School Named For Hulsings

In appreciation of their combined 24 years of service to the Plymouth Community School District, Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth and Esther Hulsing have been paid a signal honor by the Board of Education.

The next elementary school to be built in the district will be named in their honor.

The official resolution was presented as a surprise during intermission at the weekly Community Band Concert

Thursday evening in Kellogg Park.

Mrs. Hulsing recently retired from the board after 18 years service, six as president.

Kenneth was a member from 1947 to 1953 and served as president for one year.

The resolution passed by the current board, reads: "Whereas, Mr. and Mrs. Hulsing have contributed immeasurably to the

education of thousands of youth of our community.

"Now, therefore be it resolved that The Board of Education of the Plymouth Community School District and the citizens of our community proudly name the next elementary school of our district the Hulsing Elementary School."

Residents of Plymouth since 1942, the Hulsings have raised three daughters here and have

been active in civic affairs. Hulsing directs the engineering department of the Detroit Diesel Division of General Motors.

In addition to the school board, Mrs. Hulsing has been active in the American Assn. of University Women, Huron Valley Council of the Girl Scouts, Women's Club of Plymouth, and Plymouth Pan Hellenic Assn. and numerous committees and advisory groups.

'Team' To Run High School

School will be a little different when classes resume this fall at Plymouth-Salem High School.

This year the high school will be run by a team.

Heading the team will be co-principals Bill Brown and

Kent Bukema. Next year Bukema is to take over the leadership at Canton High School.

Teaming up for a better grip on the large school will be eight "area coordinators" each of whom will take responsibility for 425 students, 16 to 19 teachers and one

counselor, according to Supt. John Hoben.

Hoben explained to the school board that the coordinators essentially will be assistant principals but will also give guidance in their subject area.

THE TEAM consists of

Jerry Barker, English; Richard Bearup, business education and cooperative education; James Hagan, counseling and library supervision; Ken Jacobs, special education, art and physical education; Pat Fitzpatrick, industrial education and home

economics; Fred Meier, science and music; Jerry Morris, social studies and foreign language; and David Oppe, mathematics.

Cost for the team management program will be essentially the same as last year's administrative program with two assistant

principals and department heads, Hoben said.

However, since each of the eight coordinators will work year-around, the district will gain about 6,000 additional man hours.

The average salary of the coordinators is \$18,000 yearly. Last year, department heads taught classes and got a stipend of \$850 for their administrative responsibilities. They also had regular release time from teaching to complete their responsibilities.

TWO OF THE AREA coordinators are new to the school district

Raymond Barker, 47, came to Plymouth from Harper Creek where he was high school principal for 10 years. He also was a junior high principal for four years, assistant principal one year, math and science teacher three years, and social studies and physical education teacher three years. He holds a masters degree plus 20 post-graduate hours in secondary administration, and a bachelor's degree in social studies, physical education and science from Western Michigan University.

Joining the Plymouth schools from Comstock, Mich., is James Hagan, 40, who was guidance director at the high school level for five years. Previously he was a science teacher for two years, and juvenile officer and probation officer for seven years in Battle Creek and Kalamazoo.

His bachelor's degree is in science and sociology from Oregon State University, his master's is in guidance and counseling from WMU and post-graduate studies are in guidance and administration. Hagan has extensive experience in modular scheduling.

A PLYMOUTH TEACHER for 10 years, Bearup, 35, was a teacher and department head in business education and cooperative training and former head basketball coach for PHS. He has a bachelor's degree in general business accounting and economics and a master's in business administration. He is certified in vocational-technical office subjects and coordination activities.

**Condominium Plat Rejected**

A proposal to build a 72 unit condominium at the southeast corner of Five-Mile Road and Bradner, was turned down by the Plymouth Township Board. It marked the fourth time a development of some sort has been rejected for that corner that once was an orchard.

In rejecting the condominiums the trustees followed the lead of the Planning Commission that denied the project on May 3, 1972 and the Wayne County Planning Commission that recommend denial on May 17

on the ground that it was not keeping with the overall plans

for that section of the township.

Aside from that the residents of the area in

question, who were present in a large delegation to express their views, refused to meet with Burton A. Binder, the developer. They demanded that improvements be limited to single homes.

Binder countered by explaining that the corner lot was zoned for terminal offices and that he couldn't build single homes.

As a result the plan was rejected on the ground that there was no real need for the condominiums.

Classes Added

Four new vocational education programs will be offered at Plymouth - Salem High School this fall.

The school administration was notified that the district will be reimbursed for offering child care service, integrated office occupations, dental assistance and salesperson classes.

Ed Holdsworth Honored

New Restaurant Must Wait For Green Light

Plymouth Township will have a link in a popular restaurant chain, if -

The developers can induce the Wayne County Road Commission to place a traffic light at the intersection of Ann Arbor Road and Haggerty Road.

No building permit will be issued until the traffic light is turned on and put in working order.

These "strings" were attached to the approval given to Kal Jabara, representing the Bill Knapp restaurant chain, at the township board meeting Tuesday night.

"I like the Bill Knapp

restaurants," Mrs. Elizabeth Holmes, the township treasurer explained, "but I am not going to vote approval for anything more on that corner until a traffic light is erected."

OTHER MEMBERS of the board also voiced their opinion that the intersection was deluged with traffic each day and was fast becoming one of the most dangerous intersections in the township.

Arguments to the effect that the other three corners were commercial - Kmart on the southeast, Bank of the Commonwealth on the northeast and Koch's Sausage on the southwest - had no effect

on the trustees who were adamant that they would not add to the traffic hazards.

They pointed out that Feigel school was close by and the school children should not be

exposed to more danger.

"We've been trying to get a traffic light on that corner for almost two years," Mrs. Holmes stated, "and for some reason or other we can't get it."

"It's been promised and promised, but it hasn't been erected. Even Supervisor Breen tried to stress the importance of the light - but we still haven't got it."

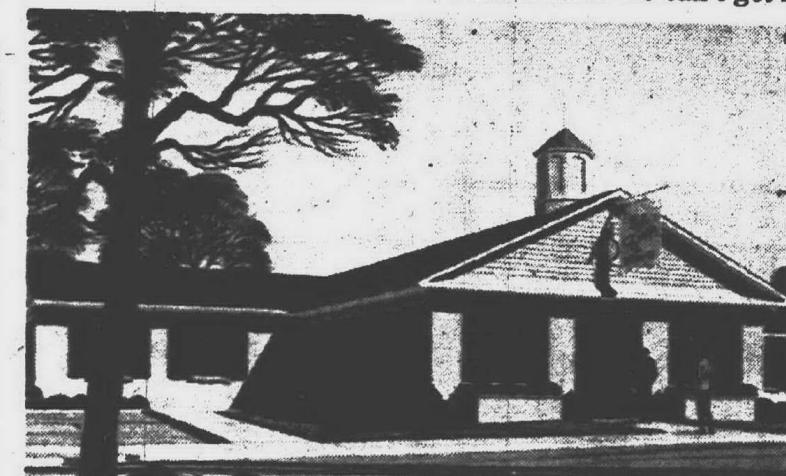
Her motion carried with Trustee Gerald Burke casting the only negative vote.

Then, it was added, that no building permit would be issued until the light was in working order.

The Knapp chain plans a "family" restaurant with seating capacity of 175 persons. It has links in several cities throughout Michigan including Ann Arbor and Lansing.

As a "family" restaurant is will not dispense alcoholic beverages.

Under the plan offered, Jabara will erect the building and lease it to the chain.



Hogan Faces Task In School Post

Blue eyes sparkling, Dr. Earl Hogan rubbed his hands and dug into the work piled high on his desk this week for his new position of deputy superintendent in the Plymouth School district.

Dr. Hogan, who came to Plymouth after being superintendent of the Mt. Vernon, O., public schools, attended Tuesday's board meeting and spent the week getting organized for his new position.

A long list of jobs awaited Dr. Hogan's arrival since the district has been functioning

with one less administrator than normal since last December.

Former Supt. James Rossman was fired at that time and, though Rossman still continues to paid, administrative responsibilities were shifted to the three administrators instead of four. Rossman hasn't accepted the consultant's position offered him.

When Supt. John Hoben was promoted from assistant superintendent of education to the top leadership post, Dr. Hogan was chosen as Hoben's

right hand man from the list of applicants for the superintendent's position.

Both Hoben and Dr. Hogan were selected from 100 applicants for the superintendent's position.

AMONG HIS strengths, Dr. Hogan has experience in elementary education both as a principal and director of elementary education in Battle Creek from 1955 to 1960. His elementary experience is intended to complement Hoben's experience in secondary education.

Prior to his superintendency in Mt. Vernon, Dr. Hogan was assistant superintendent in Albion from 1963-65. He also taught at Pickaway County and VanWert, Ohio schools.

A 1950 graduate of Otterbein College in Westerville, Ohio, Dr. Hogan earned his master's from Ohio State University and his doctorate from Michigan State University. He has also had experience teaching at the college level both at MSU and Albion College.

Among his credits is a book,

"Everyday Economics," which he co-authored.

Dr. Hogan will assume responsibility for getting the business policies written, a feasibility study on computer operations, and a survey of community feelings on such things as modular scheduling, open space concepts and field trips.

He will also coordinate the August issue of the School Community News and work on preliminary discussions on a recreation authority.

Fourth Fire Station Visioned In Twp.

PLYMOUTH James Gignac, chief of the Plymouth Township Fire Department, has taken a long, hard look into the future and has recommended to the Board of Trustees that some thought be given to a site for a fourth fire station that will be needed within the next decade.

The tremendous development of residential areas and the accompanying explosion in population will make a

fourth station necessary, he told the trustees.

As of this time the township has only two stations - one at the Township Hall on Ann Arbor Rd., and the other in Lakepointe Village.

A third is being thought of, but no official action taken on a possible site. It has been hinted that the area finally selected will be on the recreation grounds on Ann Arbor Trail in the western side of the township.

It is recommended that the fourth - when approved - also will be on the west side.

These suggestions are part of a comprehensive study Chief Gignac has made and the trustees are planning to take some action at the next meeting along with plans for the proposed addition to the Township Hall station and ease the flow of traffic to Lilley Road.

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Letter To The Editor

EDITOR:

Kellogg Park is being sliced in half. Where five trees stood there will soon be a one-way concrete street. And where Union, Deer, Harvey and Church streets were, a one-way "loop" will be constructed.

This one-way street may cause problems with many residents, especially those living next to the loop. Statistics show that one way streets are more hazardous to pedestrians than two-lane. And if you live on the loop (one way going left) and you want to turn right, you must go around in a circle to get to your destination.

So, why is the city commission tearing up the park and planning on re-paving Plymouth? They give us two reasons:

1. Better traffic movement
2. More green area

Theoretically, this traffic loop will detour traffic from Main street and relieve some of its congestion. And this loop around Plymouth will attract business to build there. More cars will travel in and out of Plymouth and more people will attract more business. And business likes to build on busy streets.

As for more green area, the park was torn into two areas, but more sod will be planted along Pennington road, so 4,000 square feet of greenery will be gained.

However, let us reconsider. Business and real estate agencies may prosper, but I doubt the residents will. The people who live on the loop will have to pay for its construction, and taxes will again be raised for all city residents. This will drive many people away, and the quiet, old-time Plymouth whose attractions were its park and Old Village will give way to a newer, more congested, more business-run Plymouth. And all the while,

you, the people, will be paying for this new Plymouth through higher taxes.

What's worse, according to city law, a public hearing must take place on this type of issue so the public, not just the businessmen will have a voice. But there was no public hearing and the people had no voice. Why?

And is it fair that businessmen and real estate agents prosper while Plymouth residents put up with crowdedness and congestion?

The city council represents the people, and public hearings are one of the ways that the people's voice is heard. It seems to me that our council is more concerned with their ideas of "progress" than the feelings of Plymouth's citizens.

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Dodson Will Head Gallimore School

PLYMOUTH A new principal for Gallimore Elementary School was appointed by the school board Tuesday as part of several administrative changes.

George Dodson was chosen to fill the vacancy at Gallimore left when Arnold Pylkas resigned after seven years as principal to accept a teaching position at a small Christian college in the south.

Dodson's appointment was effective immediately. Prior to assuming the principalship, Dodson was an elementary counselor at Starkweather and Gallimore and worked with the federally - funded Title I programs for elementary school guidance. Also approved by the board was a switch of two elementary principals.

DONALD RANK was switched from Fiegel to Tanger Elementary School on a 43-week contract while Ronald South changed from Tanger to Fiegel for a 46 week contract. The difference in contract lengths is caused by the smaller number of students at Tanger than at Fiegel, requiring less preparation in the summer.

Rank has been a principal in Plymouth for 22 years at Starkweather, Allen and Fiegel schools.

South has been with Tanger since it opened in 1965. Frank Krimbacher, formerly supervisor of building and grounds, was made an industrial arts teacher at Pioneer Middle School since his former responsibilities have dwindled.

Ralph Goble, who is supervisor of new construction, will assume some of Krimbacher's former responsibilities on a temporary basis.

Dodson accepted the principalship at Gallimore after being in the Plymouth schools for eight years. He taught at Geer, Allen and Pioneer schools before becoming a counselor.

PRIOR to coming to Plymouth he was an elementary teacher in Glennon, Mo., and supervisor of playgrounds in Leopold, Mo.

He graduated from Missouri University in 1956 and earned a masters degree in school administration from Eastern Michigan University. He also

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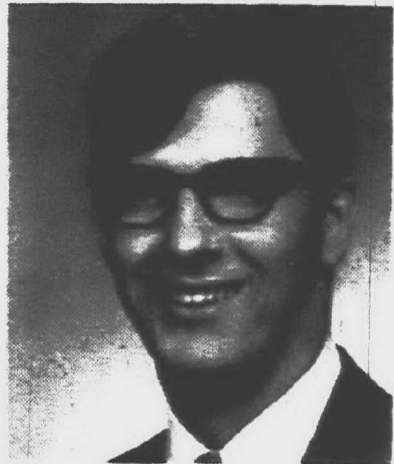

The home is an agency of the Detroit Methodist Conference. Established in 1906, its purpose was to care for the physical, spiritual, mental and social needs of the family.

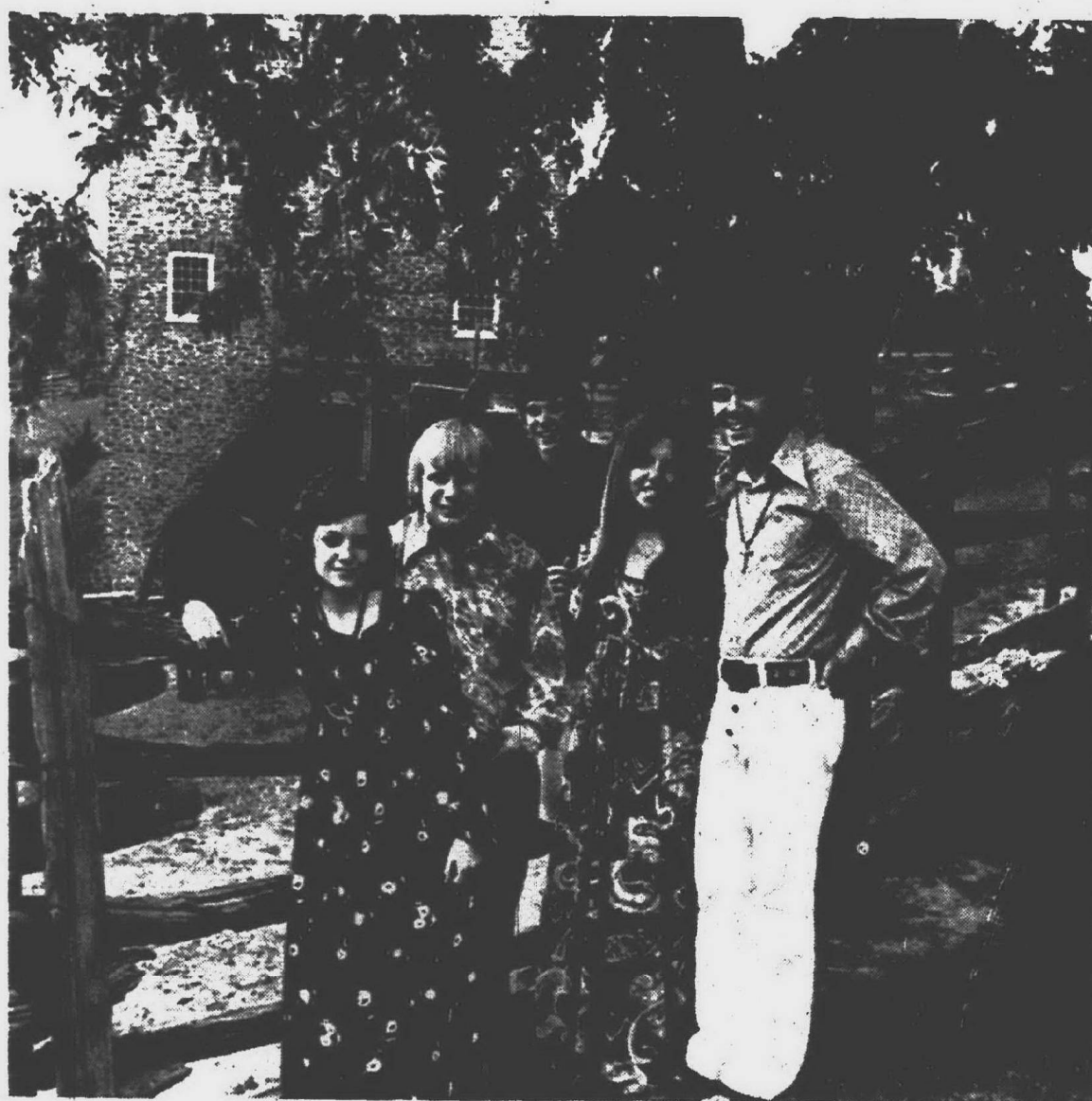
It now houses some 250 retired persons.

Besides teaching mathematics, he has also served as principal of Saint Mary's, dean of the college and college baseball and basketball coach.

Program Benefits Kids, Teens Too

The leader team program, now in its second year, has been judged successful in helping provide summer fun and cultural opportunities for some 2,000 children from low-income Detroit families.

The program is designed also to train college and high school students in leadership

capacities, and Claude Elliott, Catholic Youth Organization social worker who serves as director, said it is accomplishing both objectives.

"THE CHILDREN like it," he said. "The leaders at each program site devise their own programs. There is a wide range of activities, many of

them quite imaginative. The boys and girls thoroughly enjoy the programs.

"The college and high school leaders have worked very well with the children. These leaders have shown that they can accept responsibility, and tackle and resolve problems on their own. They love kids. Many of them work

with the children the year-round. The only difference is that in this program they get a little pay for it."

The program is sponsored jointly by the Detroit Board of Education, Michigan State University, Shaw College, Wayne County Community College, and the CYO. The Detroit Board's In-School Neighborhood Youth Corps pays the 294 high school students in the program.

The board's work adjustment program shares with the colleges the expense of paying the 28 college students. The CYO coordinates the program and provides the director and his assistant, George Navarrete.

THIS ENTERPRISE, which began late in June, is now in operation in 17 Catholic parishes, the North End Community Center and the Truth Lutheran Church. Student teams in each location supervise and set up the schedule of activities for the children.

The program was inaugurated last summer with the participation of over 2,500 children and leaders.

The two busloads of poor people imported by the Rev. Ralph David Abernathy to demonstrate at the Democratic Convention milled about on the fringes of a small cantonment of pup tents entitled "Resurrection City!" in one of this resort city's parks.

Twenty minutes earlier, Dr. Abernathy had arrived in a sedan which drove over the park turf, honking its way through a crowd of some 1,000 hippies, Yippies, Zippies, SDS, Vietnam Veterans Against the War, Tenants Unioners, Welfare Rights Organizers and head-shaven Hare Krishna chanters.

The atmosphere was humid and the aroma was an acrid amalgamation of random cooking, field toilets, open garbage cans, unwashed bodies and Hare Krishna incense.

DR. ABERNATHY'S poor people continued milling about for another 40 minutes, while this dismal successor to the late Dr. Martin Luther King sat like a caliph in front of his (far more impressive than pup) tent, to receive the adulation of a multitude of celebrity seekers and the attention of the media.

Finally, one of Dr. Abernathy's Southern Christian Leadership Conference aides began shouting an appeal asking that everyone evacuate the pup tent area so that tents could be assigned to the poor (a number of these tents had already been flattened when the crowd strolled along "Abernathy Blvd." and tripped over several tent ropes).

Twenty more minutes went by with no one receiving any such tent assignments from the Southern Christian Leaders, including the great man, who continued receiving his public while seated in front of his tent. Several small children among the poor people either scurried about or wept as a result of the long trip and no immediately apparent place to bed.

Then the humidity broke with a downpour of rain. THIS WAS INDEED reminiscent (almost nostalgic) of the original Resurrection City in Washington. Here, shortly

after the assassination of Dr. King, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, newly delivered to Abernathy's leadership, led the poor people into another cantonment, a shanty town of tents and crates which soon became a giant and ghoulish quagmire of mud.

During a brief interview in front of his tent here, Dr. Abernathy recalled that he had camped out in the original Resurrection City, right along with the people as befitted a leader of the poor.

Did he reside with them the whole time? "Well," he replied, spying this writer's media identification badge and shifting his recollection into high gear, "there were times when I had to be out to raise money and there was all that rain."

Indeed there was. And there was also a black reporter from Philadelphia who exposed the sumptuous meals which Dr. Abernathy was eating while checked into the nearby Flitts Motor Hotel - while the victims of his leadership were ankle-deep in mud.

ONE OF THESE victims was the Rev. Jesse Jackson, now of Chicago, who recently split with the SCLC to set up his own organization. During an interview, Rev. Jackson recalled having contracted hepatitis while dwelling in Dr. Abernathy's muddy fiasco (and he disclosed to this writer that he has recently developed signs of sickle cell anemia).

Despite this wretched experience, Dr. Abernathy was on hand to offer more of his leadership - to the Democratic Party, from whom he demanded no less than 750 seats, or 1/4 of the entire National Convention, for his polyglot coalition of protesters.

To implement this preposterous demand, he led an invasion of the convention's arrangements committee, to which party Chairman Lawrence O'Brien initially responded by reportedly fleeing the room. (An aide to O'Brien said that he did not "flee" but that he exited rapidly at the behest of the Secret Service.)

Convention manager Richard Murphy described the Abernathy tactic as "blackmail," but O'Brien, who eventually returned, ordered the committee to bargain with Abernathy.

This resulted in Abernathy's being given, among other things, access to the convention's floor telephone, where he could badger the delegates at will. This fueling of bigger and better intrusions at the same time bolstered Dr. Abernathy's plummeting stock as the thoroughly preposterous successor to a man of the stature of Dr. King.

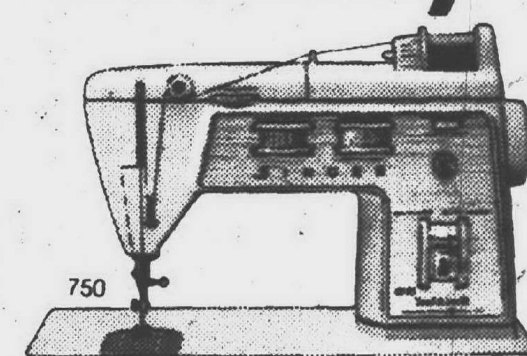

South Farmington spurred to a 2-1 first inning lead. Garden City tied it at two up in the fifth and exploded with seven in the sixth and four in the seventh.

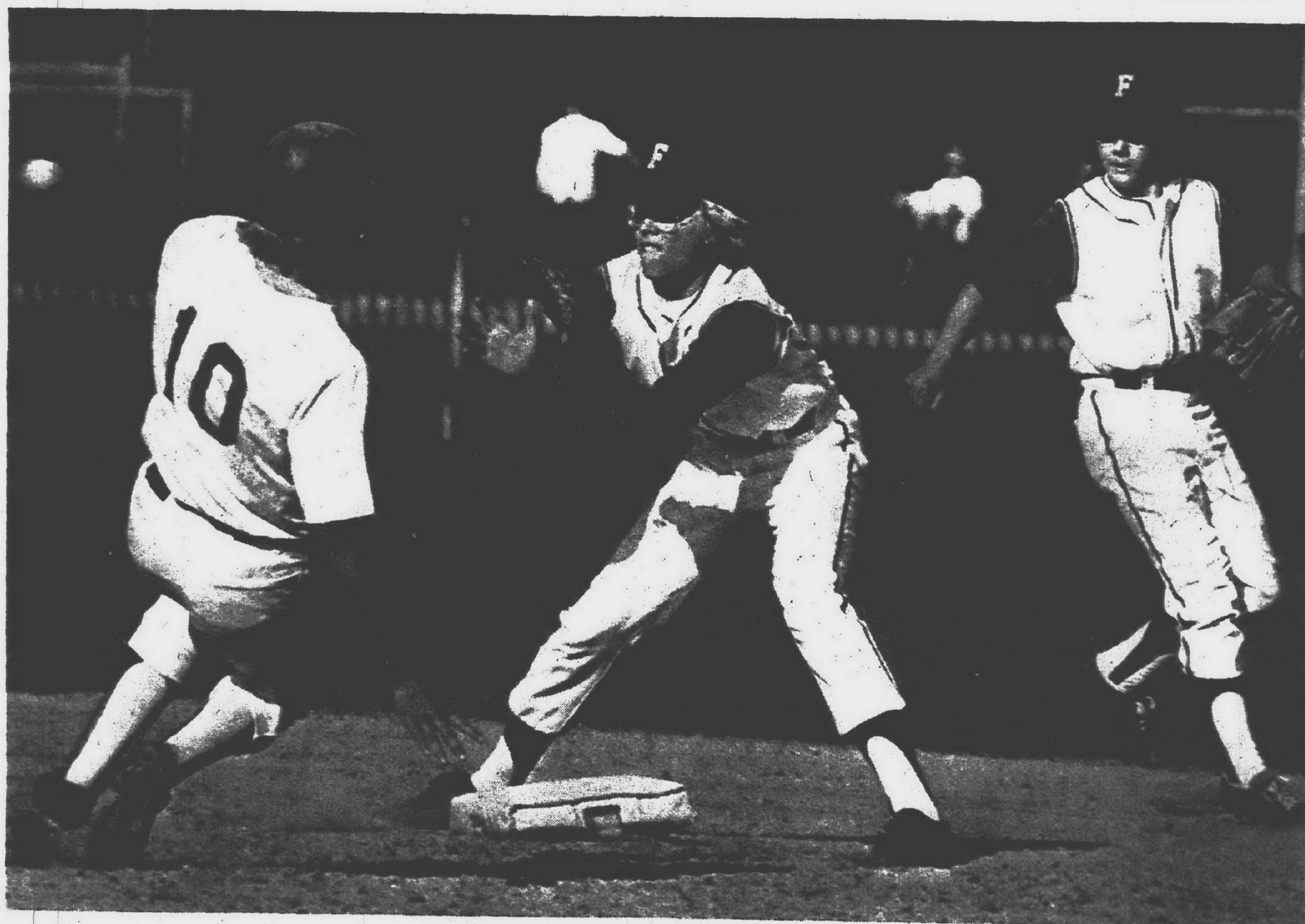
Terry Dobbs and Rick McCain worked for Garden City on the mound, with Dobbs picking up the win, allowing six hits, striking out 13 and walking one.

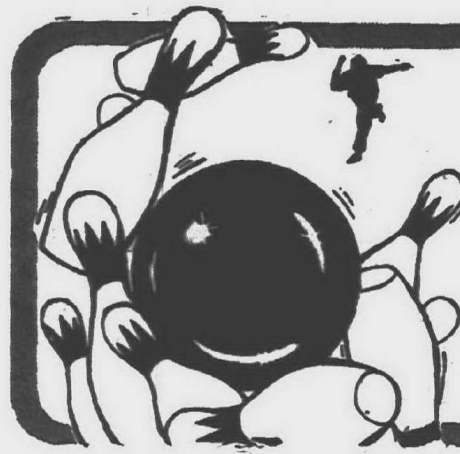
South Farmington spurred ahead with a run in the third

"I'm not finished," he called. "I'm not finished."

It took some persuading, but his followers finally let him down. True, they had miscounted and the Good Father still had one more ball to roll.

Calmly, he strode to the mark after the 15-minute interval and let go. Again the ball rolled right into the 1-3 pocket and Father Halfpenny had his perfect game — the only one ever rolled with a 15 minute intermission between the 11th and 12th strike.

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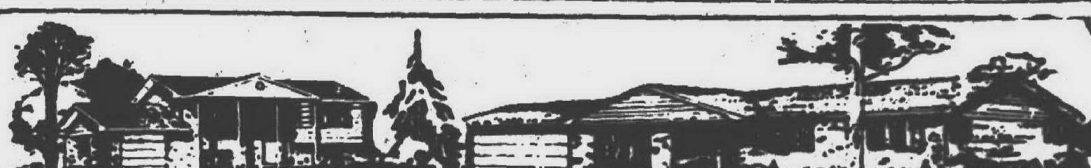

Gay '90s Tunes Add Zest

Visitors to Greenfield Village this summer find an added attraction when they hear gay '90s melodies issued from the Town Hall every hour on the hour beginning at 10 a.m.

They are sung by a cast of eight, three of whom are from Observerland.

THE GREENFIELD Village Players are well into their second summer of in-the-village dramatic and musical presentations, and are drawing good-sized crowds for every performance.

When the theater in the Henry Ford Museum was turned two years ago it was decided to stage a number of vignette-type performances instead of holding the American Drama Festival.

There'll be more shipping of horseflesh in the next two or three days in the Metropolitan Detroit area than one has seen for several years.

It's all due to the changes in tracks with the pacers and trotters closing Tuesday at Northville Downs and opening Wednesday at Hazel Park.

The runners end a 132-day meeting at Hazel Park Saturday and the Detroit Race Course begins a 108-day meeting Monday. That leaves only Jackson Raceway where "Action at Jackson" will start on Aug. 20.

But in between the openings and the closings, top leaders of harness racing and the industry will gather at the Raleigh House Sunday night to honor Northville's executive manager John Carlo on the occasion of his 75th birthday.

Johnny is the last of the six Buffalo, N.Y. businessmen who pioneered parimutuel betting on night harness racing back in 1944. Sam Wiedrick, Harold Dennison, Abe Goldberg, Earl Reed have left this world while Max Brock has retired and is residing in Buffalo.

During the ensuing 29 years, the Downs has grown from an old wooden grandstand to an air conditioned, glass-enclosed grandstand and clubhouse with a seating capacity of 7,000.

THE HALF-MILE plant is one of the finest in the midwest and the operation under Carlo is the best in the metropolitan area.

Needless to say, none will be prouder than Carlo Sunday when he greets many friends he hasn't seen for years. Brock has indicated he'll be back to wish his longtime associate well and many more birthdays.

The program won't be that long but it will include mementos from O. K. Grettenberger, president of the Michigan Harness Horsemen's Association; Stan Bergstein, executive secretary of the Harness Tracks of America; Ed Hackett, executive vice president of the United States Trotting Association; Dick Wilson, vice president and general manager of Wolverine Raceway; Don MacFarlane, president of Hazel Park Harness Association; Leon Slavin, president and general manager of Jackson Raceway; Leo Shirley, state racing commissioner, and Deputy Racing Commissioner Dick Morris.

And there'll be a goodly representation from the drivers, trainers, and grooms... all have a great deal of respect for the hard-working Carlo who spends hours atop a tractor during the early part of any meeting getting the track in shape.

FIGURING on attending the opener Monday at the DRC?... then take a tip from the folks who know and use the Inkster and Schoolcraft entrances. The track management was told last fall that Middle Belt Road would be torn up with work on an underpass under the railroad tracks... and that's exactly what's taking place.

So take a hint and use the side and back entrances into the parking lots and make sure you'll arrive in time for the races.

The DRC won't have as many gimmicks as at Hazel Park. There'll be a daily double and trifectas and that's all. Hazel Park had three trifectas, a quinella and a perfecta in addition to the daily double.

Racing will start at 3:20 p.m. on opening day and that time will be followed on weekdays with a 2:20 post on Saturday. There'll be nine races on weekdays and 10 on Saturdays and holidays.

First day visitors will be treated to a redecorated, revamped plant with the parking lots all newly covered with blacktop, the roads through the entrances all recovered and a brand new betting ring on the top of the Turf room on the top floor of the clubhouse.

The Top of the Turf section will be a revelation for all visiting it. It has a new ceiling, a tile floor, tables and chairs, a bar and the latest designs of lavatory facilities.

And there'll be new faces and new names from all over the nation on the daily program. Stables have arrived from Nebraska, California, Philadelphia and other eastern ovals with some 400 expected to check in from Hazel Park over the weekend.

Monday's opener will mark the beginning of the top running races in the area this year and DRC is looking forward to a much better season than a year ago when there was a marked dip in attendance and wagering.

PROSPECTS ARE BRIGHT on the east side as Hazel Park prepares to open its 20th season. It will be the longest standard meeting in the track's history... 82 nights before closing for the winter on Nov. 4.

Racing Secretary Bill Connors, who was stricken with a heart attack with six weeks remaining in the Wolverine meeting, arrived Monday and made the draw for the opening program Saturday morning.

More than 1,100 pacers and trotters have been allotted stall space and Connors anticipates one of the best campaigns ever.

Chris Boring, leading driver of the 1971 meet, will be back with an even stronger stable than he had at Wolverine. So will Greg Wright, the brilliant Canadian who was the top dash winner last year. Boring has asked for 35 stalls and Wright will check in with 29.

Other prominent campaigners who have always done well at Hazel Park include: Doug Ackerman, Gerry Bookmyer, Tom Wilburn, Tom and Jim Merriman, Bob Williams and Lou Huber.

Gene Riegler, who has just completed a fine campaign at Scioto Downs, will be in with 19 head. Charley King, coming from Atlantic City, has been allotted 10 stalls.

Hazel Park will offer three gimmicks... daily double and trifectas on the sixth and 10th races.

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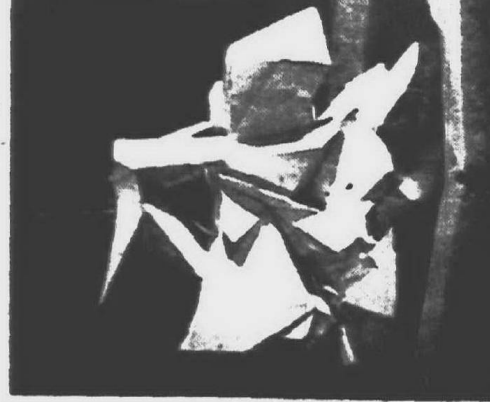

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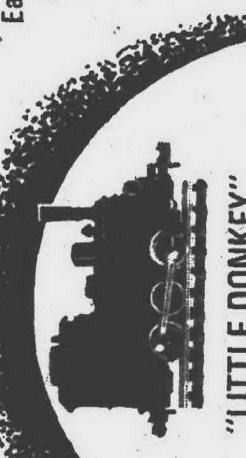

You're Bound To Find

Fascinating Hobbies

It's hard to imagine ever being bored when you travel around Observerland and see people engaged in their wide assortment of hobbies.

Just looking at the "artsy-craftsy" kind can give you enough ideas to fill leisure hours stretching a long way into the future.

And the variety is so great that we asked Daisy Proctor of Plymouth, who sees the hobby scene both as teacher of varied crafts and as retailer of handmade wares, just what's most "in," hobbywise.

PROBABLY the biggest recent gainer in popularity is the three-dimensional picture she said.

It's made by building layer on layer, and to do it you use a set of greeting cards or a sheet of gift wrap from which the same picture can be cut three to five times.

A drop of glue holds the layers together, and the effects possible are limited only by the imagination, Mrs. Proctor said. You also need a good sense of depth

perception and a steady hand, she added.

Also big on the hobby scene is a wide variety of knitting and crocheting projects. Shawls, sweaters, vests and knit purses are being turned out in great numbers.

Those lovable characters, Raggety Ann and Raggety Andy, are enjoying a new burst of popularity. You see them not only as the familiar dolls but also as all sorts of decorated items.

BEAD WORK has many devotees. Whether woven on looms as the Indians did it or strung in long necklaces intricately patterned, tiny beads work into a fascinating hobby.

Craft items that require relatively little time are increasing in popularity.

Among these Mrs. Proctor listed icopage, in which a print is cut to fit a plaster disc and then given an anacrylic coating, mod-podge pictures on wood and ceramics that involve use of purchased shapes and require only painting and firing.

The appeal of being able to create a beautiful item without investing a lot of time is strong, Mrs. Proctor believes. But she adds:

"You get out of any of these crafts as much as you invest."

IN COMPLETE AGREEMENT is Mrs. Betty Shaw of Redford Township, who has taught decoupage classes in the Pease Paint store in Plymouth for several years.

"I tell my students it's a course with no short cuts -- 20 coats of lacquer at least and sometimes 30 -- because that's the only way to get a beautiful finish that will hold up."

Mrs. Shaw, who also is active in the Redford Township Recycling Center, has used cast-off bottles discarded there for some of her loveliest decoupage work.

"That's recycling for art," she said.

She will sponsor a display of her students' work Saturday, Sept. 16, in the Pease store on Main Street, Plymouth. Prospective students who want to visit may sign up then for classes that will begin Sept. 27.

Rocketry Zooms As Hobby To Close The Generation Gap

"Boys of all ages" are getting together to make rocketry one of the fastest-growing hobbies in this area.

"I think we have as many men buying the rocket kits and building them as we have boys," said Mrs. Alex Carbon, who with her husband operates the Hobby Shop in Farmington.

"And that's good," she added, "not only because it's a hobby that two generations can enjoy but also because rocketry really should be carried out under adult supervision."

FATHERS AND SONS spill enjoy building all kinds of model planes, cars and ships, Mrs. Carbon said, and they still find trains and their gadgets and racing outfits a fascinating pastime.

But those rockets that are carefully built and then sent zooming from a vacant field or park are perhaps the favorites of dads and boys now.

Home-built rockets have been described as a learning process for boys growing up in a space age. The "technological hobby" that followed the growth of real rockets offers young people a chance to try solving aeronautical space prob-

lems on their own, and maybe find the mental process as enjoyable as the thrill of launching.

And fathers and sons who work together to make their model operate have assimilated some fairly sophisticated concepts.

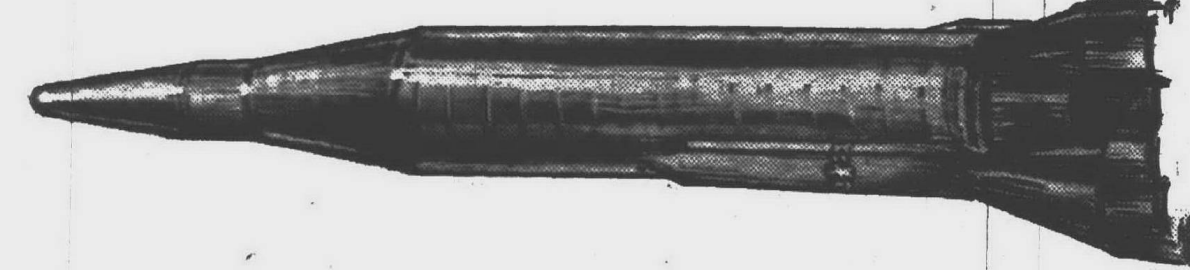
ROCKETS are launched electrically through the use of an igniter, Mrs. Carbon said.

"They're safe if handled properly," she added. "People ask us for wick line to use on rockers, but it's not safe and it's not legal and we don't carry it."

In the Farmington store is a sheet listing names from all over the area -- fathers and sons interested in forming a rocketry club to work together on their space-age hobby.

The Hobby Shop has available, besides all sorts of model kits, a wide variety of craft materials, including makings for candles, beads for beadwork, decoupage and macrame equipment and art supplies.

"And we also are able to get -- usually the same day requested -- many special kinds of materials that people need," Mrs. Carbon said.



Need Simple Craft Ideas?

You're a den mother this year and you have to dream up some craft projects for a bunch of lively little boys seemingly equipped with 10 thumbs each

Or you have a young Sunday School class, or you hear the "what can I do now?" wail at home. Here are a few suggestions for simple craft projects.

- Make a fleet of sailboats from walnut shells. The half shell is the hull, a toothpick forms the mast and sails are paper.
- Decorate some flat stones with acrylic paints. Let your imagination tell you how to use them.
- Corks can be turned into tiny people. Dress them in felt, put on a funny fact but forget the arms or legs.
- Decorate coffee cans -- with burlap, ball fringe, wall paper, shelf paper or anything else that looks interesting.
- Make bracelets from instant laundry starch, cold water, wire, bandage gauze and colored tissue paper. Mix equal parts of starch and cold water, let it stand a few minutes. Then bend a wire into the proper size to slip over the wrist and wrap it with gauze dipped in the starch paste. Cover it with pieces of colored tissue. Dry thoroughly and then cover with more paste and paper. When dried again, spray with clear plastic or coat with shellac or clear nail polish.

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
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Grandmother's Craft Gets A Modern Touch

It's grandmother's favorite -- quilting -- but grandmother might never recognize some of the creations that are being quilted.

Mrs. T.A. Cuper of Linden street in Plymouth has held two classes to teach quilting, and she'll start a third this fall.

Her students turn out not only the quilts that the ladies of pioneer times used to keep their families warm but also pillows, bedspreads and other decorative items.

"I've had all sorts of compliments on the diaper bag I quilted," said Mrs. Nora Stark, one of her students. Her projects also include a bedspread, a pillow for her antique rocker, and a floor pillow.

Women who sew always have a built-in supply of scraps for quilting, but remnant counters can offer additional variety.

It's fun to be able to identify Sue's dress, Johnny's shirt and the family room curtains in a quilt. One Wisconsin woman recently displayed a comforter she had quilted from patches of dresses saved for many years in her family.


For those who want to get into the historical as well as artistic aspects of quilting, there will be quilting demonstrations Aug. 1 through 4 from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the Detroit Historical Museum, 5401 Woodward.

Many experienced quilters will be on hand, and visitors are invited to stop by and talk with them.

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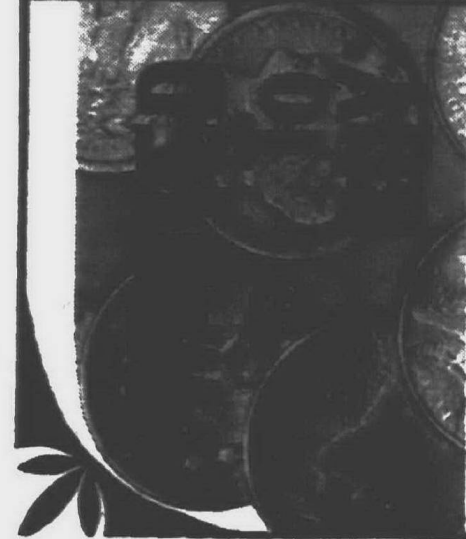

Mother Nature Is Hobbyist's Partner

Mother Nature can be the champion supplier of materials for hobby projects.

And in the open areas still to be found in Observerland, you can find a wealth of goodies to turn into decorations of beauty.

Mrs. Joyce Herrington of Farmington likes to dry flowers and use them to make gifts. She lays delicate blooms such as pansies or daisies, and leaves and fern fronds between layers of paper towels.

"You have to use the thin kind of towel," Mrs. Herrington said, "not the heavier quilted varieties. I then put the towels and flowers into a telephone book. The idea is to get the flowers completely dry as quickly as possible. Usually it takes just a few days."

SMALL CLUSTER FLOWERS such as the yarrow she gathers from the fields near her home and the baby's breath she has left over from fresh floral arrangements she hangs upside down in bunches to dry.

The blooms and dried leaves then can be pasted carefully to a variety of decorations.

Joyce Herrington especially likes to add the floral touch to graduation or wedding announcements and then frame. "They make a really personal and inexpensive gift," she said.

ELEVEN-YEAR-OLD Kathy Proctor of

Plymouth also goes to the fields for one of her favorite projects, making bouquets of fragile-looking puff balls.

Armed with an aerosol can of hair spray, Kathy goes out early in the morning to find specimens of the tall weeds that have just opened. The hair spray glues the fluffy seeds to the stem and then Kathy picks them and takes them home to dry.

"After they're dry you use spray paint to color them," she said.

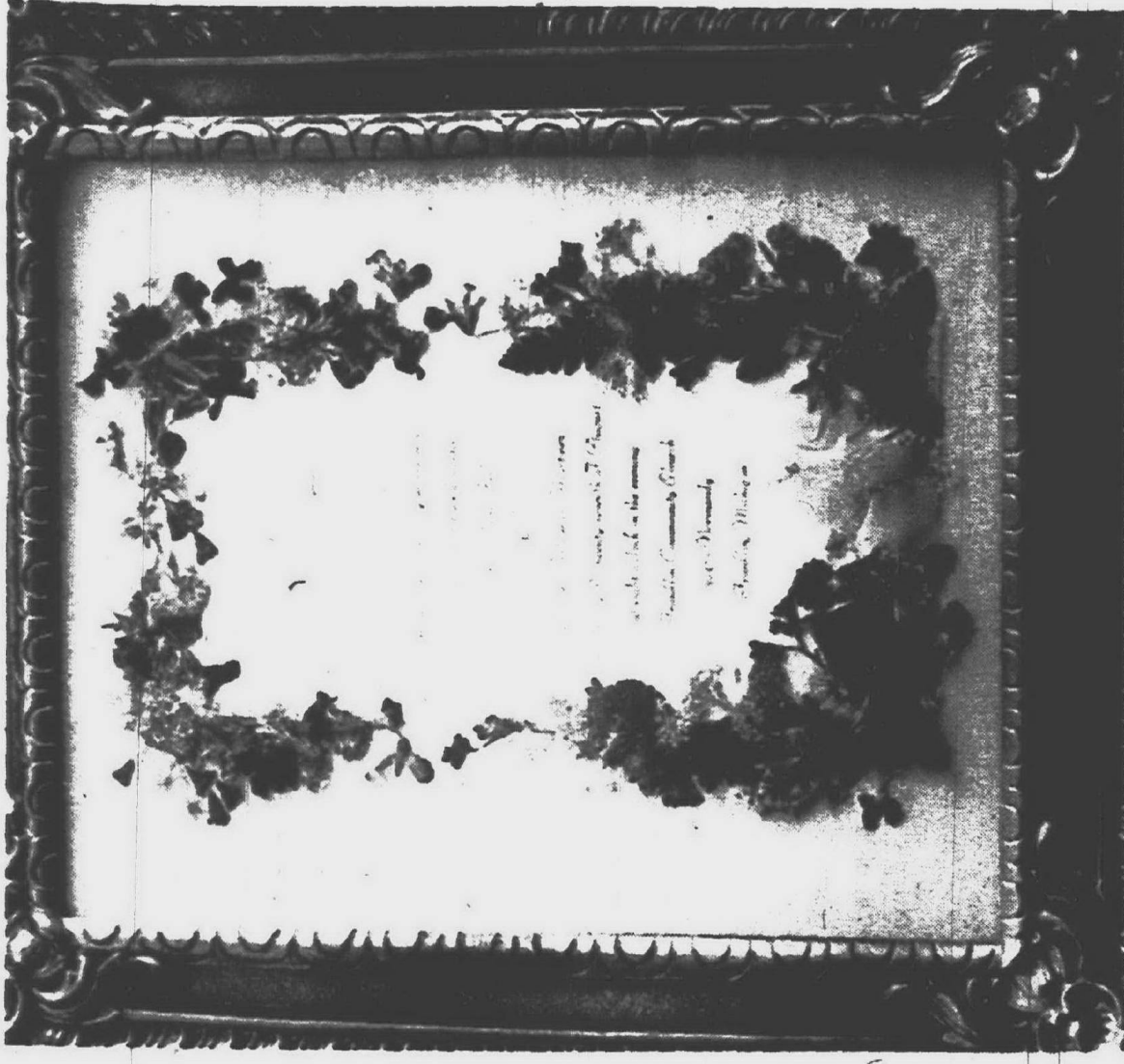
Kathy's grandmother, Mrs. Goldie Hornbach of Plymouth, makes an unusual decoration from osage oranges, also called hedge apples, a plant found only rarely in this area.

Mrs. Hornbach brings the grapefruit-sized balls back from yearly trips to Kansas and Oklahoma. Sliced crosswise, they can be dried in a warm oven and then attached to wire stems. Ball fringe make good centers for these striking "flowers."

MRS. HORNBACK also finds a use for those prickly burs that stick to picnickers and campers. She sticks them together to form tiny poodles that she then spray paints.

Smooth rocks to paint, minerals to polish, seed pods to give vent to the imagination, straw flowers to fashion into miniature arrangements -- definitely nature abounds in hobby ideas.

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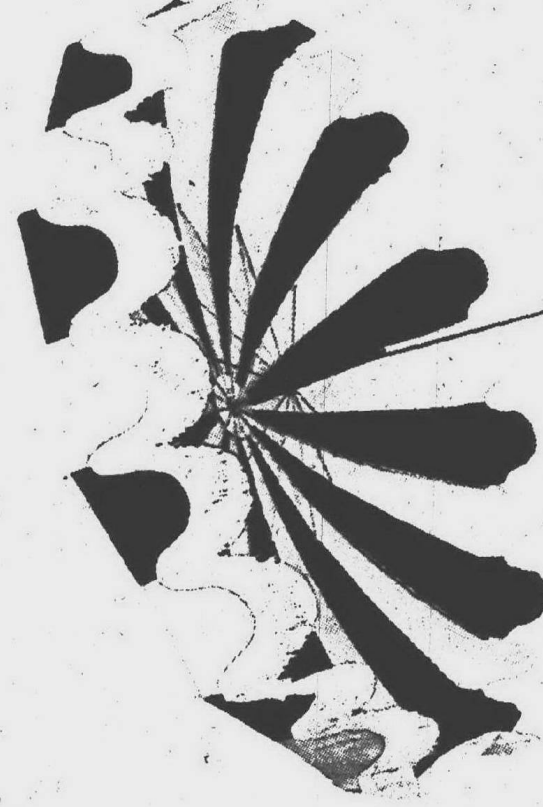
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
