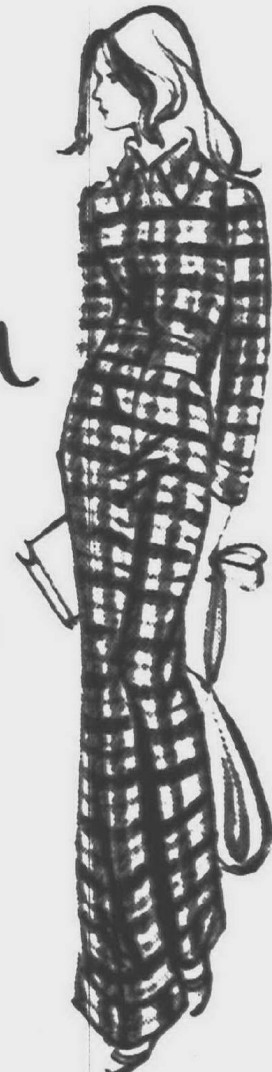

Local Girl's Heroism Hailed As 3 Are Saved From Lake

The quick reaction of an 18-year-old Plymouth girl, who earlier this summer received her senior life saving certificate from Plymouth High School, is credited with saving the life of a man floating unconscious in Lake Huron. Jane Mills, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Hoyt Mills of 5390 Gottfredson Rd., applied her newly-learned mouth-to-mouth resuscitation to one of three men knocked into the water when a power line to an electric-powered boat hoist they were moving into the lake shorted out.

The three were left unconscious in the water, but all were saved.

Miss Mills was employed for the summer at the Lake Huron Methodist Camp near Port Huron. On Aug. 17, while working in the camp, she and another girl heard calls for help.

Dashing toward the beach, she found a Port Huron man,

Donald L. Letts, attempting to drag the three men out of the water.

As Letts applied mouth-to-mouth resuscitation on one man, Miss Mills began rescue attempts on another while the other girl ran for help.

After "what seemed like an eternity," the men began breathing. Miss Mills was able to revive Kenneth Mapley, 29, who is a counselor in the Crosswell-Lexington School District. All three men recovered from their experience.

RELATING the event to her parents by telephone, Miss Mills said:

"It was a traumatic experience. It's difficult now for me to walk down on the beach where it happened."

She told her mother that "I'm so happy I took first aid. I keep thinking that without that knowledge, one of those men might have died."

Miss Mills said that any person who can should take lifesaving. "and shouldn't

take it lightly. It can become a lifesaving gift."

A 1972 graduate of Plymouth High, Miss Mills plans to attend Michigan State University in the fall. Although not certain as yet what career she wants to follow, she is considering the special education field.

"JANE WORKED as a volunteer at the Plymouth State Home during the year and enjoyed working with the children," Mrs. Mills said. "She has acting talent, too," her mother added. "Jane played the lead in the high school production of Fiddler on the Roof this spring. She also appeared in the school production of The Man Who Came to Dinner."

This was Miss Mills' first year as a worker at the camp, where she was employed in the kitchen. "Jane has always loved the water and swimming. She took to it like a fish," Mrs. Mills stated. "Although she

finished her lifesaving course at the school this spring, her certificate didn't come until a few weeks ago, and we had to mail it to her at camp."

SHE TOLD her parents she has high praise for Letts, who initiated the rescue.

"He is a wonderful person and credited us for our efforts. He personally saw to it that we met the families of the three men."

St. Clair County Sheriff Norman Meharg praised the girls and Letts for the quick reaction, saying it was "a wonderful example of heroism."

He is exploring the possibilities of recommending some sort of citation for Miss Mills, Letts and the other high school girl, Ruth Ransom, of Nashville, Tenn.

At home in Plymouth, not only her mother and father are "so proud of Jane," but her three sisters and two brothers also think she is something special.

Distribute Schedules Next Week

Co-principals Bill Brown and Kent Buikema have reminded all ninth through 12th grade students that their class schedules may be picked up during the coming week at the Plymouth-Salem high school.

Shuttle bus service to the high school will be provided Monday through Thursday this coming week, originating at Tanger, Starkweather and Bird all days except Tuesday when Allen and Fiegel will be the pickup points.

Wright Resigns Planning Post

John S. Wright announced this week that ill health has made it necessary to resign as director of the Plymouth Area Planning Commission, and in leaving the post urged a "closer working relationship" between the governmental bodies which give the agency its financial support.

Basic purpose of the PACP is to strengthen the tax base of the 54-square-mile Plymouth School District by bringing added business and industrial firms into the area.

Funds for its operation are provided by the city and township of Plymouth, Canton Township and the board of education.

The 60-year-old Wright took the job as director two years ago after a lengthy career as an industrial engineer and planning consultant for municipalities. The demands of the full-time post have taxed his health, and he said that what work he does in the future will be only as a free lance consultant.

"IT IS WITH deep regret that I resign," he said. "I feel that the interest I have generated in the development of

the Greater Plymouth area will be of benefit for some time to come if the contacts are pursued. It should help to create a balance between industrial, commercial and residential tax base.

"The main objective would be a closer working relationship between the governments," Wright continued. He also urged development of a comprehensive plan for the total area, saying that "no single area will be able to stand alone and maintain the favorable tax position we are now enjoying."

"I believe that the townships should develop their areas so as to enhance the city, rather than cause it to decay," he advised. "A community cannot become a success, nor prosper and exist for any period of time, without an identity."

He called the PACP "a contributing force in maintaining orderly growth, rather than growth by the developer," and said he feels the agency should be continued.

However, Wright suggested even stronger funding to permit the PACP to live up to the image it is trying to portray of a prosperous, fast growing community.

THE PACP now shares quarters with the Chamber of Commerce in the Mayflower Hotel and Wright expressed the view that more office space is needed to continue the dual operation.

Expressing his appreciation for the governmental cooperation given him, Wright revealed that he has a November speaking date before University of Detroit engineering and planning students when his topic will be the Greater Plymouth area.

"You can be assured that I will be telling everyone about the great community we have and how it will be preserved in the future," he said.

No decision has been made on selecting a successor to Wright. The PACP board of directors includes James Rossman, Mel Blunk, John Ohno, Harold Guenther, William Silvis, Clarence Moore, Maurice Breen, Frank Millington, Clark Finley, Philip Dingeldey, Robert Wade and Don Korte.

Fall Festival Windows Will Depict The Past

The costume and window display contests to be held as part of this year's Plymouth Fall Festival will take on broadened dimensions under sponsorship of the American Association of University Women, which this week announced the rules of both events.

In an attempt to spur community-wide participation, the association's committee has sent letters to all merchants urging that they take part and announcing that the window theme will be "Memories Are Made Of..."

Each window is to depict a specific memory such as "Mother's Kitchen," "My Toy Box," "School Days," or other imaginative recollections of the past.

All displays are to be completed by the evening of Wednesday, Sept. 6 and they will be judged beginning at noon the following day on a basis of overall appearance, authenticity, public appeal and depiction of theme.

There will be three categories: windows done by merchants, windows done by individuals other than merchants, and windows done by clubs, organizations and antique dealers. An engraved plaque will be awarded for first place in each category.

THE INDIVIDUAL "turn of the century" costume contest has been returned to Sunday afternoon on the festival calendar, making it one of the highlights of the climactic Rotary Club barbecue to be held Sept. 10.

Four categories have been established by the AAUW and after the judging there will be a "Turn of the Century Costume Parade and Fashion Show" scheduled for 4:45 p.m. at the Kellogg Park band shell. These are the categories:

1. Children up to 16 years of age — authentic costumes.
2. Costumes depicting trades, jobs or professions. For instance, examples would include blacksmith, policeman, doctor or teacher, but need not be limited to those.
3. Original costumes depicting turn of the century styles, but not overlapping No. 2.
4. Antique outfits of the same era.

IT WAS announced that prize money and ribbons will be awarded in each category, and no advance registration will be necessary.

All individuals participating will be asked to report at an area at the bandstand at 3 p.m. on the day of the contest and a panel of judges will determine the awards before public announcement is made at the time of the parade and fashion show.

Father Of 13 Ordained As Deacon

Father of 13 children, grandfather of 10, supervisor of maintenance for the Wayne County Child Development Center, Stanley A. Belanger of Westland now has an official new responsibility.

He has been ordained to the Catholic Church's permanent diaconate and is assisting with the clerical duties in St. Theodore Catholic Church, 8200 Wayne, Westland.

Belanger has been studying two years to prepare himself for the diaconate, a part of the Catholic hierarchy that has been restored after an absence of 1,300 years.

Ordained in St. Theodore Sunday, Aug. 13, just three days after taking his final examination in Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit, he now is authorized to perform many functions of the priesthood other than preaching.

"THE WORD deacon means servant," he explained, "and the apostles had deacons. Our purpose is like theirs—to take care of the details while they preach the word of God."

In the Archdiocese of Detroit, the diaconate is a part-time, unpaid ministry. So Belanger, like other ordained before him, will continue in his work in the Wayne County center.

"One thing stressed in our training," he pointed out, "is that family should come first, work second and the diaconate third in our lives."

"That way there's no disrupting of family life." And his wife, Margaret, added that one reason her husband was interested in training to be a deacon was that he felt "he could better help his family as well as others—through added knowledge and improved ability to come across to others."

The Belanger clan ranges from Mrs. Helen McGuire, of Northville, down through seven-year-old Renee, and John, Robert, Paul, Frances, Bernadette, Bernard, Annette and James. Another daughter, Theresa, died at the age of seven.

BISHOP Walter J. Schoenherr was presiding before for the ordination Sunday.

Concelebrating the mass were the Rev. John Blaska, pastor of St. Theodore, the Rev. Edward J. Baldwin and the Rev. Ronald Sayers, vicar.

A reception for the new deacon followed the mass.

In his new role, Deacon Belanger may witness marriage, proclaim the gospel

and give the homily, participate in the liturgy and officiate at para-liturgical events such as wakes, prayer services, graveside rites and benediction.

He will continue his studies for another year in order to earn a license to preach.

Belanger a resident of Westland for 19 years, said he became interested in the diaconate program after serving on the parish council's education committee.

"It was a new program and I went to observe," he said. "When I decided to take the

training, I received the complete support of Father Leonard Zak, former pastor

here, and later Father Blaska."

MRS. BELANGER said she also had found benefits in the program.

"One of the first requirements for a candidate is an interview with his wife to be sure she wants him to participate," she said.

"Then in the course of the study time we have evenings of recollection or shared prayer, for the husbands and wives together. There also are separate gatherings of the wives every few months, and they give us a chance to share our thoughts about various parts of the program."

Hadassah Leader To Speak Monday

Mrs. Max (Faye) Schenk, immediate past national

president of Hadassah, will be guest speaker at a luncheon for special gifts workers of Hadassah on Monday, Aug. 28. It will be held in the home of Mrs. Milford Golden of Birmingham.

The luncheon will kick off a campaign for special gifts for the Hadassah Medical Organization which supports the Medical Center in Israel.

Mrs. Schenk has held major positions in Hadassah for the past 35 years. While its national president, she served on the board of governors of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and the presidium of the Zionist General Council.

She represents Hadassah in the conference of presidents of major American Jewish organizations, and was elected one of the two American representatives to the board of directors of the Karen Kayemeth Le Israel.

Born in Des Moines, Iowa, the daughter of the late Rabbi N.H. Zeichik, a noted Talmudic scholar, she is the wife of Rabbi Max Schenk, who recently retired as a leader of Congregation Shaari Zedek, Brooklyn, N.Y., and former president of the New York board of rabbis.

Mrs. Schenk received her BA and MA from Drake University, where she taught science.

From 1939 to 1949, the Schenks lived in Sydney, Australia.

A frequent visitor to Israel, Mrs. Schenk has also studied the problems of Jews behind the Iron Curtain when she visited Czechoslovakia, Poland, Yugoslavia and the U.S.S.R. She recently visited Iran.

Rev. Lester Kinsolving's Religion Update

While morticians generally have an understandable aversion to being called "undertakers," the selected euphemism of "funeral director" has been a leading cause of strife with the clergy more than half a century.

It got so bad in Manhattan during the '30s that a number of the leading pastors simply hired morticians as their assistants, with the rule that no other mortician could handle any funeral in the church.

This eliminated any mortuary interference with the appropriate clergy authority in any religious service, and there is no report that any clergyman ever deigned to offer his church's mortician advice regarding such functions as embalming.

SINCE MORTICIANS handle a considerable number of unchurched, they could often retaliate by hiring the hungry clergy to do as told. Or they could frequently take advantage of clergy from distant areas who had no desire to argue at funeral time and in front of the bereaved.

One such instance took place when the late Oscar Green, a colorful and dry-witted clergyman from Palo Alto, Calif., was called to officiate in another county. As the family was approaching graveside, the mortician brusquely thrust an envelope of rose petals into the hand of the Rev. Mr. Green, loftily informing him that "It is our custom here to throw rose petals instead of earth upon the casket."

"I'd prefer dirt, thank you," replied the Rev. Mr. Green. "Oh, why be difficult?" countered the mortician, his voice thick with sarcasm. "The rose petals eventually turn to dirt, you know!"

"So do undertakers," shot back Green, "but we don't throw them on!"

Most morticians have a sense of humor and many are both cooperative and scrupulous in providing good and modest services when requested, without taking advantage of the unwary bereaved.

BUT THERE have not been nearly enough of these to offset—or to police—the monumental scandals uncovered in such best sellers as "The American Way of Death" or "The High Cost of Dying," charged the Saturday Review of Literature, about those described by author Edwin O'Connor as "the death-bed

scattering ashes over the ocean (a service which a new group, the Flying Funeral Directors of America, is providing Californians for \$25). And a growing number of clergy are suggesting that memorial services without casket are most appropriate, with the liturgy minutely and appropriately altered regarding final disposition.

WHILE ALL usable organs from heart to cornea should be utilized wherever needed, there is far less objection nowadays to cremation—especially when followed by ashes being scattered over the ocean. Certainly the mystic majesty and beauty of the sea would appear to exceed even the most manicured or scenic "memory garden" or, certainly, the many cemeteries which don't even deserve the epithet "marble orchard," because they are so grotesque in monumental variation.

The ocean is not in need of any "perpetual care," nor is there any chance that, like most cemeteries, it will have to be moved—although sentiment can postpone this for several generations if not permanently.

At Georgetown University, for example, there is a Jesuit graveyard located somewhat incongruously in the midst of a conglomerate of new dormitories. Explains one faculty member—who has asked to remain anonymous: "We thought of building the girls' dorm right on top of the cemetery, because so many of those priests had said, 'Georgetown will go coed over my dead body!'"

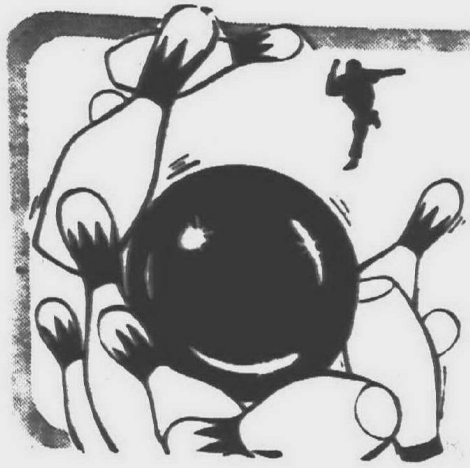

He was among the top drivers in the meetings at Wolverine and Northville, and is the leading driver after three weeks at the Hazel Park Harness Raceway. Dokey won 132 races and had earnings of \$285,000 in 1971 and looks like a good bet to surpass both marks this year.

Two fillies under his care have already accounted for almost \$100,000. They are the three-year-old Saucy Wave which has won five of 16 starts and earned \$52,000 and the two-year-old Jambo Belle which has won seven of 13 for \$45,000.

Curiously enough, both fillies are owned by Bert James who is remembered as the man who bought Albatross as a yearling and made a fortune on the Big Bird.

State's Hunting, Fishing License Sales Reach \$11.6 Million Record

LANSHING Receipts from Michigan's 1971 sale of hunting and fishing licenses rose to a record \$11.6 million, some \$1.7 million above the previous high set the year before, according to final figures recently compiled by the Department of Natural Resources.

Last season's rise in revenues reflects a strong upturn in fishing license sales and increases in Michigan's hunting fees for firearm deer, archery deer, and small game.

Completed returns from license dealers show that last year's sale of trout and salmon stamps climbed to about \$43,000 for a new record which topped the 1970 figure by about 13,000.

Last year also saw Michigan anglers buying some 837,460 resident fishing licenses to place those sales at their highest level since 1958, and up about 30,000 from 1970. At the same time, Michigan sold about 97,170 senior resident fishing licenses, approximately 4,300 more than the year before.

The combined purchases of senior and regular licenses in 1971 set an all-time high for resident fishing sales. Also on the up side last year were Michigan's sales of annual non-resident fishing licenses which rose to 137,460 for their best mark since 1956. Those sales showed a gain of more than 4,000 over 1970.

OUT-OF-STATE anglers also bought more than \$3,000 of Michigan's 7-day non-resident fishing licenses in 1971, as compared with about 50,000 the year before.

Last year's ledger includes a final figure of 17,470 for the sale of 1-day resident and non-resident fishing licenses covering the Great Lakes and Lake St. Clair. That total was up about 2,600 from 1970.

On the other side of the license sales picture for last year, totals for firearm deer, small game, archery deer, and bear were all down from their 1970 levels.

However, they were partially offset by higher sales of the sportsman's and senior citizen big game licenses in 1971.

Hitting nearly 56,100 in sales last year was the sportsman's license, which for residents covers all types of fishing and carries the privileges of fire-

arm and archery deer licenses, bear license, small game license, and trapping license (except for beaver and otter).

Those sales, representing a \$1,000 gain over 1970, probably reflected the fact that \$18.50 combination license became a buyer's bargain last year when fees were hiked for Michigan's firearm deer, archery deer, and small game licenses.

In its first year of sales last season, the senior big game license for residents drew 34,675 customers. The new license for residents 65 years and older was valid either for the state's firearm deer season or Michigan's archery deer hunting period.

DNR LICENSING OFFICIALS estimate that most of the hunters who bought it were sports men who otherwise would have purchased regular firearm deer licenses. They believe this also held true for as many as 55,000 of the hunters who bought the sportsman's license.

On the strength of these additional license sales, it is estimated that Michigan probably had around 550,000 firearm deer hunters last year, instead of the 467,500 actually accounted for under firearm deer license purchases.

By the same token, last year's sales of sportsman's licenses and senior big game licenses "hide" an unknown number of small game, archery deer, and bear hunters, plus trappers. This means that the 1971 sales totals for the following categories show something less than the number of sportsmen which Michigan actually had in each of the following ranks:

Small Game, 470,885; Archery Deer, 38,500; Bear, 3,775; Trapping, 4,640.

IN 1970, Michigan sold 588,000 small game licenses, 628,900 firearm deer licenses, 61,800 archery deer licenses,

5,440 bear licenses, and 6,160 trapping licenses.

Last year's reductions in these sales reflect a combination of other factors besides what appears to have been a sizable shift toward buying sportsman's and senior big game licenses. These other factors, hard to sort out one by one, include a resistance to the increased hunting fees, a Monday opener for the firearm deer season, a cut in antlerless quotas and a not-too-optimistic outlook for the firearm deer season, plus a relatively high level of unemployment.

DNR officials report that last year's sales in sportsman's licenses had a very "minimal" effect on purchases of 1971 fishing licenses. They explain that most anglers had purchased those licenses before last September when the increased game fees turned the sportsman's license into a "bargain."

However, in 1972, fishing license sales are down 6 percent and trout stamp purchases are off 11 percent from last year, indicating that more angler-hunters are taking advantage of the collective cost-saving feature of the sportsman's license.

Last year's sales of state park vehicle entrance permits also reached a new record in 1971, totaling \$1,990,680. That figure is listed separately from the last year's hunting and fishing license revenues.

NF-WB Pony Leaguers Work Miracle

WASHINGTON, PA. Miracles of miracles! That's what folks attending the 21st annual Pony World Series here are saying.

The team working the miracle was North Farmington-West Bloomfield which was blanked on a no-hit, no-run effort by Pitcher Rick Arnold, of Lakewood, Calif., for the official seven inning route and then scored in the extra inning eighth to oust the Californians, 1-0.

THE MICHIGANDERS scored the big run in the top of the eighth. Mike Doerr was safe on an error to open the inning but was picked off first by Fauland. Mark Salisbury popped out and things appeared grim for NF-WB. Cullen beat out a sizzler to shortstop and stole second.

Steve Morrison hit a high foul behind the plate and Arnold, who had donned catcher's garb, dropped

the ball. Morrison drove a hot smash into center and Cullen scampered across with the winning run. Bill Lowman fanned, but NF-WB had a 1-0 edge in the extra inning and the chance to meet the loser of the Monterey, Mexico-Newport News contest in Friday's third round.

IT WAS SIMPLY a case of opening game jitters for the North Farmington-West Bloomfield group of 13 and 14-year-olds Wednesday against Newport News, Va., with an 8-4 setback.

As one of the more than 100 followers of the team explained, "Good teams have bad nights when one thing goes wrong and that results in all going wrong. That's what happened to our club. We haven't given up hope because we know this is a good team."

Southpaw Salisbury started for NF-WB and appeared headed for a big game when he whiffed Newport's John Dixon, who had compiled a .540 average and fanned only once in 13 tourney games, in the first inning.

But he lost control in the second when he walked four batters with one out, forcing in a run and leaving the bases loaded for reliever Mike Cullen.

DIXON laid down a perfect bunt along the first base line which Cullen fielded and whipped to first baseman Bill Lowman. But Lowman muffed the throw and the ball rolled to the fence, and all three runners scored and Dixon landed on second.

That gave Newport News a 4-0 lead, and Dixon made it 5-0 when he went to third on a passed ball and scored on a wild pitch.

NF-WB had a big chance in the third when three hit batsmen and a walk forced in a run with two out. Reliever Bee Burroughs, who replaced starter Hal Berkey, whiffed Morrison to end that threat, and the score was 5-1.

Newport News put on the clincher in the fifth with three more runs on two singles, a fielder's choice and a two-run error by Salisbury who dropped a fly ball in center. That left runners on first and third, and the Virginians worked a double steal to tally the third run and had an 8-1 margin.

NF-WB threatened in the bottom half of the frame to score three times.

A walk and an infield error put the first two batters on base. Burroughs fanned the next two batsmen. Cullen singled in one run and Morrison followed with a double against the fence to score two more but that was all for the area outfit in the opening round defeat.

The holiday basketball tournament this year will be held on Dec. 27 and 28. The four-team field includes Schoolcraft, Kalamazoo Valley Community College, Lansing Community College and Washtenaw Community College.

AFTER THE NEW YEAR, high school wrestlers will compete in Schoolcraft's third invitational meet.

Collegiate swimming and diving will be in the spotlight in the Schoolcraft pool in February. The state community college championships will be held on 9-10, and the nationals on Feb. 23-24.

Turf Tips, Quips

No more than two years ago, rarely if ever did the purse schedule for a Saturday program at the trotters come close to that offered by the runners.

Usually the thoroughbreds had one stake each Saturday that almost equaled the total purses for the standardbreds.

How times have changed and a prime example is the comparison of the cards planned today (Saturday) at the Detroit Race Course and tonight at Hazel Park.

Better horses, better stables, better jockeys, better purses was the hue and cry of

the Detroit Racing Association prior to the opening of its late summer, fall meeting.

All of that is true with the exception of the purses which reflect the unexplained dip in wagering.

THE BANGTAILS have a \$5,500 feature labeled the "Detroit Prep", presumably a test for the \$35,000 "Detroit Prep" a week hence. But the remaining races have smaller purses, much cheaper than one would normally expect for a Saturday.

"The Detroit Prep" attracted a field of nine of the better three-year-olds going a distance of a mile and a sixteenth.

Included are: Amber Prey, a fast closing second a week ago; Majestic Needle, Go Doc Go, Napoie, Gentleman Conn, Triumphant, Big Hobo and the entry of Bob H and Glazed Donut.

Then there's a \$4,800 race for three-year-olds and up fillies and mares over a mile and 70 yards that could develop into an excellent race.

The entire card is better than average but the purses are not... all of which leads one to believe that many of the better stables with better horses may be looking for richer pastures if the trend continues.

THEN TAKE a look at the Hazel Park program which has a top feature worth \$8,500 and two other races that have a value of \$6,200 each.

That adds up to three races that are worth more money to owners and trainers than the best at the DRC.

The story was much the same during the recent Wolverine Raceway meeting which competed against Hazel Park runners and generally had more money at stake on Fridays and Saturdays.

There isn't any question that the pacers and trotters are

becoming more popular each year as the growth in crowds and betting shows.

Hardly a Friday goes by but that the standardbreds handle more and have more people in the stands than the runners.

Take tonight's card headed by the invitational pace with a field of seven.

Every one of the pacers is capable of winning and fans following the races know this. That's why they're coming out in larger numbers... they know they're going to see good racing and view the best in competition in the Midwest.

The \$8,500 race has such favorites as Windy Way, Tee Cee, Dave Butler, winner of the past two; Shiaway Lad, Bramble Hall, Track Master and Skipper Gene Marx.

Then there are two preferred paces, each with eight starters. The first has Erla's Major, Tricky Dale, Stella Frost, Local Time, Easy O, Whirlaway, Esmond Hanover and Breadman George. Every one a familiar name.

The second lists Gaviland, P.B. Abbe, Apropos, Jay Thorpe, Johnny G, Michigan Mack, Knox Patch and Hava Good.

That's quite a group of standout performers and remember these are three of the 10 races on the card.

There has to be some reason for the decided dip in wagering at the DRC and the consistently high totals at Hazel Park. We're wondering if too many new names, unfamiliar with those who like to wager a bob or two, can be among the reasons.

Who Bowls?

A wide assortment of sizes, shapes, and ages of people can be found in any bowling center enjoying the sport. There are old and young, skinny and fat, couples, groups of women, groups of men, mixed groups, groups of children, and even people bowling alone. You might even find a troop of Brownies there on a field trip if you drop in at the right time. These people keep the bowling centers rolling all day and half the night during the prime September to May season. Summertime is a bit more relaxed, and business is slower.

Bowling is one of the few sports where the sexes can meet on fairly equal terms, since it is more a game of concentration than brawn. This is evident when you see a child toss a ball and watch it roll slowly down the lane, wondering whether it will ever get to the pins, and then see every single pin fall down. In the next lane might be a 200 pounder who really huris the ball and leaves pins standing.

While some children as young as four or five years of age have been known to bowl, and in fact do so quite well, the minimum recommended age for a beginner is seven or eight years, according to Toni Miga, certified instructor and Manager of Cloverlanes in Livonia. If a child is strong enough to throw the ball, he can bowl. If he isn't quite strong enough, he will put it on the floor between his legs, bend over, and roll it. Luckily, the lanes have enough of an incline to keep the ball moving no matter how feebly it is rolled. Children will stop when tired. And they are used to swinging 50 pounds or more every day on the monkey bars in the playground, so they are probably stronger in many ways than some of their parents who lead sedentary lives.

While bowling used to be considered mostly a male sport, the latest statistics reveal that now 48% of bowlers are female. The 1970 census showed that 34.4% of bowlers are 18 years of age or under.

We asked a number of Observer-land bowlers why they bowl. Fred and Virginia Roper, of Livonia, signed their eight-and-a-half-year-old daughter Gina up for the summer bowling league offered by the Department of Parks and Recreation. Gina started out with a 39 average at the begin-

ning of the summer and brought it up to 51 by the middle of August, bowling some games in the 80's, with a high game of 115. The Roperitis frequently bowl together as a family now. "It's fun," says Mrs. Roper. "It's a challenge--you are always striving to do better," says Mr. Roper. Gina, too, says it's fun.

"I bowl for the sheer enjoyment of the game," said one father who was bowling with his 13 year old son. His son has been bowling for about four years and carries a 94 average. Fifteen-year-old Jim Zelezny, of Livonia, has been bowling for two years and carries a 150 average. He bowls twice a week--once as a substitute on a league and once for practice. "It's fun," he says. "I'm trying to beat my friend," he adds. His friend was not with him on this particular day. Unlike most other sports, bowling is something you can do alone. "You meet a lot of nice people and make a lot of new acquaintances," commented one woman. "And at the end of the season, they have a nice banquet," she continued. "It's good exercise; it takes you away from home." Her companion, a first time bowler, said she was bowling for the exercise and to have something to do.

As you can see, reasons for bowling are as diversified as the people themselves. The consensus of opinion does seem to be that bowling is "a ball."

Bowling exercises many muscles, and the benefits of regular exercise are well known. If you bowl too many games at one time for your current physical condition, you will quickly become aware of muscles you didn't realize you had, and it will be quickly evident (the next day) that bowling exercises more muscles than merely those in your forearm.

Persons in lousy physical condition would be wise to consult their doctors before undertaking to join a bowling league. Those in merely the standard semi-lousy condition common to people who lead sedentary lives should limit their first outing to three games. Or even two, if they tire too quickly. If you feel great the day after bowling three games (with no sore

THE HISTORY OF BOWLING

outlawed ninepins because of widespread gambling then rampant in the game.

The earliest known example of bowling was discovered in the grave of an Egyptian child buried in 5200 B.C. Bowling implements found in the grave were similar to those in a contest of accuracy.

Ula Maika, a game very similar to modern tenpins, flourished among the Polynesians in ancient times. The game involved rolling a stone 60 feet toward a target in a contest of accuracy.

Many of the early European games were played outdoors, some as lawn games and others using a narrow wooden board as a lane. These games often adjoined eating places or clubs and eventually either went indoors or were at least provided with a shelter at the player's end of the lane.

ever their sanctioned competition may take them.

ABC certification requirements concern not only the ball and the tenpins, but such items as length of lane from the foul line to center of the headpin, length of approach, diameter and distances between pin spots, span between the side partitions, gutter width, and a few others. Lanes themselves must be flat and level to within 40/1000ths of an inch.

Ever hear of "Moonlight Bowling?" It's very romantic. They turn off all the lights except for those at the score table and those illuminating the pins. Moonlight bowling is available only during certain hours and/or upon request. Ask your local bowling center about it. It's one of the few romantic things left that's still safe.

CHANGES TODAY IN THE BOWLING WORLD.

In the past ten years, bowling has increased in popularity. While it used to be primarily a male sport, females now account for 48% of the bowlers. Many new bowling centers have sprung up, and they are larger. Automatic scorers have barely scratched the surface of the industry, and there are some who distrust automation and feel better about doing their own scoring.

Northlanes at 8 Mile and Greenfield has facilities for blind people. Strange as it may seem, blind people can bowl. There are guide ropes to help people and leagues for deaf people.

Annual certification (measurement and inspection) of bowling lanes is one of the ways the American Bowling Congress (ABC) assures bowlers of standard playing conditions wher-

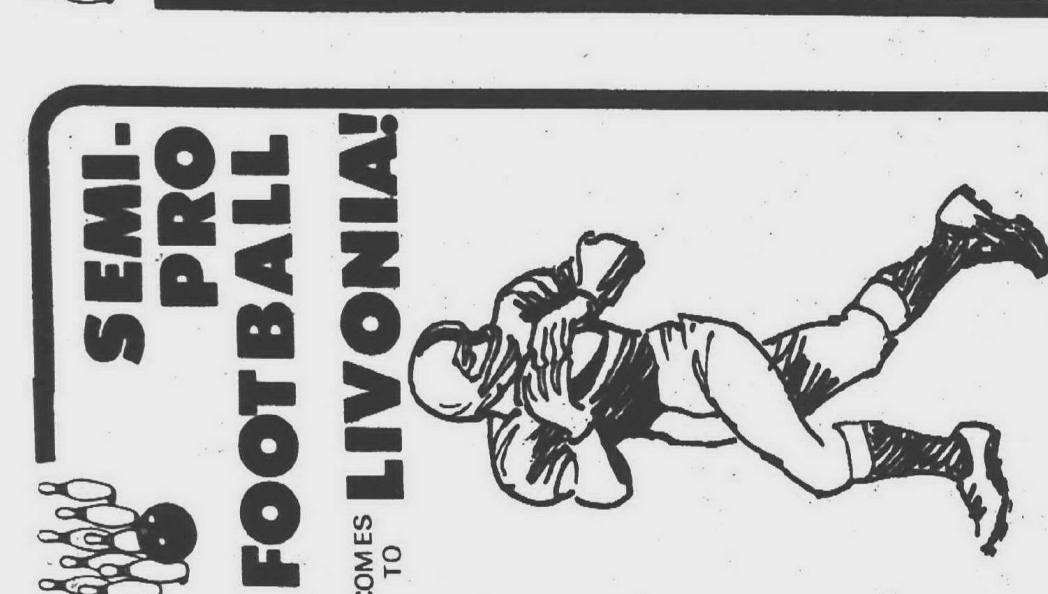

Where do you bowl?

A quick flip through your yellow pages will help you find a nearby place to bowl. A short drive will undoubtedly do likewise, since there are many bowling centers located throughout Observerland. You will note we said "Centers." Nobody calls them "alleys" anymore. Image, you know. Most of the ads say "lanes." places we visited lived up to the clean, modern well-lit image. Many bowling centers have snack bars, restaurants, and/or cocktail lounges for the added enjoyment of their patrons. Nurseries, complete with babysitters are an added bonus at some centers.

Bowling centers are open from early in the morning until about 2:00 a.m. seven days a week during the September to May season. Some even stay open all night. While most of the leagues end by midnight, some centers will arrange to accommodate you and your friends if you wish to form a league from Company X's second shift that happens to get off work at midnight and wishes to bowl then.

Open bowling--when anybody can walk in off the street and bowl--is being crowded out by leagues. To avoid disappointment, be sure and phone your local bowling center and inquire about open bowling before you pop in and learn that there will be an hour and a half wait until there is room for you. Of course, you could spend a pleasant hour and a half at their bar, but then you might not be able to hit the pins.

Prime time for leagues is 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Everybody wants their league to start at 7:00 p.m., it seems. Many centers have limited open

bowling after 9:00 p.m. while leagues continue on other lanes. A sometime bowler will probably find that Saturday night or Sunday is his best bet. Most leagues are scheduled during the week. Daytime leagues are mostly housewives.

HOW DO YOU JOIN A LEAGUE?
It's easy. If you have a group of people you would like to be a part of your league, fine. If not, that's fine too. Just call your local center and tell them you would like to join a league. They will fix you up. You will meet new friends and undoubtedly have a good time. A standard league consists of six teams. Four to five members usually constitute a team, although a single person can be a team in a "singles league."

Prices vary with the season and with the time of day. There are special days and time with lower than usual rates. Prices vary from 50¢ a game to 75¢ a game for open bowling. Some centers with automatic scorers charge 80¢ a game. With automatic scorers, you can't cheat. Lousy math ability won't help a bad toss. Shoe rental will add another 25¢ or so to your bill. There is no charge for the use of a ball. Most league prices include money for prizes to be awarded at the end of the season. Daytime league rates are usually lower than evening league rates, due to demand, or more accurately, less demand. All told, even during the peak season, \$3.00 will probably pay for your evening or afternoon out. And don't forget, the electricity would cost you something if you merely stood at your ironing board all afternoon. Maybe not \$3.00, but wouldn't you rather bowl?

What Equipment Do You Need?

All You Need Is...

All you need is a bowling ball and shoes. Few sports can be enjoyed without some sort of investment in equipment. Bowling is one of them. Balls are available at the centers free of charge, and only a nominal fee is charged for rental of bowling shoes. Once you become a bowling enthusiast, of course, you may well want to purchase your own shoes and ball and, of course, a bag in which to carry your ball. Shoes cost about what any shoes cost. Bowling balls range in price from about \$26 to \$40.



Balls

bowler's hand to allow a comfortable, natural grip if he is to attain even fair success. In the conventional grip, the fingers are inserted in the ball as far as the second joint. The span between the thumb hole and finger holes is as important as the size of the holes, and a properly fitted ball will allow your best game.



Shoes

Bowling shoes are different than ordinary shoes. While some are "universals" with two leather soles, many are made with a leather sole on the left shoe to permit a slide on the last step of the delivery and a rubber sole on the right for braking. The soles are reversed for left handed bowlers. The sales clerk is not being nosy when he

asks you if you are right or left handed. If he doesn't, he is probably selling you universals. Most bowlers wear the same size in a bowling shoe as they do in a street shoe. The new fashionable shoes that look like bowling shoes really aren't. They have like rubber soles and won't do for bowling.

WHAT SHOULD YOU WEAR BESIDES SHOES?

Besides shoes (and stockings, of course, to keep the Department of Health happy if you use rental shoes), you will need additional clothes, but you probably have them in your closet right now. Maybe you even have them on. In choosing clothes for bowling, comfort is the byword. Freedom of motion is important, particularly across the shoulders and under the arms, and of course through the legs. Pants, culottes, pleated skirts, or hot pants, topped with a comfortable shirt or sweater will outfit you in fine condition to enjoy this sport. Some women even wear dresses. Really, unless you have a highly unusual toss, you won't be bending over far enough to lose your modesty. Your choice should be based on what you feel comfortable in.



How to bowl.



The objective of the game is to knock down the pins with the ball. (You probably knew that!) There are many different ways of tossing the ball. Recommended methods depend upon the age and strength of the person, as well as his level of experience. Many bowling centers have certified instructors who will teach you (some are free, some charge) correct form, stance, method of holding, moving, and releasing the ball. "Thumbs Up" is recommended for beginners. A certified instructor is a graduate of a special school sponsored by American Machine and Foundry (AMF), who make most of the bowling equipment. These instructors are not necessarily expert bowlers themselves, but they know how to teach.

A game is divided into ten frames. A frame consists of two chances to knock down all the pins. If you knock down all the pins with the first ball you throw, it is called a strike. The automatic pinsetter clears off all the pins and resets them for the next player. You don't get your second throw (because it's not necessary—they're already all down), but you get ten points plus whatever you knock down with the next two balls you throw. If it takes you two throws, but you get all the pins down with the second throw, it is called a spare, and you get ten points plus whatever you knock down with the next ball you throw (when your turn comes again). If you throw twice and still leave some of the pins standing, the automatic pinsetter thinks that's enough tries, clears the remaining pins off, and resets the pins for the next player. With either a strike or a spare, you cannot total your score for the frame you are playing until you find out what your next one or two balls will hit. Strikes and spares are referred to collectively as "marks" because a strike is signified by an X in the box on the scoresheet, and a spare is signified by half an X in the box. Help with scorekeeping is always available from the management upon request. Since league bowlers know how to score for at least someone on

each team does), the management always has time for you. Scoring is not very difficult anyway, and you will quickly comprehend. Directions are on the back of the bowling sheets given to you when you enter and are assigned a lane.

BOWLING ETIQUETTE

Etiquette consists mainly of good sense and common courtesy. Here are some good rules to follow:

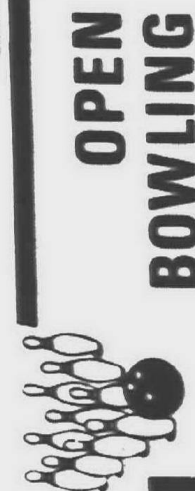
1. Give way to the player on your right. Stay out of his line of vision.
2. Avoid unnecessary delays. Be ready when it is your turn to bowl.
3. Return to the back of the approach after making each delivery.
4. Do not use anyone else's equipment unless invited to do so.
5. When a player is ready to bowl, do not distract him. Good bowling requires concentration.
6. Do not throw your ball until the pinsetting machine has completed its cycle and the sweep bar is raised. Otherwise you may damage the equipment.

muscles—be honest), pat yourself on the back—you're not in such bad shape after all. If you ache all over, you needed the exercise, but should perhaps build up to it gradually.

The psychological benefits of bowling are not to be discounted. Physical activity eases tensions, and just getting out and doing something fun with friends lifts the spirit a couple of notches. Leagues of women bowlers fill the centers during the day. Quite a few centers have baby-sitting services. Many a harried housewife feels the need to get away for a couple of hours a week and relax with her friends while she is getting some exercise. Relief from the boredom of daily life figures strongly into many activities, and a bit of excitement that is not immoral is always welcome.
