

Q. A friend has a bet with me. He says that you can grow marijuana legally in Canada without being prosecuted. He says that even if you tell the Canadian government, they won't bother you. This is too much to believe. Can he possibly be right?

V.S., Redford

A. Well, as with most rumors, there's an element of truth in what your friend is saying. First of all, it is absolutely illegal to grow marijuana in Canada.

As for telling the governbeing without prosecuted, it all depends on which branch of the government you tell.

This story first began to circulate after some Canadian farmers freely admitted to census - takers that they were growing the weed on part of their acreage as a cash crop. Some of the census people revealed this fact, but refused to divulge any names. They felt that the confidentiality of information was not to be violated.

As a matter of fact, they became quite concerned when a number of farmers got busted. Fortunately (for the census - takers), none of the farmers who were caught had given such information during the census.

Definitely, the branch of government not to tell is the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. They are charged with tracking down such things, and do so - with vigor.

The whole question is really academic: Canadian marijuana is about the world's worst. It's just too cold there to cultivate a meaningful

Q. What do you know about the Canadian government favoring the legalization of marijuana?

A. (We don't know if the sudden appearance of questions about other countries is a coincidence or if we should start opening branches in principal cities around the world.)

The Canadian government has not taken a position favoring the legalization of marijuana. A commission formed to study this question has favored legalization. The government itself gives every indication of wishing the report would just disappear quietly.

It's one thing to favor such action (as the commission did), but another thing to implement this decision (as the government would have to do). The problem is really complex: Legalization would create at least as many problems as it would solve. Resolving the problem is not. to say the least, a priority item with our friends across the border.

Medicare Signup Time Here

People who are 65 and haven't already signed up for the medical insurance part of Medicare may enroll now through March 31 at the social security office at 17500 Lahser, Detroit.

The medical part of Medicare helps pay the doctor bills for people 65 and over. "Almost everyone 65 and over is eligible," according to Sam F. Test, social security district manager of the Detroit - northwest office. "Most people who didn't sign up in their original enrollment period can sign up now," he

"You have seven months to sign up for the medical insurance part of the Medicare the first time." Test said. You can sign up during the three months before you're 65, during the month you reach, 65, or during the three months after you're 65."

THE MEDICAL insurance program is the voluntary part of Medicare. Persons who enroll in it are required to pay monthly premiums that are matched by the federal government.

DEMOCRATIC PARTY leadership in this community was so lacking two years ago that the party couldn't even come up with a full slate of candidates in the Plymouth Township election, and a couple of events of recent days indicate that '72 finds the high command still in a state of lethargy.

The party had two chances last week to make some noise here, but its public relations committee if there is one -- goofed both times by not letting anyone beyond the inner circle know of the guests that were being brought to town.

First, the 2nd District committee had a session in Plymouth with Preston W. Slosson as guest, and on another occasion Wayne County Circuit Judge Horace W. Gilmore came out to address the Wayne II membership. Both could have been good for publicity mile-

In addition, here also was a chance to lure a few of the non-believers into the fold. There might have been former U. of M. history students of Dr. Slosson's who would have wanted to say hello, and in Gilmore's case his budding candidacy for the Michigan Supreme Court makes him one of the men of the hour in a growing controversy which far exceeds party designations.

MICHIGAN HAS A peculiar system which calls for nominating Supreme Court candidates at the Republican and Democratic state conventions, then asking that they run ostensibly non-partisan campaigns to lessen the stigma of having party labels attached to the court.

Frederick G. Buesser Jr., president of the State Bar, has called this "a miserable way to select justices" and is a leader in the bar association's effort to bring about the adoption of an appointive process.

In fact, after months of discussion, a special commission appointed last year by the Legislature to review state laws applying to the judiciary has just recently decided to propose a constitutional amendment which would make the justices appointive.

The judge has built an enviable reputation as a jurist during his 15 years on the Circuit bench, but even though he is in a non-partisan position his work in earlier years for the Democratic party identifies his allegiance. He is now going all out for convention nomination to the Supreme Court, which made his Plymouth appearance important.

Several hundred of the faithful will be honoring Gilmore tomorrow at a cocktail reception in Detroit, and while the salute is no doubt deserved, it cannot be divorced from the campaign angle.



Hearts and flowers belong on the refreshment table at any sentimental occasion.

Two of the nicest choices for the salad at a reception are still the classic chicken or crab salad -- delicately seasoned and blended with real mayonnaise. For such great occasions as weddings, anniversaries, showers, birthdays and St. Valentine's Day itself, serve either of these salads in individual tomato aspic hearts.

Or, if the party occasion is more casual, here are two variations on the chicken salad theme to be served simply in lettuce cups. One salad includes crisp apples, the other, carrot strips and crunchy almonds.

Sprinkle gelatin on cold water to soften. Mix tomato juice, salt, peppercorns, bay leaf and celery in saucepan. Bring to boil and simmer 10 minutes. Strain. Add softened gelatin to hot liquid and stir until completely dissolved. Mix in lemon juice and onion juice. Pour into 12 (1/2 cup) heart shaped molds. Chill until firm. Unmold onto serving plate. Spoon crab or chicken salad on top of each. Garnish with salad greens. Makes 12

servings. Note: If heart shaped molds are not available, pour mixture into two (9-inch) square pans. Chill, then cut with heart shaped cutter.

CRAB SALAD

For enough crab salad to top 12 aspic hearts, clean and flake 1/2 pound cooked crab meat or two (51/2 to 71/2 ounce) cans crab meat. Mix with one cup finely chopped celery, two tablespoons minced parsley and 1/2 cup real mayonnaise. Chill until serving time.

CHICKEN SALAD For Chicken Salad, toss together two cups diced cooked chicken, 34 cup diced celery and 1/2 cup cooked peas. Then mix one tablespoon lemon juice, 1/2 teaspoon grated onion, 1/2 teaspoon salt and dash of pepper into 1/2 cup real mayonnaise. Toss the dressing lightly through the chicken mixture. Chill well. Just before serving, toss 1/3 cup walnuts through salad.

CHICKEN AND **CARROT SALAD**

- 1 T. lemon juice
- ½ c. real mayonnaise 2 c. diced cooked chicken
- 1 c. shredded carrot 3/4 c. sliced celery
- 1/2 c. slivered almonds (optional)
- 2 T. chopped onion Salt to taste

Iceberg lettuce Stir lemon juice into mayonnaise. Toss chicken, carrot, celery, almonds, onion, and salt. Serve on lettuce. Makes four servings.



This is only a partial list, but even a small sampling indicates impressive performance. The entire Farmington Beautification Committee, led by Mrs. Carol Kurth, merits a big pat on the back, both from local residents whose community has been so much improved by their efforts and from other suburban communities who might be challenged to follow their example.

GROWTH IN the suburbs used to be pretty much catch as catch can, despite all the efforts of zoning and planning authorities. A basic part of the problem was that local government units simply had no effective way of projecting what kind of growth they were going to face in years to come.


Statistics are better now, and both the U.S. Census and the Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments are furnishing much needed planning information. But communities have to use the data available to make sensible plans.

Right now, this is going on full blast in Plymouth and in Canton Township, just to the

Canton Supervisor Philip Dingeldey, who is leading the township board into a far-reaching and sensible development policy for the mushrooming township, reports that in 1971 plans for 291 single homes and 662 multiple dwelling units were approved. But Canton Township is not just looking at the past; predicted for this year are 565 new single family homes and 860 multiple units.

A similar trend appears in Plymouth Township, where **Supervisor Maurice Breen reports** a building boom that last year chalked up a total value of \$8.7 million against \$4.7 million in

Both township units are in the middle of a genuine building boom. Both are struggling to keep it planned and rational. Both deserve applause for trying to work to keep suburban growth a promise and not a threat.

Schools Won't Bend For 18s

Should 18-year-olds receive special treatment from high school administrators and faculty now that they have reached the age of majority?

That question is being answered in the negative in most school systems in Observerland.

As one school head put it, "They are still students and have to abide by the rules and regulations set up and approved. We see no reason to treat a youngster any different today than prior to Jan. 1. He is probably a senior, has followed the school code for 21/2 vears, and as far as our system is concerned, he'll follow it for the remaining time he is attending our schools."

The question arose when the Birmingham schools set up smoking lounges for 18-year-olds, places where smoking is allowed

in the high schools at specified hours during the day.

A check was made of most high schools in Observerland and revealed that none was planning such a step.

THE SCHOOL administrators admitted in most instances that there are smoking problems, but not to the extent that they felt it was necessary to openly allow smoking on the premises.

"This is something for the individual school system to look at," said a spokesman, who preferred to remain unidentified. "In our schools we have made smoking on school property. grounds for expulsion or at least suspension for a lengthy period of

"If the suspension spreads over a long enough period it means the student will probably

take an additional semester to finish his schooling. There aren't many who want to go that route. Sure, in some instances we have had pupils drop out of school rather than follow the school code, but in every case it was one who had poor grades and a very poor attendance record. We probably couldn't have kept him in school regardless of which way we went."

Of those who have reached the age of majority and feel they should have special treatment, some point to the fact that smoking has been rampant in many schools for a long time.

THE 18-YEAR-OLDS contend that it would be better for school officials to admit the facts and set up lounges for those beyond the age of majority.

"We're going to smoke," one stated. "The administration and faculty know it and haven't been able to stop it. So why shouldn't they look at the situation and approve our suggestion."

"THERE'S ANOTHER angle that has cropped out since January 1. School officials deal directly with 18-year-olds now. They don't have to call the parents in for a conference and discuss the situation in regard to their son or daughter.

At least none of the area schools has encountered an incident reported in Madison Heights. An 18-year-old senior walked into the principal's office and reported himself out of classes for the afternoon.

"I have reached the age of majority," he told the principal. "I'm going down to the corner bar for a sandwich and a beer or two, and I may stay there all afternoon watching television." With that he walked out.

Which leads one to wonder what he thought when he came back to classes and had to measure up to the school code ... which he had violated in such a pompous manner.

We applaud the area school authorities for their stand. Schools do have rules and regulations, and they must be followed or we will have systems without any discipline at a time when discipline is badly needed.

Group Acts In A Hurry

Most community agencies or organizations usually make a key decision after a lengthy study of the issue, referral to a subcommittee, additional study by another group, three months of debate, and then -- maybe -- a final decision.

There was a refreshing change observed last week when the revamped Western Wayne County Drug Alliance got some new blood in a move to get some federal and state funds for its suburban drug fighters.

THEY FIRST met under the revised structure the previous week and agreed to meet again the following Monday to discuss further aims of the group and to get a plan of action.

When they met a second time last week, the alliance was faced with a deadline of 5 p.m. that day to get a total dollar figure to the Wayne County Community Mental Health Services Board in order to be eligible for future federal funds.

Normally, this type of action under pressure is despised by organizations, administrators, politicians, and bureaucrats.

ALTHOUGH there were a few of each in the audience for the Jan. 31 session, the alliance made sure that a county mental health board representative was on hand to avoid rushing the necessary paper work down to downtown Detroit with a police escort to meet the deadline.

A two-page cover letter was also prepared by the new chairman of the alliance, Myles Lash, administrator for the Peoples Community Hospital Authority.

The new alliance still faces a Feb. 16 deadline to get its detailed program requests into the mental health board for consideration in the federal program.

But that deadline didn't frighten drug fighters from Garden City, Dearborn Heights and Dearborn. The drug groups in those three cities agreed last week to file a joint request for nearly \$300,000 in federal funds to support their local programs.

THE THICK document submitted by the three suburban groups was dated the day it was physically handed to the county mental health services man.

One of the beauties of the new drug alliance - besides the speed, direction and purpose enjoyed by a newsman impatient with the traditional slowness of organization - is that it seeks to coordinate the various suburban drug fighting efforts without the usual attempt to take over control of the local programs.

The alliance's main goal is to coordinate the efforts of the suburbs' drug programs, try and eliminate some of the duplication and expected waste in overlapping programs and use the cooperative approach to seek federal and state drug fighting funds.

THIS IS particularly important to the city officials, court and law enforcement people who are all involved in the battle to curb drug abuse in their own commun-

Each city has its own problem and a regional solution shouldn't be imposed on the communities. Each should be free to determine just how serious the local drug problem is and seek solutions to the problem.

After all, he said, wasn't his court just applying the U.S. Constitution -- the law of the land? Why should anyone be upset when he as a judge carries the law to its logical conclusion?

His error is the error of a typical technician lawyer: He confuses law with truth, social justice and eternal principles of the universe. Law is none of those things. Law is a bunch of static rules, written at a point in time, for a highly dynamic people.

THE POSSIBILITY of crossdistrict bussing to achieve school racial balance sent me to the nonlaw bookshelves for a relatively new volume called "The Human Zoo" by Desmond Morris, the British zoologist best known for "The Naked Ape."

His specialty is providing brilliant insights into human behavior through the study of animal behavior.

MORRIS WRITES of Sumer and zoos and modern cities, but one can see Detroit and its suburbs in every line of his illuminating book. At another point he says:

"The whole nature of citycomplexes must be re-examined. The harassed citizens of the human zoo must in some way be given back the 'village-community' feeling of social identity . . . They (planners) fail to appreciate the basic demands of human territorial behavior."

My point is that a wise judge will not dismiss all the talk about "neighborhood schools" as a racist code word along the lines of "support your local police." A distinguished zoologist sees a built-in human need for neighborhoods and villages; in other words, this "neighborhood" stuff is natural law even if it isn't constitutional law.

A very dim-witted and reactionary old judge, now deceased. used to mutter that lawyers and other judges should "get their noses out of sociology books and start reading law books." He was. of course, totally wrong.

Judge Roth would be well advised to ignore that advice, to read a few books in the social sciences before adopting a tricounty metropolitan school district plan.

EDITOR:

I wish to call to the attention of our senior citizens that under the rules of the Michigan homestead Act, all social security benefits must be included as income when applying for property tax relief.

When you consider the fact that social security benefits are not included when computing your income taxes, it does not seem fair to include them under the Homestead Act of \$6,000 limitation. I am sure that more senior citizens would be eligible for property tax relief if the social security benefits were excluded from the \$6,000 income ceiling.

I have been in contact with State Rep. John Bennett for several months urging him to draft a bill for the Legislature to exclude social security benefits in computing income to qualify for senior citizens Homestead Act exemption.

Mr. Bennett has been most co-operative. He introduced House Bill 4316 for that purpose and this bill is still pending in the House Taxation Committee.

I urge senior citizens who pay property taxes to write to their state representatives asking them to support House Bill 4316 and to do so soon. We senior citizens know only too well that we need all the breaks we can get. Fifty-six votes are required in the House to pass any bill and to quote Mr. Bennett, "This may take some doing." He has promised to do his best, but he needs all the help he can get

Plymouth Home Kids' Pal Wins Heart Of Gold

Kids who live in the Plymouth State Home and Training School always knew Mrs. Philip Sills has a heart of gold.

So do the staff members and volunteers who have seen her unstinting service there.

And the children in her Farmington subdivision neighborhood, and members of the Farmington Jaycee Auxiliary. Ttey've helped her in her projects to make things pleasanter for residents of PSH.

But now the whole metropolitan area knows about Faye Sills' heart of gold.

For the Heart of Gold council, representing 42 leading women's organizations in Women for the United Foundation, has made her one of its 12 winners for 1972.

Mrs. Sills received the gold. heart-shaped charm that denotes extraordinary community service at the fifth annual community-wide recognition luncheon in Cobo Hall yesterday.

On hand to cheer for her were her husband, who has joined her in devotion to the children at the Plymouth State home over the years, two daughters and two sisters.

Mrs. Virginia McIlhargie, head of volunteers at PSH, was there too.

"But wouldn't it be great," sighed Mrs. Sills in anticipating the event, "if the kids could go too. That would really be something."

The kids were there, though, when the Plymouth institution bestowed its own honors on Faye Sills recently.

On Jan. 20, the staff and the residents made her queen of their annual Snow Ball, and the lady who has logged more than 7,000 official hours of service to the home and countless more unofficial ones couldn't have been more surprised.

"I hardly knew what was happening," she said later, but the children, who think she's the greatest, were delighted when they put the queen's crown on her head and gave her an appreciation award plaque and a big bouquet of roses.

The Heart of Gold award, Mrs. Sills said, is "quite a thrill." But the suggestion that it seemed long overdue was brushed off quickly with:

"I never think about things like that. There's so much to do."

Faye and Philip Sills have been making regular visits to the Plymouth State Home for 12 years. Before that they worked with parents' groups for the Fort Custer Home and the Lapeer State Home.

Mrs. Sills now spends three days a week at Plymouth - "it used to be two, but there was so much to do." She's mostly in Sullivan Hall, where the blind children live, but also visits the other residences.

Partially blind herself and trained in physical therapy, she feels God gives her added strength and sight to help the children learn to walk, assist them at their meals, take them on outings, mend their toys and play games with them.

The Sills have a long-standing tradition of taking groups of children from the home to Uncle John's Pancake House in Redford Township for a meal out, and they have entertained big groups at their home and arranged many other outings.

In hours away from the home, Mrs. Sills crochets decorative items and sells them to raise money for wheelchairs for the PSH residents. She also has encouraged the youngsters in her neighborhood who have put on two fairs to raise money in the wheelchair cause.

Mrs. McIlhargie said she couldn't imagine a more worthy recipient of the Heart of Gold.

'She has given so much of herself, and the children just idolize her." she said.

"I wish everyone could see the expression on their faces when she comes in that door."

Ford Attacks **Proposed Debt** Ceiling Boost

WASHINGTON Congressman William D. Ford (D-Westland) joined with several colleagues in announcing his intention to oppose President Nixon's proposed \$20 billion increase in the national debt ceiling unless the president presents a plan to close "loopholes" in the federal tax laws.

The increase would bring the debt ceiling to \$450 billion. The congressmen asked the House Rules Committee for a rule to permit an amendment the debt-increase legislation when it comes up

The amendment would direct the president to submit to Congress by May 1 a "comprehensive program to close existing loopholes in the federal income, estate and gift tax systems." Ford said.
