Seven alleys in the city of Plymouth were ordered closed this week by a vote of the City Commission, but objections from residents blocked plans to vacate an eighth.

After a series of public hearings for abutting property owners, the commission authorized that these alleys be shut down except for public utility easements.:

To scale a tree and get giant nest in order to band the baby eaglet is no easy task. Once as Ed reached for the bird, it backed up and fell out of the nest. This meant going back down the tree, banding it and returning it to the nest. He has pictures of the baby eagerly drinking from his canteen at the foot of the tree.

EXAMINATION of an eagle tree that has fallen reveals the birds' eating habits. Ed says the one he saw had big carp scales, fish bones, small turtle shells and muskrat hides. He has heard of muskrat traps being found in the nests.

Last week when he went to observe the Arnerville eaglet (with a telescope a quarter of a mile away), there was only an empty nest. It had flown away. Ed thinks the two at Rondeau were banded.

And he hopes the trend has been reversed and that the eagle population is on the rise. It will be interesting to see

Mrs. R.M., Westland A. Boric acid really cannot produce a "high" but has found its way into street drugs anyway. Here's a recent statement from the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs:

"A potentially harmful mixture of cocaine and boric acid has been found in the illicit drug market in at least three cities...The boric acid content runs as high as 50 per cent. Based on use by cocaine abusers this may result in an intake of up to 150 mg. of boric acid a day."


MSU Expects 41,500 For Fall Term
