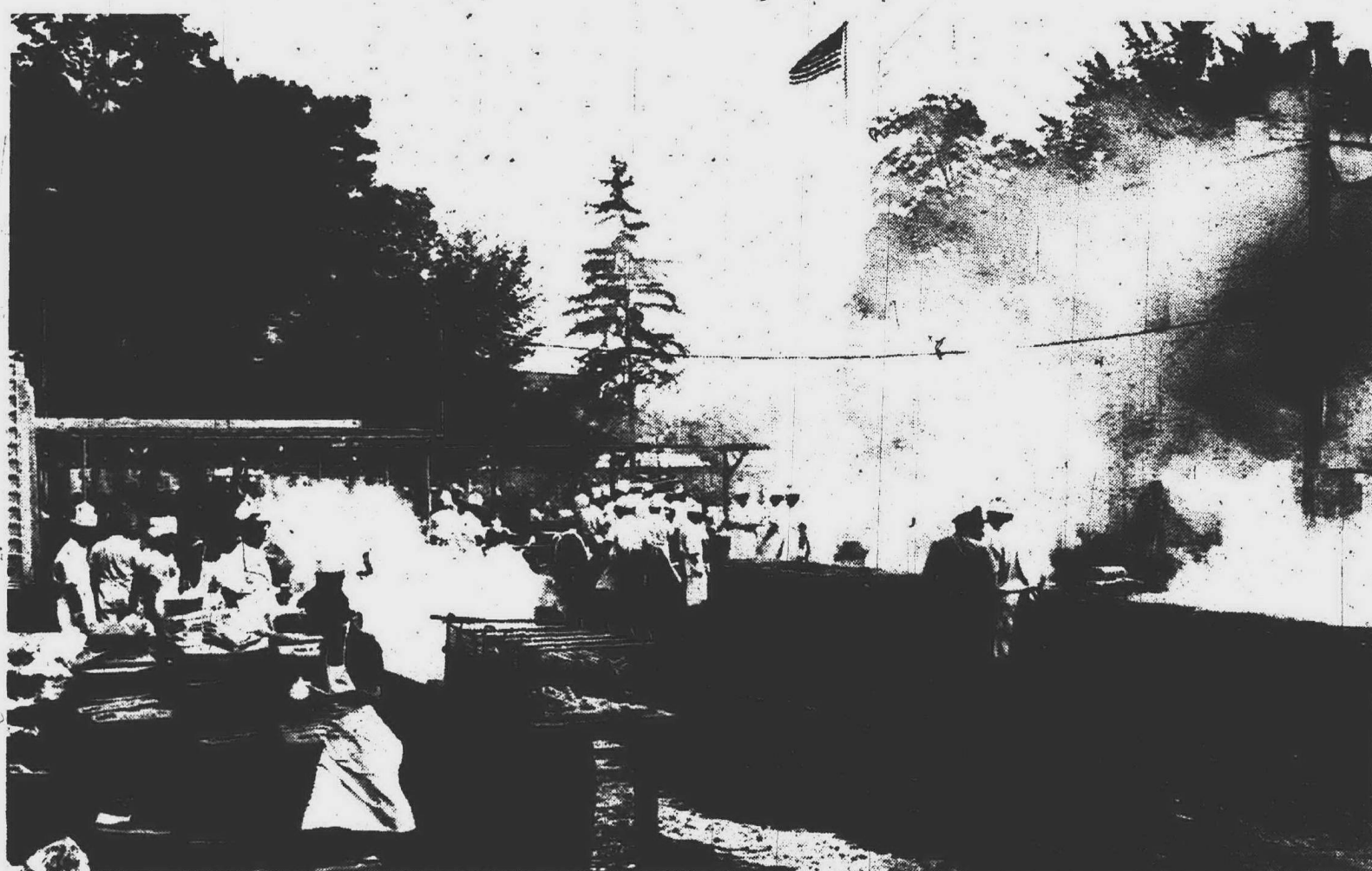

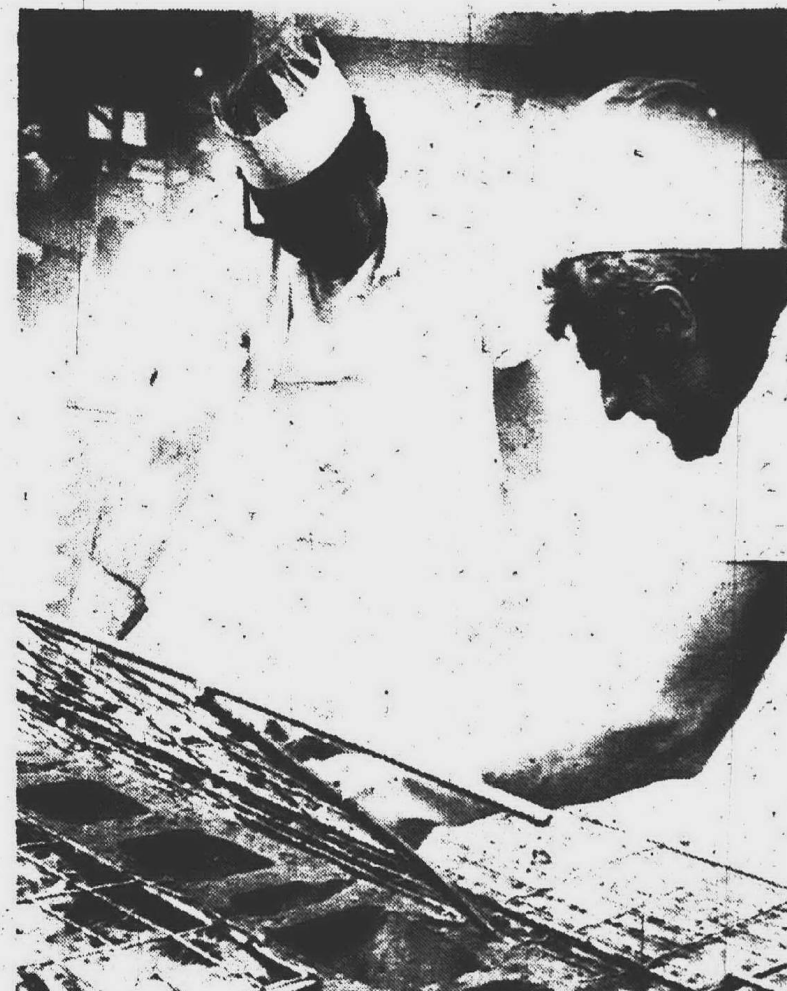

14,000 Expected To Enjoy Festival Barbecue Sunday

Plymouth's 17th annual Fall Festival, easily the biggest and most elaborately staged since the fete was originated, comes to a climax Sunday when the highlight will be Michigan's largest cookout.

Ideal weather has been promised as Rotary Club members prepare to serve 14,000 barbecued chicken and sweet corn dinners between noon and 6 p.m. in Kellogg Park.

From early in the morning, dozens of the club's civic and business leaders will be manning the barbecue pits between the Penn Theater and Masonic Temple, with barely time to think what a far cry the 1972 renewal is from the event that started the festival back in 1956.

That, too, was a Rotary barbecue on a Sunday afternoon and was attended by 125 members and their families. This weekend, as thousands upon thousands swarm into the festival area from the park to Central School, it is to enjoy the attractions sponsored by more than two score organizations.

THE CARNIVAL spirit will be in full sway all of today (Saturday) and this evening as entertainment at the bandshell continues until 9:30 p.m.

Kiwanians are serving pancake dinners until 7 tonight at the Masonic Temple, and the Jaycees will put on their annual roast beef barbecue beginning at 6 p.m. at the park.

Sunday, with Nat Sibbold of WWJ serving as master of ceremonies, the schedule of free entertainment will get under way at 1 p.m. with a performance by the Interludes.

The Pasadena-bound Plymouth High School band will be on stage under the baton of James Griffith from 2 to 3 p.m., and the Livonia Civic Chorus then will present vocal entertainment for the following hour. The Purple Gang and the Plymouth Community Band are booked to appear at 4 and 5:15 p.m. respectively.

Another Sunday feature awaited by many will be the "Turn of the Century Costume Parade and Fashion Show" to be held at the bandshell between 4:45 and 5:15 under sponsorship of the Plymouth branch of the American Association of University Women.

Prize money and ribbons will be awarded in four costume categories, and those wishing to participate are asked to be at the bandshell at 3 p.m. for judging.

The categories include authentic children's costumes, those depicting a shopkeeper's trade or a profession, original costumes and antique outfits of the same era.

ALTHOUGH EVERYTHING from cotton candy to a dunk tank will be found in the booths along Main Street, festival events are not confined solely to that area.

In the gymnasium of Central School at Church and Main, the works of more than 50 amateur and professional artists and craftsmen are on display in the second annual Arts and Crafts Show of the Plymouth Community Arts Council.

The show will be open until 9 p.m. today, as well as from 1 to 6 p.m. Sunday, and also will include a special display of children's art.

The Antique Mart again is housed in two buildings, the Grange Hall and Community Building, both on Union Street, and 21 antique dealers from throughout Michigan and Ohio have their wares on display.

Carrying out the nostalgic theme of the antique mart is the Grange's annual sale of "homemade goodies like grandma used to bake." Old and new fashioned appetites will have the opportunity to sample homemade pies, cookies, sandwiches and salads at the Grange snackshop.

Youth Inc. at 271 S. Main and Our House, operated by the Council for Community Concerns at Harvey and Fralick, both are holding open house throughout the festival.

There also will be two "Sunday only" attractions with wide appeal. One will be the antique automobile display on Main, while the other will be the tent in the park displaying farm produce.

Prizes totaling nearly \$500 are at stake in the produce competition, and all who wish to participate are to have their entries at the tent by 1 p.m. Sunday. Judging will be under direction of Robert Bake.

Hardship Cases Get A Break

The Plymouth School District cafeteria system has announced conditions of a free and reduced price meal policy for children whose families are unable to pay the full rate for lunches of 40 cents in elementary schools and 45 cents in secondary schools.

A scale pertaining to family size and income has been adopted to determine eligibility. This information is available at the principal's office of each school.

Families falling within the scale, or those suffering from unusual circumstances or hardships, are urged to apply for free or reduced price meals for their children. Application forms also are available from each principal and may be submitted any time during the school year.

The form itself is simple to complete and requests information needed to determine economic need based on the income and number of

persons in the family, number of children attending school or preschool, and any unusual circumstances or hardships.

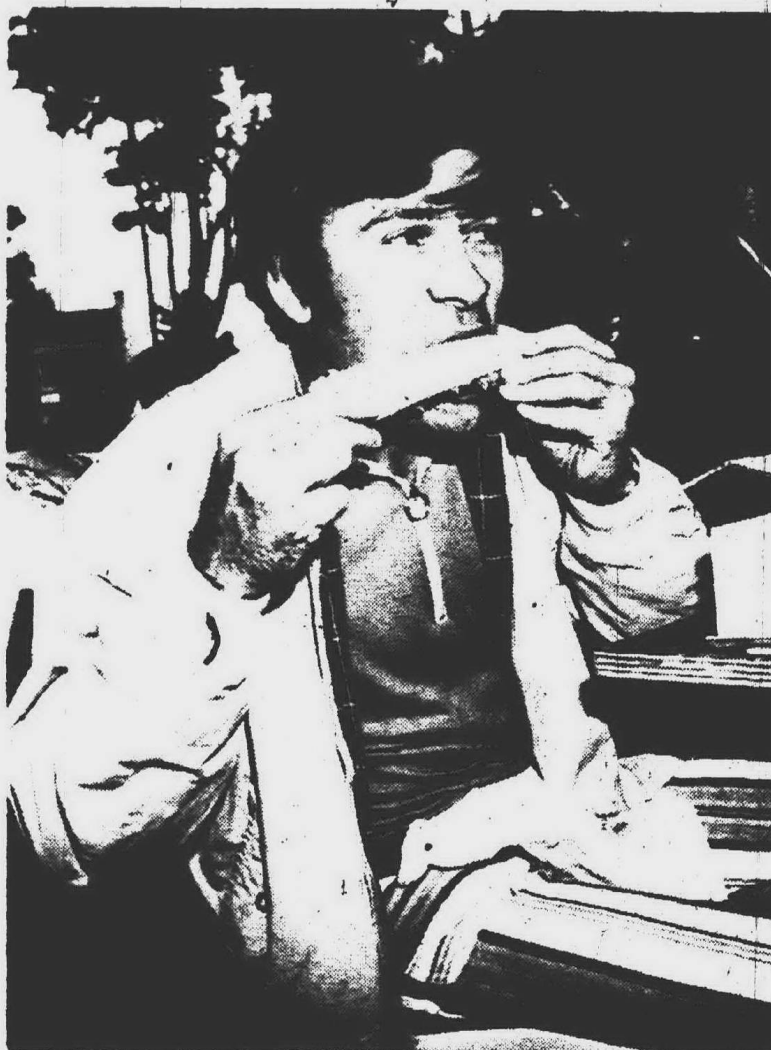
INFORMATION provided on the application will be confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility.

In order to safeguard their identity, children receiving free or reduced price meals will be treated in the same

manner as full paying students.

Under provisions of the policy, the school district nurse and the principal of the school the student attends will review applications and determine eligibility.

For free meals, the family income scale ranges from \$2,450 or less at the first rung up to \$9,700 for a family of 12. Maximum on the scale for reduced price meals is \$10,960, also for a family of 12.

The Stroller... 'Rescue The Rouge' Deserves Full Support

Rescue The Rouge! This annual chant again is filling the air as the Jaycees and their volunteer helpers throughout Observerland prepare to rid the stream of the debris and the many other things that clutter what easily could be one of the real picturesque streams in the state. It is a big job, and the Jaycees are to be commended for their enthusiastic approach to a problem that should be the concern of everyone who is interested in the beauty of his environment.

But the time has come—in fact, it has been with us for a long time—when the Jaycees need help and they should not be the lone voice crying out: "Rescue The Rouge." It is about time that the powers that be take notice and rise up in holy horror that present conditions are allowed to exist.

From the City of Southfield, through Redford Township, Livonia, Farmington, Garden City, Westland, Plymouth, Plymouth Township, and Northville, the cry is the same—"Rescue The Rouge." Yet the officials in these areas, to date, have done little more than offer lip service to

the Jaycees in the battle against debris.

FOR YEARS The Stroller has been urging that something be done. And while some folks are inclined to scoff at the pictures that have been painted—if the Rouge was cleaned, the fact remains that an opportunity to provide a real asset to the community and pleasure to countless thousands of neighbors in the area is being passed.

City and township officials, so it seems, are willing to "let

George do it" and while they attempt to encourage the Jaycees they offer little in the way of real effort to get the job done.

Some time ago The Stroller, in company with Sen. Carl Pursell and several members of the Wayne County Health Department, surveyed the Middle Rouge from its beginnings at Walled Lake. And what we saw was terrifying.

Even at its source, the Middle Rouge is a horrible sight. Flowing out of Walled

Lake through a metallic conduit, it travels along what appeared to be a swamp for more than a quarter of a mile, and its path was strewn with tin cans, cardboard boxes and all manner of debris.

As it moved along, conditions seemed to get worse, and when it entered into the otherwise beautiful setting of Hines Parkway, it still was something that was rather sickening.

WHY THESE conditions should be allowed to exist no one knows. But they do. And

the powers that be turn their collective backs and answer, "We haven't any funds" when asked about the seeming lethargy.

Several times local communities, through the work of private citizens, have become interested to the point of planning such things as a fountain in the middle of Wilcox Lake, along with paddleboats for the youngsters and fishing for the older citizens. But the idea was looked at—and just about forgotten.

Over in Livonia a year ago, there was some hint that a campaign was under way to obtain a replica of the old Mississippi River boats for Newburgh Lake. It was a grand idea and would have given the youth of today an inkling of what life was like in the past when the riverboats on the Ohio and Mississippi were an integral part of life in mid-America.

Each time, though, the idea sank back into limbo for lack of enthusiasm on the part of the powers that be.

Meanwhile, many attempts to increase the tax millage to provide additional parks have been turned down by the taxpayers.

Perhaps they feel, much like The Stroller, that the rescuing of the Rouge and all its branches would provide a source of real entertainment and enjoyment for countless thousands.

A clean Rouge River, and all its branches, would be a jewel in this part of the country.

Sure, it might have to be dredged and deepened in some areas and some of the curves taken out of it in others.

But let's do it now. It would be money well spent and there is better than an even chance that federal funding would be

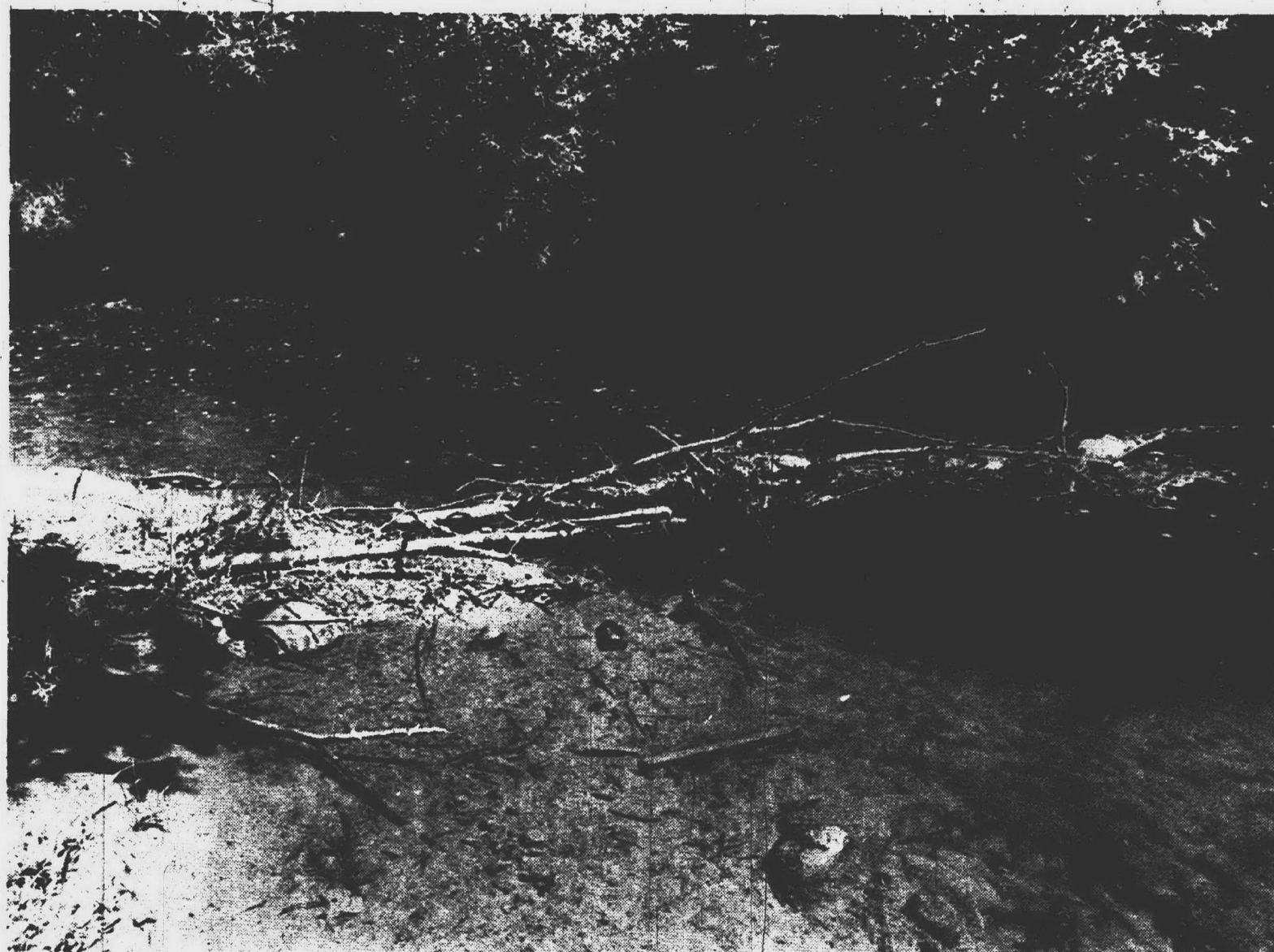
available—if the proper approach were made. Yes, let's rescue the Rouge NOW.

New Books In Library

"What Do You Say After You Say Hello?" by Eric Berne. Many readers were introduced to transactional analysis in "Games People

Play." In this sequel, Dr. Berne's method for understanding and analyzing human behavior is given final shape with the same down-to-earth wit which made "Games" such popular reading. Dr. Berne believes that each person—under the influence of his parents—writes in early childhood his own script for life. He demonstrates how each life script gets written, how it works, and how each of us can break free of it to help us attain fulfillment.

"How To Buy At Auction," by Michael DeForrest. Coming at a time when auction buying is enjoying a great popularity, the author begins by telling what things you can buy at auction and how to find good auctions. He discusses how to "preview," inspect and evaluate merchandise, and brings you to the "moment of truth" when the bidding begins.

"Needleweaving," by

Esther Warner Dendel. Introduces a new kind of pick-up needlework. The traditional loom has been supplanted by a simple piece of cardboard and a curved needle. Illustrated instructions and design suggestions are included.

"The Foxfire Book," by Eliot Wigginton. After six weeks of teaching, the author declares in the book's introduction, "I surveyed the wreckage....The next day I walked into class and said, 'How would you like to throw away the text and start a magazine?' And that's how 'Foxfire' began." He concluded the introduction by saying, "If this book is worth anything at all, it's because every piece of it was put together and handled and squeezed and shaped and touched by teenagers." And what is the subject-matter of "Foxfire"? Hog dressing; log

cabin building; mountain crafts and foods; planting by signs; snake lore, hunting tales, faith healing; moon-shining; and other affairs of plain living.

"I Came As A Thief" by Louis Auchincloss. A story of guilt and expiation, exploring what happens to the inner experience as well as the surface relationships of supposedly sophisticated and intelligent people, when the agony of temptation, not resisted, makes its way into the center of their lives.

"On the Night of the Seventh Moon," by Victoria Holt. After 10 successive best sellers, this popular author has yet another novel of adventure, suspense and romance. Helena Trant meets no end of dangers after she visits the land of her mother's birth and is almost seduced by a dashing young hunter.

THROUGH BIFOCALS

ALL SEVEN members of our board of education, augmented by top administrators, sat down for several hours Wednesday night with the four key officials of the Plymouth teachers' union and tried to find a mental common denominator that would crack the current bargaining impasse. They did not succeed.

You must understand that such sessions as these are conducted in utter sincerity from both sides. There is no name-calling, no foul expletives, no temperamental tirades.

You would expect no less from George Lawton, Marda Benson, Gary Mirto, John Graves, Fred Penar, Carl Berry, John Ohno, Mike Hoben, Earl Hogan, Mel Blunk, Norm Kee and Earl Gibson on the one hand, or from Ray Homer, Bill Heath, John Ryder and Dolly Carter on the other.

However, after having the opportunity to sit as an observer to such a discussion, one couldn't help but feel perplexed because the standoff seems to center more on a contrast in theory, a philosophy if you will, than on a hard core and identifiable merit issue.

HOMER IS THE chief negotiator for the PEA, and early in the evening he made it plain that "the whole thrust of our argument is that the board has given other matters higher priorities than teachers' salaries."

Ray had claimed in a private conversation earlier that he would show by a budget analysis exactly where the school board could come up with the extra money teachers are demanding — all \$200,000-plus of it. But he didn't do it.

What he did emphasize time and again was that what he called "the teachers' historic share of the budget" has been reduced by about four per cent in the offer now on the table. "This is a fantastic amount to drop," he commented.

He conceded that the minimum and maximum proposals are acceptable, stating that the PEA's concern is with the wage propositions at the middle rungs. "We're down four per cent, but the money did go somewhere," he pounded home. "The question is whether the board has fixed its priorities properly."

HIS ADVERSARIES find it hard to argue on that plateau, for indeed any budget is by logic a summary of priorities. How can you or I say that the \$2,982,788 budgeted for regular teachers' salaries for 1972-'73 is too low or too high as a package percentage?

Or, if we are to increase the package by a lump

sum of better than \$200,000, should we steal nickels and dimes from the rest of the priorities or just eliminate some phase of education in its entirety?

Lawton, who is the school board president, commented, "There isn't a community in the state facing the growth problem we have. We have to bargain on conditions that exist in Plymouth, not Livonia, Ann Arbor or other cities. My concern is the future of our teachers. We have to work together to get over this crush of growth, and you (the teachers) have to share these problems with us."

When it was all over, the bargaining teams agreed to meet again Friday afternoon, and in the meantime teachers are going along on their 1971-72 scale of wages and fringe benefits on a day to day basis. No deadline has yet been set for anything as drastic as a strike, but somewhere there must be a meeting of the minds.

Roberts Offers No-Fault Plan

PLYMOUTH State no-fault auto legislation for immediate personal injury payment is needed in Michigan, according to Richard A. Roberts, manager of the Automobile Club of Michigan's Plymouth office.

But provision should be made for transferring both personal injury and property damage costs to the at-fault driver, he says.

Auto Club supports legislation allowing immediate payment of medical expenses and lost wages without lawsuit but still permitting suits where medical costs are above \$1,000, Roberts said. But the club is concerned,

Roberts added, because some of the bills in the Legislature fail to allow transferring losses to the at-fault driver while other bills include property damage as part of the no-fault concept.

Transferring accident costs to the insurance company of the driver at fault allows the good driver to enjoy lower rates, Robert said, while the accident-causing driver pays higher rates.

Moreover, extending the no-fault concept to property damage could result in a motorist paying all deductible insurance costs — usually \$100 — from his own pocket, even if he is blameless in an accident, Roberts concluded.

'Family' Congregation Marks Its Fifth Year

"And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the spirit, which is the word of God."

Those words, written by the apostle Paul to the church at Ephesus, offered a name and central theme to a new Livonia church five years ago.

And Sword of the Spirit Lutheran Church, believed to be the only one in the country with that colorful name, is keeping its individuality by completing the first five years of its ministry as a "family of families."

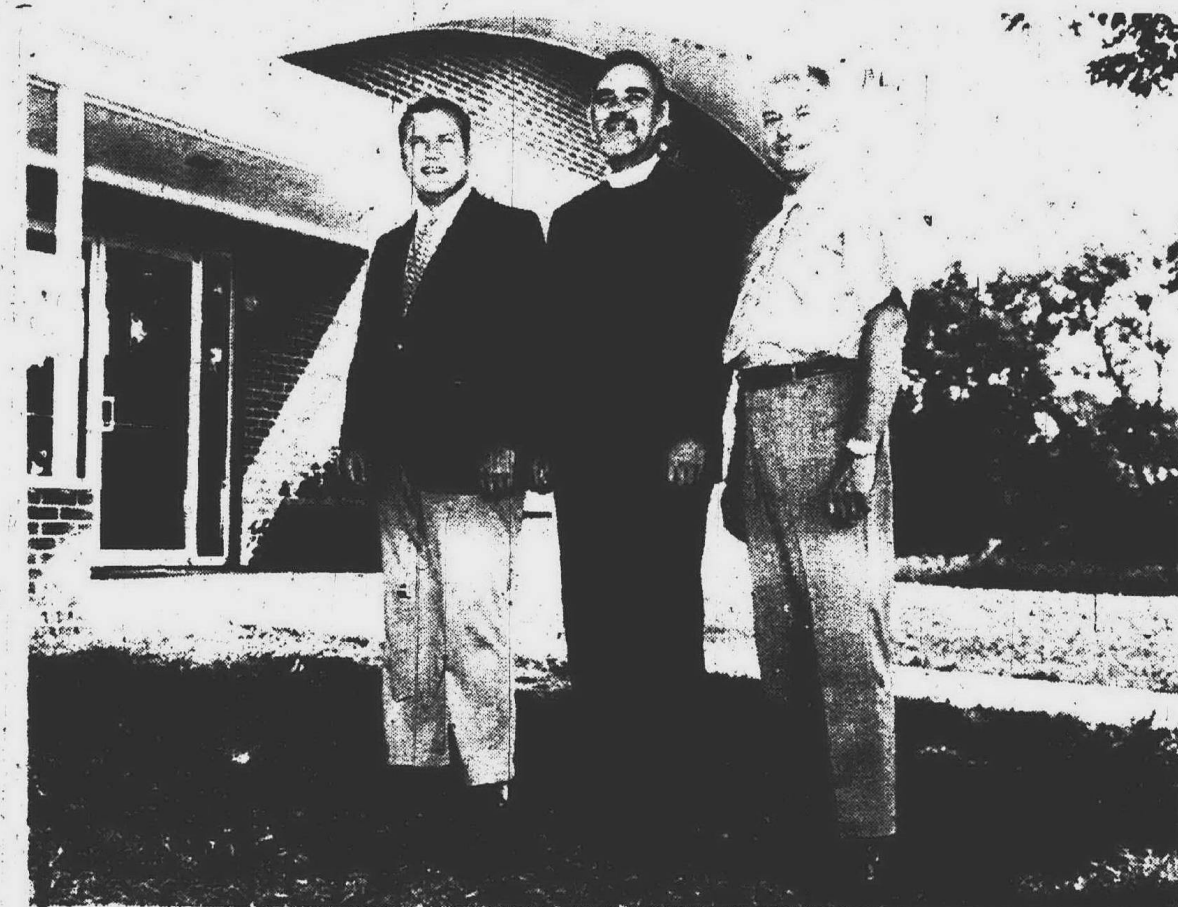
IT WAS on Sept. 10, 1967, the congregation located at 34563 West Seven Mile, held its first service. Then, as now, the emphasis was on families worshipping together.

The Rev. William D. Wolfe and his clan of four had arrived in Livonia early in the summer at the request of the division of American Missions of the American Lutheran Church.

Coming from a large, 75-year-old congregation in Pittsburgh, Pastor Wolfe set about leading development of a different sort of spirit for Sword of the Spirit.

FROM THE BEGINNING, families were encouraged to worship and study together, and soon families were coming together to the communion rail.

Now children of any age are welcome to receive com-

munion if they have been baptized and if their parents have prepared them for the sacrament.

Two summers ago, the church devoted 13 Sundays to a family celebration emphasis following family worship services.

Many family fellowship opportunities are presented as part of the regular program, the most recent a family beef and corn roast on the spacious church grounds two weeks ago.

And for the last four years the church has sponsored a three-day family weekend at Tecumseh Woods, a church camp 60 miles west of Livonia. About 15 families attend.

"And we're in no hurry for pew," the pastor said. "The folding chairs are fine and give us great flexibility of use."

EACH WORSHIP service at Sword of the Spirit sees one to three laymen or laywomen assisting the pastor, and contemporary communion services are held every two months.

But the emphasis has remained through five years one of family — with those in the church sharing with each other the joys, frustrations, disappointments and celebrations of life.

In November, the church will celebrate formally the fifth anniversary of its organization, installation of Pastor Wolfe and the first Church Council, and adoption of a church constitution.

ANOTHER STRONG emphasis for Sword of the Spirit has been one of benevolence, giving of offerings beyond local operating and debt reduction expenses.

From the start, when the weekly offering plates held about \$50 or \$75, the church made it a practice to send 10 per cent to benevolence work. Today the church, although one of the newer congregations in the American Lutheran Church, regularly earmarks 17 per cent of its offerings for the benevolence work of the synod. Offerings last year averaged over \$450 a week.

"WE REALIZE our style of ministry is not for everyone," Pastor Wolfe said. "Many people prefer the anonymity and comfort of a large congregation, and we freely suggest to them one of the other nine Lutheran congregations in Livonia if that is what they want."

"We are not competing with each other as Christian congregations, but we do feel that we offer something a little different."

Sword of the Spirit built its modest chapel and educational wing for less than \$100,000.

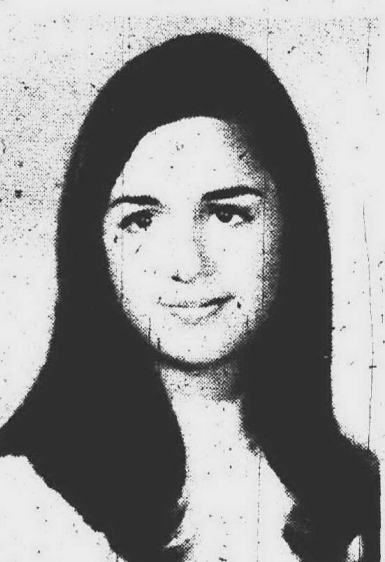

Miles is a transfer student from Ecorse High, standing 6-0 and weighing 185 pounds. The senior split end all but earned the starting assignment in the Blue Jay attack.

Ferndale will be the team to catch this season in the South-eastern Michigan Conference.

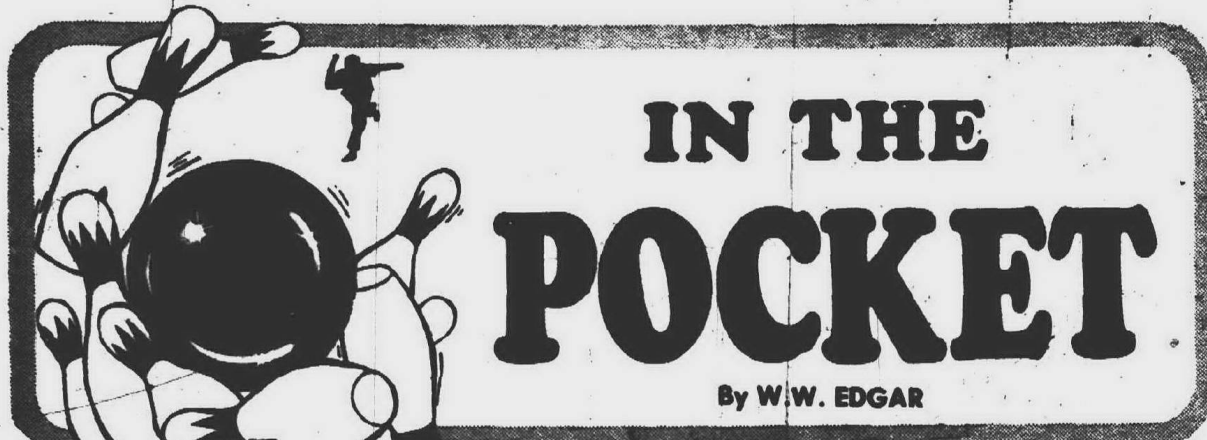
"If we could upset Kimball or Ferndale, we could have a shot at the title," said Bryant. "Anything more than one loss will eliminate a team from the running."

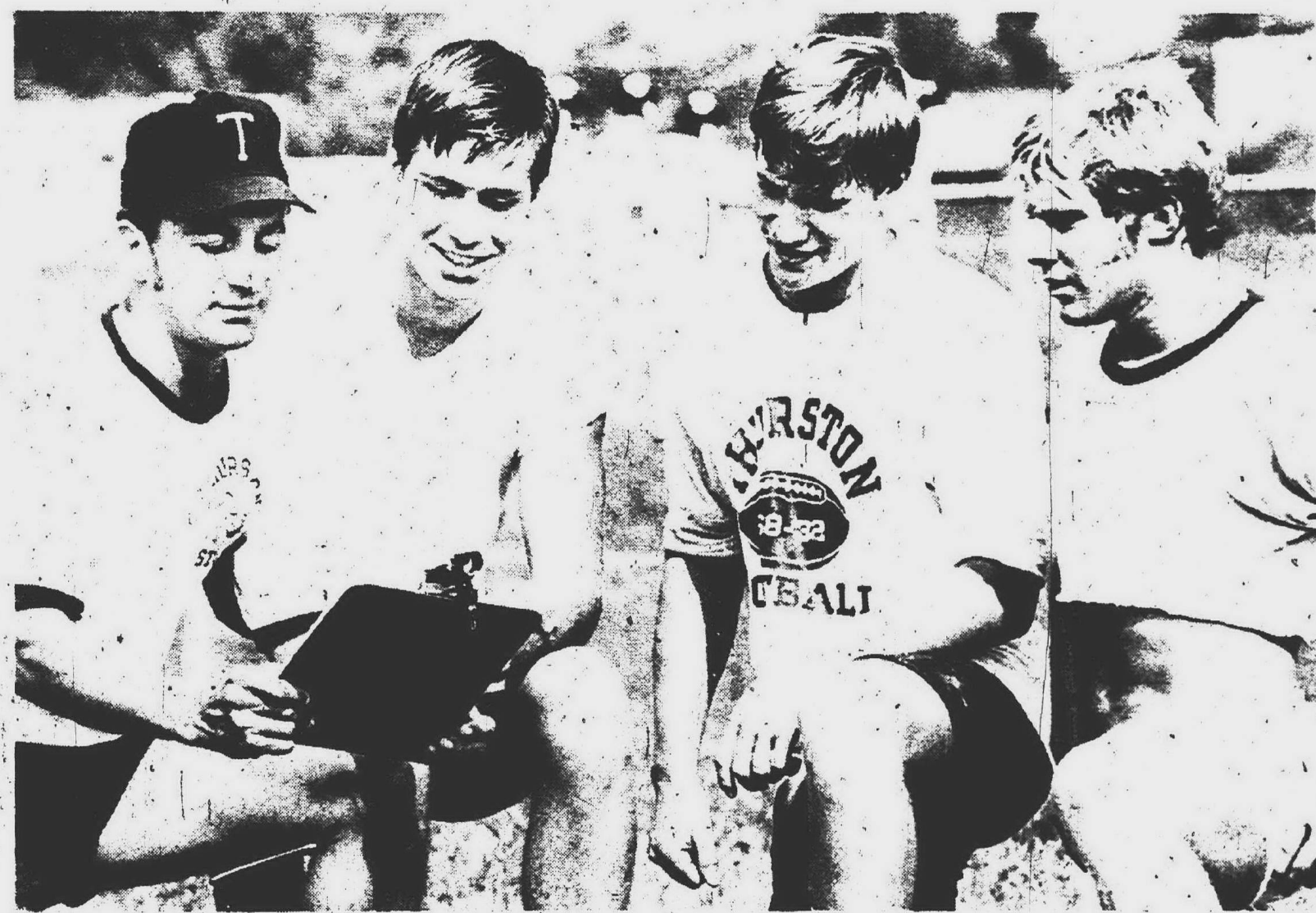

Registration for this and other art classes at the BAA are now under way.

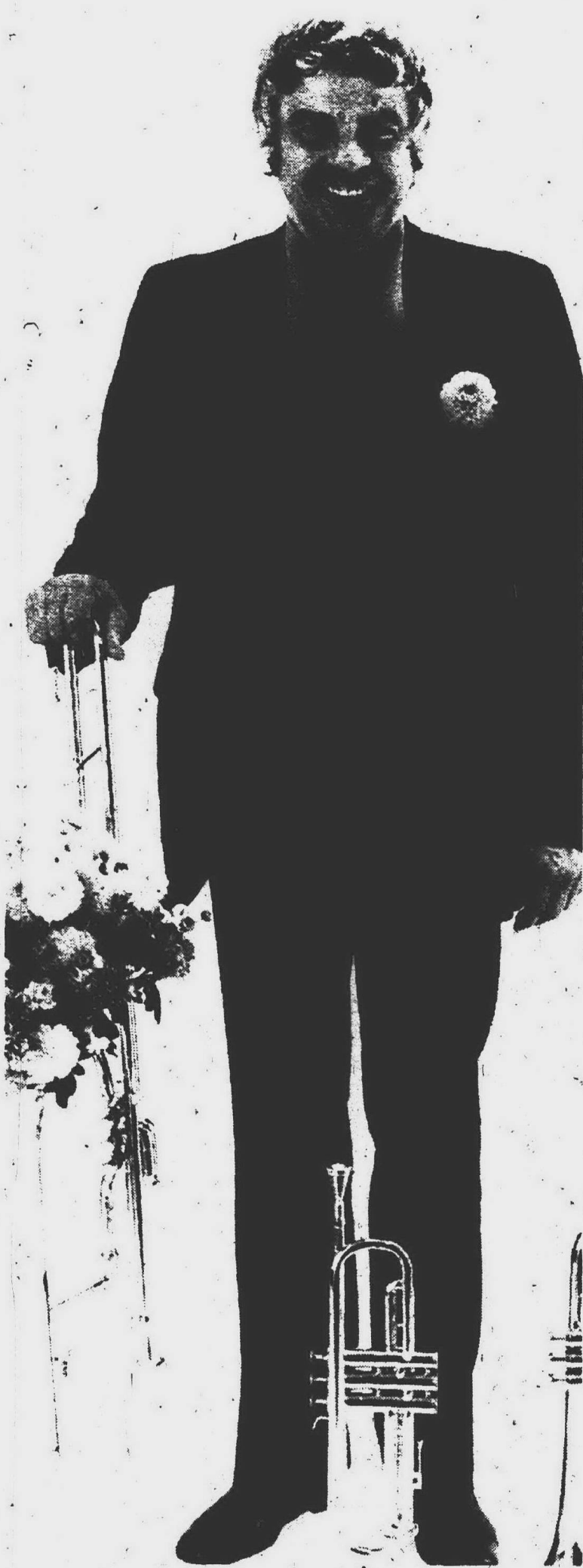
The course is geared to the adult audience but the lectures will also appeal to teenagers and those who are new to the history of art.

Turf Tips, Quips

It sounds unbelievable but one picks up rumors that the \$100,000 added Michigan Mile and an eighth scheduled for next Saturday at the Detroit Race Course may be split into two divisions.

What makes it sound so impossible is that one can't recall when a stake of that stature has had to be divided. The total entries may reach as many as 16 to 20.

Director of Racing Norris Gwin isn't saying a thing but we hear he has contacted many of the top stables that have nominated horses about the possibility of competing in two divisions of more than \$70,000 each — strange enough our information is that all have agreed to enter.

So Michigan's richest stake and one of the few in the land with more than \$100,000 up for grabs may become one of the richest in the nation this year. It will be recalled that last year's renewal went for more than \$136,000 for a single race.

Gwin was aware that he might have to split the stake when he received the largest

number of nominations in years. What is surprising is that as many as 20 owners will have horses here.

And that should make next Saturday's program the best ever presented at a Detroit area oval. Just imagine, two races with purses of more than \$70,000 filled with many of the best thoroughbreds in North America.

Racing fans, who had hoped to see the fabled Michigan-owned Governor Max go against the best, won't have that chance this year.

THE SPEEDY three-year-old, who has been ailing most of the year, came out of his only DRC start lame and has been shipped back to the Florida farm for rest and freshening up.

It is doubtful that Governor Max will start again this year. In his DRC debut, the colt raced with the leaders for three parts of the race and then faded to fifth in the drive to the wire.

His owners and trainers knew that he wasn't right and an examination showed a re-

currence of a shoulder injury that definitely ends his activities this year and possibly permanently.

Meanwhile, Gwin and his staff are awaiting Thursday morning when the entry box will be opened. Then comes the decision as to whether it will be necessary to schedule two divisions.

DRC officials are making plans for the most colorful pre-race program in history. There'll be more about that later.

SUPERBOWL, who won the 1972 Hambletonian a week ago in two record making heats, will have the spotlight tonight (Saturday) at Hazel Park when he trots in the \$27,000 Tompkins Memorial.

As expected, when owners of eligibles discovered Superbowl was going to enter, they dropped out of the competition as if the colt had the plague.

Thus a \$27,000 stake will be run off as a non-betting event with the four entrants going postward between the ninth and 10th races.

"We could have staged the

trot as a pre-program event," said General Manager Harold Duris. "But we wanted all of our fans to get a chance to see the best three-year-old trotter of a long time. Therefore we decided to make it between the final two races."

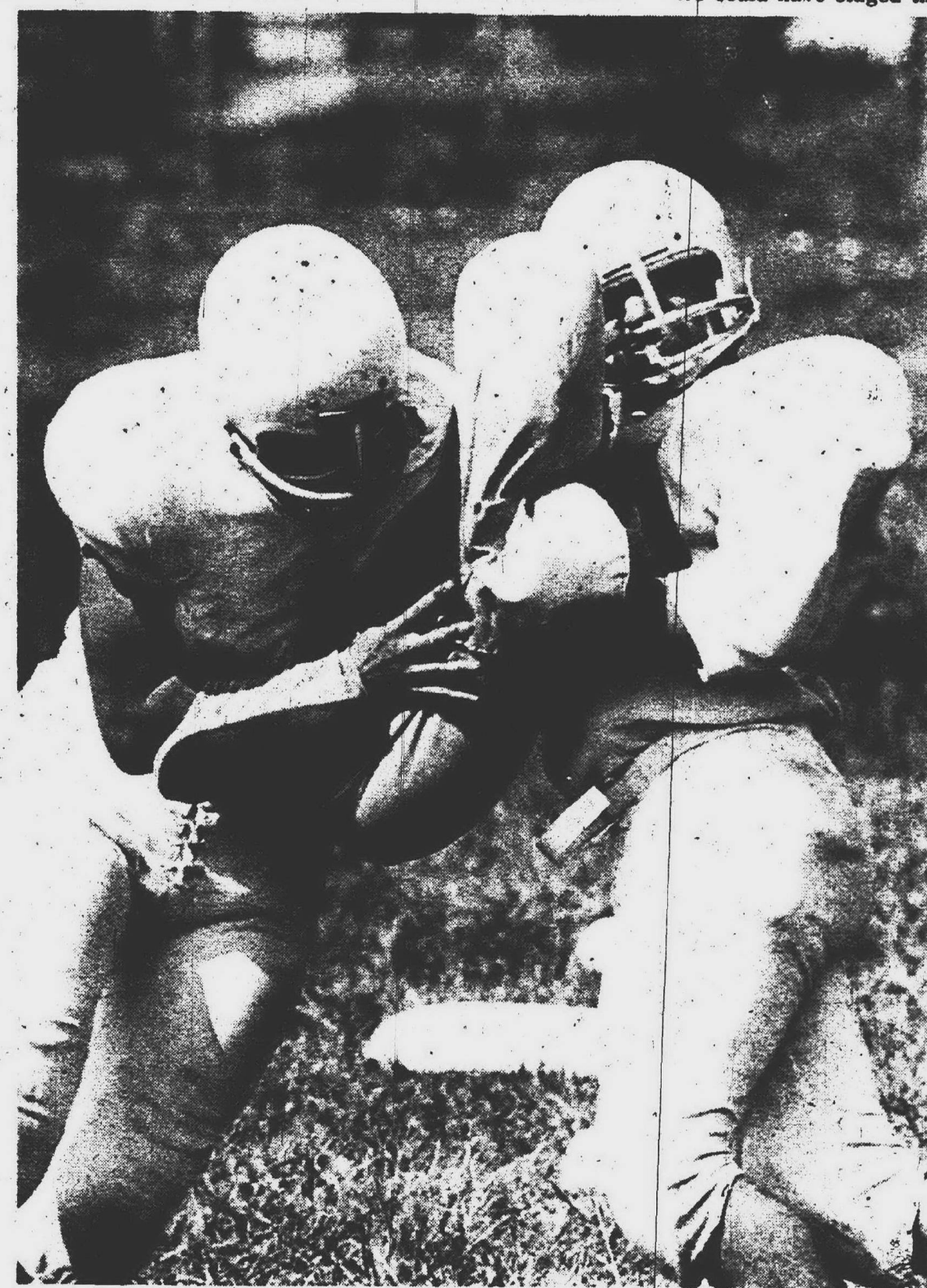

What Can You Afford?



In choosing a new home, the first thing a couple needs to consider is how much they can afford to spend. Since life styles differ, there is no flat rule to follow. However, most experts seem to agree that a couple with no unusual debts can usually afford a house that costs approximately two and one-half times their annual income. This provides a starting point, but when you get down to the nitty gritty, it's what the monthly payments will be that determines whether or not a couple can afford a particular house. Different lending institutions have differing formulas for figuring how much of a mortgage a couple can afford. The most conservative bank stated that a mortgage payment should not exceed one week's take home pay (after taxes). Another bank said it shouldn't exceed one week's gross pay (before taxes), assuming a good credit record and no large outstanding debts with the exception of maybe a car payment. A savings and loan company uses the following formula: Take total income. (Little or no consideration is given to overtime, since this can vary and even be cut suddenly to nothing at any time over the duration of a mortgage). Deduct income taxes and social security. Deduct debts of over a one-year duration. This gives net effective income. Housing expense shouldn't exceed 35% of net effective income.

A wife's income will be taken into consideration under certain circumstances. It depends on her age and the type of work she does. The lending institution tries to determine whether or not she will continue working for the duration of the mortgage. If a woman is a professional and has returned to the job market after having had all the children she intends to have, most lending institutions will count all her salary in making the determination on how large a mortgage a couple can handle. If a woman is a secretary or typist or some other type of office worker, and has all the children she will probably have, probably one-half of her income will be counted. Length of time on the job and salary level count here, too, in helping the lending institution determine whether or not she is likely to continue working. The earnings of a 19 or 20 year old new bride could not reasonably be figured into a 30-year mortgage. The lending institution would probably take them into consideration, however, in reducing the couple's debts. They would consider her a short-term worker and base the mortgage on her husband's

income without deducting for the short-term debts her income would probably cover.

Don Wolfe, a Livonia real estate consultant, says that as a rough estimate, you can figure your monthly payment will be \$10 per month for every \$1,000 financed, including principal, interest, taxes, and insurance -- everything. For example, a \$40,000 house with \$10,000 down would leave you with a mortgage of \$30,000 and a payment of \$300 per month.

For a more exact figure consult the following table to determine how much a mortgage would cost you in monthly payments (not including taxes and insurance) at various rates of interest and durations. The figures are stated in dollars per month, to the nearest 10th of a cent, for each \$1,000 of the mortgage.

Rate of Interest	25 years	30 years
5%	\$5.846	\$5.369
6%	\$6.444	\$5.996
7%	\$7.068	\$6.654
7 1/2%	\$7.390	\$6.993
8%	\$7.719	\$7.338
8 1/2%	\$8.053	\$7.690

For example, if your mortgage would be for \$20,000 for 30 years at 7%, you would pay \$6.654 times 20, or \$133.08 per month.

Current mortgage rates range from 7% to 8 1/2%, and there are several types of mortgage loans. Conventional mortgage loans, FHA mortgage loans, and VA-guaranteed mortgage loans are all made by private lending institutions, but the FHA and VA-guaranteed loans are insured against loss by federal government agencies, while conventional loans are made at the lender's own risk or insured by a private mortgage insurance firm.

Eight private companies now write insurance, protecting lenders against default by a borrower, an activity once virtually monopolized by the FHA, and these private firms are taking over a huge amount of the market that formerly went to FHA. The savings and loan associations are very happy about it, since the service for loan processing can now be measured in days instead of months. The private firms have cut much of the red tape which ensnarls FHA-backed mortgages. Also, the private insurers now require a lower down payment than the FHA asks, and their insurance fees are markedly lower.

The Federal Home Loan Bank Board, which regulates federally chartered savings and loan companies, is working to make the

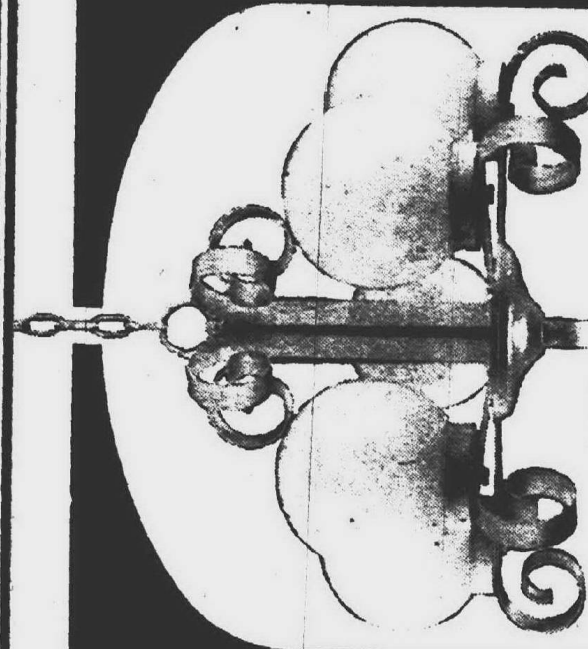

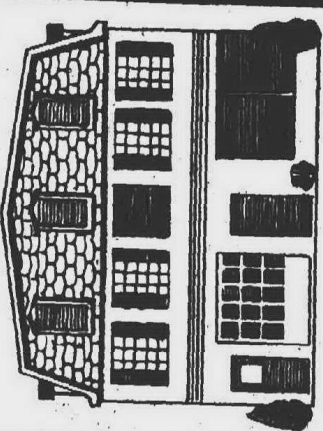

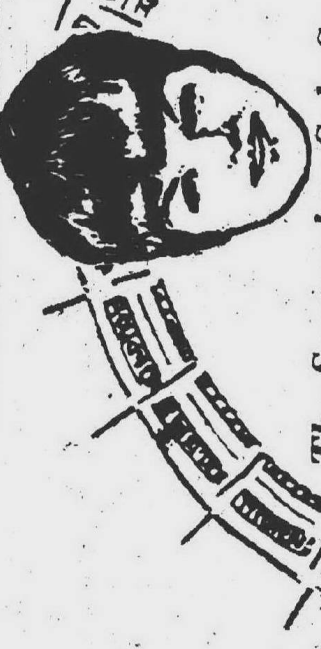

arc or almost due east to west. You can take advantage of this situation by placing the main windows facing directly south. Depending upon the location of the lot, this may mean placing the house at right angles to the street. Most communities will allow a house to be positioned any way the owner wants, so do consider possibilities other than positioning your house to face the street.

Large glass areas facing north or west will result in high heating bills, even with double - layer glass. Those north winds are pretty strong. Landscaping can be helpful here.

Having the sun in the winter, but not really look right in your new bedroom. Your bath towels may not be the right color for the new bathroom. Your furniture may not fit just right. Color schemes are easier to control in a new house than in one already completed, and while walls can be painted, bathroom tile color is pretty much set. You will probably find quite a few things you will want to buy once you move into your new home. If you are currently an apartment dweller, don't forget you will need a lawn mower, plus numerous other garden tools.

You're in much better shape if you haven't figured your monthly payments too tight.

To compound FHA's problems, there have been a number of recent abuses of FHA mortgage programs by some real estate speculators and mortgage bankers, and this has resulted in a cost of \$150 million in foreclosures in Detroit. This is at least partially responsible for the new, stiffer requirements for FHA buyers. The new 30-50 formula for qualifying mortgage loan applicants (roughly requires that his total housing expenses, including monthly house payments, utilities, maintenance, and taxes not exceed 30 per cent of his net income. The second part of the formula states that the applicant's monthly payment and expenses as listed above, in combination with his other debts including social security withholding and long-term debts of more than a year, and total monthly fixed payments may not exceed more than 50 per cent of his net income. These requirements are criticized by a number of realtors and financiers as being unreasonable -- it makes it difficult to qualify normally acceptable buyers, they say.

Current mortgage rates are running 7% to 7 1/2% on conventional mortgages that require 25% down payment. These are available at banks.

Veterans Administration (VA) loans are available only to veterans. They usually require nothing down, and the current rate is 7% which is the lowest rate anybody can get.

The VA will appraise the house and the appraisal value is the maximum

the veteran can borrow. If the house is not priced unrealistically, he can get it with no down payment. Of course, his income must be sufficient to cover the monthly payments. To investigate this possibility, a veteran should contact the VA and arrange to get a certificate of eligibility, which he then takes to the lender. As veterans return from Viet Nam, more and more VA loans are being processed.

FHA mortgage rates are currently 7% plus 1/2% to cover the cost of insurance, or an effective rate of 7 1/2%. Mortgage rates on the privately insured mortgages currently are 8% plus an amount up to 1/2% to cover the cost of the insurance. The full 8 1/2% is not always charged. Many variables are taken into consideration, including the riskiness of both property and applicant. These rates pertain to the 95% mortgages that require only 5% down. Amounts between 5% and 25% down would merit a mortgage rate somewhere in-between.

The chart above shows mortgage rates going as low as 5%. These are included to show you the difference between current mortgage rates and rates prevalent a few years ago. It can also help you measure the value of assuming someone else's mortgage rather than taking out a new mortgage. Lenders, of course, would prefer to write up a new mortgage for you at the higher rates, and in many cases this is necessary anyway because of the large amount of cash a homeowner may want from you to assume his mortgage.

If you see a house you think you might like, figure it this way. Take the price and subtract your down payment to determine the amount you would have to mortgage. Consult the mortgage chart above and multiply the number of thousands of dollars you would be financing by the factor given in the chart across from the rate of interest you would have to pay and under the number of years you would want to finance. This figure may not be right to the penny due to slight variations in differing amounts financed, but it will tell you your payment to within a dollar. Find out what taxes on the property are, and add this monthly amount to your payment figure. Insurance will depend on the value of the house, but for a \$30,000 house would probably not run over \$10 a month. Of course, exact figures will be available from the realtor, but if you know the total price of the property and taxes before you get into a detailed discussion with the realtor, you will pretty much be able to figure out whether or not you can afford beforehand.

party, isn't it? Builders in this area haven't eliminated the living room yet, but it is the next logical step.

Besides the kitchen and family rooms, you will want to look over the bedrooms. Note the plural. One bathroom is not very convenient if you have children. While a second full bath is not necessarily too important, your family life more pleasant, even if at least a second half bath will make it must be situated in the basement for economy reasons. 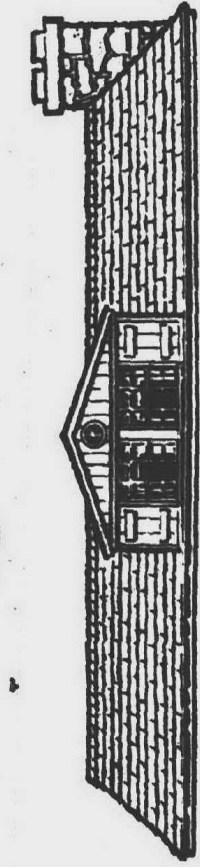

might be worth it to pay extra and get the options. This is another decision for you. TO CREATE A HOME

The Architect's View

Tom Zoedes, a Farmington architect who does some residential work, says that a custom house is not for everybody. He says that a couple should consider the likelihood that they will be staying in the area permanently, or at least three to five years, and weight the probability that the husband's employer will transfer him to another city. If their stay here is likely to be temporary, a tract house is probably a better idea. But people looking for a permanent home that is tailored to their needs should definitely consider a custom home.

According to Zoedes, a home designed by an architect for a particular couple will be better suited to them, will be better quality for the money, and will not necessarily cost more per square foot than a tract house. It is difficult to judge the monetary value of getting exactly what you want. Contentment is an intangible.

Zoedes says that real estate agents have lists of land available. He also recommends driving around to find an area you would like and then making inquiries regarding vacant land. If you see a vacant piece of land you would like that has no "for sale" sign, jot down the location and check with County Records, he advises. They will give you the names and addresses of people who own the property, and you can contact them.

Zoedes recommends that if you pick stock plans from a book and choose a custom builder instead of an architect, that you get bids from three or four builders and let them know that they are bidding against each other. An architect will always get contractors to bid against each other, and will usually go directly to the subcontractors -- one for plumbing, one for electrical work, one for cement work, etc. -- eliminating the general contractor, who otherwise receives 15% to 20% of the price of your house as payment for his work. You can act as your own general contractor under the guidance and direction of your architect, who will make periodic checks to be sure the work is being done properly and in the proper sequence.

WHAT SHOULD YOU CONSIDER WHEN BUYING A HOME?

Location, of course, is most important, but even location must be examined in light of your personal life style. How important is it to you, for example, to be close to where you work? Is it more important to you to be further out into the country for the benefit of the peace and quiet it will provide? Consider the services you will require and their availability. Ideally there should be a small shopping area, with a grocery and drug store at least, no further than one mile from your home. There should be a major shopping center with a department store within three miles of your home, with churches and schools nearby. Of course, these ideal conditions cannot always be met, and you will have to weigh the merits of convenience against the merits of being further removed from the city. Your investment is likely to be more secure in a subdivision of comparable homes than it is if it is isolated out in the country, but there are subdivisions springing up far beyond the rings of the city—many of them in the lake

areas to the north, but still within commuting distance of the city. If both husband and wife are working and will be commuting, the cost (both emotional and monetary) of commuting any great distance should be taken more into consideration. A long drive will add hours to the length of the work day, and one crabby, tired person at a time is all most marriages can stand.

After location, consider what your types of activities are, how many rooms you will need, and what conveniences you refuse to do without. A family that entertains a lot will require a different type of house than one that does not. And the type of entertaining they enjoy will make a difference, too. Couples who like informal parties, buffets, and barbecues will have different requirements than couples who like to have sit-down dinner parties. Children of different ages will have varying requirements. Whether or not there is a play area close to where mother is

working becomes less important as the children grow older. Older children need a place to study, and even parents need a place to retreat. If the husband likes to build things or repair cars, for example, he will need some place to work. A garage can sometimes serve as a workshop, but it can get chilly in winter. A wife will be much happier if she has an efficient kitchen and laundry (assuming it is she who does these things—if her husband helps, an efficient kitchen and laundry make two people happy). A minimum care house is more important to the woman who works outside the home.

There are several basic styles of kitchens. Some work better with one cook, and others function as well with multiple cooks. A kitchen can be a cooking center only, or it can be a dining area as well. The kitchen work area is usually one of four shapes: U-shape, L-shape, corridor or one-wall. The one-wall type is used frequently in efficiency apartments and in vacation homes where space is very limited.

ed, but is rarely used in other dwellings. An L-shaped kitchen is used most frequently where dining space is provided in the kitchen. A corridor type can be closed at one end. It has the advantage over the U-shape kitchen in that it allows better access to cabinets on the end, but it has the disadvantage of less-counter space than the U-shape.

Floor plan and probable traffic pattern are important considerations. In a model home, it is difficult to see the floor plan when you are so distracted by the glamorous decor. However, floor plans are available from the sales office, and it will pay you to study them closely before you buy the house. Try and imagine yourself living in the house. What pattern will you follow when you walk into the house, carry groceries to the kitchen, prepare a meal, etc.? Consider how good the separation of areas is. Will noise from the living room and/or family room carry easily to the bedrooms where other members of

the family may be trying to sleep? Closets are great sound buffers. Consider where your furniture could be positioned, and whether you would be continually walking in front of somebody trying to watch television.

In examining a kitchen, be sure to check the amount of cupboard space and the amount of countertop. It is important to have a convenient place to set things when you take them out of the refrigerator or off the stove. Work space for setting out ingredients, measuring them, and mixing them is another consideration. If a dining table is located in the kitchen, this space can be counted. If not, additional work space will be necessary. The additional work space is preferable to the dining table, since one member of the family can be setting the table for a meal while another is cooking if it is not necessary to use the table in preparing the meal.

A dishwasher saves considerable space. Many housewife considers it

worth the expense just to get rid of the clutter of dirty dishes and to make additional work space. Of course, the fact that it washes the dishes too is nice.

A corridor kitchen can have traffic jams if there is likely to be much through traffic, and it can get crowded if too many people try to work in it at the same time, but for one person it can be very efficient, as can the U-shape kitchen.

If you decide it is necessary to have eating space in your kitchen, you will have to decide whether it is also necessary to have a separate dining room. If you are on a budget, remember every square foot counts. Some people drop the eating space in the kitchen and get the adjacent dining room instead, being sure to choose a floor that is both good-looking and easy to clean. Many of the tiles available now look quite glamorous and are entirely suitable for a dining room.

An alternative to the separate dining room and kitchen is the newer kitchen - family room. It contains

space for a sofa and easy chairs, a television, and frequently much else in addition to space for cooking and eating. It is a general all-purpose room and is not left empty very often. Some of the more expensive homes have a set-up with the kitchen work space in the middle, open to a family room on one side and separated by a wall from the dining room on the other side. While this is very nice, it is also costly, and you will have to weigh its merits against its costs. Be sure to figure in the fact that the more square footage your house contains, the more you will have to clean, or pay somebody else to clean for you.

As family rooms have become increasingly popular, living rooms are being used less. The family room has in reality become the living room. It is most often the room used for parties, as well as for family, simply because it is the nicest room in the house. Even if it's open to the kitchen, that's OK, because your kitchen is usually shining clean anyway when you have a
