainwright. Muncey and Miss U. S. rate as co-favorites in the four-heat 60-mile race.

Their most serious challenge is expected to come from Tommy Fuitts, a graduate of the dragstrips and drag boat racing. Fuitts, 27, has taken over the throttle of Jim Ranger's My Gypsy.

He blazed the orange and black beauty to heat victories in both the Dixie and Wisconsin Cup races to impress his rivals. Fuitts won the National Hot Rod Assn. championship in 1966 and last year was runner-up in the National Drag Boat Assn. Championship.

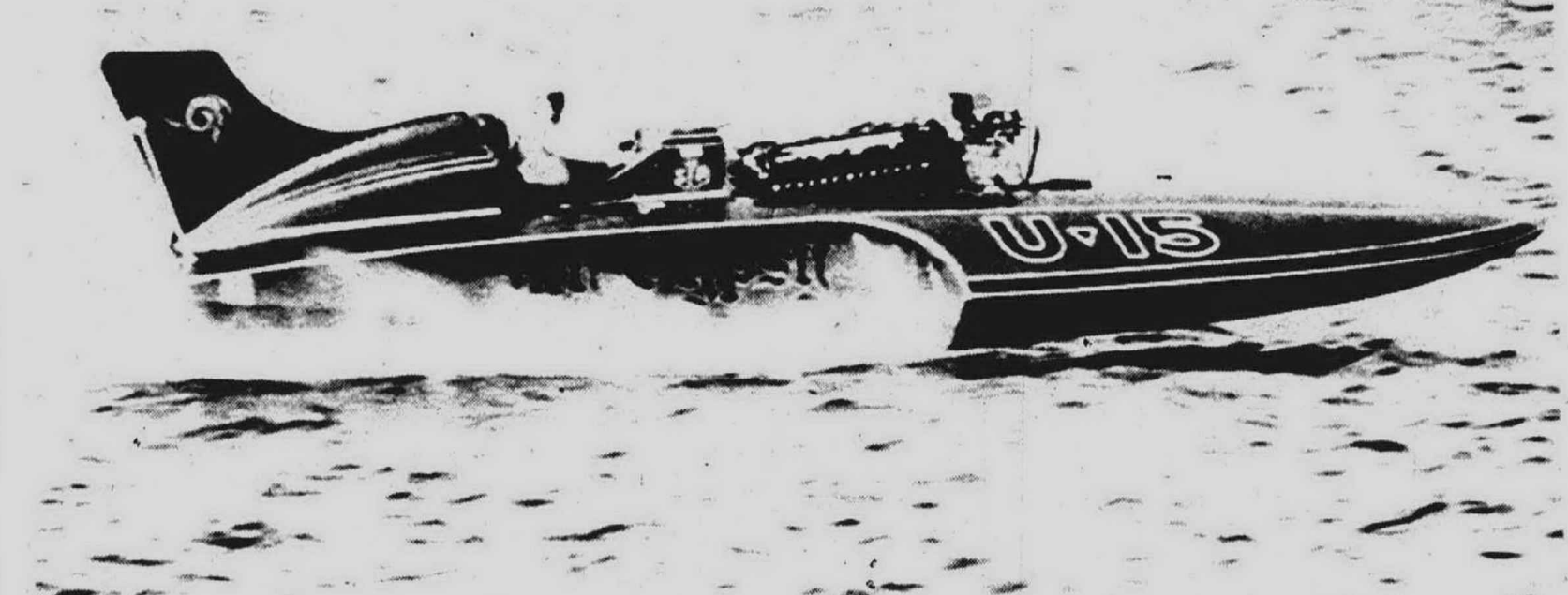
"That boy has a heavy foot and isn't afraid of anything," was the appraisal stamped on Fuitts by veteran driver Wild Bill Cantrell.

Cantrell has another prize rookie on his hands at the wheel of the new Smirnoff.

Dean Chenoweth, a former national outboard and limited inboard class champion from Xenia, O., replaced the retired Cantrell in the radically designed Smirnoff. This three-pointner was developed after exhaustive investigations of the fatal crashes which claimed the lives of five Gold Cup drivers in the last two years.

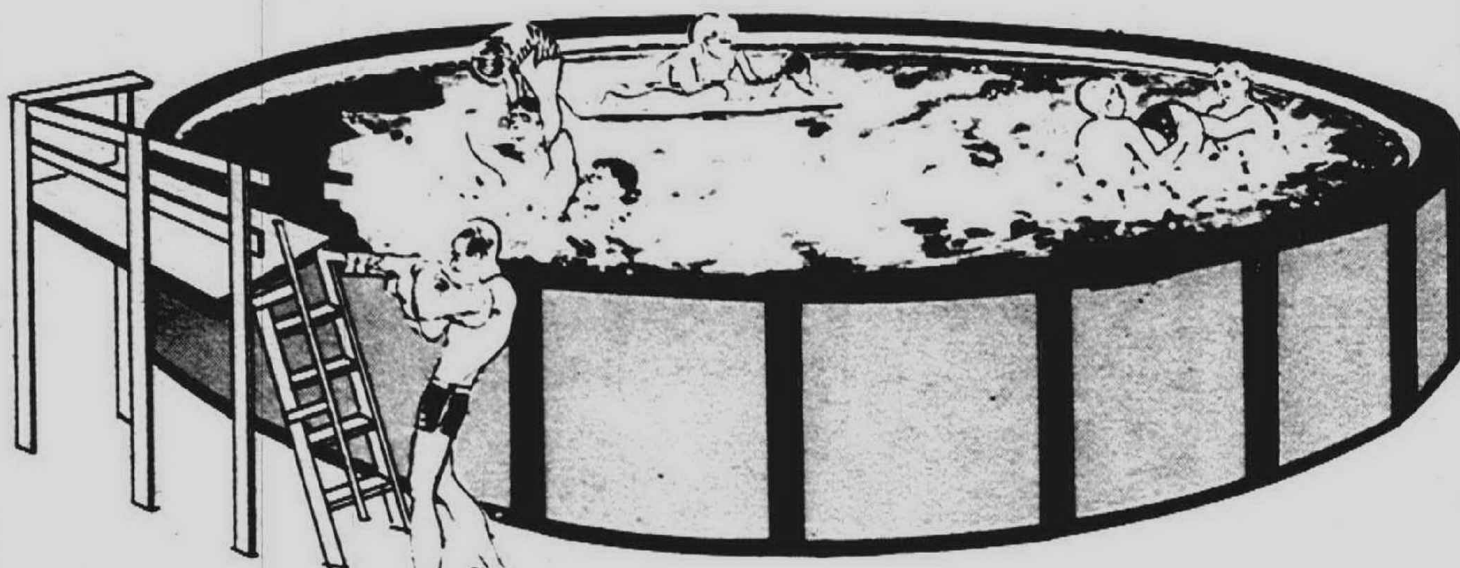

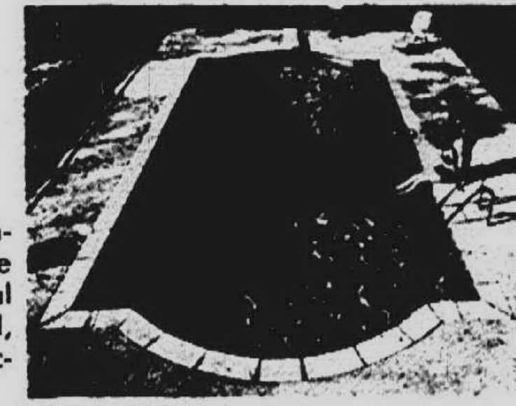

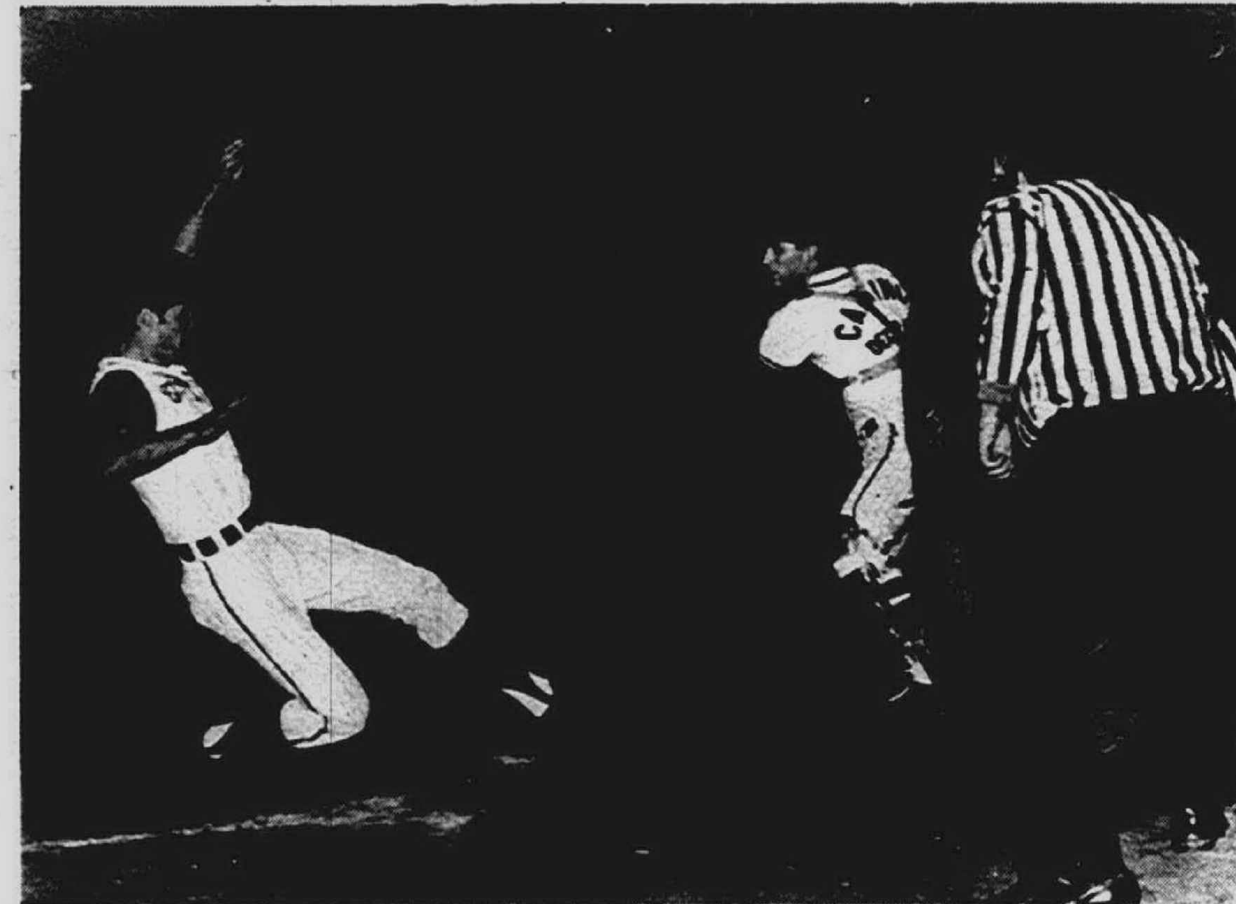
In the fourth, a single by Himmelsbach, triple by Drapalski, and singles by Sager and Patton added three more runs.



## Rose Blooms At Peak; Need Regular Care

This is the season to revel in roses—just about every one's favorite flower.

Although bloom will continue throughout the season on most roses, it can't rival the magnificent abundance of June bloom.

Blazing red climbers adorn a garage wall or festoon a low fence. Floribundas, with their clusters of blossoms on low bushy plants, add color to a foundation planting or mingle with perennials in the flower border.

The elegant hybrid Teas, with one large bloom at the tip of each stem, reveal their per-

fection in carefully-tended formal beds.

IT IS NOT difficult to grow perfect roses, but regularly scheduled care is necessary to combat the insect and fungus pests that can attack the plants.

Choose healthy, sturdy bushes to plant, and choose a location that is quite sunny and has good air circulation.

Prepare the soil deeply and enrich it with compost, peat moss, or well-decayed manure if this is available. Potted roses can be planted at any time during the growing season.

Among the varieties recommended by the Michigan State

Extension Service are the climbers named White Dawn, Coral Dawn, Gold Rush, and Don Juan, which is red.

The floribundas they recommend include World's Fair, Wildfire, Heat Wave, and Ruby Lips, all of which are red.

Their recommendations for orange floribundas are Sarabande, Golden Slippers, and Zambra. Others recommended are Lilac Charm, All Gold, Snow Queen, Fashionette which is pink, and Rumba which is red and gold.

The recommended hybrid tea varieties include White Knight, Pink Peace, Pink Duchess, Queen Elizabeth, Gold Glow, Golden Scepter, orange Tropicana, red Chrysler Imperial, Christian Dior, and Merry Widow, and bi-colored Peace, Garden Party, and Duet.

THERE ARE MANY other equally beautiful and sturdy roses from which to choose. This is an excellent time to look over the assortment in your friends' gardens and at the local nurseries and make a selection when you can see them in bloom.

Some of the more common rose troubles include black spot which makes dark spots ringed with yellow on lower leaves, powdery mildew which coats the tips of shoots and upper leaves with white, and aphids, which are small insects that cluster on the tender stems and buds and suck juice from the plants.

To control black spot, which is a fungus infection, use Phaltan.

The powdery mildew is also a fungus. It can be prevented by treatment with Karathane.

Malathion will control aphids, rose chafers and other insects that chew the leaves or flower petals. Malathion also controls red spider mites which is evidenced by a fine speckling of the leaves with gray or yellow and the eventual dropping of the leaf, but even more effective is Kelthane.

THERE ARE sprays and dusts available that combine several of these ingredients so that one application will take care of most problems.

Dusts are, perhaps, least expensive but leave a powdery residue on the leaves that is not attractive. Aerosol spray cans are most expensive but are easiest to use and are ready at all times to attack a problem.

Sprays or dusts should be used regularly every week or two to keep the plants in top condition so they can keep on producing a lavish display of beautiful roses.

Sickly leaves on foliage plants is often due to poor light and over-watering. A green thumb seems to be one of the best cures.

Gradual fading of color, elongated leaf stems and progressively smaller leaves are typical when poor light is the problem. Opening the drapes and pruning outside shrubbery sometimes provides adequate light.

Awnings, north exposures and inside walls usually is certain disaster. When plants can be rotated to a bright or sunshine area, they generate a surplus of

food and return to the glossy beauty you desire.

If rotation is not possible and these plants cannot be moved to bright locations, these plants will gradually decline.

Waterlight pots and planters can become a pond if you add too much water. Just one over-watering can kill most of the roots. Unless the plant can grow new roots, the plant quickly declines, (the off-color foliage and progressive yellowing).

The yellowing and leaf drop

is a balancing process to adjust for root loss.

An ideal way to avoid over-watering is to use pots with drain holes. Each time you water, apply enough to saturate the soil. The surplus will appear in the pan beneath the pot.

Instead of watering on a schedule use the finger test. Feel the top of the soil before watering. If you can feel moisture, the plant has enough. When the top of the soil feels dry, add enough water to saturate the soil and produce a surplus in the pan.

fertilizer you use.

Talk with your garden store manager, florist or follow the suggestion of a friend who has proven success with house plants.

If you do "get carried away"

with your fertilizing, then place the plant in the kitchen sink and intentionally over-water.

The surplus water from the bottom of the pot will contain some of the fertilizer and help reduce the overload.

## Computer To Catch Bad Check Passers

A computerized check verification service recently announced for the Detroit metropolitan market area by Comp-U-Check, Inc., is being made available to the neighborhood retailer and other small businesses.

The new firm, organized to reduce business losses due to cashing bad checks, recently announced that a number of large companies had agreed to pool their files on fraudulent checks and bad check passers.

President Eugene May said that interest in the service expressed by small businessmen was causing Comp-U-Check to scale service contracts down "to fit the pocket-book of the neighborhood store."

DEROGATORY CHECK information is obtained from banks, public agencies, business associations and other sources as well as from subscribers. This pooled information is keyed for instant reference to Michigan's permanent driver's license numbering system.

An I.B.M. Computer System 360 installed at Comp-U-Check headquarters, 19225 West Eight Mile Road in Redford Township provides instantaneous access to as many as 30 million characters of information on bad check passers and stolen and forged company checks.

When a check is presented, the subscriber phones Comp-U-Check on a regular telephone and gives only the customer's

Michigan driver's license number, which an operator transmits to the computer.

# Light-weight Containers Ease Plant Handling

A rather recent development in the nursery industry has been the use of light-weight containers for handling plants. The containers, made of plastic, pressed fibers, metal and peat, range in size from four or five inches in diameter to the size of a bushel basket. One-, two-, three- and five-gallon sizes are quite popular for a wide variety of plants.

Container growing of plants has many advantages for the nursery and the gardener. Plants are dug when they are dormant and potted in the container during the winter season. Thousands of roses are handled this way each year.

In other cases, plants are dug by a digging machine which makes a uniform ball of soil that is slipped into a container. This is a faster operation than balling the soil with burlap.

Containers have additional advantages in that they do not dry out as rapidly as the burlap balls and are more easily watered, as the water penetrates downward and does not run off the outside as in the case of balled items.

Container-grown plants can be handled easily. The stiff container can be moved around with no damage to the roots or top. This makes it easier to select plants, load them and set them in place. The container can be rotated to show the best side of the plant, moved to where it will give the best effect and even allowed to stand until it is planted.

BY POTTING or container-izing plants when they are dormant, the season for planting can be greatly extended. Peonies, which cannot be transplanted satisfactorily in spring because of their early growth and tender stems, can be potted in fall and planted when in bloom.

This sounds like Utopia, but there are problems and cautions. One problem for the nurseries is that of containers drying out in winter, particularly when soil is frozen. This is overcome somewhat by using damp sawdust around the

containers but this has only a limited effect as most of the containers are unaffected by the moisture on the outside. Plastic covers over beds or blocks of containers are used, as are lath screens, cold frames, storage sheds and similar structures.

A major problem is that

plants grown in containers for some time can become pot-bound. The roots are stopped by the container and go round and round the inside of the container binding all the roots together in a tight mass. New roots have a difficult time penetrating the mass of intertwined roots in the container,

especially around the edge.

IN PRACTICE, this mass of roots is broken up in planting, unless it is too compact. Otherwise, the pot-bound roots are no better off than if they were still in the container. The water supply is limited to just that soil around the roots and consequently the

plant may suffer severely during dry periods either in winter or summer.

In buying container-grown plants, the home gardener should watch out for pot-bound plants. Look carefully at the soil in the container. If roots are visible around the top of the soil, it is generally a good

indication that the plant is in too small a container or has been in it too long. If the plant is top heavy, look at the container to see if the roots are visible. A severely pot-bound plant will have quite a wall of roots visible around the top.

Another test is to push a

pencil or a small stick into the container. If the soil is filled with roots there will be resistance to the stick and a tearing will occur. There will also be a springy feel. Normally a pencil should push into the soil easily, without encountering resistance.

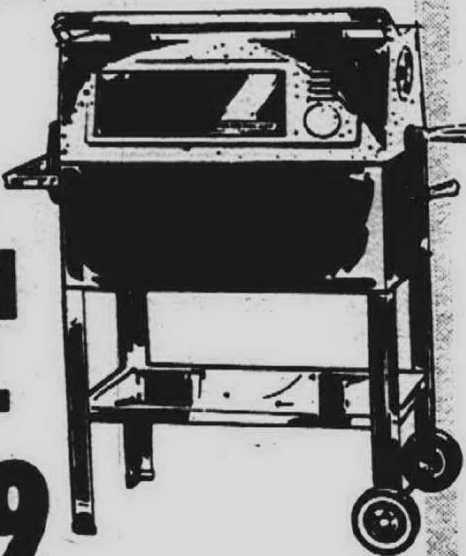
Most container-grown stock

is good, but there are always exceptions and there is a tendency for some nurseries to leave the plants in the same containers until they are sold, even if they do become pot-bound. This would be most likely to happen in places that buy their plants rather than in ones that grow them.

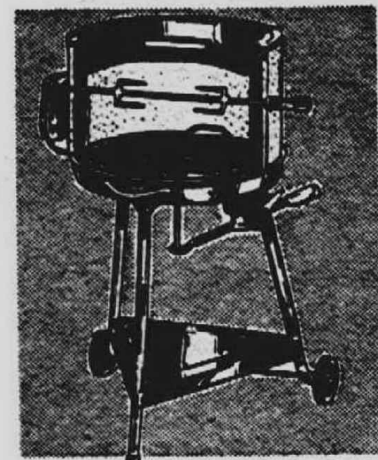

No need to take that Pan Am plane for a quick hop to England to the Stratford-On-Avon Shakespearean Festival.

Jump in the family car, zip down superhighway 401, and three hours hence you're in Stratford, Ontario, home of Canada's exciting Shakespearean Festival.

For 16 years, the bustling town of Stratford has been host to the nation's drama lovers. Critics from New York, Chicago, Minneapolis, Toronto, Montreal, Cleveland, and Detroit (yes, Wally Roberts goes, too) pour into this picturesque town where culture flourishes for 18 weeks during the summer months. Swans, white and black, cruise leisurely on Stratford's Avon River and add to its beauty.

FROM JUNE 10 to Oct. 12, six plays, one opera and the Royal Winnipeg Ballet will be presented at the Stratford Festival.

Fifteen concerts on Saturdays and Sundays feature such diverse musical interest as Duke Ellington, Ravi Shankar, Van Cliburn, Metropolitan Opera's Judith Raskin, and New York's Pro Musica.

In addition to all these attractions festival patrons can visit the Rothman Art Gallery, theatrical displays at the Exhibition Hall, or the Pioneer Village at nearby Doon, Ontario.

What about the three plays presently running in repertory fashion? (Incidentally, be sure to send for the free brochure that gives you day and date for the performances of the other three productions opening in July.)

"ROMEO AND JULIET,"

the classic love story, opened the Festival on June 10. Two newcomers to the Festival, Louise Marleau and Chris Walken, performed the leading roles.

Mr. Walken comes to the Festival from New York where he had leading roles in "The Lion In The Winter," "West Side Story," and "Iphigenia In Aulis." His fiery, yet controlled wooing of Juliet had the proper impetuosity and made quite believable the whirlwind courtship.

Sword fights interrupt Romeo's marital plans. The Stratford stage becomes a bloody battlefield many times during the evening as Tybalt dies in a street fight, Mercutio gets run through, and Paris is slain. Steel meets steel in authentic fashion at Stratford. A special fencing instructor trains the actors for months before the production and the swords are forged in England.

Miss Marleau's tragic death scene is done with great finesse.

Her early acting years were spent on the Montreal stage. Although she has a slight French accent, it is not too disturbing since she gives the difficult role of Juliet new emotional dimensions.

Director Douglas Campbell, absent from the Festival for two years, returns in triumphant fashion. His crowding of scene upon scene gives the three hour Shakespearean drama much needed pace. The party scenes usually quite placid are filled with interesting dancing and singing.

"TARTUFFE," A MOLIERE comedy dealing with hypocrisy, was the second opening on June 11. Stratford over the years has not always been committed to doing Shakespeare. Chekhov, Brecht, Rostand, Congreve, and Strindberg have been other classic playwrights to grace the Festival at Stratford.

Most of the non-Shakespearean dramas have appeared in

the second theater in Stratford, the Avon. The Avon Theater has been completely renovated at a cost of more than \$1 million.

The Avon Theater houses the musical productions and dramas that might not be suited to the "thrust stage" of the Festival Theater. The "thrust stage" in itself is a unique, dramatic experience. The audience surrounds the stage on three sides. Most of the acting is done almost in the audience's lap.

At the Avon Theater, the proscenium stage is used. Many productions find the traditional form a more comfortable mode of communication. "The Seagull" and "Waiting For Godot" will be performed at the Avon this summer.

HOW DOES MOLIERE'S "Tartuffe" fare in the thrust stage of the Festival Theater? Although the laughs come early and continue throughout the evening, old Wally felt that the Avon might have been a better place for this Moliere farce. Farce comedy depends on the banging of doors, the closeness of bodies almost bumping into each other, and the hiding behind screens.

The wide expanse of the Festival Theater diluted much of Moliere's merriment. Director Jean Gascon restricted the imagination of his designer Robert Prevost so that the stage was exceptionally bare. The sparse setting did little to convey the wealth of Orgon, the head of the bourgeois family who is so impressed by Tartuffe's piety.

William Hutt as Tartuffe plays the hypocrite in flawless fashion. Mr. Hutt's work in the Festival has always been diamond-perfect. His character-

izations are complete and perfect. The little nuances, the shades of meaning that Bill Hutt puts into his acting gives the credence to the statement that acting is a real art. Mr. Hutt is one of the big reasons for not missing a season at Stratford.

"MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S Dream," as seen through Director John Hirsch's contemporary eyes becomes a wild, sensuous, beautiful, fantastically dark comedy that struggles between the real and illusory world.

Hirsch's "Dream" will easily be the "smash hit" of the Festival. The rock music, the erotic wood nymphs, the lovers so real, and the side-splitting production by the rustics of "Pyramus and Thisbe" all add up to instant success.

You'll be charmed, slightly perturbed by some of the dark moments, and surely enchanted by the lovers as they chase each other through the woods. "The Dream" even with its moments of nightmarish qualities comes through and makes you glad you have visited the Stratford Shakespearean Festival.

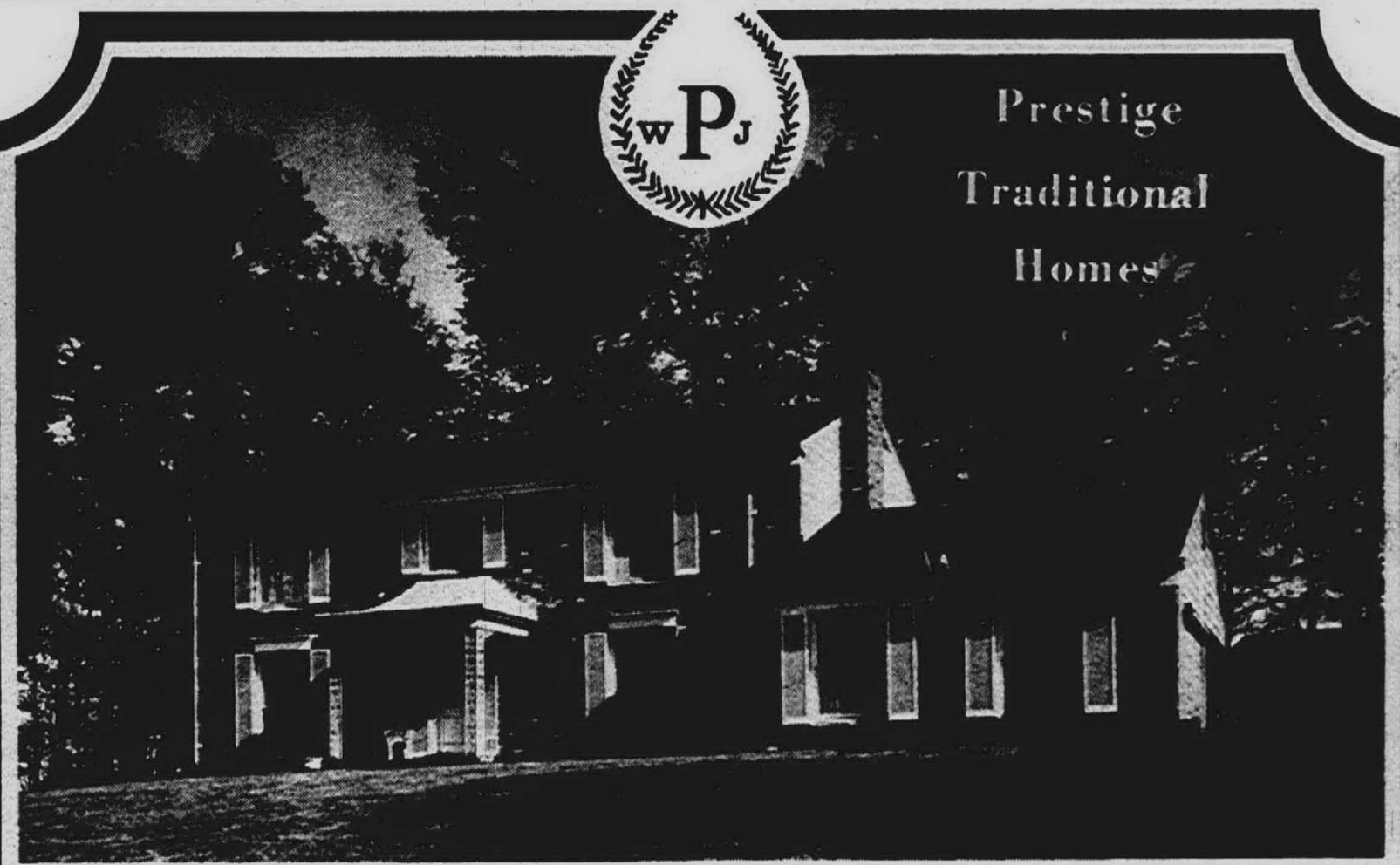

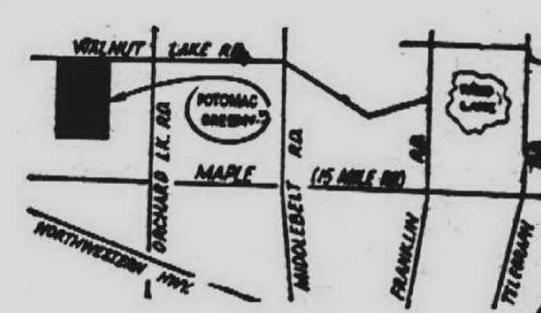

# Top College Administrators Continue To Quit

The area's two young community colleges continue to have trouble holding on to top administrators.

Thomas H. Auch, assistant director of business services at Oakland Community College, announced his resignation Tuesday—the 13th top man to leave the college in the past 28 months.

His resignation follows closely that of Dr. Richard Wilson, provost of the Orchard Ridge Campus in Farmington.

And John Brinn, vice president in charge of instruction, quit his post at Schoolcraft last

week.

The two resignations bring the total at both colleges to 17 since they were founded. OCC, in particular, appears to have internal problems, but top officials decline to talk too freely about them.

BRINN, in quitting, said he "wanted to return to the classroom." He said he would return to teaching as an assistant professor in college mathematics.

"There is no falling out of love with the college here," Brinn said. "I have no complaints."

Brinn will take a cut in pay to return to teaching.

Four others have left Schoolcraft since its founding. Miss Lois L. Waterman retired, but remained on the next year to help with special projects.

Dr. Dell Reed, who headed the school's evening college and also acted as academic dean, left for a better job at Cuyahoga College in Ohio.

Reed finished his doctor's degree while at Schoolcraft. Another top administrator, Jim Dotseth left for Oakland Community College. William Dilworth, an accountant, resigned recently for a different job.

OAKLAND HAS lost numerous top men, including President John E. Tirrell, who headed the college since October 1964. Tirrell, whose resignation becomes effective June 30, left to become director of Planning and Consulting for Education, Inc., a Bloomfield Township firm that specializes in setting up new colleges.

Tirrell's salary was bought out at \$41,000, including \$32,000 for his last year. This would indicate that he was ousted or forced to resign rather than that he resigned voluntarily. Officials continue to insist, however, that he "resigned."

Tirrell's replacement was named last week by the OCC board of trustees. Dr. Stanley J. Hergenroeder will become interim president July 1. He is provost of the Highland Lakes Campus.

Tirrell, in quitting, told the board that "it was difficult to respond negatively to requests for counsel and assistance from various groups outside of the

college." He added that it was apparent his job would conflict with his desire to become involved in "some of the exciting and creative challenges" he saw in education.

The company Tirrell will work for was, in part, founded by him.

OAKLAND'S NEW president, Hergenroeder will serve as "interim" chief executive until a new one is appointed. According to George Mosher, chairman of the board, he is among the candidates for the top spot.

Mosher denied any possibility that the wave of resignations reflected a wide spread unhappiness. Rather, he said, the college's reputation attracted people hunting top administrators, and many were taken away from Oakland.

"The community college field is the fastest growing field in

the education business," Mosher noted. "There are some 200 presidencies open right now. This college got national attention; we were visited by presidents of every community college in the country. We are better known nationally than in the county, and I'm sure we lost people because of that."

Mosher agreed some may have left because they were dissatisfied. Four or five men, he explained, became presidents of their own colleges. Others, like Jim Hobson, were high-powered executives who moved to the top of their field; Hobson is vice chancellor of business at UCLA.

"And, I see people continuing to come and go in this field," Mosher said.

"We may be high for the state, but we are not high for the nation. At best, we are a bit above average; but we are as competitive as it might appear."

Mosher, who is an attorney with General Motors, said he did not detect any poor morale on campus.

The college had pioneered in tutorial learning—packaged education with heavy emphasis on individualized learning and wide use of audio-visual materials.

The college is still in good hands, as people have been moved up to fill the spots vacated by resignation, Mosher added. Much of the planning for next year has been completed before the June 30 deadline for contract expiration.

## Sladek Runs For Supervisor

Henry R. Sladek, Wayne County Republican chairman, will seek the GOP nomination for county supervisor from the 26th district.

The district includes Livonia, Plymouth, Northville, and Canton Township.

A Livonia resident, Sladek is district manager for Western Electric Co. in Plymouth. In his political job, he was a member of the apportionment commission that drew up the 26-district setup for the Wayne County Board of Supervisors.

HE LAUNCHED his campaign with an attack on Democratic office-holders in the county as inefficient and lacking imagination, adding:

"Our county sheriff (Peter Buback) resigned recently as a result of charges of willful neglect of duty. For his replacement, the Democrat county prosecutor (William Cahalan) and county clerk (Edgar Branigan) appointed a law partner to one of the assistant county prosecutors.

"This appointment (of Roman Gribbs as sheriff) also fell short of concern and awareness of public opinion. The newly-appointed sheriff has been rejected twice by the voters for a judgeship.

"THE PROBLEMS and troubles confronting us in Wayne County and Detroit are not much different than our government in Washington. The problems and troubles of these governmental units arise from the same cause—a terrible breakdown in the administration of government," Sladek said.

Sladek is the first candidate to announce formally for the county supervisor post.

## UAW Settles In Port Huron

PORT HURON -- Some 1,700 workers have ended a 50-day strike by ratifying a contract with Mueller Brass Co. in Port Huron.

Officials of United Auto Workers Local 44 said the ratification was almost unanimous.

## Non-Public Book Aid Is Hailed

The president of the Michigan Association of Non-Public Schools hailed a U.S. Supreme Court ruling upholding a New York law requiring public school systems to lend textbooks to students in non-public schools.

"We are extremely pleased with the Supreme Court's decision in the New York textbook case," Dr. John Choltz of Detroit said. "It constitutes a vote of confidence in the value of non-public schools to the nation."

The Supreme Court upheld a 1955 New York law that requires public school districts to lend textbooks to non-public school students in grades seven through twelve.

The textbook lending program was challenged on grounds that it violated the U.S. Constitution's ban on "establishment of religion."

Supreme Court Justice Byron R. White, who wrote the textbook case opinion, ruled that the lending of books to non-public school students benefits the children and not the schools they attend.

"...Parochial schools are performing, in addition to their secular education," Justice White wrote.

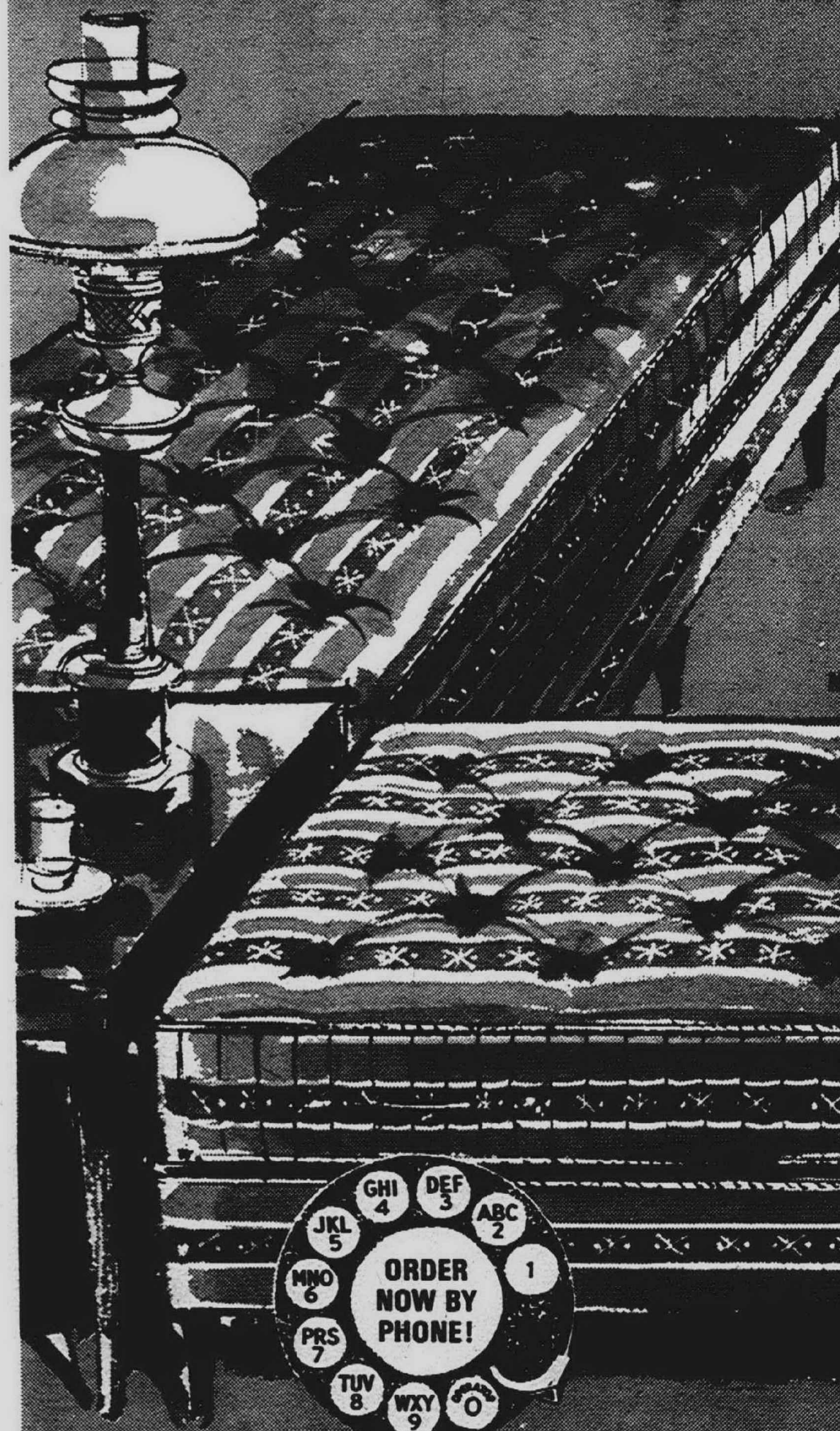

# Drug Experts Testifying Against Clark

By FRED DELANO

MASON — Dr. Ronald E. Clark listened studiously without a trace of outward emotion to three days of testimony this week accusing him of fatal misuse of the barbiturate sodium pentothal as he stood trial in Ingham County Circuit Court on a charge of manslaughter.

The Farmington Township physician, formerly of Redford, has seen a parade of medical witnesses inform the jury as to the drug's dangers, even when used as a carefully controlled anesthetic. Thursday he still sat passively as Dr. Frederick Rieders, director of the City of Philadelphia's Poison Information Center, testified:

"It is my opinion that Grace Neil died from sodium pentothal poisoning, too large a dose having been administered too quickly."

It was the death of Mrs. Sharon E. (Grace) Neil, 43, of 20225 Rensselaer, Livonia, in his Farmington Township clinic at 30735 Grand River last Nov. 3 that triggered the criminal action against Dr. Clark, a practicing physician since 1943.

DR. RIEDERS, who was imported by the prosecution as its No. 1 expert, also testified:

"Sodium pentothal is not a drug that is used in the treatment of any disease. Its major use is to render a person unconscious, or to induce a state of semi-consciousness as a truth serum that causes people to respond to questions."

He also told the jury that exact quantity of a "lethal dose" never has been determined through experimentation, only "after the fact" of a death.

Sodium pentothal, he said, can render a person fully unconscious within 10 to 15 seconds "and it is a matter of judgment on the part of the anesthetist to determine when the patient has had enough."

"I think the dosage given this patient was given in less than an hour, probably in less than half an hour, and perhaps in less than 15 minutes from a bottle flowing freely, not dripping," said Dr. Rieders on the witness stand.

Asked whether sodium pentothal would have a beneficial effect on a person suffering from heart disease, high blood pressure and obesity, he answered, "No."

EARLIER THE JURY heard a witness quote Dr. Clark as having stated he had been treating Mrs. Neil for all three of those specific ailments.

As the trial entered its fourth day Friday, no effort had been made by the prosecution to bring Dr. Clark's record of appearances before the State Licensing Board into evidence.

Neither had there been any reference before the jury to the fact that police and the Oakland County prosecuting attorney still are studying deaths in his office of several other of Dr. Clark's patients besides Mrs. Neil.

Oakland Prosecutor S. Jerome Bronson publicly revealed facts pertaining to both of those phases shortly after Dr. Clark's arrest seven months ago, and the information he supplied was given wide publicity at the time. This is one of the reasons that prompted Defense Attorney Philip Rowston to petition that the trial be moved outside Oakland County.

Mrs. Neil's husband, Sharon, characterized his wife of 22 years as "having always been very healthy until around 1962 or 1963."

He said Dr. Clark suggested at that time she go on a diet, "and from that time on, she didn't seem like the same person."

Although Mrs. Neil has been identified as a "part-time assistant" in Dr. Clark's clinic,

the husband said her duties were on a volunteer basis and "I don't know that she ever received a paycheck." He said she had had no medical training. They had known the physician since about 1949.

THE HUSBAND testified Mrs. Neil had received medical treatment from Dr. Clark for several years, and that many times after being treated with sedatives, she did not come home until the next day.

Neil said that sometimes he drove to the clinic and picked his wife up there and drove her home after treatments, adding:

"I had to practically carry her out to the car a number of times. A lot of times she wouldn't even know how she got home."

Dr. Gaylord Alexander, anesthesiologist at Sinai Hospital in Detroit who was called as an expert prosecution witness, told the jury he had administered sodium pentothal as an anesthetic at least 4,000 times in the last 11 years.

"It is too lethal a drug ever to leave a patient unattended while it is being administered," he stated in answer to a question tracing to other testimony that after Dr. Clark allegedly began the drip-method sodium pentothal treatment of Mrs. Neil Nov. 3 he had left the room for some time.

IT HAS BEEN testified that he sent his wife back to check whether the injection was proceeding properly and that it then was Mrs. Clark who found that Mrs. Neil had died.

"I would think it to be malpractice to leave a patient unattended; an overdose could kill a person," Dr. Alexander declared on the witness stand.

HIGHLIGHTS of earlier testimony included these assertions:

August Kline, of Royal Oak, whose wife had been a patient of Dr. Clark's for more than two years, declared that upon his visit to the clinic about 5:15 p.m. Nov. 3 to pick up medication he had seen Mrs. Neil in her role as office assistant.

Kline said, "She appeared as she normally appeared, sort of haggard and pale."

Dr. Richard E. Olson, pathologist at St. Joseph Hospital in Pontiac, who performed the autopsy, said that his examination showed "the body was of a middle aged woman in a good state of general health."

"The heart was completely normal for a woman her age," said Dr. Olson, "and I found no evidence in the kidneys or heart that she had suffered from high blood pressure. Her weight, which I would estimate at 125 pounds, was about average for her age. I would not consider her obese."

"After examining the body carefully externally, as well as inside the body and head, I was not able to point to anything and say this was the cause of death."

DR. DAVID KUTOB, toxicologist from the crime laboratory of the Michigan Health Department, testified specifically that tests on samples from Mrs. Neil's body showed "death resulted from an overdose of sodium pentothal."

He said these tests were of blood samples received shortly after the autopsy.

"I found the blood contained 3.1 milligrams of sodium pentothal per 100 grams of blood," he told the jury.

He also testified that a recent examination of the brain revealed a concentration of 17.1 milligrams of sodium pentothal per 100 grams adding that the higher concentration was due to the human brain being more absorbent than the bloodstream.
