Judge Bars Locker Evidence From Bennett Murder Trial

Evidence found in the Plymouth High School locker of David LeRoy Bennett, allegedly including blood-stained clothing and a switchblade knife similarly bloodied, will not be allowed when Bennett goes on trial Tuesday charged with the murder last May 9 of Mrs. Vivian Carol Berry.

Wayne County Circuit Judge George E. Bowles, before whom the case will be tried, issued a formal opinion Thursday in which he granted defense counsel's motion to suppress "the evidence obtained through warrantless search of the school locker."

Bowles thus overturned a prior decision by District Judge Dunbar Davis who had ruled during the pre-trial lower court examination of Bennett in June that the locker items were admissible.

The 22-page Bowles opinion, which also included rulings favorable to the prosecution on four separate topics, described what was found in Bennett's locker in this language:

"A brown paper bag fell out which contained a jacket stained with what appeared to be blood, a wet T-shirt similarly stained and a switchblade knife which had blood and hair on it."

"The blood was found to be consistent with that of the deceased and the hair was determined to be pubic and similar to that of the deceased."

THE BODY of Mrs. Berry, wife of Michael Berry, chairman of the Wayne County Road Commission, was found by a daughter in the garage of their \$100,000 home at 50300 N. Territorial Rd. in Plymouth Township on the afternoon of May 9. She had died from multiple stab wounds.

Bennett, 17, then a Plymouth High School senior, was arrested by sheriff's

deputies that same evening while he was attending a typing class in Central School. He has been in custody ever since, charged with first degree murder.

Bennett had been traced through the license number of the car he was driving, it having been seen in the vicinity of the Berry home that morning, and Bowles ruled that the arrest had been lawfully made.

He also ruled that the language of the arrest "was legally sufficient, and that issuance of the warrant and the arraignment were not unduly delayed even though there was a two-day gap between arrest and arraignment."

EVIDENCE TAKEN from Bennett's person at the State Police Crime Lab across the street from Central School following his arrest was ruled by Bowles to be admissible.

The judge's statement recalled that at the lab "clothing was seized, fingerprints taken and fingernails clipped and scraped."

"Certain finger and palm prints matched those in the Berry garage and human blood was found on some of the clothing," wrote Bowles. "This blood was consistent with that of the deceased."

"The search of the defendant's person was incident to a lawful arrest and itself, therefore, was lawful and the seized items admissible."

Then the judge devoted 16 pages to the sole issue of whether the search of Bennett's locker at the high school on May 10 was unlawful. The search was made by a sheriff's deputy who had requested access to the locker from Principal Bill Brown.

BROWN OPENED the locker in the officer's presence after the school day had ended, although, as Bowles pointed out, the detective "had not sought a

search warrant from a magistrate, nor did he make a claim that he had a search warrant."

The Bowles opinion delved deeply into other law cases in which questions of search and seizure have been determined by higher courts and it also quoted at length from the Plymouth High School student handbook which states:

"If a search is made in cooperation with law enforcement officials in which evidence obtained may be used for subsequent legal action, then it will be necessary for a warrant to be served on the student."

After vast research Bowles wrote:

"1. Defendant minor charged as an adult enjoys a right of privacy."

"2. In the context of this case and its particular facts the defendant had a reasonable expectation of privacy as to the locker."

"3. Under Michigan law a parent cannot consent to the waiver of the constitutional rights of a minor child against a warrantless search."

"4. Under Michigan law and the stated policies of the school district the high school principal could not consent, for the minor defendant, to a warrantless search of the locker."

"5. The search of the locker, therefore, was unlawful and the evidence so obtained -- the fruits of the unlawful search -- is inadmissible."

"Accordingly, defendant's motion to suppress the evidence obtained through warrantless search of the school locker is granted."

Bennett's defense is being handled by Atty. Daniel A. Burruss. Assistant Prosecutor Robert H. Healy is in charge of the prosecution case and selection of a jury will begin at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday. Meanwhile Bennett, the son of an elected member of the Schoolcraft College board of trustees, remains in Wayne County Jail.

Community Fund's '72 Campaign Under Way

Plymouth's 1972 Community Fund campaign got under way Thursday with the lighting of what the PCF president called "a torch of hope and encouragement."

"Our goals are higher, but our needs are higher," said Fred Beitner in presiding over the Kellogg Park ceremony marking the kickoff of a drive to raise a record breaking \$182,000.

Susan Dybas, the current "Miss Plymouth," climaxed the occasion when she ignited the flame which will burn throughout the campaign, due to end Nov. 16. Miss Dybas graduated from Plymouth high in June and now is enrolled at Eastern Michigan University.

Beitner, in his remarks to governmental and civic leaders who were present,

pointed out that "the people of Plymouth have been generous in the past and we feel they will be again."

His reference was to the fact that since Plymouth originated its own Community Fund in the mid-'40s, it never has known failure, even though the goal has climbed steadily higher year after year. Donations in the 1971 campaign totaled \$168,769.

W.E. (BILL) CARLSON, who is general chairman of the '72 drive, praised the great enthusiasm evident among the volunteers who will canvass all residents and employees in the community. He also had special praise for the nearly 200 "bell ringers" who will be doing the house-to-house solicitation.

As much as possible, that

phase of the campaign will be concentrated in the week beginning Oct. 9.

Emphasizing the community good done by the agencies which the PCF helps financially, Beitner reviewed the allocations which have been budgeted and listed these as the recipient groups:

American Red Cross, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Plymouth Dental Fund, Michigan Cancer Foundation, Senior Citizens, Visiting Nurse Association, Salvation Army, Family Service, YMCA and the Plymouth Junior Athletic Association.

Serving as solicitation committee chairmen under Carlson's direction are Leonard Evans, Kent Buikema, Ron South, Tim Ford, John Harper, John Miller, Dr. Robert Petersen, Charlene Zeese, Jan Gerish and Janet Brass.

accept the board's latest wage offer in a 218 to 166 vote during a closed meeting Monday.

Several non-economic issues have to be worked out and the contract language written.

The salary agreement stipulates that the PEA cease any appeals for retroactive pay.

The teachers at one point had received authorization from the Pay Board for the retroactive pay. But the school board routinely referred the ruling to its legal counsel - Thomas - who found a flaw in the Pay Board's reasoning.

Thomas had serious doubt if the ruling was accurate and when he followed it up found that a mistake had been made.

A clarification was requested, bringing ultimate Pay Board denial, and many teachers personally blame Thomas for their failure to get the payments.

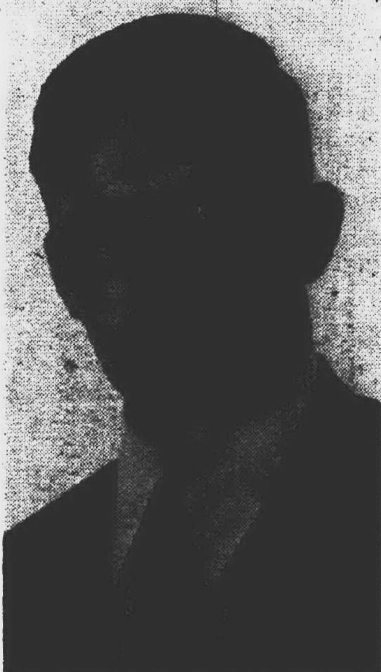
AFTER A majority of the teachers voting agreed to the board's offer, including the provision to cease attempts to get retroactive pay, Hoben issued a statement commending the bargaining teams for "the manner in which they conducted this most important task." He added that it "reflects directly upon the sincerity and dedication of those involved."

In light of projected building needs and accelerated growth in the district, Hoben asked both teams "to return to the table during the month of

October and attempt to negotiate a settlement for the 1973-74 school year."

"If this can be accomplished we could then devote our energies toward the common goal of providing for the students of our taxpayers in a manner consistent with past years," he stated.

"We need your help in selling education in the form of millages and bond issues."

Creation of the post of fire inspector had long been sought by Chief James Gignac, whose limited personnel has restricted this phase of departmental activity, and the trustees authorized holding an

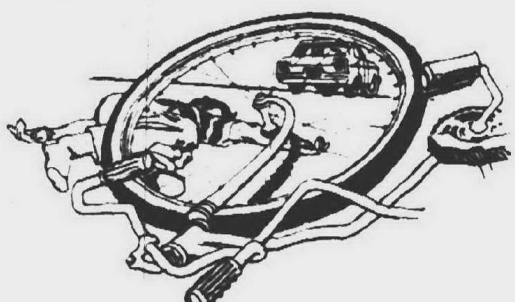

A special meeting of the Board of Education of the Plymouth Community School District, Wayne and Washtenaw Counties, Michigan, was held on Tuesday evening, August 29, 1972, in the Board Room of the Administration Building, 1024 S. Mill Street, Plymouth, Michigan, beginning at 8:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by President Lawton.

Present: Members Benson, Berry, Lawton, Mirto and Ohno.

Absent: Members Graves and Penar.

Administrators present: Supt. Hoben, Deputy Supt. Hogan, Assistant Supt. Blunk and Gibson, Adm. Assistant - Personnel Kae, Supervisor - Purchasing and Cafeterias - Sirbaugh, and Principal Smith.

Others present: Kathy Moran, Plymouth Mail & Observer, Bill Heath and John Ryder, P.E.A., Dr. Donald Daves, Roberta Gladden, F. G. Heath, Cathryn Hill, Shirley Mack, Kate Otto, James Rossman, Phyllis Sullivan, Jim Symonds, and Flossie Torda.

Additions to the agenda were called.

It was moved by Member Mirto and seconded by Member Berry to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held August 14, 1972, with the following corrections:

Page 1 Change title for Mr. Sirbaugh to Supervisor-Purchasing and Cafeterias under Administrators present.

Paragraph 7. Last line, change to read -- "to return the certified check of the unsuccessful bidder as promptly as possible."

Ayes: Members Benson, Berry, Lawton, Mirto and Ohno.

The motion was carried.

It was moved by Member Mirto and seconded by Member Berry to accept the summary of the suspended Board meeting of August 22, 1972, as submitted.

Ayes: Members Benson, Berry, Lawton, Mirto and Ohno.

Nays: None.

The motion was carried.

Mrs. Shirley Mack inquired as to the feasibility of publication of bus schedules before the opening of the school year. Mr. Blunk replied that the best method seemed to be to direct phone inquiries to Mr. Houghton who would be glad to answer questions as to time, place and bus number for any new residents of the district.

A memorandum of understanding was reviewed by Supt. Hoben which would set up a bank of clerical time to be established for each Board member as follows: (1) 4 hours per month, (2) 3 days' notice for preparation of material, (3) materials to be in edited form, and (4) arrangements to be through Superintendent's office.

Supt. Hoben reviewed a report which was received from the Wayne County Intermediate School District Office, regarding four new major housing projects in Canton Township which would encompass about 2,500 dwelling units.

Supt. Hoben also reviewed the proposed plan for implementing a towel service and use of the laundry at Plymouth-Salem High School through an initial purchase of 200 dozen towels with plans to expand to middle schools in the future and laundry service to be provided by a matron.

It was moved by Member Berry and seconded by Member Ohno to designate \$10,000 from Building and Site Fund No. 2 to implement a towel service at the High School.

Ayes: Members Benson, Berry, Lawton and Ohno.

Nays: Members Benson and Mirto.

The motion was defeated.

A copy of a letter directed to the Superintendent was distributed regarding positions concerning the President's Higher Education Act.

Supt. Hoben explained action taken to implement air conditioning repairs at the High School, that is, to agree with the proposal of the architect that they purchase the necessary pumps to complete the job and the School District furnish a maintenance man to install same with any labor costs beyond a four-week period to be borne by the architect.

It was moved by Member Mirto and seconded by Member Berry to concur with the action of the Superintendent to alleviate the problems with air conditioning at the High School.

Ayes: Members Benson, Berry, Lawton, Mirto and Ohno.

Nays: None.

The motion was carried.

It was moved by Member Ohno and seconded by Member Mirto to accept up to 2 1/2 credits toward graduation for successful completion of the General Education Development test, and that a combination of GED and service credits should not exceed six advance credits toward graduation.

Ayes: Members Benson, Berry, Lawton, Mirto and Ohno.

Nays: None.

The motion was carried.

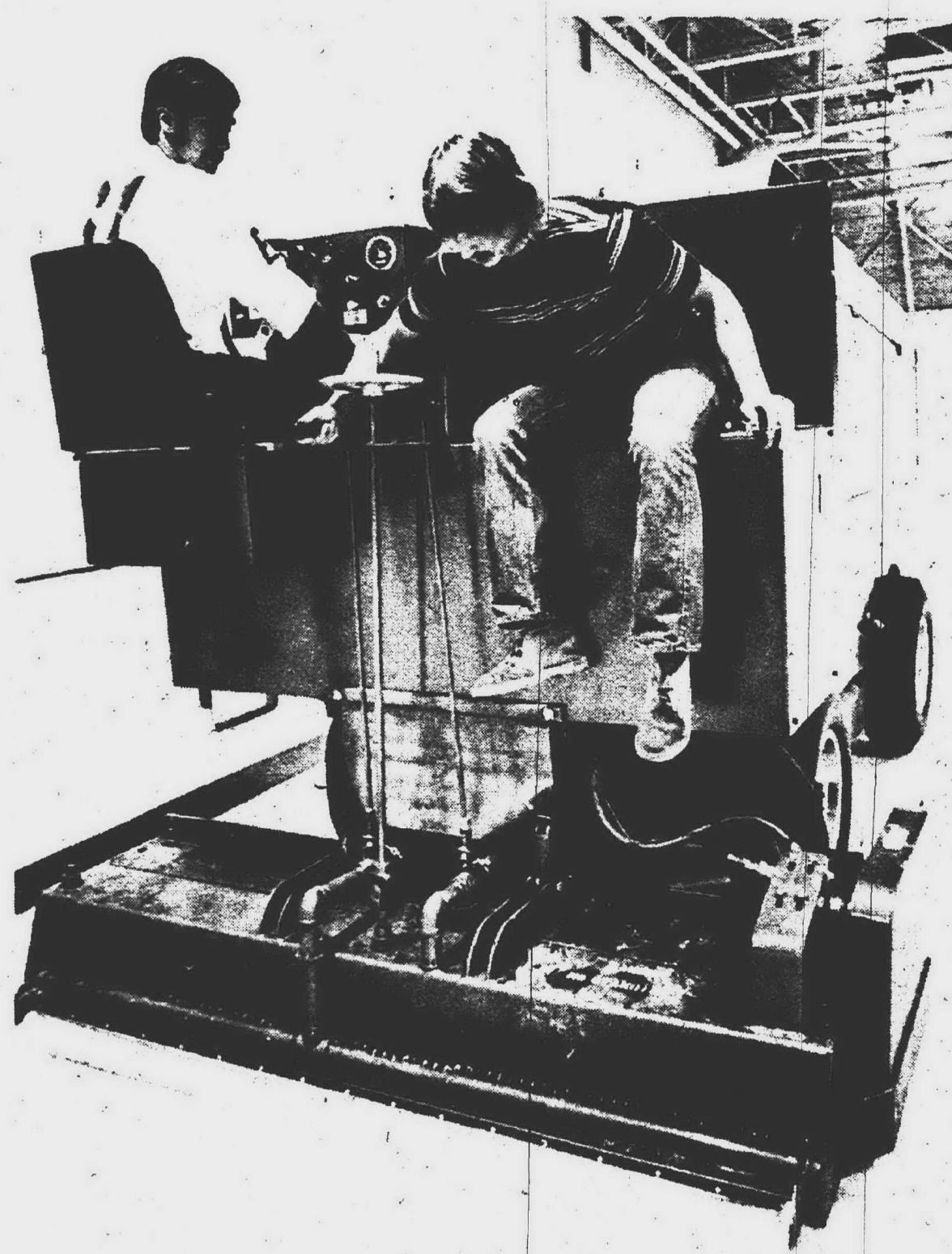

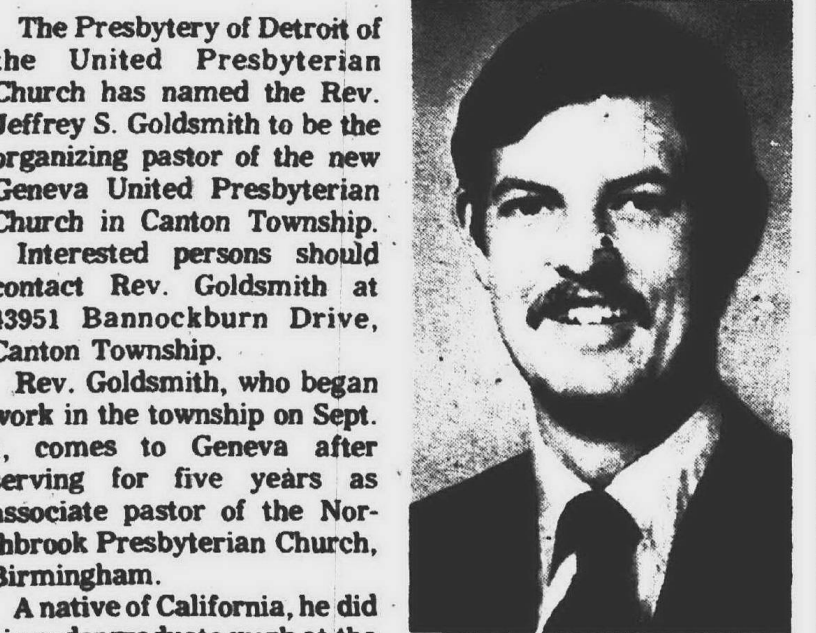
MAJOR KORBEL was released from prison in 1959, and in 1968 he and his wife were permitted to leave Czechoslovakia.

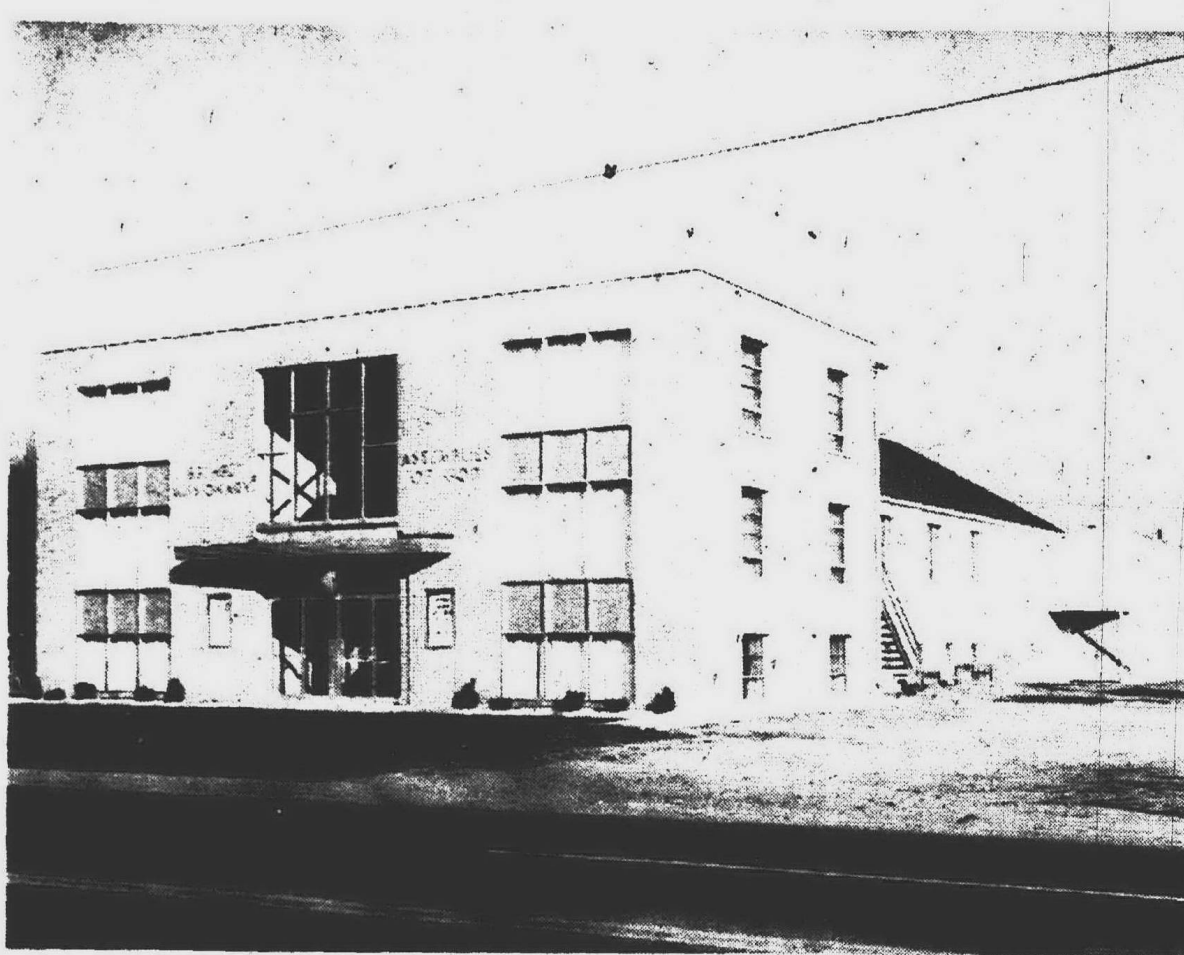

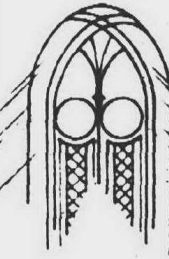

Religion Update

"In some circles, these boys are known as the 'Flat Earth Research Society' busy with stamping out dinosaurs," writes the Rev. Eugene Nissen, pastor of St. Andrew's Lutheran Church in Ann Arbor.

Pastor Nissen's letter to this column enclosed samples of anti-evolution literature from both the Creation Research Center in San Diego, as well as the Bible Science Association, of Caldwell, Idaho.

If these organizations appear obscure, there are such major bodies as the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod (2.9 million members) most of whose incumbent national leadership appears strongly opposed to the theory of evolution.

DURING LAST winter's meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS), a Dr. John Moore, of Michigan State University, told an organization called the Society For The Study of Evolution that Darwin's theory is "incredible" and "illogical." He based this conclusion among other reasons upon what he reported as a chromosome count in frogs.

But what may be the opening gun in a national anti-evolution campaign has been fired by the otherwise intelligent and invariably affable religion editor of "The Washington Evening Star and Daily News."

William ("Willow Bill") Willoughby has filed a Federal Court suit naming as defendants both the biological sciences curriculum study of the University of Colorado; as well as the National Science Foundation of the United States Government.

IN A COLUMN devoted to an apology for his notable litigation, religion editor Willoughby has sensibly, if not too convincingly, disassociated himself from all such as the late William Jennings Bryan & Co.

He opens his explanatory column by noting, pointedly, that he has actually read Charles Darwin's "Origin of Species" - which he does not want banned from any classroom.

What he wants, he writes, is "fair play ... by including a theory (of creation) that is just as plausible as the evolution theory." For: "government money is in fact sponsoring and disseminating a world view highly inimical to my religious and academic views."

IF WILLOUGHBY'S suit is not promptly (and deservedly) dismissed by the court, devout Christian Scientists should be able to avail themselves of a legal field day. They can begin litigation to compel an equivalent governmental financing of training of Christian Science practitioners as is presently provided by tax subsidies for state medical schools.

The Latter Day Saints (Mormons) can then sue to require that all history books provide space for mention of Jesus Christ's alleged visit to North America. The Jehovah's Witnesses can file for equal time in all school health courses and medical schools in order to issue appropriate denunciations of blood transfusions.

In Boulder, Colo., Dr. William Mayer, director of the biological sciences curriculum study which is being sued by Willoughby, notes that the lawsuit charges "a deliberate excising of the creation theory from the body of scientific knowledge."

Comments Dr. Mayer: "Such a theory has never been in the body of scientific knowledge! In fact, when I ask such people about what hypothesis, data and experimentation has led to this 'theory,' I get either silence, or the idea of an infallible book. This is a cute way to sell their own textbooks, which they are publishing out in San Diego."

"ALL MATERIAL relating to evolution in our books is clearly labeled as a theory," explained Dr. Mayer. "But if these people ever get in a position where they can dictate school texts, I shall fully expect a demand for square globes in all classrooms!"

Workshop At Antioch

Marriage Growth Topic

"People get married with pretty idealistic expectations - and when these expectations don't hold up they tend to be ashamed of the problems, or push them aside and pretend they don't exist."

"And you can't grow that way - you just stagnate in the gap between ideals and reality."

The speaker is Dr. Nathan Claunch, Farmington consulting psychologist who begins an eight-week marriage growth workshop at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 3, in Antioch Lutheran Church, 13 Mile and Farmington Road, Farmington.

The workshop, titled "Psychodynamics of Marriage and Family," is sponsored by the church for the community, said the Rev. Carl Kaltreider, pastor.

There will be a charge of \$35 per couple, but the first session will be free so couples can visit and then decide whether they want to participate in the Tuesday evening series.

THE PROJECT is described by its initiators as "a workshop for married couples, designed to enliven their marriage through understanding and growth in their relationship and to explore the dynamics of family relationships."

Pastor Kaltreider explained that it grew of Antioch church's aim to broaden its outreach to a ministry of the congregation to the community instead of just to the congregation.

He added that the large number of requests for counseling he has had in recent years made him aware that such workshop could be of value.

THE ANTIOCH board of directors, in approving plans for the workshop, named Dr.

Claunch to its staff - on a volunteer basis - to head a Family Life ministry.

Dr. Claunch, who has been staff clinical psychologist at Merrill-Palmer Institute in Detroit, and for the Psychological Studies and Consultation Program of Birmingham, now is in private practice in the Farmington area and said he welcomed the opportunity to work with "average people - those not under great stress."

The workshop, he said, will explore family relationships but place the emphasis on the husband-and-wife relationship because "that's where the growing must be done."

"We'll have some theoretical input from me," he said, "and some structured exercises for the couples - talking about their relationships from different points of view. They also will be some whole group discussion and probably some discussion in smaller groups."

"This really is designed to give couples an opportunity to think about the things they know they should devote more attention to."

"It's not designed as a sensitivity, 'spilling-your-guts' type of exploration - if couples talk about things that get them upset it will be to each other and not to the group."

"I hope that at the end of the eight weeks people will find their relationships more alive and kicking - less dull. Though of course that doesn't always mean improved."

DR. CLAUNCH said the program has "an experimental flavor because we really don't know yet how it will be accepted" and added: "It's not designed as a substitute for marriage counseling or psychotherapy."

Pastor Kaltreider suggested, in that regard, that by the time marriage partners

ask for counseling their relationship often has deteriorated to a stage beyond saving.

"In this workshop," agreed Dr. Claunch, "we're working to prevent and facilitate growth and excitement."

The clergyman said the workshop is not the only new move in its outreach program. "Our congregation," he reported, "also has named Dr. Arlen Schroeder, an Antioch

member and a sociology instructor at Oakland Community College, to serve as an educational consultant to the local church, to other Lutheran Church in America congregations in the northwest cluster and to all Farmington churches."

Antioch, he added, also is looking for a political scientist who would work with the church on a volunteer basis to head a ministry to a political society.

Rice Schedules India Workshop

"India - One-sixth of the World's People" will be the topic for an October workshop scheduled by Rice Memorial United Methodist Church, Beech Daly and Eight Mile, Redford Township.

The Rev. Hugh C. White, former pastor of the First United Methodist Church of Farmington and now of Ypsilanti, will tell about his recent trip to India when he

speaks at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 3.

On Wednesday, Oct. 11, Mrs. Shalini Donald will speak on the role of women in India today. A native of India, she now makes her home in Mt. Pleasant.

The program Tuesday, Oct. 17, will feature a film on India, and the workshop will be concluded Oct. 24 with a sampling of Indian culture, including music, poetry, stories and crafts.

The public may attend all programs in the series.

The statistical report concerning the financial condition of the Plymouth Community School District is submitted in accordance with Section 216, Act 269, Public Acts 1965, as amended and is compiled from the data submitted to the Michigan Department of Education and from the annual audit conducted by the firm of Sutherland and Yoe, Certified Public Accountants.

The report substantiates that the Plymouth Community School District is continuing to operate on a sound, financial basis. Serious cuts have been made in the 1972-73 proposed budget to balance receipts with expenditures. We have striven to maintain the integrity of the instructional budget. Most of the cuts have been absorbed in delayed maintenance, operational and capital outlay accounts.

The immediate future reflects a growth spiral which will double the present enrollment within the next five years. Recent studies show an increase of 1,649 students for school year 1973-74 and a student population of 18,786 in school year 1976-77. It is anticipated that a need exists for approximately \$22 million in new construction to support this growth. Other means such as extended school year and extended school days will be explored by citizen committees and the Board of Education to get maximum use of existing facilities. It is our desire to continue to bring to the youth of the Plymouth Community the finest education possible within the framework of existing revenues.

The Plymouth Board of Education meetings are on the second Monday and the fourth Tuesday of every month. Your participation and presence are most welcome.

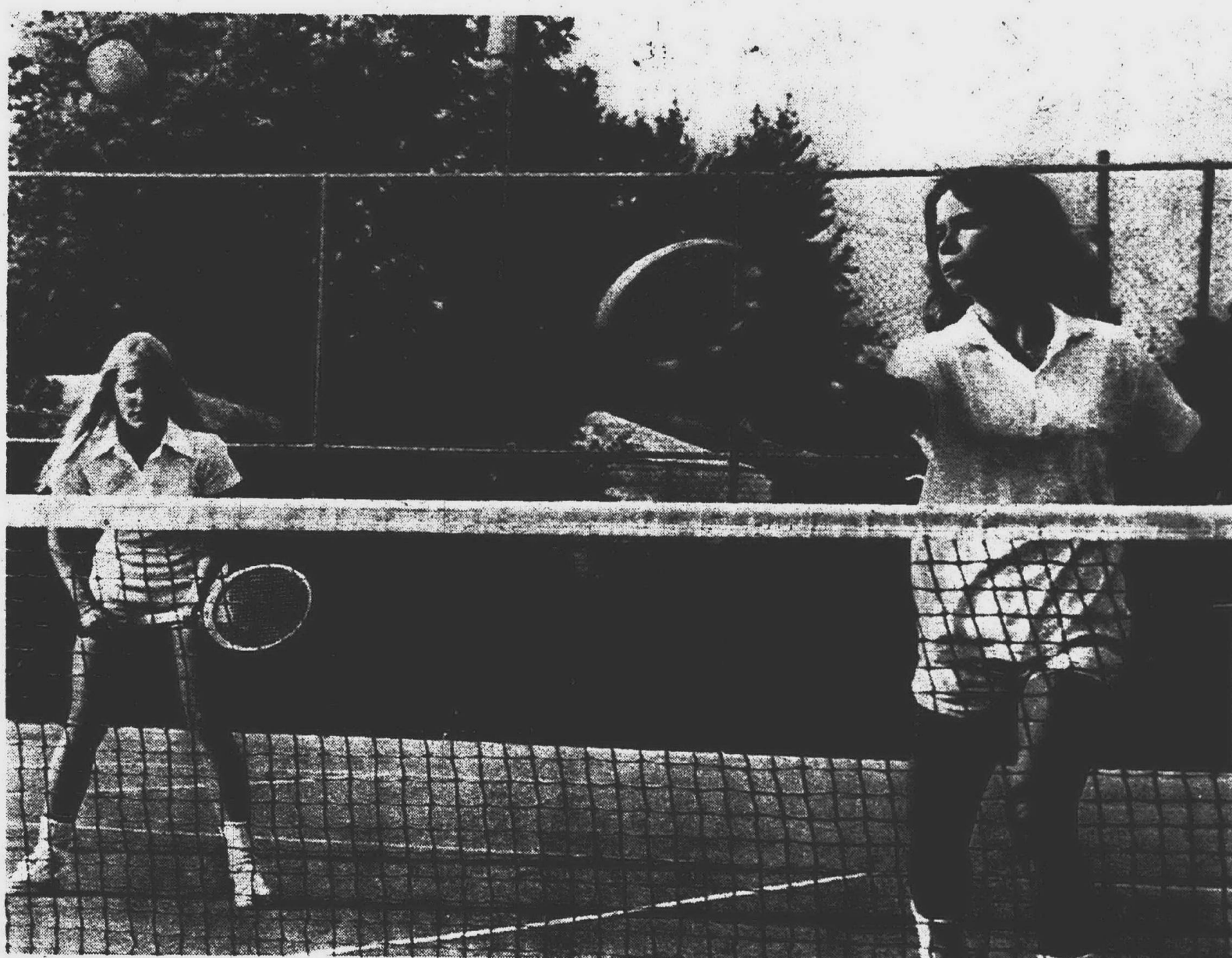
The deciding match went to Karen Meyer and Vicki Murray of Franklin over Layne Thiemann and Sue Stevens, 8-5.

Harrison Sweeps By John Glenn

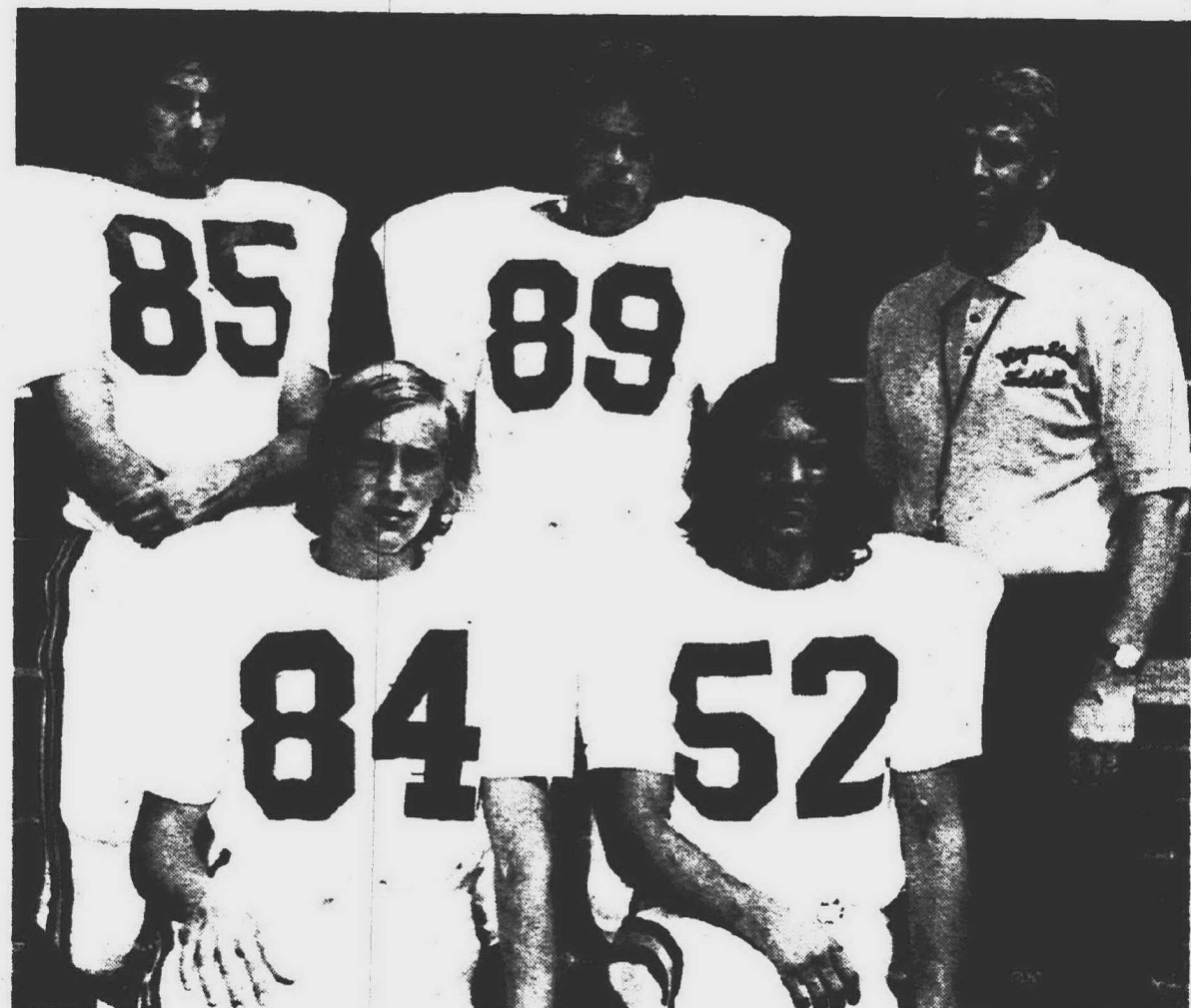

Turf Tips, Quips

Unlike the Michigan Mile, which had to be split into two divisions because of the large entry, the \$35,000 added Damsel stakes at the Detroit Race Course today (Saturday) drew 14 three-year-old fillies. Two of them are fresh from track record performances a week ago at the DRC.

Spray, owned by Kentucky's Claiborne Farm, sped to a mile and 70 mark of 1:39.2 in running away with the Damsel Prep and William H. Floyd's Fairway Flyer equaled the track standard for a mile and an eighth in the \$50,000 Milette Handicap with a clocking of 1:47.2.

Including Spray and Fairway Flyer, who came in a week early, 11 of the 14 in the Damsel are ship-ins from all parts of the United States and Canada.

Only three have been locally stabled at the DRC and Racing Secretary Norris Gwin labels it as the largest percentage of ship-ins ever in a DRC stake.

Among those coming from a distance are Mrs. B. L. Gil-martin's Barely Even and S. G. Olsson's Dancing Double, both shipping in from New Jersey.

Others are: C. J. Jackson's Happy Victory from Canada, Windfield Farm's Susceptible and Buckland Farm's Never Hula from New York, and C. C. Madden's Len Lee from Chicago.

The fillies will race over a distance of a mile and a six-

teenth with the stake listed as the eighth event on the 10-race program.

THE QUESTION of whether the Detroit Race Course will start its daily racing programs earlier for the remainder of the season will be answered at the end of next week.

Vice President and General Manager Paul Ryder, who has more or less let it be known that he favors a 2 p.m. start, will have questionnaires handed out to the patrons during the week asking for their opinions on post times.

The questionnaire will ask patrons to determine whether they prefer a 1 p.m., 1:30 p.m., 2 p.m., 2:30 p.m., 3 p.m., or the current 3:30 p.m.

Originally the 3:30 p.m. post, or what is generally considered twilight racing, started under the defunct Detroit Racing Association during World War II to give war plant workers a chance to relax in the late afternoon and early evening.

It was continued after the war for the simple reason that most racing fans had become adjusted to later racing and appeared to prefer it.

The DRC did try an early post two or three years ago but quickly abandoned it when wagering and attendance took a big dip.

However, even with a late post, attendance and wagering are at the lowest level in years and the DRC management feels that any change will be for the better.

Be that as it may, it appears from talking with folks at the races that they would like an earlier post. There isn't any question that many of the mutual help would. They are the ones that double up and work the trots at night. An earlier post for the runners means they would get off earlier and have more time to get to Hazel Park.

INCIDENTALLY, the Hazel Park management has set an 8:15 p.m. post starting next Monday.

The reason was that management feels, at this late time, that it's better to get customers out of the track by 11:30 p.m. or earlier.

The only fault with that reasoning is that if folks should get out of the track earlier now then why wasn't such action taken at the start of the meeting?

The same people that will be

home earlier beginning Monday so that they can get more sleeping time are the same ones that have been attending the harness races since opening night.

Any excuse is better than none but a lame one leaves one with the thought that there has to be other reasons that weren't stated... such as a decided drop in crowds and wagering since Labor Day.

'TIS SAD NEWS that one hears from Jackson Raceway where popular Lou Parlato, longtime program director at Wolverine, Northville Downs and Jackson at Hazel Park until the Sports Service cut him off, is critically ill in Foote Hospital.

Lou, who has been in the Michigan harness racing picture as far back as the late '40s at Northville, was stricken with a number of ailments, all serious, and is under intensive care.

He was stricken while at work on the programs at the track and was rushed to the hospital by Rollo Sims, another oldtimer at Jackson Raceway and a longtime friend, and Mrs. Parlato.

Latest reports from the hospital are that Lou is still in very critical condition. He isn't allowed visitors but we feel sure that Mary and Lou would enjoy messages from friends.

Those wishing to send get well cards can write to Lou Parlato, fourth floor, Foote Hospital, Jackson, Mich.

We hope he is swamped with letters and that he is able to sit up and read them. At this moment he isn't... his condition is that poor.

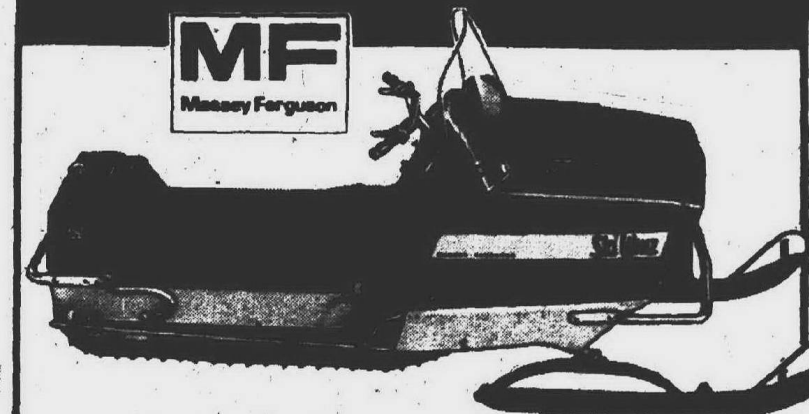



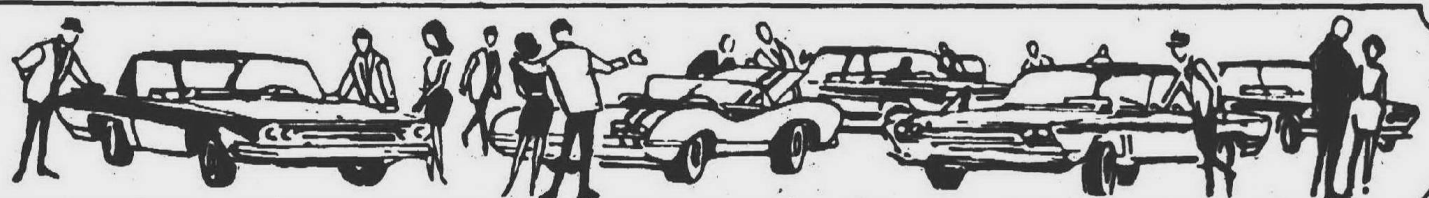

Rita To Play Again For Redford

The Redford Township Music Society is bringing back its foremost guest soloist for a return concert, but this time instead of a few hundred people, it's hoping that 4,000 will turn out to hear her.

The society is sponsoring a concert by the 14-year-old Rita Reichman at 8:30 p.m., Saturday, Nov. 4, in the Masonic Auditorium, Detroit. Tickets are \$3, \$5 and \$8.50. They are now available at the auditorium box office, Hudson's and Grinnell's.

MISS REICHMAN'S performance with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra at Meadow Brook in August drew the largest crowd of the season and won acclaim from the critics, as well as a standing ovation from the audience. This marked her professional debut.

But Miss Reichman made her Detroit area debut in 1963,

when she was featured in a concert with the Redford Civic Symphony, which is sponsored by the society, in Thurston High School. She played works by Mozart, Mendelssohn, Beethoven, Schumann, Haydn and some of her own compositions.

Born in Melbourne, Australia, into a musical family, Miss Reichman could play everything she heard by the time she was 2½. She began formal music lessons at the age of 3½ and could read music in four weeks, although she did not know the alphabet.

At the age of four, she began studying theory and composition with one of Melbourne's leading composers, and soon after she performed for the concert pianist Manfred Clynes, who wanted to recommend her for a full scholarship at the Juilliard School of Music in New York City.

But her mother decided that she was too young to leave the family, and it was not until 1968 that Miss Reichman came to the U.S. with her mother and her brother, David, and sister, Shirley.

THE THREE children received scholarships to Interlochen Arts Academy and Mrs. Reichman became a language teacher there.

Miss Reichman performed for the Michigan Music Teachers Convention and attracted the attention of Mrs. Floyd Holtenga, a piano teacher who was then president of the Redford Township Music Society. It was Mrs. Holtenga who invited her to perform and established the society's keen interest in her success. At that

time, she received rave reviews.

For the last three years, Miss Reichman has been studying under the famed pianist Rudolf Serkin at the Curtis Institute of Music, Philadelphia, Pa.

She has been soloist with the Philadelphia Orchestra and in 1971 she performed at a state dinner in the White House.

The music society is entering its 25th anniversary year. Formed in the spring of 1948, it has always worked to foster youthful talent, and plans for the concert schedule this year highlight these.

THE FIRST concert is set for Oct. 22 in Redford Union High School, with Brian Moon as trumpet soloist. Brian is an 11th grader at Stevenson High

School, and is first trumpet with the Livonia Youth Symphony.

The second Redford Civic Symphony Concert will feature a young and talented flute soloist, Linda Bamford. This will be Dec. 17. The Ford Motor Chorus will also be featured.

The soloist for Feb. 25 is still to be announced and the soloist for April 15 will be Miss Reichman's brother, David, who is a talented violinist.

The first two concerts will be in Redford Union High School and the second two will be in Thurston.

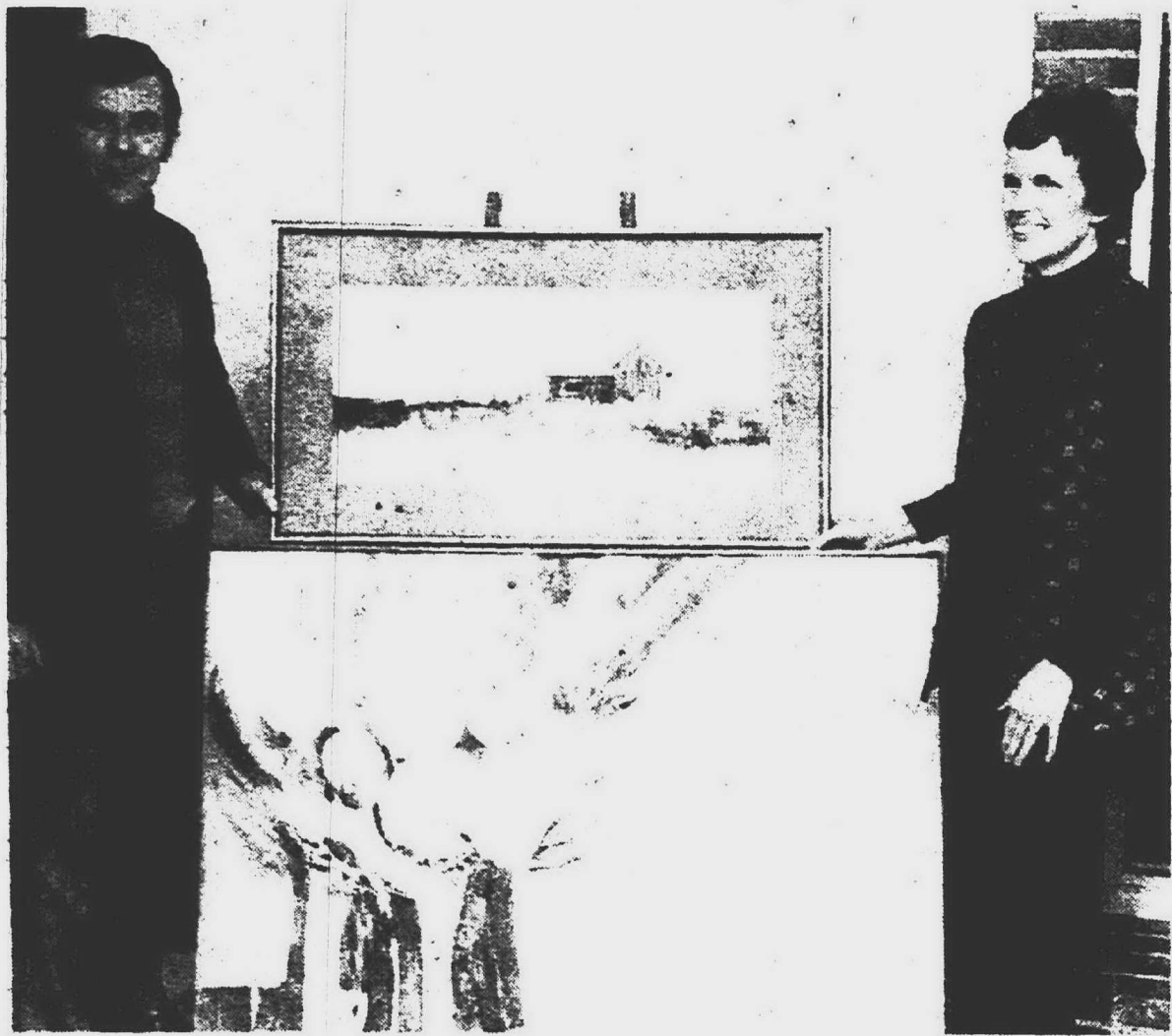

regulate an additional \$45, on top of their regular car license fee. This money goes into the state's uninsured motorist fund. Insured drivers pay only one dollar into the fund.

"A lot of people think that when they pay that \$45 they are getting some kind of insurance," Wingard says. "They aren't. They still ought to have at least liability insurance for claims against them by other drivers. Without it, they are personally liable."

Another misunderstanding that needs clearing up, Wingard says, is what happens when you change auto insurance companies.

"Suppose you have a policy with me," Wingard says, "and on its anniversary date I send you a notice that the premium is due. In the meantime, you've decided to insure with another company, so you merely ignore my notices, thinking that your policy with me will expire for non-payment. But actually you must return the policy to me so that I can cancel it. Otherwise you are still insured with us and still liable for payment of the premium."

"Most people don't know this, and it creates a lot of misunderstandings." Auto insurance in Michigan may change radically if "no-fault" insurance is legislated. There are many definitions of the term, and at this writing it is impossible to say what form, if any, will be adopted here.

But we can, nevertheless, explain the theory of no-fault insurance.

The present system of settling accident damage is based on a "fault" system. There was an accident. Someone must have caused it. That person should compensate the victim for his losses.

Stated that way, it is beautifully fair and simple. In practice, however, it can be a different story. First, there is the question, "Whose fault was it?" If you rear-end a car at a stop light, the fault is fairly clear -- you should have stopped sooner. But what if two cars sideswipe on a two-lane road. Who crossed the center line? Prove it. What if both of them were over the line?

Damage to a car is relatively easy to assess. But what is a life worth? What is an eye worth, or a leg, or paralysis? Or pain? How can a person prove that he is suffering? How can you prove that he isn't?

Too frequently, these questions must be resolved in court. This pits driver against driver, insurance company against insurance company, lawyer against lawyer. The issues are too often decided by the relative skills of lawyers, the willingness of companies to compromise or the willingness of plaintiffs to exaggerate injuries. The results are often long delays in settlement and capricious awards. Persons who deserve compensation may get nothing; those who may deserve very little can be handed an exorbitant amount by a sympathetic jury.

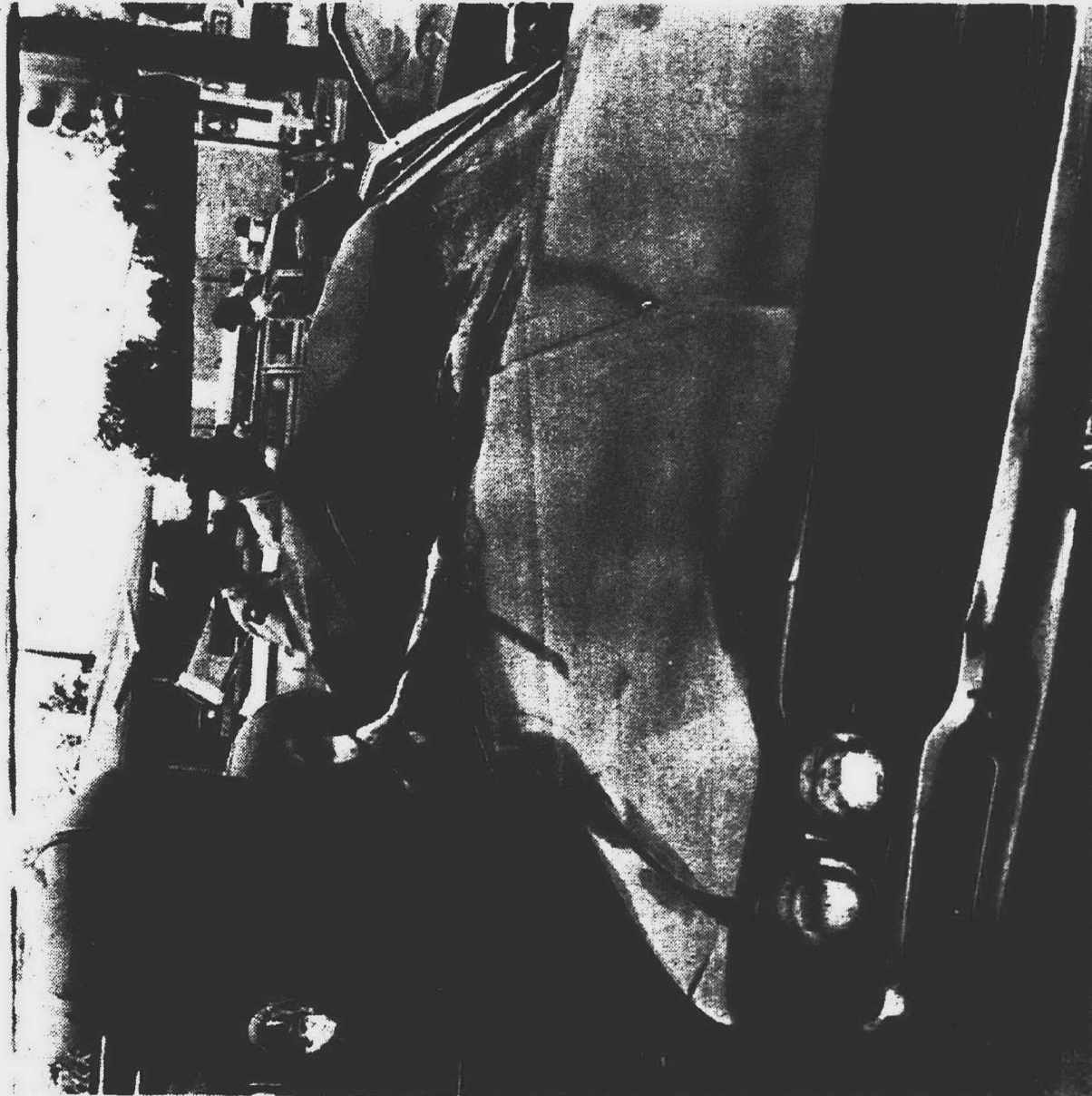
All this adds up to waste -- waste of money, waste of time. And it adds to the cost of driving your car, because it adds to the cost your auto insurance.

No-fault insurance, in its purest form, would eliminate the question of who caused the accident. It would eliminate the necessity of trying to recover losses from the other driver or his insurance company. Instead, each driver would collect from his own insurance company. Compensation for the intangible "pain and suffering" would be eliminated and the motorists would be paid only for their actual out-of-pocket losses, such as medical bills and damage to their car.

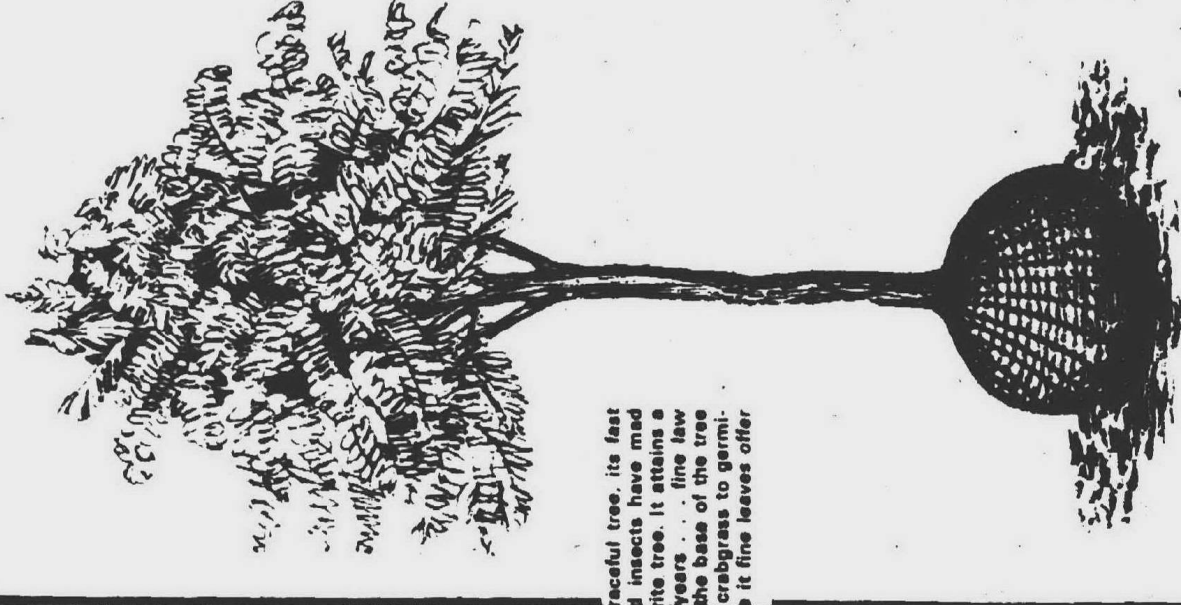
Proponents of no-fault say this would eliminate claim-padding and bring early settlements, which are now sometimes prolonged for years.

This description of no-fault insurance is over-simplified. There are many ways that it can be modified, but the above illustrates the principle.

Opponents of no-fault argue that it may make claims too easy to collect and bring about a general increase in all auto insurance rates. This would penalize the good driver, forcing him to contribute money for the benefit of the accident-prone.

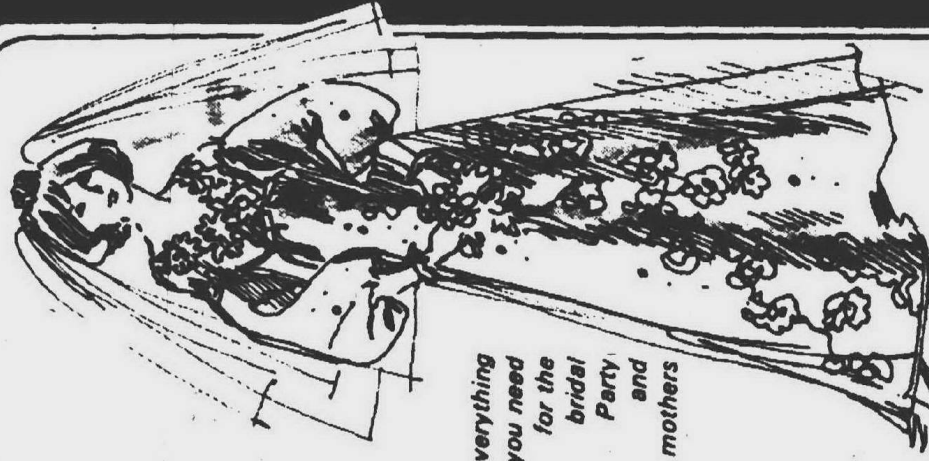

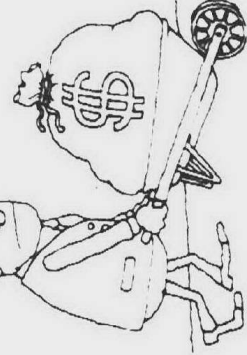

What is Insurance?

"Each man may subject himself to a small deprivation, in order that no man may be subjected to a great loss." This graceful definition of insurance was uttered in England's House of Commons in 1825 and hasn't been improved upon since. Although the insurance business has grown greatly in size and complexity, the basic principle remains the same: a group of people contribute small sums to create a pool of money. The few contributors stricken by disaster receive payments from the money pool to compensate them, at least partly, for their loss.

The need for insurance seems to be almost instinctive in man. In prehistoric hunting tribes, the hunter who bagged a deer shared it with those who didn't. He knew that inevitably the day would come when he would return empty handed and need to share the bag of a luckier neighbor. This communal sharing of food was a way of spreading risk, and that, is what insurance is all about -- transferring risk. Among the primitive hunters, the risk of going hungry was transferred from the unlucky individual to the whole tribe.

By the dawn of written history, insurance had become pretty sophisticated. The Babylonians had a system whereby a trader who organized a caravan could relieve himself of the risk of being robbed. The trader had made a loan in the first place to buy the goods for his venture. And, even as today, he would pay interest on the loan. But for an additional sum, the money-lender would agree to cancel the loan in the event that the trader lost his goods to bandits. This transferred the risk of loss from the trader to the money-lender.

The Phoenicians, Greeks, Romans and Hindus all had similar insurance systems to cover the movement of goods by both land and sea. Indeed, the history of insurance is almost the history of civilization. As new needs were recognized, someone quickly figured out a way to cover them with insurance. The first fire insurance office was opened in London shortly after the Great Fire of 1666. No doubt fire insurance sold well then.

In 1896, there were four automobiles in the U.S. Two of them were in St. Louis, Mo. You guessed it -- the two St. Louis motorists managed to run into each other. Someone saw the handwriting on the wall and two years later the first auto insurance was issued.

The first accident policy in the United States was issued in 1863 to one James Bolton of Hartford, Conn. It covered Mr. Bolton during the two-block stroll from his home to the postoffice. The premium was 2 cents. Today, insurance has been refined and expanded in ways that would have dazzled those traders of ancient Babylon. The money pools are created

and managed by large insurance companies which actively solicit business. And these companies intend to make a profit, both by investing the funds in the money pool and by seeing to it that their income from premiums is greater than their outgo in claims.

Today you can insure your TV tube, your jewelry, your little finger your crops against hail, your parade against rain. Several decades ago, Actress Betty Grable made headlines when she insured her then-spectacular legs for a million dollars.

Many golfers carry hole-in-one insurance against the day when the impossible happens and their tee shot finds its way into the cup on a distant green. The insurance pays for the traditional drinks-for-everybody that the lucky golfer is obliged to buy in the clubhouse after the game.

Some of those early Babylonian insurance men no doubt took a terrible financial licking. Having an entire caravan wiped out by bandits could well have wiped out the insurer too.

In Colonial America, the first mutual fire insurance company, the Friendly Society of Charleston, S.C., founded in 1735, went broke in 1740 when one of its members was the victim of a bad fire. Such was the fate of many early insurance companies.

Today, the spreading of risk by insurers is a fine art with little chance for the miscalculation that bankrupted Charleston's Friendly Society. Modern insurance companies have honed the mathematics of the business to a point that almost nothing unexpected happens.

All insurance is based on two mathematical propositions: (1) The law of probability and (2) the theory of large numbers.

Nearly everyone is acquainted with the law of probability. It says that when you flip a coin you will get heads half the time and tails half the time, or that of the cars you meet on the road, one in 10 will have a license plate ending with two identical numbers.

The theory of large numbers says that the more times you flip the coin or the more cars you look at, the more accurate the law of probability becomes. If you flip the coin 10 times, you may get seven heads and three tails, far from a 50-50 ratio. But if you flip it 10,000 times you cannot avoid coming very close to a 50-50 ratio.

So it is with insurance. Insurance actuaries know that out of 1,000 homes, a certain number will be damaged each year by fire. Furthermore, they know pretty closely the amount of damage that will be done. It may be that of the 1,000 homes in your neighborhood, none of them will be damaged by fire. But the theory of large numbers says that if enough homes are included -- 10,000, 100,000 or a million -- then the insurance

the Future of Auto Insurance



The statistics of auto accidents are appalling. More than half of us (56%) will be in an auto accident in the next three years. Within five years, 75 per cent of us will have been in an accident. Within 10 years, the figure will reach 94 per cent. And within the next 20 years, 99 per cent will have been in an accident.

In effect, virtually every driver is assured of being in an accident sometime. It may be a minor fender bender. Or it may be a fatality -- 55,000 Americans die each year in auto accidents.

Besides the grief and suffering they cause, auto accidents cost money. The Department of Transportation estimates it at well over 5 billion dollars a year. Who pays the bill?

You pay it, through your auto insurance.

So it behooves you to know what your auto insurance will and will not do for you.

There are four general areas of concern for every motorist. These are (1) injury to yourself or your passengers (2) damage to your car (3) injury to others (4) damage to other cars.

You are not required by law to have any of these coverages. But

sured motorist. And it is probably worth while.

"We see a lot of those cases," Wingard says.

The best thing an insurance buyer can do is to sit down and read his policy thoroughly until he understands it. Any questions that remain should be put to the insurance agent. But remember, the agent can interpret only. The last word on your coverage is in the policy. It means exactly what it says -- no more, no less.

"A lot of people don't understand their car insurance," Wingard says. "Suppose we have insured a driver for bodily injury to others and property damage to others, but not for collision damage to his own car. Suppose he gets smacked in the rear end at a stop light. A lot of times these people will come to us to help collect from the guy that hit them. But we can't. Since we didn't insure his car against damage, we have no legal interest in the case. For us to get into it would be to act as attorneys, and we can't do that."

Auto insurance policies are written in great detail because of the difficulties in defining all the mishaps that can befall a car and its driver. Consider the following: You are driving down the road in a violent windstorm and a tree falls in your path. You hit it. Or -- you are driving down the road in a violent windstorm and a tree falls on top of your car. What's the difference? If you hit the tree, that's a collision. If the tree fell on you, that's a falling object. Both may be covered by your auto insurance. But the amount you may

"Take a look at your needs," he says. "For example, you can get passenger medical and hospital expenses if you're injured in your car. But maybe you already have those areas covered by Blue Cross and Blue Shield, and don't need them as part of your car insurance."

"You can get road trouble service coverage that pays the cost of having a tow truck come start your car or change a tire. Many men feel that they don't need it, but I think a woman who drives alone much should have it, unless she's enthusiastic about changing tires in the dark."

You can also insure yourself against injury or damage by an uninsured motorist. But the amount you may

collect could differ greatly. The collision clause of your policy may have a \$200 deductible. But the comprehensive clause, under which the falling object would be covered, may have only a \$50 deductible. So if the damage were \$150, you would collect nothing for a collision, but \$100 for a falling object.

Such are the intricacies of defining damage to a car.

Deductibles are an important means of holding down the cost of your auto insurance. A deductible merely says that below a certain amount of damage, you pay it yourself. Above that amount, the insurance company pays.

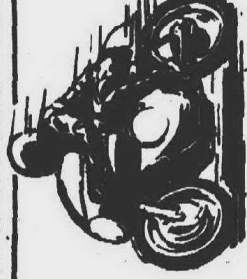
Deductibles for collision damage range from as low as \$50 upward to \$500. Naturally, the higher the deduction, the lower your rates.

Wingard's advice for insurance buyers is to "take the highest deductible you can afford."

What you can afford is, of course, a personal decision. If you feel that you could, at any unexpected time, lay out \$200 for car repairs without upsetting your family's finances, but that \$500 would create a serious strain, then \$200 is the level for you.

Most insurance men point out that insurance is not intended as a convenience to reimburse you for every minor mishap, but rather a protection against major catastrophe. There are a couple of other misconceptions about auto insurance pinpointed by Wingard. One concerns uninsured motorists. Drivers who cannot show proof of insurance by a recognized company are required to

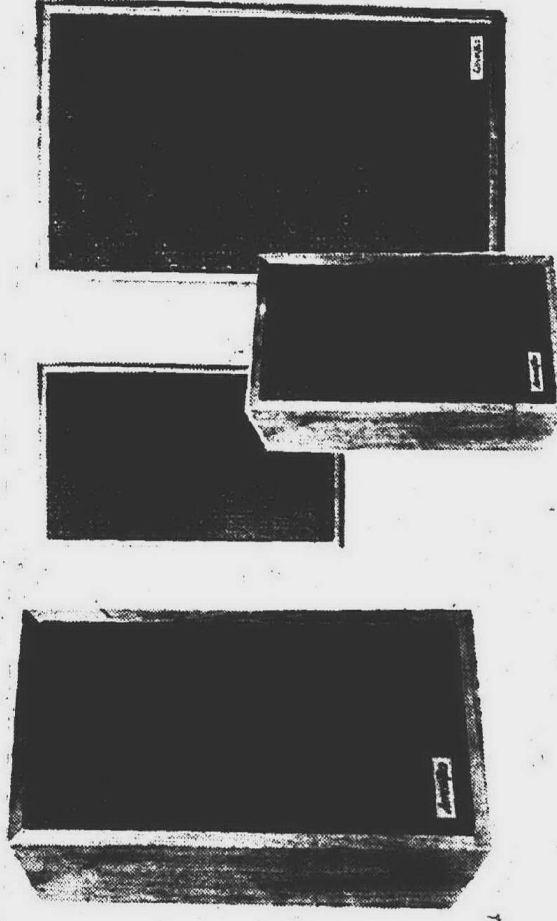

LIFE INSURANCE



"What's the death rate around here?" a stranger asked an elderly resident of a small town.

"Same as everywhere else," replied the old-timer. "One to a person."

It's as accurate a statement as you'll find about the supreme fact of life--everyone has to go sometime and everyone knows it. And many people, particularly bread-winning men, fear that their demise will leave their families in a dire financial condition. So they buy life insurance.

Unfortunately, they often buy it in an unplanned and random fashion. There are certain things that life insurance can do and others that it cannot do, and it is well to know the difference. The first question a man often asks himself is: "How much life insurance should I have?" This seems to presuppose a formula, perhaps based on income, or the number of kids, or your age.

But there is no such formula, and insurance men will be the first to tell you so.

you for the next year.

Permanent insurance may take many forms. A 30-pay life policy, for example, means that you pay premiums for 30 years. After that, you no longer pay premiums, but the policy remains in force. When you die, your beneficiaries will be paid the face amount of the policy. Meanwhile, however, you may decide to surrender the policy for its accumulated cash value. The amount of the cash value depends on many variables, but the point is that this kind of insurance does have a monetary value if you care to use it.

Permanent insurance can be looked upon as forced savings and as a minor investment because interest plays a part in determining its monetary value. But life insurance should not be regarded as a prime way to get a return on your money. Securities and other types of investments, including savings accounts, usually pay more.

The difference between the cost of term insurance and permanent is dramatic. Let's take a man age 35 who decides to put \$300 a year into life insurance. For his \$300 he can get \$100,000 worth of term insurance, or \$17,000 worth of ordinary life insurance.

At the end of the year, his term insurance will expire and the \$300 will be, in effect, wasted -- he'll have nothing to show for it. At the end of the year, his ordinary life would have accumulated a small cash value.

So, as Gotch points out, the breadwinner should decide how much immediate death benefit he wants and how much reserve he needs for the future and combine the two types of insurance in a suitable proportion.

Not everyone sees a need for life insurance.

"I've run into cases," Gotch says, "where the guy will say, 'Once I'm gone, I couldn't care less about what happens to the rest of 'em.'"

"That's usually the first time the wife has ever heard him express that idea. That's when I start looking for the door."

Gotch says that an important and often overlooked type of insurance is disability income insurance.

"Actually, you have a better chance of being disabled than dying. And it can cost a lot more, too."

This kind of insurance is sold to cover disability from accident and sickness or accident only.

"A common form is to provide 5 years of income from disability by sickness and lifetime from accident. This is on the theory that sickness will usually resolve itself, one way or another, in less than 5 years, but an accident can cripple for the remainder of a long life," Gotch says.

Disability insurance can also be arranged to meet your mortgage payments or pay your rent while disabled.

Health insurance is sold by many life insurance companies. Some of them will confess, however, that it is not their favorite form of business.

"It's almost impossible to keep up with health costs," said one insurance man. "They keep going up, and they vary greatly from one area to another. Southeast Michigan is high in medical costs."

Always, bear in mind Jim Gotch's formula: "Ask yourself, 'What's best for me?'"

companies' statistics, gained from the previous history of home fires, inexorably hold true.

With this knowledge, the insurance companies can then set your fire insurance premium -- enough to pay your share of the companies' predictable losses, plus a profit for the companies. In return, you receive the knowledge that if your house happens to be one of the few damaged or destroyed by fire, you will be compensated in large part for your loss.

Life insurance is based not on whether you are going to die, but when. A person 20 years old has about 50 more years to live -- and pay insurance premiums. A person of 50 can look forward to about 24 more years of life. Therefore the person of 20 can buy a given amount of life insurance for a far smaller annual premium than the person of 50 would pay for the same amount.

Like other forms of insurance, life insurance is based on a set of mathematical certainties. Of each thousand infants born, a certain number will die during their first year. A few more will not survive their second year, and so on through each year of life to 100 and beyond. And once you have attained a given age, the insurance companies can tell you how many persons of that age will die each year and of the survivors how much longer they can statistically expect to live.

These somewhat depressing statistics have a bright side to them, though: the older you are, the older you will probably become.

For example, the 20-year-old has a life expectancy of slightly more than 50 years, making him about 70 at death. But a 70-year-old has a life expectancy of more than 10 years.

Why? Well, one way of looking at it is that the 70-year old has already missed his chances of dying younger while the 20-year-old must still survive many hazards before he reaches the age of 70.

Today in the U.S., the average age at death for men is 67.1 years; for women, it is 74.6 years. These figures are nothing to be proud of. Among the nations of the world, the U.S.

ranks 24th for men and ninth for women. Swedish men live five years longer than their U.S. counterparts.

In trying to pinpoint the reasons for the early departure of American men, experts tend to single out too much stress, too many cigarettes and too much booze. Some insurance companies appear to agree, and have advertised special low-premium life insurance policies for non-drinkers and non-smokers.

Americans are the world's greatest buyers of insurance. We buy 80 per cent of all the personal insurance in the world and pay \$200 billions a year in premiums for it. Canadians are the world's second largest insurance buyers.

Why do Americans dominate the world insurance scene? Because insurance is mainly a middle-class need. The very poor can't afford it and the very rich don't need it. In the U.S., the middle class is large, relatively solvent, and has acquired a great many possessions -- houses, cars, boats, snowmobiles, trailers, art collections, credit cards, summer cottages -- you name it. Prudent owners of these possessions seek to protect them against loss or destruction and themselves against liability for the damage they may do to others.

About half of the world's population lives in communist or socialist nations where the insurance function is handled by the state. Another 30 per cent of the world's people live in underdeveloped countries where the level of income and the number of personal possessions does not yet warrant the development of an insurance industry. That leaves Western Europe and North America as the prime markets for personal insurance.

The diversity of insurance today means that you can insure almost anything against anything, if you're willing to pay the price. But for most people, their insurance concerns center around their car, their homes and themselves. Yet, despite the importance of these insurance policies, they are not well understood by the people who buy them. In fact, in most households, insurance probably rates as the largest expenditure about which the least is known.

Ordinary Life Policy -- Also called straight life policy. Insurance to be paid for throughout the entire lifetime of the insured.

Actual Cash Value -- The value of property covered by insurance at the time of loss.

Actuary -- Technical expert in the mathematics of life insurance.

Annuity -- A retirement income policy, whereby for a premium, either lump sum or in installments, the company promises to pay a certain amount per month or per year after you retire.

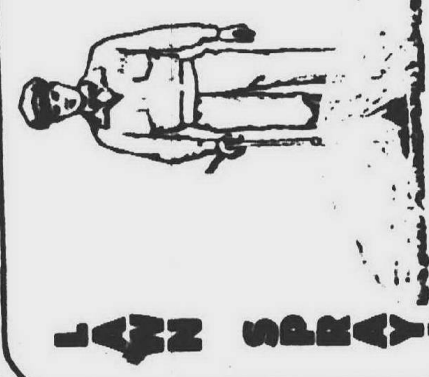
Automobile Assigned Risk -- A program under which auto liability insurance is available to drivers unable to buy such insurance in the voluntary market. In Michigan, it's called the Michigan Automobile Insurance Placement Facility.

Beneficiary -- The person to whom the proceeds of an insurance policy are to be paid. **Cash Surrender Value** -- Amount of cash paid to the insured if he surrenders a life insurance policy before it reaches maturity.

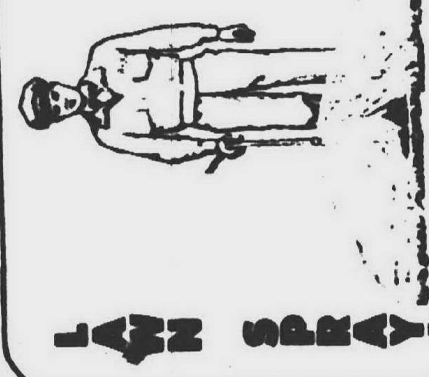
