Gignac said an informal complaint is handled by the investigating officer, responding alone to make an on-site inspection and informing the burner if he is in The chief explained that violation of state and county

> "The fire department ofordinance. The burner will be instructed to extinguish the fire," said Gignac.

He said should the burner refuse to extinguish the fire, the complaint would then be referred to the Wayne County Air Pollution Board for investigation and prosecution under the applicable regulations.

"Upon receipt of a signed formal complaint, the fire department officer will make an on-site investigation," Gignac explained. "The investigation will also reveal if a hazard to life, health or property exists and the burner will be instructed to extinguish the fire.

"The formal complaint would then be referred to the Wayne County Department of Air Pollution for prosecution."

GIGNAC SAID the complaint would then go before a duly constituted court and upon conviction of a violation of the air pollution regulations, a fine of \$100 or 90 days in the county jail, or both may be imposed for each





ITEM NO. I-TOWNSHIP RECREATIONAL PROJECT. The Board ers agreed with the concept of the Recreational Proposal, and it it that baseball diamonds should be the first project. Discussion was held on storm sewer priorities. The following projects were presented: 1. Tonquish Creek sion. 3. George H. Roginson Subdivision. 4. Sheldon Industrial Park. 5. Joy Road Extension, west of Sheldon Road. It was moved by Mr. Millington, supported by Mr. Ash, that Plymouth Gardens Subdivision and George H. on Subdivision be given priority because the sanitary and storm sewers are combined, and because of the pollution factor, those people presently living in these areas should be given first consideration on future projects. It was further stated that the Tonquish Creek Basin should be the second project, and the Sheldon Industrial Park and the Joy Road Extension should be held in abeyance. The motion carried unanimously. Mr. Hamill and Mr. Brender presented agrical views and maps covering Sanitary Sewer and Water projects for the Township, showing water going along N. 



Planking is a method of

serving fish rather than of cooking it. Since the arrangement takes time, planked fish will probably be served only on special occasions. Fish with thick flesh is best suited to planking. Arrange the fish skin down on the plank or platter, sprinkle with salt and pepper, brush with melted butter or French dressing. Bake in a moderate oven for 20 to 30 min., meanwhile preparing two to three vegetables. Arrange a border of mashed potato around the fish when done, making a nest. for each vegetable. Add vegetables, garnish with parsley, and serve.




