





A. What's happened is this: Amphetamines (that is. certain of the so-called pep pills or weight reducing pills) have been placed under the same controls as the most potent legitimate narcotics used in medicine. This does not mean that the am phetamines have the same effect as the narcotics. It does mean that the potential of abuse for amphetamines is now considered to be as great as that of the narcotics.

The amphetamines are a relatively recent discoverydating from the 1930s-as compared to the narcotics. It took some time to really assess the overall dangers of this class of drugs. Just as heroin was originally considered safe enough to be used in cough syrups and cocaine was included in tonics, the amphetamines were considered relatively harmless when first introduced.

However, in recent years their potential for abuse has become startlingly clear: half of the millions of these tablets produced annually never enter into legitimate channels. and a great percentage of those produced for legitimate use are diverted to illicit channels.

The greatest danger from these drugs became apparent when the practice of mainlining (injecting into a vein) began. The effects produced this way are more profound. So are the dangers: physical and mental damage produced by the action of the drug itself, plus the everpresent danger of infectious hepatitis from non-sterile needles. Inasmuch as mainlined amphetamines (often known as "speed") are liable to produce violent and aggressive behavior, the danger is not merely to the individual but also to the community.

The new controls you refer to simply mean that the honeymoon is over. Another 'safe" drug has taken its place in the list of hazardous substances. Q. A boy I know has been

experimenting with shooting up various drugs. I've heard about the danger of getting hepatitis from dirty needles and have warned him. So now he's recently acquired a large supply of individually sealed sterile syringes and needles (undoubtedly stolen) and he thinks he's home free. Isn't shooting up still dangerous? L.R., Livonia

A. You're right. Using clean equipment won't stop the hazards of the drugs themselves-the hazards of the amphetamines mentioned above for example. Clean needles won't keep him from risking dying of an overdose of heroin. Then too, what about dirty

drugs? Any substance injected into the body should be completely sterile. Street drugs are not. One of a number of things that can result is septicemia (blood poisoning). Another is the accidental

introduction of some small particle that will not readily dissolve in the blood stream. Such particles are called emboli, can result in what's known as an embolism, and can lead to effects identical to a stroke: loss of certain faculties, paralysis of muscles and limbs. And worst of all, death.

You can tell your friend all this, or maybe just tell him to quit trying to beat the system

As september dawns this day, rejoice at your great and abiding good luck that you are alive in this questionable and terrible and wonderful and exasperating world, alive among your friends, for the best in cluded a series of weekly Greater Plymouth is yet to come.

September, as the gateway to autumn, puts us on the threshhold of Michigan's most marvelous season when Michelangelo daubs the countryside, and when on the gridiron Plymouth stomps Bentley Weideman and Ruth Wingard. and Michigan mops up on Ohio State.

> September has contained an amazing number of pivotal happenings in the life of this writer, but the one to which I think back at this moment was that decision of my superiors which now permits me to begin my fourth year as editor of the Mail & Observer after 18 months of reportorial apprenticeship. You didn't think it had been that long, did you?

In the total span of time, we've come only a moment together. Nonetheless, we have crossed some bridges, met some challanges and hopefully have prepared somewhat for the future. Let us look back.

NUMEROUS ELECTIONS have commanded attention, and in retrospect I'm tempted to think that even if the losers had won, we would have survived. In brief, our local candidates amount to a good crosssection of the citizenry, and from where I sit, I can't see any danger of our community being uprooted at Helen the polls.

> One of the biggest and most important decisions, judging from the years of debate which preceded it, was the city's willingness to at long last join the Detroit water system. This probably was one of the two biggest stories with which this editorship has

> The other, which remains as one of the disgraceful blotches on the record of both public employes and their administrators, was the 1969 strike of school teachers. It did not have to happen, and when a circuit judge had to lock up both the school board and teachers in his court room to get a wage contract, nadir had been reached.

> Yet, education has seen the completion of that Taj Mahal which we call Plymouth High School, it has seen one of the happiest nights of all when Plymouth in 1969 won its first league basketball championship in many years, and it has seen our high school band gain acclaim as one of the very finest in the United States.

**DISAPPOINTMENTS HAVE** included the lack of appreciable progress toward official consolidation of all of Plymouth as one municipality, and even more importantly an almost total snubbing by Plymouth is a 1971 graduate of Plymouth Township government of any attempt to create for its 17,000 residents any agency of law enforcement.

In town, the new multi-purpose cultural and recreational center will provide an activity focal point, and soon the new museum will become part of the City Hall-Library complex.





## Township Has Big Fire Loss Increase In '71

**PLYMOUTH** Fire losses in Plymouth Township are hitting a pace which may well exceed the total of 1970, Fire Chief James Gignac reports.

For the first seven months of this year, fire losses totaled \$122,103, which is \$23,897 less that the figure of \$146,000 for the entire year of 1970. Fire loss for July alone totaled

Gignac said as of July 31 this year, the department had responded to 111 fire calls while for the entire year of 1970 there were 121 fire calls. In July of this year, the department had 21 fire runs

while for the same month last year there were only seven. Rescue runs made by the township fire department last

month were 21 more than for the same month in 1970. This year July rescue runs totaled 37 compared with 16 in July Total runs in July were 78

compared to 29 alarms in the same month last year, the chief said.

department has recorded 17 false alarms so far this year while last year for a 12-month period, there were 12 false alarms.

IN COMPARING previous year's runs by the department with the first seven months of 1971, the chief said that up to Aug. 1 of 1968, the department made 256 runs. For the same period of 1969, runs jumped to 405. The previous year, 1970, runs totaled 375. This year to date, the runs have climbed to

In July of this year time lost by firemen due to injury on the iob amounted to 10 days.

This was a bad month for us," the chief said. "Up to July, we had only lost one day by a fireman due to injury.'

In addition to the above calls, the township fire department has responded to four assist rescue runs so far this year. In 1970 for the first seven months, the department was called on only two such

"This steadily rising demand on our fire department is being handled with an undermanned department," the chief said. "In many instances our equipment is manned by only one fireman when we should have half a dozen."



With the conditioning sessions history, the coaches now face the important job of separating the men from the

boys, as it were. MOST COACHES, like Atkins, admit they have had an idea for sometime about certain boys, on how well they might do... or how well they

might not do. "But really, you never can make an official judgment, nor should you as a coach," declared Atkins, "until you have worked a boy in scrimmage sessions and seen for youself how well he does."

Most of the knocking around for the athletes at Southfield, Lathrup, Garden City West, Redford Union, Thurston, etc., must be done against their own pals until after the first regularly scheduled games are played on the weekend of Sept. 17-19.

Under the state high school rules, a school such as Thurston is permitted one outside scrimmage before the first official game.

Such a scrimmage actually may involve two or three other schools, but once it's concluded, a coach can't scrimmage outside until after his first game. Then such scrimmages can be held as frequently as a coach desires in between games.

Where schools have small squads, the need for outside scrimmages becomes far more important. Many coaches have asked that the outside scrimmage rule be extended to two or three sessions before the first

The coaches had to agree after last week's work that the weather "was on our side." There have been years in which the preps have had to drill in 90 degree weather. Such heat obviously cramped the style of everybody concerned. A coach couldn't get as much done as he wished.

ANSWER: Your firethorn has an infection caused by a scab fungus (fusiciadium). Scab lesions also occur on the twigs, and the disease is always more prevalent during rainy seasons.

Control: Don't wait until the fungus strikes. Spray the young green fruits with either ferbam or zineb, new and again two weeks inter. The spray will make the fruits less palatable to birds, but will not harm them if eaten.

Supt. David B. McDowell, who recommended the increase to the board last week, said the move was necessary because of the unclear financial picture caused by slow-coming state aid and unsettled negotiations with school employes.

"It is extremely unfortunate that the Board of Education is when so little information is available regarding revenue and expenditures," McDowell said, referring to the state law which requires school districts to set their tax rates by Sept.

THE 33.90 OPERATING millage ceiling was approved by the voters in January 1969, but only one mill of that threemill increase authorization was levied by the school board last year.

McDowell admitted that President Nixon's wage-price freeze had an adverse effect on this tax increase. "If the freeze had been on a year and had been a real freeze, we probably would have levied a one mill increase," McDowell





# Farmington School Crisis Teaches Area-Wide Lessons



Last week's budget crisis in the Farmington public schools should be of intense interest to every parent and taxpayer in this area. This is because what happened in Farmington could well take place soon in every community around these parts.

Last Monday, Farmington voters turned down a millage proposal submitted by the school board, which said at the time that if the millage was not passed all outside of class activities (including interscholastic football and band) would have to be eliminated.

The next two days saw intense local activity, with a citizens group formed to raise enough private money to keep the extra-curricular programs going.

Sunday night, the board voted to accept \$46,000 in cash and pledges from the group, and it appeared that the extra-curricular program (including football and band) had been saved.

Congratulations flowed to those involved in raising the private money, and everything looked just fine.

BUT IN FACT, the Farmington School Board was caught in a terrible position.

If the board had decided to reject the \$46,000, it would have slapped in the face a group genuinely involved in expressing its concern about the schools. Further, given the storm of emotions not continuing the football program would have aroused, the board would have committed political suicide by rejecting the money.

However, by accepting, the board both jeopardized what remained of its credibility and possibly copped out from its proper legal function of running the schools.

The board had said that if the millage failed, all extra curricular activities would be cut, football included. When the board accepted the money, it decided that extra-curricular activities would go on, football included.

Who's going to believe what the board says next time around?

Further, by accepting outside money which (let's face it) was intended mainly to save the football program, the board put itself in a position of having abdicated from its responsibility to run the school system according to its own policies rather than those of outside groups.

PROBABLY the board took the only position it could have. under the circumstances.

By accepting the money to save the entire out of classroom program, it responded positively to the sincere concern of Farmington people to save parts of the school program which they felt important enough to tax themselves voluntarily. It also maintained some shred of credibility in carrying out its legal responsibilities to insure a sound educational program for all children.

What is not clear just now is how the board can react to future problems.

If it needs another millage and says that if it isn't passed the schools will be put on half-days, nobody is going to believe it.

Or if it gets into a further budget problem and has to cut several more programs, it will just about have to accept private money from whatever group raises it to save one program at the expense of the others. If it does this, a real question emerges about who's running the public schools: the board or outside pressure groups?

SCHOOL BOARDS in other local communities might well reflect on the lessons to be

learned from the Farmington experience.

First, it's unwise (as well as bad politics) to make threats which you don't intend to carry

Second, it's very unwise (as well as political suicide) to make threats(i.e. drop football) which you can't carry out.

Third, the reason boards of education have the legal responsibility to run the schools is to

prevent them being run for special interest groups. This reason, however, only works when there is enough tax support to run a full and well balanced program in the schools. When there isn't enough money, school boards then have a terrible time figuring out what to cut.

Fourth, the real reason why public education in this state is in a shambles is that the State Legislature has utterly failed its clear responsibility to support it properly. Until the folks up in Lansing get property tax reform and a graduated income tax on the state law books, no school board can expect to pass any millages at all.

In that case, local boards should begin figuring out how they should react when problems similar to Farmington's hit them between the eyes.

## Ecology Attitude Dims

Despite occasional river and park cleanups by youngsters. despite the rare passage of environmental bills by our lawmakers, our public attitude toward the ecology continues to grow

The overwhelming amount of messages reaching the public ear are aimed at educating people to increase their pressure on the environment, not at educating them to "give earth a chance."

TAKE THE COMMERCIALS for outboard boat motors. What do they emphasize? Speed. Hair blowing in the wind. A gigantic wave. A projectile hurtling through the water.

Indeed, while the auto companies have slightly moderated speed and sex symbols in their advertising, the outboard motor builders grow worse, and the motors grow bigger.

What the outboard motor advertising doesn't show is the boat's waves slamming against the shore, stirring up silt, messing up fish spawning beds, hitting nests of small animals and

reptiles and amphibians. They don't show people in smaller boats getting their guts shaken up by the big boat's waves. They don't show songbirds being frightened into silence by the engine's roar.

Nor do they show the look of idiotic boredom on the face of the boat operator himself when he finds he can cross a good-sized inland lake with his 50-horse engine in one minute flat. What's there to do when he gets there? Just turn around and come back in another minute flat. That's all.

Unfortunately, there's no advertising to tell the consumer that a big motor on a small lake is a poor investment and harmful to man, plant and animal. There needs to be anti-motor advertising, just like there's anti-smoking advertising.

TAKE THE SALES pressure for mini-bikes. Dumb parents and dumb kids buy mini-bikes, and what's there to do with them?

Well, the kid can't run it on the street because it's unsafe and he's under-age. There's not

enough parkland for them because it takes 100 times as much land to meet the needs of one mini-biker as it does to handle a family reunion picnic or an entire Camp Fire Girl unit.

Now the mini-bike lobby is after the state Dept. of Natural Resources to set up trails for them. The reasoning seems to be they've spent money on these foolish little machines, and now it's up to the state to provide a place to run them.

The fact that you won't see any wild animals or hear any birds after the mini-bike trail is built doesn't seem to bother them. The kids have got to have that Freudian feeling of motorized power.

We need ads that say: "Don't buy mini-bikes. Don't build minibike trails."

TAKE SNOWMOBILES. Their television commercials show them flying through the air, that's how subliminal they get. The snowmobile is a valuable, lifesaving utilitarian vehicle for rural dwellers and doctors, but it's totally out of place in society as a

Yet the advertising suggests we buy snowmobiles, make a lot of noise, cut through the woods, bounce and fly and speed, speed, speed. The other side of the story needs to be told.

We also need lobbies for hikers, bird-watchers, bicyclists -- people who are psychologically stable and don't need the roar of an internal combustion engine under them to get their thrills.

Their work will be tough. Their activities don't generate the economic revenue that motorboats, mini-bikes and snowmobiles do, so they won't have the funds that the motorized lobbies have.

But they will have facts. They will have calm reason. They will have the gentle spirit of St. Francis, and sometimes those things can talk louder than money.

## Schoolcraft Trustees Make Excellent Choice

Regardless of whether it is a lame duck board or not, the Schoolcraft College board of trustees made an excellent choice in naming Erwin Brown, of Livonia, to fill the unexpired term of at-large trustee George Martin.

It will be recalled that Dr. Martin, who has been ailing for the better part of a year, suddenly resigned several weeks ago effective with the letter of resignation.

Dr. Martin's action took the board by surprise since he was considered to be the one trustee remaining to give guidance to the new board that will be elected in September.

Of the present group, only the at-large members--Dr. Robert Geake of Northville, John LaRue of Livonia and Dr. Martin, also of Liyonia, would remain. Dr. Martin had two years remaining of his term, Dr. Geake and LaRue each have four years to

ALL OTHER incumbents decided not to run for re-election in the poll ordered by a circuit court judge in answer to the "one-man, one-vote" mandate.

### Sense And Nonsense

Livonia is negotiating to buy a centrally-located privately-owned golf course. Or as one high city official quipped: the second golf course will give Livonia "his and hers" status.

Thus the resignation of Dr. Martin put the current lame duck board in an unusual situation: Should it fill the vacancy immediately or allow the post to remain vacant for the new board to fill?

Advised by its legal counsel to act immediately, the trustees considered several names and then decided to ask Brown if he would accept appointment for the unexpired two year term.

He agreed, and we feel sure the new Schoolcraft Board will benefit by his acceptance.

BROWN WAS A member of the Livonia school board in the early '60s, resigned and then accepted an appointment to the college board to fill a vacancy by the death of Ward McCain.

He was an excellent member, especially with his expertise in financing, and very valuable'in all discussions.

Unfortunately, Brown lost interest in college activities and did not run for a second term.

Shortly thereafter, he was appointed to fill a vacancy on the Livonia school board where once again he became one of the best trustees.

But that term ended when his company transferred him to South America for an indeterminate period of time.

HE RETURNED to Livonia last spring. Members of the Schoolcraft board, who remembered his work as a trustee also remembered that he was back in town. Thus, he became a prime candidate for the vacancy, and to

the delight of the veteran trustees, he accepted.

It may be a case of on-again, off-again, on-again Brown, but we feel the fact that he's on will work wonders with a new board that is going to need leadership and guidance.

Brown, with Dr. Geake and LaRue, should give the board a solid base to start from.

# Moslem Prayer Called Not Hostile To Others

As members Islamic Federation of Associations in the United States and Canada, we are more than a little disturbed by the statements reported in Observer Newspapers attributed to U.S. Supreme **Court Justice William Douglas** in an address before the National Newspaper · Association convention in Washington D.C.

Justice Douglas was asked "How come my children can't pray in our schools?"

In the subsequent answer, he was quoted as saying, along with statements about other religious groups, "Now I've been in Moslem schools. And they have prayers there. They read the first verse of the Keran. And you know what it

"It pledges every Moslem believer to go out and kill all the infidels (any non-Moslems). Now it seems to me that's a heck of a way to start the school day with a prayer."

As Moslems, we take offense to such reported utterances. Nothing in the first verse or even in the first chapter of the Koran Qur'an is related to any kind of hostility. On the contrary, the Qur'an speaks of mercy and kindness and the blessings of God. Nowhere in the Qur'an is militancy or animosity to non-Moslems advocated.

On the contrary, Christians and Jews are referred to by the honorific title "People of the Book" and like Moslims are promised good reward and assured a good conduct.

The opening chapter of the Qur'an reads as follows:

"In the name of God, the Merciful, the Mercy-giving "1-Praise be to God. Lord of the universe


