





Work also includes joint repair on eastbound Grand River at Appleton St., curb and gutter repair on westbound Grand River east of Shiawassee and east of Seven Mile Rd. and joint repair east of Wormer St.

SC Will Sell **NBD Stock**

The Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees voted last week to sell 120 shares of capital stock in National Bank of Detroit that is currently in the college's building and site

The 120 shares, estimated at \$8,200 in value, was given to the college by Floyd Kehrl of Northville as a gift to pay for the cost of the bells in the college's tower. At that time. the stock was worth \$6,000.

Before the bells were installed, the stock was split and the college acquired additional shares. The college purchased the bells, and the additional stock continued to rise in value.

THAT NOBLE ex officio member of every small town newspaper staff in the land, the club publicity chairman, is about to make his or her annual autumnal reappearance after a summer in drydock, so herewith a bit of free advice.

It will start with morale-boosting assurance that the press agent for any worthy organization, no matter what title the individual is given, is an accepted and valuable part of the journalistic world. This goes right up to the staff that handles press relations at the White House, servicing the best wordsmiths in the profession.

But where the president of the United States, General Motors and every university and every professional enterprise hire men and women already thoroughly trained in the basics, it seems too often that the thousands upon thousands of our little clubs in America hand the publicity assignment to some neophyte totally without qualification.

We're fortunate here in having several exceptions to that, but even they might be aided by a quick refresher course in rights and wrongs.

The whole thing is a service subject so much a part of the nation's club structure that the Sperry and Hutchinson Co. has published a 28-page handbook, a virtual textbook in fact, exclusively for club publicists. We're going to pass on some of its suggestions, urging that they be followed by all who have any reason for newspaper contact.

THIS BOOKLET concludes, "As you turn your records over to your successor, you will know that though outsiders think you've worked magic to do such a fine publicity job, it was simply a matter of knowing the rules and following them."

The rules set forth are good for anyone to know if there is likely to be reason for the suggestion of a story to this or any other newspaper. Let's pinpoint a

"News releases should always be typewritten, double or triple spaced on one side of the paper only. Never send carbon copies. Give full reference data in the upper left hand corner of the first page -- name of organization and your name, address and telephone

"Be accurate: Double check dates, names, places before you submit copy. Never guess on these. Remember that first names are a must -- it's a waste of time (and won't be printed) just to say 'Mr. Jones,' 'Mrs. Jones,' etc.

"Be brief. Forget all about adjectives. Never include a telephone number - but if you are suggesting public contact by telephone, then give the name and address exactly as listed in the telephone directo-

"YOUR CLUB secretary is expected to notify members to pay dues, or to bring a covered dish, or that a baby sitter will watch the members' tots. This is not the newspaper's responsibility. You must learn to recognize and use for publicity only those things that interest others.

"Get your copy in ahead of the deadline. Remember that it probably will be rewritten and condensed, also that the decision of placement of your news - if it is deemed worthy of publication - must be left to the newspaper.

"Don't ever try to write a headline in advance for your information. Never ask when a story will appear, never ask for clippings and never mention raffles or lotteries.

"On the other hand, don't be afraid to suggest something new if you honestly believe you have a workable idea.

"Always give exact time, exact date and exact location (an old journalistic rule that reads 'Time before place and specific time before specific place') such as 'from 2 to 4 p.m. Tuesday, June 10 at the Village Library, 126 Circle Dr.' -

"Five points are important to a good news release: Who, what, when, where and why. If possible a sixth, how, should be included. A simple but carefully prepared fact outline based on those six questions is all the newspaper really asks; the professional then will write the finished copy.

"For the final question, ask yourself: 'If I were not a member of my club, would this news interest me?'

"If the answer is No, tear it up."

Most leases are drawn up with definite rules as to whether or not subleasing is to be allowed. But subleasing, no matter what a nuisance it may seem to some landlords, is a real convenience in commercial leasing. Tasty Tips For School Lunches

By ELLY

It's always fun to see the children going off to school. There's an electric excitement visible as they sparkle with cleanliness and enthusiasm. New shoes, new dress, new socks, new lunchbox.

What goes in the lunchbox is up to you and unfortunately many lunches are as boring to eat as they were to prepare.-

A wide-mouth thermos lends itself to a wide variety of uses and you know what "they" say about variety. Remember to include foods that are easy to eat and carry. Even the addition of a colorful napkin adds to the appeal of a packed lunch.

Lunch should supply about one-third the daily food needs. Don't underestimate the nutritive value of a peanut butter and jelly on whole wheat bread sandwich but here are some ideas to add some excitement to a dreary lunchbox routine.

BUSY DAY SOUP 1 can condensed green pea

1 can condensed tomato soup

212 c. milk

1/2 t. Worcestershire sauce 1/4 t. curry powder

Blend soups together until smooth. Gradually add milk and spices stirring until smooth. Pour lunch portion into preheated vacuum bottle. Cover tightly.

CHICKEN CHEESE SAUCER PIES

Pastry for two crust 9 in. pie 2 c. cooked chicken, diced 1 chicken boullion cube 1/2 c. boiling water

1 4 - ounce can sliced mushrooms

1/a.c. butter 3 T. flour

1/4 t. salt 1/4 t. garlic salt

1/4 t. pepper 1 c. cream

1/2 t. Worcestershire sauce 1/4 c. grated cheddar cheese

Set out four small individual pie pans. Divide pastry into two balls, one ball slightly larger than the other. Roll out larger ball and cut into four 81/2 - inch rounds. Fit into pans. Roll out remaining balls for top crusts and cut into four 61/2 - inch rounds. Wrap in waxed paper and set aside.

Dissolve bouillon cube in boiling water. Set aside to cool. Drain and set aside mushrooms. Heat butter in skillet; add onion and cook until transparent. Blend in a mixture of flour, salts, and pepper. Heat until mixture bubbles. Remove from heat and add gradually while stirring constantly, the chicken broth, cream, and Worcestershire sauce. Return to heat and stir constantly until blended thoroughly. Stir in chicken and mushrooms. Set aside to cool. Place one fourth cooled filling into each pastry shell. Sprinkle the grated cheese over the filling, Put the top crust on. Bake at 450 degrees 15 to 20 minutes, or until pięs are delicately browned. Chill pies before packing in lunch.

These can be made the night before and are just right for big appetites. Cut them into halves for smaller capacities.

DRIED FRUIT Wrap and pack dried apricots, prunes, peaches,

figs, dates and raisins.

PEANUT BUTTER COOKIES 1/2 c. oil 1 c. honey

34 c. peanut butter 2 eggs, beaten 51/2 T. skim milk powder (71/2 instant)

2 t. baking powder 1/2 t. salt

1 t. cinnamon ½ t. mace

1/4 t. cloves

1/2 c. rolled oats

1/2 c. raisins 3/4 c. whole wheat flour In a large bowl with an

electric mixer blend oil and

honey several minutes until they get creamy and light. Add the peanut butter and continue beating until the mixture is blended. Beat in eggs, milk powder, salt and spices. At this point the batter will be very thick and gluey, so do the rest of the mixing with a wooden spoon. Stir in the oats, raisin, and whole wheat flour making sure everything is well blended. Drop by teaspoons on an unoiled cookie sheet. Bake at 325 degrees for 10 to /12 minutes. Makes about 30 cookies.

At last week's Republican national convention, President Nixon said his administration intended to lower property taxes to reduce the local taxpayer's crushing burden. This week, Senator McGovern is supposed to release his new version of a plan which will guarantee income to the poor and reduce property taxes.

It's clear that the national candidates know darn well that The taxpayer revolt we have seen zso much in this area is a serious -matter nationally.

But it's equally clear that despite pious claims of goodintention to do something for the Jaxpayers in Michigan, very little OBSERVATION POINT

What's This? Rate Goes Down But Tax Bills Are Up?

has been accomplished here since Gov. Milliken said that tax reform and financing for schools was his number one priority two years ago.

The legislature has wrangled over tax relief since then, with Democrats insisting on a graduated income tax as a substitute for the property levy and Republicans in the state senate remaining adamant against it.

On the ballot this November will be a referendum setting a limit on property taxes and making up the difference by flat rate income tax.

So far so good, except that the local property taxpayer has taken it in the chin for these last two years, and if the referendum fails, he'll continue to do so.

BEST EXAMPLE of the problem emerged last week in Livonia, where residents of the school district were informed that although their property tax rate will be lower this year, their total tax bill will be higher.

How does this happen?

Through a change in the state equalization factor -- a change which was not voted on by the taxpayers!

In Livonia, for instance, the equalization factor was increased from 1.79 to 1.89 this year. This means that assessments levied on homes in Livonia must be multiplied by 1.89 to get the equalized valuation, which is the amount on which property taxes are levied.

A home that had an equalized value of \$15,000 last year paid \$531 in school taxes. With the equalization factor increased by 5.5 per cent, this year's equalized value will be \$15,825.

Even though this year's millage rate was reduced about eighttenths of a mill to 34.62 applying this lowered rate to an increased equalized value means that the owner of the home will be paying \$547 in school taxes -- a \$16

THIS TAX increase was not voted on by local taxpayers. It can take place in exactly the same

way as in Livonia in any suburban community in this area.

What this juggling of our property tax really works out to is taxation without representation! Keeping in mind just how big a furor this principle caused about 200 years ago, it's not surprising that taxpayers are in revolt now over the same thing.

The referendum on this fall's ballot may not be the best solu? tion, but if you see your tax bill taking an unexpected jump, you might want to look very carefully at the proposal. At least it enables the voters to choose their tax level in a more direct way than fiddling with the state equalization factor.

Will High Court Reverse Itself?

Last week I raised some questions about the State Supreme Court's recent ruling prohibiting probate (juvenile) court judges from allowing some 15 to 17-yearolds to be tried as adults in criminal cases.

At/that time I suggested the Governor's Special Commission on the Age of Majority be reconvened in order to grapple directly with the problem of how old a person should be to stand trial as an adult for his crimes.

TWO THINGS have happened since then.

One is that the Supreme Court has granted a re-hearing at the request of outraged probate judges. There is no guarantee that the high court will reverse itself, but there is at least a chance.

The other is that the Republiran state convention last weekend nominated Mary Coleman for a vacancy on the State Supreme Court. Mrs. Coleman is a probate Judge from Calhoun County (Battle Creek). She is the only Jemale and the only nominee with probate bench experience in The huge field.

It's not my purpose to endorse anyone but to report some of Judge Coleman's thoughts on the high court deci-

"THERE WAS NO precedent no reasoning in the Supreme Court's decision to overturn the existing law," she argued. "Other states have the same wording in their laws, and it has been upheld in the courts."

There are "factors" which a probate judge must weigh, she said, before deciding to waive jurisdiction over a juvenile and sending him to circuit court for trial.

"One is the seriousness of the crime - a vicious crime.

"Second, he must be age 15.

"There must have been a pattern of bad behavior on his

"The juvenile court facilities may be inadequate." By court facilities, she meant not just the courtroom but also the detention home or training school. If these are inadequate to hold a particularly tough customer, the judge can send the accused over to circuit court.

Finally, she pointed out, a subject can't be sent to a juvenile home once he has reached age 171/2. So the probate judge must decide another method for handling the 17 1/2-year-old or shift him to circuit court where, if convicted, he could get a prison

"We have court rules. I helped write those rules," Judge Coleman said.

IN THE CURRENT Supreme Court case, she said, a 17-year-old was sentenced by the Washtenaw circuit court to prison after a second felony. His attorney wanted to withdraw from the case, but the Supreme Court refused to let him.

If on re-hearing the case the Supreme Court lets its decision

hundred young men convicted of vicious crimes will be spring from prison. Some would go free; others would spend a few months in a juvenile home, there to teach . tenderer minds Lord-knows-

The problem of crimes committed by young people is

immense. One set of figures I recall says half the nation's serious crimes are committed by persons age 18 and under. No cheap cries of "compassion" or "law-n-order" will solve anything.

We haven't heard the last of this problem.

The Detroit public schools' desegregation case has done little for the suburbs besides financially benefiting job printers turning out anti-busing window signs.

The case and Federal Judge Stephen Roth have resulted in a deep bond of unity and common purpose for the suburban school

WHEN AND if the Detroit desegregation case is resolved one way or another, the suburban sense of unity will probably remain.

On the other side of the coin, it's too bad that suburban city halls - whose mayors and counterparts in township halls need organizational unity more than the school officials - have failed to do the same thing.

The cities and townships get some help from Lansing but not nearly as much as school boards.

been ratified in many school systems and in others teachers have agreed to start classes while negotiations continue, there appears little likelihood of the strikes that have hit several districts in the past few years.

In other words, classes will begin as scheduled and the teaching staffs have agreed to go to work . . . and that's good news to parents and students alike.

There isn't any single factor that disturbs a community more than to have youngsters sitting around the house for periods ranging from as many as two months while negotiators for the teachers and school board argue over money matters.

WE WELL REMEMBER the Plymouth strike of two years ago

sharply split over the merits of the strike.

We well remember when an Ann Arbor judge finally got the two groups together by simply. making it known that the negotiations would continue without a break until an agreement was reached.

With that kind of an ultimatum, the negotiating teams sat down, went over all facets of the disagreements and did come up with a solution that could be accepted by both sides.

That was all fine and good for the teachers, the school board and the administration, but there was still a bad taste in the mouths of parents who saw their youngsters starting classes a month later than surrounding districts.

It meant curtailed vacation

periods, it meant classes extending an extra week in June, and it really put a lot of parents to unnecessary nuisances.

Actually, there always a feeling that the teachers didn't think they had gained that much by walking the bricks although they had won points on the basis of principle.

THAT'S WHY IT is so gratifying to learn that Plymouth teachers agreed to start classes while the negotiating team continues discussions with the school board - administration team over money matters.

The situation isn't settled, but at least the air has been cleared, and parents don't have to worry about their youngsters going back to school on schedule.

We feel sure the groups will be able to resolve the financial positions in the near future. But we certainly feel the teachers acted wisely in voting as they did.

Their vote did include a protision that the negotiators can call a strike if an absolute impasse is reached . . . it is to be hoped that time never comes.

The touchy situation in Redford Township at both the Redford Union and Salth Redford schools has been resolved, and now it appears all districts in Observerland will have peace for at least another

school year. And that's one of the happings thoughts of the day. Kids in .. school, parents breathing a sigh of relief - and we believe the teachers have that same feeling

Tri-County Citizens has made a substantial contribution with its legal position of equity and its limits, its disserninating of information, cooling of emotionalism, and its proper legal procedure in court. They were the only ones who had filed to finalize J udge Roth's orders so that points'of law corıld be appealed. Y ou do remember when ever yone else had to return from Cincinnati to do that.



Area gardeners continue to be surprised by the plant food on the surface of the results of their efforts.

Tallest tomato plant we've heard of is a 91/2-foot Big Boy that has reached the eaves of the garage at the home of Robert Fennell, 8925 Hubbard, Livonia.

Fennell started the plant from seed indoors this spring. He has a sunny doorwall that is ideal for methods of application. For getting the plants off to a good start indoors.

The grant will provide for three more probation officers. They will help prepare presentence reports; supervise misdemeanant offenders; and recruit, train and supervise volunteer probation counselors.

A \$28,775 grant to Madonna College will allow continuation of recruitment and training of 200 volunteer probation counselors for courts in the Wayne County area.

During the first year, 206 volunteers were trained at Madonna College and placed in 12 courts. Volunteers, directed by professional probation officers, work with probationers on a one-to-one
