

Welfare Organizations Thrive On Harmony

The Michigan Cancer Foundation, the American Red Cross and the Plymouth Dental Fund are classic examples of why money isn't everything.

These health and welfare organizations -- one local, one statewide and one international -- run on people power: hundreds of area volunteers put in time and energy to stretch Community Fund dollars and extend services to several times as many local persons in need as might otherwise be possible.

The Cancer Foundation, for example, enlists approximately 185 local volunteers. Many are older persons or members of church or civic groups which meet regularly to cut cellulose, sew pads, or prepare other medicinal wrappings. About 40 others transport area patients to and from therapy sessions or man the Plymouth branch office at 173 N. Main in Home.



The taste of victory is sweet. But when you beat your opponent in his home territory and even in his own precinct -well, that defies description.

U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) managed to take 56 per cent of the 2nd Congressional District vote last week over opponent State Rep. Marvin Stempien (D-Livonia). Unofficial tallies were 102,000 votes to 78,500.

But what was more surprising was Esch's win in Livonia by 23,200 to 17,000 and in Stempien's own precinct by 485 to 350.

Esch won every area of the district, including Washtenaw County by 48,000 to 38,400 and Monroe County 19,700 to

MISS RUSIS co-captained the Churchill squad and also placed fourth in the state in the 200 yard individual medley with a time of 2:24.886.



The rivalry began the night before the game in

the dark halls of Bentley High School. A Patriot foursome — four of Franklin's down to heart athletic rooters — decided to add a little rival school spirit to the somewhat spirit-lacking upcoming game.

IT SEEMS THAT the senior lobby at Bentley had in it a 200 pound brass statue of a bulldog, Bentley High's mascot.

The Patriot foursome's aim: to capture it the night before the big game.

It was around 7:30 p.m., the night before the game and four Franklin students disguised themselves as Bentley students. I guess they just started thinking "green and white" instead of "blue and scarlet," and scuffed their feet a little differently.

Doesn't every school have a certain style of scuffing, or is that something else?

The Franklin kids, "in disguise," talked to the janitors and got into the lecture hall to check out the theater lights, and it just so happened that the lecture hall is right next to the senior lobby where the brass bulldog stands.

WHEN THE HALLS were clear, they tried to get the Bentley doggie out the door but found that its base was about four inches too wide.

"I think the school made the base that size on purpose so that no one could walk out with it," said one of the Patriot foursome.

Two of the Franklin "movers" had to leave the scene because of other commitments, so the bulldog was placed in the lecture theater.

On the return trip to Bentley, certain tools were brought along.

About 9 p.m., two Patriots returned, dismantled the prize, and out the back door they went.

It was taken to one of the homes, where it was promptly painted Franklin's "blue and scarlet," with 4 red "F" on each side.

A letter was written to accompany the bulldog Back to Bentley.

It said:

"To Bentley students and faculty,

"Sorry we borrowed your puppy dog for the night. We hope you find the slight improvements as acceptable as we did. A word to the wise: don't waste your time bolting it down next time.

"ARDJB "P.S.: He isn't very well potty trained."

THE ORIGINAL PLAN was to return the dog at the halftime of the football game, which would have caused some commotion.

But students as they be, the secret was out all over Franklin High by 9 the next morning, and the main office had already received a phone call from Bentley concerning the whereabouts of its bulldog.

The culprits were quickly found lurking in the halls of Franklin with sizable smirks quite evident; the dog was brought to school, washed up, and the janitors returned it to the halls of Bentley.

Were the Bentley students up in arms? Not hardly; it wasn't even noticed. I wonder whether the Bentley students even know they had a bulldog in the senior lobby.

School administrators kept it hush-hush in fear of some sort of retaliation, and apparently the Bentley students never even missed their little puppy.

THE CAPER has been labeled "one of the greatest things ever to hit Franklin," and one of the best moves for "school spirit."

Franklin went on to win the football game, 30-14, and the Franklin student body had at least the satisfaction of knowing it had pulled one over on Bentley, even if they didn't know anything about it.

St. Mary Doubles Size; Dedication Is Nov. 21

The Order of Felician Sisters -- whose lives are devoted to caring for people, sharing their misfortunes and bringing relief to pain and suffering -- have reached another milestone.

When the enlarged St. Mary Hospital in Livonia is dedicated next Tuesday afternoon, it will take its place in the front rank of hospitals in the state and be the largest institution of its kind in the metropolitan suburbs.

It opened in 1959 with 180 beds, and the latest addition has given it a capacity of 371 beds and the very latest in facilities and equipment.

"THE NEW ADDITION is a spectacular tribute to the skill of modern science." Sister Mary Calasantia. executive director remarked. "and also is a tribute to the vision and courage of the Felician Sisters and the people of the five communities it serves."

Since its inception, St. Mary Hospital has filled a much needed gap in northwest Wayne County and has become a medical oasis for the thousands of people who have brought about the population explosion in the area over the past decade.

Serving Livonia. Farmington. Redford. Plymouth and Northville, it is the main medical center of the entire

In terms of material and equipment, the expanded facility cost \$13 million, and many persons shared in its financing. Chief among them were the individuals and firms whose donations amounted to \$3 million over a period of nine years, the loan of \$8.6 million taken by the Sisters and a grant of \$1.5 million from the United Foundation and \$500,000 granted in 1965 for the expansion of the emergency department.

The true worth, however, cannot be measured in dollars.

"The real and ultimate value of the brick, glass and stone structure lies in the inestimable service to the people in Livonia and surrounding communities." Sister Calasantia pointed out. "Those things cannot be measured in dollars and cents."

With the expanded facilities at their disposal, the men and women dedicated to the fight against disease can now wage a bolder war with the ills which plague all mankind.

TO HANDLE THE additional duties and expanded services, the employes roster will be increased from 575 to 800 and the patient load from 11,200 in 1971 to 20,000.

The addition is virtually a hospital in itself. It contains a sub-kitchen, coffee shop, doctors' lounge and library, the medical records department, business office, operating rooms, an inhalation therapy department, physical medicine and rehabilitation department, laboratories, central sterilization and supply department, pharmacy, mental health unit, cardiac care unit, intensive care unit as well as an additional 47 medical beds and 63 surgical beds, and a variety of offices and visiting rooms.

The latest scientific devices will provide what Sister Calasantia calls "ingenious aids" to the 139 doctors and 610 currently employed personnel.

The dedication of the new addition will add another bright chapter to the history of the hospital that was given its impetus back in 1949 when the newly organized Livonia Chamber of Commerce placed a hospital at the top of the list of priorities for the new city.

Realizing the cost of such a facility and knowing that it would be difficult to obtain the necessary cash, chamber officials appealed to the Felicians, who established their community in Livonia

FROM THE START the Felicians were most cooperative, and finally a drive was launched in the early '50s. For one reason or another, it didn't get off the ground, and the plans and hopes lay dormant for a half-dozen years.

Then, in 1958, through a grant from the Hill-Burton Fund, the drive was activated again with Sister; Columbine, now the provincial mother, and Sister Calasantia working as a team to oversee the building and operating of the hospital

It was a great day in Livonia when the original structure of 180 beds was dedicated on Nov. 21, 1959. Sen. Philip Hart delivered the main address, and the long cherished dream had become a reality.

The hospital's place in the areawas soon established, and in 1965 the first major expansion was completed. Following this, the great need forced another expansion in 1967, and now the present expansion which doubles the size of the original facility on Nov. 21.

THERE IS MUCH significance attached to the date of the dedication.

It was on Nov. 21 years ago that the first Felicians landed in America. It was Nov. 21 that the Felician community was established in Livonia and on that date in 1959 when the first unit was dedicated. So it is following a rich tradition to have the enlarged facility dedicated on Nov.

Of the future of St. Mary, Sister Calasantia said. "The future is in the hands of the people of the communities it serves, men and women of good will and charitable nature, whose health needs will guide the destinies of the institution in the years to come."

She revealed that the next step forward will be the expansion of the x-ray department, the nuclear medical

department and out-patient facilities.

"After that will come other needs.
other challenges and other achievements."


There can be no terminus to St. Mary Hospital's forward march against the forces of disease and death.

The dedication ceremonies are scheduled at 2 p.m. on Tuesday. Nov. 21 with Jacque Cousin, executive vice-president of the United Foundation as the principal speaker. The invocation and blessing will be said by the Most Rev. Walter J. Schoenherr.

And with the dedication the 13-yearold St. Mary hospital pledges its total résources to the aid and comfort of all mankind-- born and unborn, young, middle-aged and old.

Never in its young history has it ever wavered from that pledge, and its governing body promises that it never shall.





OBSERVATION POINT

Legislature Bears Responsibility For Multitude Of Ballot Questions

Most folks I've talked to here said this past week's election was the worst they remember. Long lines. Bad weather. Too few voting machines, in many cases fewer than two years ago. A long. confusing and cumbersome ballot.

Many people went over to their polling place, took one look at the long lines, slow movement and bad weather, and just drove back home to watch the returns on TV.

The net result of the whole thing was that voting, perhaps the single most important act in a democracy, was denied to some, made confusing to others, and accordingly acted to distort rather than clarify what the people really wanted.

On this editorial page, some of our staff members have made some suggestions about how to improve the physical mechanics. of the voting process and raised some questions about why certain offices are filled by election.

MY OWN CONCERN is with another part of the reason the election was so aggravating to so many people: There were too many darn propositions on the ballot.

There were five proposals on the state-wide ballot, two for

Wayne County voters, three facing Southfield electors, and one in the City of Farmington. The state proposals were complicated and far-reaching, and by the time voters had waded through them, they had little time or energy to think carefully about the local ones (which is one reason why Southfield's muchneeded millage was defeated.)

Why were there so many state proposals on the ballot?

Frankly, because the State Legislature copped out on its responsibility to pass legislation on tough issues and passed the buck back to the public to decide.

CONSIDER: The five state proposals on the ballot concerned were daylight saving time, abortion reform, property tax reform, graduated income tax, and Vietnam veterans bonus.

Of these issues, only daylight saving time and the bonus for Vietnam vets had any place on the ballot, and I'm not too sure about the latter.

The other propositions were there because the Legislature failed to do its job enacting legislation and the guys in Lansing asked the voters to do their job

Some Time-Savers: Weekend Voting, **Balloting By Mail**

We complain often about voter apathy when election after election -- such as for school or municipal offices - goes by and attracts minimal participation. Then, when long lines of voters remind one that people aren't as indifferent as they sometimes appear, we complain again. The ballots were too long, it took too long to mark them, too long to count them, and, oh, yes, the weather was lousy, too.

There was a time, before we became so automated and so computerized, when the long lines at a presidential election were accepted more good naturedly. But of course, that was when the entire nation had fun waiting until far into the night to learn the results, and it was like a game to keep one's own count, state by state.

In the case of voting, however, it's a fact that many persons actually become so discouraged that they give up in despair and

forfeit their voice in government by not bothering to wait it out. This is tragic, and it could be avoided. MIND YOU, with rare excep-

last Tuesday's nationwide exasperation. I suggest it would behoove the Congress to institute a formal study aimed at bettering the balloting system for the country as a whole.

It is time that we thought seriously about at least three changes, all of which already have been brought up by one American or another in the past.

One is to get away from the tradition of voting on a working Tuesday and turn the national election into a two-day Saturday -Sunday affair when there is more leisure time.

Hand in hand with that goes the suggestion that if we must continue to appear physically at the precinct level to cast ballots, then stagger closing times according to time zones so that the polls would close simultaneously from coast to coast.

INCREASING DEMAND for absentee ballots gives impetus to a third approach, that of letting the entire nation ballot by mail. The workings certainly should not be monstrous to perfect, and the opportunity for unhindered study of the paper ballot at home carries obvious advantages.

Carrying that latter thought one step further, we read often these days of the technological advances being made by the Bell System and the marvels that await us in future years. It is not unimaginable that the day will come when votes can be cast simply by dialing preprogrammed digits on one's telephone.

That will be the ultimate, and inevitably editorial writers will bemoan passing of the days when electors could chin with their neighbors in long lines at the polling places.

Voters Get Share Of Blame

In a way, it was difficult to sympathize with citizens who had to stand in line an hour, two or three to vote on Nov. 7. The chief reason for the delay was a long ballot, and among all the reasons for the long ballot, the most important was the people themselves, with the Michigan Legislature coming due for its share of knocks.

We have forced ourselves to vote on a lot of things we don't really need to vote on. We genuinely need to vote on legislative, policy - making candidates at all levels, as well as on chief executives. But the time has come to re-examine the rest.

AT THE COUNTY level, why do we need to elect the sheriff, the prosecutor, clerk, register of deeds, drain commissioner and auditor?

Ask the next 50 persons you meet how they judged the competence of their county clerk. Unless you run into a county building professional, all 50 will say they haven't the foggiest notion of whether their county clerk is doing a good job.

The same goes for the treasur-

commissioner, prosecutor, auditor and the like.

Under the 1964 constitution, the Michigan Legislature has power to pass a meaningful county home rule law, similar to the city home rule act, that will allow the appointment of these functionaries. Because of an unholy alliance between certain Detroit hacks and certain rural bumpkins, a poor county home rule act was passed.

The voters, notably in Wayne County, deserve their share of criticism for failing to move toward home rule, such as it is, when they had the chance in 1968. To some extent, they deserve to stand in long lines as punishment.

IT'S A POLITICAL axiom that a judge, once elected, practically never gets booted out. It's also an axiom that a judge, once appointed to fill a vacancy, is seldom rejected at the next election -even when he's a Republican appointee in a nominally Democratic county.

We have in effect, right now, a system of circuit and probate judges who are appointed for life.

er, register of deeds, drain The voters are kidding themselves who say they have any power over the election of judges.

> Wayne County voters elected nine circuit judges and three probate judges without opposition, and filled only two contested circuit court vacancies; Oakland voters re-elected several circuit judges without opposition and, from a field of candidates that was at least 50 per cent dismal, picked two new circuit judges who will undoubtedly be re-elected; they also elected a probate judge in a contest that had blatantly partisan overtones that no one discussed much. In both areas, voters re-elected appellate judges who were unopposed.

Either the governor or the Supreme Court should be appointing judges. Certainly, no one can argue that the voters at present really know who they're voting for, or why:

THE BALLOT is not only long; it is wide - nine parties wide.

The voters themselves must take some of the blame. No voter should sign a petition to place a party on the ballot unless he intends to vote for it. By doing that, the voters could rid themselves of at least five of the nuisance parties.

State Law Inadequate

Human nature and state election laws appear joined in a tug of war that is stretching voter waiting lines longer and longer.

The state insists that two minutes are adequate for any voter to complete the most complicated election ballot and has written that limit into the law. It also has set a minimum of one voting machine per 600

So the arithmetic gets bollixed up right at the start. The normal 13 polling hours break down to 780 minutes during which 600 voters must use a machine. That would give each voter only 1.3 minute to vote and get in and out after that. of the booth.

absentee ballots, which are "cussed" to count, in the words of Livonia City Clerk Addison Bacon.

He attributes the absentee voter surge to a combination of 18-20 year olds who are away at college but voting at home, the decline from 70 to 65 years in the age group permitted to vote absentee and the increasing number of voters who are abusing the privilege by voting absentee to avoid waiting in line.

Of course, the law doesn't say a government unit can't provide more than one machine for each 600 registered voters, but few are inclined to do so.

Most municipalities are pinched for funds and unwilling to spend up to \$2,500 for a new voting machine to stand idle except for one day each four years.

So the two sides stand paired off like a couple of kids sticking their tongues out at each other. Mr. Voter won't vote quickly. The state won't ease its laws.

Hazel Skerrett Honored

The Annapolis Hospital Auxiliary goes into its 15th year of service to the Dearborn hospital with 12 of its charter members, including Hazel Skerrett and Katherine Hickey of Westland, still active volunteers.

Mrs. Skerrett was one of those on hand as the auxiliary marked its anniversary with a salad luncheon in the hospital Oct. 19. Since the auxiliary was formed, she has given the hospital 802 hours of service.

The membership meeting, attended by 56 of the current members, also included a short business session led by president Mary Morgan and a talk by Walter S: Wheeler, hospital superintendent, on "Medicine of the Future."

THE AUXILIARY held its first membership tea in September of 1958 with 300 charter members.

Over the years, volunteer members have contributed some 10,202 hours of service in such capacities as working in the admitting office, taking baby photos, feeding patients, passing out water and juices, transporting patients and delivering mail and flowers. The first director of

volunteers, Jean Rothrock, was named in 1963, and Ruth Long now holds that position. The auxiliary gift shop began with a few, shelves in 1959, and two years later had grown so rapidly that a chairman was appointed as a permanent board member.

PLANS BEGAN for a chapel in the hospital in 1966, and two years later the auxiliary was able to contribute complete furnishings for the room.

Some of the other hospital additions made possible through auxiliary contributions are flowering crab trees for the grounds, an operating room humidifier, a flag, delivery cart, hot pack machine, tilt table, parallel bars, cardiac monitor and defibrillator, circo electric bed, public address system, isolette and oxygen tent.

The group also has contributed to an EKG machine, heart monitors, heart-lung resuscitators, a camera for hospital records and has made a \$4,000 contributions towards an auto-analyzer for the laboratory.







Dressing Or Stuffing, It's A Must

"Turkey and dressing and all the trimmings."

Whether you call it dressing or stuffing, it is a vital part of the Thanksgiving menu. To many persons, it is just as important as the roast turkey itself.

When it comes to stuffing, some people are purists. It has to be just like mother used to make it and her mother before her. Some like it dry and crumbly; some like it wet and

There are the "giblets in" fanciers and the "no giblets" stalwarts. There is the "sage only" group as opposed to the "throw in a little of everything" crowd.

The true stuffing lover enjoys them all, and will experiment. It takes a pretty poor dressing to dampen his enthusiasm.

SAGE AND ONION STUFFING

- 2 medium onions, chopped
- 1/2 c. butter 8 c. soft bread crumbs 6 to 10 sage leaves, chopped or
- 2 t. dried sage 2 eggs, slightly beaten
- 11/2 t. salt 34 t. freshly ground pepper

Melt the butter, add the onions and simmer a few minutes until golden. In a bowl combine the bread crumbs. onions, butter, sage and egg. Toss until well mixed. Stuff bird lightly.

CHESTNUT STUFFING

- 1 c. butter or margarine 1 c. minced onion
- 1 t. ground thyme
- 1 t. ground sage
- 11/2 t. salt
- 3/4 t. pepper 1/3 c. chopped parsley
- 34 c. chopped celery and
- 2 qt. soft, stale bread crumbs or cubes
- 1 lb. chestnuts, cooked, shelled and chopped

Melt butter in skillet and add all ingredients except last two. Cook for five minutes, stirring. Add crumbs and chestnuts. Stuff turkey lightly. Makes about 10 cups.

OYSTER STUFFING 1 c. butter or margarine

- 1 c. minced onion 1 pint small oysters, drained
- and chopped 1 T. crumbled poultry
- seasoning
- 11/2 t. salt 34 t. white pepper
- 1/3 chopped parsley
- 34 c. chopped celery leaves 2½ qt. soft stale bread cubes 2 eggs, beaten (optional)

Melt butter in skillet. Add all ingredients except crumbs and cook for five minutes. Add crumbs and beaten eggs, if desired. Makes about 10 cups.

SAUSAGE-NUT STUFFING

- ½ c. sausage meat ½ c. butter
- 4 T. minced onion
- 1 t. paprika 11/2 t. salt

Milk

- ½ c. chopped celery
- 1/2 c. chopped parsley 8 c. soft, stale bread crumbs 2/3 c. chopped pecans, or other

Cook sausage until brown, breaking into small bits with fork. Add butter and onion. Cook for two or three minutes. Remove from heat and add next six ingredients. Add just enough milk to moisten and mix well. Stuff bird lightly.

RAISIN-WALNUT STUFFING (For chicken or duck)

- 11/2 c. chopped celery and
- leaves 11/2 c. chopped onion
- 1 t. thyme
- 1 t. sage
- 1/4 t. pepper 1 t. salt
- 1/4 c. butter or margarine ½ c. water 3 c. stale bread crumbs or
- cubes ½ c. chopped raisins
- ½ c. chopped walnuts Cook celery, onions and seasonings in butter for five minutes. Add remaining ingredients and mix thoroughly. Makes about five
