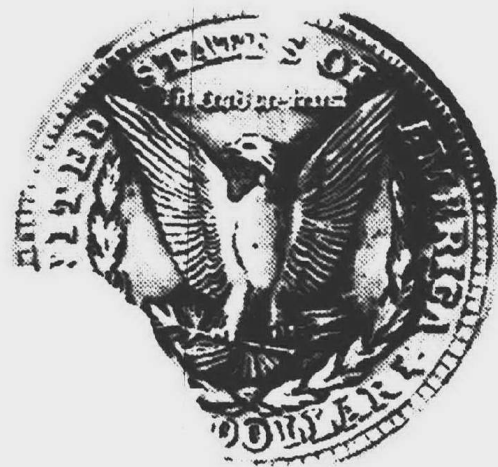

### CANTON TOWNSHIP

Canton Township planning commissioners this week got a preview of what's to come in the weeks ahead over the controversial rezoning for a regional shopping center and housing development at Sheldon and Joy Rds.

Although not a scheduled agenda item, the rezoning question came up for discussion at the last moment Tuesday when township hall was deluged with phone calls about the proposal announced recently by Detroit builder Dominic Mocer.

Spokesmen for the developer were asked to appear to answer questions and to give a repeat performance of the presentation made before the planning

commission several weeks ago.

The session this week was by no means the public hearing that will be held after all initial procedural steps are followed in all rezoning cases, explained Bart Berg, commission vice chairman who filled in at the meeting for the absent chairman, George Lawton.

But even before the public hearing date is set, a report and recommendation from the township's planning consultant, Michael Manore, will have to be discussed, explained Berg to the capacity audience of residents largely from Canton's newer subdivisions that are in proximity to the development.

### MANORE'S REPORT

should be forthcoming soon since he now has all the area governmental reports that were requested to help the commission in its deliberation.

Following Manore's report, the date for the public hearing will be set. After that, the rezoning request will be referred to the Wayne County Planning Commission for a recommendation before official action is taken by the township board.

At issue is 195 acres zoned residential, bounded by Joy Rd. to the north, Sheldon to the west and Morton Taylor Rd., as yet unopened, on the east.

Mocer, who has three other developments under way in the township, has proposed an enclosed-type mall that would compare in scope to the

Livonia Mall and be even larger than nearby Westland Center. Along with the shopping center are plans for apartments and several types of cluster housing, buffered by a small development of single-family homes.

Included also in the development are an entertainment complex with three theaters, a bowling alley and several restaurants. Nearby would be a small office building complex, two mid-rise (seven story maximum) apartment buildings and low rent garden-type apartments for senior citizens.

RESIDENTS FROM nearby Windsor Park and Old Plymouth subdivisions jammed the township fire

hall, where commission meetings are held, to voice disapproval of the proposed project.

Traffic generated by the shopping center was one of the main concerns in the discussion punctuated by frequent cries of "We don't want it built."

Residents charged that they are being hemmed in by shopping centers and that the township is failing to follow its master plan.

"The roads leading to a mall like this won't take that kind of traffic. They're country roads," argued one subdivision resident.

Manore told the Mail & Observer after the meeting that the traffic problem "was a serious drawback to the plan."

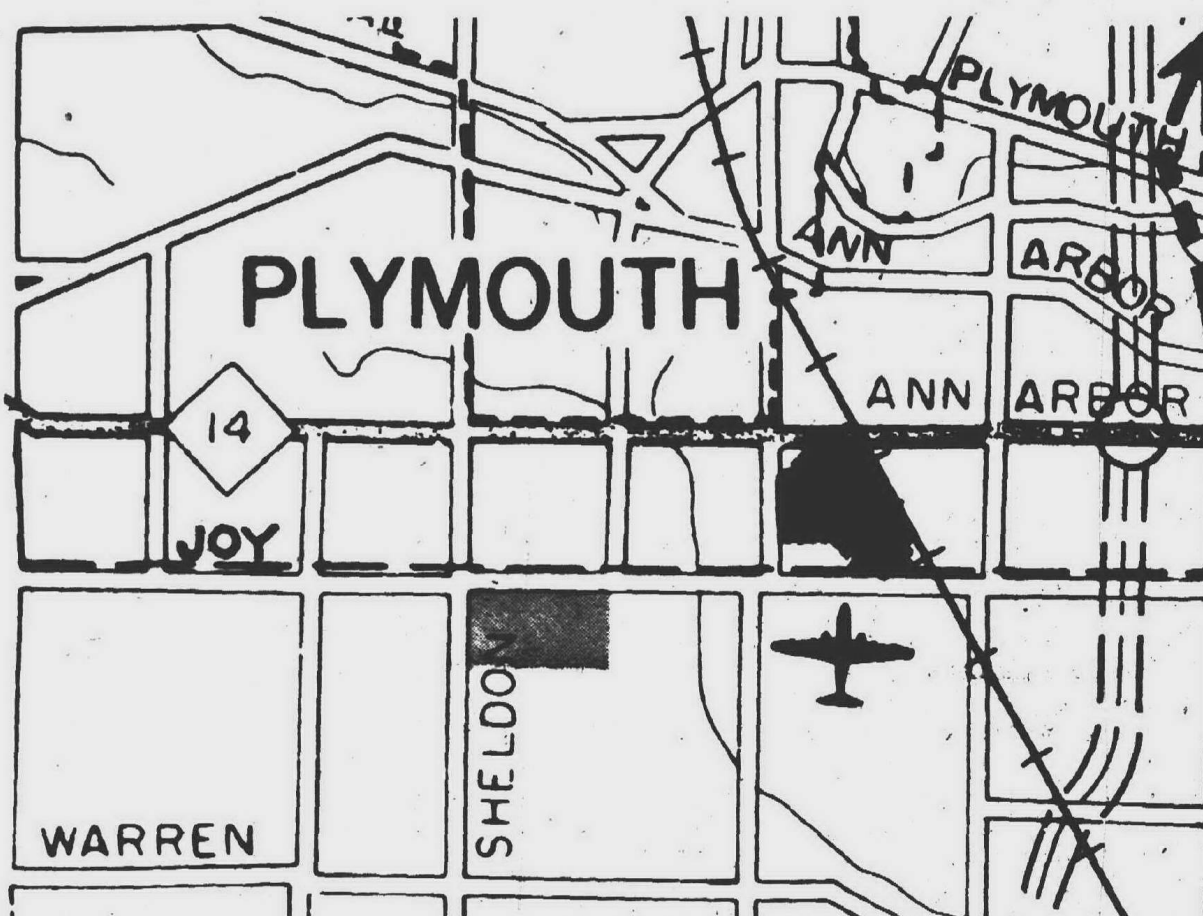
"Why rezone when there are already plenty of areas zoned for commercial development already?" asked another man.

A SHOPPING center of this magnitude and quality "will keep out the junk," answered Louis Stein, of Schostak Brothers, leasing agents for the development. Amplifying on his remarks, Stein said that if the Mocer development is approved, some of the other smaller shopping centers probably won't be built.

"Store owners will think twice about where to locate," he said.

"What I want to know is, what do I have to do to fight this project?" asked one man.

## Detroit Firm Building \$2 Million Plant Here

Put two football fields end to end, leaving room between them for the band, cheerleaders and pom-pom girls to entertain, and you can get a conception of the size of a \$2.4 million structure now under construction in Plymouth Township.

The Federal Pipe and Steel Corp. of 6464 E. McNichols, Detroit, is building this as a second warehouse facility, having selected a 16½ acre site in Gould Industrial Park because of the accessibility to the total metropolitan area which freeways now under construction will provide.

Morton Kiefer, Federal secretary-treasurer and a

partner in the firm's ownership with Saul Modell, president, said at least 75 persons will be employed here, with a potential of 150. In addition to the warehouse 715 feet long, 160 feet wide and 40 feet high there will be 6,000 square feet of office space. The structure is located on Joy Rd., east of Lilley Rd.

FEDERAL IS a distributor of structural steel, pipe, building and plumbing supplies, and Kiefer pointed out that the site will permit anticipated expansion as the company continues to grow.

A special siding from the C&O is being installed to

provide rail service.

Loren (Bud) Gould developed the 100-acre industrial park in the late '60s, saying it had a potential of adding \$20 million to the local tax base. Only 15 acres of the park are now unoccupied, said Gould Thursday in hailing Federal's project as the largest the township has seen since the Ford plant was built on Sheldon Rd.

The prosecution's contention that David LeRoy Bennett was bent upon robbery the morning of May 9 and became involved in a sequence of events culminating in the savage murder of Mrs. Vivian Berry brought 15 witnesses to the stand this week as their web of testimony took form.

Bennett's trial on a first-degree murder charge before Judge George E. Bowles in Wayne County Circuit Court now is in adjournment until Tuesday morning, court being closed Monday in observance of Columbus Day.

Assistant Prosecutor Robert H. Healy claimed to the jury after its membership was completed Wednesday, "There was a pattern to the boy's operations that morning. The picture painted by the sequence of events is one of tragedy and horror. It is a blood-curdling picture created by the known activities of the defendant."

"He went to three other houses first. Then he went to the Berry home at 50300 N. Territorial Rd. in Plymouth Township, robbed this woman, then stabbed her 70 times, took a six-pack of beer out of the refrigerator and then went back to classes at Plymouth High School."

THE BODY of Mrs. Berry, 43-year-old wife of Michael Berry, chairman of the Wayne County Road Commission, was found that afternoon next to two Rolls Royce auto-

mobiles in the garage of their home by their daughter, Gail, after she had returned from classes at Schoolcraft College.

The 17-year-old Bennett, of 14387 Northville Rd., Plymouth Township, had attended an auto shop class from 7:30 to 9:30 a.m. May 9 in Central School, according to the testimony of a former classmate, David H. Fuson.

Fuson said he had been with Bennett for the entire two-hour class. They then were to report to the new Plymouth High School at 10, but Fuson said Bennett failed to show up - and he next saw him there about noon.

THE PROSECUTION alleges that Bennett, driving a Comet owned by his uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Bennett of 48655 Gyde Rd., made these stops during that period:

First, at 8039 Ridge Rd., then at 8355 Ridge Rd., thirdly at 48650 Joy Rd. and finally, at the Berry home.

In all cases, Healy insists, Bennett complained of having car trouble and asked permission to use the telephone to call for repair service. The first three did not let the man in.

Mrs. Billie Jean Fischer of 8039 Ridge told of such an incident and identified Bennett from the witness stand as being the young man who had stopped.

Mrs. Shirley Ketchman of 8355 Ridge described similar circumstances but could not make identification.

James Eggenberger of 49850 Joy also recited such an incident and became the second witness to identify Bennett as having been the youth in question.

Eggenberger told the court that he had become suspicious, had written down the Comet's license number and later in the day had reported the incident - and number - to the sheriff's office. It was that lead which put deputies on the trail of the car and led to Bennett's arrest while at a typing class the same evening.

EMOTION RAN high in the early stages of the trial as Berry and then his daughter, Gail, took the stand to tell of the discovery of Mrs. Berry's bloodied body.

Alarmed because his wife had not answered his frequent phone calls to the home, Berry said that Gail - who had just walked in - answered the ring about 2 p.m.

He told Gail to look for her mother and bring her to the phone.

"Then I heard her screams," testified Berry, sobbing openly. "I started shouting over the phone for her to come to the phone, and when she did she was absolutely hysterical."

"I said, 'Go feel her pulse,' and she said, 'I can't; she's dead, Daddy.'"

At that point, Berry broke down completely and rushed weeping from the courtroom. The trial will resume at 9:30 Tuesday and is expected to continue into the following week.

# Political Scientist Will Address 51st Chamber Banquet

Dr. Edgar Wiggins Waugh, who retired as professor of political science in 1968 after 40 years at EMU, has received numerous accolades for his writings and public service but this will be his first major speaking engagement in Plymouth.

A native of Mississippi, he has studied at that state's university as well as at Eastern Michigan, Columbia, George Washington and the University of Michigan.

He also has been a consultant to congressional committees and in 1951 was the losing nominee of the Democratic party for state superintendent of public instruction in Michigan.

The meeting was called to order by the Supervisor Mr. Breen at 8:02 P.M. All members were present.

**READING, CORRECTING AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES.** Regular Meeting, September 12, 1972, regular meeting be approved as submitted. Supported by Mr. Ash and carried unanimously.

**READING, CORRECTING AND APPROVAL OF BILLS.** Mr. Ash moved that the bills in the Grand Total amount of \$88,505.91 be paid. Supported by Mr. Overholt and carried unanimously.

**OLD BUSINESS.** Awarding of Bids on Rear Yard Drain and Inlets in Woodbrook Sub No. 2. Mrs. Richardson read a letter from Mr. Hamill wherein he recommended the bid be awarded to Peter Basile Sons, Inc., in the amount of \$9,844.00. Mrs. Holmes moved that the Board accept the recommendation of the Township Engineer and award the bid to the lowest bidder, Peter Basile Sons, Inc., in the amount of \$9,844.00. **ORDINANCE NO. 384**  
**CITY OF PLYMOUTH,**  
**MICHIGAN**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 141, AS AMENDED, THE WATER ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH, MICHIGAN.

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Section 8 of Ordinance No. 141, as amended, the Water Ordinance of the City of Plymouth, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 8. The rates for services furnished by said Water Supply System shall be as follows:

Except as herein otherwise provided, water to be furnished by the System to each tap shall be measured by a meter installed and controlled by the City. Water charges shall be as follows for each quarterly (three-month) period, to-wit:

WATER RATES	
First	50,000 gallons - 78 cents per 1,000 gallons
Next	100,000 gallons - 66 cents per 1,000 gallons
All Over	150,000 gallons - 58 cents per 1,000 gallons

In addition to the above, there shall be a quarterly service charge, as follows:

For service with a 5/8-inch meter	\$ 3.15
For service with a 3/4-inch meter	4.75
For service with a 1-inch meter	6.45
For service with a 1 1/2-inch meter	11.85
For service with a 2-inch meter	18.55
For service with a 3-inch meter	34.15
For service with a 4-inch meter	55.60
For service with a 6-inch meter	109.75
For service with a 8-inch meter	240.00

The minimum quarterly charge, including the service charge, shall be on the basis of the following schedules:

5/8-inch meter, including 4,000 gallons	\$ 6.27
3/4-inch meter, including 6,000 gallons	9.43
1-inch meter, including 10,000 gallons	14.25
1 1/2-inch meter, including 24,000 gallons	30.57
2-inch meter, including 40,000 gallons	49.75
3-inch meter, including 91,000 gallons	100.21
4-inch meter, including 165,000 gallons	169.30
6-inch meter, including 369,000 gallons	341.77
8-inch meter, including 750,000 gallons	693.00

For non-metered water services rendered, or any other water service furnished, which is not covered by the above schedule, or miscellaneous services for which a special rate should be established, such rates shall be fixed by special resolution by the City Commission of the City of Plymouth.

(c)

For building or construction purposes, the following quarterly charges shall be made for the use of water from the time of installation of the service pipe until meter installation:

For 3/4-inch service pipe	\$ 10.00
For 1-inch service pipe	20.00
For 1 1/2-inch service pipe	45.00
For 2-inch service pipe	75.00
For 3-inch service pipe	125.00
For 4-inch service pipe	154.00
For 6-inch service pipe	345.00
For 8-inch service pipe	700.00

(d)

For water supplied to users outside the corporate limits of the City of Plymouth, the rates charged shall be as follows:

- For water supplied through meters, the service charge in accordance with the above schedule, and one and one-half (1 1/2) times the domestic rates as herein before set forth, except the water furnished Plymouth Township consumers shall only be charged for at the regular rate charged users within the corporate limits of the City.
- For water supplied otherwise than through meters, the rates shall be one and one-half (1 1/2) times the flat rates or charges adopted by resolution of the City Commission for such users within the corporate limits of the City. Except, however, water furnished to another municipal corporation shall be furnished at the regular rate charged users within the corporate limits of the City.

(e)

The City shall pay for all water used by it, or any of its departments, at the foregoing rates for users within the corporate limits of the City, and no free service shall be furnished by said Water Supply System to any person, firm or corporation, public or private.

For fire protection, the City shall pay out of its appropriate funds, the sum of Two Dollars (\$2.00) per year for each fire hydrant, said sum to be paid annually.

(f)

The term "tap" as used herein shall include any opening or outlet heretofore or hereafter made in the System, for the purpose of withdrawing water therefrom for any use, public or private, either commercial or domestic, excepting fire hydrants, and no taps shall be made to the System unless authorized by the proper City authorities.

APPLICATION FOR CONNECTION

(a)

Prior to the making of any connections to the System, application therefor shall be made to the office of the City Treasurer, upon forms furnished by the City.

(b)

Charges for all water service connections (taps) to users within the corporate limits of the City of Plymouth shall be Two-Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), or actual cost plus fifteen per cent (15%), whichever is greater. A deposit of Two-Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) shall be required at the time an application for tap is filed for use within the corporate limits of the City.

(c)

Charges for all water service connections (taps) to users outside the corporate limits of the City of Plymouth shall be Three-Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), or actual cost plus fifteen per cent (15%), whichever is greater. A deposit of Three-Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) shall be required at the time an application for a tap is filed for use other than within the corporate limits of the City.

SECURITY DEPOSIT

A cash deposit of Twenty-Five (\$25.00), as security for the payment of water bills, shall be required to each user in such cases as the City Commission shall deem such security to be advisable, or in such cases where a deposit is required by the provisions of Section No. 21 of Act No. 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended.

BILLING

Charges for water service furnished by the System shall be collected in quarterly (three month) periods, and bills shall be sent to each user immediately after the end of each quarterly period, and shall be due and payable at the office of the City Treasurer ten (10) days after the date of the bill. For all bills paid within seventeen (17) days of the bill date, a discount of ten per cent (10%) shall be deducted.

ENFORCEMENT

Charges for water service shall constitute a lien on the property served and if not paid within six (6) months, shall be placed on the next general tax roll and collected as a part of the general City taxes.

The City shall have the right to shut off and discontinue the supply of water to any premises for the non-payment of water rates when due. A fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be paid to the City prior to turning on the water to such premises.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance and shall become operative and effective on the 2nd day of October, 1972, A.D.

# Canton Zoning Fight Brewing

A weary planning commission reminded the residents that the notice of public hearing is published in a newspaper circulated in the township and they can go on record officially as being against the project at that time.

But that wasn't the end of the fireworks. Township board members can expect almost the same type of heated meeting next week when many of the same residents threatened to confront the board about another rezoning request stemming from the future

junction of Sheldon and Canton Center Rds. Equally as upset over that issue, residents questioned the decision to allow the rezoning of 44 acres north of Warren and east of Canton Center from R-1C (single family) to R-M (multiple).

THE REZONING, explained Manore, was a compromise reached when the developers agreed to dedicate land for the 120-ft right-of-way needed for the joining of Canton Center and Sheldon, east of Gallimore Elementary School. The developer had

originally planned to build single-family units but was denied permission by the township because of long-range county plans to merge Sheldon into Canton Center Rd., making it the main north-south artery through the township and thereby keeping traffic on Sheldon at a minimum.

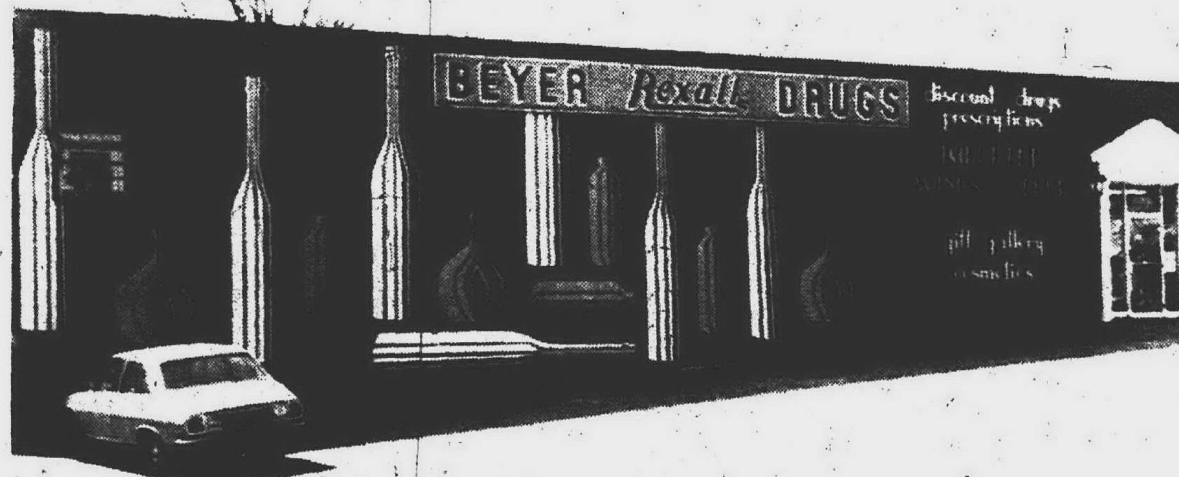
Brought out in that discussion was the fact that school children will have to cross what will eventually become a five-lane highway to get to a school.

The rezoning request was referred to the Wayne County Planning Commission with the

recommendation that some thought be given to the construction of a foot bridge to span the highway, much like the one on Middlebelt Rd. in the Clarenceville School District.

# Catholic 'First' Involves Deacon From Livonia

William Lenny, married deacon who was a Livonian until last weekend, now is filling an unprecedented role in the Catholic Church.

The Rev. Lenny on Oct. 1 began his duties as associate pastor of two neighboring parishes in the rural area near Norwalk, Ohio.

And he and his wife and four children are getting settled in the rectory of Mother of Sorrows Catholic Church of North Auburn, until now a home to priests rather than youngsters.

REV. LENNY, ordained in June 1971, after two years of study in the Detroit Archdiocese Diaconate program, also will be working with the Toledo Diocese to help set up a program for training married men as deacons, or helpers to priests, in that area.

"To my knowledge," Rev. Lenny told the Observer in a telephone interview from North Auburn, "it's the first time that a married deacon has served as an assistant pastor."

His role is to assist the Rev. Omar Rethinger, senior pastor to both Mother of Sorrows and St. Bernard parish in New Washington, Ohio.

He will work with the parochial schools operated by both parishes and will assist Rev. Rethinger in all capacities except saying mass.

WHILE STEPPING into a brand new position in the Catholic church that has seen its priesthood shrinking in numbers in recent years, Rev. Lenny sees the move as a natural one for him and advantageous to all involved. While living in Michigan,

Rev. Lenny and his family made their home in Livonia but attended church in St. Brigid in northwest Detroit. In his capacity as a deacon, he assisted in the parish of St. Thomas Aquinas at Ford and Evergreen in Detroit, and he was employed as a religious education director by St. Catherine Catholic parish in Algonac.

"I had to cover a lot of territory," he said.

In addition, he felt his training and capabilities as a deacon were not being put to the best use in a city parish

where families are close together.

"I wasn't used to the fullest of my capacity," was how he put it.

IN THE RURAL area where he and his family have relocated, families of the two parishes are spread out over about 15 miles. "And this is where a deacon is really needed," he added.

His new position developed because of the death of the priest in New Washington. Rev. Rethinger moved from the Mother of Sorrows rectory

to St. Bernard, taking over spiritual leadership of both parishes.

"That left an empty house and a need for an assistant in two parishes," Rev. Lenny said. He had been talking to the Toledo diocese about the possibility of a move, so it was suggested that he come in the dual capacity.

"The parish council at Mother of Sorrows agreed," he said. "There was no opposition. There are 14 members of the council—13 voted to bring me in and the other didn't vote because he said he didn't quite understand the move."

ALTHOUGH the area tends to be conservative and the move is pretty revolutionary for the Catholic church, Rev. Lenny said his new parishioners "couldn't be more friendly."

"Everyone has been just great," he reported, adding that women in the parish were quick to appear with some homebaked goodies for the first family to occupy the rectory.

The two older Lenny children, Colleen, 11, and Sean, nine, are students at St. Bernard school that runs from third through eighth grades. Seven-year-old Timothy attends Mother of Sorrows, where there are only grades one and two. Brigid, youngest occupant of the rectory, is 2½.

REV. LENNY, who left the insurance business five years ago to become a religious education director, feels the new position is his best opportunity yet to serve his church to his fullest capacity. He and others in the Toledo diocese are well aware of a lot of eyes will be on the little corner of Ohio in the next few months. "That always happens when you try something different," said the new associate pastor.

While Christians are obligated to try to share their religion with all their neighbors, some manifestations of evangelism -- particularly that directed to Christianity's parent religion of Judaism -- can be exceedingly bizarre and nervy.

Take, for example, that latest manifestation of Jesus Freakery, "Jews For Jesus." It can be wondered just how charitably these fence-straddling ecclesiastical exhibitionists would react to the establishment, by Sammy Davis, Jr., and Elizabeth Taylor Burton, of a "Former Christians For Moses" organization, or "Jews For Jesus -- Who Was Jewish."

In the New York area recently, several Jewish families received a somewhat startling letter informing them of their nomination (by "some friends") for appointment to the advisory board of the American Christian College, the educational endeavor of the Rev. Billy James Hargis, the rotund and generally shouting

right-wing evangelist, of Tulsa.

"WITH THE EXCEPTION of American Christian College, there is not a single college in America that takes ONLY students who have already established themselves as Christians," wrote the college's Dean H. Russell Grow -- to his Jewish prospects.

"You will be doing us a big favor by accepting, and it will not take any of your time," added Dean Grow, reassuringly.

Very little time indeed. For this incredible letter went right on to spell out the one duty involved in the honor of being an official advisor of American Christian College: "Our bank account is very low at the present time, and I must find approximately \$35,000 to pay some overdue bills," elucidated the Dean.

"If you could send us a check for \$10, \$25, \$50, \$100, or \$250 today ... Our seven-man Board of Regents is anxiously awaiting your reply."

IF DEVOUT Jews are

appalled by such methods, so indeed are Christians of integrity -- as they observe the increasingly widespread degradation of honorary degrees and trustee posts to the level of barter for fund raising purposes.

There are ways of countering this -- if enough proposed recipients of such "honors" can summon enough character to resist. As an example, one bishop received a letter informing him of the intention of Daniel Baker College (near Dallas) to award him the degree of doctor of divinity at its forthcoming commencement.

In the very next paragraph of this letter, the bishop was informed of yet another honor: he had been appointed chairman of his state's committee to raise \$25,000 for Daniel Baker College.

The bishop immediately wrote back to inform the college that he would be delighted to accept both honors -- with the understanding, of course, that 10 trustees of Daniel Baker College would serve as a committee to raise \$100,000 for his area's mission churches -- payable any time before commencement day.

He never again heard from

Daniel Baker College -- which subsequently went deservedly defunct.

IN NORFOLK, Va., a waterfront superintendent named William Dyson, a former pastor of several Baptist and Methodist churches, announced his establishment of the "American Academy of Clergymen," explaining that "Many are nominated but few chosen and given the opportunity to use the Academy seal."

Dyson has subsequently expressed considerable chagrin that only two dozen of the first 100 "chosen" clergy accepted the honor (at dues of \$90 -- for the first year).

An equally enterprising (if non-profit) methodology was developed by the Rt. Rev. Alfred Banyard, Episcopal bishop of New Jersey. Until the Episcopal Church Annual informed him of their refusal to print such degrees, Bishop Banyard was honoring selected clergy with the degree of "Doctor of Divinity In The College of Brotherly Love."

Commented one of the bishop's more disgusted colleagues: "D.D. -- L.I.D. -- S.T.D. -- and now Fiddle Dee Dee!"

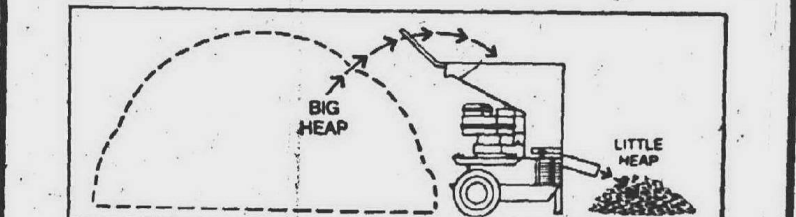

# State Wants To Improve Metro Area Fishing

The State Department of Natural Resources wants to develop an intensive, well-rounded program which will boost local sportfishing opportunities for residents of the Detroit metropolitan area, and give these people a better chance to be "turned on" by their fishery resources.

In the next few months, the DNR will set up and work with an advisory committee of Detroit area residents to "dig into" the plan, put a price tag on it, and gear up with specific fish management steps for an action program.

DNR fisheries officials are shooting for next June to have these refinements finalized and ready for consideration by the Natural Resources Commission.

BETWEEN NOW and then, their cooperative studies with area residents will bear down on five main management points touched upon at this month's commission meeting. They include:

1. Extension of pier and shore-fishing facilities along the Detroit Waterway from Port Huron to western Lake Erie, and on public inland lakes and streams throughout the metropolitan area.
2. Fish-planting possibilities to improve angling in both inland and Great Lakes waters in the entire Detroit area.
3. Establishment of fisheries interpretive services.
4. Development of recreational fishing facilities.
5. Stimulation of private fishing services.

THE REVIEW of the DNR's fish-planting program for the Detroit metro area will focus on making improvements in releases of trout and salmon,

as well as such major warm-water species as muskellunge, northern pike and walleyes.

In singling out a study on fisheries interpretive services, DNR fisheries officials note that fisheries, wildlife, and other resources are not as much a part of everyday living for urban citizens as they are to out-state areas.

They go on to point out that both children and adults in the Detroit area would profit from a more direct association with the many interesting phenomena that make up the fisheries resources of Michigan.

To that end, attention will be given to featuring displays of live fish in their natural settings. Along those same lines, the DNR sees a good deal of merit in staffing the metropolitan area with trained fisheries specialists who would actively share their knowledge of ecology and conservation matters with local residents.

THE NEEDS for developing new Great Lakes piers and shore-fishing structures will also be documented.

In addition to these investigations, DNR specialists and the Advisory Committee will look into establishment of offshore fishing platforms and new "fishing islands" in Lake St. Clair and western Lake Erie.

As part of these studies, consideration will be given to such fish habitat improvement projects as artificial reefs and dredged pools to attract concentrations of fish.

CLOSELY TIED to the concept of interpretive services is the next main part of

the DNR's Detroit metro fishing plan, which covers recreational fishing facilities. On this point, the DNR is thinking in terms of put-and-take fishing ponds and controlled stream areas which it would stock to serve mostly youngsters.

The idea here is that these facilities would give Detroit area youths their first taste of fishing thrills and fun. Such recreational "fishing holes" could also serve other metropolitan residents, notably those who, for financial and other reasons, could not otherwise take advantage of angling improvements which are being considered under the DNR's plan.

The plan also calls for making studies to see how such services as rental boats, fishing guides, charter craft, and party-fishing boats can be spurred to meet their great potential in Great Lakes waters of the Detroit area.

Over and above these five major points, the DNR is pushing for a joint review and coordination of other activities which will have a bearing upon the fishing plan in particular and conservation in general.

# 400 Hear Brodsky At Schoolcraft

More than 400 persons—young, old and in between—turned out at Schoolcraft College Tuesday evening to see and hear recently-exiled Russian poet Joseph Brodsky.

Originally slated for the Liberal Arts Theater, the evening of poetry had to be moved to the larger Waterman Center because of the size of the crowd.

Brodsky's Schoolcraft appearance was only his second since he arrived in Ann Arbor as poet-in-residence. The University of Michigan's only other poet-in-residence was Robert Frost.

BRODSKY HAS been invited to speak at many colleges, including England's Cambridge and Oxford, and an article written by him appeared in last weekend's New York Times Magazine.

What the audience heard, besides some fine poetry, was an interesting contrast in styles. Brodsky's poetry was read first by two members of Schoolcraft's English department, Dave Perkins and John Kyriacopoulos, in English, in a rather flat,

narrative style, such as that used by Frost.

Then it was recited, at times almost sung, by Brodsky with plenty of expression. In a question period, Brodsky said that he learned this style of reciting in school.

For many in the audience (myself included), Brodsky's poetry was new because translations of his works are extremely hard to find. A few are in anthologies, most notably his "Verses on the Death of T.S. Eliot," and his second volume of Russian poems was published in New York in 1970.

A new volume of his poems is scheduled for publication by Ardis Press in Ann Arbor this year and a Penguin edition of his poems, introduced by W.H. Auden, is scheduled for publication in 1973.

HIS POEMS covered a wide range of topics, but all were characterized by rich imagery and a seeking. From the sampling, it would appear that he is less pessimistic than Eliot, more metaphysical than Frost.

On the razing of a Greek Orthodox Church: "It is one thing to bring a folk to Christ,

to bear his cross is something else."

On the break-up of a relationship: "When they part, people make a greater splash than when they join."

He says, "People are not my thing, things are more pleasant," and writes of "the nothing that fills our lives."

AND IN the Times article, he says, "I do not believe in political movements. I believe in personal movement, that movement of the soul when a man looks at himself and is so ashamed that he tries to make some sort of change—within himself, not on the outside."

In the questioning, Brodsky said he never meant his poetry as a protest and felt that his imprisonment in 1963 and his invitation to leave Russia were unjustified.

Brodsky has been called "a loner" and it is obvious that he is unhappy about his exile. He doubts that he will ever be proficient enough in English to translate his poems. And "of course my family suffers," he told his audience.

But he still retains his sense of humor. "I like my welcome here," he said. "I've been getting nice letters of welcome, especially from housewives."

The exhibit will be a continuing one, with a change of artist each month. There will be a wide variety of styles, technique and media.

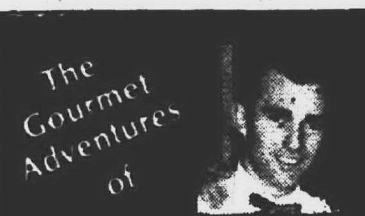

## Fabric 'Paints' A Room

A small bedroom furnished with attic leftovers can take on an important look with the use of imagination, a sewing machine and yards and yards of fabric.

The fabric is used as other decorators would use a paintbrush -- to cover bed headboard, to fashion a canopy, and to cover the walls as well as the windows.

In the room shown here, the fabric is checked gingham in assorted sizes and colors, and the focal point is an eye-catching patchwork bedspread made from nine-inch squares used diagonally.

Walls are covered with quarter-inch yellow checks, and the same color in larger checks form the tie-back draperies and the elegant canopy. The same material can be used for a padded headboard and for a table cover.

The quilt utilizes pieces of assorted checks in navy, red and pink as well as yellow. To make it, you start with a lining, lay it on the bed and then pin on the patches in alternating colors.

This room, using fabric that costs less than \$1 a yard, was decorated in checks for less than \$100.

## New Tricots Need Special Handling

Tricot knit fabrics are coming into their own. These are warp knits which, unlike double knits, are knitted in flat form.

They differ from the double knits in that they usually have stretch only on the crosswise direction. Tricot fabrics may be combination fabrics, such as those using Arnel triacetate and nylon.

Here's how to get the best results sewing these warp knits:

- Use cotton-covered polyester thread and a ball point needle, size 7 or 9.
- If edges tend to curl during cutting and sewing, use a spray starch to stiffen.
- Machine tension often needs adjusting. Loosen both top and bobbin; and use a long stitch, eight to 10 per inch.

- Keep pressure light on the presser foot.

- Stay-stitch curves and other off-grain edges to stabilize garment; reinforce stress points with seam buttonholes.

- Use a steam iron at appropriate setting for fiber content of the fabric (usually medium setting).

- Use a press cloth and light pressure on the iron when pressing to avoid glazing and impressions. For special care, iron on the reverse side.

When buying these new fashion fabrics for home sewing, check the bolt end or fabric identification strip for care instructions. If this information is not available, ask the sales person to find out for you. And, for fabrics manufactured after July 3, be sure to ask for a permanent label with care instructions to attach to the finished garment.

# New Processes Boost To Home Seamstresses

Do-it-yourself fabric waterproofing and a new process for making complete garments permanent press



A GOOD sewing project for holiday giving is a plain or patchwork puff pillow made from McCall pattern 2864. It's an easy to sew item that utilizes a single piece of fabric pleated and stitched to a smaller piece. Pattern pieces are included for a 14-inch pillow and a 16-inch bolster, and creative sewers can vary the size to fit individual needs.

are developments that could make the home seamstress' work more satisfactory.

Both are recent developments on the market.

The waterproofing comes in a concentrate called "Dryfab Liquid," and is sold by Amway, home sales firm.

IT CAN be used on all washable fabrics and contains no phosphates. Garments to be waterproofed must be washed first, even when new, and the concentrate is then added to hot water in the washing machine.

After the clothes have been put through a washing cycle, they can be dried in the dryer or air-dried and ironed. The manufacturer said the water repellent does not change colors, cause any odor or cause garments to stiffen.

THE NEW, patented process for achieving durable press qualities is called "Ameriset" and has been developed by the American Laundry Machinery Industries in cooperation with Cotton Producers Institute.

Equipment is ready to be installed in neighborhood stores to serve the home sewing market.

It gives garments a 20-minute vapor treatment, and tests have shown that those that have been treated retain their durable press characteristics after as many as 20 washings.



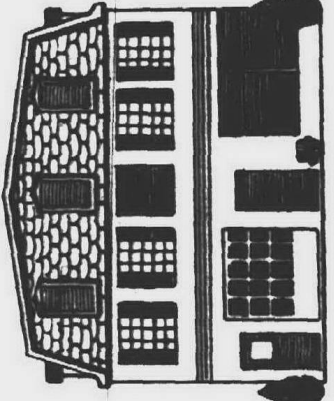

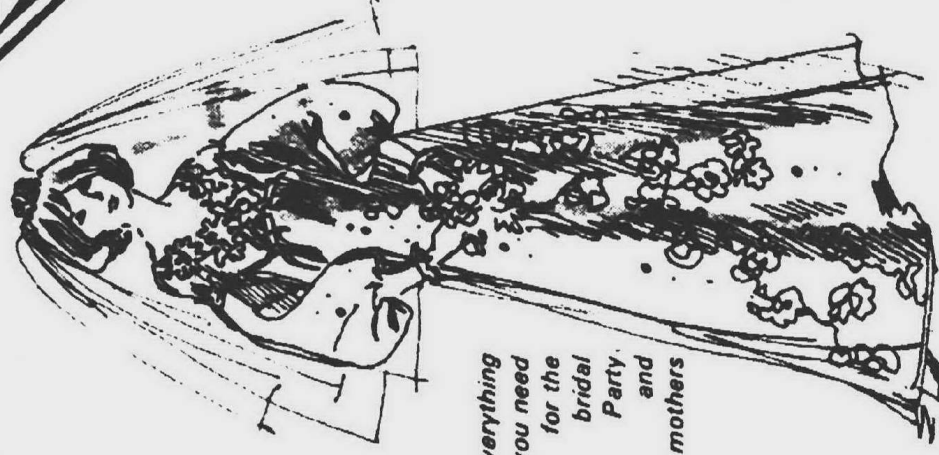

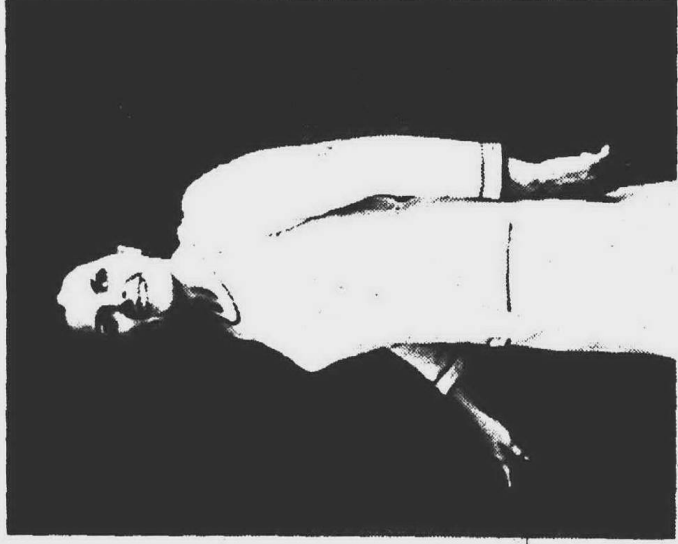

picks the blends. "I look for something that will wash well and I like to pick

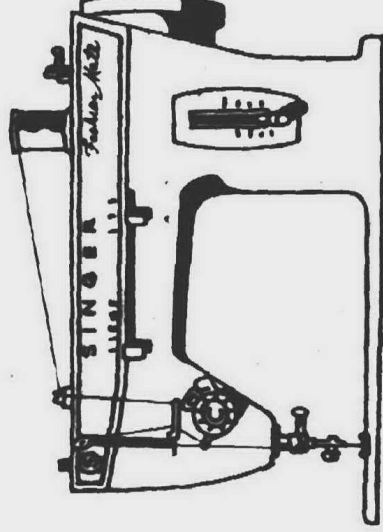

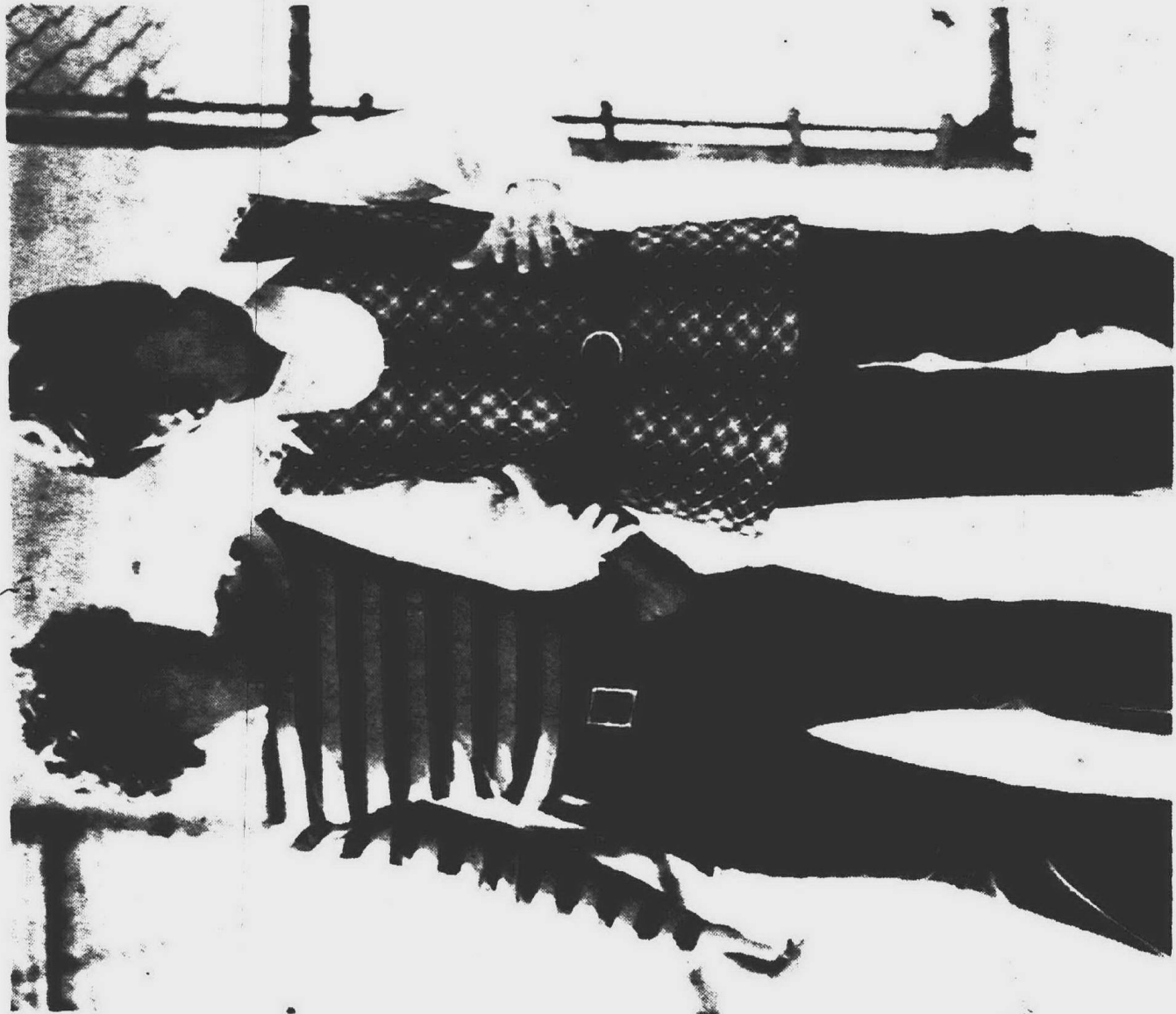
Jane's mother, Betty, who likes to sew too, is also a winner as a result of Jane's contest showing.

Simple patterns have long been a part of the home sewing scene -- for use by beginners or when the project was a hurry-up one.

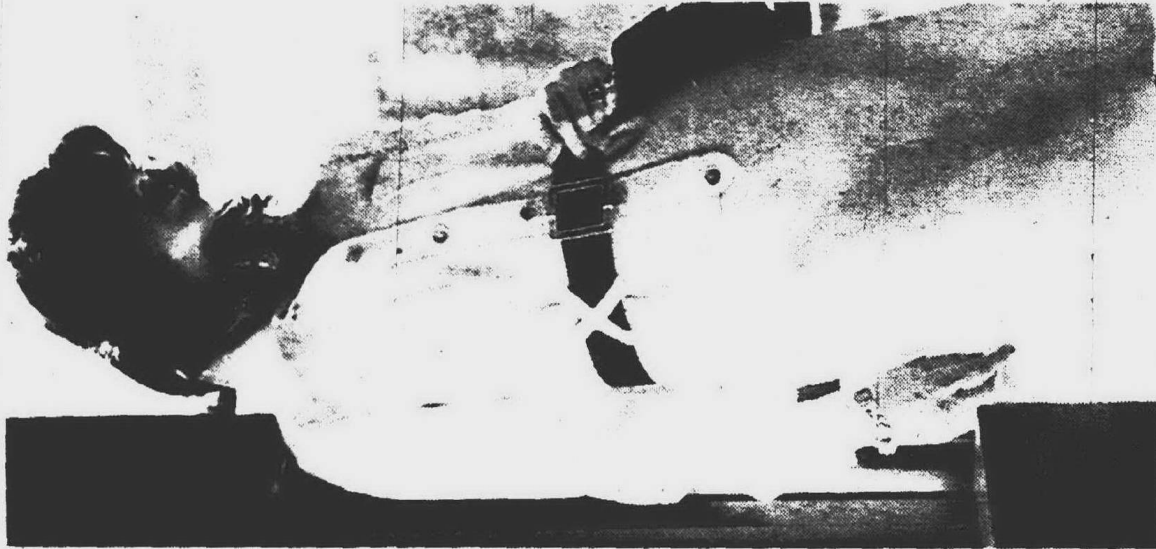
This fall simple patterns have a big difference. They're designed not to look simple.

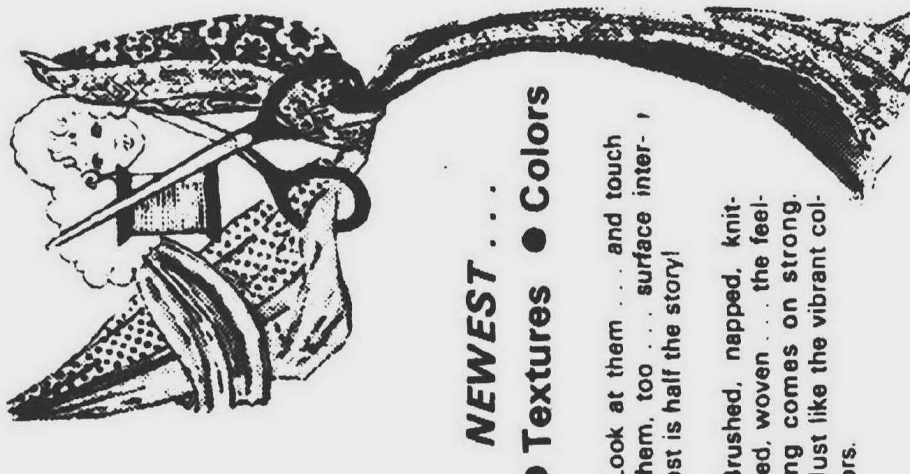
