Benson, Mirto, Berry Gain Board Seats; Renewal OK'd

Mrs. Marda J. Benson and Gary A. Mirto ran 1-2 Monday in the Plymouth School District election to win four-year terms on the board of education. Before the evening was over, third-finishing Carl F. Berry also was appointed to fill the vacancy caused by the recent resignation of John E. Hanskat.

In the greatest outpouring of voters in any school election in Plymouth's history, the electorate also gave resounding approval to the renewal of a five-mill, five-year tax levy, while defeating two companion measures, each proposing a new levy of one mill.

Unofficially, the count of votes cast in the seven precincts stood at 6,410 - amounting to a record 49 per cent of those registered.

APPOINTMENT OF the 32-year-old Berry, who as a patrolman is the youth officer in the city police department, was in adherence to the board's announcement that it would "consider" the third highest vote-getter for the Hanskat seat if there was a "clear-cut mandate from the voters."

Berry, a 1958 Plymouth High School graduate, is president of the Council of Community Concerns as well as being a director of Youth Inc. and the Plymouth Jaycees. Authorities consider him to be more closely in touch with the drug abuse issue among Plymouth youth than any other person, and his strong across-the-board precinct showing made it apparent that he was clearly the community's third choice.

His appointment is for one year, but this gives him the opportunity to run for reelection as an incumbent if he so chooses in 1973.

In finishing ahead of the heavily endorsed Dr. E.J. McClendon and Mrs. Sara Evans, the ap-

pointee gave credit to strong youth support and expressed elation at the board's decision to act immediately on filling the vacancy. Hanskat resigned last week because he and his family are moving to Florida.

MRS. BENSON, a widowed mother of nine, is the second woman in a row to lead the ticket in an important local Plymouth election. Only last November, Mrs. Beverly McAninch set the pace by polling more votes than any of her seven rivals in the City Commission race.

Her new full-term companion on the board, Mirto, is a 29-year-old local high school graduate who was unaware of his victory Monday night for hours, as he was attending a Detroit meeting in his role as administrative assistant to the Detroit Board of Education.

Both Mirto and Mrs. Benson will assume their new duties July 1, but Berry will step into the Hanskat shoes immediately.

Binding the three together is their frequently voiced pledge to bring about a greater degree of citizen involvement in school affairs. Even in their most satisfying hour Monday, all three reaffirmed this point as they donned the cloak of responsibility for a school district of almost 11,000 young people.

Both Extra Millage Proposals Lose

At a time when voters are rebelling against property taxes, Plymouth residents demonstrated support of their school system by voting nearly two to one in favor of a five mill renewal.

The renewal for a five year period passed in every precinct totaling an even 4,000 "yes" votes to 2,310 against it.

But at the same time, voters overwhelmingly defeated two additional millage requests in every precinct.

The proposal for an additional mill to be levied for five years was defeated 3,842 to 2,301. The third proposal for a mill levy for one year lost 4,287 to 1,779.

After certifying the election results the board decided not to return to the voters on the two defeated proposals.

"In light of the fact that we are going to be depending on the voters in October or November for a bond issue and because it is a pretty clear cut vote, I think we should accept it (the results) as the desire of the people," trustee George Lawton said.

THE BOND ISSUE will be for construction of Phase III of Plymouth-Canton High School and for construction of two additional elementary schools.

The board members were all smiles as the election results began trickling in indicating that

the renewal would pass. The first to report was Precinct 3 which set the pattern for passage of the renewal and rejection of the additional requests.

Passage of the renewal means:

- The 81 "pink-slipped" teachers will be rehired (they were notified in April they wouldn't be rehired if the millage failed).

- Twenty teachers who have resigned will be replaced bringing the district back up to its current teacher level.

- Extra-curricular activities will be maintained.

- The athletic programs will continue.

- Lunchroom and playground supervisors will continue to be employed.

Commencement To Salute 615

Plymouth High School diplomas will be awarded to 615 graduating seniors tonight (Wednesday) as the annual commencement exercises are held for the first time in the new football stadium.

In contrast to previous years when the ceremony has been held indoors, there is no limit on the number of student guests who may attend. This has led officials to issue specific parking instructions in an attempt to ward off an intense traffic problem.

The program will open at 8 p.m. with a procession into the stadium of the graduates in their blue and white caps and gowns.

Two guest speakers are scheduled to address the Class of '72 and the families and friends of its members before President Esther Hulsing and her colleagues of the board of education present diplomas.

They are Bill Bonds, newscaster of WXYZ-TV (ch. 7) and Max Ellison, well known Michigan poet who formerly lived in the

Plymouth community. He now resides in the Petoskey area. Three of Ellison's children graduated from PHS.

AT THE conclusion of the formal exercises in the stadium, graduates will move into the high school structure for the annual senior party which will continue until about 3 a.m.

"A Night at the Fair" will be the theme of this final social fling which is being co-sponsored by a committee of parents and the YMCA.

include a band, sideshow attractions, carnival games, movies, swimming, refreshments and special gifts.

In case of rain, the entire schedule of commencement and allied events will be put over until Thursday night.

IN ACTUALITY, the stadium program is one of three graduation events conducted by the school system - but by far the largest.

Diplomas already have been presented in a special ceremony at the Detroit House of Correction to 15 persons who, while inmates there, completed their high school work this spring through the Plymouth School district.

The third program is that scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Thursday in Central Junior High School when Plymouth diplomas will be awarded 24 men and women who have completed high school graduation requirements through the adult education program of night school classes. This is the 10th year of the special adult commencement and it brings to a mark upwards of 200 the number of diplomas earned.

An interesting sidelight to Thursday's ceremony lies in the fact that two of the adult graduates also have children who will be getting diplomas at the Wednesday ceremony in the stadium.

These are Mrs. Clara Newberry of 9027 Oakview, whose daughter Joy is a PHS senior, and John Roland Lawrence of 11430 Gold Arbor, whose son John Alan Lawrence is another of the PHS seniors.

THROUGH BIFOCALS

By FRED DeLANO / Editor Mail & Observer

AMONG THE MANY speeches which I have heard through the years and of which I don't remember a single word was the guest address delivered at commencement exercises the night I graduated from high school.

I remember that there was one, and recalling that we were in the heart of the depression - with FDR having been inaugurated only three months before - I probably could recreate out of my own head the gist of the message.

What I'm getting to, though, is that in contrast to that speech there are some very vivid memories of high school. They involve numerous experiences, with fellow students obviously entwined. But some of those memories also are of teachers - pleasant memories - and I think that 39 years later I still can reel off all their names.

Some day, when this week's Plymouth High School graduates of 1972 look back upon this chapter in their lives, I hope they, too, can recall with equal pleasure the faculty members with whom they developed a rapport, and who may have led them into a pursuit of knowledge that can be turned into adult intelligence.

THE TEACHING profession is an honorable one peopled largely by men and women of dedication and with a sincere interest in helping produce good citizens of good judgment. They are not all of equal ability, of course, but neither are the folks in my profession - or possibly yours.

Seven of the Plymouth teaching corps have come to the end of their active classroom careers this week, and as they go into retirement one would hope that their memories, too, will be happy ones.

Included are Carvel M. Bentley, Evelyn Edgar, Mildred E. Field, Margaret Hartweg, A. Joan Hayskar, Lois Jensen and Margaret McKenna.

When their total careers are combined, the records show that these seven persons have devoted 200 years to teaching. Their accumulative service to the youngsters of the Plymouth community adds up to 172 years. One might guess that they may know more about your little darlings than you do as fathers and mothers.

IT'S TRUE ENOUGH that all seven retirees merit applause, and I hope it doesn't offend the others if three of the group are singled out for further mention. Their longevity of service to the Plymouth cause has been exceptional and remarkable.

There's Margaret Field, for instance, who has been in education 46 years - 23 of them in Plymouth where she has been Starkweather principal since 1953.

Joan Hayskar joined the local faculty in 1944 and gained full-time status in 1948. She already had taught at Bangor, Mich. and Pella, Ia., and altogether has more than 30 years invested in trying to bring about better usage of the English language. (Long ago I personally became resigned to the belief that this is a hopeless task.)

Carvel Bentley? Well, his retirement must be classed virtually as a milestone in Plymouth education. For 43 years this gentleman has been connected with your school system, dating from 1929. The first 21 were as a teacher and then came 19 years as high school principal. The final stanzas have been in the co-op program.

Carv never taught any place but in Plymouth. His phase as head of the high school almost, but not quite, paralleled Russell Isbister's years here as superintendent. There's a lurking suspicion that much of the credit we pass out for the fine quality of a Plymouth education belongs to those two men.

Millage Renewed

However, passage of the renewal means that the district will be levying the 27.05 operating millage and thus functioning with nearly the same budget that it currently has but with more students.

CURRENTLY the district levies 26.3 of the voted millage for operations and 6.25 mill for debt retirement.

The district will have to absorb an anticipated 660 student enrollment increase next year with little additional funds and trim the current budget to pay the teachers their retroactive pay.

Teachers were notified Friday that their request for retroactive pay was approved by the Pay Board. The school board discussed the matter briefly and said the Pay Board ruling was referred to the school district attorney before final approval. This is the procedure that was followed before administrators and maintenance personnel were granted retro pay.

Estimates on the cost to the district of the payments run from \$200 to \$400 per teacher to a maximum of \$139,000. The recent freeze on expenditures will absorb some of the cost.

DEFEAT OF the second proposal also means that 19 new teachers won't be hired, the new social studies program won't be implemented in the elementary schools, and additional special education services won't be provided.

Defeat of the third proposal means that if Ford Motor Co. wins its reassessment suit, the school district will have to pay back some of the taxes it has already collected.

Before the board adjourned its meeting, it approved rehiring the "pink slip" teachers and hiring replacement teachers up to the current level of 474.

Doctorate Degree Honors Are Habit In Hudson Family

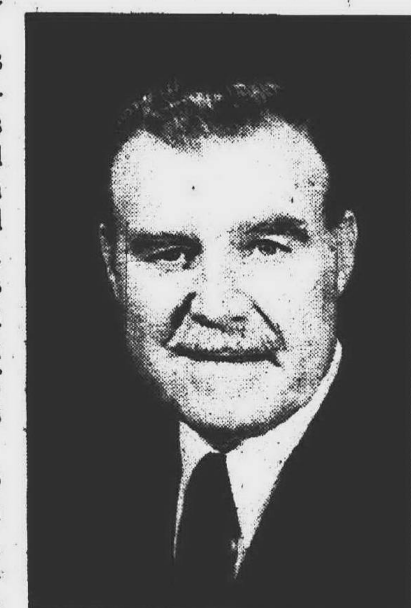

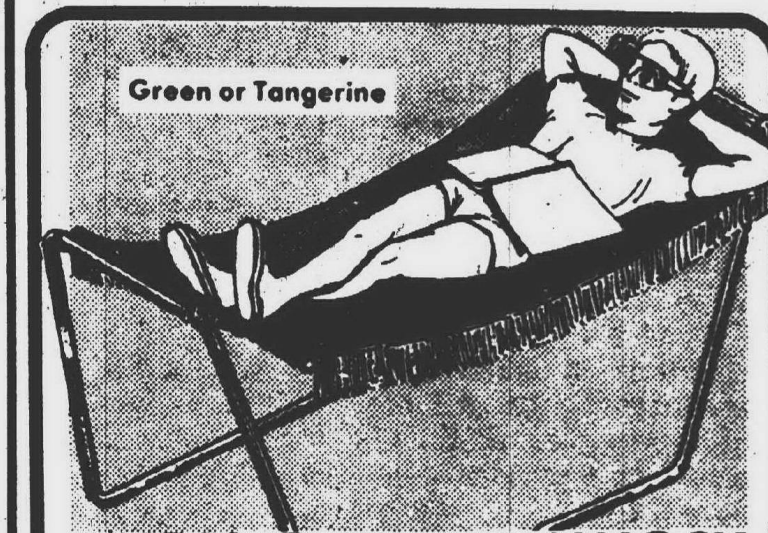

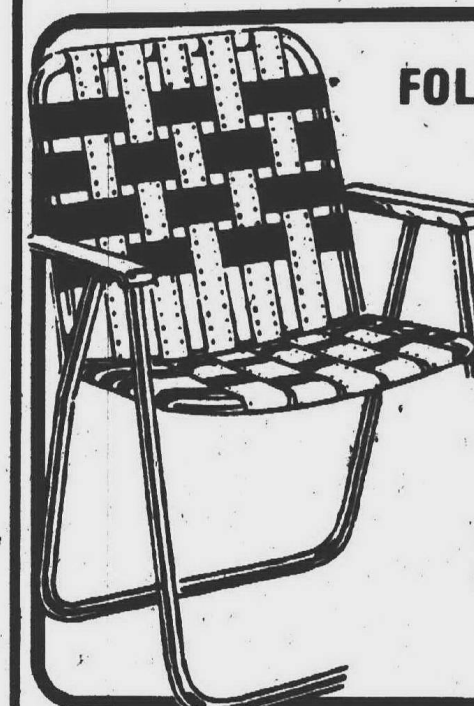

County Tax Plans Due For A Vote

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners may ask the voters to continue an expiring one-mill operating levy and to approve a half-mill for correctional facilities in this year's elections.

Meeting as the ways and means committee May 25, the commissioners voted to put the two property tax proposals before the electorate. Formal approval at the board meeting today is required.

The commissioners decided to ask the voters to renew the one-mill levy for another five years in the Aug. 8 primary election.

One mill equals \$1 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation. It amounts to \$5 per year on a house worth \$10,000 and

produces about \$12.5 million in revenue annually.

"WAYNE COUNTY already faces a \$12.5 million deficit this year and failure to renew this millage would result in disastrous service cut-backs," declared Commissioner Conrad L. Mallett, of Detroit, ways and means chairman.

The one-mill levy was voted originally in 1964 and renewed in 1968. It is due to be levied for the last time on Dec. 1, 1973.

The ways and means committee decided to ask the voters to approve a half-mill levy (50 cents per \$1,000 equalized valuation) in the Nov. 7 final election. It would

run for 25 years and be used to finance construction and operation of correctional facilities.

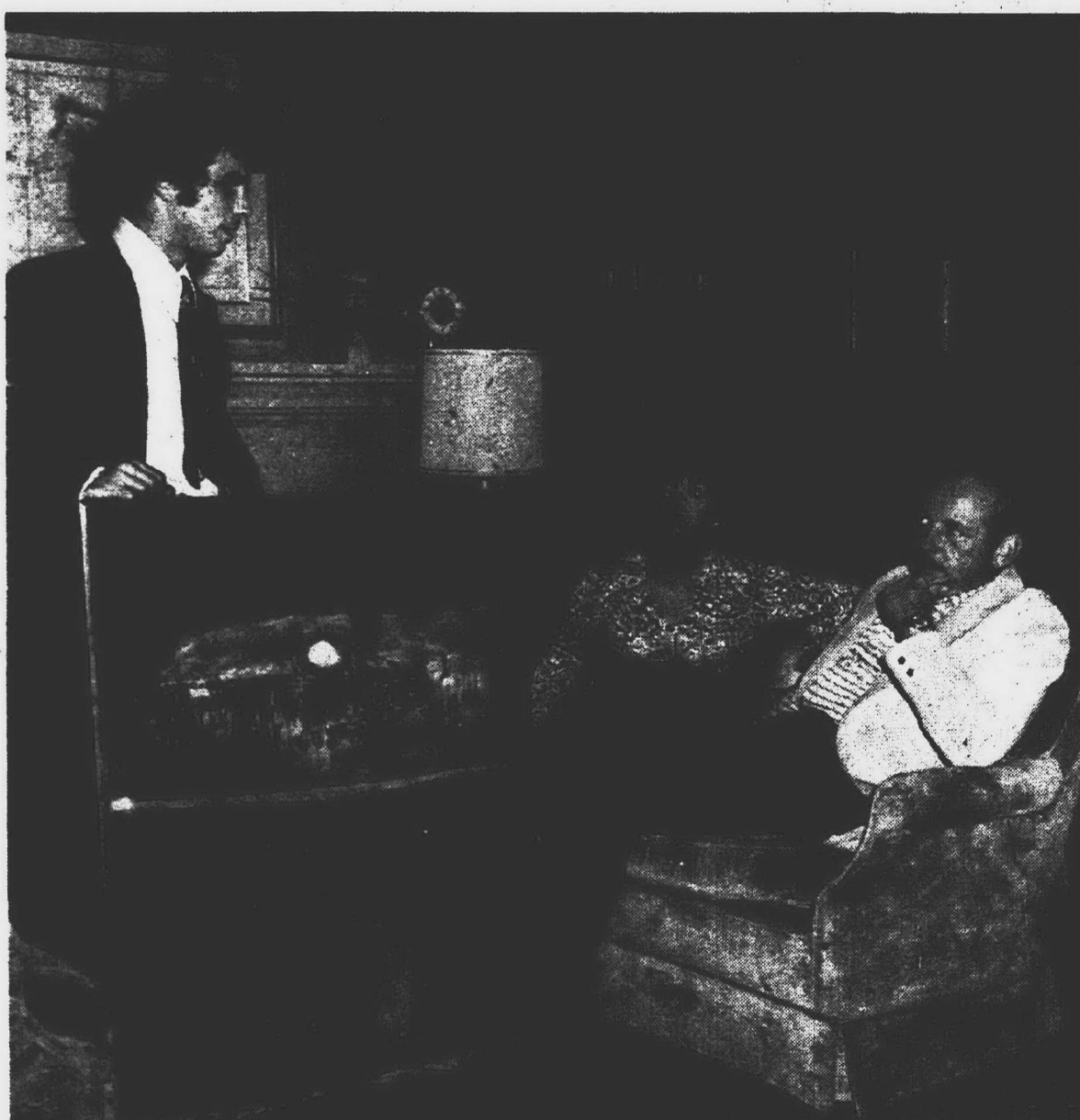
The Board of Commissioners has set a target date of next Jan. 1 for the start of construction of a new county jail as the result of a Circuit Court order virtually requiring new jail facilities.

Consultants have recommended that a new downtown jail housing 750 inmates be built by 1975 at a cost of more than \$21 million and that additional jail facilities be constructed by 1980, bringing the total cost up to around \$40 million.

THE BOARD OF Commissioners already has started a \$2.2 million renovation program at the present jail. The consultants have recommended another \$3.3 million in renovations to permit use of the present jail for the "foreseeable future."

The 25-year levy could also be used to build and operate a rehabilitation facility for juvenile delinquents which has been a top-priority program of the Board of Commissioners for several years.

The cost of the court-ordered jail improvements has precluded allocation of funds for the youth facility up to now.

Plymouth Artist Sells His First Oil Painting

PLYMOUTH "I am well pleased with the deal, but somehow, I really hate to see it go."

This feeling of mixed emotions was expressed by Torbett Guenther, young artist son of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Guenther, following the sale of his first oil painting.

The sale, to the John Upjohn family, of the famed Upjohn pharmaceutical firm of Kalamazoo, was the highlight of the young artist's one man show in which he displayed more than 30 pieces of his handwork.

He is now working on a project designed along the lines of the Stone Henge, in England, that is reputed to be the oldest standing monuments in the world. "I'm really enthusiastic about this one," he said, "as it gives me a chance to display various dimensions."

"What I really want to do," he added, "is to become a teacher in fine arts. In this way I can give expression to work and still help young people along."

AS FAR AS his personal work is concerned, he is pressed for room at home, so

he has taken over a large building from his favorite Uncle Lee in Bridgeport, Mich. and plans to make it a real studio for oil paintings and sculptures.

"Medals," which he sold to the Upjohns, required more than six months work and young Guenther still shakes his head when he realizes it is gone.

"If there is any satisfaction to the sale," he confided, "it is fact that the Upjohns are real art critics. I would have felt worse about parting with the painting had the purchasers been anything but lovers of oil painting."

THE PAINTING, a series of service medals and other type of awards done in a deep red, is to be hung in a special setting in the art room of the new Upjohn home, and will be the centerpiece of a new collection.

"I got the idea for the painting," Guenther explained, "when I was given a service medal after my stay in Vietnam. I suddenly felt, if they give medals as a fitting reward for engaging in war, then other medals have some significance, too."

"The painting is one of my favorites," he went on, "and while I feel flattered that such critics as the Upjohns should select my work, I still hated to part company with it."

NOW A student at Eastern Michigan University, Guenther got his start in oils under the tutelage of Mrs. Johnnie Crosby during her workshops at the Plymouth YMCA.

The first public showing of any of his works was made several years ago when he unveiled a sculpture in aluminum that hangs on the Main Street side of Central School.

Thousands of miles of creeks, streams, rivers, ravines and inland lakes have made this state a land of bridges, according to Automobile Club of Michigan.

There are more than 3,000 bridges on the state highway system alone, with thousands more on county roads and city streets. Wayne County alone has some 560 bridges.

Bridge engineers of the Michigan Department of State Highways have listed some of the outstanding and unusual bridges for Auto Club.

THE LIST IS topped by the giant Mackinac Bridge spanning the Straits of

Mackinac which separates Michigan's Upper and Lower Peninsulas. Two older spans - Detroit's Ambassador Bridge and Port Huron's Blue Water Bridge - connect Michigan with her international neighbor, Ontario, Canada.

A third bridge which connects Michigan with Ontario is the newer International Bridge, opened in 1962, and joining Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., and Sault Ste. Marie, Ont. The two-mile arch and truss-type bridge spans the St. Marys River and the Soo Locks and links U.S. I-75 and the Trans-Canada Highway, two of the longest highways in North America.

The Blue Water Bridge permits pedestrians, at present the only large bridge in the state to allow foot traffic. (The Ambassador Bridge usually allows people to use its eight-foot walk but this is closed indefinitely until some construction is completed.)

An engineering marvel and a tourist attraction by itself since its opening in 1957 is the Mackinac Bridge, popularly called "Big Mac." From anchorage to anchorage, it is the longest suspension bridge in the world. There are 42

miles of wire in the main cables.

The American Institute of Architects has designated the bridge as one of the seven man-made wonders of the world.

OLDEST OF the Michigan - Ontario bridges is the Ambassador Bridge. Opened in 1929 at a cost of nearly \$17 million, it is almost two miles long and 152 feet above the water at its highest point. There are five traffic lanes. The two cables from which the bridge is suspended are supported on towers and tied to massive anchorages.

The arch-type Blue Water Bridge, opened in 1938, is 3½ miles long and spans the St. Clair River between Port Huron and Sarnia, Ont. The bridge is the eastern terminus of the 1,607-mile Interstate 94 freeway between Port Huron and Billings, Mont. There is a walk for pedestrians.

Another interesting bridge, but only for railroads, is the old International Bridge at Sault Ste. Marie, erected in 1887. It stretches 3,607 feet across the American Locks, the St. Marys Rapids, and the Canadian Locks. One of the largest jackknife spans in the world, it combines both the swing and bascule types.

BRIDGES NOT so familiar to most Michiganders include these:

The Rouge River Bridge, just south of Detroit, opened in 1967. A deck plate girder structure, it was the costliest single project ever constructed by the Michigan Department of State Highways. Capable of carrying 120,000 vehicles a day, it is a vital link in the I-75 freeway system as it enters Detroit.

Among the picturesque bridges is the high Cut River Bridge, 4.3 miles northwest of Brevort on US-2 in Mackinac County. Built in 1947, the cantilever truss-type bridge has three 555-foot spans.

Visitors who use a parking area provided at the east end of the bridge can walk back and descend into the deep ravine. From the bottom looking up the scenery is spectacular.

One of Michigan's most unusual bridges also is on US-2 over the Manistique River in Manistique. This 1918 bridge was once featured in Ripley's "Believe It or Not" newspaper syndicated column because the water level is higher than the riding surface of the bridge.

A different type of bridge is

the double-deck vertical lift bridge which carries US-41 traffic across the Portage Lake waterway between Houghton and Hancock. Opened in 1959, the upper deck provides a four-lane highway while the lower deck has railroad tracks. The section with the decks can be lifted 100 feet above the water.

THE PINE RIVER Bridge on M-55, 4.2 miles west of the Wexford County line, is a high, cantilever bridge, built in 1934, the same type as the Cut River Bridge in the Upper Peninsula.

Another Wexford County bridge singled out by the panel of highway engineers, is the Pine River Bridge on M-37, 12 miles southwest of Harrietta. Built in 1948, it is a deck plate girder type.

Also listed are two bridges on M-26 over the west and east branches of the Firesteel River. One is 1.3 miles northeast of M-38, the other 1.9 miles northeast of M-38. Both were built in 1952.

The highway department also includes as outstanding the bridges which lead into the I-196 and I-296 interchange in Grand Rapids.

three for Gov. George Wallace, two for Sen. George McGovern and one for Sen. Hubert Humphrey. District Chairman George

W. Sallade of Ann Arbor, Wayne-2nd Chairman Marshall Manning of Plymouth and other party leaders cut a deal on how delegates would be

apportioned. Under the deal, the Wayne-2nd was to get a Wallace delegate. There's little Wallace sentiment among Democrats

in the Wayne-2nd, and local delegates not only rejected the deal but tossed out Manning as caucus chairman and replaced him with Dick McGinn.

Instead, the local delegates ran Sandra McClennen for the position of a McGovern alternate, but Mrs. McClennen's vote got split among other female candidates and she lost.

MRS. MCCLENNEN taught three years and was a program director supervising a staff of 50 at Plymouth State Home and Training School. Automotive Technician Test Set For Saturday

Tests for automotive technicians wishing to qualify for certification under the national automotive technicians certification board program will be conducted at 8:30 a.m. Saturday, June 17, at Wayne State University.

The tests will be given in Room 134 of State Hall, located on the northwest corner of Cass and Warren. Test fee is \$10.

Any mechanic or body man engaging in the repair of vehicles who has been actively employed in the trade for at least two years is eligible for

the examination. Those who successfully complete the exam will earn a certificate.

EXAMINATIONS are offered in the following classifications: engine overhaul; electrical systems; carburetion; cooling systems; braking systems; automatic transmission; power train and standard transmission; suspensions and alignment; standard and power steering; air conditioning and refrigeration; heating and cooling; body and fender repair; automotive refinishing; glass installation;

truck repair (general); and frame repair.

It is expected that the motoring public will become increasingly aware of the NAYCB program and will look for mechanics with the certificate and shoulder patch.

Though it is sponsored by three national associations, the program is open to any qualified shop owner or mechanic whether or not they are members of the sponsoring groups.

The sponsoring associations are the Independent Garage Owners of America Inc., Automotive Service Industry Assn. and National Congress of Petroleum Retailers.

The national program is described as the automotive service industry's response to the nationwide shortage of trained professional mechanics and as a means of assuring motorists of a method of determining qualified technicians.

Reservists, Guardsmen Get Time Off

Employers in Michigan were reminded today that reservists and national guardsmen are entitled to time off from their jobs to perform active duty for training.

The reminder came from Louis H. Woiwode, area administrator of the labor-management services administration, U.S. Department of Labor, in Chicago.

Upon their return from training, reservists and national guardsmen have a legal right to be restored to their positions with the same seniority, status, pay and vacation rights as they previously held.

The law also prohibits any kind of employment discrimination against a reservist or guardsman because of his participation in the program.

Woiwode pointed out that military training duty for guardsmen and reservists normally occurs during the summer months, and it can be expected that most of them will be absent from employment for two or three weeks of training during this period.

Reservists and were cautioned by Woiwode to notify their employers before leaving for training and to report back to their jobs immediately upon completion of their tours, or they may forfeit their statutory reemployment protection.

Welfare Bill Splits Reps 7-1

LANSING
Only one Observerland
representative voted for the
\$640 million welfare bill which
cleared the House last week.

Rep. James Defebaugh (R-
Birmingham) defeated the
bill while it was opposed by
Reps. Richard Young (D-
Dearborn Heights), John
Bennett (D-Redford Town-
ship), Marvin Stampien (D-
Livonia), James Tierney (D-
Garden City), Thomas Brown
(D-Westland), Raymond
Baker (R-Farmington), and
Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park).
Rep. Raymond Smit (R-Ann
Arbor) didn't vote.

"I FEEL the welfare
budget is not a terrific amount
for its caseload," Defebaugh
said. More than 707,000 per-
sons are currently receiving
some form of welfare
payment and it is expected to
go over 800,000 next year.

Defebaugh said
Republicans succeeded in
putting a "cap" on the year's
budget after it failed on the
first attempt.

Many Democrats, who
argued that the limit on
spending could hurt families
who honestly need the

payments, refused to vote for
the bill with the "cap" on it.
The House also passed an
amendment declaring that
Michigan would write its own
welfare standards and that the
state would stop its portions of
the payments if the federal
government refused to accept
the standards.

The amendment could lead
to a confrontation with the
federal government,
Defebaugh said.

The federal government
pays nearly half of Michigan's
welfare costs.

3 Senators Approve 'No-Fault'

LANSING
Three Observerland
senators voted for the "no-
fault" insurance plan ap-
proved by the State Senate
last week 28-7.

Sens. William Faust (D-
Westland), Carl Pursell (R-
Plymouth), and David
Plawecki (D-Dearborn
Heights) supported the bill
while Sen. Daniel Cooper (D-
Oak Park) voted against it.

As approved by the Senate,
the bill would provide prompt
benefits without regard to
fault for 100 per cent of all
"reasonably necessary"
medical and rehabilitation
expenses; 85 per cent of lost
wages and pension benefits up
to \$1,000 per month for an
unlimited period; all
reasonable auto repair or
replacement costs, full sup-
port to survivors up to \$1,000
per month based on the
economic value of the victim
to the survivor in a 30-day
period; and \$1,000 maximum
death benefit for funeral
expenses, according to
Plawecki.

"UNDER THIS measure,
no-fault insurance will still be
required for bodily injury, for
absolute liability for damage
to property other than autos,
and for liability to out-of-state
auto accidents," Plawecki
said.

Additional no-fault benefits
are available optionally, he
said.
"I supported this legislation
because it will bring long over-
due relief to Michigan
motorists, who are now forced
to pay ridiculously high in-
surance premiums for a
"fault" insurance system
which has resulted in great
inequities," Plawecki said.

"Statistics have shown that
under Michigan's present
insurance system, those
suffering the greatest injuries
are undercompensated for
their loss while those suffering
the least injuries are over-
compensated for their loss."

Reps Vote Against State Tax

LANSING
That "temporary" hike in
state income tax is near
becoming permanent after the
State House approved a bill to
keep the tax at 3.9 per cent
with objections from five
Observerland representa-
tives.

The bill passed the House 57-
46 and was sent to Gov.
William Milliken for
signature.

Voting against it were Reps.
James Defebaugh (R-
Birmingham), John Bennett
(D-Redford Township),
Richard Young (D-Dearborn
Heights), Thomas Brown (D-
Westland), and Raymond
Baker (R-Farmington).

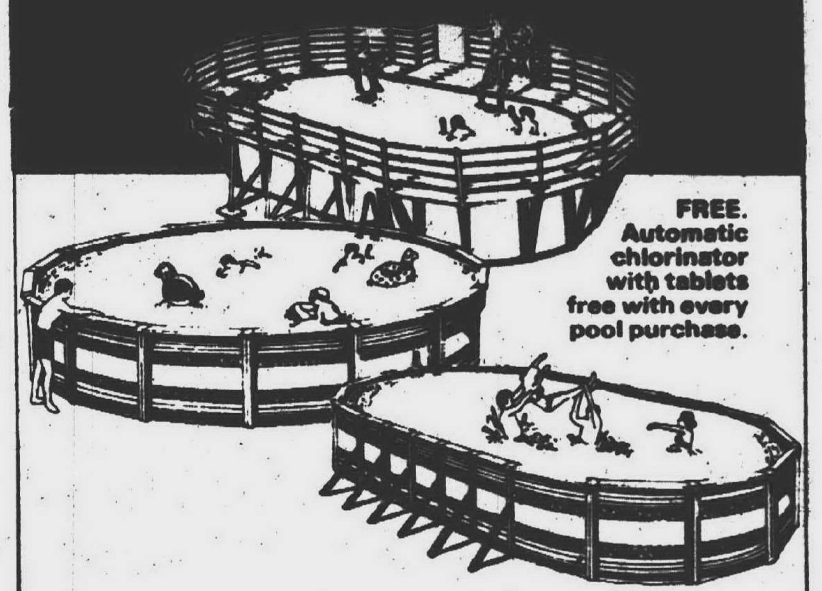
Those who voted for the
extension were Reps. James
Tierney (D-Garden City),
Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park),
and Raymond Smit (R-Ann
Arbor). Rep. Marvin Stampien
(D-Livonia) did not vote.

If the bill hadn't passed by
July 31, the personal income
tax would have reverted back
to 2.6 per cent, the tax on
corporations from 7.8 to 5.6
per cent, and the tax on
financial institutions from 9.7
to 7 per cent.

Defebaugh said his "no"
vote was a "protest vote"
because the state continues to
budget expenses higher than
its revenues.

Latin And Math Suit Meticulous Teacher

When Adelia Minor's students put on their togas and sat down to their annual Roman banquet, Latin was far from a dead language at Redford Union High School.

Beginning with a short sacrifice intoned to Jupiter in Latin, the Roman banquets were authentic "ad ovo ad mala" (from eggs to apples) Miss Minor recalls.

Students and faculty were welcomed to the classic board only if they were in authentic garb, and those students who served the food and drink wore the costumes of Roman slaves.

Eaten in hand in the manner of the Caesars' time, the feast started with eggs (deviled), continued with plump fowl (oven fried chicken) accompanied by crusty rolls dipped in honey, and ended with apples.

The slaves poured the juices of the grape and other fruits (unfermented). Entertainment, including Roman dances and a few words spoken in Latin, took place inside the enclosure of the banquet table.

WHEN THE GOLDEN age of the Roman feast and Latin gave way to more modern languages at Redford Union about 10 years ago, Miss Minor became a geometry teacher. And she has managed to make the discipline of geometry a relevant study for the students in her classes.

Modern math changed the emphasis in teaching geometry, according to Miss Minor. Students used to memorize proofs of theorems, drawing the diagrams and reciting statements and reasons.

Today, they solve problems, using the theorems as proofs in their exercises. Geometry has become a more practical subject, she comments.

MISS MINOR is retiring after teaching in Redford Union High School for 25 years. Earlier she was in

Clarkston and Garden City, for a total career of 40 years.

The daughter of a Universalist minister, Miss Minor was born in Norwalk, Ohio, and grew up in southern Illinois. She earned her bachelor's degree at Michigan State Normal College (now Eastern) and her master's at Washington University in St. Louis. Because of the depression, she was unable to find a job on completion of her master's. She went to work under a Federal Economic Recovery Act program teaching English to foreign born in St. Louis.

When she took a teaching post in Garden City in 1936, she organized a Girl Scout troop. For 10 years she took her girls camping each summer.

A student from her first class in her first job at Clarkston was Miss Minor's guest when she was honored by her fellow teachers and friends at a retirement banquet. Now a grandmother, Mrs. Mildred Corvill Bower came from Owasco to recall Miss Minor's Roman banquets and other activities at Clarkston.

As befits a teacher of classic disciplines, Miss Minor is a well organized person and educator. She has enjoyed planning what she would teach, carrying out her lessons, and seeing the results.

HER PLANS for retirement, however, are indefinite.

She'll paint up, clean up, and fix up around her neat home in Farmington. She will enjoy traveling to visit her brothers, one who has a part-time association with the University of Chicago during his retirement, and another, who is cultural affairs officer in the foreign service stationed in Mexico City.

She'll also garden, do some arts and crafts, and catch up on all the hobbies she hasn't had time for during her teaching career.

Trees, Children Find Full Flower

Flowering trees now stand on the grounds of Garden City's Henry Ruff and Maplewood schools and at the Northwest Guidance Clinic — gifts from a lady whose special approach to learning has helped many children reach full flower.

Mrs. Crystal Agre, who is retiring as school social worker, gave the trees for the places she has enjoyed working because "I wanted to leave something of beauty behind me."

But a legacy of far more importance has been left by Mrs. Agre in the schools she served and the clinic she helped establish.

IN JUST 15 years — she didn't start college until she was 49 and her last child was in college and her husband had his master's degree — she has been instrumental in starting a readiness program for all children starting school can feel some early success.

"Every child starts school with the expectation that he will learn," Crystal Agre says in explaining the readiness program.

"He must feel some success right away, or the emotional problems may start. But for some there is an immaturity in some field — his perception isn't the same as other children's or his ears don't relay messages the same way."

The program developed first in Henry Ruff school and later adopted by the Garden City system involves spotting in kindergarten the children with learning problems and alerting their parents.

Then the readiness children start first grade on half days, their teachers working with

them in small groups and "teaching to their strengths," as Mrs. Agre puts it.

"When little people experience even a minimum of success, you will not have so many emotional problems," she comments.

IN CRYSTAL AGRE'S own life, success in higher education came late and was all the more enjoyed.

"When I grew up in Kansas City, Mo., learning for girls wasn't much valued, so I didn't go to high school," she said. "I finished grade school June 7, 1917, and that was all the formal learning I had for more than 30 years."

But learning isn't all in books, and Mrs. Agre must have picked up a great deal as she watched a son and two daughters go through high school and into college and boarded university students in her Ann Arbor home.

For when she convinced Eastern Michigan University to let her take a series of entrance exams despite the lack of a high school diploma, she did so well on the first test that the rest were waived and she was admitted.

"It was the most thrilling and exciting thing that ever happened to me," she recalls.

"That first summer session I took American history and literature — because my daughter had taken those subjects the summer before and I happened to have the books."

IN THE FALL, she tackled 18 credit hours and received As in all but one course. She finished EMU on an alumni scholarship with majors in English and sociology and a teaching certificate and then was given a tuition grant to get her master's degree from

the University of Michigan in school social work.

She was hired by the Garden City schools even before completing the classroom work.

Once on the job, she said, it didn't take long for her to become convinced that many learning problems were physical rather than psychological in origin, and at that point she became acquainted with the Michigan Association for Children with Learning Difficulties and worked with others to establish in Garden City the Northwest Child Guidance Clinic, which since has changed its name and offers service to persons of all ages.

Among the retirement gifts that have given Mrs. Agre the most pride are \$50 annual grants in her name from the PTAs of Henry Ruff and Maplewood schools to help children at the clinic.

"I've loved being part of a professional team in the Garden City schools," she said, "and that's what I'm going to miss most, after the little people, of course."

THE IDEA of retirement has taken some getting used to

Because in just a few days more she heads for campus for a few days of orientation, and it's bound to be a mighty big step from proud graduate to lowly freshman.

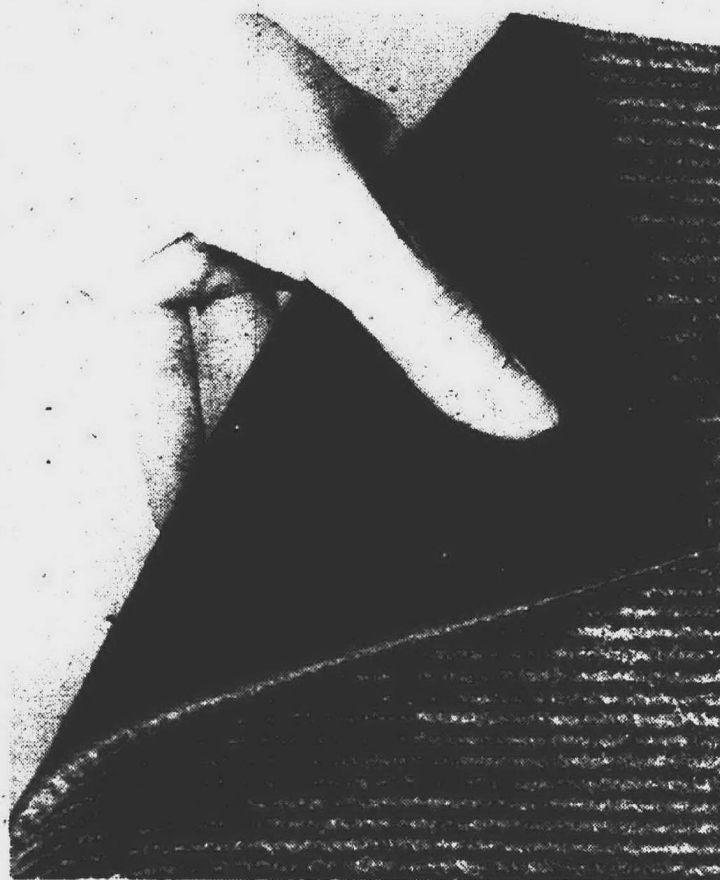

If you enjoy poking around historic cemeteries or deciphering faded inscriptions in yellowed family Bibles, you'll have a kindred feeling for Mrs. Orvis Henke of Farmington.

She readily admits to a fascination with tracing her forebears, because, she explains, "it places you in history."

It's also placed her and a number of others in the organization that values heritage, the Daughters of the American Revolution.

MARGUERITE HENKE established her eligibility for the patriotic group by verifying that one of her great - great - grandfathers was Sgt. David DePue of the Continental Army in the American Revolution.

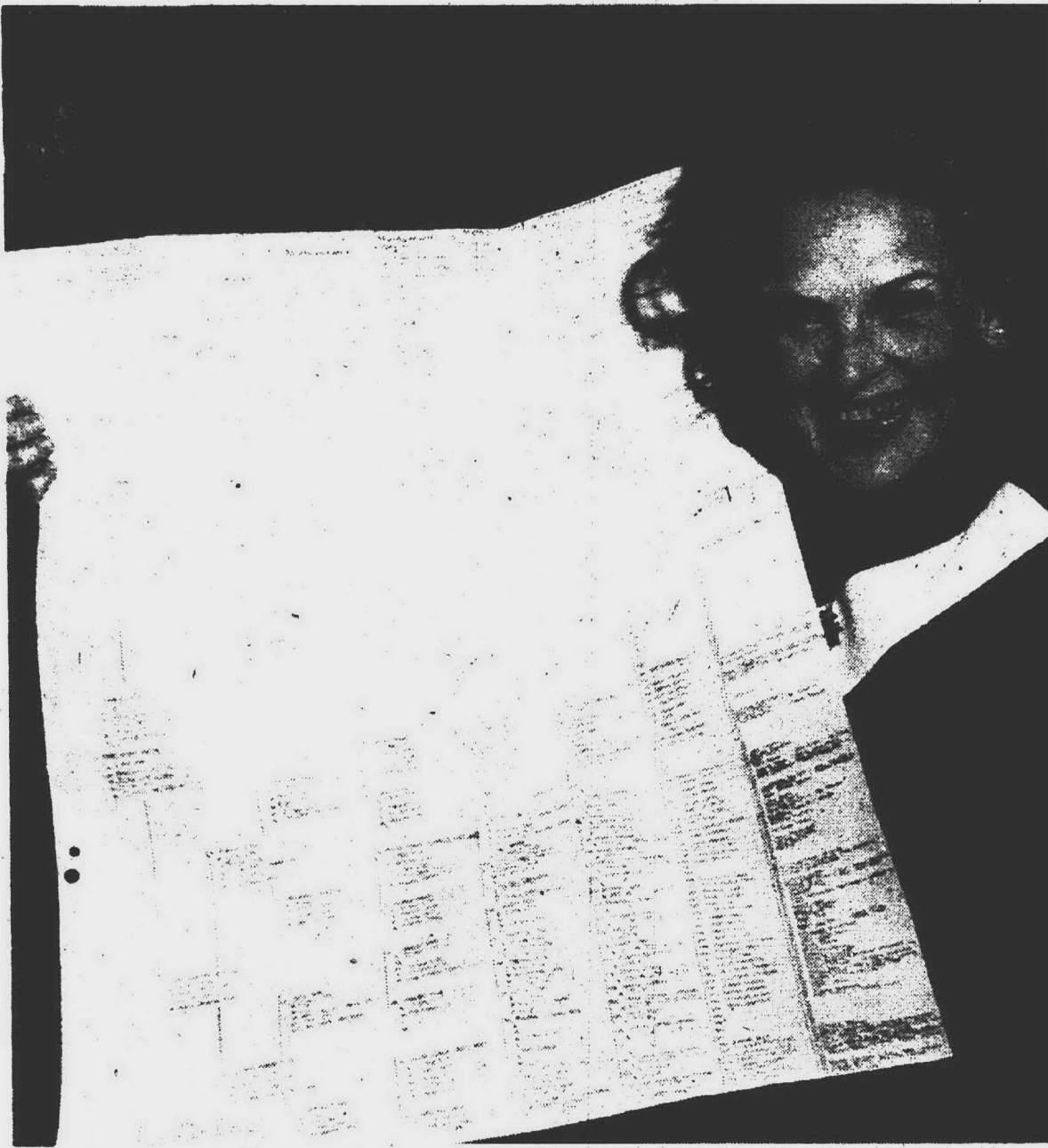
Her original membership was in the Fort Ponchartrain DAR chapter, which she served as regent, and more recently she helped found the new Quakertown Chapter in Farmington. To qualify more members for the new unit, she traced several more genealogical lines.

"By the time I finished bringing those first papers up to date, I was hooked on genealogy," she said. "I took a course in the subject and started buying books that contain genealogical records."

Now she has shelves full of such books and notebooks crammed with records of lineages she has traced.

She Traces Forebears To Appreciate History

MRS. HENKE long had been interested in the Daughters of the American Revolution because she had college friends who were members, but considered herself ineligible.

"I knew my mother's ancestors had been here before the Revolution," she explained, "but they were Tories and the DAR requires an ancestor who served in the Continental Army or rendered material aid."

But when her father, Roy Martin of Flint, reached retirement he decided to learn more about his family that had been in the Washtenaw area for several generations. In the process, he met a distant cousin who was a member of the DAR.

So Mrs. Henke contacted that lady and began her own genealogical search. It took her back to a Joseph Martin, who died at sea when he was coming to this country from Ireland in 1800. But his eight-year-old son, James, landed in America and went to live in New York State. There, in due time, he married a young woman named Letitia DePue, whose father had served in the Continental Army, and that made Marguerite Henke eligible for the DAR.

"David DePue died in Michigan while visiting his daughter," she relates. "I know he was visiting because I found a letter his widow wrote when applying for a government pension. And his grave in Highland Cemetery, Ypsilanti, and those of his daughter and her husband and son, Azariah Frank Martin, have been marked by the Fort Ponchartrain DAR."

WHEN YOU STUDY family trees, Mrs. Henke said, you have to have a sense of humor because, as one historian has said, "you can't tell what you might find hanging there."

In her own case, she said, it was a witch named Samuel Wardwell who was one of those hanged in Salem in 1692. "There's no question he was a witch," she said. "He foretold the future and many of the things he said came true."

She also learned one of her ancestors is one Pietro Cesar Alberti, who was the first Italian to come to this country.

and had a tobacco plantation in New York, where the city stands now.

"I've been told that he probably has 3,000 descendants in this country," she said, "but only about 100 of us know it."

MRS. HENKE, in addition to her DAR connections, is state president of the Daughters of Colonial Wars, for those with ancestors here before the Revolution, and regent of the Detroit chapter of the Daughters of American Colonists and a director of the Huguenot Society.

She firmly believes "everyone should have a family history," and she has some definite suggestions on how to compile one.

Write down what you know of your family, starting with yourself and your parents and your grandparents, she advises. Then talk to relatives, find out who has the family Bible and check births, deaths and marriages recorded there.

Then write to governmental offices to get copies of death certificates - better than birth certificates, says Mrs. Henke, because they've been kept much longer.

"You can also go to a genealogical library, such as Burton at Detroit Main, or the Michigan State Library at

Lansing, and check for genealogy of the family name. When dealing with a common name, it may be helpful to check the daughters' married names. I've had good luck this way. And remember that names can be spelled in many ways and often are written down as the clerk heard it."

'New You' Can Emerge From Makeover Service

If you're willing to give up two or three hours of your time and about \$35, you could get a new look that could astonish your husband and make you the envy of your neighbors.

At least this is the experience of a 30-year-old, Dearborn housewife, Carol Sylvester.

Dark-haired Carol got tired of her "old look," took her courage in her hands, and decided to take advantage of a new service being offered by Jacobson's Beauty Salon in Dearborn.

THE NEW SERVICE is called a "miracle makeover." Through it, Mr. Jason, new fashion co-ordinator for the salon, promises to discover "your full beauty potential."

The process begins with a styling cut, hair conditioning if needed, and a consultation with Jason about the make-up that's right for you. It also includes plenty of instruction about how to turn yourself into the new you at home.

Then with a set and a comb-out, you're ready to face the world. In case, you forget just what's been done and what ingredients are required, Jacobson's have it all charted for you.

Cost of the whole thing will vary with what's needed. Carol had her hair frosted,

because according to Jason, her dark hair made her complexion look sallow. She also exchanged her dark-framed glasses for a pair of contact lenses.

Carol's saggy eyebrows got a trim and were lightened. She got false eyelashes, trimmed by Jason to fit, and lessons in how to put them on. (Wait a minute so the glue will get a little tacky. Also, peel the old glue off in the morning when it's dry.)

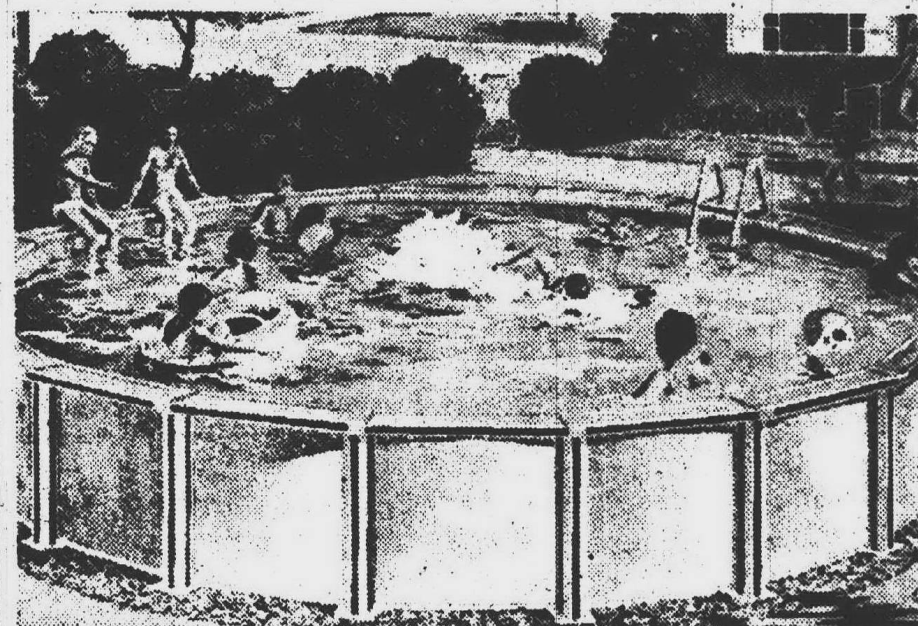

'Music Under Stars' Series Begins June 15

James Frazier, a Detroit who achieved international renown last fall as the first native-born American to conduct the Leningrad Philharmonic, returns to his home town of Detroit this Thursday (June 15) to open the 20th consecutive season of free Michigan State Fairgrounds concerts by the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. His program will include music by Debussy, Beethoven, Tchaikovsky, and Strauss's tone-poem "Don Juan," a work Frazier conducted in the Soviet Union.

EIGHT CONCERTS will be presented in this year's "Music Under the Stars" series, Thursday through Sunday evenings, June 15-18 and 22-25. All start at 8 at the Fairgrounds Music Shell located near Woodward Avenue and Eight Mile Road. The widely-varied programs will feature three conductors, five instrumental soloists, and two vocalists, including both local and visiting artists. The other two conductors of the series are regular conductors with the Detroit

Symphony Orchestra, associate conductor Pierre Hétu, who will make his first appearance at Friday evening's concert, and conductor-in-residence Paul Freeman, who will direct the concert on Saturday evening. Sunday evening's concert will again be conducted by Hétu. Featured soloists for the opening week will be Thomas Bacon, French horn player with the orchestra, who will be heard in the Horn Concerto No. 1 by Richard Strauss on Friday; Ruth Burczyk, pianist from Grosse Pointe, to be

featured in the Liszt "Hungarian Fantasia" on Saturday; and Rosemary Russell, soprano, a professor of voice at the University of Michigan, who will be heard in operatic favorites Sunday. The following week's concerts, June 22-25, will feature debut performances by two pianists, Edward Thomas, a professor of music at Bethel College in St. Paul, Minn., who will be heard on Thursday, and Tedd Joselson, a student at the Juilliard School of Music in New York, to be heard on Saturday.

APPEARING AT other concerts will be two local musicians, soprano Onita Sanders on June 25 and violinist Gordon Staples, the orchestra's concertmaster, on June 23. The free concert series is sponsored by the National Endowment for the Arts, the Michigan State Fair Authority and the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. Entry to the parking lot is through Fairgrounds Gate 5, on Woodward Avenue just south of Eight Mile Road. Parking fee is 50 cents.

How 'Goodies' Help Behavior Problems Of State Home Kids

If good behavior came in flavors instead of patterns, chocolate would be the favorite at Plymouth State Home and Training School.

Chocolate and other sweets are the tasty rewards for good behavior at the Northville Township institution — and the treats make the children actually want to behave. The institution houses mentally retarded children.

Children with the severe behavior problems are learning to dress themselves, stop throwing temper tantrums and avoid causing fights simply because they can earn "goodies" by being good and are ignored when they cause trouble.

SC Dean Is On Committee

Fred Stefanski, Schoolcraft College dean of arts and sciences, has been elected vice chairman of the Michigan Engineering - Community College Liaison Committee, which held its charter meeting in Traverse City in May.

The organization has been formed to coordinate engineering programs throughout Michigan so that students who take their first two years of engineering in community colleges may transfer to any of the state's four - year engineering colleges as juniors with the maximum amount of credit.

Representatives from the 29 public community colleges, nine engineering colleges, and the State Board of Education constitute the committee.

OPERATING WITH the simple premise that good behavior — not bad — should be rewarded, Paul MacCormack and other officials from PSH are helping children form behavior patterns suitable for living in the community.

Though Joey doesn't realize it, he learned to dress himself through positive reinforcement. After every difficult step of dressing he was given candy and, more importantly, attention.

And now Amy feeds herself instead of throwing the spoon on the floor because she earned attention and candy while learning the motions of bringing the spoon to her mouth.

Both children are among the more than 100 from the institution who had severe behavior problems and were selected for the "behavior analysis and therapy" (BAT) program.

Since it was started in October of 1970, the program has been opened to community children. So far, 30 have participated in it along with their parents.

Any parents of retarded children living at home can apply for admission to the program. Children are selected for the program based on their behavior problem.

ALL THE CHILDREN have behavior problems — but the community children have the advantage of having parents who can be taught the behavior modification approach and then individually cared for, MacCormack said.

Children from the institution can improve their behavior after participation in the intensive program. But then they have to return to the wards where they become one of a group of children again and lack the intensive attention.

When the children are selected for the behavior modification program, they are grouped according to size, rather than age so smaller children aren't threatened by the larger ones.

Once they are put on the BAT ward, they are observed, their problems are identified, and then they are put on the "token plan."

If a child must learn to dress himself, he is given candy — an immediate reward — for accomplishing the many little steps used in putting on a shirt or pair of pants.

If the child constantly fights and bites his peers, he is segregated from the group, and his bad behavior is ignored rather than reinforced by attention from the attendant or doctor.

The same is true for a child who throws temper tantrums.

SOON THEY learn that the way to win attention is to behave.

The behavior modification theory is also being applied to the more serious cases of children who abuse themselves. Both MacCormack and Dr. Henry Corte, PSH psychologist, say that some children begin abusing themselves as a way to get attention — and not necessarily because of masochistic tendencies.

Reversing that pattern is difficult and sometimes the positive reward system fails.

As a last resort the therapist will use small doses of electric shock to discourage the self-abuse. The shock is not at all like the "shock therapy" used years ago.

In those times, the shock was intense and traveled through the person's body. Now it is used in mild doses and it only travels through a one inch span between the two prongs attached to the skin.

THE SMALL battery-operated shock is attached to

the skin on the person's arm or leg. The shock is only applied when the person begins to abuse himself.

"We try to use it as little as possible," Dr. Corte said emphasizing that the shock has no damaging effects. If the method does not show signs of working after limited use, it is discontinued.

"If we had a perfect world, there would be no need for punishment," Dr. Corte said. "Punishment has many undesirable side effects."

But a child who abuses himself "one day will kill himself," if he can't be discouraged, he said.

ONE MOST encouraging product of the treatment is a 22-year-old man who had been kept in restraints for 13 years to keep him from severely hurting or killing himself.

Now his self-abusiveness has been curbed, and PSH employees are beginning to teach him to feed himself and toilet train him.

For any of the participants in the BAT program, therapy may last for a few weeks up to two months, depending on the person's response. If there has been no change in the behavior after two months, it is discontinued.

The theory is the same, but sometimes the children are rewarded with tokens which they can exchange at the institution's store for candy and other items.

But whether it's chocolate, candy corn or tokens, the children are learning that good behavior — not bad — pays off.

New Canoe Rules Are Toned Down

The Department of Natural Resources' proposed river-use rules for troubled stretches of the Au Sable, Manistee, Pine, and Pere Marquette rivers were unanimously approved this week with several problem-solving changes by a joint legislative committee on administrative rules.

Despite the committee's action, the measures remain blocked from taking effect until at least the end of July under a restraining order which was issued several weeks ago in Lake County Circuit Court.

The injunction against the rules stays in force through July 27-28, at which time a trial hearing will be held in that court to chart the next course of action on the much-discussed regulations.

IN THE MEANTIME, terms of the restraining order will enable the DNR to take further steps to meet administrative requirements for implementing the rules as they were passed this week by the joint legislative committee.

This means the DNR could have the measures ready to take immediate effect if and when they clear the court and several checkpoints under the state's administrative procedures system.

Under that system, the rules now must go to the governor's office for a minimum 10-day period of review, and then be filed with the secretary of state for 15 additional days.

AS APPROVED by the legislative committee, one of the major changes in the rules calls for a three-year "phasing-down" of daily watercraft permit quotas covering the main stream and south branch of the Au Sable River during weekends and holidays from the last Saturday of April through Labor Day.

Under this adjusted plan, the daily permit quota for the main stream from Grayling Pond Dam (US-27) down to Wakeley Bridge would be set at 350 for this year. It would be scaled down to 250 watercraft permits in 1973 and then be leveled off to 150 permits in 1974 and each year after that.

The DNR had proposed restricting the main stream's permit quota to 150 during Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, starting with this season.

THE LEGISLATIVE committee also adopted a graduated system for reducing daily watercraft

permit totals covering the south branch of the Au Sable from Chase Bridge down to Smith Bridge.

As such, the permit quota for those waters would be established at 200 for this year and rolled back to 150 in 1973. In 1974 and each year thereafter, it would stand at 100, the level which the DNR had recommended for this season.

Dropped under another major change was the proposed time restriction which would have limited the daily use of watercraft to the 8 a.m. - 6 p.m. period on permit-controlled sections of the four northern Michigan streams.

Action was also taken to raise from two to five the number of seasonal watercraft permits that will be available for use by members and guests of non-profit clubs, which hold frontage along sections of the streams designated for permit quotas.

AS A NEW feature of the DNR's proposed rules, the committee added a provision which will enable each river guide to obtain one seasonal permit for traditional "longboat" or "riverboat" use

on permit-controlled parts of the Au Sable, Manistee, Pine and Pere Marquette.

Another accommodation in the DNR's recommended regulations was made by adding a measure which will permit the use of non-motorized watercraft on Shellenbarger Creek between Shellenbarger Lake and the main stream of the Au Sable.

That liberalized change was adopted so that members of a Seventh Day Adventists organization may reach the main stream from their club headquarters on Shellenbarger Lake.

DNR officials, in reflecting upon all of these changes, credit the legislative committee for doing a thorough, first-class job of ironing out troublesome points in their recommended set of regulations.

"Frankly," notes a DNR spokesman, "the committee put its finger on those sections of our rules which were causing the most problems and controversy. We believe the committee has come up with some very fair and honest solutions to those problems, and we endorse its changes 100 per cent."

Minority Job Plan Hits Snag

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners has named a special coordinating committee to help implement a minority employment program in the County Road Commission.

Creation of the committee was agreed upon during a meeting at which union representatives complained that an affirmative action program adopted recently by the Road Commission conflicts, in some respects, with the seniority provisions of their contracts.

The Road Commission plan sets a five-year goal for increasing its non-white employment until it equals the 27 per cent proportion of minority population in Wayne County.

THE ROAD Commission, responsible for operation of the Detroit-Wayne County Metropolitan Airport, needs an affirmative action minority employment program to qualify for government funds dispensed by the Federal Aviation Authority (FAA). It is also required to have a

specific program for hiring and upgrading minority employees as a result of action by the Board of Commissioners.

In March the commissioners directed all county departments to submit an affirmative action program with detailed plans of operation.

The Road Commission proposal is the first submitted, and the first to come under review of the special coordinating committee.

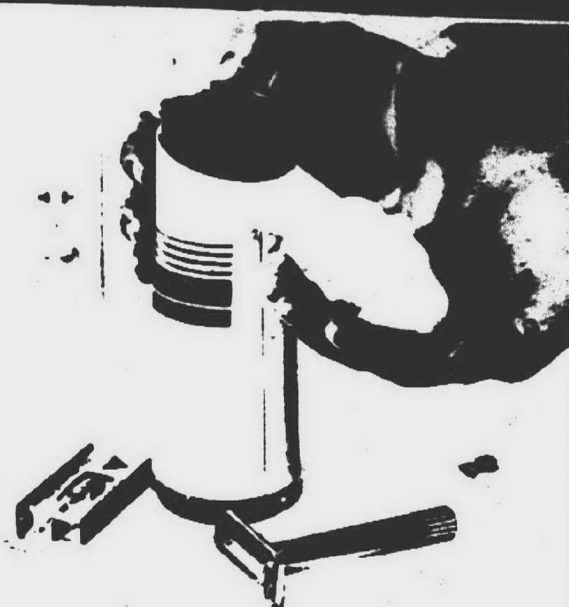

Honor Dad With These Cookies

Called "padre" in Spanish, "pere" in French, "otets" in Russian and "otosan" in Japanese, Dad in different parts of the world has roles that differ even more than his many names.

In the United States, a new father struts around handing out cigars. But among the Ainu of Japan and in many African and South American tribes, the father takes to his bed right after the baby is born and stays there for periods ranging from a few days to a month! The mother, in contrast, returns to her housekeeping as soon as possible.

Why? Because it's believed that the newborn child is affected by whatever its father does. If he worked, hunted, chopped down trees or rowed during the first days of its life, the baby might be dangerously weakened by all that strenuous exercise! So Dad follows the safest course - and does nothing.

"Chasten they son while there is hope," advises the Bible, "and let not thy soul spare for his crying." But in the Arapah tribe of New Guinea, one of Father's biggest jobs is to see that his offspring never cry.

Among these gentle folk, children are given almost anything they ask for, coddled and cuddled well past babyhood. Fathers as well as mothers delight in feeding the youngsters by hand, slipping them the choicest morsels of food. The kids grow up, not as spoiled brats, but as replicas of their mild parents.

Father's Day seems like a good incentive to fill up the cookie jar with peanut butter oatmeal snaps, try a fancy new chicken recipe and this frozen praline pie.

FROZEN PRALINE PIE

1 baked 9-inch pastry shell
3/4 c. Karo light or dark corn syrup
1 pkg. (8-ounce) cream cheese, softened
1/4 c. margarine
1/3 c. firmly packed light brown sugar
3/4 c. milk
3/4 c. coarsely chopped or broken pecans
Whipped cream (optional)
Gradually add the corn syrup to the cream cheese, stirring until smooth. Melt margarine and brown sugar over medium heat, stirring constantly. Gradually stir into the cream cheese mixture. Stir in milk. Pour into baked shell. Sprinkle pecans over top of pie and freeze until firm, four to six hours. Serve with whipped cream if desired.

CURRIED BREAST OF CHICKEN VERONIQUE

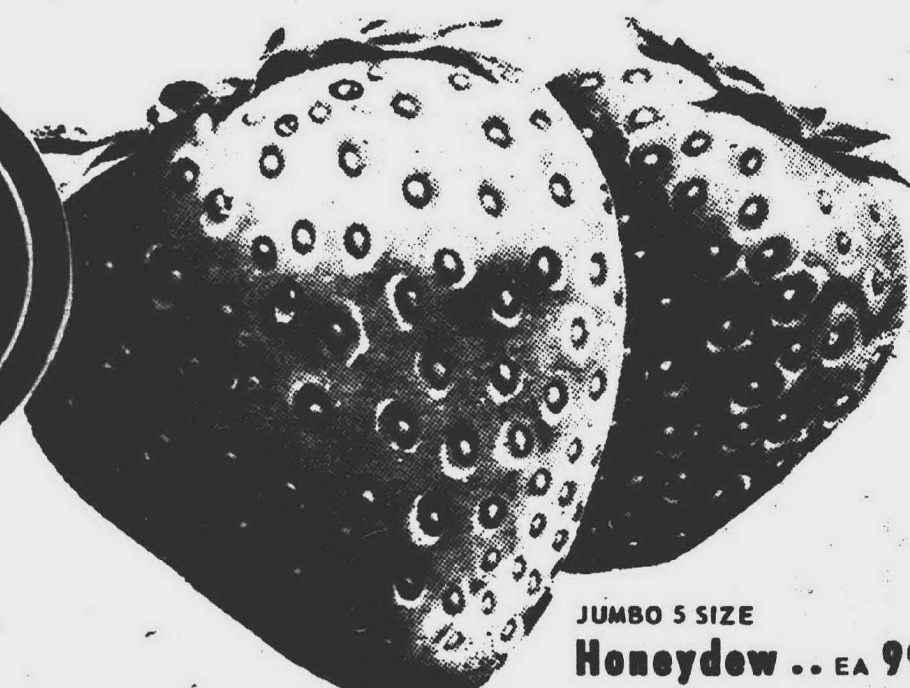
6 chicken breast halves
Salt and paprika
Flour
1/2 c. butter or margarine
1/3 c. flour
1 can chicken broth (10 1/2 oz. condensed)
1 c. light cream
1 t. curry powder
1 1/2 c. seedless green grapes
Wash chicken and pat dry. Sprinkle chicken on both sides with salt and paprika. Dip into flour. Heat butter and brown chicken on all sides. Cook over low heat, turning occasionally, until chicken is tender. Cover chicken while it is cooking. Remove chicken to a platter and keep warm. Add flour to pan drippings and stir to loosen all drippings. Gradually add the chicken broth, light cream and curry powder. Cook over low heat, stirring, until the sauce thickens. Add grapes and heat briefly. Spoon sauce over chicken breasts. Makes six servings.

PEANUT BUTTER OATMEAL SNAPS

Mix together 1/4 cup peanut butter, 1/4 cup margarine, 1/2 cup granulated sugar, 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar. Mix in one beaten egg and 1/2 teaspoon vanilla then one cup quick oats, one cup sifted flour and 1/4 cup chopped nuts. Shape into a roll about two inches in diameter. Wrap in waxed paper and chill about four hours or until firm. Cut in 1/4 - inch slices with a sharp knife. Place on ungreased baking sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for eight to 10 minutes or until edges are slightly browned. Remove immediately from baking sheet and cool on wire rack. Makes about 36 cookies.

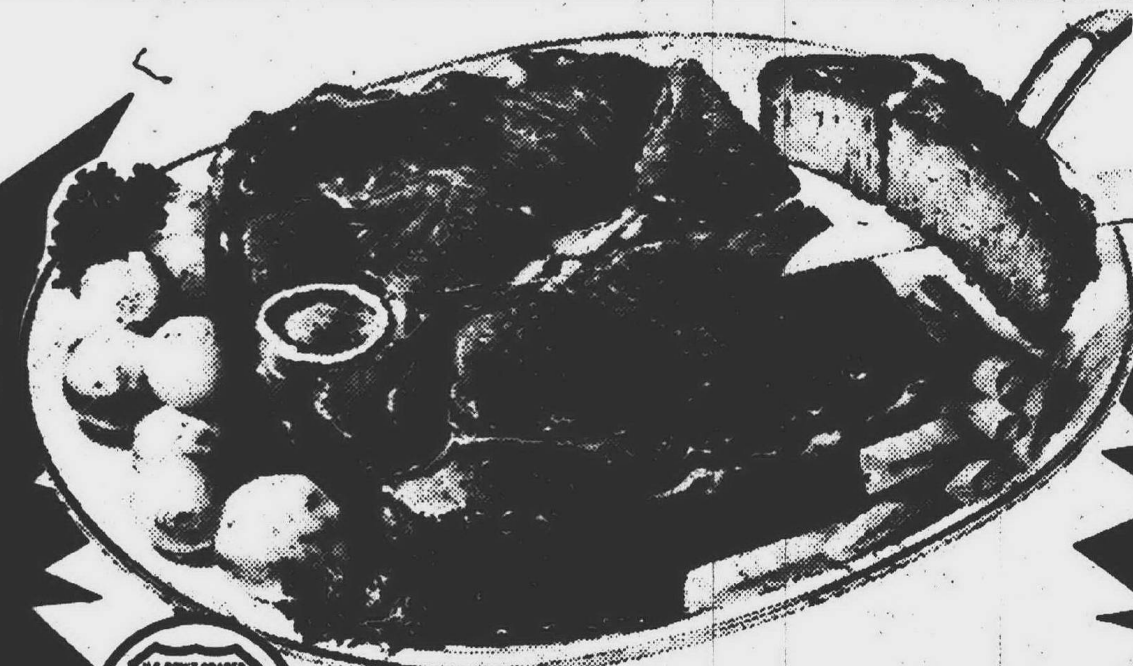

Problem In Handgun Hassle Is Trying To Collect Facts

At a Senate hearing not long ago on a subject since forgotten, a witness told of a chicken and a snake who battled each other bloody over a piece of copper wire, one thinking it a worm and the other thinking it a relative.

It shows what can happen, he said, when opponents on any issue operate on differing sets of facts.

The story was brought to mind again by the flow of mail and comment that followed my introduction of a bill to prohibit the ownership of handguns to all except law enforcement officers, licensed security guards, collectors and target shooting clubs. All other handguns would be purchased at fair market value by the government.

On the handgun issue there is clearly no consensus on the basic facts.

The bill would have no effect on rifles and shotguns although many of my correspondents feel that private ownership of all firearms is threatened.

THE CONFUSION, perhaps my fault, carries to every level. The Board of Directors of the Michigan United Conservation Clubs, an estimable

organization of conservationists and sportsmen, shortly after the handgun bill was introduced, passed a resolution that read in part:

"Whereas some elected and appointed public officials have expressed their opposition to the private ownership of not only handguns but also long guns such as commonly used for hunting..."

Here, I should admit, the MUCC is in possession of information not available to me because I have heard of no official who opposes the private ownership of rifles and shotguns. Long guns and handguns are quite different in function and threat. They are linked by the word "firearm" in much the same way that automobiles and tanks are linked by the word "vehicle."

Handguns are primarily designed for the killing and wounding of human beings.

Long guns, in contrast, have many wholesome uses and are awkward weapons for the commission of street crimes. Because of their handy design, handguns account for three-quarters of all firearms woundings and killings although they comprise only one-quarter of all the guns in the nation.

BUT TO ILLUSTRATE the differing sets of facts, let me cite the arguments most often

used by opponents of handgun controls.

1. "Criminals won't turn in their guns so only law-abiding citizens will be left unarmed."

But the facts, as I understand them, are that criminals are turning in guns every day, though not voluntarily. Every year, police confiscate thousands of weapons from criminal suspects.

However, criminal arsenals are constantly being replenished -- through burglaries, thefts, loans and purchases -- with handguns owned by honest citizens.

2. "Householders won't be safe in their homes if handguns are taken away."

There is a world of evidence that a household without a handgun is more secure than a household that has one. Only a tiny fraction of the times that a household handgun is fired will the bullet bring down a robber or burglar. The usual victims are gun owners or their relatives, children, friends and neighbors.

Most American homicides do occur in the home, and the handgun is the usual instrument because it is most often kept loaded and even a child can operate it.

3. "The Constitution prohibits gun control legislation."

The second amendment to the Constitution reads, "A well-regulated militia being necessary to the security of a

free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed."

Very often, pro-gun publications print only the last 13 words of that amendment. But the Supreme Court, reading it in full, ruled in 1939 that firearms regulation is not unconstitutional unless it impairs the effectiveness of the militia (now known as the National Guard).

4. "People, not guns, commit crime. Without handguns, they'd find some other way to kill."

But doesn't the government have some obligation to make killing as difficult as possible? And the handgun, unlike other available weapons, is really designed as an efficient instrument for one purpose: the killing and wounding of humans.

5. "Your mail, you admit, is running heavily against handgun control. Why not heed the will of your constituents and abandon this folly?"

Well, constituent mail is a valuable source of information for any office-holder but it does not always reflect the majority view. Every scientific poll ever taken on gun control shows that most people favor it -- but polls shouldn't control legislative decisions either.

At least every once in awhile a politician ought to go where his logic takes him even though it makes political life more difficult.

Wallace Backers Something Else

The way a mere man would describe the Wallace delegates would be like this:

They walk into local district Democratic conventions with an aura of sanctity and patriotism about them and expect party leaders to jump.

The supporters of the Alabama governor remind everyone at the top of their lungs that their man got more than 50 per cent of the vote in the presidential primary, and how come we don't get more committee seats, and what's goin' on here anyhow?

Unlike the Goldwater backers in the Republican ranks in 1964 and the McCarthy-Kennedy-McGovern people of 1968-72, the Wallaceites did virtually no precinct organizing; they ran few delegates, and most of those got beaten; they know as much parliamentary procedure as a poodle puppy and can't comprehend why they, speaking for the majority, aren't allowed to shout down the chairman or anyone else, any time they feel like it.

THAT'S THE WAY a mere man sees it. But a more entertaining view is provided by Amy Juntunen, a young Livonia matron who is attending Schoolcraft College. Amy attended some of the recent Democratic conventions, helped the Observer compile data on the delegates and then recorded her impressions, which I am delighted to share, of the Wallace women.

"One thing for sure," she

begins, "they are not Bryn Mawr alumni nor Junior Leaguers. It's far easier to imagine them at St. Jerome's bingo night or at a Tupperware demonstration than at a League of Women Voters meeting."

"Yet they are more politically involved, more willing to fight it out in the bloody arena of the Democratic Party's congressional district conventions than your average leaguer."

"Bordering on the fanatic in their belief that George Wallace will be the next president -- if 'they' don't finish the job next time -- these Wallace Women are so far removed from the ladies personally associated with the governor that one must wonder what his reaction is when meeting them on the campaign trail."

At this point, I should point out that Mrs. Juntunen herself is a native of Alabama, hence has some comprehension of what the women "personally associated" with the governor are like.

SHE GOES ON: "Red, white and blue are the colors of the day, obesity the shape of things. Indeed, so many are overweight that one begins to wonder if free Silhouette memberships aren't promised along with law and order and an end to busing."

"Style is not of over-riding concern to the Weight Watchers for Wallace (freshman class) faction; girdles are evidently considered subversive, hair dressers to be avoided at all costs. The few more shapely Wallace gals, the ones with the short skirts, boots and Lady Clairol hair, have more in common with their hefty sisters than the 'Stand Up For America' and 'Send Them a Message' chest banners."

"There is a common denominator -- the shrill voices ('you call this a convention? This is a farce!'); the anger lines etched into old and young faces alike, the chests heaving with indignation -- though these vary in size and structure -- and the absolute certainty that anyone who doesn't think George Wallace is the greatest man alive is a Communist and or just plain stupid."

So much for a woman's eye view of the Wallace clan.

There are those who say the Wallaceites added an element of fun and excitement to the recent round of conventions. Maybe so. But I've seen high school clubs operate with more political sophistication.

School Psychologist Denies Charges

In a recent letter to the editor, Howard Davis expressed support for the position that the Livonia Public Schools eliminate their school psychologists who are described as "old world doctors who enjoy practicing intellectual medicine on the minds of children."

In the letter, Mr. Davis implies that psychologists in the Livonia Public Schools employ techniques and goals similar to those employed by Herr Goebbels to "brainwash Hitler's youth and degenerate the German public mind to the animal state."

One is left with the impression that the school psychology department in Livonia is a nefarious propaganda department bent on brainwashing the youth of our city in order to achieve some corrupt end.

Mr. Davis demonstrates not the slightest knowledge of the

role and function of Livonia's Department of Psychological Services and his charges represent a grave disservice to the youth within our schools if allowed to stand unanswered.

In 1959, school psychologists (or school psychological diagnosticians as they are often referred) were introduced into the schools by the Michigan State Department of Education.

The purpose was to provide, through psychological evaluation, a process to identify and more adequately structure educational programs for students who were educable mentally handicapped or trainable mentally handicapped.

The role of the psychologist is NOT therapy. Following the evaluation, more effective educational programs can be instituted and, when warranted, special supportive teacher assistance can be provided. The goal of this program is to allow handicapped students to become more effective learners and to be more able to take an

active and meaningful role in society.

THE RATIO of psychological personnel recommended and financially reimbursed by the Michigan State Department of Education was and is one per 5,000 students. This is the ratio maintained at present in the Livonia Public Schools.

Since 1959, service has expanded to include students demonstrating learning disabilities or having physical disabilities since these students also require special programs of educational assistance. When appropriate, consultation is also extended to both teachers and parents. It should be stressed that NO child is seen for psychological evaluation without parental permission.

It is occasionally stated that "there is no special education in life." The implication is that these handicapped youngsters should be expected to "sink or swim" in the regular school program with no assistance.

Were this position accepted, blind students would be given regular classroom readers, deaf students expected to profit from lectures and mentally handicapped expected to function at grade level.

Such expectations are obviously false and would not bear rebuttal if one were not frequently bombarded with this statement by those who "thoughtlessly voice the 'no special education in life' slogan."

It is by giving such youngsters needed assistance during their school careers that many are able to take their

place in society when reaching adulthood without the need for further assistance.

One should therefore keep in mind that the elimination of Livonia's psychological services would serve to eliminate many of Livonia's excellent and highly regarded programs for the handicapped.

I would like to point out that in March, 1972, a group of Livonia citizens from the school advisory council reviewed Livonia's psychological services and recommended that the department be expanded by one member rather than eliminated as Mr. Davis has suggested.

This citizen group's assessment revealed no role of the department in undermining the fabric of American society as implied in Mr. Davis' letter. Interested citizens who would like to discuss further the role and function of the department should feel free to contact department members at any time.

Difficult To Identify Street Names At Night

With the arrival of summer and the usual army of vacationers visiting Observerland with its many new sub-divisions there is a crying need for improved street identifications in the hours of darkness.

Maybe the street signs are erected with white numbers on green or blue backgrounds. But many of them are so far removed from the intersections that it is most difficult to see them.

Oftimes, the difficulty arises in the daylight hours -- in the newer sub-divisions where the travelers will be visiting for the first time.

ONCE DARKNESS comes it is almost impossible to identify a street unless the motorist pulls over to the side, shines the lights of the car, if possible, on the sign.

In many of our sub-divisions, too, that are built in wooded areas, the trees hide the street signs in the hours of darkness -- and the problem of identification becomes even more acute.

There is a simple solution and in the interest of public safety it should be applied as quickly as possible. All it requires is that the lettering be done with fluorescent paint -- the type that stands out when in the path of light rays.

Homeowners Group Act Challenged I-275 Bids May Hit \$11 Million

This is an open letter to the Burton Hollow Civic Association in Livonia.
Along with a copy of the association's newsletter, I received a notice of a meeting to be held at a local public high school. This notice was hand delivered by the same person and through the courtesy of the Burton Hollow Civic Association.

Bids will also be taken by the Michigan State Highway Dept. on improvements at the intersection of Levan and Five Mile Rds. in Livonia totalling an estimated \$100,000.

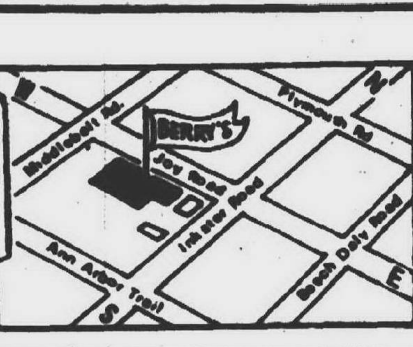

Bentley, Plymouth Bow In Regionals

High school baseball in Observerland came to a close at the Southfield state tourney regional but it wasn't without a struggle.

Livonia Bentley and Plymouth High each won their respective district titles and were in the running for the regional crown along with Detroit Cody and Edsel Ford. Bentley fell victim to Edsel Ford, 5-1, but Plymouth battled past Cody, 3-1, for the Plymouth - Edsel Suburban Eight Southfield regional showdown.

Plymouth ran out of steam and Edsel Ford zipped by the Rocks, 4-1, to win the right to move to the state finals at Flint this weekend.

"We were just outlucked against Edsel Ford," said Bentley Coach Marty Klokik. "A break or two and we would have had the game and maybe even the regional."

BENTLEY popped on the board in the top of the first on a Pat Perino double and single by John Gentz but the bottom of the stanza told the story.

Sophomore Dan Vezina was on the mound for Bentley and got into a jam by walking leadoff batter Ron Branz. Gary Dorosh then tapped one back to Vezina who scooped up the ball and turned to second but found the umpire between him and the bag and then looked to first but nobody was there and Edsel Ford had runners on first and second.

Vezina struck out the next batter and Randy Owen grounded one to third baseman Tom Worniak. The Bulldog third baseman rifled a throw to second that carried into center field and Branz scored.

On an appeal play, Vezina balked to advance the runners and Dave Buta drew a base on balls. Mike Burke sacrificed to score Owen and Jeff Davoish singled to score Buta and Edsel Ford was in command, 4-1.

COACH KLOKIK brought in Brent Boegler and a ground out ended the inning.

Edsel Ford scored its final run in the second on a single by Branz, a single by Jim Cameron that was a routine pop fly to short lost in the sun

and an error by Worniak at third, to fill the bases. Boegler uncorked a wild pitch that hit Buta to force in Branz with the fifth and final run.

EDSEL FORD only got two hits after the second but Bentley mustered only four in a futile attempt for a comeback. The Bulldogs fell out of the tourney and finished the season with a 11-13 mark. Plymouth won its semifinal game over Detroit Cody, 3-1, in what Coach Wayne Sparkman described as "one heck of a game."

Senior righthander John Owens went the distance, allowed only four hits, walked none and struck out four in taking the win. The triumph evened his season mark at 7-7 and lowered his earned run average to a 1.57 with 78 strikeouts in 76 innings.

Bob Owchinko went the route for Cody and also gave up only four hits, with three unearned runs telling his story. The Detroit hurler struck out eight and walked one.

PLYMOUTH WOKE up in

the third inning to score all three earned runs. Dave Hees singled and Steve Robb laid down a perfect bunt. A wild toss allowed Hees to score and with no outs, Dan Hees singled in Robb.

HERMAN then drove one over the left fielder's head for a three bagger to score three and scampered in on a sacrifice by Hagen.

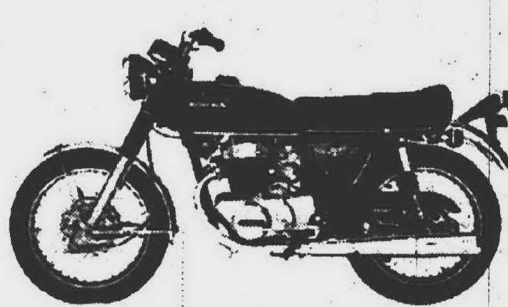

Turf Tips, Quips

Saturday will go down as one of the biggest dates in Michigan thoroughbred and standardbred racing. It will be recorded in history as the date on which a Michigan colt won the \$50,000 added Michigan Derby at Hazel Park and a Michigan owned trotter registered one of the biggest upsets of 1972 with a shocking triumph in the \$25,000 Matron three year old trot.

Mr. Cutter, generally regarded as the state's most outstanding three year old, romped away from seven challengers after taking a three-length lead turning into the stretch and finally hit the wire five lengths in front of the odds-on favorite Introductory.

The Cutter is owned by the Redbob Stable of Oxford. The crowd of 17,262, largest of the season, made The Cutter second choice and the colt ate up the fast track to win \$33,210 and an additional 10 per cent breeder's award.

Crimson Reaper, another Michigan owned from the Crimson Farm stable of Peter Salmen, a Livonia industrialist, set a fast pace for more than half of the race, leading by three lengths at one time. That's when The Cutter, with Larry Snyder up, darted past to move past Crimson Reaper and Introductory. That was the end of the race for the others as the colt just kept moving away.

Mr. Cutter became the first Michiganbred to win the Derby and it also was the first Derby triumph for Snuder, the tracks' leading jockey who had four winners for the afternoon. Introductory was second.

BUT THERE was a major upset on the other side of town at the Detroit Race Course where Mr. Colwell, a Scotch Valley colt owned by Duane Greenlee of Milford, came from far back in the stretch drive to overtake and beat the famed Super Bowl by a half length in 2:02.3.

Super Bowl, champion two year old trotter of 1971 and early favorite for the 1972 Hambletonian championship, was the 1-5 choice this time and appeared to have the victory well in hand when he opened up two and a half lengths as the field turned into the stretch.

There are those who believe driver Stan Dancer was caught napping in the drive to the wire since he drove Super Bowl with supreme confidence that the colt was the best in the field.

As it turned out Charley Norris Jr. had a live one on the outside in Mr. Colwell who showed amazing speed in the final furlong and gradually whittled the margin from two and a half lengths to a mere half-length and then sped by the startled Dancer and Super Bowl to win by a half length.

Dancer tried to shake up his colt in the closing strides but there wasn't any chance of halting Mr. Colwell...the Michiganbred just flew past and hit the finish with a clear margin.

Longest priced trotter in the six horse field, Mr. Colwell went off at better than 21-1 odds and paid \$45.20. Third was Flush.

Super Bowl won 15 of 23 races last season and earned \$163,898. He took a record of 1:59.4 over the mile track at Lexington, Ky. last fall.

In contrast, Mr. Colwell had raced with only moderate success at the county fairs. He showed only four wins in 26 starts and earned a scant \$7,487. The colt picked up \$12,500 for his Matron triumph.

EARLIER in the evening, Dancer met defeat by a length with Speedy Carlene as Delmonica Hanover, champion two year old trotting filly of 1971, led from start to finish to win the \$8,678 Breeders filly stake.

It was a pre-program non-betting affair because of Delmonica Hanover, Driver-Trainer Del Miller made the Wolverine management look good in its decision for a non-betting race by sending his filly to the front at the start and staying there to win in 2:01.4.

Then Dancer added another bit of zest to the already zestful racing card when he had a helicopter waiting in the infield to transport him and his wife, Rachel, and other members of his party to Metro Airport immediately after the three year old trot.

The famous driver will vacation in Florida until Friday when he'll return to Wolverine to guide the great Albatross in the \$60,000 Matron four year old pace. The Bird will be aiming for an unprecedented sweep in the Matrons...winning as a two and three at Wolverine and now attempting to make into the winner's circle as a four.

And the appearance of Albatross will bring what Wolverine Raceway's official family believe will be the biggest crowd in Michigan history and the first million dollar handle.

make the night one that most harness racing fan's don't want to miss.

ALBATROSS was the big reason for the track becoming the first to pass the \$900,000 barrier a year ago. Now he's rated as the most spectacular pacer in modern times who will be making his final appearance in the Detroit area.

Coupled with Albatross will be the annual celebration of "Good Ol' Times" at the track. The night when prices are rolled back to the scale at the turn of the century...dime hot dogs, nickel coke, free admission to the grandstand, an antique car parade in front of the stands, two or three oldtime jazz bands and numerous other items that

But prior to Friday, there'll be the \$25,000 Matron three year old pace on Thursday and the \$60,000 Matron for four year old trotters Wednesday which brings Speedy Crown, 1971 Hambletonian champion, back to the track in quest of his first victory.

The series of Grand Circuit events opened Friday when Russ Butler, a son of Adios Butler guided by veteran Eddie Cobb, was an easy victor in the championship finale of the \$24,950 Motor City pace.

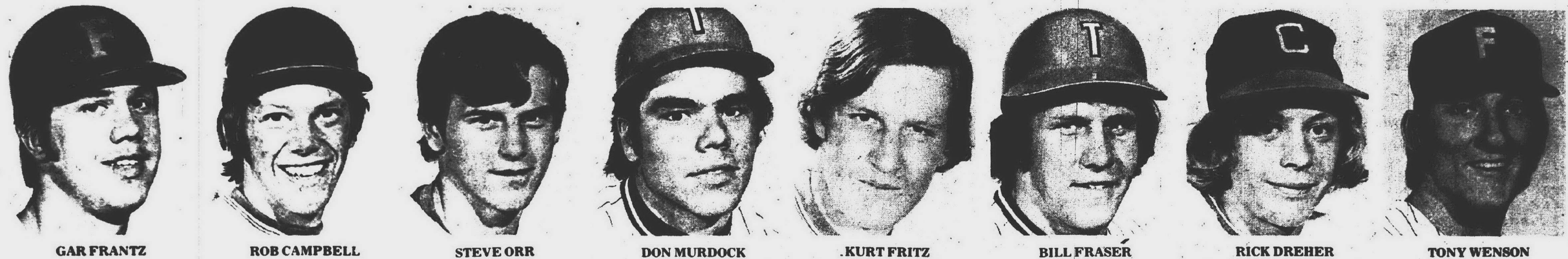

Here Are The Best In Area Prep Baseball!

How would you like to manage a prep baseball team that hits at a .366 clip, averages six foot and 175 pounds, a pitching staff that performs at a .786 winning percentage and averages one and a half strikeouts per inning?

Sounds too good to be true? Not when it's the all-area, all-Observer baseball team selected from 21 high schools.

Juniors made a strong bid in the first team balloting with four on the No. 1 team. Six seniors and one sophomore round out the top team selected by your Observer Sports Editor and area coaches.

Thurston's Bill Fraser paced all Observerland hitters with an even .500 mark with 38 hits in 76 at bats with a pitching threesome compiling a 22-6 record.

GARDEN CITY EAST'S Dennis Ray, Redford Union's Gary Fulk, and Bishop Borgess' Reese Dobrick make up the No. 1 pitching staff.

RU paced all schools with three players on the team with Thurston and GC East claiming two berths apiece.

Franklin High claimed the first base position in junior Gar Frantz. The Patriot slugger connected for 27 hits in 61 at bats for a .442 batting mark (Third in Observerland).

The Franklin co-captain was an unanimous all-conference choice in the Northwest Suburban league and paced the Patriots with 27 hits, 21 runs batted in, seven doubles and three home runs.

AT SECOND BASE is RU's second year starter Rob Campbell. The Panther senior hit .364 with 22 hits and 16 runs to his credit.

"Rob has a strong arm and good range," said RU Coach Bob Atkins. "He developed into one of the league's top leadoff hitters."

GC East's Steve Orr was top choice at shortstop. The 5'9" junior, also the Panther quarterback, batted .345 with 19 hits in 55 at bats.

Orr was also leadoff batter and came up with nine stolen bases.

THE EAST SHORTSTOP was involved in 10 double plays and was All-League in the Mid-Wayne conference.

Rounding out the infield is Thurston's Don Murdock at third base. The Eagle senior was a two year starter and captain of the 11-10 squad.

He hit .290 this season but fell to .238 this season.

Unlike other members of the all area squad who made the team with a high batting average, Don was the No. 1 third base selection for his all around play and attitude. "Bob is tops on defense and always gives it 100 per cent," said Thurston Coach Emil Majeski. "He would be the player I would turn to in any key situation."

THE OUTFIELD is composed of seniors Bill Fraser from Thurston and RU's Kurt Fritz and junior Rick Dreher from Churchill.

"Fritz was the clutch man in our attack," said RU Coach Atkins. "He was the team leader and played right field as well as any high school player I've seen."

The Panther senior batted .333 with 29 hits in 87 at bats. He scored a total of 23 runs, established a school record with 23 runs batted in, popped out 10 extra base hits and five home runs.

FRITZ also paced the RU squad with eight stolen bases in nine attempts.

Junior Red Wing defenseman turned ball player Bill Fraser stole the limelight at Thurston this season. The 185 pound senior batted No. 1 in Observerland at .500.

Fraser lashed out 38 hits in 21 games, hit four doubles, two triples, and three four-baggers. The Eagle centerfielder made good 13 of 14 stolen base attempts.

"There isn't enough I can say about Bill," said Eagle mentor Majeski. "He was the team leader and has rapidly changed his outlook from hockey to college baseball."

CHURCHILL JUNIOR Rick Dreher rounds out the outfield

with 19 hits in 51 trips to the plate for a .373 showing. The Charger outfielder was errorless in 16 games and collected four assists.

Dreher struck out only four times and stole six bases in leading Churchill to a winning season.

Eligibility Problem Hits Adray Baseball League

The Adray baseball league is taking a tumble and nobody wants to make the first move back to the drawing board. Adray has four leagues in Michigan for boys ages 16 through 20. Lansing, Mt. Pleasant, Detroit and Ann Arbor have leagues with the Ann Arbor circuit evolving around Overland.

Managers are allowed to pick up four outsiders to round out a 15 man roster. An outsider is classified as any player living outside the city the team is representing in the state of Michigan, just as long

as he does not live in a city that does have another Adray team.

But a stipulation does exist that allows a player living in an area where an Adray team exists to play for another Adray team if he receives a release from that manager.

The residency question has become a very ticklish situation as some coaches are placing the desire to win above the "health" of the leagues.

For years the suburbs were robbed of good ball players as Detroit teams usually made a clean sweep of the better kids. But the Detroit Adray and Ann Arbor loops finally agreed upon a pact where they would

not grab ball players from each respective district.

TWO SEPARATE cases have popped up and nobody wants to make a decision on what is right and what is wrong.

The powerful Redford Adray team coached by Pat Sheridan has Detroit's Jim Ford on the roster. Redford Adray is in the Ann Arbor league and Ford hurled in the opener Sunday against Northville Reef in an 8-1 victory.

Sheridan claims that Ford who plays ball for Eastern

Michigan University has been a resident of Ypsilanti the past eight months and is living in Ypsilanti and thus is up for grabs even though his parents live in Detroit.

"Ford is living in an apartment in Ypsilanti," said Sheridan. "He votes in Ypsilanti, pays rent and has a driver's license there."

"I know a lot of people don't like the idea of him playing for me since he has played ball in Detroit the past few summers, but as far as I know... he is a legal resident of Ypsilanti and

we can have him on the roster as an outsider."

"It's really a shame to have to bind players to play on a certain team just because of residence," added Sheridan.

The other incident is just the opposite but a little more clear. A player admits living in Wayne, in the jurisdiction of the Westland Burger King team in the Ann Arbor league is on Detroit Larco's entry in the Detroit Adray league.

THE PLAYER is 18-year-old Dave Miton who also played for Eastern Michigan University.

"Miton is a resident of Wayne but does not want to play for the Westland Adray team," said Larco Coach Al Favro. "His parents don't like the setup in Westland and they don't even want him to play there."

"Why should he be forced to play somewhere he doesn't want to?" added Favro. "They should change the rules and make it open in all leagues."

FAVRO has played three games already but unlike

Redford Adray, he is holding back on playing Miton until there is a definite ruling.

There is no way Favro wants to be involved in any type of forfeits.

"I have an attorney working on the case now," concluded Favro.

So a fight is now on between Detroit and Ann Arbor with Adray President Perry Deacon sitting tight.

Livonia's Department of Parks and Recreation Summer Baseball Supervisor Bob Schwarcz is caught in the middle. He heads the Ann Arbor contingent and has received numerous complaints on both cases.

"All I want is a ruling and I will abide," said Schwarcz. "I am willing to listen to anybody to tell me how to prove whether the kid is living in Detroit or Ypsilanti."

"Everyone wants Perry Deacon to make a ruling but he won't," added Schwarcz.

"Everyone knows Favro runs the Detroit league and even though the Miton case is a direct violation, he'll probably get away with this incident... but the Ford case I don't know how to rule."

"MITON IS now living in Ypsilanti for the sole purpose of being able to play for us in Detroit," added Favro. "Any player living in Ypsilanti can be grabbed by any Adray team as an outsider as Ypsilanti does not boast an Adray team."

"Once I receive a written protest, I will act on the problem," said President Deacon. "It will then be brought before a protest committee and a ruling made."

"Both cases are violations but I will not act until I receive a written protest," added Deacon. "I am all for letting the matter go and just considering the entire incident an even trade."

The Court Jester

"How does that guy win?" "What a silly looking serve!" Look at those weird strokes." "He's unorthodox."

The above are just some of the descriptions heard this past weekend about one or two players in the Livonia Tennis Club Tournament.

Naturally, the quotes came mainly from the losers, but they had a point to make. How often have we seen a player with unusual strokes knock off better players who seem to have "classic" strokes?

They have developed a style of their own. Usually they are self-taught, never having had a lesson, but you find they play seven days a week.

You've seen them. The ones

with the strange looking serves are the ones I enjoy watching. They start by doing a few hip gyrations and seem to wave at you with their racket before they hit the ball. You're so mesmerized by this technique, that you haven't as yet realized that the serve is landing in your court rather consistently.

Now I figure this guy has spent a lot of time watching some belly-dancer and has figured out a method of distracting his opponent. If I were him I'd be careful.

Which leads me to my next point. The great Tony Wilding once said: "Perfect style, inexhaustible stamina, even the best strokes are of no avail if the brain that governs the hand is not taking stock of strategic positions and planning moves by which winning coups may be achieved."

This is called strategy or generalship. Good players don't just hit the ball for the sake of returning it. They utilize spin, change of pace, depth and angles, and anticipate their opponents moves.

A good chess player plans several moves ahead. The same holds true for tennis. You may not have the most classic looking strokes on the court, but you are consistent and you have a plan.

You have one great shot in your repertoire and your objective is to get to use that shot as often as possible. How can you move your opponent around to feed you that shot? Think about it next time you're on the court. Mail your results to Believe It or Not.

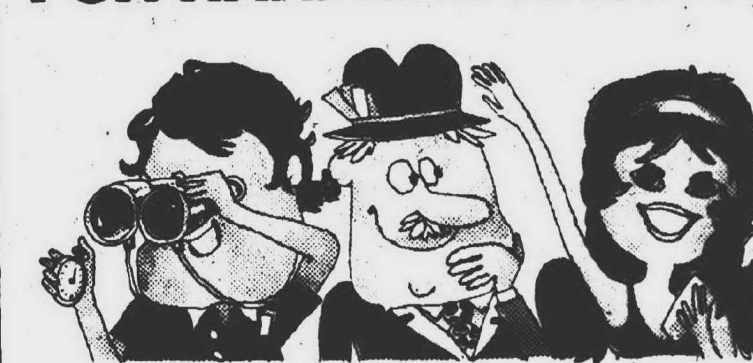

A special task force has been formed by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners to determine how Wayne County General Hospital can be utilized to its maximum extent.

Currently, one-third of the hospital's 500 medical beds are unoccupied. Known as "Eloise," the hospital is located in Westland.

Among considerations under review by the task force is the possibility of allowing private physicians and private patients to use the hospital.

The appointments from the Board of Commissioners, two from the County Board of Auditors, and two from the County Board of Institutions, governing body of the hospital.

The appointments from the Board of Commissioners, made by Chairman Robert E. FitzPatrick, are Commissioner Paul Silver, Detroit, and James P. Curran.

Curran is project director of the Detroit-Wayne County Health Department steering committee, and was named chairman of the task force at its first meeting, June 8.

Representatives from the Board of Auditors are Leonard D. Proctor, board chairman, and Edward Bobowski, county budget director.

Members appointed by the Board of Institutions are Dr. Ramon R. Joseph, president of the medical staff at Wayne County General, and Dr. Thomas J. Herrmann, assistant dean of the medical school at the University of Michigan.

THE TASK FORCE, says Curran, will focus on five major concerns.

Besides the possibility of admitting non-staff physicians into hospital practices, the group will also review hospital revenue sources and expenditures, and will

reevaluate its relationship between the University of Michigan and Wayne State University medical schools.

"Our overall goal is to review the health needs of Wayne County and the impact on the future of Wayne County General Hospital," said Curran. "To achieve, this we are looking toward broad participation from all concerned groups."

With the aid of consultants, the group hopes to complete its study by mid-October.

Ex-officio members of the task force are FitzPatrick; Martin Birk, chairman of the Board of Institutions, and Symon R. Gottlieb, executive director of the Greater Detroit Area Hospital Planning Council.

In addition to the medical hospital, Wayne County General Hospital has a psychiatric division and a long-term care facility.

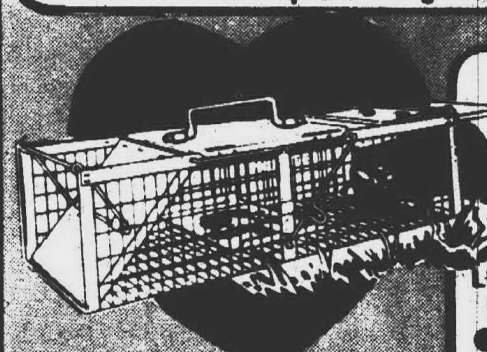

Mrs. Rhoda Niss, Livonia mother who received a new



kidney more than a week ago in University Hospital, Ann Arbor, was reported in fair condition Monday afternoon.

A hospital statement said "the new kidney is not functioning completely normally as yet."

Mrs. Niss is well known to many in this area because of the courageous and uncompromising battle she has waged against kidney disease since 1968.

Hundreds have made contributions to the mounting costs of her home use of a

kidney machine, and a theater party to help offset the cost of the transplant surgery is scheduled tonight in the Livonia Mall Cinema.

MRS. DIANALINE Brennan, across-the-street neighbor who heads the non-profit Home Dialysis Kidney Foundation that has been clearing house for aid to Mrs. Niss, said that the theater party sponsored by the Hearthstone Homeowners Association in Livonia already had netted \$750.

"A lot of that wasn't for tickets," she added. "Just contributions from people who wanted to help."

Mrs. Brennan said she had gone with Mrs. Niss's husband, Sidney, to visit her Sunday.

"She wasn't feeling very well," she said later. "But we talked to a couple of other transplant patients who said their progress had been very slow at first."

Mrs. Brennan also said she understood it wasn't unusual

for progress to be up and down following transplant surgery.

THE TRANSPLANT surgery was done in University Hospital in the early hours of Monday, June 5.

Mrs. Brennan said she understood that the kidney had come from a four-year-old boy, and that his second kidney was given to a young woman from Flint.

"Rhoda got her call Sunday evening," said Mrs. Brennan, "and they packed her bag and went right out."

"As soon as the tests were made to make sure the kidney matched in type, the surgery was begun. It started about 2:30 a.m. and went on until 8:30."

Mrs. Brennan said she understood it is good to receive a kidney from a young person. "According to all I've been able to learn, there is less chance of rejection," she added.

MRS. NISS, who has been one of only a few kidney patients to use a home machine, has been having dialysis several times a week since the second of her own kidneys ceased to function more than three years ago.

The first had failed about the time the first of her three children was born 14 years ago.

In recent months, as kidney transplants became more frequent and more successful, she decided to have the surgery if a kidney became available.

The Home Dialysis Kidney Foundation before the latest drive for funds was able to meet about \$16,000 in costs connected with Mrs. Niss's home treatment.

Leaders of the foundation figured about \$10,000 would be needed to see her through transplant procedure. "And if it is finally successful, she will be on medication the rest of her life," Mrs. Brennan added.

She thanked all who had helped with contributions, including the National Honor Society of Clarenceville Junior High School which raised \$162 on a recent ice cream social and the Westside Lions Club which recently added \$1,000 to a previous \$2,500 gift.

Wallaceites Land 'Pro' In 19th

Glenn Hartsell of Redford Township is far from the ordinary Wallace backer.

The ordinary Wallace backer is a person of practically no political experience, no history of activity in the Democratic Party and no record in politics.

Hartsell, in contrast, has a couple of decades experience. He is an unquestioned Democratic loyalist and was even a delegate to the 1968 Democratic National Convention.

Hartsell and six other persons from the 19th Congressional District were picked last weekend to attend the 1972 national convention in Miami Beach, there to select a nominee to take on incumbent Republican Richard Nixon.

ran uncommitted for delegate in Redford's sixth precinct and says now he will stay committed to Wallace, even after the obligatory two ballots.

JOANNE SMITH of 31858 Staman Circle, Farmington Township, got into politics through the civil rights movement. She was on Archbishop Dearden's Committee for Human Relations and once won a Ford Motor Co. civics award for her civil rights work.

Her interest in civil rights drew her attention to the late Martin Luther King's realization that the Vietnam war "is a racist, immoral war" then to an interest in

Gene McCarthy for president that year.

Mrs. Smith is serving her first term as president of the Farmington Democratic Club.

A graduate of Aquinas College, Mrs. Smith taught prior to her marriage and raising a family.

SHIRLEY SROKA, 39, of 29910 Mirlon Dr., Farmington Township, boasts a nearly perfect record in going to the polls for the last 18 years but never became politically active until Gov. Wallace's race four years ago.

"I just called the office on Telegraph Rd. in 1968 and volunteered. I've been active in the American Independent

Party (which Wallace founded for his '68 run) until recently," she says.

Mrs. Sroka's husband, Andrew, is practically the only AIP precinct delegate elected in Oakland County and is still active in AIP. They have three children.

Her short history of interest in the Democratic Party gave qualms to some party leaders, who demanded a loyalty oath that she support whomever the national convention nominates. In a compromise, Mrs. Sroka agreed not to "openly support any candidate other than the nominee."

A graduate of Detroit's Mackenzie High School, Mrs.

Sroka is now a housewife and student (education, political science) at Henry Ford Community College.

ROBERT WRIGHT, at 30, is the relative "youth" voice in the 19th District delegation. Wright, of 32465 Maryland, Livonia, is an insurance salesman for Associated Group Underwriters and, like Mrs. Smith, got into McGovern-style politics through civil rights work—the Livonia Human Relations Commission and the Northwest Interfaith Center for Racial Justice. He has also been active in the Rosedale Garden Civic Assn. and the New Democratic Coalition of Livonia.

OF THOSE SEVEN, only Hartsell and Rebecca Woods of Pontiac were delegates in 1968. Mrs. Woods, who is black, is still backing Hubert Humphrey, but Hartsell is committed to Alabama's Gov. Wallace this year.

Says a friend, Clayton Shackett Jr.: "The party didn't have an ear open to the sounding of the people. Glenn believes in representing the people from his area. Wallace is anti-busing and carried every precinct in Redford."

Hartsell had some opposition from about 30 Oakland County Wallaceites. His friends contend the Oakland Wallaceites weren't familiar with Hartsell. All other national convention delegates got the unanimous 350 votes in the district caucus.

A former member of the Democratic State Central Committee and a member of the township planning commission, Hartsell, 19514 Dalby, Redford, is a contractor in private life. This year he ran "uncommitted" for delegate from the township's seventh precinct, but he "got the message" as the Wallaceites put it, and made his commitment.

Under terms of Michigan's presidential primary, Wallace got four national delegates from the 19th District. Sen. George McGovern got two and Humphrey one. The 19th covers western Wayne and Oakland counties.

The other five, besides Hartsell, and Mrs. Woods, are Arthur Bierschbach of Redford, Shirley Sroka of Farmington and Betty Collier of Drayton Plains, all for Wallace; Joanne Smith of Farmington and Robert Wright of Livonia, both for McGovern. Thus, Observer area Democrats got five of the seven seats from the 19th.

ARTHUR BIRSCHBACH, 35, of 19181 Centralia, Redford, is a more typical Wallace delegate — his political activity goes back only eight months, to when it became clear Federal Judge Stephen Roth would order cross-district transportation to achieve school racial balance.

Bierschbach, who is in Store management for Great Scott supermarkets, previously had been active in Cub Scouts and Little League (he has four children) — "and then they told me they were going to bus my kids. I feel strongly that there'll be a private school in Redford Township if that ever happens. This woke up a lot of people."

So on May 16, Bierschbach

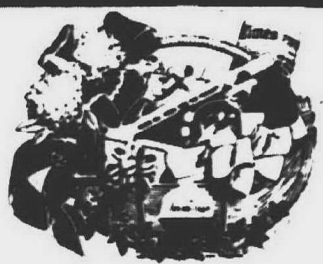

Raising The Roof? Choose Right Materials

Whether you're in the market for a new primary home for comfortable everyday living, or a second home just for leisure - time fun, raising the right roof should be one of your most important considerations.

Why? Because the roof you raise will not only be your new home's main defense against the elements, it will also have a lot to do with its vulnerability to fire.

With that in mind, here are some things you should know about roofing materials, to

help you put a ceiling on possible hazards:

ASPHALT SHINGLES. The most popular type of roofing, these come in a wide variety of colors and shapes and offer years of good service. Conventional asphalt shingles are made with an organic base, are rated Class C by Underwriters' Laboratories, and provide only basic protection against light fire exposure.

WOOD SHINGLES and shakes. Though beautiful, cedar shingles and shakes are

not fire-resistant, which is why some cities no longer permit them to be used unless they are chemically treated.

SLATE AND TILE shingles. Both slate and tile shingles are good-looking and long-lasting. Their Class A fire rating means protection against severe fire exposure. They weigh a lot, however, and a home must be very sturdy to bear their weight.

ASBESTOS CEMENT shingles. These Class A shingles are strong, durable and fire-resistant, cost less and weigh less than slate or tile, but cost more and weigh more than fiber glass shingles.

Giant pumpkins again: home gardeners who sowed pumpkin seeds are reminded that some of the little seedlings should be thinned out, leaving the best two plants in each spot.

This year we've sent out 10,000 packets of sunflower and pumpkin seeds, thanks to the Men's Garden Club of America, who made the seeds available.

For real giant pumpkins wait until each plant has three

or four fruits, then save the largest and carefully prune off all others regularly for the rest of the season. Be sure to water the plants during dry periods. Water whenever necessary and feed a liquid plant food several times during the season to produce extra large fruits.

Soak the soil to a depth of at least six inches rather than sprinkling the garden lightly more often. The secret is to get water down to the roots of the plant. About one inch of water a week.

WHY PEONIES FAIL: There are several reasons why peonies fail to bloom: Too much shade, especially in dry soil under trees, planting too deeply is another cause for poor flowering. Young, developing buds or "eyes" of the roots should never be planted deeper than two inches below the soil surface. Also, some peonies just are shy or stubborn bloomers. Someone should make up a list of those that seldom bloom.

Botrytis blight is another reason for non-flowering. This is a fungus disease which causes the buds to turn brown, then black and shrivel up, without opening. Ants are often seen on peony buds, but they have nothing to do with blooming. Some people feel the ants are there to "cross-pollinate" but this is not true. They collect the sweet nectar produced by the developing buds and do not damage the plant.

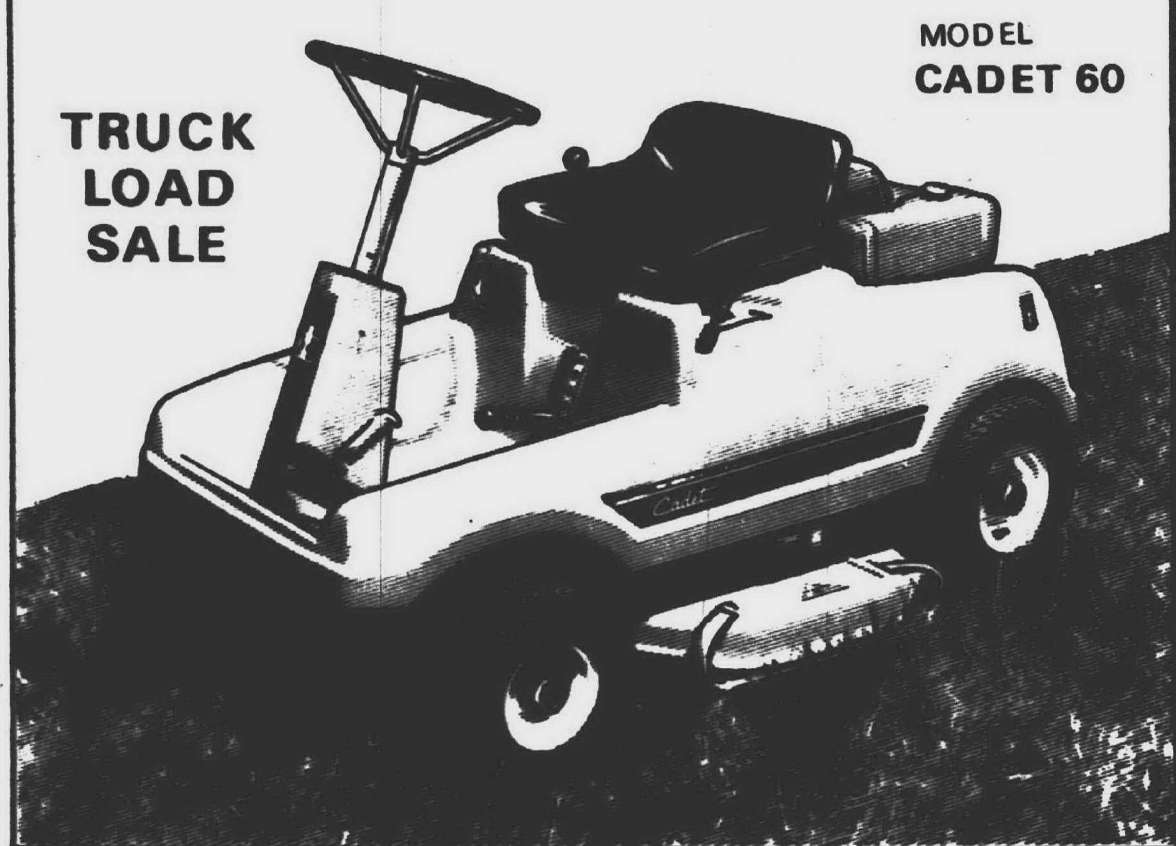

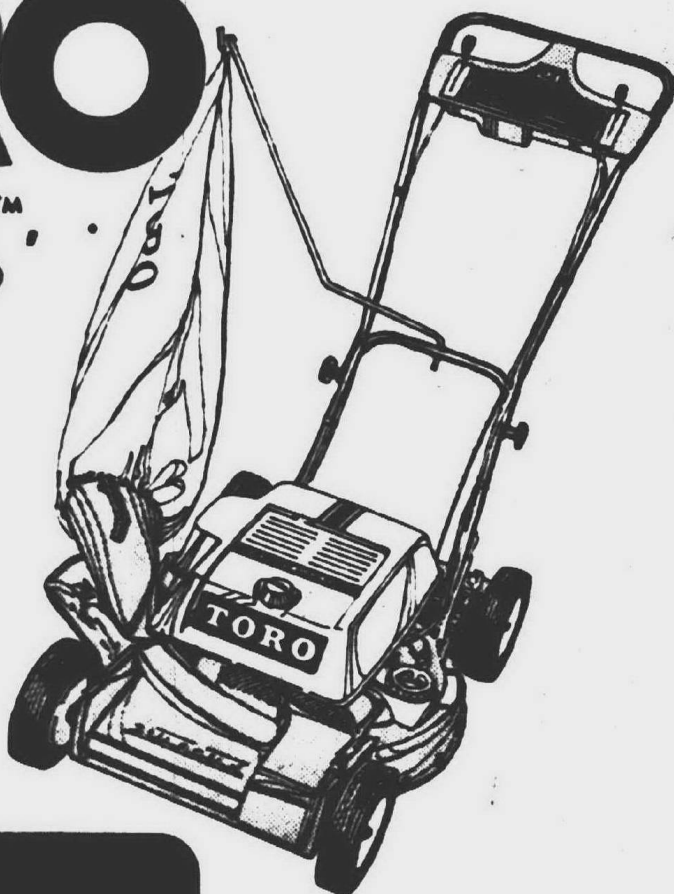

Mosquito Boom Hazardous

The hordes of mosquitoes which seem to descend every time you step out the door this spring may be more than a simple annoyance, a Michigan State University pesticide research specialist warns.

An unusually large mosquito population may be spreading encephalitis, dog heartworm, allergies, and secondary infections, says Dr. Harold Newson, MSU entomologist.

Heavy rains in late April caused flooded areas where mosquito larvae developed. A cold spell followed by warm weather then triggered mass

hatchings rather than the usual gradual development of the mosquito population, explains Newson.

Just how many cases of mosquito-borne encephalitis have occurred in Michigan, is not yet known, but there are in the state a number of mosquito species known to transmit the disease. The disease, which strikes children primarily, often goes unreported or is diagnosed as aseptic meningitis. Many people have minor symptoms but don't see a doctor.

In Ohio, however, an intensive research program for

the past several years has revealed a large number of cases of California encephalitis, probably transmitted by mosquitoes.

Dog heartworm is another mosquito-borne disease that has increased markedly during the past five years, Newson says. Hunting dogs in particular are vulnerable to the parasite. Preventive and curative drugs can curb the disease, but are expensive, impractical or risk the dog's health.

FAR REACHING mosquito control programs would be a more practical solution, Newson suggests.

"People in Michigan tend to accept mosquitoes as a necessary evil, when for as little as a dollar a year per citizen, mosquito abatement programs could nearly eliminate the problem."

Michigan is one of the few states without tax-supported mosquito control programs. Here, each county or municipality deals with mosquitoes in its own way. Funds for Lansing's control, for example, come from its department of parks and recreation. If budget cuts are necessary, such minor operations as mosquito control often suffer.

Control must come through broadscale independent programs, Newson says. Permanent drainage ditches in marshy areas, implantation of mosquito larva-eating fish, and use of insecticides as a last resort are effective and inexpensive when part of a wide area tax-supported system.

A bill that would authorize establishing voluntary mosquito abatement districts throughout the state is now in committee. "If the bill passes," Newson said, "such programs would probably cost each citizen about as much as one can of mosquito repellent."

Sod Waterway Used For Runoff

Move that surface water off your land by using the easy method - a sod waterway, says a Michigan State University soil and water expert.

"When surface water runoff is uncontrolled, severe soil erosion and sediment pollution of natural waterways can occur," says Donald J. Schaner of MSU's Department of Resource Development. "In

addition, deep gullies may develop, making it difficult or even impossible to move farm equipment."

Schaner says that temporary waterways can be created by simply lifting the plow or other tillage implements when crossing the runoff area. Permanent sod, cover crops or previous crop residues left in the waterway tend to reduce runoff rates.



Pest Of The Week

STRIPPED SMUT

During the cool, wet days of spring this lawn disease of bluegrasses is prevalent. It is occurring frequently now in Michigan in many areas.

Merion bluegrass is particularly susceptible. Infected areas may die out completely during hot dry weather. Patches occur at first as small, yellow areas. Grass leaves appear curled and striped with black. A black, soot-like dust rubs off these stripes.

CONTROL: Apply Tersan 1991 (Benomyl) eight ounces 1000 square feet as soon as it appears. Water in with at least an inch of water after application. Other chemicals, which are experimental at this time, are on the way for control of this disease, but unfortunately are not available this year.

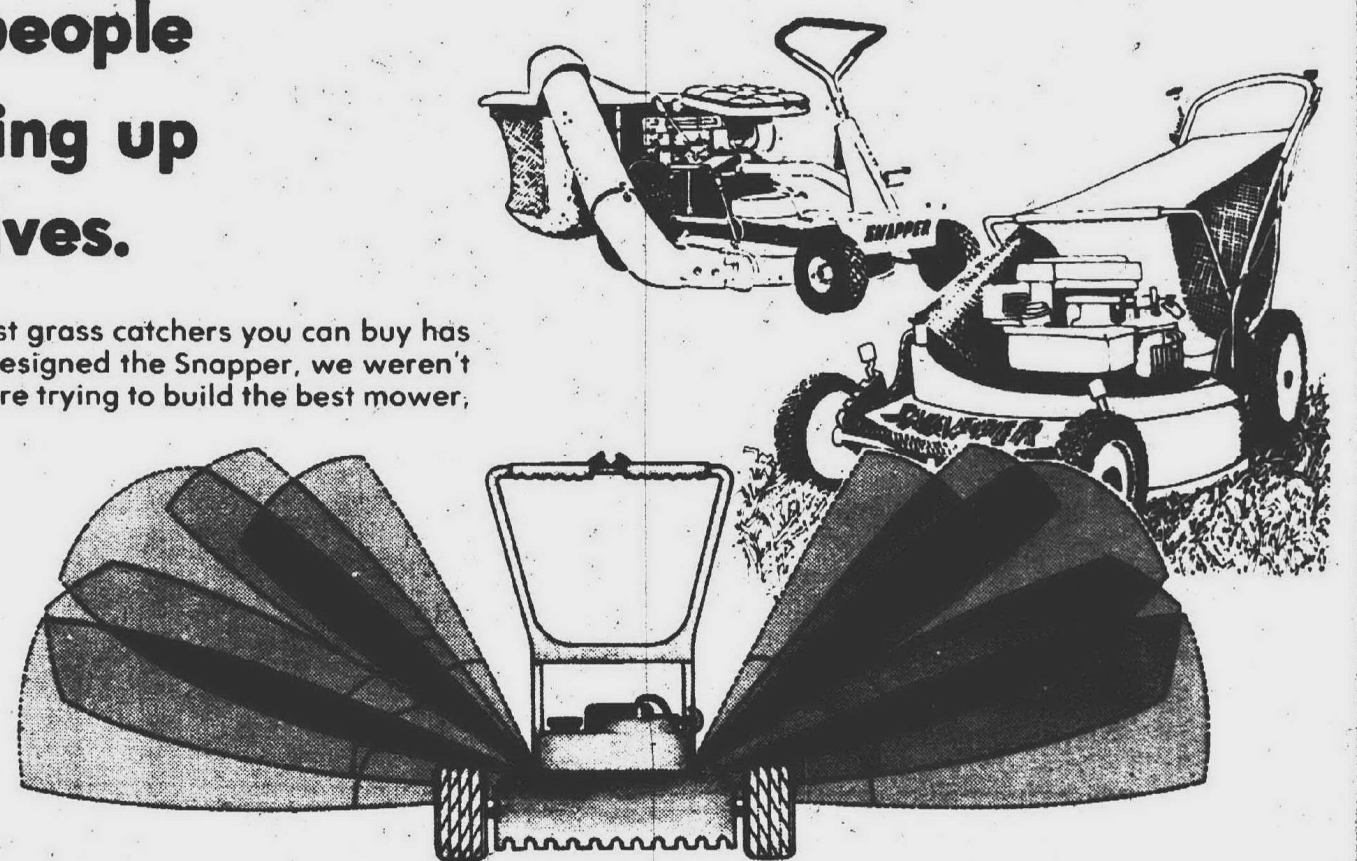

Vines Decorative Part of Landscape

Locust Trees Blooming By Michigan Roadsides

EAST LANSING Vines can be a decorative part of your landscape, says Dr. Harold Davidson, Michigan State University horticulturist.

These climbing plants have many special uses in landscaping: screening, covering large wall areas and providing decorative effects. Many vines have outstanding seasonal characteristics such as showy flowers and fruits or bright fall colors.

Some vines, such as Dutchman's Pipe, American Bittersweet and Jackman Clematis, climb by means of twining stems, tendrils or twisting leaf stalks. These vines are best for trellises or frames.

Other vines, like the Virginia Creeper, climb solid walls and need no additional support.

There is a little street in Farmington called Locust Drive, named for the many locust trees that line the road. However, it is not the only place in the area graced by these beautiful trees that are now laden with long clusters of fragrant white blooms.

Known as common locust, black locust, or false acacia, these trees have the botanical name of *Robinia pseudo-acacia*. They are natives of the Ozarks and Appalachian Mountains from Pennsylvania to Georgia, but have made themselves at home in southern Michigan.

They have been cultivated in the United States since early colonial times and are one of the most widely planted of all American trees, growing in every state in the continental United States.

They have been widely planted in Europe, too, especially along city streets where their durability and drought resistance as well as their beauty is appreciated. They are possibly the only American tree to have become naturalized in Europe.

THEY ARE also used in erosion control and in the reclamation of wasteland. The spreading roots hold the soil on steep hillsides and gullies. Young plants sprout from the roots around older plants forming thickets that are ideal

havens for birds and small game animals. The roots add usable nitrogen to the soil until eventually it is suitable for other trees and shrubs.

Locust wood is hard, heavy, and close-grained, second only to cedar in durability. Locusts grow in almost any kind of soil, except those that are very dry or very moist. They are very fast growing, especially when young. They generally reach 40 to 60 feet in height, although occasionally individuals 100 feet tall are found.

The trunk is often twisted or crooked and the crown is open and irregular in form. The bark is dark and thick and deeply ridged, the twigs are somewhat zigzagged with small spines at their base, and the leaves are long and feathery with many small oval leaflets that are thin and smooth.

The showy white flowers, in drooping clusters four or five inches long, have a delicious fragrance. Each blossom, shaped like a pea blossom with the two lower petals joined to form a keel, two side ones forming wings, and the upper one like a banner. These are followed later in the season by short flat light brown seed pods that cling to the tree all winter. The pea-shaped flowers and seed pods give testimony to the fact that locusts are members of the pea or legume family.

NUMEROUS horticultural varieties of the common locust have been developed including

a kind with handsome rose-colored flowers, a variety without spines, a narrow columnar form, and a weeping form.

Another member of the Robinia family group is the Clammy Locust, (*Robinia viscosa*), a medium sized tree with hairy twigs and leaf stems and pink flowers.

There are also numerous Robinia shrubs that make attractive specimens in a yard or park. The Rose Acacia (*R. hispida*) has large pink flowers on a shrubby bush one to three feet tall. *Robinia Kelseyi* grows to 12 feet, either a tall shrub or a small tree, laden in early summer with clusters of small rose-colored flowers.

The popular Moraine locust is a distant relative of the black locust. It is a horticultural variety of a tree known commonly as the honey locust and botanically as *Gleditsia triacanthos*.

The honey locust, unlike the common or black locust have small greenish rather inconspicuous flowers and long twisted bean-like pods. The stems and often the trunks, too, are armed with long formidable spines.

The Moraine locust was the first horticultural variety of honey locust to be developed that eliminated the spines and the seed pods. Now there are numerous other name varieties of seedless and thornless honey locusts. Like their cousins, the common locust, they have graceful fern-like leaves and are good ornamental or shaped trees.

He is a graduate of the University of Michigan and Detroit College of Law. His law office is in Livonia.

concerned with an immediate end to the war in southeast Asia and a new emphasis on domestic problems.

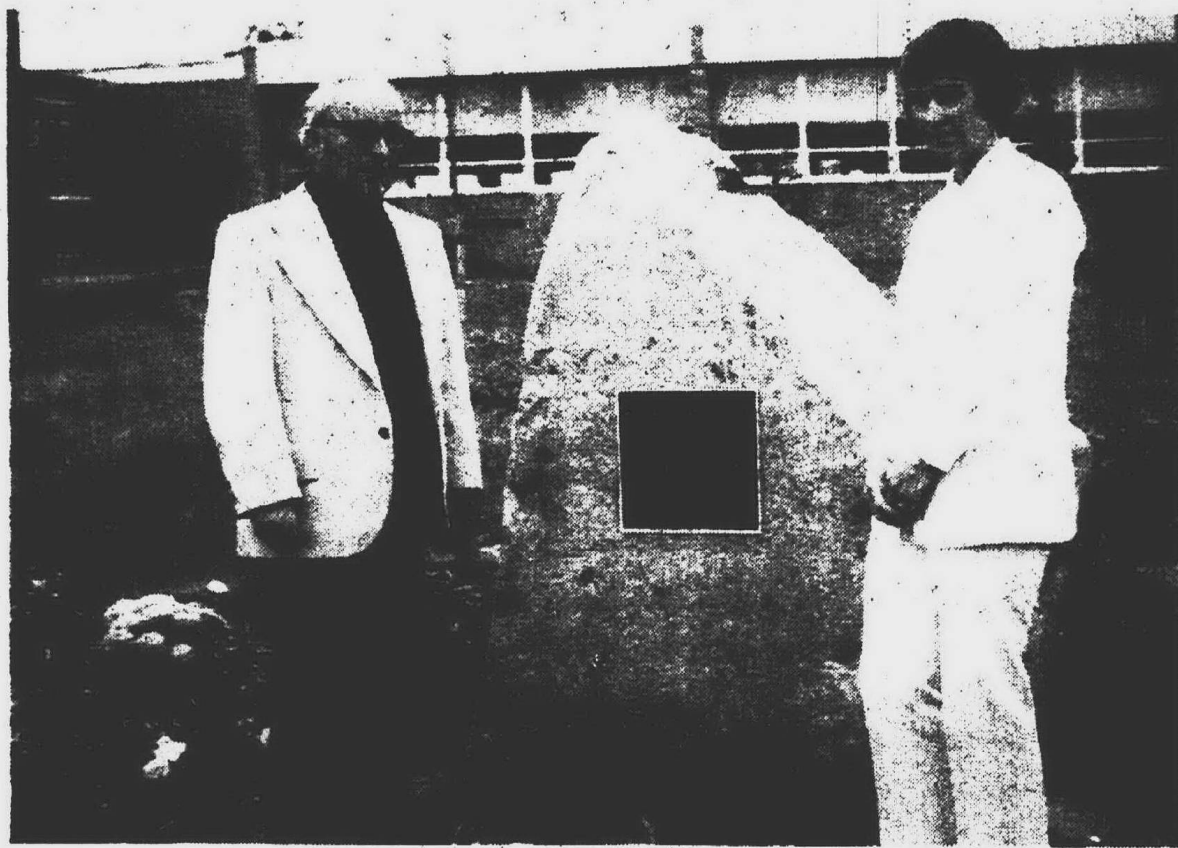
"One of my principal projects in Congress will be to participate actively in the movement for reform which would make Congress more responsive to the needs and attitudes of the people," Stempien said.

Esch Attacks Report Fee On Campaigns

WASHINGTON
U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) recently denounced action taken by the House Administration Committee that weakens the act limiting campaign spending.

Esch said the committee has ordered that campaign spending statements filed by candidates be available at \$1 per page rather than the 10 cents per page that was charged before the act took effect.

"Since each candidate's report consists of numerous pages, and since there are hundreds of candidates and campaign committees, this increased cost has made examination of the record prohibitively expensive to all but the biggest newspapers and magazines," Esch said.

Revenue Sharing Bill Splits Reps

LANSING The revenue-sharing bill which passed the House last week "helps many and hurts few," according to State Rep. James Defebaugh (R-Birmingham), one of four Observerland representatives to vote for it.

In a 69-33 vote, the bill passed with "yes" votes also from Reps. Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park), Raymond Baker (R-Farmington) and Raymond Smit (R-Ann Arbor).

Reps. Richard Young (D-Dearborn Heights), John

Bennett (D-Redford Township), James Tierney (D-Garden City), and Thomas Brown (D-Westland) voted against it. State Rep. Marvin Stempien (D-Livonia) didn't vote.

MANY SUBURBAN legislators objected because it gives considerable aid to Detroit. Defebaugh agrees that it does help Detroit but said large cities need more help at present.

The formula channels back to local governments funds from the state income tax and the sales tax receipts.

It takes into consideration the "tax effort" demonstrated by local units in determining what share they should receive.

Suburban districts were holding out for consideration of total "tax burden" in determining their shares because this formula would include school taxes. School taxes aren't considered under the "effort" formula.

Detroit reaps a large portion of revenue sharing funds because it has a city income tax, a heavy property tax and a city tax on utilities.

YOUNG WAS quoted as objecting to the formula despite his previous support on measures helping Detroit.

"What we're saying is that there's \$31.55 per capita for Detroit residents in this bill and that the rinkydinks in my suburb are entitled to \$19.52," he said.

"All we're trying to do is to make Detroit face reality. Sooner or later, there has to be a reduction. We can't keep on allocating money this way, making no investigation of conditions, taking the officials from Detroit at their word on how bad off they are."

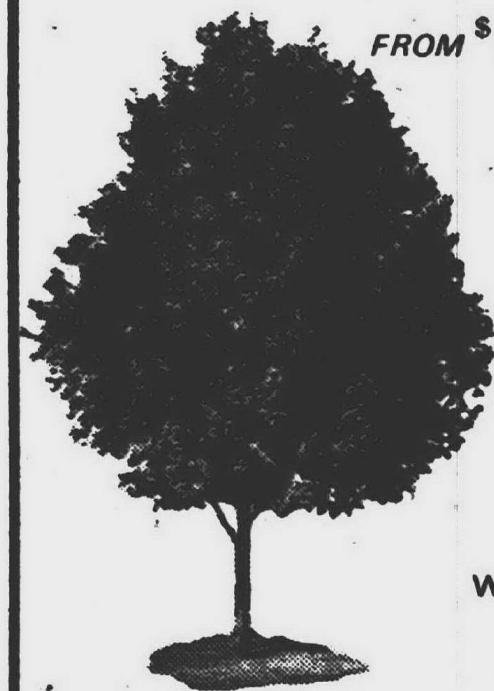
