Dr. Clark Dies In Prison Fall

Dr. Ronald E. Clark, 61, former Farmington Township physician, died Thursday morning in Jackson State Prison when he fell 30 feet from a fifth floor corridor to a concrete floor below.

Clark was serving sentences for the deaths of Mrs. Grace Neil of Livonia and Mrs. Hannah Bowerbank of Detroit, both former nurses of his. The courts found Clark guilty in the deaths of both for administering an overdose of sodium pentothal (truth serum).

Jackson Prison Lieutenant Jessee Worth said Clark apparently fainted and slipped beneath the iron safety rail. State Police report there are two eye-witnesses to the incident. Clark had been suffering from a bleeding ulcer, but cause of the fainting is unknown at this point.

Mrs. Violet Clark, the doctor's widow, says she and attorney James E. Wells of Southfield have several questions about why the ailing prisoner was allowed to be kept in the top tier of cells.

Wells, who defended Clark in the Mrs. Bowerbank manslaughter trial, said he would raise these questions at the coroner's inquest to be held Monday before a six-man coroner's jury in Jackson County.

Wells claims Clark had been harassed by prisoners and was frequently approached by homosexual inmates. A letter he wrote to his wife on Thursday indicated the doctor was in good spirits, says Mrs. Clark.

ORDINANCE 27.04 '72

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH BY AMENDING THE ZONING

THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:


PART I. That the Township Zoning Ordinance No. 27 is hereby amended by amending the Zoning Map, by changing those areas indicated on the Amended Zoning Map No. 49 attached hereto and made a part of this Ordinance, pursuant to Section 14 of Act No. 184, P.A. 1943, as amended for the purpose of conforming the provisions of said Ordinance No. 27 and said Zoning Map to the decrees of the Wayne County Circuit Court, being a Court of Competent jurisdiction, as to specific lands. PART II CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED

Any Ordinance or parts of any Ordinance in conflict, herewith, are hereby repealed

PART III EFFECTIVE DATE The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, welfare, morals and safety and are hereby ordered to take immediate effect and be in force from and after the earliest date allowed by law

PART IV ADOPTION This Ordinance was adopted by the Township Board of Trustees of the Township of Plymouth by authority of Act. No. 184 of the Public Acts of 1943, as amended, of the State of Michigan, at a regular meeting duly held on this 21st day of March A D . 1972, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law

PART II. ORDINANCE NO. Section 1. Litter: Prohibition, Construction of Terms, Removal of Debris

in PART II, below

from Highways. It is unlawful for any person knowingly, without the consent of the public authority having supervision of public property or the owner of private property, to dump, deposit, place, throw, or leave, or cause or permit the dumping, depositing, placing, throwing, or leaving of litter on any public or private property or waters other than property designated and set aside for such purposes. The phrase "public or private property or waters" includes, but is not limited to, the right of way of any road or highway, any body of water or water course, or the shores or beaches thereof including the ice above such waters; any parks, playground, building, refuge, or conservation or recreation area; and any residential or farm properties or timberlands. It is unlawful for any person who removes a vehicle, wrecked or damaged in an accident on a highway, road or street, to fail to remove all glass and other injurious substances dropped on the highway, road or street as a result of the accident.

Section 2: Litter: Causing to Fall on or Throwing into the Path of Vehicle Prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly cause any litter or any

object to fall or to be thrown into the path of or to hit a vehicle traveling the highway. Section 3. Definition of Litter

The term "litter" as used herein means all rubbish, refuse, waste material, garbage, offal, paper, glass, cans, bottles, trash, debris or other foreign substances of every kind and description. Section 4. Penalty; Sentence.

Any person violating any provisions of this act shall be punishable by fine not to exceed \$500.00 or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. The court, in lieu of any other sentence imposed, may direct a substitution of littergathering labor, including, but not limited to, the littering connected with the particular violation, under the supervision of the court.

Section 5. Publication of Ordinance: Receptacles for Litter The Township of Plymouth may post notice signs and otherwise to publicize the requirements of this Ordinance. The Township of Plymouth may establish and maintain receptacles for the deposit of litter on public property under the supervision of the Township of Plymouth and publicize the location thereof

PART III. CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED. All previous ordinances or parts of ordinances and all amendments thereto, conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

PART IV. EFFECTIVE DATE The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, welfare and safety and are hereby ordered to take immediate effect and be in force from and after the earliest date allowed by

ORDINANCE NO. XXI-J

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE UTILITY ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH FOR THE PURPOSE OF CHANGING WATER CONNECTION CHARGES AND BILLING AND ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES AND OF PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION OF INTERIOR AND EXTERIOR WATER METERS

THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

PART I PURPOSE. Pursuant to the provisions of Act No. 342 of the Public Acts of 1939, as amended, of Act No. 94 of the Public Acts of 1933, as amended, and of certain covenants of the Township of Plymouth, for the purpose of adjusting water connection charges to sums not less than the cost of connection plus twenty per centum (20%), of limiting the period for payment of bills without penalty, of providing enforcement procedures and penalties to promote prompt and full payment of bills, of prohibiting free service, of providing for the installation of interior and exterior water meters, and of affirming all other portions of Ordinance No. XXI as heretofore amended. Ordinance XXI shall be, and the same hereby is. amended by PART II, below.

PART II. The Utility Ordinance of the Township of Plymouth, Ordinance XXI. as heretofore amended, of the Township of Plymouth is hereby amended in the following manner and respects only:

SECTION 5.

WATER CONNECTION CHARGE

A connection charge of not less than the cost of connection plus twenty per centum (20%) shall be made for each connection to the System Such connection charge shall be as follows:

Rates for larger sizes or lengths or both shall be computed on request and charged as applicable. A permit for such connection shall be obtained in advance from the Township, and the property owner or user making such connection shall pay any inspection charges now or hereafter established by the Township to the use thereof.

SECTION 5. BILLING

Bills for the debt service rates (where payable in installments) and sewage disposal use rates, shall be made as separate items on the water bills for those premises served by the sewers of the System which have connections to the water mains of the System, and separate bills for such rates and charges, for those applicable, shall be prepared for premises having no connection to the water mains. Bills shall be rendered quarterly during each operating or fiscal year and shall represent charges for the three month period immediately preceding the date of rendering the bill. Said bills shall be mailed to the address of the premises, unless the Township is otherwise notified by the property owner of the premises, and shall be mailed sufficiently in advance of the next billing quarter so as to be received by the addressee no later than the first day of the new quarter, and said bills shall be due and payable within ten (10) days from the date thereof, except when the tenth (10th) day is a Saturday. Sunday or legal holiday. in which case the next succeeding day which is not a Saturday. Sunday or legal holiday shall be the final day for payment without penalty, and for all bills not paid when due and payable, a penalty of ten per centum (10%) of the amount of such bill shall be added thereto.

SECTION 5. ENFORCEMENT

Pursuant to Section 21 of Act No. 94. Public Acts of 1933, as amended. (being Section 141.121, M.C.L.A.), the charges for water service and sewage disposal prescribed by Ordinance XXI, as amended furnished to any premises shall be a lien thereon, and any such charges delinquent for six (6) months or more shall be certified annually and prior to September 1st of each year by the official or officials in charge of collection thereof to the Township Supervisor, who shall enter the same upon the next tax roll against the premises to which such services shall have been rendered, and said charges shall be collected and said lien shall be enforced in the same manner as provided for the collection of taxes assessed upon such roll and the enforcement of the lien therefor; provided, that in all cases when a tenant is responsible for the payment of any such charge and the Township Board is so notified in writing, such notice to include a true copy of the lease of the affected premises, if there be one, then no such charge shall become a lien against the said premises from and after the date of such notice. In the event of filing of such notice, no further service shall be rendered to such premises until a cash deposit in the sum of not less than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) shall have been made as security for

payment of such charges. In addition to any other lawful enforcement methods, the payment of charges for water service to any premises may be enforced by the Township by discontinuing the water service to such premises from and after the date such charges are past due and payable and the payment of charges for sewage disposal service to any premises may be enforced by the Township by discontinuing either the water service or the sewage disposal service to such premises, or both, from and after the date such charges are past due and payable. Following such discontinuing of service to any premises, restoration and continuation of service shall not be made unless and until payment in full of all past due and payable charges, penalties and interest for water service and sewage disposal furnished to said premises shall have

been paid in full, and in addition thereto, payment of a turn-on charge in the sum of Five Bollars (\$5.00) shall be paid to the Township if service is restored and continued during regular working hours, or after regular working hours, the turn-on charge shall be in the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) SECTION 6. (A) PROHIBITION OF FREE SERVICE

No free service shall be furnished by the System to any person, firm or corporation, public or private, or to any public agency or instrumentality. but service so furnished by the System shall be paid for in accordance with the foregoing schedule of rates, or any revision thereof, in compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance. The Township of Plymouth shall pay from its general funds, or from the proceeds of taxes which it is authorized to levy within constitutional limits, the water rates and sewage disposal rates herein set forth, for any connections serving said Township, or any of its departments or agencies.

(B) INTERIOR METERS - BASEMENTS OR CELLARS

No building or structure shall be constructed extended, repaired or altered in such a manner as to construct, extend, repair or alter a basement or cellar unless sufficient design and installation of plumbing systems are provided for water meter installation and location in that portion of the basement or cellar situated closest to the System main water lines and in an easily accessible, clean, dry space which will accommodate the water meter in a horizontal position by a combination of elbows, valve gates and templets between the inlet and the outlet pipes and which will provide a minimum of six inches (6") clearance between all postions of the water meter, templets and valve gates and the closest abutting immovable object. No building permit shall be issued by the Department of Building Inspection unless the building plans are in compliance with the foregoing requirements. No certificate of occupancy shall be issued by the Department of Building Inspection unless the building plans are in compliance with the foregoing requirements. No certificate of occupancy will be issued by the Department of Building Inspection unless the completed building or structure is in compliance with the foregoing requirements and the water meter has been installed and is in operating condition and function

(C) INTERIOR METERS - NO BASEMENT

No building or structure shall be constructed, extended, repaired or altered, without a basement or cellar being a part thereof, unless sufficient design and installation of plumbing systems are provided for water meter installation and location in an easily accessible, clean, dry space impervious to freezing which will accommodate the water meter in a horizontal position by a combination of elbows, valve gates and templets between the inlet and the outlet pipes and which will provide a minimum of six inches (6") clearance between all portions of the water meter, templets and valve gates and the closest abutting immovable object. No building permit shall be issued by the Department of Building Inspection unless the building plans are in compliance with the foregoing requirements. No certificate of occupancy shall be issued by the Department of Building Inspection unless the completed building or structure is in compliance with the foregoing requirements and the water meter has been installed and is in operating condition and function.

(D) EXTERIOR METERS

Whenever the Township Water and Sewer Department shall not have obtained three consecutive quarterly readings of a water meter located on any premises, an outside meter reader shall be installed at actual cost to the property owner or tenant, as the case may be, and such charge shall be collected and subject to collection enforcement in the same manner as hereinbefore provided for water service and sewage disposal charges, providided, that consecutive readings shall mean actual readings of the water meter by the Township Water and Sewer Department, its employees and agents, or by the customer as evidenced by authorized return mail customer water meter reading cards received by the Township Water and Sewer Department.

(E) DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES AND LIABILITY

The Township of Plymouth, its agents and employees, exclude all implied warranties, warranties of merchantability, warranties of fitness and warranties of third persons as to the design, operation, function, maintenance or installation of the total or component parts of the water service and sewage disposal systems, and shall not be held liable for damages arising from or occurring as a result of the design, operation, function, maintenance or installation of the total or component parts of the water service

> While the formal evaluation of "The 10 Plan" is not due until April 8, when Police Chief Timothy Ford will compile statistics on the 90day trial period of the four-day work week both the Plymouth Police Officers Association and Ford have indicated they prefer the plan.

PPOA voted The unanimously March 10 to support the plan and the platoon system which was implemented to insure 24-hour a day coverage every day.

In a letter to Ford, PPOA President William W. Fletcher said, "The response to this type of work schedule from the association membership was a unanimous vote that we accept this type of schedule on a permanent

FORD SAID the PPOA's reaction to continuing the program on a permanent basis also was not due until April 8, but "apparently they like it so well that they're asking now that it be continued.'

The police chief told The Mail and Observer he also favors the plan because it has resulted in a significant drop in overtime and sick time and has increased training time. He also credited the plan with the development of a chain of command within the department.

"I think I'm going to recommend to the city that we continue the 10 Plan for the rest of the contract year." Ford said. The contract year expires June 30.

"After that we'll see what the budget holds for us," Ford

Under an agreement between the city and the PPOA, parts of the policemen's contract that dealt with the eight-hour day, five-day weekwork schedule have been put aside.

THROUGH BIFOCALS By FRED DeLANO / Editor Mail & Observer

IT WAS just two years ago Friday - March 24, 1970 -- that the electors of this city decided that Plymouth should join the Detroit water system, which finally came to pass slightly less than four months ago. As you know, this was accompanied by approximately a 50 per cent increase in the rates.

Well, guess what.

When Our Leaders assemble for a city commission committee of the whole meeting Monday night, one of the topics up for discussion will be a written proposal from Mayor James B. McKeon that the rates be increased again -- now.

The mayor, with some support from his colleagues, asserts that an adequate surplus to meet the city's objective of covering all bonds by Jan. 1, 1976 can not be built up under the present rate structure. He suggests a very small increase for householders, but still an increase, and that the city really sock it to major industrial water users.

His Mayorship will not have easy sailing. Some commissioners are opposed to any increase until it is demonstrated that McKeon's financial doodling proves accurate, and some think it's just poor timing.

THE PICTURE is complicated by several factors. Not the least is a warning from the Detroit Water Board that it may raise the price next fall for the water it provides to the suburbs by as much as 15 or 20 per cent.

It doesn't take any wizard to figure out what the commission probably would do in that case. That the increase will be passed on to consumers in all municipalities hit by the Detroit action is a foregone conclusion.

Then, too, Our Leaders are thinking about requiring installation of outdoor meter - reading devices at all homes, which will mean another bite out of John Q. Citizen's pocketbook if the plan actually is approved.

At the root of it all is the indisputable fact that the city's No. 1 customer -- the Burroughs Corp. plant -- has gone steadily downhill in water usage. This means that revenue anticipated from Burroughs simply is not coming in and, in the words of the mayor, "Nothing I hear indicates Burroughs consumption will improve."

In a nutshell, this means that sooner or later the rest of us are going to have to pick up the

SEVERAL WEEKS AGO the commission gave first reading to an amendment to the water ordinance that would change the billing pattern from a bi - monthly schedule to a quarterly system. Final adoption has been stalled while Our Leaders wrestle with the money issue, for if rates are to be changed it might as well all be done at one fell swoop.

It has been the city's objective to operate the water department on a rate schedule that would yield a surplus in excess of \$30,000 a year to get rid of bond payments by '76.

McKeon's arithmetic calculates the annual surplus at about \$10,000 the way things stand at the moment, but some members of the administration say his slide rule is all wet. What the mayor wants is to put the rates at a level where the \$30,000 - plus target can be assured, even if the

city has to face a court challenge in the process. Commissioner Harold Guenther commented a few days ago, "It isn't good business if we have a surplus of only \$4,000 or \$5,000 a year. This is nothing but breaking even."

On the other hand, Commissioner Norbert Battermann has announced himself as opposed to any increase at this time, calling it "poor policy." Monday's meeting will be just an informal talk session, but the matter could come to a vote April 3. Right now it's difficult to predict which philosophy will prevail.



Palms for the cardinal on Palm Sunday are a tradition for Farmington's Frederick Wenson family.

A tradition that the Wenson clan intends to keep going a long time.

Their palms are not the ordinary strips of green associated with the age - old rites of Palm Sunday.

Each is a complete branch. with most of the leaves intricately braided into rosettes and flowerets to make it a thing of beauty.

THE DAY BEFORE each Palm Sunday. Wenson delivers two freshly braided palms to the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Detroit for Cardinal John Dearden and one of the bishops to carry in the walk that begins the celebration of Holy Week.

"We make them only for the cardinal," said Wenson, who learned the craft from his mother and is passing it on to his six children. "The only other person I would consider making one for is the pope. and this it would have to be as a gift from the cardinal."

The story of the beautifully braided palms goes back more than half a century to the days when Wenson's mother, the late Mrs. Katherine Wenson, was a small girl in one of Detroit's Catholic schools.

"The nuns had taught her class some elementary methods of braiding palms, I guess as a means of putting to use the palm leaves all Catholic children receive on Palm Sunday," her son said.

SHE KEPT WORKING at more palms to braid.

grade." Wenson remembers. "We were living in the Blessed Sacrament parish and my mother used to send braided palms back to the school. My teacher, Sister Ludmilla, was in charge of decorating the altar and asked if my mother would consider making some of her braided palms for the occasion. Mother said she would be honored."

The whole family pitched in to work on two large palms and several smaller ones, Wenson said. Cardinal Edward Mooney carried them in the Palm Sunday procession, and from then on the Wenson palms were an annual part of Palm Sunday at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral.

After Cardinal Mooney's death the palms still were gratefully received by his successor. Archbishop Dearden, later to become the second cardinal to head the Detroit archdiocese. Frederick Wenson and his sister worked with their
