Renaissance For Downtown Given Push By Commission

A bold, visionary plan for the renaissance of downtown Plymouth was presented Monday night to the City Commission which immediately put the wheels in motion to make it a reality.

Initial projects envision construction of a \$3 million high rise apartment building for 300 senior citizens on an unannounced site, a three-story commercial retail structure at the rear of the Central Parking Lot on Harvey St., demolition of all Main St. structures between the National Bank of Detroit and Kresge's, covering the Central Lot with a deck that would extend the walks, lawn and trees of Kellogg Park, and the building of a new \$750,000 parking facility for at least 540 cars.

These and other suggestions from a Downtown Development Committee appointed last May by Mayor James B. McKeon were given unanimous support by the commission, which also approved hiring a consultant for a \$5,000 fee to implement and building, there has not been a new private commerdevelop the program.

THE REPORT was presented verbally by Attorney Edward Draugelis, chairman of the special committee, who commented, "The heart of the City of Plymouth, its downtown shopping area, is dying because of neglect.

THE COMMITTEE presented these specific recommendations to the commission:

"1. Remove the present zoning restrictions in the downtown area.

"2. Replace them with standards set up in a new ordinance establishing an Architectural Control Committee in an area to be described as the Downtown Plymouth Area as defined by the city plan commission. The Architectural Control Com would establish standards which will permit high rise

structures upon application in appropriate cases.

"3. Adopt an ordinance establishing a parking authority for the purpose of constructing a new parking garage in the downtown Plymouth area, four stories in height and to house approximately 500 to 700 cars (but only to do this in conjunction with a new structure to be located in the downtown area housing retail outlets.).

"4. Hire a consultant-expert for the purpose of implementing the above program. That is: (a) the city to commit itself to the construction of a parking garage in cooperation with (b) the construction of a retail facility up to 80,000 or 90,000 square feet.

"5. Adopt a resolution of support of a non-profit corporation to be formed by leading citizens for the purpose of erecting a high rise senior citizens housing unit in the downtown area and to concur in the reten-



That is an overly simplified sentence pertaining to two realms of local dispute which are worlds apart, but I linked them in that fashion because in my attempt to attend both I hope to see adult rationality displayed as much in one as the other.

Quite obviously, any disagreement between Plymouthites over some of the intricacies of the Fali Festival can be compromised satisfactorily because these are highly educated adults with a common board. goal, accustomed to reaching decisions through reason rather than emotion. Right?

The matter which NAG wants to discuss is more complex, this being the bussing issue - and whether you prefer it to be spelled with one's" or two, it takes no more than the one word itself to identify one of the most inflammatory controversies of our times.

However, one would hope that this evening's Plymouth discussion would strive more to explain than to inflame. In fact, there may even be points concerning the Plymouth school district that should calmly be described to the rebellious McCabe forces.

PLYMOUTH CAN NOT, nor should not, isolate itself from the cases now before Federal Judge Stephen J. Roth, involving Detroit and more than 80 suburban school districts, of which we are one. But I do suggest that our affinity may be more closely aligned with the Ann Arbor school system than that of Detroit.

It should not be forgotten that the Plymouth district includes parts of two townships in Washtenaw County. Because we straddle a county line, our Board of Education has greater millage powers. We also are closer to Ann Arbor than Detroit, and in 1969 it was in a Washtenaw County Circuit Court that our teachers strike was settled.

The school districts surrounding ours, reading clockwise from the north, are Northville, Livonia, and South Lyon. We touch all seven.

Mention bussing to extremists and they immediwhat they don't grasp is that this may never be in

On the other hand, if balance is to be obtained across Michigan -- not in just the tri-county area -there may be some crossing of district lines and many districts, Plymouth included, may be called upon to accept incoming students. We have room for 500 right now, and if outside sources provided the \$500,000 to maintain our educational par of expenditures per student, there are many who would favor such social progress, including some members of the school

BUSSING DISCUSSIONS, like those when the parochiaid issue was at white heat, are all too apt to be based upon personal hates and emotion at a time when clear-headed objectivity should be substituted for hysteria. With that in mind, I recommend as mandatory reading an article in the current October issue of Reader's Digest, entitled "What Happens After Bussing Starts."

It is the most concise, clear analysis of this national topic which I personally have come across. Author James Nathan Miller gives the U.S. Supreme Court background and writes to these questions:

How far may the courts order children to be bussed? What schools can courts order to bus? Is there any method other than bussing to achieve desegregation? Instead of bussing, why not put the money and energy into improving ghetto schools? Will academic standards suffer? What about the possibility of violence that both black and white parents fear community-wide resistance and/or student-to-student friction? What about the possibility of white flight and resegregation?

In this article you learn about "compensatory education," "magnet schools," the "tipping point" and such experiments as Connecticut's "Project Concern." If you have fears, it may calm some, for it is an analysis that goes far to separate fact from Wayne-Westland, Belleville, Willow Run, Ann Arbor fiction. If you are interested in enlightenment, read it. It will help you think before you speak.

Barberries Overlooked, Make Good Barriers

By BETT PRANTE

THE COMMON barberry (Berberis vulgaris) has at red from the second second to be used in families and best for the second secon disease of wheat.

The rust fungus spends part of its life cycle on wheat and other cereal plants and part of its cycle on common barberry and other plants. It helps prevent spread of the rust disease if there are no common barberry plants grown where wheat is grown. Fortunately, there are other equally attractive barberries that are not infected by the rust and can be safely planted.

A good substitute for the common barberry is the Japanese barberry (Berberis Thunbergi). This is a dense plant that grows about five feet tall but can be kept pruned to a lower height.

The small green leaves turn brilliant scarlet in fall. The red berries strung along the branches stay plump and fresh all winter. The plants are especially attractive in spring when they are laden simultaneously with fresh new leaves, waxy yellow flowers and the still fresh red fruits from the preceding year.

grows in almost any kind of soil and is noted for its ability to withstand dry situations. It is a sturdy dependable thrub that can be used as a specimen plant, in a background screen planting, for an informal hedge, or clipped into a trim tailored hedge.

The Japanese barberry

It is such a common oldfashioned shrub that has been used and misused for so long that its value is not fully

THE RED-LEAVED variety of Japanese barberry seems even more commo than the species. It makes a good accent plant, but care must be taken when using it in foundation plantings not to get a spotty, busy effect.


The variety "minor" is a small form that is never more than four feet high. Because of its small leaves it is called the "Box barberry". It makes a neat hedge plant. The variety "erecta" grows with an upright form. This, too, is a good hedge plant. Of special interest is the pygmy red barberry, a very dwarf red-leaved form, that is good in the rock garden or as a specimen plant in a small Japanese-style garden. It is also effective used as a border in front of other shrubs.

The wildfire barberry (B. gilgiana) is another good substitute for the common barberry, and so is the Korean barberry (B.Koreana.) Both grow about six feet high and have pendant clusters of red berries.

There are some evergreen barberries that have proved perfectly hardy in this area. One of the hardiest and emest is Juliana harberry. It forms a dense shrub, six feet high, clothed with spiny leathery leaves. It is a beautiful shrub that is attractive all year.

Somewhat smaller is the warty barberry verruculosa). This compact evergreen barberry is especially interesting because the lower sides of the leaves are silver colored, making a pretty contrast with the deep green upper surface, In autumn the foliage gets a bronzy tinge.

The black barberry (B. gignepaint) is reported to grow as well in New England as in California. Perhaps hardiest of all evergrees barberries is the thre barberry (B,tricanthanna) which grows four feet tall.

Strong Cleaners

The best way to handle a cleaning chore is to use the least strong cleaner that will still do the job. Using strong chemicals or abrasives where they are not needed can be a form of "overkill" that does more harm than good.

The Aluminum Association reports that this is particularly true of aluminum products. Aluminum needs only a little cleaning to keep it looking like new.

For instance, if you want to clean the aluminum siding on your house before the cold weather sets in use just water or water with a mild soap added. The long, hollow handled brush used for car washing is also handy for washing down the sides of houses.

BEFORE putting your aluminum screens away for winter, rub them with a stiff brush while washing them down with a hose and mild detergent. When they are thoroughly dry, they can be painted with thinned screen varnish or clear lacquer.

When your camper is ready for its winter's rest, its painted aluminum parts can be cleaned with water and a mild cleaner, and rubbed down with a soft sponge.

And when your aluminum boat has finished its season, it really won't need any maintenance, but if you want to paint it for appearance sake, follow the paint manufactirer's directions.





Schoolcraft's **Unpaid Loans Total \$700**

The Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees wrote off \$703 as "uncollectable student loans" at its recent meeting.

The unpaid loans owed by nine students ranged from \$18 to \$100. Funds are taken from general operating funds to cover the unpaid loans.

Edward McNally, vice president of student affairs, explained that the unpaid oans are a small percentage of the total student loans granted. He added that "everything short of hiring a collection agency" is done to collect on the loans.

McNally said the college does grant extensions on the loans. A hold is placed on the student's transcript if he hasn't repaid the loan, but the student can get his transcript and an extension, by paying a negotiated deposit.

The loans written off by the board had been granted between December 1968 and December 1969.

They offered a six-point program to make the wageprice freeze more equitable. and to meet unemployment and other problems.

Their statement follows: "AFTER TWO years and nine months in economic failure, the president has now adopted two of the most important proposals consistently made by Democrats - temporary controls on wages and prices and actions aimed at allowing the dollar to reach its true value in international markets.

"But the president's pricewage freeze fails to include controls over interest rates and profits, and is therefore by labor. Moreover, the 'new economic policy' does little to meet our tragic unemployment problem.

"While we favor some elements of the president's economic program, it requires the following changes and

the authority he now has under the Credit Control Act of 1969 to limit increases in interest rates:

"The 'double dip' - the 10 per cent investment tax credit proposal, which will cost the Treasury \$4.8 billion in lost revenue in the 1972 calendar year, and the June, 1971, "Asset Depreciation Range" system of accelerated depreciation (still without Congressional approval), which will cost \$3.4 billion in 1972 — should be curtailed; "A considerable portion of

the funds made available should be put to better use by expanding the emergency public service and public works jobs programs and by prompt enactment of welfare

"Additional revenues needed for fiscal soundness can and must be raised by closing the hopholes in the Federal tax system which allow billions of dollars a year to escape for the benefit of special interests;

"The beleaguered local property taxpayer must be helped by maintaining Federal aids for state and local governments needed to head off further increases in

the property ax;
"Imaginative efforts should be made to get labor and management agreement on effective wag price controls which protect the interests of all parties - including the

Unfair Property Tax Linked With Bussing Controversy

In the alarm and confusion 2 surrounding Federal Judge Stephen Roth's ruling that Detroit's schools are segregated, an equally important news story has been submerged.

This is a direct legal attack on the local property tax as the base for school financing, initiated last week by Gov. William Milliken and Attorney General Frank Kelley. If the state Supreme Court agrees, the Legislature will be forced to restructure totally the financial underpinnings for all schools in this state.

This could be the most revolutionary change in the history of Michigan education.

THE KEY point in the argument to be made to the Supreme Court is rooted in both the Michigan and the U.S. Constitutions: equal protection under

This legal principle has led, among other things, to the "one man, one vote" ruling of the U.S. Supreme Court, which eliminated population differences between legislative districts and made each person's vote count the

If applied to the local property tax as the source of school funds, it would seem to eliminate the clear difference in tax revenue available per pupil from one school district to another.

For example, the Garden City school district in 1970-71 spent an average of \$758 per pupil, while Farmington spends \$946. This is because school millage and the value of taxable property differs greatly between different districts.

If the challenge to the property tax succeeds in the Supreme Court, we can expect some kind of flat per pupil education grant, applying to each pupil regardless of where he or she lives.

THIS IS the point where the attack on the school property tax and Judge Roth's ruling come

There were two key points behind the suit charging that Detroit schools are segregated. The first is that any school system that separates the races is inherently unequal. The second is that the Detroit school system is in fact not as good as other school systems, mainly because Detroit's city taxes are so high that its residents haven't been able to afford the school taxes that suburbanites pay.

If aid to education is equalized throughout the state by elimination of the property tax,

the second point behind the Detroit suit will have been directly met.

Whether that will be enough to convince the courts that on balance the first point in the suit in itself is not enough to require bussing of students across school district lines is, of course, not

But the success of the suit

against the property tax would go a long way to make education in Michigan better and more equitable than it now is. It would reduce the unfair pressure on the local taxpayer. And it would be the first step in solving the problems which have led both to the taxpayer revolt of recent months, and to the recent controversy over bussing.

Boom Is Worse Than You Think

The population boom isn't as bad as you thought it was. It's twice as bad. Three things pointed this up during the last week.

What makes population increase so bad for the environment is not just that there are more people, but that the people use up resources at an even faster

The latest figures indicate the birth rate is declining, and this lulls some folks into ceasing to worry about population. But the facts are that the population is still rising; that the present slowdown may well be normal for conditions of war and economic recession; and that the pressure on the environment is really what we should be looking at.

For example:

HOUSING – The number of dwelling units is rising faster than the population, according to the latest census figures compiled by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

Southfield from 1960-70 showed a 120 per cent increase in population but a 131 per cent increase in the number of dwelling units.

Canton Township's population rose 107.5 per cent and its dwellings by 127.4. In Garden City there were 10 per cent more people, 15 per cent more dwellings; in Plymouth Township, 109 per cent more people, 144 per cent more dwellings; Westland, 50 per cent more people, 82 per cent more dwell-

What's happening is that more single folks are getting their own apartments, more older folks are maintaining their own residences and not moving in with the adult children, and to some

extent families are smaller. (Incidentally, this is why so many of our Observerland politi-

cians were shocked that their census figures weren't bigger in 1970 -- they had based their population guesstimates on the number of occupied dwellings, and so they got exaggerated figures).

Whatever the reason, the plain and simple fact is that our consumption of the land is outstripping our population growth.

CARS - In this week's supply of handouts, the Michigan State Highway Dept. reports that cars are multiplying twice as fast as people in the U.S. It seems that population growth is 6,000 a day and auto registrations rise 12,000 a day.

The same package of handouts quotes the president of the National Highway Users Federation for Safety and Mobility as warning the highway industry that it's "under attack." He labels as a "myth" the charge that "highway interests are overpaving the country."

The speaker, D. Grant Mickle of Washington, D.C., is partly right; the way we're buying cars, we will need more highways. But he is on dangerous ground when he insists that highways don't ruin the environment and aren't strangling cities.

He ought to figure out how much land in (say) downtown Detroit is eaten up by parking lots, or how much land is wasted on paving in our grid pattern of subdivision streets, the most inefficient street pattern known to man.

SCHOOLS - The figures out of the Plymouth School District zapped you right between the eyes. Enrollment rose 5.5 per cent, the budget by 11.3 per cent. In other words, the school district was spending money twice as fast as the kids were coming in.


In terms of personnel, you would expect a school district to add a teacher for every 25 new pupils, but Plymouth was adding staff at a considerably faster rate.

The Plymouth figures happened to catch my eye, and I don't mean to pick on that district. Most of them are like that.

What's most disappointing of all is the reaction of some of our so-called leaders. Dr. Granville Sewell, a hot-shot from Columbia who spoke recently at Schoolcraft College, could think of only reducing tax exemptions as a method of discouraging population growth.

WE BELIEVE THREE retiring members of the board deserve accolades for their outstanding work during the past 11 years. The three . . Mrs. Jane Moehle of Plymouth, Clarke Oldenberg of Garden City and Paul Mutnick of Clarenceville.

They attended meetings in the old Newburg School in Livonia where conditions were anything but ideal. Cold in the winter, hot in the summer with wasps flying overhead most of

the time to keep the trustees on edge constantly wondering if they would strike . . . one knows from experience that wasp bites can be very painful.

Then there was the matter of working with Dr. Bradner to fill the administrative posts necessary for the early planning of any

One of the first appointments was that of Pat Butler, of Plymouth, as librarian. It was one that had to be filled by a capable person since the library had to be started well in advance of any buildings.

Then came the big moment when the board approved the site at the corner of Haggerty and Seven Mile Roads in Livonia. The excitement of gathering in the kitchen of the Esch home for the signing of the papers and the first glance of the big hayfield that was to become a community college.

They made a trip to California with the architects to study campuses there and to get ideas of what would make a beautiful but functional campus in Livonia.

THEN CAME ANOTHER big moment . . . the ground breaking for the first building and Schoolcraft College was on its

Finally, classes started and the trustees thought they could breathe a bit easier. Small chance for almost immediately the question of finances came up and had to be resolved. It was for the time being but has been a constant problem since.

During this same period the enrollment had climbed from 1,000 to more than 6,000 which brought additional problems.

Through it all, the three original trustees kept plugging away, taking the good with the bad. They weren't always right but they did what they thought was necessary and proper. The three deserve a vote of thanks for a job well done and that's what we are saying now.

A Political Copout

Bussing to obtain integration is futile because the goal is realized only for seven hours a day and during the other 17 hours the races continue their separate existence.

Bussing to obtain integration is a copout as well as an insult to the American quest of life, liberty and pursuit of happiness for all citizens.

FOREMOST AMONG the many objections which can be made against bussing is the fact that children are being punished for the mistakes of adults. The youngsters have not created our segregated society and should not be subjected to the many abuses of having to be bussed miles.

Still better yet, however, headon and begin making significant inroads in integrating the The population problem is suburbs. Let President Nixon, Chief Justice Burger get tough with the bankers and real estate men in this country and let them know the equal opportunity laws in this country can no longer be skirted.

If the suburbs of Detroit were sufficiently integrated, the necessity would not exist to bus children so that, at least for a few hours a day, white and black persons could mix.

Bussing is an issue today only because the Nixon, Johnson, Kennedy and Eisenhower administrations refused to force integration in the suburbs. Only Harry Truman had guts enough to meet the civil rights issues squarely and honestly.

Attempts to integrate the schools are a political copout because what's needed is to tackle the sophisticated techniques employed by suburbanites to maintain their islands of mercy. Until forced integration is attempted, this country will continue having civil rights problems.

And we'll continue playing silly games such as bussing children to achieve integration in the classroom. Someday, when America grows up, we won't have to "guess who's coming to dinner" because it really won't matter.

Psychologist Warns

Don't Negotiate Kids' 'Civil Rights'

Children have certain inalienable "civil rights," says the man who is showing thousands of parents how to deal with their offspring.

These rights include long hair, loud music and the pursuit of friends of their own choosing, according to Dr. Thomas Gordon, California clinical psychologist and called "Parent Effectiveness

And, Dr. Gordon told about 300 parents gathered in the Livonia Family Y Wednesday night, there's no point in trying to use the methods he teaches "when the child does something you don't like but you can't prove to him that it
