Ground-Breaking Opens Unity's 2nd 10 Years

Unity of West Suburbia, with ground broken for its new church building and its third minister installed, moves this week into its second decade in Livonia.

The congregation that held its first services in Bentley High School July 1, 1962, expects by the first of next year to be worshiping in a new sanctuary to be located on Five Mile between Middle Belt and Inkster.

Gene Sorensen, just arrived from Los Angeles to succeed Marlyn White as minister, was on hand for the groundbreaking Friday, June 23.

So were Livonia Mayor Edward H. McNamara, Tom O'Conner representing William Lindhout & Co., architects, Tom Kowalsky, president of of the church board and quite a few of the members.

THE CHURCH, aifiliated with the Unity School of Christianity in Kansas City, Mo., had its beginnings here a little over 10 years ago when Diane Seaman, a Unity minister, started a series of lectures May 1, 1962, in Bentley.

By May 23, an advisory committee to form a new Unity center had been set up. and the first service washeld

Two years later the congregation moved to its first home, located at 30025 Curtis, Livonia. Existing buildings there were remodeled to meet the congregation's needs, and formal dedication took place July 19, 1964.

MISS SEAMAN served as minister to Unity of West Suburbia until July of 1969. when she left for a Unity ministry in Barbados in the West Indies.

In the fall the post was taken over by White, the youngest Unity minister in charge of a full time ministry.

The following year it was decided that the Curtis location did not allow sufficient room to expand thechurch's program. The 312 acres on Five Mile were then purchased, and had been paid for completely by the time ground was broken for the new



Witnesses say that Major Medley had just reached two persons from an area below the dam and placed them in a truck when the water broke through and swept him and his passengers to their deaths.

Mrs. Medley last saw her husband when they waded out of the Salvation Army Building in waist-high water. Major Medley set out to help people escape, while his wife set up temporary shelter for evacuees.

This massacre was just the sort of incident Adams had hoped for. The incident was played up in the Boston papers and Sam revitalized his Committees of Correspondence to spread the word with letters to 75 colonial towns.

Thereafter, Adams staged anniversary celebrations of the massacre with street dramas to enacting the events according to Sam's script. The last massacre

observance was held in 1784 when July Fourth was declared a national holiday.

(For verification of how minor an incident the Boston

Massacre actually was, readers may wish to refer to a book entitled "The Boston Massacre" written by Hiller B. Zobel and published in 1970.)

Adams managed the Boston Tea Party after Parliament passed a bill in 1774 closing the port of Boston. It was, in part, sympathy for Bostonians which prompted the other colonies to form the first Continental Congress in 1774.

At this point, the arrest of Adams and Hancock was ordered and troops attempting this move were met by the "embattled farm-ers" on the hill at Concord.

REVERE is best known for making his famous ride carrying the warning "The Redcoats are Coming!", immortalized by Hen-

Wadsworth Longfellow. But Revere was only one of

the night-riders carrying that warning. Others were William Dawes, Ebenezer Dorr, Joseph Hall, and Solomon Brown.

Revere made many other rides for the Sons of Liberty just as dangerous and strenuous as the famous ride on April 18, 1775 from Boston to Lexington carrying word of the advance of British troops to Sam Adams and John Hancock.

Boston because General Gage had a warrant for the arrest of both. Besides attempting to arrest Adams and Hancock, the British

troops also intended to confiscate arms collected by the colonists.
Revere also was official courier for the Massachusetts Provincial Assembly in 1774 and, in May of that year, rode from Boston to Philadelphia on horseback announce passage of the Intolrable Acts.

He participated, in the French and Indian War as a younger man and took part in the capture of Crown Point in 1756. Some historians, however, have characterized Revere as an undisciplined soldier and report he once faced a military court-martial for military insubordination.

He was a silversmith and engraver by trade and quite good Many of his silver, engraved punch bowls are displayed in art museums in the East, and his silver pieces compare favorably with

works of other famous artists.

Before the Revolution, however; Revere devoted much of his time in radical activities for the Sons of Liberty. He helped lay the plans, with Sam Adams, for the Boston Tea Party, and may have been one of the "Indians" in at-

Revere designed and printed the first issue of Continental money, designed and engraved the first official insignia for the Continental Congress, and the state seal for Massachusetts.

During the war, Revere opened a gun powder mill in Canton which blew up. Next, he opened a copper mill and invented the process for rolling

The revolutionary leaders appeared from obscurity -- Patrick Henry in Virginia, Sam Adams in Massachusetts, and Christopher Gadsen in South Carolina...

Attacks on homes of stamp distributors, Churchill wrote, "was the work of a few merchants and young lawyers who were trying their hands at rousing the unenfranchised mobs."

Adams' opposition to the Sugar Act of 1764 was basically limited to newspaper articles and a few speeches. During this assault, Adams expressed his battle strategy. "Put your adversary in the wrong and keep him there" and "Take a stand at the start!"

Act saw a shift in strategy from verbal assaults to physical violence with the unleashing of street gangs already primed by the traditional "Pope's Day" frolics involving anti - Catholic sentiment expressed in annual parades.

Use of mobs was a conscious conclusion reached by Sam Adams that words alone would not suffice to keep hold of the Lion's tail. By 1767, Adams became convinced revolution was inevitable and five years later the doctrine of separatism was appearing openly in the Boston Gazette col-

Adams sought to gain repeal of the Stamp Act by employing the Boston street mobs to endanger the life and property of those officials administering and enforc-

ing the tax.

The North and South street gangs were shaped by Adams into a deadly political instrument which, under his leadership, began to demonstrate alarming military discipline.

Success of mob violence in forcing repeal of the Stamp Act made Sam willing to summon up violence at any time in the future. It was he who decided when the gangs would strike, whom would be the victims, and how much damage would be inflicted.

Historian Samuel Eliot Morrison declares: "Adams alone of the forerunners of American independence was a typical revolutionary who, except for his Christian piety, reminds one of the Communist agitators of our

The Declaration of Independ-

ence announced the birth of a new nation, expressed a unique theory of democracy, and summed up the reasons compelling Americans to independence, and the political and social principles upon which the Revolution was based.

Thomas Jefferson, author of the Declaration, detailed grievances against King George III with the foremost charge being his government had become destructive of the unquestionable rights of mankind to enjoy "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness."

WHEN ANY governmental form contrives to deprive citizens of these rights, people have the right to alter or abolish that form and establish a new government,

Jefferson argued.

The Revolution would not lead to anarchy, he contended, because "all experience hath shown that mankind are more disposed to suffer while evils are sufferable, than to right them by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed." The core of the Declaration is the doctrine that all men ARE created equal, and if some men are not treated equally, they should be. This doctrine, above all others, has kept this nation from living up to its ideals be-

cause there are too many Americans unwilling to accept as equals others different than The equality doctrine is the

plumb line of America's unique form of Democracy. Our failure to totally pass this test has caused friction in past years and is a fore-boding of future unrest and divisions which will make less jubijant the bicentennial observance of July 4, 1976.

Standing the Declaration lies in accepting the meaning of the term "We hold these truths to be self-

In terms of philosophy, the description "self-evident" means that these truths require no proof. Just as many believe the Bible contains God's truth and that the "self-evident" truth proclaimed in the Declaration is to be accepted rather than de-That truth, which requires no






