## Artrain Draws Big Crowds

## 'First Lady' To Visit

Mrs. William G. (Helen) Milliken, Michigan's first lady, will be a special guest in Plymouth Tuesday to view the vast local participation in the Artrain project.

The governor's wife is general chairman of the statewide Artrain committee. During her tour of the attractions arranged by Kaleidoscope Plymouth she will be the honored guest at a luncheon in the Round Table Club sponsored by the Community Arts Council.

When Artrain made its debut in 1971, it did so at Traverse City, which is the home of Gov. and Mrs. Milliken. Since then, the rolling art gallery has traveled the length and breadth of the state, but its local sponsors think no other community has matched Plymouth's accompanying cultural output.

DESPITE INCLEMENT weather, more than 950 persons viewed the exhibit at the C&O Starkweather siding on opening day, Wednesday, and the schedule of group tours alone indicates this probably will be the lowest daily total before the train completes its visit May 6.

All 10,000 students of Plymouth schools are being given the opportunity to tour Artrain and the crafts exhibits set up in the C&O freight house. Many of them have their own classroom works on display.

In addition, coordinator Jo Hulce reports that school tours have been scheduled for students from Livonia, Farmington, Northville, Wayne, Dearborn Heights and several other districts.

ANOTHER EVENT also was added this week to the already crowded 18-day Kaleidoscope Plymouth calendar when it was announced that the Plymouth Study Group will present a free lecture by Prof. Guy Palazzola at 8 p.m. Wednesday, April 26 in Plymouth High School auditorium.

Palazzola, a native of Kalamazoo, is on the faculty of the University of Michigan School of Architecture and Design and will discuss "A New Look at Figure, Landscape and Portrait Painting." He will present a slide lecture which will show how the contemporary artist handles the problem of rendering traditional subjects such as still-lives and portraits. He will compare the

## Western Portion Of Twp. To Keep Pastoral Nature

Assurance that western Plymouth Township will retain its basic residential character is contained in the final report of a special committee created last June to study the comprehensive development plan of the township.

Yet, in suggesting a series of specific zoning exceptions, the committee has managed to blend the thinking of those who want nothing but large open lots with the philosophy of those whose anticipation of impending growth has led to a quest for commercialization.

In essence, non-residential zoning would be concentrated in the corridor formed by the C&O railroad and the new M-14 freeway, plus areas surrounding juncture of major thoroughfares.

Russell Ash, who serves on both the township board and the planning commission, was chairman of the committee. It also included Trustee Gerald Burke as well as Charles Childs and Smith Horton from the planning commission.

Township trustees have "received" the report, asking that comments from the planners be submitted in May prior to final adoption. This action would incorporate the report into the master plan for township development.

THE COMMITTEE put two of its major criteria in this language:

• "The local amenities provided by the hills, streams and many wooded areas establish a setting which is basically residential in nature.

• "The presence within the

area of a railroad right of way, at least one major automobile thoroughfare, and the promise of two future expressways compel regard for non-residential land uses as well."

Then, as a preliminary to listing proposed exceptions, the committee stated:

"Keeping these criteria in mind, it is a recommendation of this committee that a master planning map be adopted as the comprehensive development plan for Plymouth Township, and that this map be identical to the present zoning map, except in the following areas."

THESE ARE the specific changes proposed by the committee:

1. Area bounded by Eckles Rd., Schoolcraft Rd. and the I-275 and M-14 expressway interchange to be C-2 (commercial).

2. Area bounded by Haggerty Rd., Schoolcraft Rd. and the I-275 and M-14 expressway interchange to be H-R (high rise).

3. Outlot bounded by Tavistock, Ann Arbor Rd., Eckles Rd. and Cambridge Village to be T-O (transitional office).

4. Area bounded by Lincoln Mercury dealership, Ann Arbor Rd. and I-275 entrance ramp to be (a) H-R (high rise) on the north one-half and (b) R-2-A (garden apartment residential) on the south one-half.

5. Area bounded by Haggerty Rd., Ann Arbor Rd., Terry and Arbor Village Subdivision No. 4 (Salem Square) to be T-O (transitional office).

6. Area bounded by Sheldon Rd., new M-14 and St. John's

Seminary to be R-1 (one family residential) with planned unit development a possibility.

7. Area east of Sheldon Rd. and bounded by new M-14 and the C&O railroad to be M-1 (light manufacturing).

8. Extend the industrial area between Five Mile Rd. and the C&O railroad west to the Detroit House of Correction for M-1 (light manufacturing) and M-2 (general manufacturing) use.

9. Area east of Beck Rd. and bounded by the C&O railroad and new M-14 to be (a) C-2 (commercial) on the west one-quarter and (b) H-R (high rise) on the east three-quarters.

10. Area west of Beck Rd. and bounded by the new M-14, Ridge Rd. and the Detroit House of Correction to be (a) C-2 (commercial) on the east one-quarter and (b) planned unit development on the west three-quarters with an R-1-S (suburban residential) density factor.

11. Area zoned C-2 (commercial) on the southwest corner of Ann Arbor Rd. and Ridge Rd. to be buffered by T-O (transitional office) on the west and south sides.

12. Area bounded by Ann Arbor Rd., Ridge Rd., Joy Rd. and Beck Rd. to be developed as a planned unit development.

13. All A-G (agriculture) areas west of Beck Rd. to be R-1-E (country estates).

14. All R-1-E (country estates) areas west of Beck Rd. to be R-1-H (country homes).

15. Include the Hilltop Golf Course and the area bounded by Beck Rd., Ann Arbor Trail and Powell Rd. in the recreation of the township.

## Army Recruiter Finds Service Interest High

The United States Army has taken up permanent residence in Plymouth.

Under the command of Staff Sgt. Robert McAndrew, the new station is located in completely renovated offices at 819 Penniman, just off Main St.

"This is the first permanent recruiting station the army has maintained in Plymouth," McAndrew said. "We had a temporary office next to the draft board at 595 Forest for three months last year. This new office has been open for business since Jan. 1 of this year."

He explained that the army decided on a Plymouth office as part of its effort to establish an all volunteer army.

"This station is for the convenience of all Plymouth and Northville residents," he said.

McAndrew is responsible for recruiting in the Plymouth area, including the township. He is aided in the Northville area by Sgt. James Dunn who also works out of the Plymouth station.

McAndrew is a Plymouth resident and has been in the army 12 years. Dunn, who hails from Rowlin, Wyo., is also a 12-year veteran.

Recruiting isn't the only job the sergeants have.

"Actually we are a combination of recruiter and chaplain," McAndrew stated.

"There is no obligation for a young man or woman to stop in our office and inquire about the service. We will listen to any problems they may have and will explain to them all facets of the Army."

McAndrew said he often gets inquiries about other branches of the service from persons stopping in the station.

"If we, for some reason, can't answer questions about

the other branches of the service, we'll get them for anyone interested," he added.

THE NEW recruiting station has attracted more inquiries from young women than men, said McAndrew.

"Oh, we get a lot of inquiries about the Army from men, but so far the women have shown the greatest interest."

McAndrew, who is a native of Michigan, opened the first permanent recruiting station in Livonia in 1970. He worked out of there until being transferred to Plymouth.

"Getting acquainted with the

young people in the area is part of the job," McAndrew added. "We want to let them know that we aren't going to try to trick them into joining."

He said he works closely with Tad Burry of Plymouth High School as a means of explaining the opportunities of today's Army.

"Although the Army recruiting service has a primary mission of placing qualified men and women into specific jobs, I feel we have a very important secondary mission as a public servant. We are probably the biggest

# Plan Recovery Of WWI Hero Plaques Here

**PLYMOUTH**  
Wheels are being put in motion to attempt a recovery of the bronze plaques that were placed on the nine trees planted on Church Street more than a half-century ago to honor the nine men from Plymouth who made the supreme sacrifice in World War I.

With Post Adjutant Jerry Olsen spearheading the move, the VFW post, headquartered on Mill Street, will discuss the possibility of a recovery at its meeting Tuesday evening with the hope that a special Memorial Day service can be arranged.

Olsen became enthusiastic over the possibility after reading of the 1919 ceremony when the trees were planted just above the intersection of Main and Church Streets.

The idea of the possible recovery came from Herald Hamill, president of the Plymouth Historical Commission, and it was given life in "The Stroller" column last Wednesday.

"I think this is one of the finest ideas we have had in a long time," Olsen remarked, "and I am sure that Commander Ed Holdsworth will approve a program that could include all servicemen's organizations in the area."

**THE TREES** were planted in a straight line, according to Hamill, before the curve was placed on Church Street to help correct traffic. And while several of the trees have been victims of Dutch elm disease,

at least two are still standing. "It would be nice," Hamill stated, "if the old plaques could be recovered, refurbished and given a place of prominence in the city—possibly in the new historical museum."

The nine men who were honored by the tree planting in 1919 were:

Myron H. Beales  
Charles Burch  
Charles Chappell  
Scott D. Cortrite  
Walter E. Gordon  
Vernon B. Henderson  
Harry S. Lattenbury  
R. Edward Tighe  
Among those who recall the tree planting is Frank Henderson, brother of the honored soldier, and he voiced his enthusiasm for the recovery program.

**HE CALLED** attention to the fact that back in 1940 a stone was dedicated on the site of the tree planting (opposite the front door of Central School) to the nine men, and a bronze star was engraved for each of them.

The stone was erected by the ex-servicemen's club and dedicated on Memorial Day 1940.

It has been suggested, and may be part of the pending program, that the small grassy plot in front of the school be designated as a city park and that a special memorial be held each Independence Day.

The names of the nine World War I dead also are cut into the large Plymouth Rock in Kellogg Park.

# It's 'Bad News Night' In Canton

**CANTON TOWNSHIP**  
It was bad news night at the April meeting of Canton Township's board of trustees.

Things got off on a glum note early in the evening when it was announced that the township was going to have to repay the county for an \$11,000 "overpayment" of state income tax.

The board's woes mounted even more upon hearing it would have to write off a \$155 water bill owed by the State Highway Dept.

The township has been trying to collect the bill for the past three years, but highway officials have remained steadfast in their claim that the department "doesn't pay water bills or tax bills."

That's the statement that was made to Supervisor Philip Dingley when the township tried to collect the money due after a tenant, renting a home owned by the highway department, moved suddenly in the winter, leaving the house open and the heat off.

"THE PIPES froze and broke, and the basement—even part of the yard—flooded," Dingley said.

When the township was unable to collect from the tenant, it began billing the state. When the bill still wasn't paid, the township added it to the tax roll.

The highway department still refused to pay, claiming it had a rental agreement with the tenant holding him liable for the utility bills.

The house in question is at 40901 Ford. It was purchased by the highway department in 1969, according to Dingley, when it was acquiring rights-of-way for the M-275 expressway.

The board reluctantly passed a resolution at its April 11 meeting writing off the bill as a bad debt.

**ADDING FURTHER** gloom was the news that the township lost a court case involving the rezoning of a 24-acre site in a swampy area between the railroad, Haggerty Rd. and the proposed I-275. To the south of the site is the Canton Village mobile home court.

Proposing another mobile home development, the owner had petitioned for a change of zoning from the present industrial classification to residential.

The board denied the petition, and the owner took the township to court.

The result was that the board's decision was reversed when the presiding judge visited the area, noting that there was no other industry in the area.

Whether the township will appeal the decision has not

been determined. A letter from Township Attorney William Sempliner said his office is still reviewing the case and would make a recommendation in the next few weeks. The board voted to defer action until it hears from Sempliner.

**THE LAST** bit of bad news was the announcement that the township as well as the Wayne-Westland Community

School District is being sued by Canton auto dealer Don McCollough, over what is claimed is the unlawful collection of school taxes.

The case is one of 80 in the courts, according to Dingley.

"The interesting one to watch will be the Ford Motor Co. suit against Plymouth Township," he added.

job placement office in the area.

IN ADDITION to offering all sorts of jobs, McAndrew said the Army is also the world's largest school.

"Today, young people can get training in such fields as a meteorological observer, a nuclear power plant mechanic, a soils analyst, plumber, a television cameraman, even dog training."

The new two-year enlistment is now in full swing at the recruiting station in Plymouth, McAndrew remarked.

"It is now possible to enlist for a two-year hitch instead of the usual three or more years as was the case in the past. Under this option, a young man or woman can also delay their departure for up to six months."

"The new Army has experienced a drastic change in the last year. This includes starting wages of \$288 per month for a single man and approximately \$400 a month for a married man."

HE ADDED that another change includes a written guarantee on the enlistee's choice of overseas assignments.

"This two-year program gives a young person an opportunity to try the Army on for size. If they so desire, they can always extend the tour of duty for additional years."

Plymouth's recruiting station is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturdays.

"We plan to participate in community events, including Michigan Week and Memorial Day observance," the sergeant said.

"Today's Army Wants to Join You, and so do we. Stop by and say hello," he concluded.

## The Stroller

### Voice In Wilderness

It was like sinking your teeth into an oyster and coming upon a prized pearl. In the midst of a discussion with several members of the Wayne County Road Commission regarding the aggravation of the long delays at the C&O rail crossings, and agreeing that something should be done to eliminate them, there came a voice, like the voice in the wilderness.

It was Tom Fidge Jr., who moved to N. Territorial Road some time ago, and he caused a bit of eyebrow lifting when he said --

"I moved to Plymouth because of the railroad and the crossings."

"I didn't want my children to grow up and not know what a railroad train looked like or never know the sight of an engine -- diesel or steam."

"We find it quite fascinating just to stand and watch the trains go by."

Then he added: "Do you realize the thousands of youngsters who never have seen a train, let alone ride in one? It's too bad because that is part of America."

THERE WAS a smile or two around the table, but the remark struck a responsive chord with The Stroller.

Many were the times when, as a youth in the foothills of the Allegheny Mountains, he stood in awe as passenger trains and long freights passed.

In fact, it was a ritual in the old home town to walk across the bridge each evening to watch the "Black Diamond," pride of the Lehigh Valley Railroad Co., move west. It's schedule called for passing at 9:14 p.m. and the clans starting strolling across the bridge an hour or two in advance -- just to get a good look.

The passenger coaches, too, held a fascination as they went by and one could see people sitting at the dining car windows enjoying a meal.

Many were the times when The Stroller used to wonder if he ever would have the good fortune to enjoy such a privilege.

But it was during presidential election years that the railroad sidings and the passenger cars provided the biggest treat.

MIND YOU, these were the days long before television, and not many towns boasted halls of sufficient size to play host to candidates. As a result, they'd have the special car shifted to the siding and the candidate spoke to the gathering from the rear platform.

It was on a rear platform such as this that The Stroller got his glimpse of Teddy Roosevelt, who was seeking a return to the White House as head of the Bull Moose party in 1912. No one ever could forget the sight of him, with his nose-pinching spectacles and his mustache as he shouted valiantly to drive home his points.

His visit on the platform was no longer than a half hour, but he left a fine impression as the man who preached: "Speak softly but carry a big stick."

Through the years, other candidates made similar impressions from the rear platforms of the passenger trains. It was from such a platform that "Hard Hitting" Harry Truman waged a successful campaign to win the presidency in 1948.

The last to make use of the railroad siding was the late President Dwight D. Eisenhower, and his visit to Michigan in the 1952 campaign still is cause for a smile in many gatherings of the old timers.

HIS TRAIN pulled into the siding, in Saginaw and it was announced that "Ike" didn't have much time and would make just a brief appearance.

other hitchhikers and then they get the rides first.

THE BEST rides are usually from other tourists, but the three-wheeled, multi-purpose carts the farmers drive here are also dependable, probably because you can make face to face contact with the driver as he puts them by.

It is supposed to be fairly easy to get part-time jobs here teaching or tutoring English for about \$1.50 per day, enough to live on. But when I arrived here and learned the boat was leaving later in the evening, I decided a sub-sistence salary wasn't worth walking through the rain.

I can always return if some job isn't available elsewhere. Crete is full of mountains with spectacular views and scary roads. In one place, the mountains are snow capped. There are also broad plains planted with olive trees and orange and lemon groves.

Oranges cost as little as five cents a pound, and it wouldn't be hard to snatch off a few as you walk along the highway. You can cook your meals at the hostel. The bread in Greece is a bargain, and the eggs are wonderful.

FRESH MILK isn't so common, and if you found it, it would probably be goat's milk... there don't seem to be any cows to speak of in Crete or elsewhere in Greece.

The yogurt is made of goat's milk and is much better than the kind made from cow's milk, although you can't get it already flavored.

One thing the Greeks apparently don't eat at all is peanut butter. It costs over a dollar for a small jar that comes all the way from the United States, which is rather strange since all the grocery stores sell shell peanuts by weight from big sacks.

This is a perfect place to settle down and subsist for months on end and forget all your plans.

## City Hikes Volunteer Fire Wage

The "Help Wanted" sign is out at the Plymouth Fire Department.

Chief George Schoenneman is looking for men interested in becoming volunteer firemen.

As an added incentive for volunteers, the City Commission also has increased the pay scale by a unanimous vote.

EFFECTIVE immediately, the pay jumps from \$4 for the first hour of duty to \$6, and from \$2 to \$4 for each additional hour.

"We especially need men who would be available during the day. This is where our real shortage of volunteer men is felt," the chief said.

Qualifications call for applicants to be in good physical condition and between the ages of 21 and 35 years. They do not have to live within the Plymouth city limits but should live in the near-by area.

"A VOLUNTEER fireman is not tied down from his routine way of life. In other words, the job doesn't interfere with his regular employment. He is only subject to call when available," said Schoenneman.

Schoenneman said volunteers are required only to respond to a fire when available. He is then required to either go into the fire station or to the scene of the fire.

"The volunteer is required to attend training classes four hours a month. He is paid while in training which includes all phases of fire fighting. All training is done in Plymouth."

A man who has taken advanced first aid courses, or can take first aid, can be used on the department's ambulances. They would then be licensed by the state, the chief added.

Persons interested in applying for a volunteer job, may do so any day of the week at the Plymouth Fire Department located in the City Hall.

"They can apply either to me or the lieutenant on duty," Schoenneman said.

VOLUNTEERS are paid twice a year for their work, the first of June and Dec. 1.

"This way a man has extra money for a vacation in the summer and extra funds for Christmas."

"With the pay increase, a man has the opportunity to earn extra money and in addition is providing a service to his community."

"It's possible too, that he may enjoy the job enough to want to join the department," the chief concluded.

# Quakers Ask Support For Open Services

The Quakers, who helped to found Farmington more than a century ago and reportedly have felt less than welcome there recently, are looking for a church to help them in their current goal.

The goal, according to a statement from a committee of the Evangelical Friends Association of Detroit, is to establish a regular local meeting that would include blacks among the worshipers. Black Quaker elders have

been present in several Friends meetings held in Farmington and Livonia during the past year.

**BUT AFTER** recent television coverage of such a meeting, the Evangelical Association reported a "wave of mild hysteria" in the community and added:

"One might surmise that the only 'good Quakers' are the dead ones' safely buried in

Farmington Friends Cemetery on Gill Road."

The statement said that despite "the climate of hostility" and the fact that land the association had under option "is no longer available," the Quakers plan to continue meetings and will hold the next on Pentecost Sunday, May 21, with a delegation from each Farmington church invited and black ministers on hand.

"Quakers hope that a lot of

Farmington Christians and interested seekers with open hearts and minds will be there too.

"What minister will step forward and open a church to help out?"

**THE EVANGELICAL** Friends Association, located at 11118 E. Jefferson, Detroit, sought in its statement to give the background of the meetings and "clarify some facts."

"A small group of Friends and interested young people have been meeting continuously in Farmington and Livonia for the past three years," the statement said. "Several meetings were held in the original Livonia Meetinghouse, 'Quaker Acres,' built in 1846 by pioneer

antislavery Friends. (Quaker Acres is located on Seven Mile Road, just west of Farmington Road.) A lecture to which members of the United Committee on Negro history were invited was held there in 1971.

"This building was not congenial for worship, since it is primarily a museum. Prayer meetings were held in homes until this year, when a series of three dialog gatherings, exploring the richness of the evangelical and liberal traditions of Quakerism, were held in the Farmington Universalist Church.

"IN 1971, the first public Friends meeting in nearly a century was held in Far-

mington during the Founders Days Festival at the Church of Christ, Scientist."

These meetings, the statement said, have led young and newly-interested Quakers to reestablish Quakerism in the community that antislavery Friends helped found in 1824.

"A charismatic renewal has begun among Friends in southeastern Michigan and the meeting in Farmington is a focal point for a new dispensation of the spirit.

"Black Quakers from Detroit have played a key role in awakening a greater consciousness of the power and love of God in renewal meetings.

"They have ministered in

all public meetings in Farmington and will continue to do so.

"The meetings based upon silent waiting and meditation are opportunities for persons to worship in testimony, song, scripture sharing and praise, unlike the more formalistic services of most churches."

**POINTING OUT** that in the Quaker meetings "both blacks and whites are warmly

welcomed into an inclusive community of praise," the statement added:

"Most churches in Farmington seem to practice an institutional 'apartheid'—Friends want no part of that approach."

## Jewish Congress Asks Vietnam Pullout By July

NEW YORK

The national Governing Council of the American Jewish Congress has made public a resolution condemning the "massive escalation" of the war in Indo-China and urging that the Nixon administration set July 1, 1972, as the date for complete withdrawal of all U.S. forces and the cessation of all military activities.

Expressing itself as "deeply shocked" at the increased U.S. military activities in Southeast Asia, the American Jewish Congress policy-making body declared:

"The withdrawal of all forces must continue unabated, and at an even swifter pace, and we must immediately stop all bombing and other air, ground and naval activities.

"The increased engagement

by U.S. forces on the ground and in the air is viewed by the world as a stunning reversal of announced U.S. policy and a betrayal of the repeated public pledge of withdrawal by this Administration.

"The only rational and moral course available to our country at this tragic moment is to proceed expeditiously with the complete removal of U.S. forces from Southeast Asia as the only way of stopping the killing and securing a quick release of our prisoners."

"We demand that the administration set July 1, 1972 as the date for complete withdrawal of all U.S. military personnel and cessation of all military activities; call for an end to the killing by all sides; and proceed immediately with talks looking toward a negotiated settlement."

The day's activities, including a visit from the Rev. Conrad Frey, president of Dr. Martin Luther College in Minnesota as well as a potluck dinner and a program presented by the children of the school, are part of the church's centennial year celebration.

Pastor Frey, former

president of the Michigan Lutheran Seminary in Saginaw, will speak at the 8:30 and 11 a.m. services Sunday. The Rev. W.F. Koelpin, pastor of St. Paul, will be officiant.

**THE VISITING** CLERGYMAN held his post in Saginaw from 1950 to 1966 and also has served as educational and mission consultant to the Chinese Evangelical Lutheran Church and helped organize the Far East Theological Seminary in Hong Kong before going to Dr. Martin

Luther College, located at New Ulm, Minn.

The potluck and the children's program will be held in the fellowship hall of the St. Paul church, third building occupied by the congregation in its 100-year Livonia history.

**THE CHURCH'S** day school began with appointment of an organizational committee in April of 1947. Those serving were George White, Walter Ash, Gustave Eshels, Richard Gaston, Edwin Hicks, Clarence Pankow, Ralph Warnowski, William Wolff and Harley Wolfman.

They arranged for extensive remodeling of the basement of the church building, with St. Paul members doing most of the work.

With new quarters ready, the school opened Sept. 7, 1947, with 25 students and the Rev. Theodore Sauer as the first teacher.

The following year, the enrollment grew to 33 students and Hilda Wollenweber of Corviss, Minn., was named as the school's first full time teacher, assisting Pastor Sauer.

By 1949, the congregation was ready to build a new two-room school, and it was dedicated Feb. 4, 1951.

**FREDERICK JANKE** was installed as the first principal in August 1952, and Leslie Kehl and Mrs. Charles Sergison later served in that capacity.

The school, which gained new facilities when the church moved to its Farmington Road site two years ago, now has an enrollment of 111 students from first to sixth grades.

The present staff includes Eugene Pydynowski as principal and Carolyn Smart, Mrs. Betty Pydynowski and Mrs. Lois Press as teachers, as well as Pastor Koelpin. Mrs. Press is observing her 15th anniversary with St. Paul.

# Rev. Lester Kinsolving's Religion Update

The successful defense of Navy Chaplain Andrew Jensen during an unprecedented court-martial for alleged adultery in Jacksonville, Fla., cost more than \$15,000 for necessary investigations and two civilian attorneys. (Jensen was aware that a reported 95 per cent of all military court-martials result in convictions).

The locally organized Chaplain Jensen Defense Fund (P.O. Box 6022, Jacksonville, 32221) has raised \$2,800, but Jensen's denomination, the American Baptist Convention, has claimed that this entire amount should be paid by the Navy. And unless the Navy does so - as well as providing realistic guarantees that Jensen will suffer no discrimination in promotion or assignments - the Baptists will furnish no more chaplains to the Navy.

Similar action - which could decimate the Navy Chaplain's Corps - may be taken by 40 or more Protestant denominations whose chaplaincy boards are members of the General Commission on Chaplaincies and Armed Forces Personnel, which is scheduled to discuss the Jensen case with the Navy Department in Washington on May 1.

THE NAVY'S METHODS in prosecuting Chaplain Jensen reek on a number of counts, primarily on the incredible fact that this career officer with 17 years of unblemished service was brought to general court-martial on the strength of affidavits filed by two self-confessed adulteresses.

Laura Gudbranson and Mary Ann Curran, wives of naval officers at Cecil Naval Air Station here, testified that they had sexual relations with the Chaplain on 22 occasions. Even were this testimony true - and it was torn apart in cross examination - just how many times does an officer's "lady" have to be "seduced" before her conscience overcomes her glands enough to report a court-martial offense?

And since there was no mention of rape, why was Chaplain Jensen threatened with possible imprisonment on

the strength of the affidavits of two self-professed adulteresses - his alleged partners in crime who continue resident on U.S. naval bases?

AMONG FURTHER compelling questions on this scandal:

• Why was Chaplain Jensen's report about wife-swapping on the base accepted into the trial record, but not permitted to be featured in testimony? Why also, as Chaplain Jensen vividly recalls, were two-thirds of his defense witnesses denied the right to testify - while those who did testify were compelled to supply the prosecution with the substance of their testimony in advance of the trial?

• Why was Chaplain Jensen immediately replaced as senior Protestant chaplain by the former assistant chaplain, Southern Baptist Hoyt Swan? Chaplain Swan told this writer that he had not obtained affidavits from either of the two accusing women - and that he could not recall ever having been reprimanded by Jensen. But the Rev. Herman Benner (former Chaplain - Col., U.S. Army) of American Baptist headquarters commented:

"Jensen had to reprimand Swan repeatedly for laziness. And Swan's signature as witness is on these women's affidavits, photostatic copies of which we have."

• Why is it that during all the months he faced possible imprisonment that Chaplain Jensen recalls that the Navy's chief of chaplains, Methodist Admiral Francis Garrett, never came near him and did not return his phone calls?

After the acquittal, Admiral Garrett wired Jensen congratulations and promised a forthcoming visit. When contacted by phone about this strange brand of pastoral care, Admiral Garrett refused to comment unless in Washington and under supervision of Navy public relations.

Garrett's predecessor, Southern Baptist Admiral James Kelly, when asked why he had not investigated a similar case, replied: "We investigate the scriptures." This flagrant lack of con-

cern will probably be emulated by the Congress, especially in an election year. Witness the perfunctory buck-passing by the few senators who even bothered to respond to the written appeal from the Jensen Defense Fund, sent to all 100 U.S. Senators, for a congressional investigation.

Wrote one senator: "Since Commander Jensen's legal residence is not in the State of Maine, in accordance with senatorial courtesy and custom, it would be improper for me as a Maine senator to intercede on his behalf. (signed) Margaret Chase Smith."

But Mrs. Smith's concern for non-Maine citizens apparently can extend all the way to California - as when she attracted national publicity by fighting Air Force Reserve promotion for actor Jimmy Stewart.

Durance opened the third

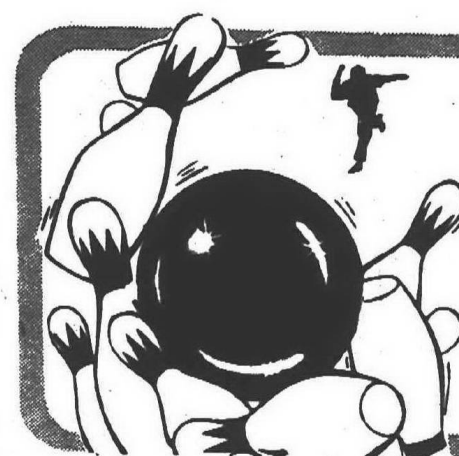

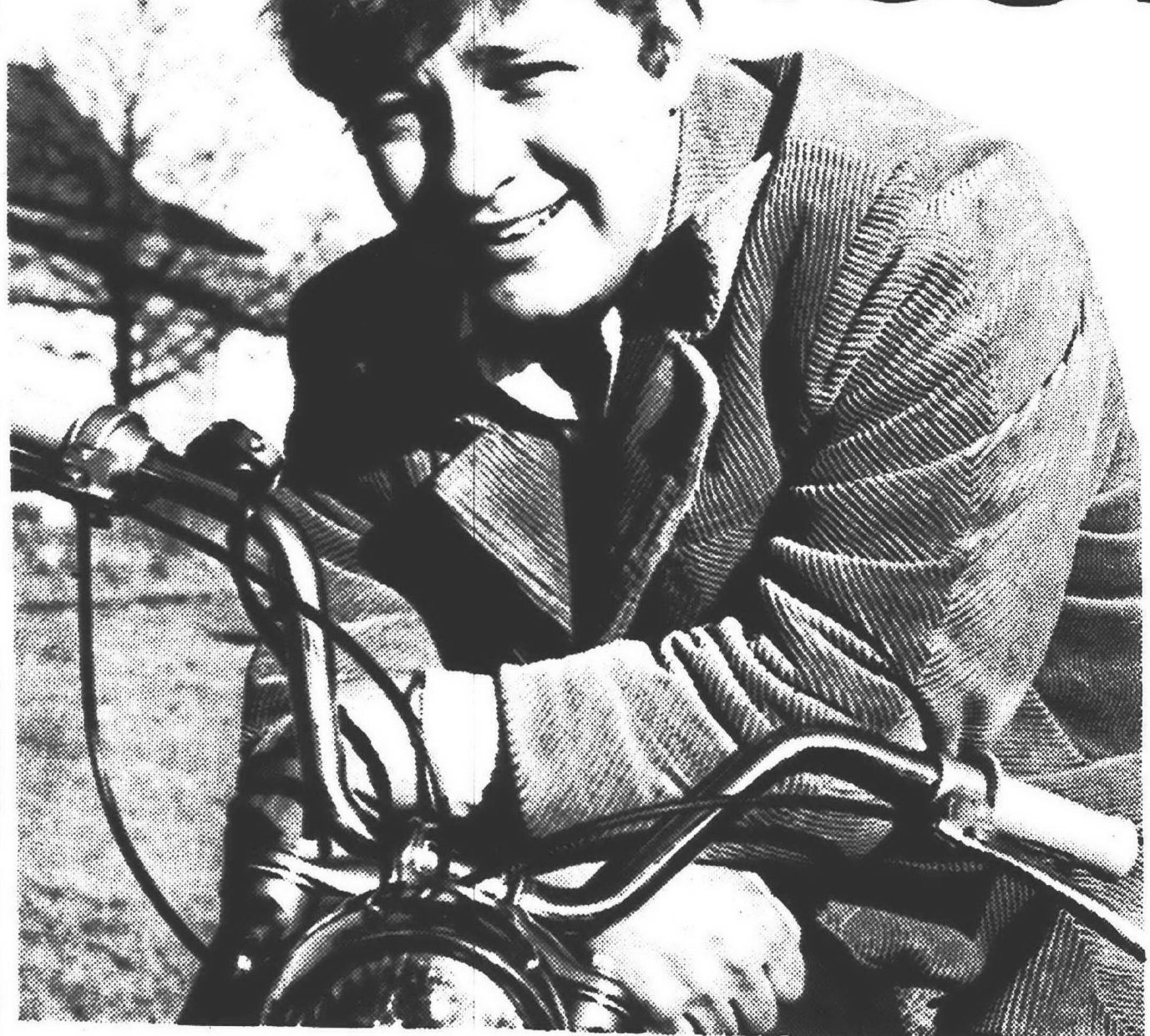

This is the final year of competition for Albatross who

will retire to stud duties after 1972.

## Don't Overwork Your Hypothalamus



TODAY'S COOLING technology is so advanced that tomorrow's home may look like this single-family dwelling. Within the transparent dome enclosure of house and lot, climate control is so complete that it is always spring, flowers grow year-round, and there is little need for roof or walls, except for privacy.

Nature has provided man with a built-in climate control system that maintains a stable body temperature. Regulator of the bodily cooling system is a small portion of the brain called the hypothalamus, which works like a thermostat. When heat is intense the hypothalamus causes blood vessels to dilate and sweat glands to accelerate.

Humans adapt to heat several ways. Heat is released from the body by convection, in which warm air near the body rises and is replaced by cooling air; through radiation in which warm air near the body is attracted to a cooler object; and by evaporation which releases moisture through the pores of the skin. The moisture is vaporized, carrying away the heat.

Primitive man sought summer comfort with very little success. It helped if he were a king or a caliph with the manpower of hundreds of slaves to hand-carry snow from the mountains to pile in his garden.

Today the average homeowner enjoys more comfort than a Roman emperor, thanks to the revolutionary technology of air conditioning and the residential cooling boom that began two decades ago.

THE ANCIENTS effected some astonishing construction projects in their efforts to beat the heat.

One determined Bagdad caliph built his summer palace with double walls which were packed with snow brought from the mountains.

By the 19th century physicians were increasingly aware that heat and humidity excesses hampered their patients' recoveries.

After he was shot in the summer of

1881, President Garfield was cooled by a fan-driven device installed in his White House room that melted about 536 pounds of ice per hour.

Nearly 50 years earlier, malaria and yellow fever patients were cooled by fans blowing air over ice hung in their Charleston, S.C. hospital rooms.

A number of history's great minds turned their attention to overcoming the problems of the weather.

THE GREAT Leonardo da Vinci engineered a water-driven ventilating fan that cooled a single room. English architect, Christopher Wren, devised a gravity exhaust ventilating system to cool off the British House of Parliament. One very contemporary variety of cooling equipment actually is well over a 100 years old. The heat pump, only today coming into its own as a practical way to automatically heat or cool as needed, was first devised in 1854 by an English physicist.

Willis Carrier, a young American engineer, was responsible for the breakthrough that eventually led to air conditioning as we know it today. In 1902 Carrier was able to simultaneously regulate temperature and humidity.

Air conditioning was pioneered in slaughter houses, candy factories, textile mills and manufacturing plants. Owners of theaters began to offer cooling along with the featured bill, to keep up the crowds in summer.

Today's most modern climate control systems offer total comfort that goes beyond heating and cooling. The ideal system also adds humidity in winter, controls indoor odors, and provides an electronic air cleaner that removes at least 95 per cent of all the dirt, pollen and smoke particles from indoor air.

## Haste Makes Waste On Wallpaper Project

So you are thinking of trying your hand at hanging your own wallpaper?

Haste can certainly make waste for the do-it-yourselfer working on a wall-covering project.

Following instructions is fine if the walls have been prepared properly. In fact, one manufacturer of wallpaper adhesives points out that wall preparation is the most important step in the process.

"Don't take shortcuts," probably is the best advice that experienced applicators can give the novice working on his first wallpapering project.

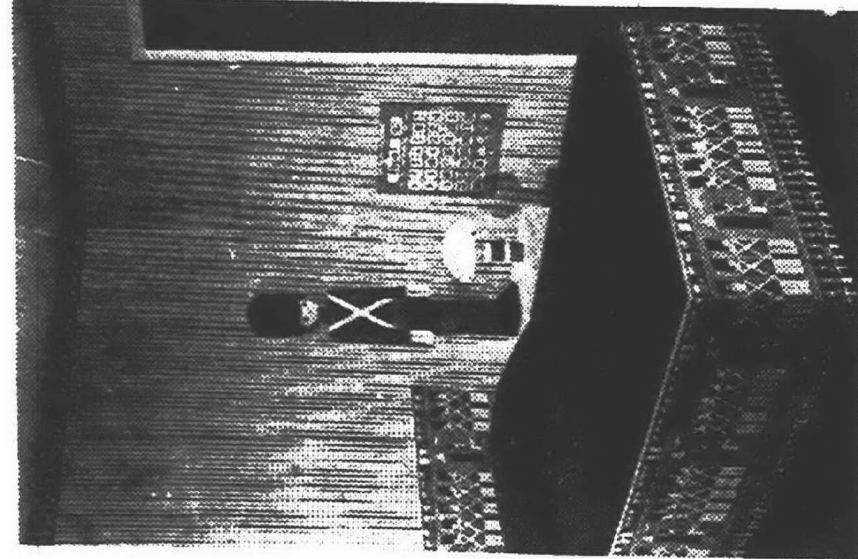
Be sure to remove all the old paper, fill the cracks and holes, and sand rough areas. To make sure your room has a professional look when finished, apply a fast and economical coat of wall size.

Wall size acts as the first coat in preparing surfaces for papering. It also is an ideal sealer.

According to home improvement advisors you should allow at least two inches at the top and bottom for matching and trimming when cutting strips of wallcovering. This helps you match exactly the pattern of each succeeding

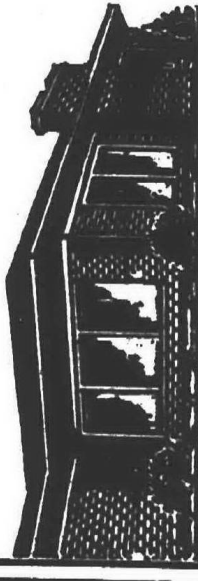
strip at the righthand side of the preceding strip.

A one-pound package of adhesive should hang 14 rolls of wallpaper.

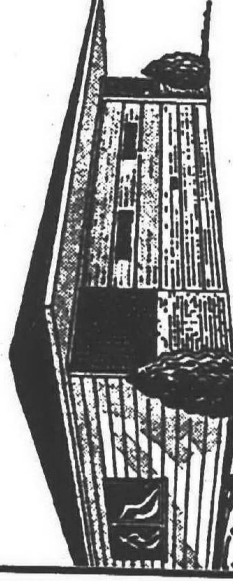

## The Great Cover-Ups....

Once you've mastered your first slipcover project you'll find home decorating "from scratch" is a satisfying as well as a money-saving project.

Slipcovers should not merely protect your upholstery, they should show off the piece of furniture.

Today, upholstery fabrics and trimmings come in a plethora of styles and colors to give zip and dazzle to slipcovers.

Try the tips below and you'll soon be eyeing those bargain chairs with the thought of giving them a treatment.

**KEEP THESE** points in mind when making your own slipcovers:

- Slipcovers should be fitted, pinned and cut on the right side. Otherwise the arms will be reversed.

- Be sure to cut and pin goods on the straight of the thread, up and down from the floor.

- Use sharp scissors and use a one-inch seam, throughout.

- An old slipcover, if available, is a good pattern.

- Lay the material out right side up. Pin here and there to keep fabric straight. Gather and clip around curved sections to ease fit.

- Pin seams together as you cut each piece.

- Once your slipcover is cut and pinned, lift off of chair. Sew one seam at a time, beginning with inside chair pieces, then outside arms and wings, then front arm panels. Unpin one full seam at a time, insert welting or trimming, and sew, before continuing to the next seam.

### SEWING HINTS:

Cut a separate piece for the top of a square arm chair.

Add an extra five inches of fabric to a skirtless slipcover: turn under and fasten with upholstery pins or Velcro.

Cut slipcover skirt separately, adding one inch for hem and one-half inch for seam closing.

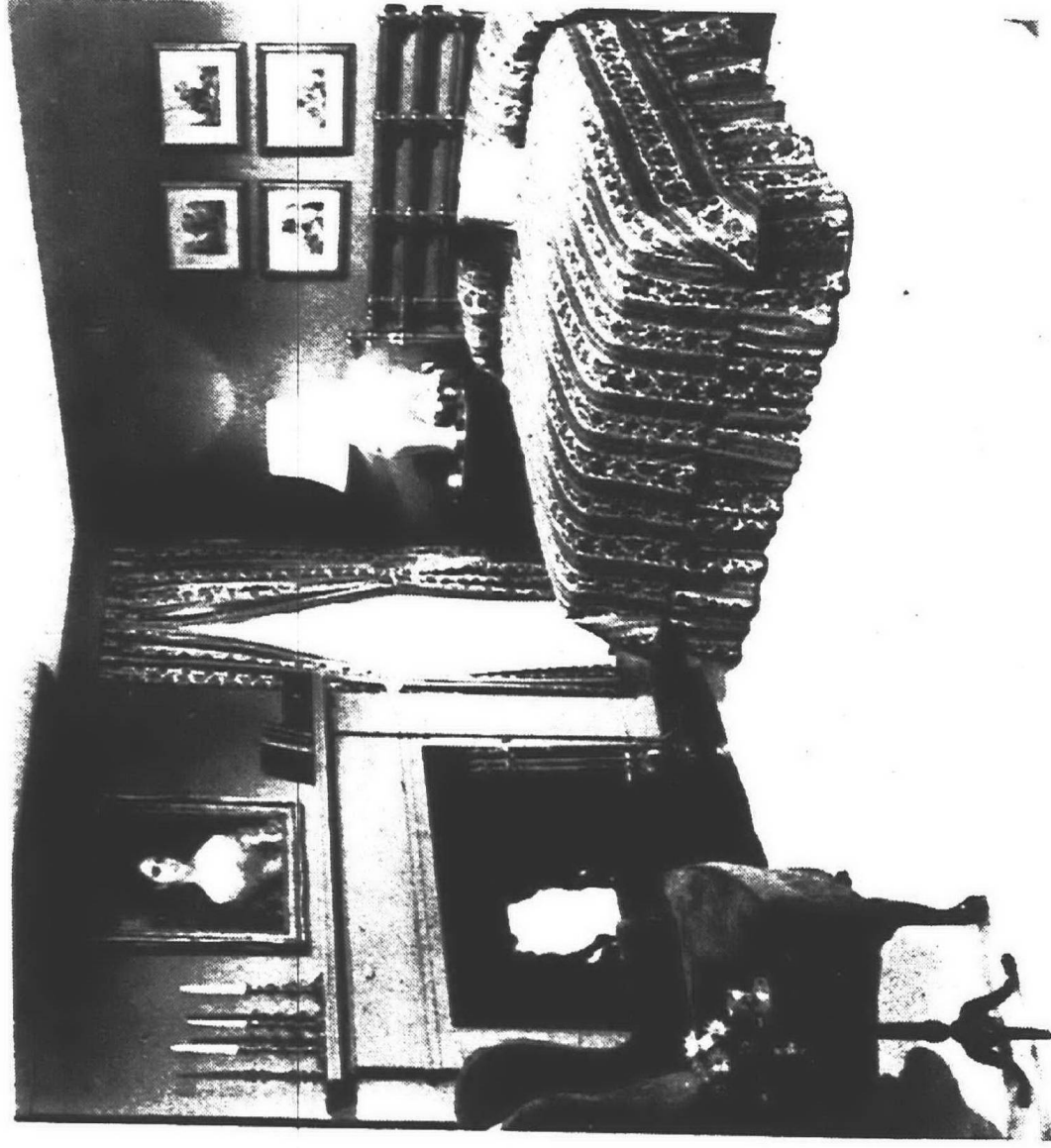
### TRIMMING TIPS:

Ready-made welting comes by the yard; try it in contrasting colors for the in-trim look.

For a truly coordinated look, repeat the slipcover trimming elsewhere in your room. Use trim on draperies or valance, or on a small area rug, on pillows, or as a dado around the wall. You could even cover a picture frame or mat with your slipcover trimming.

Directions for the most complicated slipcovers, wing chairs and sofa beds, can be found in books such as Conso's "1001 Decorating Ideas Homemaker's Handbook." It is on sale where drapery fabrics are sold and in bookstores.

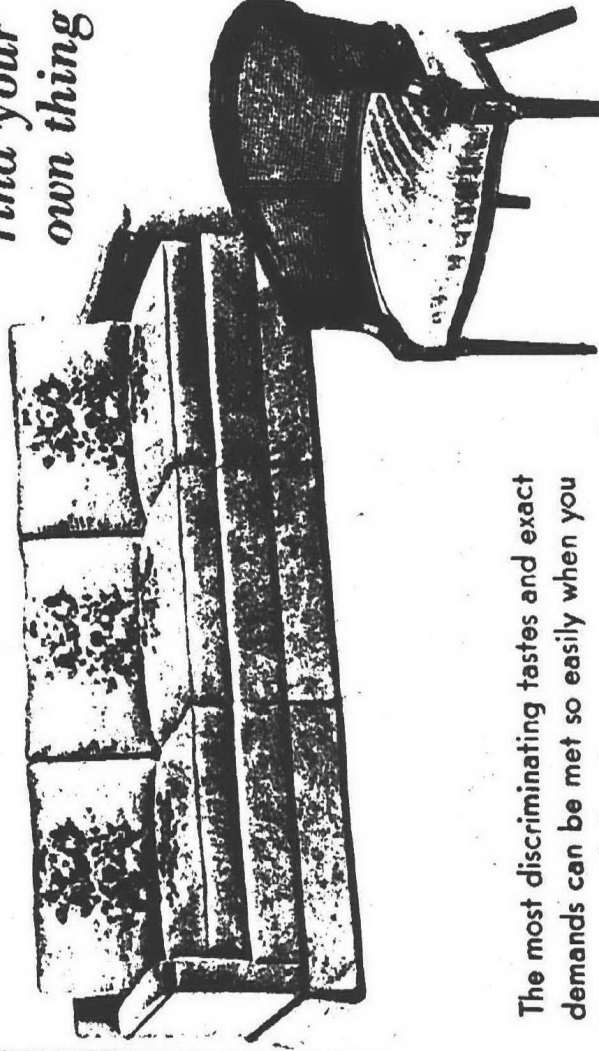

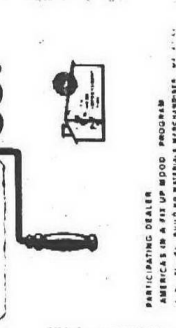

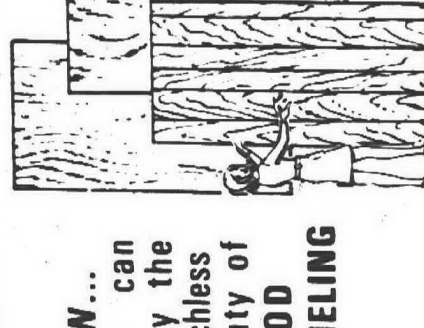
