

"In past budgets, the board of education has allocated approximately 62 per cent of the operating budget for teachers' salaries. This year they have allocated 58.2 per cent, which is a loss of about four per cent in our share of the budget. This means that other needs for this four per cent have a higher priority in the eyes of the board than teachers" salaries.







## 3 Reps Win Praise On Ecology

Three Observerland state representatives have "outstanding" records on environmental legislation according to the Detroit Area Coalition for the Environment, which rated all the metropolitan legislators on their voting record.

State Reps. Marvin Stempien (D-Livonia) John Bennett (D-Redford Township) and Raymond Baker (R-Farmington) received outstanding ratings on 11 bills and five amendments by voting "right" on 15 occasions.

Rep. James Defebaugh (R-Birmingham) received a "very good" rating while three other local legislators were listed as having very poor voting records. These include Reps. Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park), Richard Young (D-Dearborn Heights) and Thomas Brown (D-Westland).

BENNETT. Stempien and Baker were listed as voting for an air pollution control bill raising penalties for pollution and providing for surveillance fees, wilderness protection act, inland lakes and streams protection bill, snowmobile regulations, removal of a bounty on coyotes, sedimentation control, bill board regulations, increased water pollution penalties and a bill to protect endangered species.

Stempien voted against an environmental education bill while the others voted for it. Bennett didn't vote on the mass transit bill, but Stempien and Baker voted for it.

Forbes showed the "poorest" voting record, according to the environmental group, because ne voted against the air pollution control bill, environmental education bill, lakes and streams bill and water pollution bill.

He didn't vote on the sedimentation bill, but voted. for eight of the 16 bills and amendments.

Brown had voted against the sedimentation control bill and inland lakes and streams bill and didn't vote on the mass transit bill. He voted for eight of the bills and amendments.

Defebaugh voted for 14 of the measures but didn't vote on the water pollution control







THAT GREATEST of all sports seasons - football - is at hand, and in this plot of paradise we call Plymouth there is an exciting sense of anticipation that this is the year of the Rocks, the Chinese calendar to the contrary.

The effervescence of high school youngsters knows no better outlet than in the exultation of a football triumph (with basketball second by the length of a wrinkled nose), and it is an infectious thing which can spread with equal impact among their elders.

This was so very evident just a year ago Friday evening up in Bloomfield Hills when an underdog Plymouth team upset Andover's defending Wayne-Oakland League titlists in the last minute, 15-14. All who had accompanied the Rocks (outnumbering home fans) joined the players in their heady jubila-

But that jubilation had floundered by the time of November's sleet and rain in the face of a 4-5 record. and for 10 months those who have this thing in their blood have been saying, "Wait until '72."

And wouldn't you know it? That's where we are now, and Friday night that same Bloomfield Hills Andover again will be Plymouth's opening grid foe but here at home. Our great band and our pretty Rockettes and cheerleaders will add to the enthusiasm of a home town crowd in our new stadium, and on the field where the issue will be settled, someone is bound to say, "We can't win 'em all if we don't win tonight."

YOU SEE, for the first time in a decade Plymouth seems to have the makings of a championship football team, maybe one of the best in Michigan. There are nine games ahead, seven in the tough Suburban Eight sandwiched between non-league tests with Andover and Farmington Harrison, and even Coach Tom Moshimer is bubbling with optimism.

Now in his sixth season here, Moshimer has yet to field a Plymouth team that has played better than .500 football even though at his previous stop his clubs had gone 35 in a row without defeat.

But so good are the prospects this autumn that Tom has put himself on the spot with a statement, "We are gunning for a perfect 7-0 league mark. One loss might mean a share of the crown."

Moshimer undoubtedly realizes that the Blue and White diehards have been a bit restless the last couple of years, and if he is to sleep soundly next winter the Rocks had better make a real run for the title, even if they don't get it.

The Rocks abound in experience and depth and Moshimer himself praises his charges by saying, "The spirit and attitude have never been better." But he knowns - and his players do, too - that words won't put Plymouth ahead of Edsel Ford, Allen Park, Redford Union and the rest. Someone had better put some points on the board.

**THE TOOLS** for doing just that bear such names as Ron Egloff, Jim Szilagyi, Steve Robb, Mark Allen, Steve Crowther and a host of others who should give Plymouth strength both in the air and on the ground.


It is a club which has good size in the line and great speed in the backfield and which should find exceptional leadership qualities in its co-captains, Egloff and Robb -- a pair of two-way players who sparkle on both offense and defense.

It would be unfair to say that whether the sun will rise and set hinges on a successful football team. but it is true that Plymouth fans are hungry for a winner. They know they have an all-state prospect in Egloff and they know, too, that this is the last year of just one Plymouth High School.

Next year we will have teams in two leagues representing Plymouth-Canton and Plymouth-Salem and how all that will work out has yet to be seen. However, it is exactly the upcoming '73 split which means that '72 has to be the year for a united Plymouth bid for a championship.



#### Installment On Taxes Due

DETROIT Individuals filing 1972 declarations of estimated federal income tax must pay the third installment of tax by Friday, Sept. 15.

Taxpayers who first met the requirements for filing an estimate after June 1, but before Sept. 2, are required to file on Form 1040-ES and pay at least half of the tax by Sept. 15. These persons should use declaration-voucher No. 3.

Thomas A. Cardoza, district director of Internal Revenue for Michigan, said taxpayers whose anticipated income during 1972 has changed may be required to amend their declarations.

Space to compute an amended estimate is provided in the estimated tax package received by taxpayers.

Publications 505, "Tax Witholding and Declaration of Estimated Tax," which furnishes detailed information. on this subject, can be obtained free from your IRS district office.

## How Esch And Stempien Compare As Busing Foes

looking for Voters philosophical differences between the two candidates in the 2nd Congressional District on the question of busing won't find any.

At least not if they look at the anti-busing statements from the two - incumbent U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) and State Rep. Marvin Stempien (D-Livonia).

Both men, in mailing pieces sent to resident in the district (Plymouth, Livonia, Ann Arbor, Washtenaw County and Monroe County), say they oppose busing "to achieve racial balance."

And both men reiterated these positions in recent. exclusive interviews with the Observer Newspapers.

Stempien won the right to face Esch by defeating five others in the Democratic primary Aug. 8.

IN THEIR official busing statements, both men denounced Judge Stephen Roth's decision. Esch recently mailed a four-page statement to everyone in the district outlining his views. And Stempien has mailed two pieces, one dated July 17, 1972 and the other dated simply July, 1972.

' Stempien said that he had voted against such busing in 1969 and again in 1971.

Stempien voted against a legislative house joint resolution (HJR EEE) on busing in April, calling it ineffective and a "fraud" because it would do nothing to stop Judge Stephen Roth's cross-district busing order.

Stempien said he was "not opposed in transporting school children within a school district to provide improved educational opportunity" in April, when explaining his opposition to HJR-EEE. Instead, voters should pressure their congressmen and senators for anti-busing laws, Stempien said.







ma and birth defects. Children learn to play musical instruments, work on hobbies and participate in games and activities with the assitance of recreation instructors.


Kiwanians provide recreational and educational materials and instructors at Mott Hospital and furnished an activities room in the hospital at a cost of \$50,000.

## **Peaches** Inspire **New Pies**

By ELLY

Just in time for the peach season some brand new pie recipes have come our way. Peaches are the third most

important fruit crop in the United States; the first is apples and oranges rank second.

Peach blossoms and fruit have inspired artists and poets down through the ages. If you are in a creative mood perhaps one of these peach pies will put your artistic talents to work.

STREUSEL PEACH PIE 10-oz. pkg. pastry mix

3 T. cold water ½ c. peach preserves 2 t. lemon juice

1 T. corn starch 4 c. fresh peach slices TOPPING:

1/2 t. cinnamon 1/4 t. nutmeg

1/4 c. sugar Heat oven to 425 degrees. For pastry, place all but one third cup pie crust mix in a medium-sized mixing bowl. Gradually add water, tossing lightly with a fork. Form into ball. Roll out on lightly floured board and fit into nine-inch pie plate. Trim; flute edges high and prick bottom and sides with tines of fork. Bake for 10 minutes and remove from oven. Reduce oven temperature to 375 degrees.

For filling, combine preserves, lemon juice and cornstarch. Add peach slices, stirring just to combine. Pour into partially baked pie shell. For topping, a combine reserved one third cup pie crust mix, cinnamon, nutmeg and sugar; sprinkle over filling. Bake in 375-degree over for 35 or 45 minutes or until bubbly. Cool on wire

> **FRESH PEACH** LATTICE PIE

1 recipe double crust pastry 1/2 to 2/3 c. sugar 11/2 to 2 T. cornstarch

Dash of salt 5 c. peeled, sliced ripe peaches 1 t. lemon juice 1T. margarine

Mix together sugar, cornstarch and salt; sprinkle over. peaches. Add lemon juice and toss together until well coated. Line a nine-inch pie pan with one half the pastry allowing one-inch overhang. Roll remaining pastry into 12-inch circle. Cut into 10 one-inch strips with pastry wheel or knife. Place five of the strips across filling. Weave lattice crust with remaining strips by folding back alternate strips as each cross strip is added. Fold trimmed edge of lower crust over ends of strips; seal and flute. Bake in a 425-degree oven 30 to 35 minutes or until browned.

> **PEACH ORANGE** CHEESECAKE PIE

CRUST: 1 1/3 c. graham cracker crumbs (16 squares) 2 T. sugar

1/4 c. (1/2 stick) butter, melted FILLING:

1 T. (1 envelope) unflavored gelatin 2 T. water

½ c. sugar 1 egg yolk

1/2 c. frozen concentrated orange juice, thawed 11/2 c. cottage cheese ½ c. whipping cream,

whipped 1 egg white

2 T. sugar

Sliced sweetened peaches In a small bowl mix together

crumbs and sugar; stir in butter. Reserve tablespoons butter to garnish pie. Press remaining mixture firmly against bottom and sides of nine-inch pie pan, building up slightly around rim. Bake five minutes in preheated 350-degree oven. Cool on wire rack.

To prepare filling: Soften gelatin in water. Combine half cup sugar, orange juice and egg yolk in one-quart saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until thickened (about three minutes). Remove from heat; add softened gelatin. Stir until dissolved. Cool. In large mixing bowl beat cottage cheese until smooth; beat in gelatin mixture; fold in whipped cream. In a small mixing bowl beat egg white until foamy; gradually add two tablespoons sugar and beat until stiff. Fold into cottage cheese mixture. Chill until mixture mounds. Mound into pie shell. Garnish top of pie with sliced peaches and reserved crumbs. Chill. Serve with more sliced peaches.



## **Governments Should** Set Up Standards

By Stan Smalley Troy

This is in response to your editorial titled Local Governments Should Set, Publish Productivity Figures printed on August 16, 1972. I am a representative of a management consulting firm that has been working with a number of local agencies to develop highway maintenance management systems.

One aspect of a management system is the establishment of expected performance or productivity figures.

IN THE FALL of 1969, the Oakland and Genesee County Road Commissions started to develop a system which would help them manage their highway maintenance field work. These two counties were the first of all the county highway agencies in the United States to hire our firm for such a purpose.

Since that time the Lapeer and Wayne County Road Commissions have embarked on similar projects and the Michigan Department of State Highways has installed the system on their highways maintained by the County Road Commission of Macomb, St. Clair, Washtenaw and Wayne.

The main reason these highway agencies start such a project is to get the most out of every taxpayer's transportation tax dollar. Increasing productivity will either get more work done for the same amount of effort, or will reduce the amount of dollars required to maintain the same levels of service.

Maybe the work should not be done in the first place — or at least not as much as has been done in the past. Productivity values alone will not help in this determination. However, with a complete management system the managers are able to plan in advance how much of each type of work they want to accomplish during the year. Then the system communicates these management

decisions directly to the people performing the work in the field.

As Paul Van Roekel, Oakland County Highway Engineer. expressed it in a recent report to his Commissioners: "In summary, the Highway Maintenance Management System has provided what we wanted: the ability to plan and budget an annual program and the tools to execute that planned program."

Agencies that have methods by which they can measure common productivity rates do like to compare their values. However, caution should be used when making these comparisons.

For example, a production rate of 25 potholes filled per day says nothing of the quality of workmanship that went into the job, the size of the crew that did the filling, the traffic conditions that crew was faced with, nor the type of equipment available to that crew, all factors which affect the amount of work that can be done in a day.

A MAINTENANCE management system requires a manager to set a standard for each work activity that specifies how many men to use, what equipment and material to take to the job, what method to use in doing the job and what workmanship levels are expected.

The standard also states an expected production if the work is performed in accordance with the standard. Each agency tailors the standards to fit their local conditions. Once the standards are established, then productivity values can be compared to the standard instead of against another crew that might not be playing the ball game under the same set of rules.

You are right in your editorial. local government should set productivity standards. They should do even more. They should follow the lead of the few local government agencies that have introduced their managers to the latest management tools.

"Biggest and the best ever held in Plymouth." That was the goal of the entire


