



THE BOOTSTRAP approach to improving downtown Plymouth decided upon Saturday with appointment of a group to form a development corporation was inspired in no small part by a big thinking, gung-ho man from St. Clair, Creighton Holden.

On Page One today you can read of the "Commitment to Progress" meeting called by Mayor Jim McKeon which drew nearly 100 townspeople who have a stake in Plymouth's future. It differed from so many similar gatherings through the years because there actually was a commitment, and it was this man Holden who helped show the way.

Holden owns the St. Clair Inn and is a big-wheel in the American Hotel Association and Michigan Tourist Council. Nonetheless, his personal success wasn't enough to prevent his beloved St. Clair from sliding into a business vacuum a decade ago, but his know-how did give him the role of leadership in the resurrection.

"Our town was dying and being boarded up," he recalled to his Plymouth listeners who are seriously concerned about the business decline here. "I would like to tell you that a few enlightened citizens sat down and said, 'Let's build a great city,' but that's not the way it was at all.

"The resistance to change is fantastic, and it was a matter of working out the alternatives. What we had to do was excite the people.

"We put on free 6 a.m. breakfasts for all the city, showed through picture blowups that the alternative to action was death, formed the St. Clair Progress Corp., and tore down a mile of the town, three blocks deep. All that we dreamed of has now come to pass."

"FIRST, YOU HAVE to start with a hell of a lot of pride in your community," declared Holden. "You have to make it an attraction, make it unique. It may be a small town, but you can't stand small thinking. And if someone says, 'Let's put that in committee,' shoot him on the spot."

It was an open letter to his fellow townspeople which Holden wrote in 1963, following a Time Magazine article on vanishing American small towns, which lit the fire under St. Clair thinking and got things started.

He read that letter May 15, 1971, in Plymouth and so much of it fit so well that it may spark fires of interest here, too. Listen to some of it:

"TOO OFTEN HEARD in our town are the defeatest, ignoble phrases, devoid of human dignity, 'It won't work' and 'It's not practical.'

"Accept the premise that a whole new fresh approach is not a dream but the only practical way to go. Old concepts are being shattered all around us every day. Continued on Page 10A

"Establish in our hearts and minds a sense of values and a goal that is worthy of our time and efforts. Let's go first class; none of us will ever get another crack at putting our brains and shoulders together to build a masterpiece.

"It fires the imagination – a boulevard with trees in the median, malls and atmospheric stores and businesses, gaslights, ample parking - all planned so that they will be enhanced with age.

"THE INTERSTATE FREEWAY can be the artery that pumps blood into our business community or the tourniquet that squeezes us into becoming just another small part of sprawling Detroit's suburbia.

"We must remember the people traveling today's expressways are on their way, non-stop to someplace that has created in them desire to by-pass all else to PLYMOUTH get there. Fast highways do not mean progress to the

"Why do people want to go one place over another? Because that place has dared to be different, unique, uncommon. It has atmosphere and charm, it president; Harry McCourt, has better enhanced nature's beauty and gifts than second vice president; John other places, and because the people are warm and

"WE MUST CREATE the magnet that draws. Once here we must create in them a desire to come back and tell their friends of our virtues.


"This is the formula, and if done right no ordinary shopping center or typical city suburb would be able to compete. Many tourists become residents and some bring their plants and offices to their new hometown.

"Techniques, patterns, and methods for doing the job -- yes, and even monies are available. Today's dream can become tomorrow's reality, if we want it badly enough. I do; do you?"

Holden put it just that bluntly to St. Clair in 1963 and got the answer he wanted. He has enough friends here to share the same enthusiasm for Plymouth in 1971. The first step has been taken, but a lot of determination and persistence will be needed on many fronts to bring about the revitalization that is dreamed. The alternative? As Holden put it, death.



Even when it's on baseball rules.

There's something flattering when the phone rings and a Jack Berry or Bill Halls or a Ken Clover seeks advice on how a certain play should be called.

Somehow, they're generally plays that come up in kids' games and for lack of a keen knowledge of the rules, managers and parents sound out the major daily. sports departments in hopes that what they'll hear will make the caller right and the umpire, who rendered 100 YARD: 1 -- Date Helliwell. Time: the controversial decision, wrong

TAKE THE PLAY Halls called about.

Runners on first and third. One out. The catcher TWO MILE: 1 -- Don Anderson. 2 -- Doe tips the bat of the batter and the umpire rightfully calls it interference.

The batter is awarded first base ... and the runner on first naturally has to move up to second. The ump also orders the runner from third to score.

That's where the argument begins. How can the ump permit the run to count under such situations? Simple. That's what the rule says.

SOUTHFIELD'S BERRY, a student of hockey and golf rules, is mystified why no balk was called when the pitcher ... again with runners on third and first ... bluffs a throw to third and then wheels around and picks the runner off first.

"Doesn't he have to throw to third, if he commits himself?" Berry wonders.

No, the pitcher doesn't have to go through with his throw to third. The rule says he MUST throw to first if he makes such a move. But he can bluff all day to second and third, provided that there is a runner on that particular base.

If he bluffs to any base and there's no runner lessons last week. Don Brown, there, it's a balk.

> ENTER THE SCENE Clover, who suddenly has spent night after night digging into the rule book on baseball.

The batter lashes one down the firstbase line. It's Fayroian keeps his receipt a liner which curves foul as it nears the base.

The first baseman, with both his feet in FAIR territory, leans across the foul line and knocks the ball down. Before any further play can be made, the runner has reached first safely. But...the ump calls it a FOUL BALL?

Mr. Clover says: "The ball was touched first by a

fielder in fair ground. So shouldn't it be fair?" If it were football or basketball, the position of the player's feet would determine whether the ball is

inbounds or out. In baseball, the umpire has to judgewhere the ball would drop - fair or foul - and if in his opinion, the ball would have dropped foul, then it's a FOUL, regardless of how far across the line the fielder reached.

BASEBALL DECISIONS, like those in other: sports, can be very interesting.

There's more to an umpire's life than calling strike, ball, out, safe, fair, foul!

What he does often isn't appreciated, because managers, coaches, players and fans don't know why

an ump makes the ruling. True, everybody can't be an expert on all the

baseball rules, but it strikes me that if you're going to run any kind of a team in any league - from the Little League on up, it helps to have a good idea of what the major regulations are.

Like — there's nothing in the rule book that says on an over-throw which goes into the stands, the batter gets one base, plus the one he's going to.

Such an interpretation can produce some inequities and arguments.

What the rule says is that if there's an overthrow and the ball becomes dead, the batter-runner and all other runners advance two bases from the start of An example: Runner is on second. One out. The

ball is hit to the shortstop. The runner stays on second and doesn't move as the shortstop whips the ball wildly past the first baseman and into the dugout. If you deal with that business of "one base, plus

the one he's going to," you'd have to permit the runner on second to go to third and no farther. At the same time, you'd award the batter-runner second

But, the way the official rule reads, since the runner was on second when the play began, he's entitled to score.

After all, if you allow the batter-runner two bases, the same should hold true for any other runners. This makes sense, eh?

IT PAYS TO REMEMBER, that:


• If a fair batted ball bounces over the outfield: fence, the batter-runner is to be allowed only a double, regardless of how distant that fence may be from the plate.

•If a runner from third tries to steal home with less than two outs and the batter interferes with the ; catcher, the runner from third is out. If there are two outs, then the batter is out. The ump renders the call that can hurt the most.

•No run ever can score on a play in which the batter-runner is ruled out for failing to arrive safely at first or any other runner might be called out on an appeal play for missing a base on a forceout. This ruling has been known to nullify two and three runs and produce a flock of arguments.

There's no way you can win a protest over the calling of a pitch, whether the ball is fair or foul whether the runner is out or safe. The ONLY time you can rightfully protest is when an umpire messes up a rule interpretation. When he goofs up on judgment, too bad. He always wins.

And, say it goes. There'll be more of these renditions on baseball rules later in the summer.

give all persons over the age of 18 the right to make contracts, draw up wills, place bets at race tracks, make their own medical decisions and be parties to legal actions.

In short, this age group would be asked to assume the full rights and responsibilities of an adult.

The only important right not covered by the bill was the right to vote in state-local elections. Michigan's Legislature has voted for ratification of an amendment to the U.S. Constitution to allow that.

"WHAT WE WERE saving is that they (18 to 21-year-olds) can be held responsible for criminal acts and can be drafted and sent to war." Stempien said. "However, when it comes to making a contract or making a will, they can't do these and other things necessary to get along in our society.'

Stempien said he voted for the age of majority bill to increase the responsibility of this age group and to resolve the contradiction in current

But Young and Tierney said that including a lower drinking age in the bill will nave serious repercussions. Both voted for an amendment that would have kept the drinking age and the age for placing bets at 21.

Though Baker could not be reached for comment, he also voted against the final bill and for the amendment.

YOUNG SAID a poll of school superintendents showed 56 per cent opposed to any change in the drinking age and another 38 per cent opposed to lowering it to 18.

"I think it will create problems with the 16 and 17year-olds," he said. "I think they have found this to be true in New York State. When you turn 18, you will stay with your peers, and I think this will result in alcohol circulating in high schools."

Tierney expressed similar concerns, adding he is afraid this age group will "mix gas and alcohol."

"I voted 'no' because I most sincerely believe that House Bill 4584 is not in the best interests of the young people of the state or the motoring public of our state." Tierney told the floor of the House last

Later he said that making liquor more easily available to youths would result in a carry over to 16 and 17-year-olds and increased drinking and driving.

**CEILING BEAMS** BENNETT VOTED for the amendment to keep a higher legal drinking age, but, when it lost, decided to vote in favor

of the bill. "I had reservations abou that (a lower drinking agen! he said, "But we tried to stop drinking by prohibition, and it didn't work. I think they are

going to drink anyways." "I feel if these young then can fight and die for their country, they are entitled to all other rights," he added. Stempien said he hair "seen any basis in fact" that persons in this age group are

not responsible enough to purchase liquor legally. It is contradictory to say that "for making his last will and testament a person is responsible, but for a person to drink in public he is not,"

Stempien said. "Either they are respon-

sible or they are not. "ALL THE DRINKING

laws say is they may not purchase and have liquor in public. There is no prohibition against minors drinking. They can drink in their homes now — they just can't drink in public," said Stempien.

Agreeing, Forbes said, "If we are going to instill confidence in our youth we have to give them responsibility."

# The Perennial Bed Is A True Work Of Art

Perennials are the joy and delight of the gardener. The tender green leaves of daylilies spreading an emerald carpet, or the bright ruby stalks of peonies pushing white shasta daisies, bright through the moist soil are the essence of spring's rejuvenation. The wonder and magic are renewed each year as perennials come alive and grow again from roots that have lain dormant all winter in the frozen ground.

They are fun to work with because there are so many different kinds of perennials. Most bloom for only a few weeks, but it is a stimulating challenge to select an array of plants that will provide a sequence of bloom from early spring until late fall.

The gardener uses his creativity and artistry to blend this array of plants into a garden picture that is an expression of his individuality. A beautiful perennial bed is not only an out the little tender plants, but indication of the gardener's this is a good time to divide and skill and knowledge, but it is a transplant perennials. true work of art.

THE SEASON begins when the new shoots appear and the first blooms can come almost as early. Bright golden alyssum, candy-tuft with clusters of snowflake blooms, pink and purple creeping phlox, primroses, columbine, dainty forget-me-nots. bleeding heart and Virginia bluebells can be combined with spring bulbs or used to enhance the beauty of flowering trees and shrubs.







# Suburbs Depend On Auto Industry

By Philip H. Power

Whether we like it or not, our suburbs are directly dependent for their economic health on the state of the automobile industry. When it's going well, employment is up, people are spending money, orders are flowing, executives are meeting their debt service payments, fish are jumpin' and the cotton is high. The reverse happens when the auto industry is in trouble.

Unfortunately for our economy, the industry took a long strike last fall and is still in the middle of a drive to compete against imported cars made abroad, where labor is cheaper. Even more of concern in the long run is what appears to be a sustained attack launched against the auto industry by a diverse group of people.

Safety experts are pushing development of various devices which the auto companies say will help save lives but will also raise the price of cars.

Senator Hart is hot to get better bumpers, and the Federal government has laid down minimum standards for auto pollution.

Even recent polls have suggested that the American male's affair with his automobile -- a romance that goes back to the Model T and carries as many Freudian overtones as any other romance - is fading.

And, of course, there is always Ralph Nader.


FOR A LONG time, the auto industry reacted to these pressures by elephantine methods: It ignored them.

But in recent months, the big three automakers have started to

react in much more constructive ways to consumer complaints. Each has launched programs designed to speed up handling of beefs related to safety, pollution, product quality and service.

Ford has started a "We listen better" campaign, and has been encouraging customers to write to corporate headquarters with complaints or suggestions about their cars. The company has also established a new customer service division to improve its service operation.

General Motors has started an experimental program enabling consumers in the Chicago area to call Detroit toll-free to make their complaints direct; the complaint is relayed to the regional service office nearest the customer and a local representative visits the customer and his dealer to solve the problem.



**AUTO CRITICS**, predictably, have viewed these efforts with something close to cynicism.

Auto sources claim the reverse. A Chrysler official said of the critics, "They should come here and see what we're doing."

The public reaction seems, on the whole, positive. Chrysler's "Man in Detroit" program has been receiving about 400 letters and 100 phone calls a day; Ford has been somewhat more vague. but notes that it has received

"thousands" of letters; at GM. the volume has been somewhat lower than expected, around 100 a day.

Although cynicism may be in order, given the past history of the auto companies, at least they have shown they are willing to take steps to listen to people.

Obviously, this is a good start. If it helps the auto makers improve their credibility and their products, it can only help us in the suburbs.

# No Secrecy About Public Meetings

Dallas Goss, president of the Plymouth Education Association which represents teachers in the Plymouth School District, has taken our Editor Fred Delano and School Supt. James Rossman to task for reports coming from a meeting of the school board on a Saturday morning several weeks

The points at hand are that Delano was not notified of the public meeting and that he was able to learn what transpired in an interview with Supt. Rossman.

Goss, in his President's Letter published in the PEA publication Plymouth Educator, writes:

"THE USE of the careers of educators as ammunition for taking a bead on the school board by the local newspapers is reprehensible. For the sake of the teachers involved, would that the sniper had to help conduct the classes involved through to the end of the school year.

"The press seems to be piqued, to put it mildly, over the board's decision to change the date of its next meeting. As president of the Plymouth Education Association, I have not missed a school board meeting as a result of its being changed to another day. In fact the vice president of the board informed me two days before April 10 that another date was being considered. . . ''

Then his column continues, "Another important consideration was the nearness of the deadline for notification for reemployment to probationary

teachers in compliance with the Michigan Tenure Act.

"The information pertinent to this situation that appeared on the front page of the local newspaper was not released by board

"It is unfortunate that the superintendent of schools felt obliged to unkennel the details of the board's deliberations. The board functions under Robert's Rules of Order which dictate that minutes of any meeting are submitted for approval and correction at the next regularly scheduled meeting which would have been April 27.

"The board's practice and only requirements have been to approve minutes every 30 days at the first board meeting of the month. The next date for this to have been done was May 10."

GOSS THEN GOES on to point out that the minutes of the meeting were released in detail three days after the meeting although the board approval wouldn't have been until May 10.

Then he continues:

"Unlike another editor in Plymouth, the Educator does not consider itself to be the spokesman of the Almighty, nor to be above, the laws governing the conduct of school boards in the state of Michigan and the rulings of the Supreme Court of this state with respect to those laws.

"Our purpose is to present a view of events to the public, as one possible interpretation and

"Point 2 — Not having one's contract renewed is a traumatic experience at best. For a young family man, it is a personal disaster. To compound this disaster by stating erroneously that they had been fired in large letters across the front page of the local paper is inexcusable.

"There is a dividing line between the public's right to public knowledge and the public servant's right to privacy in his professional life. The privacy of five individuals was invaded in such a way that chances of employment and growth in their profession has seriously been impaired."

If it wanted to hide behind the usual "executive session," it had the prerogative. But it didn't choose that route. Apparently the board members acted as they saw fit, in a public meeting, and it was duly reported by the board's spokesman.

As to waiting 30 days for approval of the minutes before reporting actions of a meeting. . .please, Mr. Goss, we can't believe anyone could make a statement like that. Actions of public meetings become public property at once.

That's why reporters are in attendance; that's why the public attends, that's why Mr. Goss is present to report back to the PEA. It may be all right for Mr. Goss to preside over closed PEA meetings but school boards aren't exactly in the same category.

#### Teachers On School Boards?

Each Law Day, the barristers puff themselves up and proclaim: 'Ours is a government of law, not

They're essentially right, but I would amend their cliche to say: 'Ours is a government of law, not of ethics."

For we are in the season again when candidates are announting for board of education posts. There being no law to prohibit it, and ethics being irrelevant, we find that a number of these candidates are persons who teach school in other districts.

For immediate examples: James Melosh, who teaches in the Claranceville district, is running for the Livonia board; Donald M. Hanson, who teaches in Livonia, and Edwin Blasyk, who teaches in

NO ONE IS saying they're inept or dishonest. No one is saying they're violating the law. But I do suggest their candidacies demonstrate a certain moral obtuseness, a certain insensitivity to the ethical principle called "conflict of interest."

Nearly all teachers these days are unionized, mostly under the Michigan Education Assn., some under the American Federation of Teachers. Those unions get local officials together to plot out strategy on a regional basis.

The school boards (stockholders) have their get-togethers, too, and hear talks from prominent legal eagles on how to deal with the teachers unions.

The conflict is clear: A school board member who is also a teacher could learn the latest management stratagems, then pass them on to his union.

Before the teacher unionists burn me in effigy, let me point out that the conflict of interest could work the other way: An Anti-union teacher could pass on strategic information to the school board on which he serves.

HERE'S A practical case: The board and union in school district "A" agree to set salaries

based on the average in several neighboring districts. A teacher in district "A" is a school board member in district "B". He therefore has something material to gain by voting for high salaries in "B".

Similar conflicts can occur over settling of grievances.

Teachers like to argue that they can make great contribulions to the political process. And they can-on city councils, in the Legislature, in political parties. But they shouldn't be on school

Even their favorite argument--that they have some expertise in school matters--can be turned against them. If you get a board that has too much first-hand knowledge of schools-as we have at Schoolcraft College-then the board can begin second-guessing and interfering with the administration.

There's much to be said for a board that's a little on the dumb and innocent side.

### Avocado Has Flavor All Its Own

By ELLY

The avocado or alligator pear is a native of Central and South America but our supply comes from the southern states. Our chief source is from the avocado orchards along the Rio Grande though they are cultivated from Florida to California.

For salads, dips or desserts, they add a flavor all their own.

To prevent discoloration always peel or mash with a stainless steel utensil and sprinkle with fresh lemon juice or a weak cider solution.

And don't discard the pit. It will produce a lush green foliage when rooted. Stick three toothpicks into the pit to suspend the top above water in a glass. When the roots appear, plant in soil and place in a sunny window. It will require frequent watering.

#### GUACAMOLE

- 1 large ripe avocado.
- 2 t. fresh lemon juice 1 t. chili powder
- 1 garlic clove, crushed 2 T. mayonnaise

Peel the avocado and remove the seed. Mash the pulp until smooth and creamy. Add lemon juice and mix well.

Add chili powder, garlic and mayonnaise. Add salt to taste. Serve with potato or corn

STUFFED AVOCADO RINGS

- 1 avocado
- 1 small pkg. cream cheese 1 t. heavy cream
- 1 t. onion juice

Cut avocado in half crosswise to remove pit. Peel | Ham..... carefully. Blend cream cheese, cream and onion juice. Pack this mixture into the cavity of the avocado. Brush cut surfaces with lemon juice to prevent discoloration. Place two halves together and chill. When ready to serve slice in rings about 1/3-inch thick. These may be used as a garnish around a platter of cold meats or as a salad on a lettuce leaf and topped with French dressing.

#### **CHICKEN-AVOCADO SALAD**

2 c. finely chopped cold, cooked chicken 12 c. finely chopped celery

Salt and pepper

- 1 T. fresh lemon juice Hot pepper sauce (just a dash)
- 12 c. mayonnaise 2 large ripe avocados 2 hard cooked eggs, sliced
- Combine all ingredients

except avocados and eggs. Halve avocados and remove the pits. Scoop out the pulp and reserve the shells. Dice pulp and add to the chicken mixture. Fill shells with the mixture and top with egg slices. Serves four.

#### **AVOCADO LIME PIE**

1 large ripe avocado 1 can sweetened condensed milk (14 ounces) Grated rind of 1 lime 12 c. fresh lime juice 2 egg yolks

1 baked 9-inch pie shell

Dash of salt

Chopped nuts

Mash the avocado well. Combine the sweetened condensed milk, lime rind, lime juice, well beaten egg yolks and salt. Stir until the mixture thickens. Fold in the mashed avocado. Turn into the baked pastry shell and chill for several hours. Sprinkle with chopped nuts.

#### **LUNCHEON SALAD**

1 large avocado 2 grapefruit 2 or 3 oranges. Romaine lettuce Bing cherries

Makes six servings.

Chill fruit. Peel avocado then remove pit and cut into thin slices. Peel and divide oranges and grapefruit into sections Arrange grapefruit sections and avocado slices alternately on a bed of lettuce.

Overlap two sections of orange at each side. Garnish with several black Bing cherries. Top with dressing made of sour cream and chopped Macadamia nuts. Serves five or six.


