ONE DOESN'T realize how sensitive some of our citizens are, or how wide the gulf is between conflicting viewpoints on this matter of continuing charterprescribed prerequisites of two-year residency and property ownership for holding elective office in Plymouth, until he declares himself as openly opposed to both.

Good Heavens, immediate reaction of some to my expressed hope that these provisions of the charter be ruled unconstitutional in next month's federal court case was as if I had defiled Plymouth's most sacred pretense, the one which asserts that it was really here that those Pilgrims landed 351 years ago and not at a suburb of Cape Cod.

Those who would defend the existing charter argue that no one should participate in municipal decisions until proving his or her worthiness by longevity as a resident, backed by the feudal theory that only the landed gentry are qualified to belong to the ruling class.

In my view, there are some interesting developments which tend to prove the nonsense of that approach and which bolster the idea that any registered voter is qualified to be a candidate for office.

PLYMOUTH USES as its motto a phrase which reads, "The City of Homes," which is nice and genteel in the best all-white suburban sense, but it doesn't portray the change taking place in the city's population, which went from 8,766 in 1960 to 11,758 in Net-Up For Half

Just drive around this town and you will see that multiple dwellings have sprouted everywhere except in the neighborhoods of the financially elite. Some of these renters live in old houses that have been converted into two or more flats, while others are in larger apartment buildings - with many more still to come in keeping with the realization that the only way Plymouth can grow is up.

Let me give you a couple of statistics. During the first six months of 1971, building permits valued at \$115,000 were issued for new single-family houses in the city. In the same January-through-June period, construction was authorized for \$905,000 in new multiple-family dwellings!

Reports from the girls of Welcome Wagon show \$1.52 on 18,371,109 average impressively that two of every three new families moving here from every which point of the compass are buying their own homes, but does this mean that the minority 33 1/3 per cent of renters must be disen-outstanding. franchised of their voices on the local political scene? If you are one of the conservatives who say yes, then you and I read the United States Constitution through different bifocals.

ALL OF THIS is more timely than you may realize. Junction Truck Route Ban To Be Enforced

It took public hearings Monday night on proposed paving of Junction and Karmada Streets to reveal that their frequent use by heavy trucks as a short-cut across the northern edge of Plymouth is in violation of the city ordinance defining through truck routes.

Owners of property along the two streets objected strenuously to the concrete traffic of trucks serving inreconstruction proposed by the city, many of the Junction is permissible, but arguments centering on the complaint that deterioration has been brought on by unauthorized truck traffic.

Because of the industrial usage, residents forcefully demanded that they be given relief in the special assessments if the streets are repaved. In this they received backing from several commissioners-although no final action was taken.

In fact, because only four commissioners were present. it was decided to keep both hearings open for the Aug. 16 meeting when the necessity of the two projects will be decided. Assessment ratios would be determined at another session even subsequent to that one. IT WAS mutually un-







"WHY COULDN'T the schools permit such things as clubs (for want of a better word) to set themselves up in business?" he asked.

"As an example, we could build tool sheds for the backyards of families with overcrowded garages. We could use the schools in the summer time when the equipment otherwise is laying idle. We could put market research students to work, have our own salesmen, then our own architects and workmen to build the building."

He pointed out that the schools could lease their equipment to these clubs during evening hours after school or all through the summer and thus help to defray the cost.

"And what would happen if you couldn't market your product?" The Stroller asked -

"Then we'd get an actual course in bankruptcy and that would be part of our education "

The House reinstated a tax credit system whereby if property taxes exceed a certain level, residents will be allowed to deduct a percentage of the property tax from their state income tax payment.

Persons who are renting could also apply for the tax credit using 17 per cent of their rent as the estimated property tax payment.

Another provision would allow the tax to lapse after one year if the public has not voted on a proposal to grant some type of property tax relief.

IF THE SENATE concurs this week with the House version on the increase, the bill could be passed and into effect next week.

An appropriation of \$250,000 is included in the bill to finance the emergency work needed to implement the increase.

The state anticipates about \$250 million in new revenue from the increase which will be channeled into areas such as education and welfare.



Their attack may cause locust to completely drop all its foliage during mid to late summer. This is the worst damage the leafhopper causes.

The insect overwinters in the egg stage and the nymphs appear when tree leaves reach full maturity. The nymphs as well as the adults suck the juices to cause damage.

A spray made up of two tablespoons of 50 per cent Sevin wettable powder per gallon of water is used to control the leafhopper. A mixture of two teaspoons of 57 per cent Malathion emulsion per gallon of water can also be used. For best results spray the foliage thoroughly.





Landscape Planned For Easy Maintenance

By BETTY FRANKEL

Do you wish that your yard cover rather than formal were covered with green concrete? By mid-summer many a gardener wishes he not wooded part of the area didn't have so much lawn to that is normally carefully and so many flower beds to meadow that will have a beauty.

A few homeowners in the area have tried covering large parts of their yard with green gravel, or white marble chips. or fist-sized natural stones, but almost invariably a disaster area has resulted. The gardening work may have been eliminated but the garden seems to have been eliminated, too.

What is needed is a happy medium with chores cut to a minimum but some plants to provide verdant freshness, a soft texture, pleasant variations in height, attractive color, and oxygen to counteract air pollution.

A recently published book, "The Low-Upkeep Book of Lawns and Landscape" by McDonald and Lawrence Power (Hawthorn Books Inc. N.Y. 1971) offers some suggestions for reducing garden work.

THE AUTHORS point out that the glass window walls of modern houses have made the outdoors an integral part of our interior living so the yard can't be neglected or overlooked.

Their suggestions for low up-keep landscaping include keeping the plan simple and clean-lined. There is still plenty of scope for interesting design and for flair and individuality of style, as the many illustrations in the book indicate.

It is suggested that the lawn area be restricted and reduced in size as much as possible. On a very small lot grass can even be eliminated entirely. In place of lawn they suggest extending patios, decks, and terraces out from the living areas of the house. Materials should be durable and easy to maintain. Use brick, stone, concrete or wood. A combination of deck and patio adds interest and can provide for changes in level to make a more varied and pleasing design.

REMOVE A circle of grass from around the base of trees and fill with gravel or a ground cover. Several trees can be included in a larger free-form island. Use ground covers, too, on steep slopes, in shady areas, or in wet soil.

Use mulches or ground covers in shrubbery beds to keep weeds down. Mulches that are suggested include gravel, wood chips, or shredded bark. Put plastic sheeting under the mulch.

To cut down on edging chores use a barrier strip to keep grass from invading shrub or flower beds. Also make a mowing strip along the edge of beds or walls. The wheel of the mower can ride on the strip and it can then cut close to the edge eliminating hand trimming.

McDONALD and Power suggest relying on flowering shrubs, spring bulbs, and few hardy perennials for flowers in the garden. For summer color they suggest growing some annuals in portable containers so color can be had where you want it when you want it.

The authors of this useful little book also recommend installing an automatic sprinkler system. It will eliminate much work and the authors claim that it uses less water than conventional systems whereby you move when you remember to.

Another approach to low maintenance is taken by Cory Kilvert in his book "Gardens and Grounds that Take Care of Themselves" (Macmillan 1969). This is a book that suggests leaving property in its natural state. If the lot is



Integration In The Suburbs: The President's Approach

By Philip H. Power

"We will not seek to impose economic integration upon an existing local jurisdiction; at the same time, we will not countenance any use of economic measures as a subterfuge for racial discrimination."

Long words. Legally weighed words. President Nixon's words. spoken recently to state the administration's policy with respect to racial integration of the suburbs.

What do they mean and what do they suggest about the future of the suburbs?

Basically, what the president meant was that while the administration will not accept housing patterns which explicitly seek to keep black people out of the suburbs or even those which by snob zoning are intended to do the same thing through the back door, the government will not force a high income suburb to have low income housing. In other words, while racial discrim-- ination is out for the suburbs. economic discrimination is OK.

THIS IS A popular position with most people who live in the suburbs.

The idea that all suburban dwellers were so bigoted they could not possibly stand the idea of a black family, no matter how well off, living in their neighborhood is clearly the creation of center city newspaper and TV people who don't live in the suburbs and know nothing about

A survey conducted by this newspaper on the second anniversary of the 1967 Detroit riot showed clearly that most folks in the suburbs were willing to have black families living next door, so long as they were wealthy enough to buy a nice house. mow the lawn, behave in acceptably middle class ways, and not lower the property values. But the survey also suggested that folks here in the suburbs were not about to put up with public housing or low income zoning which they felt would lower both the social tone and property values of their neighborhood.

. What our survey suggested was borne out loud and clear by the rumpus stirred up last fall in Warren, when former Governor and now Housing and Urban **Development Secretary George** Romney seemed to say that his department was going to withold federal low income housing money from suburban communities to try to force racial integration.

Romney got away from Warren with his scalp still in one piece; but probably the incident had a lot to do with his wife's bad showing in her race against Sen. Philip A. Hart.

THE PROBLEM I've got with the president's statement is that while it sets a lot of suburban minds at ease, it does very little to help out people in the big center cities.

For about 20 years now, the

pattern has been clear. Rich people (generally white) have been moving out of the center cities to live in the cool, clean suburbs, leaving poor people (generally black) to stay in the hot, dirty center city. This, in turn, both lowers the tax base center cities use to support their services and increases the demands on those very services.

The result has been the progressive deterioration of the center cities.

And if you accept the idea that the suburbs are functionally dependent on the center cities (and vice versa), you've got to be worried that at some point the deterioration process will go so far as to very seriously affect the quality of life as we know it now in the suburbs.

For example, if the process I have described above continues in the Detroit area, the center city will get poorer and poorer (and blacker and blacker), and at some point life in the city will get so grim that the only way people will be able to get through the streets is in an armed personnel carrier.

PRESIDENT NIXON seems to be saying that he really doesn't know what to do about the big cities, but that he hopes that as time goes on, enough people living there (generally black) will come to make enough money to afford to live in the (generally white) suburbs.

I suppose that in the long run

the president may be right (although he seems to be ignoring the implication that if the process he hopes for actually happens, the big cities will eventually have no population at all.) But as the

famous economist John Maynard Keynes said, "In the long run, we are all dead."

I hope the president's long run view of the future of the center cities is not that long.

Will Secret Witness Fund Solve Hit-Run Death?

Almost two months ago, Chris Beattie, a senior at Bentley High in Livonia, was run down and killed while walking alongside the road on Henry Ruff. . . and the driver sped away and hasn't been heard of since.

The fatal mishap happened in late afternoon in broad daylight, and thus far the identity of the hit-and-run killer is unknown.

It seems strange that a person could be run down and killed in broad daylight, and at this moment no witness has stepped forward to give Livonia police the information they need to wrap up the case.

The bereaved parents have made appeals, the police have asked for assistance, this newspaper has expressed an opinion more than once that witnesses should make known any facts they have on the case. . . none has had the courage to do this. Of course, they must know in their own hearts that they are protecting a killer. We can't understand why.

NOW THE QUESTION has come up: "Will a witness or witnesses be willing to give their information for cash?

'Will they step forward under the provisions of a Secret Witness program in which the names of the informers are kept secret and a reward of \$1,000 cash is paid upon arrest and conviction of the hit-and-run driver?"

Is a cash reward needed to ferret out the guilty party? It appears to be a sad commentary on residents of the community involved and the City of Livonia that such a step has to be taken, but William Beattie, father of the dead girl, feels it is the only

That's why Beattie personally is offering \$1,000 through the Secret Witness route as the only means of solving the case.

THE OBSERVER Newspapers and Livonia police are joining in the program. Letters may be sent to the Observer and the

information will be forwarded to the police.

The Secret Witness format will be the same as that used in other newspapers in the area and throughout the land.

The informer must write or type the information and send the letter to Secret Witness, Box 333, Observer Newspapers. 36251 Schoolcraft Road, Livonia, 48150.

The only identification necessary is a six digit number on one corner of the letter. The writer must write the number twice in the corner, tear off one corner with the number and leave the second portion on the letter. It must be torn off since the torn part must fit identically in the corner of the letter. It can't be cut but must be torn.

There can't be any other identification. No phone number, no address, no names. Nothing but the letter with the corner torn off and a six-digit number.

THE CASH HAS been deposited in a local bank, and cash will be paid to the informer, with no identity required after the arrest and conviction.

The Secret Witness award will be available for three months after which Beattie will withdraw his offer.

The sad, grieving parents have made a written appeal to witnesses to make their facts known. The Beatties aren't wealthy but are willing to pay the \$1,000 to relieve their minds of the tremendous pressures since the fatal mishap.

The letter reads:

"WE APPEAL TO anyone who has any knowledge of the hitand-run driver who struck and killed our Christine on Henry Ruff near Nye on June 1 to please call the Livonia Police or the Observer Newspapers.

"We do not understand how anyone could live with the knowledge that they struck and

injured someone and left her by the side of the road to die. Neither do we understand how the driver's friends or family, who must have some suspicions, can remain silent.

'This was like a flower bud ready to burst into bloom. Chris had just turned 18, was ready to graduate from Bentley High as an honor student, looking forward to a summer job, a car of her own and the future with so much enthusiasm. To have her struck down from behind with no chance to save herself is still unbelieveable.

"The almost two months since the fatal accident have been very long for us. Why God needed Chris now we do not know. I only pray we can accept his judgment."

With an appeal like that and the grieving parents willing to pay \$1,000 for the much needed information, why can't witnesses answer their prayers?





At Cranbrook, Kids Learn By Doing

Public Can View Science, Arts, Gardens And Church

Six separate institutions, tied together by grounds and a common foundation, make up Cranbrook, covering 300 acres in Bloomfield Hills. This educational and cultural center with entrances on Lone Pine Road was founded by the late George G. Booth and named for a village in Kent, England, ancestral home of the Booth family.

Cranbrook is primarily active in the fields of science, education, religion and art. The philosophy-"Kids learn by doing"-spills over into the open-to-the-public facilities, notably the Institute of Science and the Academy of Art. Both have after-school and weekend classes for the 7-19 year old age group.

marium, the Planetarium, the Observatory or the Nature Center at the Science Institute. Most of the displays are permanent, but there are also temporary displays timely in charac-


At almost any time, there is some special show on exhibit available for public viewing at the art galleries.

Visitors may stroll through the spacious gardens. No guides are available, but to take the greatest advantage of a walk, visitors are advised to ask for a booklet that carries a map and points of interest.

The gardens wind through trails past the Greek Theater, St. Dunstan's Playhouse, a Grotto Pond, bridges, pineways, ravines, waterfalls and sculptures, and all are connected with a bit of history.

Fifty separate items are listed on the tour plus numerous wild life feeding stations.



So the booklet is the only aid the guest has to identify woodcuts, tapestries, sculptures, paintings, mosaics and the equisite, unusual furnishings.


THE SCHOOLS, their grounds and accompanying studios are off limits to the public.
