
Mother Waddles At SC

How Long To Kick The Habit?

Questions should be sent to the Community Commission on Drug Abuse, P.O. Box Drugs, Livonia, Mich. 48151.

Q. How long does it lake to cure a drug addiction. This is very important to me . . . Will you please auswer as soon as you can. I've heard that if you really try you can "kick" a habit in less than a week.

A. We are asked this, or similar questions, with great regularity. There seems to be a great misunderstanding about the nature of addiction and what is a true cure.

In the light of a report published in the Oct. 25 "Journal of the American Medical Association" by the AMA Council on Mental Health and its committee on alcoholism and drug dependence, we can perhaps give a better answer than would have been possible before. First of all, 'kicking

habit" in less than a week is possible. This is called withdrawal but is not a cure. Almost anyone who has had an addiction over a long period of time has probably withdrawn a number of times.

The key to the article referred to above is the following sentence: 'Once established, drug dependence of the morphine type, has the characteristics of a chronic, relapsing disorder."

Recovery is considered to have occurred only if the following criteria are met: 1)" ... continually abitinent from the drug , ... for a period of three years."

2)"... remains, during this time, free of abuse of other. psychoactive (i.e. mind-altering) drugs, including the abuse of alcohol..."

3)" ... does not suffer significantly from drogrelated social and econ disability or incapacity."



ZILWAUKEE CARROLLTON SAGINAW

THE NEW I-675 spur around Saginaw provides a new escape route for motorists trapped by openings of the Zilwaukee Bridge that carries I-75 over the Saginaw River. The seven - mile - long spur, costing \$33 million, is expected to cut peak traffic loads one-third on 1-75 around Saginaw by diverting local motorists. Only motorists traveling to Saginaw via I-75 are advised to use 1-675 unless there is congestion created by Zilwaukee Bridge opening. The spur adds two miles to the 1-75 route around Saginaw and is designed to serve motorists going to and from the city. 1-675 and 1-75 connect 31/2 miles south and 11/2 miles north of the Zilwaukee Bridge. I-675 makes a westerly loop as it travels through Saginaw, utilizing a high - level bridge over the river in downtown Saginaw.

Interchange Size: 633 Acres

After more than 10 years on the planning and design boards, Michigans' b freeway interchange will begin taking shape foon in southern Oakland County.

The State Highway Commission has announced that the Department of State High-ways will take bids in Lansing Nov. 17 on two contracts involving the interchange. They total an estimated \$17.4

The interchange will require 633 acres in Novi Village and Farmington Township. It will link three interstate freeways - I-96, I-696 and I-275 - and two other major routes, the future M-275 and M-102.

ONE OF THE two contracts, estimated at \$12.3 million, calls for more than four miles of grading, draining structures, concrete paving, watermain alterations and construction of one bridge.

The companion contract, estimated at \$5.1 million, calls for construction of 14 bridges. Work under both contracts is scheduled for completion by October 1974.

The final part of the interchange, which will connect up to the future M-275, is scheduled for contract letting in early 1975.

Two minor contracts on preliminary interchange work were let earlier this year. They involve hauling fill-dirt some 20 miles from the Chrysler - Davison interchange excavation to the east and west quadrants of the proposed new interchange.

About three - quarter million yards of fill-dirt are being trucked to the new interchange site from the



ARTIST'S CONCEPTION of the interchange of I-96, I-696 and I-275 on the Farmington Township border.





It's Time To Tuck In The Garden For Winter

GLADS, cannas, tuberous begonias and dahlias should be dug up and the corms or tubers stored in a frost free place until pext Spring when they will be planted again. Itidy window boxes and

planter boxes, too. Evergreen branches stuck into the grand can make these attractive in winter.

Finish planting bulbs. It is late in the season for this, but if you still have any on hand tuck them into the ground as soon as possible. Little bulbs get covered with an inch or two of soil and tulips and other larger bulbs should have about a six inch covering of

All evergreens should have been planted before now, but if there are still some to be tramplanted and they can't wait until next Spring, get it done di soon as pos water them thoroughly every week until the ground freezes hard. Alsopapian to use a plastic spray on them, especially in early Spring when they will lose moisture through the needles when the roots can't take up water from the frozen soil.

THERE 18 STILL time to shrubs. This can be done as long as the ground can be worked. Roots will still grow until the ground is frozen and-trees and shrubs planted this Fall will have a head start on those set out next Spring after the ground can be worked

Dormant shrubs and small trees can be moved with have roots but large trees need a ball of earth around the roots.

Plant a few shrubs or trees with berries that the birds like to eat. The birds will add a lively touch to the garden in winter and the bright berries will be cheerful to see - until they are eaten.

Give the lawn a final cutting if it looks long and shaggy. This will make it look tidier all through the winter, and may also remove a few insects or diseased grass blades thus making for a healthier lawn


next year. Trimming and edging the beds will make the yard look neater and will also give the gardener a boost next spring when he is sure to be busy with many planting chores.

RAKE LEAVES and put them on the compost pile. If left to mat on the grass all winter they can kill the grass beneath them.

Winter mulches are different than summer mulches. Put straw or salt bay on the strawberry beds. Mound a cone of soil about six inches high around the rose plants.
Put a winter mulch on newly planted perennials. This is a layer of straw or other material that will not blow around that is put on after the ground freezes: Its purpose is to prevent alternate freezing and the wing that might pe the plants out of the groun damaging the roots.







Thousand - legged worms are not poisonous. They feed on decaying organic matter, You may acquire quite a on decaying organic matter, pile of "beautiful junk," the compost, and on damp, rotting wood. Sometimes they injure soft - stemmed plants in gardens and greenhouses, but they do not bite people or

Centipedes (hundred legged worms) produce fewer pairs of legs, are faster moving. The foremost pair of legs is modified into poison fangs. The centipede is to be avoided, although it's bite is not fatal.

CONTROL: Dryness kills millipedes. If they enter a dry basement, they'll curl up and die, but if the basement is damp, they'll survive. Use a vacuum sweeper on them. Outdoors you can spray basement windows, steps, foundations, etc. chlordane or lindane.

Fivate Firm Plunks Vestland School Test



in Dearborn. Thomas A. Cardoza, district director, said that as of Nov. 8. the Dearborn office of IRS will be located at 22720 Michigan.


The building, formerly known as the IBM Building, is situated near Westborn Shopping Center, east of Outer Drive.

The office serves most of south and southwest Detroit and suburban communities. Cardoza said.

Taxpayer service and information will be furnished on the first floor at the new location. The office will also staff personnel qualified to answer questions on the economic stabilization program. Office hours for public assistance and information remain unchanged; Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The new location features improved facilities for the public as well as ample parking in a lot adjacent to the building, Cardoza said.

The IRS considers this a "permanent" move of their Dearborn office as evidenced by a five-year lease with option to renew.



Milliken Can Cool Hysteria With Appeal

Last Wednesday Gov. Milliken said in a state-wide television address that he would appeal Federal Judge Stephen Roth's ruling that legally sanctioned segregation exists in Detroit schools.

Milliken's speech made lots of sense, both for Michigan and for him politically. As the governor himself has said, he made the speech because he was concerned about the wave of emotional reaction which he termed nearhysterical.

But he had a more general point in mind. Quite simply, it was that unless Judge Roth's ruling was given the full and thorough test of the appeals process of our system of law, no eventual outcome-even though it might involve minimum bussing within the Detroit school district alone-could be accepted by the public.

Milliken said that he would uphold any final court decision on bussing, and that he would not try to block or delay any decision from the Court of Appeals or the U.S. Supreme Court. Clearly, he is hoping that the public, having seen that whatever order comes is given a thorough test in the courts before being implemented. will not react in the same violent way that we now associate with Pontiac.

BUT MILLIKEN'S speech goes farther than that statesmanlike goal. For in the most direct terms, the governor faced a political crisis over the bussing issue that he could not afford to ignore. This was particularly so because the strongest protest against bussing came from precisely those areas of the state that had the most to do with his election last year: the suburbs.

Shortly after Judge Roth's ruling, various political forces in the state started taking various positions in reaction to the issue that clearly will be the hottest one to hit the state in some years.

Democratic state leadership, following State Chairman James McNeely (who was trapped into taking a quick position on the issue during a press conference called for quite another purpose), said they were against bussing because it was a bad thing, but felt if it was the only way to tackle the problem of segregation then so be it.

State legislators, especially those from the suburbs, said they felt bussing was bad; they overrode blacks in the Legislature and passed resolutions against it.

Sen. Robert Griffin, running for re-election and finding suddenly an issue which looked like it might save his seat, said he was against bussing and that he

was introducing a constitutional amendment to prohibit it.

Atty. Gen. Frank Kelley, who will run for the Democratic nomination for the Senate, said he had mixed feelings about bussing but that he was pretty sure the Supreme Court wouldn't sanction it anyway.

SO MILLIKEN, WHO had been abroad while the whole thing erupted, returned home to

find himself seriously threatened. He took a step which, while not rejecting the idea of bussing itself, met the immediate needs of his Suburban constituents: He would appeal the ruling, which translates as a coded way of saving that in actual fact he is against bussing, too.

The governor's speech has helped everyone off the hook, for the time being. Judge Roth's

order will be appealed, and that will take time, no matter what the result.

During that period, emotions - may cool down a bit, and perhaps the court will develop a sensitivity to the feelings of the public which will help them through the tangled legal and ethical issues involved.

In this case, the governor did well by doing good.

Game Time Is Over

Oakland County commissioners will have a chance Nov. 18 to stop playing political games with one of the most important longrange issues facing southeastern Michigan.

The Oakland County board has been sitting on \$104,500 earmarked for the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority, not because it has any quarrel with SEMTA but because it's unhappy with its share of state road funds

Oakland is fighting with Gov. Milliken and the Legislature and using SEMTA as a pawn in its monetary game. Not that Oakland roads couldn't use some more work - indeed they can!

The county has pretty well got what it wants from the state, and now we'll see if the commissioners come through with the SEMTA funds. If they do. SEMTA can accumulate a \$500.-000 regional share and pick up \$950,000 in federal funds.

IT'S A PITY to see anything hold up SEMTA'S work.

The six-county agency has taken over a defunct bus line in the eastern suburbs; it set up two "employment express" lines, one to Southfield, to bring inner city workers to waiting suburban jobs; within perhaps a year, it will be able to acquire Detroit's DSR and consolidate a fistful of bus systems into a unified package to serve the entire region -no more fussing with invisible municipal boundaries.

Rapid transit is something the Detroit metropolitan area, among major U.S. metropolises, has been almost alone in lacking. But it's about to become a reality.

Groundbreaking for the Woodward corridor rapid rail line is scheduled for 1973, and the first part of the downtown Detroit to Pontiac line is due to begin operation in 1976, on the nation's 200th anniversary.

SEMTA has an experienced

general manager in Thomas Lipscomb, who came here earlier this year from Philadelphia. The former Army general didn't come out here to do studies; he came here to run a balanced transportation system; he means busi-

The Woodward corridor isn't the only one that will be getting rapid rail service. The TALUS 1990 plan calls for five lines, one of them in the Schoolcraft Road corridor.

WE'RE CUTTING off our noses to spite our faces if we don't move with SEMTA. Suburbanites who work downtown can save themselves a lot of time and grief on jammed expressways by taking rapid transit.

suburbs (unfortunately) show no sign of allowing racial integration in housing, rapid transit will be a greater necessity for Detroiters who work in the increasing number of offices and factories that are moving out here.

And anyone who has driven in from I-96 or I-94 and seen the brown haze over the region can only applaud the decrease in air pollution that rapid transit can help bring about.

It's unfortunate, when SEMTA faces a number of hurdles, that Oakland County saw fit to play games for so many months. But the county commissioners on Nov. 18 will get a chance to redeem themselves. Here's hoping they'll do it.

No One Has Come Forward To Tell

It seems incredible in this day and age, in these modern times when we appear to have the answers to everything, the solutions to all problems . . . but Livonia has a case that has defied solution for almost six months.

It is the hit-run death of teenager Chris Beattie, a member of the 1971 graduating class of Bentley High, who was struck and killed by an unidentified driver just one month before what was to have been the happiest moment of her life . . . highschool graduation.

Chris was run down just a block or so from her home while walking along Henry Ruff from her part-time position at a nearby junior high.

THE INCIDENT took place in broad daylight on a late spring afternoon. There were youngsters playing tennis at a court not far from the scene of the fatality.

There were youngsters playing along the street. One has to believe there were adults looking out of windows at some of the homes in the vicinity. It all apparently happened quickly . . . a station wagon traveling south on Henry Ruff, Chris walking along the side of the road . . . then suddenly the noise of a car speeding up and racing away and

a girl's body in a heap. That's all the Livonia police know of the accident. That's all the bereaved parents know. Both the police and the parents would like to have the hit-run death solved. They would like to know the name of the heartless driver who sped away after taking the life of a lovely girl.

But now, just short of six months later, they are no closer to a solution than they were five minutes after the incident.

THE FATHER set up a Secret Witness Fund of \$1,000 three months ago and plans to extend it for another two weeks. He, the police and the Observer Newspapers had hopes the fund would bring a witness out of the walls of secrecy.

It hasn't worked out as we hoped. Once again we are making a plea for anyone who has any knowledge of the fatality to make it known through the Secret Witness Fund.

The \$1,000 will be paid in cash if the tip leads to the conviction of the driver. It is a simple procedure but one must follow these rules:



3 Alternatives To Bussing

School bussing is the most insidious attempt to "put one over" on the American public I have witnessed in my 68 years of life.

Grave inequities exist in our educational system, but reducing the educational level of all is hardly a desirable way to do it.

A few suggestions: 1. Let all tax monies to support the public schools be paid into a state central fund and paid to each district strictly on an equal per-child basis. Each school board would then have the same amount of money to spend in proportion

enrollment as any other. Have this fund administered by a bank and trust company, they being paid a small fee for each child the fund covers. Keep bureaucracy, sticky fingers and gross inefficiency

out of it. 2. If there are districts where the citizens, on a 100 per cent voluntary basis, care to add additional considerations, that is certainly their

privilege and right. 3. Eliminate the real property school tax completely. Replace with a head-tax for each child to be paid by the parents of same. Let us start with at least \$200, per head. Such a tax would put some of the responsibility where it belongs on the parents! It would also soon act as a sensible deterrent to our too rapid population growth. FRANKLIN ACHTERKIRCH


