Two Observerland faculty members of Wayne State University have received research funds.

Assoc. Prof. Gordon F Anderson of 25142 Muerland. 

"THE WHOLE issue of local control is interwoven in this concept, for as the State of Michigan enters more deeply into the financial support of our schools it will be most difficult for state legislators or the State Board of Education or the governor not to include controls and yardsticks of measurement along with the larger checks. Accountability is a word we are hearing more and more in education. And we shall have to face the responsibility of being able to come from. The state assessment tests are a leading indicator of this.

"Objective evaluations by "Wiser and better imperative as we face mounting demands for services from all our levels of

> "We in education must be aware of the total needs of our communities to insure that we have our fair share of the dollars available to take care of education but not at the expense of other programs that may be equally necessary and that might indeed make our work easier. I used to think that more and better education for all was the prescription that would cure all of society's ills. Unfortunately it is far from being that simple.

"In many ways I regret my decision to leave the board at this time. (Assuming of course that I would be re-elected which might not be).

"The next few years in our Plymouth District are going to be exciting and interesting ones in education - painful, too, at 'times. But a firm foundation has been laid by hundreds of people working cooperatively throughout the laet two decades to bring a good education to our children.







"The list of reasons people have given me as to why they intend to cast a negative millage vote is endless," Libbing commented.

"As I engage them in conversation and attempt to point out some considerations that they may not have perceived before, their fuel supply continues to feed the fires and further negative comments and sore points are brought forth.

"A typical list would include modular scheduling, the commons area at the high school, taxes, the handling of the James Rossman case, busing, drugs, quality of teaching staff, and Canton-Salem high school names.

"In the late '50s I can remember that one of the biggest stinks in town occurred when a couple of Huck Finn types painted the last two digits of their graduation year on the water tower. I believe it was a few years later that the piranha were slipped into the cook's goldfish aquarium in the high school kitchen. Minor now, they were hot items then.

"I DON'T PROPOSE to comment on all the local issues that are grieving the public, but perhaps a few words about one of them will serve my purpose.

#### Newcomers Of Canton To Organize



#### Loitering Ban OK'd By Twp.

**PLYMOUTH** An ordinance prohibiting loitering at any school located in Plymouth Township was given unanimous approval this week by the township board.

Both the City of Plymouth and Canton Township already have a similar measure on the books, and earlier in the year school officials asked Plymouth. Township to enact such legislation.

West and Pioneer Middle Schools and Bird, Allen, Fiegel and Isbister elementary schools all are located in the township.



# RU Captures Observer Relay Crown

The second running of the Observerland Relays lived up to all expectations with the one surprise being the overall champion in Redford Union.

The Panther cindermen brought the crowd of over 2,000 to its feet with a 440 relay win over powerful Franklin and Bishop Borgess along with firsts in the high jump and pole vault.

RU also scored a third in the 880 relay; fourth in the shot put and shuttle hurdle relay; and fifth in the long jump, two mile, and distance medley relay.

Livonia Stevenson gave the title bid a real shot but fell two points shy at 23 points. Franklin finished third with 21, Bishop Borgess fourth with 191/2 and Churchill fifth with 16 points.

It was a busy day at the Lola Valley junior high track with pole vaulting starting at 3:30 p.m., hot dogs sold out by 7 p.m. and RU crowned champions at 11:30 p.m. with pole vaulting ending around 12:30 p.m.

EVERY RELAY RECORD was broken with only two individual marks standing from the first running of the relays in 1971. The two being the best shot put by Farmington's Tom Massey at 55'11½" and the top long jump by Mike Gow of North Farmington at 20'8".

Southfield Lathrup's Matt Hepler had the best shot put with a toss of 52' but Garden City West put it all together for a relay first. Mike Green, Gary Snyder and Gerald Holmes combined for 146'21/2" which topped the mark of North Farmington at 141'81/4"



Thurston trio of Dennis D'Annuzio, Bill Van Alsten and Rick Westphal captured first in the long jump with a total distance of 58'81/2" bettering North Farmington's mark of 57'111/2".

RU scored its first win in the high jump with a total height of 17'3". Dave Schoof, Paul Matthews and Scott O'Grady made up the winning combination. School had the best jump at 6'1", also a record.

CHURCHILL OPENED the running events with top honors in the four mile relay, with a time of 18:37.1. The Charger quartet of Don Shaw. Randy Saletnik, Don Priebe and Dennis Kurtis broke the mark Churchill set last year at 18:49.9. of which Kurtis was also a member.

The 880 relay as expected was right down to the wire with favorites Franklin, Farmington, RU and Borgess battling it out. But the fastest 880 relay team in the area proved itself again with Mike McKindles, Chuck Quinn, Mark Newman and Ken Yuhasz scoring a Franklin first at 1:32.7, breaking North Farmington's mark of 1:33.9.

Franklin's hopes of an Observerland championship started to vanish when Plymouth dashed to top honors in the two mile relay. This was one race Patriot Coach Bob Holmes had been counting on but the combination of Brian Smith, Eric Weber, Tom Matthews and Scott Dunson bettered Franklin by two seconds.

STEVENSON scored its lone first in the distance medley with Tim Duffy, Rich Fuerst, Bill Walker and Dave Mathia clocking in 10:54.4.

Next came the shuttle hurdle relay with favorite Bishop Borgess proving true to form with a first at :58.2. The hurdling foursome was Tim DeBeliso, Mark Cesarz, Mark Sopko and Greg Battle.

Everyone at the track knew what the next event was . . . the 440 relay. By the time the third and fastest heat was to start, everyone in attendance was standing with Stevenson in lane one, Borgess in lane two, Farmington in three, RU in four, Franklin in five and GC East in six.

The crowd was in an uproar at the gun and Tom Tullock had the edge in the first turn for RU. Jim Prince and Tim Biehl kept the Panthers in front and when Biehl handed off to Tom Burk Porgess, Franklin and Farmington were closing

The final running event was the mile relay and the Franklin team of Tom Chester, John Dawe, Chuck Quinn and Joe Jinnett dashed away with top honors at 3:39.4 with Stevenson four second behind.

Some three hours later, the pole vault event came to a close with Farmington's Nat Durham the individual winner at 13'7" and RU the relay winner with a total height of 32'6".

Scott Bjerke, Greg Broquet and Dave Bloomingburg combined for the Panther clincher, and Coach John MacKenzie couldn't have had a bigger smile.

**DEFENDING CHAMPION Farmington** placed eighth with only 11 points.

"We were plain flat," said Falcon Coach Jerry Young. "We didn't run too hot but it was a great meet to be a part of."

Franklin Coach Bob Holmes expressed disappointment after the 17 school meet.

"We didn't come up with a single point in the field events," said Holmes. "Sure RU was on its home track and might have had a little advantage but we fell inches short in too many running

"The 440 relay was a must and RU really surprised me," added Holmes.

RU might even have surprised itself. Coach MacKenzie knew he had the potential but the question was if he could put it all in the right places for a meet of this sort which required

overall balance and depth.

#### **Oriental Poppies Grown From Seed** Few garden flowers elicit as the year following seed

much admiration as does the sowing. Oriental poppy. Blooms are so big, so bright, so beautiful.

While it is possible to buy roots of these poppies to move in late summer, it also is possible and much cheaper to grown them from seeds.

you can be quite certain that at least some of the resulting plants will have the same flower color as the named parent.

But, it is the nature of plants grown from seeds to vary, so that there also will be other flower colors in the seedlings you raise.

MANY gardeners prefer the several colors. After all, growing perennials from seeds is an adventure, particularly if the perennial is Oriental poppy.

Sow seeds of this poppy in a seed bed or special place where you can care for the seedlings. Keep them watered and weeded. Thin as necessary so individuals are not crowded and transplant the thinnings. Your most magnificent poppy may be among them.





A nurseryman friend of mine, R. W. Daubendiek of Harpers' Ferry, Iowa, has second - generation trees which are 30 years old, and which show no sign of blight. In addition, he has about five acres planted with about 20,000 third generation American chestnut seedlings which he is hopeful will be free from the disease.

"THE LATEST FIELD tests indicate that a combination of pruning and fungicide injection give many infected trees a good chance for survival providing the first symptoms of disease are reported promptly to a qualified tree expert. Here are

the steps involved: "Surveillance -- Elms should be checked daily during months of June, July and August for any sign of wilting, known as "flagging" in the crown. Should any limb or series of limbs show substantial yellowing of leaves, this should be reported the same day to your tree expert.

"Injection - Recent work by qualified investigators show that early injection of the fungicide such as Benlate benomyl one to three days after first report of flagging will inhibit further spread of the disease. This material is introduced into the system of the tree by way of capsules with feeder tubes placed on the trunk approximately six feet above ground level.

"Pruning - At the same time, limbs that show flagging should be cut off at a point where they join the main trunk. If done in time, this will help prevent travel of the fungus downward into the main system of the tree.

"Identification - Although most cases of D.E.D. can be diagnosed on sight, it is wise to make positive identification by a subsequent laboratory test. This can be done by your tree expert. However, it should not delay the above treatment. Urgency for immediate treatment makes it impossible to delay action for laboratory confirmation of diagnosis. In other words treat first, confirm diagnosis later or it may be too late to treat at

"as one of the two members of the Governor's Special Commission on Land Use;


"and recently as a member of the Detroit-Wayne County Criminal Justice System Coordinating Council and chairman of the Western Wayne County Mayor Supervisor Association.

# Legislative Process Breaking Down In Tangle Of Politics

The legislative process in the State of Michigan is not working. The present State Legislature was elected in November, 1970. In 1971 the Legislature passed the age of majority package

(important law, but easy to somewhat pass), repressive drug laws, no-fault responsibility. divorce, and an increased income tax rate. So far this year. the Legislature has adopted a miserably watered-down billboard control bill and legislation to help finance a new stadium in Detroit. Still up in the air are congressional apportionment, overhaul of the state criminal

code, wiretapping, off-track betting, no-fault auto insurance, abortion reform, continuation of the 1.3 per cent income tax, and the entire 1972-73 budget. Of these, all except of the budget. the budget bills were in-

troduced in 1971. It's a terrible record, and one which hurts us in the suburbs more than other groups in the graduated income state because the changes in our society which require ballot. legislative remedy hit us in the suburbs faster and harder than

WITH ONLY seven weeks left before the summer recess effectively ends meaningful legislative activity, the temptation is to call them all a bunch of narrow-minded goons and hope they all get licked when they try to run for re-election. While there may well be some

merit in this approach, it isn't entirely fair or analytic of the problems the Legislature has faced over the past two years.

elsewhere. .

Two heavily emotional issues - re-apportionment and cross district bussing - have been very important in botching up the normal legislative process. State Rep. Marvin Stempien (D-Livonia) estimates that these two matters alone have chewed up at least one-quarter of the Legislature's time over the past year.

The thrust of the reapportionment issue is purely political and self-interested. Any legislator wants to be sure that his own chances for reelection are not hurt by any redistricting that might be done; when it comes to a politician saving his own skin, normal legislative procedure be damned!

Complicating the apportionment question are the ambitions of many state legislators to carve out congressional districts for

themselves. Sometimes this ambition is acted out fairly responsively (locally, Stempien and State Rep. Dan Cooper, representing Southfield, are examples). Other times (John Bowman of Roseville being the best illustration), personal ambition replaces public

The impact of bussing is well known. In the Legislature it produced the most emotional debate in many years and this cut entirely across normal political lines. Democrats were raging at Democrats, and Republicans at Republicans; leadership powers over delegations were accordingly reduced to nothingness.

A FURTHER explanation of the futility of the Legislature lies in the complicated question

Last Friday, in one of the most important votes this year, the State Senate rejected an effort to put a property tax referendum on the November

As State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) points out, you can't have much meaningful discussion about what to do with government policy until you have settled the matter of how you are going to get the money. This issue has been at the heart of legislative inaction for at least three years now, with the major hangup being the refusal of majority Republicans in the State Senate to accept the idea of a graduated income tax -- an idea endorsed by Republican Gov. Milliken, the Michigan Chamber of Commerce, and the Michigan Manufacturers Association.

Frankly, I do not expect the Legislature to sort out this problem itself. The governor and Atty. Gen. Frank Kelley have asked the State Supreme Court to rule on the matter of property taxes, and it now looks as though the court will direct a solution where the Legislature has been unable to act.

WHAT DOES this chronicle of failure and futility mean?

First, that the legislative process is effective when issues are clear enough for meaningful debate and compromise is possible. That is not the case this year.

Second, the legislative process does not work when highly emotional issues (selfinterest in re-apportionment, bussing) are involved.

Third, despite these two very understandable explanations

## **Board** Gets, A Mandate

Farmington residents turned out in record numbers April 24 to defeat a Farmington Schools' request for 3.5 mills for one year. That vote must not only be accepted as being record but should be viewed as a mandate of the people to operate the schools with funds available.

The outcome was close, 205 vote margin, and it is amazing that 5,980 residents did see fit to vote "YES" on the question when additional school millage questions are dropping like dead flies across the state. But 50 per cent of the district's registered voters turned out and, bitter as it might be, the outcome must be accepted and trims made.

IT WOULD be ill - advised for the school board to attempt another millage election during

The best chance to pass the millage was on April 24 because a strong campaign was conducted and met by minimum group opposition. The climate was ideal for passage, except for fears of cross - district bussing and taxpayers' fed up with rising home assessments.

With George Wallace campaigning for president, bussing will remain an emotional cloudburst until November regardless of what decisions are made by Judge Stephen Roth or what appeals are filed. Assessments will continue to rise and relief will never come until legislators get off their duffs and put a meaningful educational reform package on the ballot.

The temptation for the school board to try another election is strong because who among us would enjoy having to decide how to trim \$400,000 from a \$17 million operating budget that already is fatless from trims made by two millage defeats last year.

TRIMMING that \$400,000 may require eliminating all extra - curricular activities, including varsity sports. It could mean laying off another 40 teachers in addition to those laid off last year, or closing a school down, or going on half day sessions.

The board's challenge is to make those trims in the most judicious manner possible, but the cuts should be made and attempts for another millage vote forgotten about until 1973.

The criteria should be to trim in such a manner as to hurt students less. At this point, we can forget about hurting parents and alumni but should concentrate on trimming \$400,000 in such a way to do least harm to students.

Especially important are the losses which must be borne by elementary pupils. Last year, the cuts unfairly hurt the elementary youngsters more than secondary students. Decisions like this should not be repeated.

The actions which must be taken will seem drastic to school trustees and the 5.980 residents who voted in favor of the millage. But some lessons in this country must be learned outside the classroom and, in Farmington, must be learned by 6,185 adults who must be slapped in the face with the truth instead of having it penetrate their ears.

are finding quite effective. We hope to make it more effective with the passage of time. "However, in all honesty it is quite obvious

that this type of plan is not the answer for all students, and we will have to continue to examine ways to help those students who are not func-

tioning well under the modular system. "I might add, however, that we had a similar percentage of students unable to function adequately under the traditional set-up.

"JUST AS SOCIETY in general is increasingly beset with a greater abundance of hard-to-solve problems, our schools, being a part of the whole, have their share.

"We must keep in mind these facts: never before have our schools offered such a wealth of curriculum choice, opportunities to learn in a multitude of ways, supplementary and specialized programs, instructional hardware, and assistance for those in need of it.

"I can't help but wonder how many more national awards our band must obtain, or how many more hundreds need to be placed on the honor rolls, or how many more successful graduates we must turn out, before people realize that the school system is alive and well and doing the job it was asked to do even in the face of mounting pressures and problems.

"School names and other issues have to be dealt with, but if they are used as reasons to reduce support for the program in its entirety, then we have failed as society to cope with ourselves realistically and to take note of our accomplishments."

Communist China is far less threatening than many Americans have been conditioned to believe, says a man who knows the country well. In fact, hardly threatening at all, in the view of Allen S. Whiting, who also is sure that President Richard Nixon's recent visit to China opens the Vietnam." way to a new view of that vast nation.

Dr. Whiting, professor of political science and associate at the University of Michigan Center for Chinese Studies as well as National Security **Council and State Department** consultant, spoke Monday for the Plymouth - Northville League of Women Voters annual meeting.

Dr. Whiting, who has spent years in China on several study trips, documented in detail his position that facts do not bear out the fear of China exemplified in a September Gallup Poll.

"And the army of China is close to the people in the matter of everyday living," he added. "There's hardly a factory, school or commune per cent of the American without army personnel

> In the matter of sea and air power, he pointed out that China's biggest ships are destroyers and its planes are largely fighter interceptors, designed to repel invaders.

> **NUCLEAR WEAPON work** began from Russian blueprints before Russia decided China was dangerous, Dr. Whiting said. "We used to hear about Chinese ICBMs, but we don't any more because China decided not to go for that kind of ar-

"If you look at the pronouncements of several American presidents from the Chinese viewpoint, you have to see how threatened that of Detroit, he was precountry has felt," he said.

"To China, the United States appears a mysterious, inscrutable, unpredictable country. It's true that Mao Tse Tung has made remarks about China being able to lose a million people in a nuclear war, but nothing in China's behavior at any time has shown rashness in case of nuclear attack."

DR. WHITING maintained that only one of the nine cases of Chinese force has been unprovoked.

"In Korea, for instance, the Chinese tried desperately to prevent involvement by repeated warnings that it would happen if U.S. came all the way to the border," he

"In India, it was an answering force. In Vietnam, the Chinese have kept to the rear, repairing railroads we bombed, for example. There, the message the Chinese are giving the North Vietnamese is 'We will stand by you, but we will not be agressor'.'

Dr. Whiting said the Chinese "have taken it from foreigners for many years" and now have great mistrust and antipathy toward the Russians. They also consider the Japanese a far greater threat than the United States, he added.
