The City Commission has begun a thorough review of the work scheduled for the final two years of the three-year street improvement program.

Agreeing that some adjustments must be made along the way, the commissioners, accompanied by engineers, went over the entire program and will be ready for a final report in the near future.

While reviewing the plans, considerable thought is being given to any change in traffic that may ensue when the new expressways-- M-14 and I-275-- are completed.

ONE OF THE main concerns is Farmer Street from Sheldon Road to the C&O Railroad. This is to be a complete concrete street from Sheldon Road to Blunk Street. From that point it is to be widened five and one half feet on each side to make it a 33-foot concrete street.

The other concrete streets in the 1973 program include Deer from Wing to the south end; Kellogg from Maple to the south end; Beech from Harvey to McKinley and Union from Mill to South Holbrook.

Along with these plans for concrete, the following streets are to be improved with slagerete and asphalt: Dewey from Hartsough to Ross; Roosevelt from Hartsough to Ross; Harding from Hartsough to Ross; Hartsough from Harvey to McKinley and Pacific from William to Farmer.

The street improvements recommended for 1974 to complete the three-year project include: Fair from Fairground to Mill; Fairground from Fair to Burroughs; Hamilton from Union to Ann Arbor Trail; Joy from Coolidge to Virginia; Coolidge from Joy to Burroughs and Rose, from Amelia to North Mill Street.

One of the major problems uncovered is the matter of drainage on some areas with storm sewers close by. A check is being made now to see if sanitary sewers intercept water.

IT ALSO WAS revealed that Hamilton receives a great deal of traffic and that residents favor new pavement. This was tabled a year ago due to possible industrial expansion.

The other streets in the 1974 program are: Elizabeth from Roe to West Ann Arbor Trail, and Roe from Union to Hamilton and Hamilton to railroad.

The review is being made at this time in order to be ready for the taking of bids for 1973 work early in the new year.

## A Real Hockey Fan

### Sees Games In Russia

Randy Sharland of North Territorial Rd., Plymouth is such a fan. He went to Moscow, Russia, to watch the last four games of the Soviet-Team Canada series.

Sharland, who works for the post office in Plymouth, started skating at the age of five and has been playing hockey for 13 of his 25 years. He plays defense and is skating with a Livonia team and a Windsor team this season.

It was back in June that Sharland decided to go to Moscow. He subscribes to Hockey News, which is published in Montreal. Tours to the games were advertised in that paper.

THOSE 3,000 Canadian hockey fans who accompanied Team Canada to Russia were not 100 per cent Canadian. There were at least 100 Americans in the group, from Illinois, California, Texas, Florida and Plymouth, Mich.

On Sharland's flight out of Montreal were Maurice (the Rocket) Richard and his wife,

# Own Story Seals Bennett's Fate In Murder Case

Three defense motions for a mistrial, all of which were denied during the 10-day first degree murder trial of David Leroy Bennett, may have set the stage for an appeal of his Circuit Court conviction.

The 17-year-old Plymouth Township youth is in Wayne County Jail awaiting sentencing Nov. 13 after being found guilty last Friday in the May 9 stabbing death of the wife of Michael Berry, chairman of the Wayne County Road Commission.

Under Michigan law, Circuit Judge George E. Bowles, before whom the case was tried, has no choice other than to sentence Bennett to life imprisonment.

DEFENSE ATTORNEY Daniel Burress, when queried about the possibility of an appeal, said that he could make "no comments" at this time.

However, legal authorities point out that precedent would dictate that he make no comment until after sentencing anyway. They further emphasize that Bowles' denials of the trio of mistrial motions give Burress ammunition to at least claim judicial error in attempting to have the jury's decision set aside.

Even if Burress does carry the case to a higher court, the law provides that in a first degree murder conviction such as this, Bennett would remain in custody while the case was under review.

Burress made his first

motion for a mistrial early in the trial. He based the motion on the grounds that Assistant Prosecutor Robert Healy had mentioned before the jury that two pieces of evidence were missing.

Bowles denied the motion when Healy explained he wasn't referring to evidence which had been barred by the court in an earlier ruling.

A second time the defense asked for a mistrial occurred when the prosecutor questioned a witness as to whether Bennett "is so psychotic he can't testify in his own defense."

Burress told the judge he objected to Healy's injecting the present mental ability of the defendant. The motion was again denied.

THE THIRD motion for mistrial came when it was learned that two women, visiting the court, had been in the jury room while the jury was occupying it.

The incident was explained, to the judge's satisfaction, that the two women had wanted to use the ladies' room and said they were unaware they were not allowed into the jury room.

The trial was delayed more than a half-hour while each jury member, one by one, was called into the courtroom and asked if the two women had spoken to them. All said they had not.

Bowles, who kept a tight rein on the court proceedings, also had to make a decision on a defense motion to suppress evidence "obtained through warrantless search of Bennett's school locker."

The bloodstained clothing, a switchblade knife and a syringe were not allowed as evidence.

A DRAMATIC PERIOD in the trial came as it entered its third week when Berry, who had been listening to the defense discuss the rights of privacy of the defendant, yelled out in court:

"How about the privacy of my wife?"

Shortly thereafter, Berry hurriedly left the courtroom and was heard to say, "I can't stand it."

A great deal of time was spent tracing a six pack of beer which Bennett had given to two of his classmates the day of the murder. The


### Bradner Gets EMU Post

His major concern will be relations with such colleges and to make them aware of EMU facilities that may be of assistance.







Before he knew it he was smack in the middle of a lot of political palaver that brought several smiles, and the promises made by the seekers of public favor brought back memories of several other presidential contests that ranked with the best humor on stage or screen.

And those who think that our good friend Archie Bunker is the only good comedian on the air should have listened to the under-dog candidate in the race for the White House.

There he was, in living color, talking to a group of engineers at the gate of a large plant that was about to be closed, and The Stroller just couldn't believe some of the things he was hearing. "I think it is a down right shame," the candidate said in all seriousness, "that you fellows will be out of work. I just can't make myself believe it. prosecution was trying to show that the beer came from the Berry home.

After questioning two of Bennett's classmates about the beer and calling in Berry's two sons-in-law to testify how much beer was in the ice box, the incident faded from the scene with nothing decided as to where the beer came from.

A SURPRISE to many was the apparent sudden switch by the defense from trying to prove Bennett didn't kill Mrs. Berry to an all-out attempt to prove he was mentally ill.

In questioning Dr. Gerald Briskin, clinical psychologist at Wyandotte General Hospital, the defense attorney asked point blank: "Doctor, would you say the killing of Vivian Berry on May 9 was the result of a mental disease?" It took the jury of four women and eight men 3 1/2 hours to reach its verdict.

When it was announced, Bennett, as he had throughout the trial, remained stone-faced.

The clearest picture of Bennett's actions the day of the murder were given by defense witness Dr. Arthur Hughett, director of psychiatry at Wyandotte General Hospital.

He told the jury he had talked with Bennett on three different occasions.

"He said he had a feeling he didn't want to kill her and told Mrs. Berry if she didn't do anything, she wouldn't get hurt.

"She started to run, which he said made him angry. He chased her and stabbed her several times. He said that then, as she lay bleeding, he pulled her clothes off to see if he could help her.

Hughett said Bennett told him he was not depressed about the act nor was he depressed at being confined to jail.

The doctor also testified that the youth said he did not know Mrs. Berry and that he picked daytime for the robbery because he thought there was a better chance that women would be home alone.

"There was no sexual assault on Mrs. Berry," the doctor added. "However, his attacks on the lower part of her body was a sexual assault on all women he mistreated. He said he had nothing against Mrs. Berry personally."

out of work. And if I am elected I will see that no engineers with college degrees will be without jobs."

Fine. But where will he find them? IT WAS REMINISCENT of the days when Franklin Delano Roosevelt was charming the electorate with his fireside chats and vowed that, if elected, he would have 60 million jobs available. Mind you, this was in the heart of a depression. He took the White House lease from Herbert Hoover and provided the jobs -- but we had to go to war to reach that figure.

Now we are in search of peace in the world, and here is a chap -- and serious about it -- telling the unemployed that he'll have jobs for them no matter what.

The Lady of the House, who also had been listening, commented, "Well, if he can get jobs for them next month, why can't he do it now?"

"Maybe you expect too much," The Stroller answered. Remember the last presidential election when one of the candidates told an anxious world that he had a plan to end the war -- if he was elected. Well, he got the job. That was almost four years ago -- and the war isn't ended yet.

Then, over the tube, came the charge that there was corruption in the national government -- that things were not just as they should be and the candidate said, in no uncertain terms, that this would be ended -- if he was the people's choice next month. The Stroller couldn't help laughing.

IT REMINDED him of a close election down in the Dutch country years ago when a fellow named Harry Gangware, the incumbent county treasurer, closed his campaign with a mammoth rally on the large patio in front of the court house.

He shouted and puffed. He screamed and pounded his fists to drive home a point. Then, with one final gesture, he closed his campaign with this never-to-be-forgotten remark --

"There is no substitute for experience -- not even honesty."

And the next day he was beaten at the polls.

Then on the screen came the candidate with another promise. THIS TIME he was bemoaning the fact that there were so many families living under deplorable conditions and promised that he would see to it that there would be a minimum living wage for all families.

He didn't say where the funds would come from, and The Stroller recalled a remark from his old friend, Ray Grimm, a fellow councilman, on the City of Livonia's first governing body.

For the better part of an hour we had been discussing some development and soon came to realize that we didn't have the funds available.

"Maybe we can get some government money," one of the other councilmen remarked.

"Where would the government get the money?" Grimm asked. "Don't the people have to send it down there, before the government can send it back?"

Few in the meeting hall had given that a thought. THE PICTURE ON the tube switched to another political battle in which the contender was criticizing the work of the incumbent -- that he had done little on the job and shouldn't be sent back.

It reminded The Stroller of the time an auto salesman tried to sell him a Chevrolet car and pointed out that "the Ford you're driving isn't much of a car. It can't cam-

pare with the Chevy." The Stroller didn't buy. Then, a few months later, his auto salesman friend returned, this time trying to sell Ford cars.

"Sorry, friend," The Stroller said. "I couldn't buy a Ford after you once told me what a terrible car it was."

Our political candidates, with all their muck-raking, may find themselves in the same position one of these days -- trying to sell a program they once ridiculed.

But for one evening, at least, they are a vast improvement over summer re-runs on the tube.

# Family Services Fill Major Role

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is another in a series on those agencies sharing in the Plymouth Community Drive. This one deals with the work being done by Family Services.

PLYMOUTH There are two ways to look at Family Service's increasing involvement in the Plymouth community.

Statistics show that between 1969 and 1971, the agency's case load grew from 190 to 328. The 725 personal interviews conducted in 1969 jumped to 1,540 last year. The staff counseled 440 adults, 130 teenagers and 96 children with family or personal problems. One could conclude that marital and parent-child relationships are deteriorating fast in Plymouth.

The more likely explanation is that people are finding out that the office at 880 Wing St.

is a place to get help -- the rare help that comes through one individual listening and talking to another.

Through this assistance, family problems and tensions are being resolved. More than two-thirds of 1971's cases were closed by the end of the year.

THE PROBLEMS people bring to Family Service, a branch of Child and Family Service of Washtenaw County, are seldom unique or unusual. Husbands and wives argue about money, child management, or, in this age, women's liberation and enlightenment, division of responsibilities in the home.

As parents they are concerned about truancy from school or home, lack of respect, or other forms of rebellion. But the youngsters in the family often complain of lack of respect too, the agency reports, and of what they

perceive as unreasonable restrictions on clothing, hair or curfew.

Individual adults often come to the agency too, due to loneliness, boredom or a lack of confidence or fulfillment. Sometimes their depression is triggered by a sudden change of social status or life style," the staff says, "or the impact of physical changes as they reach middle age."

The agency can be of help not only in resolving problems but in preventing them: pre-retirement and premarital counseling are examples of this. And although there are some things it cannot do, such as lend money or give psychiatric help, it can refer clients to organizations which can.

ALTHOUGH MUCH of the assistance is on a "one-to-one" basis, teenagers, divorced adults and parents

with child management problems also participate in group meetings where they can gain a better perspective of their own problems through helping one another.

Those who can afford to pay for counseling (about 33 per cent last year) do so. But about 50 of those needing help in 1971 had no income, were on public assistance or made less than \$5,000 per year. Another 81 cases had an income of

between \$5,000 and \$10,000. Fees are charged on a sliding scale -- according to family size and ability to pay.

It is clear that without the Plymouth Community Fund subsidy the majority of Family Service clients -- whose low income often compounds their problems and makes them more urgent -- would have had nowhere to turn.

When they reached Moscow there was a "great deal of confusion." The first blow was the lack of tickets to the games and there was some doubt that they would be available. The second blow was their "first class" accommodations, which turned out to be a hotel that was "200 or 300 years old and had no hot water." Sixty members of the group backed out at this point and were flown back to Copenhagen. The rest stayed on for 10 days in Soviet capital.

Tickets for the games were procured. Tours were arranged to schools, the opera, museums, art galleries, restaurants and a boat trip down the Moscow River to an amusement park.

"THE CANADIANS and Americans were easily spotted at the games," said Sharland. "They were in bright colors. The Russians were all grays and blacks." There were very few Russian women in attendance but the fans did appreciate good plays.

"At the first game they seemed to be awed by the behavior of the Canadian fans. They spent more time watching them than they did the game.

"Later, when the Canadian fans would cheer, the Soviets would whistle. A whistle to a Russian is the same as a boo to an American.

"Bobby Orr was there but was not playing. Whenever he showed up the Canadians all cheered and they (the Russians) didn't know what the cheering was about. They had heard of Orr but didn't recognize him."

SHARLAND SAID the outcome of the games became a matter of national prestige to the Canadians and he experienced the feeling right along with them.

According to Sharland, when discussing Russian food, "They are very big on fish, serve a lot of sturgeon."

"A typical meal would be

half a tomato; cole slaw with very little dressing, sort of bland; a few sardines; beef, chicken or fish; potatoes, quartered and fried; and dessert.

"Desserts were the best part of the meals. Their ice cream is good. They had cookies and something like chocolate brownies only heavy," he said. "I don't know

how they got them so heavy." The countryside was much the same as northern Michigan. It was only when they saw a farmhouse, gas station or met other cars that they realized they were in a different country.

THE MOSCOW circus was "spectacular" and the boat trip and amusement park interesting. The school

children were great hockey fans and could speak some English. Our hockey fan did not attend the opera but did visit many museums.

The travel bureau had told them the weather would be in the high 50s and even the 40s but there was an inch of snow the day before they left, which everyone said was unreasonable.

# Private School Set For Plymouth

By MARTHA MAHAN

**PLYMOUTH**  
The idea of a private secondary school for the western suburbs, the five year dream of a Plymouth teacher, will be placed before the

public for its reaction at two meetings in Plymouth. The board of directors and interested citizens Nov. 1 and 2 at 8 p.m. at the Mayflower Hotel to report on progress to date and plans for the future.

The school is not designed as an anti-bussing "out," founder Jane Navarre emphasized, but an institution for parents who seek quality education

where the uniqueness of each child can be preserved. **NO FLY-BY-NIGHT** operation, the school is incorporating as a non-profit, tax-deductible institution and following the standards for accreditation set by the University of Michigan.

A site has been picked in Plymouth Township and architects are working on preliminary building plans. Mrs. Navarre said. The school, to be called Emerson Independent Secondary School, will open in September of 1973 for grades seven, eight and nine with enrollment limited to 50 students at each grade level. By 1976, Emberson expects to have a total enrollment of 300 for grades seven through 12. All of the eight teachers signed so far have master's degrees or are in master's programs, as will the other two still being sought. The headmaster, whose name presently is withheld for being sought.

tribution of \$500 to the tax deductible building fund. **BECAUSE THE** faculty does not wish to discriminate in any way, Mrs. Navarre said, a special account has been established at the First Federal Savings in Plymouth where a family, instead of paying the tuition in one lump sum, can pay as little as \$20 per week to build tuition credit.

Scholarship funds also are available, she said. The present site under consideration is in the northwest section of Plymouth Township near Northville and Livonia. The directors decided to locate in Plymouth Township, Mrs. Navarre said, because of the availability of land and because Plymouth has been able to retain a community spirit and bond which is necessary for the support of such an institution. Also, there is presently no quality, non-public, secondary education on Detroit's western outskirts to provide an alternative to public education.

**THE ARCHITECTURAL** firm of Graham-Culotta of Northville, member of AIA and architects of other educational institutions, has been employed. Preliminary plans are now being made. Relocatable classrooms which are attractive and functional and far less costly than permanent buildings are planned, and architects of other

Legal work is being handled by the firms of Dobson, Griffin and Barense in Ann Arbor and Demel and Armstrong, in Plymouth. Both Dobson and Demel previously have done legal work for educational institutions. The teachers founded Emerson because they believe public education fails to meet the needs of every student, Mrs. Navarre said. Public schools are doing a good job, she said, but their bigness and increasing drug use prevent realizing an atmosphere of individual attention. Plans have been under way for more than a year, Mrs. Navarre said, and letters were sent to community and political leaders in every city west of Detroit from Dearborn

**FEDERAL JUDGE** Stephen Roth's cross-district bussing ruling made her hesitate to press forward her plans, Mrs. Navarre confessed, because she feared public reaction might be to regard hers as one of the so-called "freedom schools." "But it was a dream of mine and my life," she said. "I had contacted the State Department of Education long before Judge Roth's ruling came down. So I decided to go ahead. The school will not open unless there is a broad base of interest and support from families in the western suburbs," she declared. "If we cannot find support here, perhaps there are other communities who would like to see us locate there, but we hope to find a home in Plymouth." Emerson hopes to duplicate the success of Greenhills School in Ann Arbor which was started by seven families who felt that, although the Ann Arbor public schools rated very highly, there ought to be an alternative to public education.

They were able to raise \$500,000 before the school opened its doors, and it now has a beautiful facility on 35 acres, provides a complete educational program for 250 students and has waiting lists for some grade levels.

And about the shutouts. "We never expected two in a row," said Churchill Coach Ken Kaestner. "Then we got three, then four, then No. 5 over Mott. We just went crazy."

"It has to be the greatest feeling ever," added Kaestner. "The shutout string has been a great motivator for our squad," said Kaestner. "If we can shut out WL Western, we will have shut out every team in our league."

The man behind the defense is Churchill baseball coach turned football for the winter season, Roger Frayer.

Stevenson scored a 47 in the meet at Dunhal Hills with Farmington a close second at 430. Walled Lake Central







Bentley had two scoring chances go by the wayside in the second half. Once the Bulldogs fumbled on the Allen Park four yard line and once on the 20.



Ten exciting thoroughbred races will start at 2:30 p.m., and will be featured by the \$4,000 WJR 50th Anniversary two miler. It will be the one and only two mile race of the year at DRC and will include 10 or 12 of the best marathon runners on the grounds.

The new early post time of 2:30 p.m. daily starts the following Tuesday, Oct. 31. The remainder of the DRC 1972 meeting, which extends through Dec. 2, also will be cut to a five day race week, with all Mondays "dark" starting Oct. 30.

Racing has also been cancelled for Thanksgiving Day so that horsemen and DRC employees can spend the holiday with their families.

# DRC Changes Race Program

A recent survey of its fans and a late season shortage of horses have determined two program changes at Detroit Race Course when its "short" mid-Autumn thoroughbred meeting begins Tuesday, Oct. 31.

Responding to a positive vote of its patrons, DRC will move its daily post time up one hour to 2:30 p.m. To conserve horses and still give fans nine races on weekdays and 10 on Saturday, DRC will be closed on the five Mondays of its 1972 fall meeting.

In making the announcement, DRC Vice President-General Manager Paul R. Ryder said both changes are a result of "popular demand."

"All of our surveys have indicated that today's race fan prefers the earlier post time which also enables him to get home earlier," Ryder said.

"Fans have also indicated they like nine races daily, 10 on Saturday. By eliminating Monday racing and making that an additional day of rest for the horses we can present

our regular full race programs the remainder of the week."

Ryder said that Detroit Race Course also will be closed on Thanksgiving Day, allowing horsemen and employees to be home with their families. A total of six days has thus been cut from the original autumn schedule, which currently extends through Saturday, Dec. 2.

"Michigan Racing Commissioner Leo Shirley has agreed wholeheartedly with our suggestions for change and has been tremendously cooperative," Ryder said. "I don't believe he would be adverse, either, to our using those 'lost' race days the week after Dec. 2 if the horses and the weather would happen to hold up favorably."

POST TIME in recent years at DRC has been at 3:30 p.m. weekdays, 2:30 p.m. only on Saturday and holidays.

The Mondays cut from the DRC schedule involve the dates of Oct. 30 and Nov. 6, 13, 20 and 27. The new 2:30 p.m. post time will be in effect Tuesday through Saturday.







### Ski Heil

There is a great ski season coming! What are you doing to prepare for it? Do you have a personal fitness program that you are working on? Skiing demands not only balance and agility, but strength and endurance as well. How do you "shape-up"?

Let me recommend a few simple tests that you can administer in the privacy of your bedroom, when no one is around to watch you. First try a few simple pushups, men on their toes and women on their knees. If you have difficulty doing 10 you're in trouble. The arm and chest muscles are used in riding tow ropes and pushing yourself up after a fall.

Next, the wall sit. Put your back against the wall and sit so that your legs form a 90 degree angle. Time yourself in that position. Anything under one minute means you're better off sitting in the lodge this winter! Those upper leg muscles are extremely important in skiing.

How's your cardio-vascular endurance? Take your resting pulse rate for one minute while in a sitting position. Anywhere from 60 to 80 beats a minute is fairly normal.

Next, run in place at a jogging pace for three minutes. Take your pulse within 10 seconds after stopping (sitting down) for one minute again. That is your working pulse rate. Now here is the important part. Check your pulse again after a five minute rest period. Has it returned to normal? If it has not, I suggest you give

up smoking, overeating, and start doing some endurance work such as jogging or swimming or skipping rope. Your heart is a muscle and needs work like any other muscle if it is going to remain strong. If you don't have cardio-vascular endurance you will tire easily and that leads to injuries, particularly late in the afternoon. When you're tired your muscles won't respond, primarily because they lack endurance as well as strength.

**THE SMART SKIER** knows whether or not he or she is "in shape". They've had a recent physical and their physician has given them a clean bill of health. When you're paying the high price for a lift ticket, you want to ski all day, but not at the risk of incurring an injury. How many have taken that "last run" and wiped out half way down? I believe most ski injuries occur because of lack of ability, improper equipment and poor physical conditioning.

The average local skier doesn't realize how important conditioning is because the runs are so short and much of the time is spent waiting in lift lines.

In 10 years of conducting pre-ski conditioning classes, I've only had two skiers injured on the slopes. A few have been injured in class (Dr. Lilly, it's nice to have you back with us!) but that is to be expected! It must have been an old Norwegian skier who said, "Take care of your body and it will take care of you!"

# Shrubs Are Decorative, Functional

Shrubs are woody plants with many stems rising from the ground. The so-called deciduous shrubs are those that lose their leaves every winter and grow new ones in the spring. There are literally thousands of different kinds. Some are small and delicate or spread into low ground-hugging mats. Others are tall and robust growing into thick twiggy mounds. And there are all sizes and shapes in between.

In nature and in the plantings around our homes trees dominate because of their height and the canopy they create overhead. However, shrubs cannot be overlooked. Forests have an undergrowth of shrubby thickets. Hillside are clothed in their twiggy growth and marshes, ponds and lakes are ringed by a variety of shrubs. In our yards shrubs are building blocks which shape the outdoor spaces.

Many people think of shrubs only in terms of decorative beauty but they are among the most functional of plants. Although they have flowers that please us with their fragile beauty or bright hues, this beauty is fleeting. On some shrubs the flowers last only a few days, and at best a few weeks of bloom is all that can be expected. The bonus offering of colorful autumn foliage is short-lived, too.

as shapes in the landscape at all seasons. Shrubs can be grouped or arranged to create our outdoor living spaces as well as to decorate them.

IF YOU DESIRE a private outdoor world of your own, a refuge and a retreat, then you can enclose your backyard, or a part of it, with tall twiggy shrubs. Lilacs, forsythia, honeysuckle, mock orange, beauty bush, and viburnums, or other shrubs over six feet in height can do an effective job.

They won't need much care or maintenance and are much friendlier looking than a fence. Also, they do the best screening job at the season when this is needed most.

If you don't need total enclosure, but want to merely suggest a separation, shrubs can be grouped to create this impression.

At the same time, they can be placed to serve as a screen to hide a view you don't want to see, such as your neighbor's trash cans or compost pile. They can be used to block the

rays of the sun or of a poorly placed outside light, and create some needed shade. Also, they can be used to break the force of the wind and make a sheltered spot for outdoor relaxing or dining.

Medium sized shrubs, three to four feet in height, such as dwarf flowering quince, or deutzia, azaleas, and some cotoneasters and spireas can be used to separate one area in the yard from another. They can separate the patio from the rest of the yard or screen the vegetable garden, or create an area where toddlers can play but are not hidden from view.

SHRUBS CAN be used to create pathways and to guide traffic. They can guide guests to a front entrance that is not very visible or otherwise clearly marked. They can form a pathway from the front drive through a side yard to the back patio. Also, a carefully placed group of shrubs can be used to keep neighborhood children from

wearing a path across a corner lot.

Low-growing deciduous shrubs can be used as ground covers. Those that are suitable include several cotoneasters, dwarf forsythia, and dwarf honeysuckle, but the low evergreen shrubs are often a better choice as ground cover material.

In summer when they are clothed with leaves, shrubs show many shades and tints of green. The variations in leaf colors can be used to introduce subtle variety into the landscape, or can be planned so the various tones add almost as much color as would be provided by flowers.

Russian olive and Arctic Willow have silver gray leaves, and the leaves of some honeysuckles are a decidedly blue-green hue. There are variegated forms of weigela and red-stemmed dogwood with a white margin on each leaf and there are some

shrubs with yellow or pink edging light green leaves.

Golden syringa, golden-leaved Japanese honeysuckle and a few others have yellow or yellow-green leaves all summer.

JAPANESE maples, purple-leaf plum, red barberry, and smoke tree are among those that have red or purple tinged foliage.

The bright hued plants with red, purple or yellow leaves really stand out in the landscape against the subdued greens of the other plants. Because of this they make ideal accent plants. They are like an art object in your home or a piece of jewelry you wear. Treat them as something special to be featured and not as background material.

They will never take a proper place in a border planting, but will stand out and focus attention on themselves.

Growing conditions should be considered when choosing shrubs. Shrubby dogwoods, fothergilla, honeysuckle and viburnums will endure considerable shade. Dogwoods, Michigan holly, elderberries, willows and several viburnums will grow in wet soil. Smoke bush, beauty bush, barberry, sumac and shrub roses will grow in dry, sandy soil. For acid soil choose azaleas, heaths, and heathers.

# State, County, Local Proposals Face Voters On Nov. 7 Ballot

## Marygrove To Benefit

### An Observer Roundup

The tremors won't be felt the next day, but results of the ballot proposals on the Nov. 7 ballot will have a long-range effect on Michigan residents. November's ballot is loaded with serious questions ranging from the time residents will begin their work day in the summer to how they will finance local schools.

Coupled with the proposal to reduce the property tax for school financing is a proposal to lift the State Constitution's ban on a graduated income tax.

Voters will decide whether to remove the 1846 abortion law, which permits an abortion only to save the mother's life.

Also among the statewide issues is one to provide additional benefits to Vietnam-era veterans.

Residents of Wayne County will vote on two millage questions.

Farmington voters will decide whether to float a bond issue for an ice arena, and Southfield voters will be asked to make three changes in their charter.

All Michigan voters will face the following issues on the November ballot:

**PROPOSAL A** would change Michigan's daylight saving time from the last Sunday in April until the last Sunday in October each year, putting Michigan in line with most other states in the country.

Michigan residents would get up an hour earlier during the summer and thus have an extra hour of sunlight in the evenings, if it passes.

**PROPOSAL B** would

overturn Michigan's abortion law to permit abortions in certain conditions.

The proposed law would allow a physician to perform an abortion at the request of the patient, if "the period of gestation has not exceeded 20 weeks and if the procedure is performed in a licensed hospital or other facility approved by the Department of Public Health."

Proponents say the law would give the mother the right to decide if she wants and can afford to have the child and it would do away with the illegal, back alley abortions. Also they say it would cut down the cost of an abortion, making it more readily available to lower income women.

It does not provide for the father having a voice in the decision.

In addition to the morality arguments, opponents say that the law will not do away with illegal abortions, costs of abortions won't be cut and the leniency of the law will cause an influx of women from across the country.

**PROPOSAL C** to amend the constitution would "limit property taxes for school, county and township purposes and to provide that the Legislature shall establish a state tax program for support of schools."

If passed, it will eliminate the property tax for general school operation purposes; limit the property tax to a maximum of 26 mills for county, township and school purposes; require the Legislature to establish a tax program to finance public school education; and require the Legislature to provide for distribution of supplemental funds based on local need and for specific purposes.

This proposal got on the ballot after a petition drive conducted by the Michigan Education Assn. It is supported by Gov. William Milliken.

The property tax would be replaced with an income tax and voters will have the chance to provide for a graduated income tax in a companion proposal.

**PROPOSAL D** would lift the constitutional ban on a graduated income tax. It doesn't provide for replacement of the property taxes with an graduated income tax but states it "would enable the Legislature to impose a flat rate or a graduated state income tax and to enact laws to permit local units to levy a flat rate or graduated income tax."

**PROPOSAL E** would benefit veterans. It would allow the state to borrow \$266 million for tuition payments and bonuses to veterans discharged after Jan. 1, 1961.

Vietnam veterans would be given a \$500 bonus, and veterans serving in non-combat areas would receive \$15 for each month of service to a maximum of \$360.

The state would pay for the proposed bond issue with money in the general fund. Proponents say that the bond issue would not require an increase in taxes and would follow the same procedure as in the past for World War II and Korean War veterans.

Michigan residents voted a three cents tax on cigarettes in 1949 and an additional two cents in 1952 to cover bonuses to veterans.

The last payment on the bond issue for Korean veterans was June of 1971 and the five cent tax now goes into the general fund. It would

presumably be channeled out to pay the \$17 million payments on this bond issue for the next 20 years.

Voters in Wayne County will vote on two other millage questions:

**PROPOSAL F** would increase the county millage by six-tenths mill for five years to pay for construction of a new jail. The jail is expected to cost nearly \$40 million. And...

**PROPOSAL G** would increase the county millage by another four-tenths mill for five years to cover the costs of planning and constructing juvenile facilities. It is estimated to cost \$29 million.

Passage of both proposals would produce an additional \$6 million annually through 1977. It would cost homeowners \$1 on each \$1,000 of state equalized valuation.

**FARMINGTON** residents

will vote on a \$1.2 million bond for construction of a city indoor ice arena and sports facility to be located at Shiawassee and Orchard Lake Rd.

**SOUTHFIELD** residents have three local proposals on their ballot:

• Proposal F would raise the millage ceiling in the charter by 3.5 mills, from seven to 10 mills.

• Proposal G would provide for a special election for mayor if a vacancy occurs between regular elections.

• Proposal H would abolish the pay board which is currently appointed by the mayor and which sets the income for all elected Southfield officials. It would keep salaries at the current level unless increases are approved by the voters.

## 2 Highways Will Get Repairs

Repair work on sections of I-96 and I-696, damaged by "blow-ups" during the hot days of early summer should be completed by September 1973 under a contract awarded by the State Highway Commission to John Carlo, Inc., Warren.

The contract calls for concrete paving repairs on I-96 from the Oakland-Livingston county line east to I-96 spur (Grand River Avenue) and on I-696 from I-96 east 5.7 miles to Middle Belt Road in Wixom, Novi, Farmington and Quakertown.

Repairs will be made both with pre-cast concrete slabs and quick hardening concrete poured in place. Carlo was lowest of three bidders at \$214,967.

The commission also awarded T.A. Forsberg, Inc., Okemos, the contract for deepening the Francis Drain from Ten Mile Road northeasterly to I-96 in Novi, work to be completed by June, 1973. Forsberg was lowest of ten bidders at \$39,967.

# AIP Hopeful Debates Ford's Man

Congressman William D. Ford (D-Taylor) has one active opponent in the 15th District campaign, but it isn't from the Republican corner.

Aldi Fuhrmann, the American Independent Party candidate, showed up last week to argue issues with Ford's administrative assistant, Frank Rathbun, in a panel sponsored by civic groups in Plymouth.

Republican contender Ernest Fackler, who reportedly has a new state job from Gov. Milliken, has virtually

stopped campaigning before he ever began.

FUHRMANN followed much the same line as AIP presidential candidate John Schmitz, a John Birch Society member, in laying blame for many of America's problems at the doorstep of communism.

"The United Nations was founded and conceived by communist hands," he declared, adding that 16 of 17 members of the U.S. team that helped found the UN were later "cited" for communist activities.

"We can't have peace until we get rid of 'em" — meaning communists and the UN."

The school busing controversy, Fuhrmann went on, stems from a UN resolution which says in effect that "you will be integrated whether you like it or not."

Another AIP concern is tax-exempt foundations, especially those funded by Ford and Kellogg.

Fuhrmann said 98 per cent of Soviet technology comes from the U.S. and its NATO allies. Contending that "the Soviet Union can't make war material without U.S. aid,"

Fuhrmann called for a cessation of that kind of trade with and aid to the Soviets.

RATHBUN AVOIDED any direct argument with the AIP candidate in reciting Ford's eight-year record in Congress. "Ford has voted with the groups in Congress who want to get out of Vietnam..."

"The problem isn't busing; it's quality education — which Congressman Ford has worked for in committee (Education and Labor). The federal government's share of education funding is seven per cent; Ford has introduced a

bill to raise it gradually to 35 per cent."

Rathbun answered another AIP candidate who had declared 90 per cent of the world's opium supply comes from a China and that opium plants should be defoliated by American air strikes. "Seventy per cent of the opium comes from Turkey rather than China, according to what I've read," Rathbun said. "President Nixon is supposedly trying to subsidize farmers in Turkey so that they won't be dependent on the sale of opium."

BOTH MEN were asked whether they thought the U.S.

and the world face over-population problems and, if so, what Congress should do about them.

Ford's assistant agreed with State Rep. Marvin Stempien (D-Livonia), an earlier speaker, that the world faces a problem in 20 or 30 years; that the U.S. doesn't; that population problems are related to water, land and air resources, which must be kept free of pollution and conserved; that birth control information should be readily available; and that parents should have free choice in deciding how many children they will produce.

Fuhrmann blamed population growth in the U.S. entirely on immigration. "If you're worried about over-population, cut off the influx of immigrants," he said.

The same day, the Commerce Dept.'s census index was saying that one birth occurs every 8 1/2 seconds, one death every 17 seconds and one-immigration every 70 seconds, in effect making immigration one-ninth as important a factor as births.

## Jail Millage Wins Support

The Detroit Bar Association, the Urban Alliance and four major labor organizations are among the groups that have endorsed the Wayne County jail and juvenile justice proposals that will be on the Nov. 7 election ballot.

Propositions F and G won endorsement by the United Auto Workers Union, the Metropolitan Detroit AFL-CIO Council, the Teamsters Union and the Metropolitan Detroit Building Trades Council. The board of directors of the Bar Association endorsed the two proposals at a meeting Oct. 19.

THE PROPOSITIONS were endorsed a few hours earlier by the Urban Alliance, a non-partisan organization that rates ballot proposals and candidates for office.

The two ballot proposals also have been endorsed by

the Detroit-Wayne County Criminal Justice System Coordinating Council which represents all city and county agencies involved in the courts, law enforcement and related programs.

Earlier endorsement came from New Detroit, Inc. which allocated some \$27,000 for a voter education campaign concerning the two proposals. New Detroit was established by the business community after the 1967 riot to alleviate conditions which led to the uprising. It is funded by grants from business.

Proposition F proposes 6-10ths of one mill (60 cents per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation) for a five-year period for construction of jail facilities.

Proposition G would provide 4-10ths of one mill (40 cents per \$1,000 of equalized valuation) for five years to build additional Juvenile Court facilities.

## UM Offers O'Leary Prize

ANN ARBOR Annual recognition and a prize for "the best piece of political journalism produced in Michigan each year" will be administered by the University of Michigan department of journalism.

The U-M Regents have authorized the establishment of the "Morgan O'Leary Fellowship Prize for Political Journalism." The request came from Philip A. Power, publisher of Observer Newspapers Inc.

The fellowship prize honors O'Leary, former director of public relations for the Michigan Democratic State Central Committee and public information officer for the Livonia School District. He was killed in a 1971 plane crash.

The winner of the annual

O'Leary prize must "make self available to the U-M students and faculty in a lecture or seminar during the year succeeding award of the prize," said Vice-President Michael Radock. The winner will carry the title "Morgan O'Leary Fellow in the University of Michigan Department of Journalism."

"Power proposes a transfer of an existing Morgan O'Leary Fund to the University to open the account and an annual mail solicitation campaign among O'Leary's friends and admirers," Radock said.

"The fund shall accumulate gifts and other transferred funds until a minimum of \$10,000 has been reached. Earnings from that principal, or a larger one supplemented by additional gifts, will be available for the prize."

**Nixon Signs Esch Bill On Technology**

Congressman Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) told the Livonia Civic Federation of Civic Associations that President Nixon has signed into law an Esch bill which will improve the working of Congress. The bill (HR 12043) creates an Office of Technology Assessment, which will serve Congress as an independent investigatory agency, similar to the General Accounting Office, with expertise in technological programs. OTA would advise Congress as to the technical feasibility of proposed federal programs and assist Congress in evaluating highly complicated proposals from federal agencies which deal with advanced technical products—such as the space shuttle.

Esch said, "This new agency will make a tremendous contribution to improving the decision making capabilities of Congress. If we are to make wise decisions on the multi-billion dollar programs proposed to us by such agencies as the Defense Department, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, the Atomic Energy Commission, etc., we must have all the facts in hand. This new agency will furnish us with an impartial and expert assessment of the facts."

Esch, who says he has worked for six years for congressional reform, told the Livonia group that "this is

only the first of numerous steps which need to be taken to improve the ability of the Congress to perform responsibly in assessing national problems."

He also discussed his bill, the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 1972, "which would have avoided the present squabble between Congress and the administration over spending limits since it would have forced Congress itself to act responsibly in dealing with the budget."

Esch is seeking re-election in the 2nd Congressional District which includes Livonia, Northville, Plymouth, the eastern half of Washtenaw County and Monroe County.

# Smit Opposes Graduated Tax Rate; Dwyer Hits Local School 'Bugaboo'

A graduated state income tax emerged as a major issue between a Republican state representative and his Democratic challenger in the 52nd House District.

Rep. Ray Smit (R-Ann Arbor) denounced Proposal D on the Nov. 7 ballot, contending a graduated income tax would lead to "uncontrolled spending."

Robert Dwyer, Plymouth businessman and Democratic leader, said Proposals C (limiting property taxes on schools) and D should be treated as a package. He favors the graduated income tax.

They spoke last week in a panel sponsored by civic groups in Plymouth. The 52nd District includes portions of eastern Washtenaw and western Wayne counties.

DWYER SAID "we have to treat the state as a single district for purposes of finance," making the finan-

cing of education a top state priority.

He denounced the "bugaboo about local control. School districts aren't sacred. Local control can be retained" even with state financing of schools.

Without endorsing or opposing the proposals, Dwyer

urged voters either to favor or oppose both C and D, and not to split them. If only C passes, individuals will pay higher taxes if both pass, they'll pay "a little less," he predicted.

Dwyer faulted Republicans in the Legislature for failing to put on the ballot a com-

promise plan of Gov. Milliken and Democratic leaders to cut property taxes and allow for a graduated income tax. Resolution "GG" got 54 Democratic and 21 Republican votes in the House but only three GOP votes in the Senate.

Dwyer called a flat rate income tax "regressive" and declared that a flat rate of seven or eight per cent, the level to which the tax would rise if only Proposal C is passed, would be "four times as regressive" as the current level.

REP SMIT, seeking his fourth term in Lansing, was "predicting and urging that C will pass" in order to cut property taxes for schools.

But he saw the present flat-rate income tax as a kind of lid on the general level of taxation and direly predicted state spending would soar if a graduated income tax were ever permitted and passed.

Asked if spending couldn't go out of control anyway, even

with a flat rate tax, Smit said it was unlikely. Backers of a graduated tax, he said, see it as a method of making others (high income persons) pay more. Taxes are fair only when "all segments share in paying."

Denouncing welfare spending, which he said had quadrupled in only six years,

Smit blamed the increases on federal rules; "adverse court decisions" which liberalize welfare requirements; and general societal problems such as the high divorce rate and deterioration of the family. Smit called the reelection of President Nixon as one way to retard liberal court decisions on welfare.

## Ban On Studded Tires Expected

This winter may be the last season that studded snow tires are legal in Michigan if proposed legislation is approved, according to Automobile Club of Michigan. Any legislative action would still permit tires with metal studs to be used on Michigan roads from Nov. 1 through April 30, 1973.

Alarmed over evidence that studded tires cause serious highway pavement damage, both the State Senate and House of Representatives have passed measures banning studs. A joint conference committee is expected to meet after Nov. 27 to iron out differences between the two bills. The House ban against studded tires would exclude the Upper Peninsula while the Senate version is a statewide restriction.

CURRENTLY, studded

tires are permitted in 45 states and the District of Columbia. Minnesota, Louisiana, Mississippi, Utah and Hawaii ban their use.

Michigan motorists driving with studded tires for a maximum of \$20 fine plus \$3 court costs.

## 2 Teacher Unions OK Stempien

State Rep. Marvin Stempien (D-Livonia) has been endorsed by the Livonia Education Assn. and the Michigan Federation of Teachers in his race against U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) for the 2nd congressional District seat. The 2nd District includes Livonia and Plymouth City and Township.

In announcing their endorsement, the LEA said "Stempien's "excellent





# Hoffa To County: Jail 'Degrading'

Warning, that if people "treat men like animals, they become like animals," former Teamsters Union President James R. Hoffa has joined the campaign for new jail and juvenile facilities in Wayne County.

In a Detroit Town Hall speech, Hoffa urged approval of two millage proposals Nov. 7 to build the facilities.

He and Sheriff William Lucas together called for voter approval of the two proposals—Propositions F and G.

PROPOSITION F would provide 6 10ths of one mill (60 cents per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation) for a five-year period, generating some \$39.5 million for construction and operation of new jail facilities.

Proposition G proposes a levy of 4 10ths of one mill (40 cents per \$1,000 of equalized valuation) for five years. It would raise a total of some \$28 million for new Juvenile Court facilities.

Hoffa has been crusading nationally for prison reform since being released from federal prison in December after serving 58 months of a 13-year sentence. His conviction on jury tampering charges is still being appealed.

In his speech, Hoffa painted a grim picture of human exploitation and degradation in prisons and jails. He called American prisons "the worst in the world" and urged his listeners to demand reform of conditions which, he warned, are among the causes of violent crime.

"Each one of you may be the victim of an individual that has been abused, disturbed, raped, beaten—because of your failure to act—in the prisons," he declared. "If you treat a man like an animal long enough, he'll become like

an animal and the people will pay."

IN ADDITION to calling for approval of the millage, Hoffa urged his listeners to write their congressmen, senators and other public officials with demands for penal reform.

Hoffa noted that Propositions F and G would provide facilities that would permit better separation of youthful and first-offenders from violent and hardened criminals. He stated:

"Recognize that your son, your daughter, unfortunately, may become involved in this day and age in something other than a major crime, and yet be pushed into a situation where those who have violated every rule that you respect, can assault, destroy and be associated with your immediate family."

8 slices bread, crusts removed  
2 c. wheat cereal, crushed with a rolling pin  
2 ripe bananas

Beat eggs slightly; add milk, sugar, salt and spices. Mix thoroughly. Cut bread in half diagonally. Dip in egg-milk mixture, then in cereal crumbs, coating both sides with the crumbs. Cover the bottom of a skillet with oil and fry the bread pieces on both sides until brown. Drain on a paper towel and keep warm in oven until all are cooked. Add more oil as needed. Slice bananas and put between two diagonal, cooked bread pieces to make a sandwich. Serve hot with syrup. Makes eight servings.

**TACKLER'S TREATS**  
4 T. softened butter or margarine  
3/4 c. sugar  
1/4 c. milk  
1 egg  
1 t. lemon juice  
1 c. flour  
1/4 t. baking soda  
1/4 t. salt  
1/4 t. each cinnamon, allspice  
1 large ripe banana, minced  
1 c. crushed Wheaties.

Cream butter and sugar until fluffy; beat in the egg. Combine milk and lemon juice; gradually add to creamed mixture. Mix in sifted flour, soda, salt and spices. Fold bananas and Wheaties in lightly. Drop by teaspoonfuls on greased baking sheet about three inches apart. Bake in preheated 375-degree oven for 10 or 12 minutes or until lightly colored. Remove with a spatula to a wire rack to cool. Makes about 24 2 1/2-inch cookies. To keep a few days, place waxpaper between cookies and wrap loosely in foil.

**HALF-TIME CUP CAKES**  
1 1/2 c. sifted all-purpose flour  
1 c. granulated sugar  
1 t. baking powder  
1 1/2 t. baking soda  
1/2 t. salt  
1 c. commercial sour cream  
1/2 c. fully ripe mashed banana  
1/4 c. butter  
2 eggs  
Confectioners' powdered sugar

Blend dry ingredients. Add sour cream, banana, butter and eggs. Mix at low speed of electric mixer until blended, about one minute, or mix by hand with a spoon. Fill paper or foil-lined medium muffin cups two-thirds full. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven for 25 to 30 minutes. Cool. Sprinkle with confectioners' sugar. Makes about 24 cupcakes.

**LINEBACKER'S BREAKFAST SOUFFLE**  
6 to 8 slices bacon  
2 T. bacon grease  
2 T. flour  
1/2 t. salt  
1/2 c. milk  
3 eggs, separated  
1 ripe banana, mashed


Fry bacon until crisp; chop and reserve. In a medium saucepan, heat bacon grease, add flour and salt and cook one minute. Mix in the milk and cook until the sauce becomes very thick and pulls away from the sides of the pan. Remove from heat and add one egg yolk at a time, beating vigorously after each addition. Mix in th banana. Whip egg whites until soft peaks form. Add about one cup of the whipped whites to the sauce mixture. Fold into mixture with a rubber scraper, using an up and over motion. Fold in the chopped bacon than gently fold in remaining egg whites. Scrape into a one-quart, ungreased souffle dish. Bake in preheated 350-degree oven for 30 to 35 minutes until golden brown. Makes four servings.



## How We See Ballot Issues

# Schools Need New Tax Plan

A quality public school education should be at the top or near the top of every parent's list of priorities for their children.

It is obvious that a good local school system has a lifetime impact on a youngster and what he or she does after completing their education.

For those reasons, both Proposals C and D should be approved by voters at the Nov. 7 general election.

**PROPOSAL C** would shift the burden of school financing from the regressive local property tax to the State Legislature, which then would decide which taxes would replace property taxes for school operations.

The local property tax already has been stretched to the limit in most suburban school districts, and it certainly does not do the job of raising sufficient funds to finance one of the most important public services offered by government.

Of any kind of tax to pay for any service, the property tax is the least fair and the least just for people in any income bracket, but even more so for those with modest or pension incomes.

The unjust property tax system now has Dearborn homeowners paying 12 mills for schools (\$12 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation) and getting

an estimated \$1,250 of expenditures per student. A few miles away, Wayne - Westland School District has a tax levy of 36.6 mills -- the highest in the state and three times the Dearborn levy -- but gets only \$950 per student.

By lifting the property tax off of the over-burdened shoulders of homeowners, there would be financial relief for thousands of senior citizens, who in many cases have to pay an outrageous percentage of their modest income for property taxes.

**PROPOSAL D** should be approved by Nov. 7 because lifting the constitutional ban on a graduated rate income tax would open the door for a long-needed

justice and fairness to our tax system.

Most economists have long argued for a graduated rate income tax as the fairest possible and we agree.

The current flat rate tax carries over to a degree one of the evils of the local property tax in that it places much of the burden on modest and middle-income wage earners without a real recognition of a person's ability to pay.

Studies by Gov. William Milliken's staff show that most suburbanites would either benefit by a savings in the shift from a property tax to a state income tax hike or have one tax offset the other.

But in any case, decrease or increase in taxes, Proposal D represents the fairest and most just manner to finance public education in Michigan.

## Does State Owe Vets?

Proposal E on the Nov. 7 ballot would allow the state to borrow \$266 million to provide tuition and cash bonuses for Vietnam veterans who are Michigan residents.

It is an unusual proposal because it seeks to supplement existing federal aid programs for returning veterans with additional state benefits.

There is absolutely no question in our mind that society as a whole owes a great debt to the

men and women who served their country in Vietnam. The real question involved in Proposal E is whether or not it is appropriate for Michigan taxpayers to pay for additional benefits for our state's veterans.

We think not, and accordingly urge a "No" vote on this proposition.

After all, veterans serve in the U.S. armed forces, not state militias. They are selected by the federally run Selective Service system, not through some Michigan-only agency. Traditionally, the federal government through the Veterans Administration has taken responsibility for providing benefits to all veterans regardless of state of origin.

We see at this point no overwhelming argument that this pattern should be broken with approval for an expensive \$266

bond issue for a purely Michigan benefit program.

It can be argued that present federal programs for veterans are inadequate. This is true. But the solution to this problem is not to augment existing programs on a state by state basis, but rather to improve the present federal package.

It can also be said that Michigan previously had similar programs for World War II and Korean War veterans. But merely to say that such programs existed in the past does not necessarily prove that to have a new one now would be the right thing.

On balance, we feel the best way for all veterans to get the generous kind of aid they deserve is through the federal government and not through Proposal E.

## Abortion: A Personal Decision

Proposal B on the Nov. 7 ballot deals with one of the most emotionally charged issues to hit the state in many years -- abortion.

The proposal, if approved, would change present state law sharply limiting abortion to allow a licensed physician to perform an abortion in a state licensed facility at the request of the mother up to 20 weeks of pregnancy.

Few issues are so personal and so private as an individual's attitude toward abortion.

Few public issues have been so heatedly debated, with so few minds changed as a result.

An individual's attitude toward abortion is likely an expression of his most deeply held religious and ethical beliefs. Newspaper editorials, whether for or against Proposal B, are likely to have virtually no effect on the reader's views.

Accordingly, we simply urge each voter to consider Proposal B carefully and to vote according to the dictates of his or her own private conscience.

## How You Can Make Halloween Safer

It's trick-or-treat time in most Observerland communities.

The traditional Oct. 31 has been officially declared as Halloween in most of our cities and townships.

This year, like last year, stories of Halloween tragedies come to mind. The following are some simple steps that parents can take to insure that their children have a safe and happy Halloween.

- If you're going to give out treats, turn your porch light on. That way the little hob-goblins will know where they're welcome and will be able to navigate your porch steps better.

- Give out only wrapped candy. Recent instances of tampered-treats have been unfortu-

nate and can be avoided.

- Tell your children to bring their treats home to be inspected before sampling them.

- Have your children confine their trick-or-treating to your immediate neighborhood and if possible, go only to homes where the neighbors are known.

- If possible, go with your children. Make sure that little children are accompanied by older ones.

- Have children wear costumes that will show up clearly in the dark and avoid masks that impair their visibility.

- When driving on Halloween, be careful of youngsters crossing streets. Make sure your children know pedestrian rules.

## DST Good For State On Balance

Once again Michigan voters will have a chance to put the state in line with the rest of the country by passing the daylight savings time Proposal A on Nov. 7.

It will be the second time in recent years that voters will face the ballot issue, and we again urge that it be passed.

In 1968 the issue narrowly missed approval when it lost by only 490 votes of the more than 2.8 million votes cast.


This time voters will find the wording of the ballot issue much simpler, stating that "the proposed law would change Michigan to daylight savings time from the last Sunday in April until the last Sunday in October of each year."

Not only would it put Michigan in time with the rest of the country, but it would give Michigan residents an extra hour of daylight to enjoy summer evenings.

To the golfer it means that he will have more time on the golf course, and to the homeowner it means he will have more time to do his outdoor work and keep his weekends free.

But to those interested in the environment, it also means an hour less each evening of using electrical power. It would be better for the environment, conserve on power and save pennies on electrical bills.

In our estimation, the advantages far outweigh any disadvantages.



## County, Suburbs Deserve New Jail And Juvenile Home

It's a shame that Wayne County is being forced by a court order to build a new jail. As a matter of civic duty and human decency, the leaders and voters should have provided proper quarters for persons awaiting trial or serving short sentences for minor matters long ago.

Instead, prisoners themselves filed a suit and won a court order for new facilities. Even if these people are prisoners, they don't deserve to be treated like rats. They're still human.

A new jail will be built eventually, regardless of the method by which it is financed. It will cost \$39.6 million and include a downtown facility for 750 inmates and an out-county facility in Westland for 400.

**PROPOSAL F** on the Nov. 7 ballot would provide 6/10ths of a mill for five years to pay for a new jail. If it fails, the jail will still have to be built, but through different financial arrangements. These could involve a bond issue that might double the cost over a long period of time.

Which makes more sense: To finance new jail facilities on a pay-as-you-go basis or to burn up a lot of money on interest payments? Clearly, it's cheaper to pay 60 cents per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation for five years. We fully endorse a "yes" vote on Proposal F.

The faster and more cheaply we build a new jail, the better. If you don't like the idea of "coddling" prisoners, then look at it

this way. Jail conditions currently are so bad that judges are reluctant to send prisoners there. We will be protecting ourselves from these criminals by forthrightly approving Proposal F and working speedily.

A **COMPANION** proposition on the Wayne County ballot is Proposal G, which would provide 4/10ths of a mill for five years to build \$29.3 million in juvenile facilities.

The present youth home, on E. Forest at the Chrysler Freeway in Detroit, would be expanded from its present capacity of 215 juveniles to 325.

In addition, a new detention facility for 110 youngsters would be built on a 75-acre county site near Michigan Avenue and Merriman roads in Westland.

It's in suburbia's interest to have such facilities near by. For years we have heard suburbanites complain that county services are all in downtown Detroit and that the traffic is terrible. Well, here's a chance to develop a western county services area.

"Facilities" mean more than just a detention home. Courtrooms, administrative offices and staff facilities are included in the 1965-80 construction plan.

By 1980, western Wayne County will have a greater population -- both total and juveniles -- than Detroit and the eastern suburbs. It makes excellent sense to begin the planning and building right now by giving support to Proposal G.

## Secrecy At Clarenceville

# The Public Gets Invited -- Out

The Clarenceville Board of Education appears to prefer pragmatism over following the law in its handling of teacher union contracts.

Last year it tweaked the public's nose by ratifying its contract with the Clarenceville Education Assn. (CEA) at a closed door "public" meeting from which press and public had been "invited out."

This year, after negotiators reached agreement on a tentative contract, the two sides agreed to keep its terms secret until both sides had ratified.

**THEN THE BOARD**, at a public meeting before the teach-

ers had voted, ratified this year's pact.

Under the Michigan School Code all official board actions must be taken at regular public meetings. And under the same code, records of official actions automatically become public records and subject to public inspection.

But Supt. David McDowell still refused to let the press know terms of the contract, citing his secrecy deal with the CEA.

He said the board didn't want "premature publicity" to get the teachers rattled into possibly turning down the agreement.

But the Observer feels the public had as great a stake in the agreement as the teachers. The public is paying the bill. More-

over, the law is on the public's side.

Supt. McDowell told the Observer that he had talked with a Dr. Edward Pfau whom McDowell identified as a member of the State Department of Education's legal division and had been advised that withholding contract information from the public was "in line with what most districts do."

**BUT DR. PFAU**, who turned out to be in the department's research (not legal) division, said the conversation had taken place before the board acted to ratify.

"I don't remember the conversation exactly," Dr. Pfau told the Observer, "but I think it was something to the effect that it could make agreement less of a

problem" if details were withheld from the press.

Dr. Pfau said he also had reminded Supt. McDowell that there currently is a bill in the Legislature which would require any district which had failed to reach a contract with its teachers by June 15 to perform all further bargaining in public.

Dr. Pfau opined he saw little chance of the bill's passage, but added: "It shows the trend of public thinking."

That trend would appear to be that while it might be more pleasant for the board to tie itself into a contract and present it to the public as a "fait accompli," the board wasn't elected to perform pleasant tasks but to stand in for the public's interests.







# Who Are You Being Halloween?

OR HOW ABOUT being a belle of the Gay '90s?

The Farmington Players, who know how much fun it is to dress up and be someone else, stand ready at Halloween to help others do the same.

The Players have a huge collection of fancy dress costumes they'll rent for masquerades, and maybe throw in a bit of dress-up advice as time allows.

This week members of the theatrical group are on duty each day from 1 to 6 p.m. in the Players' Barn, 12 Mile east of Farmington Road.

Also in the barn are long racks of costumes ranging from his 'n hers clown outfits to a glamorous queen's robe and crown.

MANY HAVE BEEN worn in Players productions over the years. Some, like the clown suits, are strictly for rental. And costumes from the Players' collection have walked off with many a first prize at masquerade balls.

The Players, a going concern in Farmington for a

couple of decades now, began their Halloween rental tradition in the late 1950s.

Mrs. Hope Nahstoll, longtime of the Players, told about the project.

"We started in the late 1950s," she said, "after we bought a costume collection from Mrs. William Lancaster."

A teacher of expression for many years, Mrs. Lancaster had made a practice of renting out costumes at Halloween.

She had built up a large clientele," Mrs. Nahstoll said, "and our plan was to continue the renting for just a few years to cover the cost of the group of costumes."

HOWEVER, the rental program wasn't easy to drop, the theater group learned.

"We found it was a community service that people needed," and we also were making a profit and raising money to put into new costumes and props for our productions," Mrs. Nahstoll added.

So the service has continued,

and last year the Players outfitted well over 100 Halloween party-goers and netted \$500 in the process.

The several hundred costumes in the players' collection one of the most extensive owned by a community theater group - have come from many sources.

There's a red velvet roaring twenties dress that showed up in a clothing drive to support the American Field Service exchange student program in Farmington.

"The AFS leaders didn't think it quite suitable for that sale," Mrs. Nahstoll said, "so they gave it to us." An elegant evening wrap from the turn of the century era was trimmed with braid for a queen's robe when the Players put on "A Man for All Seasons" a couple of seasons back.

PLAYERS MEMBERS check rummage sales, both for items that would be good for costumes and for formals made of usable material. Several such gowns in silks and velvets have been turned

into tunics for Shakespearean productions and the musical "Once Upon a Mattress," and these are popular rental costumes for men at Halloween.

"It rather surprised me when the men started wearing them with tights," Hope Nahstoll said. "Not too long ago most men wouldn't have considered such a costume for Halloween or any other time."

Mrs. Nahstoll finds antique shop visits in search of costume material an interesting part of vacations, and she's delighted to receive on behalf of the players any period clothing people want to donate.

Several such gifts, particularly appreciated by the Players, came from Mrs. William Slocum of Farmington, daughter of the late Fred Warner who was governor of Michigan.

"She gave us dresses she and her mother wore when her father was governor," Mrs. Nahstoll said. "We cherish these; they've been on our

stage but they don't go out as rentals."

Quite available to rent, though, are some of the 200 outdated tuxedos presented by Town Toggery, a menswear store in Farmington.

COSTUMES are available in pairs, she said, because that seems to be a popular way to go to a masquerade. "If we outfit a woman in a 'Gay Nineties dress," she said, "we usually can fix her escort up as a riverboat gambler or something like that."

The rental cost of outfits such as a complete clown suit is \$5. Accessories, such as a hat or shawl to go with a dress, are extra. Or the players will rent a glamorous accessory alone instead of a complete outfit.

A deposit equal to the rental fee now is charged, and it is returned if the costume is returned in good condition on the date agreed upon by the Players and the renter.

You have to stay in the hotel in which you are told to stay. Service in the restaurants is very bad. There is no incentive to do better, since the only upward mobility is by education and a person with little education has no chance for advancement.

"To say something nice,"

she said, "the children are a delight and the people are wonderful, but they are afraid. You are a prisoner in your own country." But to the Russians, who had so little in the past, for their children to have a chance to get an education "is a marvelous thing."

She found that she made many friends by tipping with tubes of lipstick, hair bows and mascara instead of money. These items are very costly in the USSR, and the recipients are delighted with them.

Miss Kampen has, of course, written a book about her trip. It's entitled "Are You Carrying Any Gold or Living Relatives?"

"You mean bums," I suggested.


"No, hoboes," She was emphatic. I decided I'd better learn the distinction.

## LWV Compiles Figures For Predictions

WASHINGTON, D.C. A prediction that women will be celebrating the enactment of the equal rights amendment to the U.S. Constitution by next May was released by the national president of the League of Women Voters, along with voting figures indicating that in the November election, women could, for the first time, vote in greater percentages than men.

"State legislatures are ratifying the equal rights amendment at about the same pace they took action on the woman's suffrage amendment," the league announced.

FIVE MONTHS after Congress approved the 19th Amendment (June, 1919), 19 out of the necessary 36 state legislatures had given their approval. Five months after the March 1972 Senate passage, 20 out of the necessary 38 states have acted affirmatively on the amendment.

"If the pattern continues to hold," said Lucy Wilson Benson, league president, "the enactment of the 27th Amendment will come in May of next year."

"Leaguers have not forgotten their suffragist roots," she continued, "and in state legislatures where action is still to come, we'll be working for women's rights just as hard as our predecessors lobbied for the right to vote."

AS TO THE WOMAN'S impact on the upcoming election, a recent Gallup Poll shows that women and men are even in registration (74 per cent each) but women's turnout record in the last five elections has run an average of four percentage points lower than the men.

However, Mrs. Benson feels that "with the indisputable upsurge in women's interest in politics there's an excellent chance that we will surpass the men's voting record."

The league's figures indicate that if all the women who are registered do vote, women will cast about six million more votes than men. Then too, according to the U.S. Census figures, women outnumber men with a slight edge in the 18-24 year old group, the first-time presidential vote category.

But figures fail to give any indication on which way the

woman's vote will go. In the last six presidential elections, according to Gallup Polls, women have gone with the winner three times (Eisenhower twice and Johnson) and with the loser three times (Dewey, Nixon, and Humphrey.)

The league also released some Then (1920) and Now (1972) figures showing the upsurge of women's participation in government. In 1920, 26 per cent of the women voted. In 1972, 60 per cent are expected to vote.

In 1920, there were no

women serving in Congress. In 1972, there are 12 women in the House and two in the Senate.

In 1920, the Democrats had 93 women delegates to the convention and the Republicans had 27 women

delegates. In 1972, there were 1,271 women delegates to the Democratic Convention and the Republicans had 469.

After the 1920 elections, there were 37 women serving in state legislatures. In 1972, there are 383 women serving in state legislatures.





# Auto Industry Leaves Many State Landmarks

Michigan has numerous landmarks which are reminders of its early automobile years, according to Automobile Club of Michigan.

The landmarks are former homes of automotive pioneers, or old factory buildings where almost forgotten cars were once made. Some of the latter have been merged into the huge complexes of today's automobile companies.

Some landmarks can be visited, but others remain private homes or are still used in manufacture. A few are memorials, set aside for the part they once played in automotive history.

AMONG THE best known is Fair Lane, built by Henry Ford in 1915 and where he died in April, 1947. The big yet unpretentious stone mansion is just off Michigan Avenue near Southfield in Dearborn.

For years the 56-room home beside the Rouge River with its gardens, trees, orchards and farm fields was the center from which Ford directed his vast interests and where he and wife, Clara, entertained family, friends

and distinguished guests from America and abroad. After Ford's death, Fair Lane housed the Ford Motor Co. Archives for several years. In 1956 the company gave the estate, including 210 acres of adjacent land, to the University of Michigan.

It is now a conference center and headquarters for the University's Dearborn campus. Tours of Fair Lane may be arranged.

Nearby is the huge Ford Rouge Plant, begun in 1917, which became the world's largest single-company industrial complex during the mid-1920s and today remains the only factory which can turn raw material into finished autos within a matter of hours.

There are nearly 100 structures, sprawled over some 1,115 acres. The Ford Rouge visitor tours are popular.

THE ROUGE plant superseded another famous Ford factory, the Highland Park plant, which gained fame as the birthplace of mass production and the Ford Model T. When it went into production in 1910, it was not only the biggest building under one roof in Michigan but also the world's largest automobile factory. Today the plant is still owned by Ford.

Ford conceived a plan during the early 1920s to dot the countryside with small waterdriven factories to offer employment to farmers during the winter.

Of the 22 hydro-powered village industries he eventually built, only Northville still remains in operation. It employs about 230 persons and makes valves. Another country factory, Nankin Mills, is now a nature center.

Greenfield Village, part of the Americana complex started by Ford which contains more than 100 historic buildings, preserves the white frame house where he was born in 1863. Restored in 1916 on its original site at Ford and

Greenfield Roads, it was moved to the Village in 1944.

Another Ford-related plant and a milestone is the Willow Run facility. It was the largest single-building factory in the world when completed in 1942 and the first plant to mass produce airplanes. In 1953 the factory was taken over by General Motors' Hydramatic Division.

THE DETROIT area has several other automotive landmarks.

The Gray Motor Car Co.'s original factory is now a part of Chrysler Corp.'s Highland Park plant. Gray, manufactured between 1916-26, came into Chrysler ownership, via Maxwell, in 1925. The building is located at the foot of McLean near Oakland, behind an engineering office structure.

Buildings at Chrysler's Jefferson Ave. plant go back more than 60 years, when Chalmers Motor Co. owned the plant. Today Chryslers and Imperials are built there.

Much of Chrysler's Hamtramck assembly plant, once known as Dodge Main, dates back to the Dodge Motor Co. in 1914.

The old Packard plant at 1500 East Grand Boulevard was the first large automobile plant in Detroit. Packards were manufactured there until production was discontinued in 1958. The factory, including most of the nine structures built between 1903-05, are occupied today by varied enterprises.

A DETROIT HOME of a prominent auto pioneer is that of John Dodge, at 121 E. Boston Blvd. It is now occupied by the Catholic Archdiocese of Detroit.

Kearsley Street in Flint, which extends from downtown to the present Cultural Center which includes Flint Community College, once contained rows of homes of automotive leaders. Several still are standing.

Albert Champion, who organized the A. C. Spark Plug

Co. in Flint with W. C. Durant, lived at 423 E. Kearsley in 1919-20.

C. S. Mott, a pioneer who became one of the GM's largest stockholders, lived in the same home between 1912-16. Mott then built Applewood, where he still lives, at 1400 E. Kearsley.

James Whiting was another who lived on the street. He was president of the Flint Wagon Works at the time Buick was brought to Flint for \$10,000 in 1903. It is now a home for the aged.

Charles W. Nash, former president of Buick and General Motors, lived at 804 Garland Street from about 1903 until he left to found Nash Motor Co., in Kenosha, Wis., in 1916. Although remodeled, the house still stands.

LOUIS CHEVROLET, a French-Swiss mechanic who designed the first automobiles for Durant which bore the Chevrolet name, lived in a house which still stands at 917 Root Street.

The homes of several other Flint automotive greats, including J. Dallas Dort, Durant and Walter P. Chrysler, have been lost through the years, some through urban renewal.

The Durant-Dort factory on Lewis Street was built in 1902, after an earlier building was destroyed by fire. After 1912 it was headquarters for the Imperial Wheel Co., another division of Durant-Dort.

Although now used by a wholesale firm, the original automobile lettering can still be seen on the side of the building.

Early Buick and Chevrolet plants have been enveloped into the present-day giant complexes.

THE ORIGINAL factory of Buick in Jackson, before manufacturing was moved to Flint, is now a part of Kelsey-Hayes operation.

In Kalamazoo, the old three-story factory of the Roamer Motor Car Co. is used by a paper company. Before the Roamer car, built between

1916-25, the structure housed the Michigan Buggy Co., manufacturers of a car called the Michigan which was on the automotive scene between 1903-13.

The former Handley and Handley-Knight (1921-23) plant in Kalamazoo is now in the Checker Motors Corp. complex.

Lansing still has several automotive landmarks, despite losing the landmark R. E. Olds home to freeway construction several years ago. One is Oldsmobile's building 16. Erected in 1912, it is used today for the sub-assembly and assembly of Toronados, as well as for storage space.

# Esch, Stempien Field Questions On Ecology, Busing, Attendance

About 200 Livonia high school students got a better look at the 2nd congressional district candidates last week than did Livonia and Plymouth residents who turned out for a candidates night that evening.

Since U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) arrived late for the candidates night, the audience missed a chance to put the same questions to Esch and his prime opponent, Rep. Marvin Stempien (D-Livonia).

But earlier Thursday both Esch and Stempien faced Churchill High School students and sparred about stands on busing, pollution and attendance records.

The students saw more of the similarities and differences between the candidates than did the audience at the candidates night cosponsored by the American Assn. of University Women and League of Women Voters.

AMERICAN Independent Party candidates Henry Kroes made his first public appearance in Livonia and Plymouth, telling his audience he wasn't there to give "goody goody government campaign promises."

"Remember that govern-

ment can't give you anything without first taking it away," he added.

Launching into an attack on the Council of Foreign Relations, Kroes described it as a group of prominent politicians whose objective is to "bring the United States into an one world government."

"They are working to overthrow the United States government as an independent world government," Kroes said.

All recent presidents and presidential candidates as well as all presidential appointees since after World War II have belonged to the council, he said.

The monetary system in the country is completely controlled by the Federal Reserve

System, Kroes continued, and it in turn is controlled by member banks.

The third problem Kroes pointed to was drugs.

"Everybody is talking about programs for addicts, but what they're not talking about is stopping the drugs at their source."

Where do the drugs come from? Kroes said 80 per cent come from a province in China and said the later he would be in favor of defoliating the province to eliminate the poppy plants.

STEMPIEN LISTED his priorities as ending the war in Vietnam, creating jobs to decrease the unemployment rates, and working on environmental and education measures.

"I would rather err on the side of unemployment than err on the side of inflation as we have in the last four years," he said, urging creation of jobs "even if it costs us something in inflation."

Stempien said he has been very active in the area of consumer protection legislation in Lansing and would continue this interest in Congress.

ESCH DIRECTED his comments toward action on the Education and Labor Committee and Science and Astronautics Committee that are expected next year.

More money will be allocated to schools from the federal government with no strings attached, Esch predicted, and the Congress will also pass legislation to prohibit cross district busing for racial balance.

Originating out of the science committee will be legislation that Esch sponsored to reconstruct the economy to provide retraining for workers and increase jobs.

The value added tax on business is "less than an honest tax," he said, responding to a question. He said he wouldn't support a "clean value added tax," but a modification of it.

BOTH CANDIDATES attacked more issues in the Churchill discussion with questions on marijuana drawing the biggest student response.

Stempien drew applause from the audience when he commented that the Legislature "will ultimately license marijuana as alcohol is licensed."

Noting that the Legislature recently passed a new law lowering penalties for possession of marijuana, Stempien said it will be some time before further changes are made.

"This state is not ready for that (licensing)," the Democrat said. Esch's comment that he supports the "decriminalization of marijuana" also received applause. He also advocated increased federal drug education funds.

ON THE controversial abortion issue, Esch's stand was warmly received. Esch commented that he has not taken a public stand on the liberalized abortion

proposal before state voters at the general election.

"No politician can decide for you but each human being ... should make that decision," Esch said.

Stempien's only comment on abortion was that he plans to vote against the proposal. In answer to another question, Esch said the United States should help reconstruct both North and South Vietnam after the war in southeast Asia is over.

"If we have devastated the country, we must clean up afterward," he commented. That includes North and South Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia, he added.

Earlier, the incumbent commented that since 1967 he has "supported a position similar to McGovern's."

He said he supports a unilateral cease fire. A date for withdrawal of troops should also be set, he said, but not until prisoners are released.

STEMPIEN SAID that the war issue has become similar to the busing question because candidates are seeing "who can 'outwar' the other one, who can 'outbus' the other."

The Livonia Democrat added that he worked against the nomination of Lyndon Johnson in 1967 because of Johnson's war position.

He also supported a cease fire.

"The way to end the war is to stop shooting," he said. IN A RELATED question, Esch said Congress cannot decide the amnesty issue while Stempien said no amnesty should be given to deserters.

"I support the idea...that we should not talk in Congress about the amnesty issue until the war is over and the prisoners returned," Esch said. He noted that the president now has the power to grant amnesty.

Stempien said amnesty should not be given to deserters. He said deserters should face the consequences of their actions.

"Amnesty must be discussed in conjunction with the prisoner of war issue," Stempien added.

A QUESTION about Esch's attendance record led to a

sharp exchange between the candidates.

Esch, who has been criticized by Stempien for his attendance record, said he ranks in the top one-fourth of all representatives. He said he voted in from 80-83 per cent of all vote calls.

In a parting shot, Esch commented that Stempien ranks eighty-third out of 110 state representatives in attendance.

In answer, Stempien commented: "Figures lie and liars figure." His criticism of Esch's attendance record comes from checking the Congressional Record, Stempien said.

On his own record, the challenger said he missed one day in 1971 while he was in Washington, D.C. discussing revenue sharing with federal leaders. In 1972, Stempien said, he missed seven days when his brother died. In 1969, Stempien said he missed two months while in the hospital for surgery.

"Other than that, my record has been in the same general category as the speaker of the House, and he's there every day," commented Stempien, who is the majority floor leader of the house.

In rebuttal, Esch said both have similar attendance records.

"On balance, we ought to see that both individuals are on the job," the incumbent said.

IN ANSWER to another question, Stempien said in general he supports low tariffs rather than high tariffs. He said "I do not believe in protectionism or isolationism."

Esch said he supports "equity in trade."

"We can't have any country flooding our market," but added "we simply can't go back to building walls and tariff wars."

The challenger hit Esch for his vote in favor of U.S. Rep. Jack McDonald's amendment to the Clean Water Act.

In answer to a question about pollution, Esch said it was "largely my initiative" which got the clean water bill passed.

Stempien replied that Esch voted for McDonald's amendment which Stempien said would exempt industry from paying for capital improvements needed to clean up water pollution.

## Bridge Hand Confidence

Ever get discouraged when the opponents open the bidding? Ever tend to downgrade your holding because of it? Ever lose buckets of points because of that? Can this tendency be corrected? Hmmm...

The deal is valuable for several reasons as a teaching source:

(1) note North's excellent choice of a takeout double rather than bidding spades immediately: the spades can come later

(2) note South's willingness to make a jump bid confirming 10-plus honor points with only a 4-card minor

(3) note North's champion bid of 3H, confirming the club suit, showing the heart stopper (or void) and requesting South's controls

(4) note North's good choice of Blackwood and South's equally fine response. Blackwood specifically requests aces OUTSIDE THOSE ALREADY CUE-BID BY EITHER PARTNER: hence duplication is avoided

(5) finally, note North's slamming the hand at 6, not probing for 7.

THE PLAY was also somewhat instructive:

Declarer decided that he had

too few entries to his hand to ruff out all his red losers in dummy, and the diamond finesse didn't look like a good bet (he being not gifted with your X-ray vision!); he therefore played to break spades no worse than 4-2 (5-1, if trump broke 2-2).

Thus declarer won the opening lead with dummy's S A, cashed C A K, ruffed a heart in dummy, ruffed a spade in the hand, ruffed a second heart in dummy, and led another low spade, ruffing with the hand's last trump.

West might overruff, in which case dummy was good, so he dumped a diamond; declarer then crossed to D K and ran the spades: West was welcome to ruff in at any time and dummy would still be high with its one remaining trump left as an entry.

Remember... when the opponents open the bidding, you may still have the upper hands!

# How Nader Sees 3 Congressmen

Instead of eliciting scathing criticism and fervent denials as many expected, Ralph Nader's investigation of local congressmen has drawn favorable comments from at least two of the representatives who were investigated.

It may have been a sigh of relief, but both U.S. Rep. William D. Ford (D-Taylor) and Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) said they were "pleased" with the final report and had only mild criticism of the contents.

U.S. Rep. Martha Griffiths (D-Detroit) had severely criticized the preliminary report, but the final copy has eliminated some of her sore spots.

"I WAS PLEASED with it," Ford, who represents the 15th district, said. "My only concern with it is that I don't know how the newspapers and news media are going to treat it."

The fact that the report only briefly describes the bills on which the representative's votes are disclosed was "disappointing," Ford added.

"That's one of the things Nader insisted he was going to do -- give a broader in-depth analysis of voting patterns" than other groups do, he said.

Esch, who represents the 2nd District, says the study reemphasizes "that Esch is an individual in his thinking."

"Secondly it emphasizes my service to the district," Esch added.

His positions on environmental legislation and against the Vietnam war are stressed in the report.

BECAUSE THE descrip-

tions of the congressman's votes are so brief, they tend to be deceptive, Ford said.

For example a committee vote shows Ford voted against a measure "to give public service job preference to unemployed veterans who served after 1964."

This is deceptive because of the wording in the measure, Ford said. He said that veterans should be given special consideration (which was finally put into the bill) but giving them "job preference" would have forced hiring veterans over an unemployed man with five children and possibly fire persons if a veteran applies for the same job.

"BILL FORD votes a straight liberal ticket for federal aid to education, OEO antipoverty programs, unemployment insurance, urban renewal and model cities, rat control, child care, legal services for the poor, increased social security benefits, and pollution control," the Nader report states.

"Ford is known for his impatience with those conservatives who decry deficit spending," the report continues. "The fact is, they are advocating that the members sit by the path with their rifles

and shoot mice while the elephants march by," Ford is quoted as saying.

The report praises Ford's action on education measures and notes that he cosponsored the Higher Education Bill which marks the first federal aid legislation passed for colleges and universities.

It traces his changing position on Vietnam from 1967 when he was totally committed to the war until 1968 when, after the Gulf of Tonkin episode, Ford became critical of the war.

THE REPORT praises Esch as being "his own man."

"Marvin Esch: the media calls him a liberal, the Democrats call him an administration supporter, and he calls himself a pragmatist. By looking at his legislative record one can see that he is quite literally his own man: he votes the way he feels."

"No one can accuse Esch of being a straight, party-line voter," it continues. "In 1971, he supported the President only 51 per cent of the time while the average Republican support ran to 72 per cent. "Esch voted with a majority of the Republican party 45 per cent of the time and opposed them 37 per cent."

It states that Esch made 78

per cent of the House floor votes and missed voting on key issues such as cutting the Peace Corps budget, an appropriations bill for foreign economic and military aid, an urban renewal amendment and legislation on wage and price controls.

He missed the subsidy votes for the supersonic transport, Lockheed loan guarantees and merchant marine construction and subsidies. Esch also missed the vote to permit the underground nuclear test in Alaska.

"THE VIETNAM war has been one of Esch's primary concerns," it says. "He is against the war, and this is where he differs greatly from Nixon. He has authored a position paper on the war and has cosponsored several anti-war bills."

Esch's votes on environmental legislation are cited including one to end killing of sea mammals, a noise control bill and one to give the Environmental Protection Agency the power to impose federal pollution standards.

"Recently Esch's floor voting record has been anti-labor," the reports states, citing his vote against migrant worker compensation and to

settle the West Coast dock strike through compulsory legislation.

"On the manpower side of the Education and Labor Committee, Esch is known as an innovator. He is attempting to greatly expand efforts on prison reform, including proposals for job training and subsequent opportunities for criminal offenders.

ESCH WAS critical of the report's statement that he "has not been an active or successful initiator of legislation."

"It shows some naivete on their part," Esch said, explaining that it is necessary to have Democratic names on legislation in order to get bills through the Democratic congress.

REP. MARTHA Griffiths

(D-Detroit) is described as a "skilled politician who chooses her fights carefully" in Nader's study.

"Her record as a member of Congress is not that of a reform leader," the report states. Although she consistently supports programs to solve social problems, her positions on crime and justice, welfare, foreign policy and defense spending are described as more moderate than liberal.

It points out that she was the sole dissident in 1966 for a drug treatment program that offered addicts a choice of resident treatment instead of prison for up to three years. She is said to have called the program a "bribe" to allow addicts to escape prosecutions. The bill did not apply to addicts convicted of violent crimes, the report states.

"When Griffiths gets into a fight, she is a formidable opponent," the report states. "But her critics complain about the battles she has chosen not to take on."

An anonymous Detroit official is quoted as saying "In general, Martha Griffiths has been neither particularly helpful nor particularly difficult. There's no one thing we've gotten I can trace directly to her."

THE REPORT continues by describing her busing votes. "Griffiths, a supporter of civil rights legislation in the 1960s, simply did not vote on busing questions in 1971. But she opposed it this year. Asked about Michigan Democrats and busing, Griffiths bluntly responded, 'If they don't vote against busing, they won't be back next year.'"

Members of peace and welfare groups are reportedly "anxious" to see her advocate their causes more forcefully.

The report also says she has not been "an avid floor supporter of cutting the defense budget."

"Some of Griffiths' black constituents complain that they find it difficult to bring their problems to her. She has created some enmity among blacks in Detroit because she supports President Nixon's family assistance plan, bitterly opposed by the National Welfare Rights Organization."
