# Graves Tops School Voting; Penar, Ohno Also Victorious

A systems engineer, a Livonia faculty member, and a researcher won seats on the Plymouth Board of **Education Monday after only 14 per** cent of the district's voters turned

John C. Graves, director of student activities at Livonia's Franklin High School, took the highest number of votes in the contest for two four-year terms and was followed closely by Fredrick M. Penar, an engineer with Bendix Aerospace Division in Ann Arbor.

John M. Ohno, who is employed in research and development by General Electric, ran a consistently top race to win the two year unexpired term vacated by R. Bruce Scott.

Penar and Graves were present at the board meeting when results came in at about 8:45 p.m.

All three winners had been endorsed by the Plymouth Education Association (PEA). The PEA now has a four out of five record since one of their two endorsees, John Hanskat, won a seat last year.

OF THE 1,759 votes cast, Graves took 1,200, Penar 1,113 and Ohno

Paul Huyck ran third in the contest for the four-year terms with 620 votes and Winton Kloosterman trailed with 365.

Penar, of 8414 Forrest Drive, and Graves of 11330 Russel, will replace board members Ned Stirton and Donald Tripp who decided not to seek reelection.

President of the Fiegel School PTA, Penar holds a bachelor's and master's degree in physics from the University of Michigan. He is the assistant cubmaster in the Cub Scouts and is a member of the Community School Council. He has three children.

chosen by the Livonia Jaycees as the outstanding young man of 1970 for his youth work and as one of the five outstanding young men in Michigan.

He has 12 years experience in teaching and holds a bachelor's degree from Michigan State University and a master's from Eastern Michigan University.

OHNO HELD an edge over opponents Mrs. Kathleen Williams and Thomas Fidge Jr. in all of the precincts. Mrs. Williams finished with 607 votes and Fidge followed with 180.

### Asparagus Patch Needs Fertilizer


Asparagus plants provide abundant yields if fertilized properly, points out a Michigan State University horticulturist.

"To maintain good spear production, asparagus plants need fertilizer application during late June," says Robert Herner. "If fertilizer is applied at this time, the roots have a chance to store it

Use a complete fertilizer for your home asparagus-patch, Herner recommends. Complete fertilizers include 5-10-10, 5-10-5, 6-24-12, or 10-10-10. Apply 21/2 to three pounds per 100 square feet of garden

Herner recommends a soil test every two years to accurately determine fertilizer and lime needs. Contact the county Cooperative Extension Service office for more information about soil testing.

There is still time to plant bulbs of glads, cannas and dahlias for summer bloom ... Bordeaux misture will control stem rot and other diseases on delphinium ... Leaf hoppers and plant bugs on Moraine, Skyline and other locust trees can be controlled with sevin.

# College Budget **Hearing Set**

Schoolcraft College's \$6.1 president and the board of million projected operating trustees. budget will be up for public scrutiny at a public hearing at

7 p.m. Wednesday, June 23. Details on the projected budget will not be released until later this week but the board of trustees had approved a tentative operating budget in the amount of \$6,131,327 in April.

The projected budget is nearly 10 per cent over the \$5.6 million budget for the current school year. It is based on a projected student enrollment of 5,950 - an increase of 254 (or 12.5 per cent) students over this year's enrollment of 5,296.

The board of trustees held a final study session on the budget last week and the college's business staff met for a full day Monday to prepare the final budget for the public hearing.

college began preparation of the budget in December and since then it has traveled a snake-like course for review by an administrative committee, the vice-presidents, the budget review committee, the college

Included in the budget will be the cost for the Sept. 13 millage election. The college is asking an added one-half mill for operating purposes and another one-half mill for general purposes in the election.

> IF STEMPIEN'S bill passed this week without further amendments, it would authorize the college apportionment commissions to draw up districts for each college district and then the commissions and college boards would vote on which method to use by May 15, 1972.

The community college apportionment commissions are to be made up of the county clerk, county treasurer, prosecuting attorney, and the statutory county chairman of each of the two main political parties.

However the public could have the matter put to a referendum by circulating petitions and asking for an election date to be set/within 30 days of the May 15 deadline.

But prior to a final vote, the bill could be amended by Tierney requiring that a public election be mandatory, according to Stempien. Stempien said that he agreed to that compromise with Tierney though he does not approve of the Legislature mandating people to use public funds for an election.

If the bill passes, it will not affect the plans for a Sept. 13 election Schoolcraft, Stempien said.

Depending on action taken in the committee, Tierney's bill would probably not upset the election plan either.

Tierney opposes the November odd year elections because he said he "hates to see our schools put in a political realm that can do nothing but hurt the kids.

Stempien's bill also calls for odd-year November elections.

# Strikes By Public Employes Run Grave Public Risks

Local school officials in the suburbs and elsewhere are doing some hard thinking these days about bargaining new contracts with teachers and other school system employes.

The bargaining this year has been seriously complicated by the fact that the State Legislature dilly-dallied in a thoroughly irresponsible way over just what the state aid formula for local education would be for the coming fiscal year. As a result. local districts had no clear idea about how much money they would be getting from Lansing, and accordingly had no way of determining in advance what their limits in contract bargaining might be.

It would come as no surprise to many local school officials if there were strikes in some districts in this area come school openings this fall. This, despite the theoretical legal prohibition against strikes by public employes legal in the sense that state law forbids them, and theoretical because most public employe unions have discovered they have more to gain by going ahead and striking and daring the courts and the public bodies that employ them to do their worst. Who, for example, is going to assume responsibility for firing all the teachers in Livonia's sprawling school system if they have to turn around the next day and hire an entire replacement staff?

THE ISSUE OF public employes having the right to strike is a tangled one. My guess is that if they have the right to bargain collectively, they ought to have some means of demonstrating effectively their displeasure at an inadequate contract offer, even though I am very bothered at the idea that this interrupts certain vital public services.

Earlier this summer, for example, the sanitation workers in Detroit refused to work any overtime until the city promised to restore jobs to some workers laid off during the usual budget crisis. Garbage piled up in mounds enormous even for Detroit and city officials worried aloud over the health hazard caused by the exploding rat population.

For the city, the argument was clear: There was no money available to spend on re-hiring the workers laid off, and overtime was necessary to get the garbage picked up. The union's position was equally simple: As long as the city is going to pay overtime to catch up with the garbage collection, they might as well use that money to hire more people.

The real losers in that strike were plain folks who found their alleys and back yards piled with foot upon foot of smelly garbage.

AT ABOUT THE same time.

the news was full of another kind of strike by public workers which took place in New York City.

Members of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employes staged a two-day walkout which resulted in 700 million gallons of raw sewage spewing into the waterways, closure of garbage incinerators, stoppage of school lunches for needy children and - with the cooperation of a Teamster local disruption of 24 bridges leading into the city, causing traffic jams which we don't see here even at the interchanges at rush hour.

The strike was called not over the inadequacy of a contract offer from New York City. Rather it was explicitly designed to put political pressure on the State Legislature to ratify a generous pension offer previously negotiated between the city and union.

The strike backfired, mainly because of public outrage and press comment. "It would have been an obscenity to capitulate," said one New York state solon. "So far as the public was concerned, shooting at dawn would have been too mild a punishment."

This was a totally political strike, undertaken not as part of the collective bargaining process but as a crass pressure play to blackjack the State Legislature into buying a pension plan. It was entirely irresponsible.


THE ONLY PEOPLE who suffered were the public, and the public had no organized pressure group to represent their interests.

As a New York cab driver I talked with during the strike said, "Those SOBs gonna try to get their slice now. Well, if they get it, it'll come out of my hide, and our union can just turn around and strike over a wage increase for us."

In such cases, it should be clear that nobody - organized into a union or unorganized - benefits. Costs go up, and everyone pays eventually.

But the New York experience ought to be a sobering one to us in Michigan. If a strike can be called in New York for totally political purposes, entirely unrelated to contract bargaining, it could happen in Michigan. What, for example, would happen if Michigan policemen organizations decided to strike to force the State Legislature into upping state support to local police departments?

There must be a better way to protect the interests of public employes and the public bodies that employ them without exposing the public at large to the threat of political strikes. Sooner or later the Legislature and the courts will have to confront this problem, and it might as well be sooner, before somebody really gets hurt.

### When Is Right Time To Hand Out Boosts?

# Baseball Tournament. JC Carnival Mistreated

On behalf of the Optimist Club of Livonia, I am issuing a strong protest against the city allowing the Jaycees to put on a carnival at the site of the Les Anders baseball tournament.

The Optimist Club has for several years co-sponsored the Les Anders Memorial Baseball Tournament at Livonia's Ford Field.

This year, the tournament has been played under conditions which were intolerable. A first-class baseball tournament has been effectively destroyed by the apparent small-town decisionmaking process still used in Livonia. I gladly grab the opportunity to get all the closets cleaned out-and the girls can't wait to get there and browse.




She didn't. But she did come home with a paperback book that I'm sure was in the pile that went from our house to the sale.


