A. Yes, you certainly can. There is only one small hooker to this, however: there's no effect at all produced by these papers. What they are made from is the stems of marijuana plants. These stems contain no active such as THC to produce a "high." And for this reason there is no legal restrictions regarding this part of the plant.

It is interesting to note that the promotors of these cigarette papers don't mention these facts. Rather one is given the impression that a "high" will be produced.

The best cigarette papers for any purpose are rice papers. The marijuana papers, which are of inferior quality, sell for four times as

much. Q. What do you think about John Sinclair finally being freed from a 10-year prison sentence for possession of two marijuana cigarettes? Should he have been let off? And was the concert with John and Yoko Lennon protesting his imprisonment what forced the state to free him?

E.S., Westland A. Well, most people in the field of drug abuse felt that the former laws which treated marijuana as a narcotic (with penalties to match) were too harsh. We are included to agree with them. It would follow then that Sinclair had been imprisoned too long. This should not imply a blanket endorsement of his life-style.

As for that protest concert, it could be classified as an act of statesmanship rather than of protest. (Statesmanship has been defined as "finding out where the parade is going, and then getting in front of it.)

It was common knowledge that when the new marijuana law went into effect John Sinclair was as good as free. And this was before the concert. We much preferred the intent of the earlier rock concert by John Harrison, Bob Dylan and Ravi Shankar to help keep the millions of Bangladesh from starving.

Hospital Courses At Marygrove

A new series of nine and 10 week allied health courses will be offered at Marygrove College beginning Saturday, Feb. 12 through April 29. The college is located at Mc-Nichols (Six Mile) and Wyoming in Detroit.

Hospital personnel who wish to upgrade their positions, veterans with medical corps experience and other adults who wish to go into hospital work are potential students for these courses.

"A hospital is a city within itself," said Mrs. Thelma Brewington, director of the program. "Almost any kind of career imaginable outside of a hospital is to be found in the health field."

New courses include training for emergency room technical aides, secretaries, management supervisors and hospital business office specialists, xray technical aides, pharmacy aides and medication technicians, human relations and hospital finance technicians.

These are in addition to courses for beginning and advanced electro - cardiogram and operating room technicians, medical records technical aides and medical secretaries, medical terminology, computer techniques, laboratory technical, nurse and orderly aides.

The courses are offered evenings and Saturdays. Free parking and counseling are available.

Tax Exemption Rules Changed

by the Michigan Association of witholding tables that caused Certified Public Accountants too little to be witheld from the offering advice on filing 1971 pay envelopes of millions of federal income tax returns.)

Taxpayers preparing to file their 1971 federal income tax returns will find that the most significant changes from last year are in the treatment of exemptions and deductions. according to Albert P. Teetzel. CPA president of the Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants.

An exemption that can be subtracted from adjusted gross income for each of the taxpayer's dependents, including himself.

On 1971 returns, \$675 may be taken for each exemption-up from \$625 last year. Persons who are over 65 or blind are allowed a double exemption, or \$1,350. (The personal exemption rises to \$750 in

A DEDUCTION is an expense that falls into one of several categories which the law permits to be subtracted in whole or in part before arriving at taxable income. The major categories of deductible expenses are taxes, interest, medical and dental costs, charitable contributions, and casualty losses

(fire, theft, etc.) The CPA official says that instead of itemizing deductions many taxpayers. especially those in the middle to lower brackets, may find it advantageous to take the standard deduction of 13 per cent of adjusted gross income or \$1,500, whichever is less, a sharp rise from the 10 per cent and \$1,000 standard deduction of last year.

Teetzel expects the change to cause millions of additional taxpayers to claim the standard deduction, rather than itemizing, and says there should be a further trend in that direction next year, when the standard deduction goes to 15 per cent and \$2,000.

FOR LOW-INCOME families there is a minimum standard allowance which, together with the personal exemption, means a single person with income of not more than \$1,725, and couples filing jointly and with income of not more than \$2,400, will have to pay no federal income taxes at all.

"Although the low-income allowance was intended primarily to benefit familes at or below the poverty level, it applies also to dependent members of more affluent families," Teetzel says. Thus, a taxpayer's child can have an income of up to \$1,725 and owe no taxes, while still being claimed as an exemption by the parent. This has been modified for years after 1971.

One major new deduction is available in 1972 to families in which both husband and wife work or there is only one employable adult. Such taxpayers may deduct up to \$400 a month of the costs of the care of children or invalids, according to the CPA official.

Payrolls and payments to suppliers by General Motors' three Livonia operations set records in 1971.

A joint year-end statement by F. Harger Green, chairman of the GM Plant City Committee and Fisher Body plant manager; Walter O. Muller, Chevrolet plant manager, and Dick T. French, GM Parts Division manager, noted that payrolls totaled \$79.3 million in 1971, up more than \$7.1 million from the previous record of \$72.2 million paid in 1969.

An additional \$87.4 million was paid to more than 1,450 firms within a 75-mile radius of the city which supplied the GM plants with materials and services during the year.

The total of these two disbursements -- \$166,-759,000 -- also established a record for the Livonia

MORE THAN \$155,515 was awarded to employes under terms of the GM suggestion plan for ideas to improve the quality and efficiency of GM's products and manufacturing operations.

During 1971, GM employes invested more than \$2,145,000 through payroll deduction in U.S. savings bonds. In addition, employes contributed more than \$246,000 to the 1971 United Funds in communities where they reside.

The 1.1 million square foot Fisher Body plant, located at 28400 Plymouth Road, fabricated nearly 36,000 tons of interior trim for GM cars during 1971. These included seat cushion covers, door trim pads and vinyl exterior roof pads for Buick, Cadillac, Chevrolet, Oldsmobile and Pontiac cars.

A weekly plant tour is available to the general public each Thursday at 1 p.m. The tour leaves from the main lobby and is about one hour in duration.

THE CHEVROLET PLANT, at 13000 Eckles, plays a major role in Chevrolet manufacturing. All springs and bumpers of current model Chevrolet passenger cars, including expanded urethane bumpers, are produced there, as well as most of the service parts for Chevrolet trucks.


Stabilizer bars, control arms, and various engine, bumper and spring mounting brackets are also made at the plant. A 212,000 square-foot addition has been completed and will be used to produce coil springs.

The GM Parts Division operation at 36667 Schoolcraft shipped more than 23.4 million pounds of material to approximately 1,200 GM dealers during the year.

The home handyman can make an under-stairs closet. Usually in basement, this space can be organized and kept clean by stringing some 2x4-inch lumber and covering it with a Masonite brand decorative paneling. There'll be ample space for shelf items, vacuum cleaner


Specialized storage closets, for linens or cleaning equipment and supplies, should be located close, to areas served and often can be built in spaces too small to accommodate full - size closets.

A linen closet should be as close as possible to bedrooms, but smaller closets could be added in bathrooms for towels and wash cloths, and in dining room or kitchen for table linens.

Door openings should be eight feet high and about as wide as the closet, to allow storage all the way to the ceiling and for easy access on the sides. Ideal linen shelf depth is 12 to 16 inches, about the width of two 1x8 - inch western pine boards.

No single location for a cleaning closet is convenient to all areas of the house, so it may be best to split this storage.

A floor - to - ceiling cabinet about 12 inches deep (depending on bulk of vacuum cleaner) and three feet wide should be sufficient, with upper third devoted to shelves.

Redford Township is the largest township in terms of population in the country.

RAND McNALLY'S decision makes a lot of sense.

Perhaps, now that private enterprise has shown itself willing to face facts, even the State Highway Department can get off its duff, recognize the unique nature of Redford Township, and properly label a community of over 70,000 on its own maps.

When and if that happens, Supervisor Robbins, Chamber President Moore, legislators Bennett. Plawecki McDonald, and a whole lot of concerned citizens in Redford Township can sit back and reflect that they have taken on the establishment and won.

Redford Township, like many suburban communities in this area, has an identity prob-

The difficulty stems from the fact that proximity to Detroit swamps the identity of a community which, if plunked down away from the metropolitan area, would be one of the

bigger ones of the state. Further, most of the big newspapers, radio and TV stations are Detroit oriented, which doesn't help the

suburbs develop the kind of identity they want and need.

So it's nice to see a group of local people, with a bit of an

SEMCOG Hit By School Cuts

The losses to SEMCOG are of more than average seriousness. boards from the time SEMCOG ing of Southfield, whose great urbanity in the private sector and an almost incredible

Nor was it a matter of right -

wing nuts making a loud noise as it was in Troy. There were no great, long, bombastic arguments in Plymouth, Livonia and Farmington. The dropouts occurred quietly, with little more fuss than would occur in the cutting of the janitorial staff.

THAT'S ONE KEY, perhaps, to the "shy" of these regional dropouts. School budgets are incredibly tight -- everywhere. Anything that doesn't contribute fairly directly to basic education and public amusement is likely to get cut.

Thus, the decisions of these three boards to pull out can be traced to the economic recession and the failure of SEMCOG itself to prove it can help schools

In a way, it's not surprising. There was a good deal of doubt, when SEMCOG was first organized in 1968, whether school boards, community colleges and intermediate school districts should be members. What, it was argued, did they have in common operationally with counties, cities, villages and townships?

In fact, the Southeast Michigan COG is one of the few in the nation that has brought educational units in. The majority stick with county and municipal memberships.

ON THE OTHER hand, there's a grim irony in the way the three local school boards (not to mention such townships as Farmington and Redford, both early champions of SEMCOG) have left the fold. They quit at a time when regionalism is becoming an official policy of the feder-

al government. Bob Turner, SEMCOG's executive director, makes a pretty sophisticated point about city - school relations. He says both are failing to correlate data about social problems and schoolproblems. Is a vandalism problem related, for example, to a truancy problem or a parks problem? As long as schools and municipalities insist on having as little to do with each other as possible, they will fail to make progress in some areas.

Who are the lost boys in never-never land?

Are they the whimsical friends of James Barrie's Peter Pan, who never grew up?

The lost boys (and girls) are very real.

You remember them as cub scouts and brownies. They marched in fourth of July parades. They played Little League baseball. They were the bright-eyed future.

But something in the insidious '60s turned them off.

REMEMBER THIS was the first hard corps of TV kids. It took them from Howdy Doody and Red Buttons in the '50s to murder in the '60s. Not the shoot 'em up cowboy and Indian films of the past, but real live murder.

Into their TV rooms came the murders of their president, his alleged assassin, Martin Luther King and Robert Kennedy, who was to end our war. Some were in Chicago for the Democratic convention and felt the blows first hand. The others watched, and felt them at home.

Was it the hopelessness and wrongness of the war in Vietnam that turned them off? The feelings of guilt and sympathy aroused by the stepped - up civil rights movement? The gradual whittling away of all respect for the establishment by the Mailers and Ginsburgs and even some of their teachers who wanted them to "think for themselves?"

Youth has always reached that time of disillusionment with the older generation's world.

But this time, some of them found a new piper to follow, one who turned them on. He played ear-shattering psychedelic music and passed out mind-shattering

And the piper's tune led them right out of this world.

SO THIS IS THE challenge of the seventies: to remove the need for feelings of guilt, that one may have plenty while another may starve; that although all men may not be created equal, they may be treated as such; and that peace and integrity return to the land.

And Hamlin towns all over the nation who neglected to pay heed to the piper are trying to bring their children back.

Each Observerland community has its drug abuse program. Plymouth has its "Our House" and Redford Township its RICCOD. Livonia has Community Commission on Drug Abuse. Offer Advice On Handling Obscene Calls

The new year is nearing the end of its second week but already it is starting out like so many others in the past.

Already Observerland has had its share of tragic accidents, homicides etc. but what is particularly bothering area police. departments is the rash of threatening, obscene and annoying telephone calls that seem to come

out of the woods with the start of a new year.

ESPECIALLY IS this true in Redford Township where police officers have had several reports and complaints already.

In some instances the complainant has reported that he or she is able to recognize the voice of the caller and make

identification of the suspect.

But in most instances the caller tries to contact a feminine voice and then opens up with the worse language possible to the consternation of the listener.

In cases of this kind, police officials report that those using obscene, vulgar, indecent or offensive language usually try to disguise their voices and are very hard to identify.

They offer this advice to the listener, hang up as quickly as possible with a bang that will shock the ear of the caller and then report the incident to police immediately.

If the voice is familiar, this should be made known to the officer handling the report.

How do these callers get phone numbers of women alone at home? Very simple say the police, the caller just picks numbers at random in the book and keeps calling until a feminine voice answers.

In some instances the caller may study the habits of families in a neighborhood and learn when the male members are missing from a home, check the address and then make the obscene call.

It only takes one such call to make a nervous woman of a homemaker who felt secure even though her husband was working during the day or perhaps late in the evening.

Redford Township has an ordinance which covers such 'phone calls if the person involved is taken into custody.

IT READS: "Any person who telephones any other person or causes another person to be telephoned and uses vulgar, indecent or offensive language, or suggesting any lewd or lascivious act over any telephone, shall be deemed a disorderly person punishable by a fine of not to exceed \$500 or imprisonment for a period not to exceed 90 days or both, such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court."

Undoubtedly the other communities in Observerland have similar ordinances. Thus the listener has some consolation if the caller is brought to justice . . . unfortunately such is not the

Persons receiving annoying calls should first call the police department and make a report. Then he or she may call the Annoyance Call Bureau of Michigan Bell at 964-2020 where they will be advised of what steps to take.

The only request from Michigan Bell is that before calling the Annoyance Call Bureau and should the suspect be identified the complainant be willing to prosecute.

'Tenure' Protects Bad Teachers

EDITOR:

I, like many other college students, will soon be entering the overstocked field of education. Many of us will not find jobs because there are too many teachers. But there are not enough "good" teachers. The main reason for this lack of "good" teachers is due to tenure.

Our school system is full of teachers who should not be entrusted with preparing the youth of today to be tomorrow's leaders. They continue year after year because of a clause in the Farmington public schools' teacher tenure contract states that the teacher's job is insured until he "resigns, elects to retire, is retired or is dismissed for reasonable and just cause after a fair hearing."

Dismissal is extremely rare. The nature of the contract makes it nearly impossible. What specifically is meant by "reasonable and just?" It is due to ambiguities like this that a teacher dismissal in a different school system took over three years. During this time, the incompetent teacher remained in the classroom.

The obvious solution is to abolish the tenure system. None of the auto industries would keep an assembly line worker who turned out inferior !cars; why should the schools allow an inefffective teacher to remain?

Instead a teacher should continue only after passing periodic reviews. Continual employment would depend on merit like it should. Then the immensely important responsibility of educating the youth would depend only on those teachers who were worthy.

Since the difference between a good and poor education significantly relies on the teacher, can a school system run their employment by tenure? Can you justify turning away or laying off competent teachers while inadequate teachers fill our classrooms.

Under the tenure system, we will never reach the point Plymouth city charter may where there are enough "good" teachers.

HOW AN **ABORTION AGENCY FUNCTIONS**

The deep, soothing voice at the end of the telephone line answers with three letters, "L-

To a desperate woman, those letters may seem like the last hope.

The initials stand for Legal Abortions for Women, an abortion referral agency with four branches in metropolitan Detroit, including Livonia.

The agency began a "couple months ago," according to "Henry Barton" (an alias) who says he's in business to help desperate pregnant women. What he does is arrange trips to New York for abortions. It's his full-time occupation.

"I serve a very important function," he says. "It's very soul-satisfying for me."

A call from a nervous woman typically goes like this:

Barton asks for the woman's first name and last initial and asks questions to determine just how far the pregnancy has advanced.

"We don't moralize here," he told one hesitant girl. "I just lay the facts on you."

After he determined that the caller was in her second month of pregnancy, he began assuring her that at that stage she was not carrying a "baby."

"Don't start identifying with it as a baby, by no stretch of the imagination is it a baby. It is just a late period."

That particular woman was told she could be "instantly depregnantized" by a method known as vacuum curettage in a "plush, fully-equipped medical center in Manhattan."

"You will be treated at the finest center in Manhattan by the top gynecologist who heads the department," Barton added.

"You will be given the red-carpet treatment with a private operating room and private dressing room.

"Incidentally, it makes for a nice trip. You will be in the center of Manhattan near the shopping area near Saks Fifth Avenue and Central Park."

Though he declined to give the name of the hospital or doctor, Barton told the girl that it was a safe, simple procedure. She could leave by 8 a.m. the next morning and be back by 3:30 p.m. in the afternoon.

"We're a well-greased operation, geared for action - it's our business to get you to the hospital as safely, quickly and cheaply as possible," he added.

The vacuum curettage method is used for pregnancies up to 10 weeks at a total charge of \$175 plus plane fare, Barton said. Women under 21 can fly to New York for \$58 stand-by. and those over 21 fly for \$90 round trip with a reservation. The agency's charge is included in the hospital fee, but Barton declined to say how much it is.

After the operation, the woman can rest in an adjoining room and then go shopping before catching the return flight at 2 p.m., he

Later when talking with this reporter, Barton said he refers about 15 to 20 girls to New York each week, most of whom are under 21 and many of them single. He said he averages 20 to 30 phone calls a day.

So far his only advertising is by personal contacts, leaflets he distributes in parking lots. and radio ads on WRIF-FM and WABX-FM.

"We're a legitimate business; we're not underground by any means," he said, adding that his agency is one of four LAW offices in the area including one in Birmingham, Harper Woods and east Detroit.

When talking to a woman who is within 20 weeks of pregnancy, Barton says, "I never refer to it as a baby - it isn't a baby. It is an embryo with no size, shape or identity.

"But as the biological time clock ticks on, it becomes a baby."

In the 11th and 12th week, he said, the abortion is performed by a D. and C. operation in which the embryo is scraped from the uterus. Between the 13th and 20th week, a saline solution is injected into the uterus and the fetus dies and is passed out.

"The closer a woman gets to that state (1 to 20 weeks), the more I begin to lean the other way and try to discourage them," he said. "I begin to hedge a bit then."

Barton tried to discourage one woman wanting an abortion in the 24th week. Instead of telling her she could have the abortion that late in pregnancy, he gave her a "gory description in raw language of what happens," he

"That way I didn't stick her with a baby she didn't want, but I made her want that baby WSU Women Plan Film so bad that she was protecting it as if she were holding it in her arms."

He stressed that "warm, personal" attention given to each woman at the Manhattan hospital "from the time the doorman opens the cab."

He asks each girl who goes there to call to assure him she has returned safely.

Barton said he uses an alias to protect his wife and five children from crank calls, which he said are "in a minority."

Before the girl leaves Detroit, she has to meet with Barton at a mutually convenient place "like Big Boy's" so they can sign release

But he said he doesn't keep a file on the women and destroys any record he has after each one returns.

Since abortions are illegal in Michigan, it is probable that "Henry Barton" and other referral agents will continue to profit from sending women to New York where the operation is performed quickly and legally.

Kroger Will Test Nutritional Labels

Nutritional labeling of food National products will be tested by Kroger for a three-month period starting early in 1972, in cooperation with the Food and Drug Administration of the United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

Kroger Food Stores, said the three-month test will cover five food products distributed thru 66 Kroger Food Stores in the greater Cincinnati area.

The products which will carry nutritional information on their labels during the test are Kroger Mel-O-Soft white bread, Kroger homogenized Vitamin D milk, Kroger Grade A Large eggs, Kroger pork and beans and Kroger peanut butter.

Although the Detroit division area is not a a part of the official test with FDA. Sawall said Kroger eggs and possibly other items, which are distributed by Kroger in this area, will carry the same nutritional information as the test stores.

Each label will carry a listing of major nutrients in the product and will indicate their importance as measured against the recommended dietary allowances for adults, as established by the Food and Nutrition Board of the




Bussing To Be A Reality

Wilson was in Observerland last week as the third attraction of the adult speakers program at St. Bernardine of Siena Catholic Church in Westland, and two dozen persons of both sexes and all ages came out to hear him and see his films.

WILSON'S technique is to break down fear of the predator with pictures of his wolves frolicking with children, licking their faces, playfully stealing a cap, rolling about like lap dogs as they get their tummies scratched. Then he gets serious.

Like all predators, the wolf is actually "incapable of running down an example of a healthy prey," he says, describing how eight wolves declined to take on a healthy

Instead, wolves pick off crippled, slow, sick or old deer and moose. This allows the fittest of all species to survive.

But human hunters, in contrast, attempt to kill the best examples of the deer and moose species, and Wilson deplores it: "Skimming the cream is obscene."

The numbers of wolves are dwindling. Michigan's upper peninsula has about 10 (net counting two dozen or so on Isle Royale National Park), Minnesota 500, Alaska 5,000.
