Mike Hoben Is Full-Time **School Head**



JOHN M. HOBEN -- known popularly throughout the community as "Mike" - was appointed Tuesday night as the full-time superintendent of the local school system by the Plymouth Board of Education.

Hoben had been "acting" superintendent since James H. Rossman was fired by the board last December.

From more than 100 candidates, the only other finalist under consideration had been 45 - year - old Douglas Lund, former superintendent of the Rochester, Mich., schools.


Hoben was the choice of the board by a 6-1 vote, having a solid majority ever since the trustees trimmed the list of candidates to three.

Hoben moved into Plymouth school administrative assignments after serving 11 highly successful years as football coach. He also was a member of the counseling staff and was assistant principal in charge of counseling when he gave up the football duties to move into the administrative side of the profession.

He is a graduate of Adrian College where he starred in athletics before taking a coaching assignment at Cheboygan. Hoben also starred in football at the University of Michigan during the war years as a member of the Marine unit stationed there for training. He served in World War II and came out with the rank of captain.

It was his success as a football coach at Cheboygan that brought him to the attention of Plymouth school officials and resulted in his acceptance of the coaching job at PHS.

As Lt. Col. Hal J. Gibson, who is the commanding officer and conductor, told the throng Continued on Page 4A





"Tonquish was their chief," he writes, "and The choicest nuggets of information come their leader in these acts of lawlessness. In his imperious."

> After dealing with many of these forays of lawlessness along the trail from Detroit westward toward Plymouth, the author deals with the final moments of the chief and reveals that he died as he lived - recklessly.

> "The last act in the drama of his life occurred in the fall of 1819," he relates, "when the Indians entered the home of a man named Sargeant, and took from it all the bread the family had and departed.

> "The Indians then fled, and the settlers hastily collected, organized and armed themselves and started in pursuit. The Indians fled up the Rouge River to its confluence with the west branch which they followed up the north side. At that point the Indians turned to the left and crossed the stream, since known as Tonquish Creek."

HE RELATES how the whites finally captured all but Chief Tonquish's son, who ran. As he scurried away Major Macomb, leader of the whites, aimed his gun to shoot him, but Chief Tonquish stopped him and said he would call his son back.

Instead, in Indian language, he told him to run, and finally he was felled with a bullet in his

'The chief had been disarmed except for his knife and, seeing his son fall, drew his knife and sprung at the major," writes Osband.

That proved to be his undoing as the author then relates that the major shot him in the scuffle. "He died that night and with this, and his

son's death, ended the Indian troubles in

Such is the story of Chief Tonquish and a life devoted to lawlessness and wanton destruction along the trail that now is one of the arteries of travel in the Plymouth area.

Summing up his life, The Stroller's old friend, Ray Grimm, a history buff, said "Chief Tonquish was a scoundrel."

No wonder all that has been named as a remembrance of him is a storm sewer.





ALTHOUGH THE DATE of a given year is inscribed upon these awards, the real significance seems to me to be in the fact that they actually salute an individual's accumulative community service.



Chevy Plant Will Train **Firefighters**

The plant fire brigade at Chevrolet Motor Division's Spring and Bumper facility will "fight fire with fire" in an outdoor training program during a two week period beginning Monday, June 5.

The purpose of the firefighting exercise, according to Plant Manager W.O. Muller, is to update employes who voluntarily serve on the fire brigade on the latest methods of extinguishing actual industrial fires. The annual training session is supplemented by an intensive year-round program of fire prevention training.

In planning the sessions, Muller said special attention was given to ways of minimizing excessive smoke, undesirable fumes and particulate matter. "We plan to have enough of a fire to make it a realistic and worthwhile training activity without causing a serious air pollution program in the area," he added.

Test fires of different types will be set under close control in a safe area on plant property. The plant fire brigade will be given instructions on how to identify the cause of a fire and also in selecting the right extinguishing agent.


At the next meeting, on May 22, Dr. Stanford Smith will discuss the changing fish populations in the Great Lakes. Anyone who is interested is invited to attend.

Tomato plants like a uniform supply of water at all times. Dry soil stunts growth and causes the bottom of fruits to develop a brownish-black spot called blossom end rot.



Leaf miners mine out the centers of leaves leaving only the outer surface of the leaf, which is almost transparent. Whole leaves or major portions of the leaves may be destroyed.

Adults lay eggs in the leaves in early May, but activity has been delayed due to the cool weather. It should begin as the weather warms.

Trees commonly affected are elms, oak, maple, etc. Birch and hawthorne are especially susceptible. Last year a heavy infestation occurred on oaks.

CONTROL: Systemics appear to be effective on this insect. Applications should be made now. Use two per cent Di-Syston granules applied to the soil in the root area. Sprays may be applied later when mines first appear on the leaf and before they reach % inch in diameter.

Watch for black pimples on the leaf surface, which are indications that eggs have been laid. Apply three sprays seven to 10 days apart, of 57 per cent Malathion emulsion at rate of two teaspoons per gallon. A second but less damaging brood of this insect appears in July.







ORDINANCE NO. 378

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 341, ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH, MICHIGAN, AS AMENDED.

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Section 200 of Article II - Definitions of Ordinance No. 341, known as the City of Plymouth Zoning Ordinance, as amended, is hereby amended to read

"SECTION 200. For the purposes of this Ordinance. certain terms or words used herein shall be interpreted as follows

The word "Person" includes a firm, association. organization, partnership, trust, company, or corporation, as well as an individual: The present tense includes the future tense, the singular number includes the plural, and the plural number includes the singular; the word "shall" is mandatory; and the word "may" is permissive; the words "used" or "occupies" include the words "intended," designed," or "arranged to be used or occupied," the word "building" includes the word "structure," and the word "dwelling" includes the word "residence," the word "lot" includes the words "plot" or "parcel."

Terms not herein defined shall have the meaning customarily assigned to them.

Accessory Use or Building: Is a use or building on the same lot with, and of a nature customarily incident and subordinate to those of the main use or building.

Alley: Any dedicated public way affording a secondary means of access to abutting property, and not intended for general traffic circulation.

Alterations: Is any change, addition, or modification in construction or type of occupancy, any changes in the structural members of a building, such as walls or partitions, columns, beams or girders, the consummated act of which may be referred to herein as "altered" or "reconstructed"

Apartments: The dwelling units in a multiple dwelling shall provide the following in terms of floor

(a) Efficiency Apartment: Is a dwelling unit containing not over three hundred and fifty (350) squarefeet of floor area, and consisting of not more than one (1) room in addition to kitchen and necessary sanitary facilities.

(b) One-Bedroom Unit Is a dwelling unit containing a minimum floor area of at least four hundred and fifty (450) square feet per unit, consisting of not more than three (3) rooms in addition to kitchen and necessary sanitary facilities

(c) Two-Bedroom Unit: Is a dwelling unit containing a minimum floor-area of at least six hundred (600) square feet per unit, consisting of not more than four (4) rooms in addition to kitchen and necessary sanitary facilities.

(d) Three-or-More Bedroom Unit: Is a dwelling unit wherein for each room in addition to the four (4) rooms permitted in a two (2)-bedroom unit, there shall be provided an additional area of one hundred fifty (150) square feet to the minimum floor-area of six hundred (600) square feet.

Auto Repair Station: Is a place where, along with the sale of engine fuels, the following services may be carried out: general repair, engine rebuilding, rebuilding or reconditioning of motor vehicles, collision service, such as body, frame, or fender straightening and repair; over-all painting and undercoating on automobiles.

Auto Service Station: Is a building or premises or portions thereof arranged or designed to be used for the retail sale of oil, gasoline or other fuel for the propulsion or lubrication of motor vehicles and which may include facilities for changing of tires, tube-repairing, polishing, greasing, washing or servicing such motor vehicles; but excluding so-called high speed automotive washing, steam cleaning, body repairing, bumping or painting.

Auto Wash, Highspeed: Is a building or portion thereof containing facilities for washing more than two automobiles, using production-line methods such as a chain conveyor, blower, steam-cleaning device, or other mechanical devices.

Basement: Is that portion of a building which is partly or wholly below grade but so located that the vertical distance from the average grade to the floor is greater than the vertical distance from the average grade to the ceiling. A basement shall not be counted as a story

Block: Is the property abutting one side of a street and lying between the two nearest intersecting streets, or between the nearest such street and railroad right-of-way, unsubdivided acreage, river or live stream, or between any of the foregoing and any other barrier to the continuity of development.

Building: Is any structure, either temporary or permanent, having a roof supported by columns or walls, and intended for the shelter, or enclosure of persons, animals, chattels, or property of any kind.

Building Height: Is the vertical distance measured from the established grade to the highest point of the roof surface for flat roofs; to the deck line of mansard roofs; and to the average height between eaves and ridge for gable, hip, and gambrel roofs. Where a building is located on sloping terrain, the height may be measured from the average groundlevel of the grade at the building wall.

Building Line: Is a line formed by the face of the building, and for the purposes of this Ordinance, a building line is the same as a front-setback line.

Club: Is an organization of persons for special purposes or for the promulgation of sports, arts, sciences, literature, politics, or the like, but not operated

Condominium: Is a building or group of buildings in which individual portions thereof are owned by or offered for sale to separate entities, with common elements owned jointly as prescribed by Act 229 of 1963, as amended.

Court: Is an open, unoccupied space, other than a required front, side, or rear yard, and bounded on at least two sides by a building. A court extending to the front yard or front lot line or to the rear yard or rear lot line is an Outer Court. Any other court is an

Inner Court. District: Is a portion of the incorporated area of the Municipality within which certain regulations and requirements or various combinations thereof apply under the provisions of this Ordinance.

Drive-In: Is a business establishment so developed that its retail or service character is dependent on providing a driveway approach or parking spaces for motor vehicles so as to serve patrons while in the motor vehicle, regardless of whether self-service is involved.

Dwelling Unit: Is a building, or portion thereof,

designed for occupancy exclusively by one (1) family for residential purposes and having cooking facilities and separate sanitary facilities.

Dwelling, One-Family: Is a building designed exclusively for and occupied exclusively by one (1)

Dwelling, Two-Family: Is a building designed exclusively for occupancy by two (2) families, living independently of each other.

Dwelling, Multiple-Family: Is a building, group of buildings or portion of a building designed exclusively for occupancy by three (3) or more families on a lease or rental basis, living independently of each other.

Erected: Includes built, constructed, altered, reconstructed, moved upon, or any physical operation on the premises which are required for the construction. Excavation, fill, drainage, and the like, shall be considered a part of erection.

Excavation: Is any breaking of ground, except common household-gardening and ground care.

Essential Services: Is the erection, construction, alteration or maintenance by public utilities or municipal departments of underground, surface, or overhead gas, electrical, steam, fuel or water transmission or distributions systems, collection, communication, supply or disposal systems, including towers, poles, wires, mains, drains, sewers, pipes, conduits, cables, fire-alarm and police call-boxes, traffic signals, hydrants and similar accessories in connection therewith, but not including buildings which are necessary for the furnishing of adequate service by such utilities or municipal departments for the general health, safety, or welfare.

Family: Is one or two persons or parents, with their direct lineal descendants and adopted children (and including the domestic employees thereof) together with not more than two persons not so related, living together in the whole or part of a dwelling comprising a single housekeeping unit. Every additional group of two or less persons living in such housekeeping unit shall be considered a separate family for the purpose of this Ordinance.

Filling: Is the depositing or dumping of any matter on to, or into the ground, except common household gardening and ground care.

Floor-Area Ratio: The ratio of the floor area of build-

For example: When a floor-area ratio of five-tenths (0.5) is specified the floor area of a building constructed on a lot of ten thousand (10,000) square feet in area is limited to a maximum of five thousand (5,000) square feet. The number of stories being Optional, the building area may be five thousand (5,000) square feet for one (1) story; twenty-five hundred (2.500) square feet for each of two (2) stories, and so forth. The purpose of this ratio is to control the bulk of buildings and encourage the development of open space or plazas about structures in the intensely developed portions of the City.

Floor Area: For the purposes of computing the minimum allowable floor area in a residential dwelling unit, the sum of the horizontal areas of each story of the building shall be measured from the exterior faces of the exterior walls. The floor-area measurement is exclusive of areas of basements, unfinished attics, attached garages, breezeways, and enclosed and unenclosed porches.

Grade: Grade shall mean a ground elevation established for the purpose of regulating the number of stories and the height of the building. The building grade shall be the level of the ground adjacent to the walls of the building if the finished grade is level. If the ground is not entirely level, the grade shall be " determined by averaging the elevation of the ground for each face of the building.

Greenbelt: A strip of land of definite width and location reserved for the planting of shrubs and/or trees to serve as an obscuring screen or buffer strip in carrying out the requirements of this Ordinance.

Home Occupation: Home occupations may include such personal or professional services as that of a doctor, dentist, engineer architect, lawyer, accountant, dressmaker, barber or beautician. Such services shall be carried on by no more than one (1) individual residing in the dwelling.

Junk Yards: Is an open area where waste, used or second-hand materials are brought and sold, exchanged, stored, baled, packed, disassembled, or handled, including, but not limited to; scrap iron and other metals, paper, rags, rubber tires, and bottles. A "Junk Yard" includes automobile-wrecking yards and includes any area of more than two-hundred (200) square feet for storage, keeping or abandonment of junk but does not includes uses established entirely within enclosed buildings.

Kennel, Commercial: Any lot or premises on which three (3) or more dogs, cats and similar domestic animals are either permanently or temporarily boarded.

Loading Space: Is an off-street space on the same lot with a building, or group of buildings, for the temporary parking of a commercial vehicle while loading and unloading merchandise or materials.

Lot: Is a parcel of land occupied, or to be occupied, by a main building or a group of such buildings and accessory buildings, or utilized for the principal use and uses accessory thereto, together with such open spaces as are required under the provisions of this Ordinance. A lot may or may not be specifically designated as such on public records.

Lot Area: Is the total horizontal area within the lot lines of the lot

Lot Corner: A lot where the interior angle of two (2) adjacent sides at the intersection of two (2) streets is less than one-hundred thirty-five (135) degrees. A lot abutting upon a curve street or streets shall be considered a corner lot for the purposes of this Ordinance if the arc is of less radius than onehundred fifty (150) feet and the tangents to the curve, at the two points where the lot lines meet the curve or the straight street-line extended, form an interior angle of less than one-hundred thirty-five (135) degrees.

Lot Coverage: Is the part or per cent of the lot occupied by buildings, including accessory buildings.

Lot Depth: Is the horizontal distance between the front and rear lot-lines, measured along the median between the side lot-lines.

Lot Double Frontage: Is any interior lot having frontages on two (2) more or less parallel streets as distinguished from a corner lot. In the case of a row of double-frontage lots, all sides of said lots adjacent to streets shall be considered frontage, and front yards shall be provided as required.

Lot, Interior: Is any lot other than a corner lot. Lot Lines: The lines bounding a lot as defined

(a) Front Lot-Line: In the case of an interior lot, is that line separating said lot from the street. In the case of a corner lot, or double-frontage lot, is that line separating said lot from that street which is designated as the front street.

(b) Rear Lot-Line: Is that lot line opposite the: front lot-line. In the case of a lot pointed at the rear, the rear lot-line shall be an imaginary line parallel to the front lot-line, not less than ten (10) feet long lying farthest from the front lot-line and wholly within

the lot. (c) Side Lot-Line: Is any lot-line other than the front lot-line or rear lot-line. A side lot-line separating a lot from a street is a side-street lot-line separating a lot from another lot or lots is an interior side lot-

Lot of Record: Is a parcel of land, the dimensions of which are shown on a recorded plat on file with the County Register of Deeds at the time of adoption of this Ordinance, or in common use by Municipal or County Officials and which actually exists as so shown, or any part of such parcel held in a record ownership separate from that of the remainder thereof.

Lot Width: Is the horizontal distance between the side lot-lines measured at the two points where the building setback-line intersects the side lot-lines. except in the case of lots which diminish in width from front to rear, the lot width shall be measured at a distance of fifty (50) feet back from the front lot-

Main Building: Is a building in which is conducted the principal use of the lot upon which it is

Main Use: Is the principal use to which the

Major Thoroughfare: Is an arterial street which is intended to serve as a large volume trafficway for both the immediate Municipal area and the region beyond, and may be designated as a major thoroughfare, parkway, freeway, expressway, or equivalent. term to identify those streets comprising the basic structure of the street plan. Any street indicated as a major thoroughfare in the Thoroughfare Plan shall be considered a major thoroughfare for the purpose of this Ordinance.

Master Plan: Is the comprehensive plan including graphic and written proposals indicating the general location for streets, parks, schools, public buildings and all physical development of the Municipality, and includes any unit or part of such plan, and any amendment to such plan or parts thereof.

Mezzanine: Is an intermediate floor in any story occupying not to exceed one-third (1/3) of the floorarea of such story.

Mobile Home: A detached single-family dwelling unit with all of the following characteristics:

1. Designed for long-term occupancy, and containing sleeping accommodations, a flush toilet, a tub or shower bath, and kitchen facilities, with plumbing and electrical connections provided for attachment to outside systems.

2. Deisgned to be transported after fabrication on its own wheels, or flat bed or other trailers or detachable wheels.

3. Arriving at the site where it is to be occupied as a dwelling complete, including major appliances and furniture, and ready for occupancy except for minor and incidental unpacking and assembly operations, location on foundation supports, connection to utilities and the like.

Mobile-Home Park: A parcel of land under single ownership improved and licensed for the placement of mobile homes for non-transient use

Municipality: The word "municipality" shall mean the City of Plymouth.

Nonconforming Building: Is a building or portion thereof, existing at the effective date of this Ordinance, or amendments thereto, and that does not conform to the provisions of this Ordinance in the district in which it is located. Nonconforming Use: Is a use which lawfully

occupied a building or land at the effective date of this Ordinance, or amendments thereto, and that does not conform to the use regulations of the district in which it is located. Nursing or Convalescent Home: Is a structure

with sleeping rooms where persons are housed or lodged and furnished with means and nursing care

Nursery, Plant Material: Is a space, building or structure, or combination thereof, for the storage of live trees, shrubs, or plants offered for sale on the premises, including products used for gardening or landscaping. The definition of nursery within the meaning of this Ordinance does not include any space, building or structure used for the sale of fruits. vegetables, or Christmas trees.

Off-Street Parking Lot: Is a facility providing vehicular parking-space along with adequate drives and aisles, for maneuvering, so as to provide access for entrance and exit for the parking of more than

Parking Space: Is hereby determined to be an area as required by this Ordinance which shall be exclusive of drives, aisles or entrances giving access thereto, and shall be fully accessible for the storage or parking of permitted vehicles.

Public Utility: Is any person, firm or corporation, municipal department, board or commission duly authorized to furnish and furnishing under state or municipal regulations to the public, gas, steam, electricity, sewage disposal, communication, transporta-

Rooming Houses: The term rooming house -- a building other than a hotel-motel, or dormitory where for compensation and by prearrangement for a definite period, lodging or lodging and meals are provided for more than two (2) persons.

Rooming Unit: Any room or group of rooms forming a single habitable unit, used for living and sleeping, but which does not contain cooking or eating facilities.

Setback: The distance required to obtain front, side or rear yard open space provisions of this Ordi-

Sign: Is the use of any words, numerals, figures, devices, designs, or trademarks by which anything is made known, such as are used to show an individual firm, profession or business, and are visible to the general public.

Sign-Accessory: A sign which is accessory to the principal use of the premises

Sign-Nonaccessory: A sign which is not accessory to the principal use of the premises.

Stable, Private: A stable for the keeping of horses for use of the residents of the principal use and shall not include the keeping of horses for others. or for commercial boarding, and with a capacity for not more than two (2) horses; provided, however. that the capacity of a private stable may be increased if the lot whereon such stable is located contains at least one (1) acre of land for each additional horse

Stable, Public: A stable other than a private stable, with a capacity for more than two (2) horses, and carried on within an unplatted tract of land of not less than forty (40) acres.

Story: Is that part of a building; except a mezzanine as defined herein, included between the surface of one floor and the surface of the next floor, or if there is no floor above, then the ceiling next above. A story thus defined, shall not be counted as a story when more than fifty (50) per cent, by cubic content, is below the height level of the adjoining

Story, Half: Is an uppermost story lying under a sloping roof, the usable floor area of which, at a height of four (4) feet above the floor, does not exceed two-thirds (3/3) of the floor area in the story directly below, and the height above at least twohundred (200) square feet of floor space in seven

feet, six inches (7'-6"). Street: A right-of-way dedicated to public use

which provides vehicular and pedestrian access to adjacent properties, whether designated as a street, highway, thoroughfare, parkway, road, avenue, lane, or however otherwise designated.

Structure: Is anything constructed or erected, the use of which requires location on the ground or attachment to something having location on the ground, with the exception of fences, walls or pave-

Temporary Use of Building: Is a use or building permitted by the Board of Appeals to exist during periods of construction of the main building or use, or for special events or as otherwise permitted in this

Usable Floor Area: (For the purpose of computing parking) is that area used for or intended to be used for the sale of merchandise or services or for use to serve patrons, clients, or customers, including areas occupied by fixtures and equipment used for display or sale of merchandise. Such floor area which is used or intended to be used principally for the storage or processing of merchandise, or for utilities shall be excluded from this computation of "usable floor area." Measurement of the gross horizontal areas of the several floors of the building, measured from the interior faces of the exterior walls.

Use: Is the purpose for which land or a building is arranged, designed or intended, or for which land or a building is or may be occupied.

Yards: The open spaces on the same lot with a main building, unoccupied and unobstructed from the ground upward except as otherwise provided in this Ordinance, and as defined herein:

(a) Front Yard: Is an open space extending the full width of the lot, the depth of which is the minimum horizontal distance between the front lot-line and the nearest line of the main building.

(b) Rear Yard: Is an open space extending the full width of the lot the depth of which is the minimum horizontal distance between the rear lot-line and the nearest line of the main building.

(c) Side-Yard: Is an open space between a main building, and the side lot-line, extending from the front yard to the rear yard, the width of which is the horizontal distance from the nearest point of the side lot-line to the nearest point of the main building.

ZONING EXCEPTIONS AND VARIANCES

(a) Exception: An exception is a use permitted only after review of an application for a building permit by the Zoning Board of Appeals, or Planning Commission, other than the Administrative Official (Building Inspector), such review being necessary because the provisions of this Ordinance covering conditions, precedent or subsequent, are not precise enough to all applications without interpretation, and such review is required by the ordinance.

(b) Variance: Is a modification of the literal provisions of the Zoning Ordinance granted when strict enforcement of the Zoning Ordinance would cause undue hardship owing to circumstances unique to the individual property on which the variance is granted.

The crucial points of variance are:

(1) Undue Hardship

(2) Unique Circumstances; and (3) Applying to Property.

A variance is not justified unless all three (3) elements are present in the case.

The "exception" differs from the "variance" in several respects. An exception does not require "undue hardship" in order to be allowable. The exceptions that are found in this Ordinance appear as "special approval" or review by Planning Commission, or Zoning Board of Appeals. These land uses could not be conveniently allocated to one zone or another or the effects of such uses could not be definitely foreseen as of a given time. The general characteristics of these uses include one or more of the following:

(a) they require large areas

(b) they are infrequent

(c) they sometimes create an unusual amount of traffic

(d) they are sometimes obnoxious or hazardous (e) they are required for public safety and

convenience. SECTION 2. ARTICLE XVI - GENERAL EXCEP-TIONS - is hereby amended by addition of a new sec-

A single structure or a group of structures incorporates several different real estate and tax entities, thus creating new aspects of municipal responsibility and administration affecting the public health, safety and

tion to be known as "Section 1602 CONDOMINIUM,"

In order to adequately and properly protect the interests of the community, assure a desirable and stable environment in harmony with that of the surrounding area and provide the special amenities and safeguards considered essential to the characteristics of individual ownerships, condominiums shall be subject to the following:

1. No concominium shall be developed, nor shall any existing structure(s) be converted to a condominium in any use district until after a permit has been issued, and such permit shall be issued only upon the approval of the Planning Commission. As a basis for issuance of a permit, the complete plans, specifications and Master Deed shall be submitted, and shall be reviewed as to compliance with the following objectives:

(a) Parking provisions shall be adequate to fulfill expected requirements, which may exceed otherwise prescribed criteria and may necessitate enclosed or covered parking in closer proximity to units.

b. Complete pedestrian circulation shall be provided within the development via corridors or adequate sidewalks, which shall connect with public sidewalks at convenient intervals.

c. Outdoor open space shall be provided to meet the health and recreational needs of the owners, and, where individual open spaces are considered necessary, privacy of each shall be assured by effective

d. Privacy of individually owned units shall be assured by orientation or other means to assure visual privacy from casual pedestrian traffic and from nearly units; and protection against noise infiltration shall be assured by special and adequate acoustic treatment of walls, floors, ceilings, window openings and of utility lines (water and sewer) to eliminate or reduce to an acceptable level sound transmission into, between or

from individual units e. Security of individual units shall be provided by adequately fire-rated vertical and horizontal partitions

separating units. 2. No condominium shall be permitted in any use district unless it complies fully with use, area, height, bulk and all other requirements of that district as provided by other sections of this Ordinance.




But the "sort of rock" music from "He's Alive" by John Wilson was "fantastic and it just fit," she said.

Busing? Sure. A whole lot of people are afraid and angry at the prospect of busing their kids to cruddy schools where they run the danger of getting beat

And sure. Wallace was the candidate with the clearest position against busing, in a field marked by a lot of dancing around the issue by the other guys.

'Cramming this stuff': A welfare program which keeps costing more and more money each year, but which neither helps the desperate situation of those needing welfare nor assures the guy who wants to work that he isn't getting penalized for it. A court-orderd busing program which not many people want and which probably won't do the job it is intended to do. A tax structure which is unfair and outdated but which doesn't ever seem to change.

'You gotta do something': Just beefing at the welfare program excesses and costs has done nothing about it. Folks who refused to go along with the busing in Pontiac were arrested. Voting for state legislators who say they will change the tax structure hasn't made any difference.

'I'm just fed up!: That says it

ALL THESE things fall together into the rubric of a government structure insufficiently responsive to the needs of the people.

What does that mean? A government which is too removed from the needs and feelings of the average guy, too interested in solving problems which have little to do with the ordinary Joe, too ineffective in doing what it says it's doing.

And, most important, too big. Government for the man in the street is so big, so complicated, so filled with cloudy people mouthing opaque policies in a vast network designed to prevent any one person from being pinned with responsibility, that it has no meaning for the citizen. Government has become less 'our guys' and more 'those guys.'

Closed Door Sessions OK? House Apparently Thinks So

Can an elephant fly? No. Can a cat have puppies? No. Can a legislative body hold an "executive" session? In Michigan it can, thanks to 57 characters in the State House of Representatives.

The House last week defeated 57-36 a bill sponsored by Rep. Edward Suski (D-Flint) to ban "executive" sessions of public bodies. Suski wrote his bill because of a lot of closed-door

dealings that came to light in the Flint City Council.

WHAT WE'RE talking about is not "executive" sessions but "closed door secret sessions from which the public is barred." City councilmen, township trustees and school board members who lack the guts to look the voters in the eye and say "this meeting is secret" like the euphemism "executive" session.

("Executive" has to be the second most lowdown, sneaking euphemism used in politics. The worst is "anti-war" demonstration because 100 times out of 100, the demonstrators aren't protesting the war activities of the Soviet Union, China, North Vietnam or the Viet Cong; they're protesting only American policies, and the demonstrations should more properly be called "anti-American.")

In a dozen years of covering public affairs, I have been orally chewed out many times by dishonest public officials for referring to their "executive" sessions as "closed door, secret sessions from which the public is barred." Never once, however, has such an official written a letter to the editor and signed his name arguing in favor of secret meetings.

The oral arguments they give are these: (1) secrecy is needed to handle delicate personnel matters and real estate transactions; (2) nothing official was decided - it was just discussion.

BOTH ARGUMENTS may be taken apart rather easily.

First, the number of secret meetings held by any one public body is always far greater than the number of personnel and real estate matters that are discussed. It follows that other things were discussed; in actual practice, it's easy for a board member to say during such a session, "While we're at it, let's discuss . . . "

And besides, if the meeting is secret, how do you KNOW only personnel or real estate matters were discussed.

Second, it's not enough to say nothing official was decided, and then to hold an open public meeting and pass the matter with little or no public discussion. The public should know what options were open; the public should know what doubts one or two board members had about the proposal before their arms were twisted by the others.

The public, especially, needs to know what proposals were rejected in those secret meetings and never actually got into the public arena. After all, what a legislative body rejects may be as important as what it passes.

Besides, how do you KNOW there was "only discussion." This writer can recall accidentally coming on the minutes of Western Michigan University trustees' "executive" session and learning that they did, in truth, make decisions behind closed doors. One rich, old lady trustee, for example, wanted a billboard company to remove a Drewry's Beer sign from the entrance road to the campus. She wanted the matter resolved in secrecy because she would have looked ridiculous had she brought it up in public.

AND SO REP. Suski's bill to stop secrecy and sneakiness on the part of public bodies has been defeated, 57-36.

The good guys voting in favor of the bill were Reps. John Bennett (D-Redford) and Richard Young (D-Dearborn Heights). Bennett has been the target of my righteous wrath in the past, and I'm glad to acknowledge that he did at least one thing right.

The bad guys voting: against it are Reps. Joe Forbes (D-Oak Park), Ray Baker (R-Farmington), James Defebaugh (R-Birmingham), Marvin Stempien (D-Livonia) and Tom Brown (D-Westland). Absent were Reps. James Tierney (D-Garden City) and Raymond Smit (R-Ypsilanti).

By refusing to require the tax information to be given to home buyers the idea was that the home sellers have certain responsibilities in addition to their hallowed rights as property owners.

IF THE ordinance is passed, McKinney has assured that policemen will use discretion in enforcing the ordinance, thus putting to rest any fears that a squad of rifle-toting officers will stage a raid in a subdivision to see if tax rates are posted in used homes for sale.

McKinney's ordinance was drafted mainly as a consumer protection move to give customers in the real estate Now McKinney wants to market as much protection and in buying.

This principle has been extended to most other market places - all of which are on private property--and should be extended to the area where people are spending their largest portion of their income.

Broomfield Faces McDonald In 19th

Rep. William Broomfield (R-Royal Oak) brought an end to speculation and publicly announced his candidacy for election in the reapportioned 19th Congressional District.

Broomfield, who currently represents the 18th District, will have to oppose U.S. Rep. McDonald Farmington) for the 19th District GOP nomination.

His decision to run came after court approval of a congressional apportionment plan that takes the western section of Broomfield's district and splits into the 19th and 17th Districts.

The new composition of the 18th makes it more Democratic, while the 19th remains largely Republican despite the inclusion of Democratic Pontiac.

THE NEW apportionment plan is prompting McDonald to move his residence out of his Farmington apartment. Both Farmington City and Township were apportioned into the 17th District, which will be predominantly Democratic.

U.S. Rep. Martha Griffiths (D-northwest Detroit) represents the 17th which also annexed Redford Township and Southfield.

McDonald is reportedly seeking a residence in Waterford Township which would locate him in the middle of the new 19th.

The new 19th takes in all western Oakland County except Farmington and Southfield and annexes three townships from eastern Livingston County.

IN ANNOUNCING his candidacy, Broomfield said that he represented a major portion of Oakland County when he was first elected to Congress in 1956 and for two years as a state senator. He also was a state representative for three terms.
