Carroll turned in a fine performance in the Southfield net, but Churchill won in the end, 6-4. There is a good chance that Carroll will no longer be No. 3 at Southfield.

"I guess there is a certain amount of Ned Harkness in me," said Carinci. "But I'll never sacrifice respect for victory,'

Two years ago when hockey in Southfield was getting off the ground, teams like Churchill and Stevenson were crushing Carinci's crew by scores of 15-0 and 15-1.

Christmas Care For Poinsettias

Whether you are buying a poinsettia as a gift or to brighten your own home this holiday season, you will have a healthier, prettier plant if you follow these tips from Michigan State University horticulturists:

Choose a poinsettia with dark green foliage. Fallen or vellow leaves indicate poor fertilization or a root disease.

The bracts -- the red, pink or white parts usually thought of as the poinsettia flower -- should be of good size and color. The red or green button-like parts at the center of the bracts are the actual flowers.

Before taking a poinsettia outside, be sure it is wrapped well. Exposing it to low temperatures for even a short period of time can cause leaves and bracts to turn brown and fall off.

At home, place your poinsettia near a sunny window or in some other well lighted place. Do not let any part of the plant touch the cold window panes. and keep the plant out of drafts from radiators, air registers, or open doors and windows.

Reps. John Bennett from Redford Township and Ray Baker from Farmington went and say they learned a lot. I don't dispute their right to go, but I hope they're right.



snowmobile. But if you're such a city slicker that you can't travel without the sound of an engine and the smell of gasoline, then be kind enough to observe the "10 Commandments of Snowmobiling." They are offered by Frank P. Opolka, head of the state Dept. of Natural Resources' snowmobile safety section.

"1. I WILL be a good sportsman. I recognize that people judge all snowmobile owners by my actions. I will use my influence with other snowmobile owners to promote sportsman like conduct.

"2. I will not litter trails or camping areas. I will not pollute streams or lakes.

"3. I will not damage living trees, shrubs, or other natural

features. "4. I will respect other people's property and rights.

"5. I will lend a helping hand

when I see someone in distress. "6. I will make myself and my vehicle available to assist search

and rescue parties.

"7. I will not interfere with or harass hikers, skiers, snowshoers, ice fishermen or other winter sportsmen. I will respect their rights to enjoy our recreation

facilities. "8. I will know and obey all federal, state and local rules regulating the operation of snowmobiles in areas where I use my vehicle. I will inform public officials when using public lands.

"9. I will not harass wildlife. I will avoid areas posted for the protection or feeding of wildlife.

"10. I will stay on marked trails or marked roads open to snowmobiles. I will avoid country travel unless specifically author-

Theirs Hardy Prays, Bokays For Speling

Like most adults. I feel churlish and "man-who-came-todinnerish" when my mistakes are pointed out to me by children.

Some time ago I was taken to task by several fifth graders for misspelling the word trilobite. I ! was chagrined and defenseless. I should have known better than to proceed into the realms of geology on faith alone. Although I did look it up in the dictionary, it was not so much to see how to spell it as to see how long ago these little creatures lived.

So no excuses, but some observations...

FEELING VERY defensive indeed, I scanned the fifth graders letters to see what spelling errors I could find in rebuttal.

To my surprise, I found only a couple, but being a nasty adult -about spelling -- it's enough to

So bear with me, young friends.

I think it is lovely that you are being taught to spell trilobite correctly. I hope you find some opportunities to use it.

Frankly, in many years of writing, I have never had occasion to use trilobite, and like the purple cow, I really hope I never see it, again.

But I run into "there" and "their" almost daily. I know the difference. One of you doesn't.

There's an old poem which was corny even in my day, but contains a truth which has to be pointed out to every generation. It begins "For want of a nail, a shoe was lost. . . . and goes on to tell how a whole kingdom was lost for lack of attention to detail.

I'm afraid that we are in danger of losing our written language for lack of attention to details such as "there" and "their" and "its" and "it's."

WHEN YOU YOUNG ladies become brides, will you carry a "bouquet" or a "bokay?"

Do your teachers believe that spelling is not too important --I've run into many who do. including one who wrote home to inform parents that they shouldn't "worry about the spelling at this stage. It will be 'delt' with later."

How much later?

This is the question many, many employers ask when they hire a new secretary ... even for a school system... or when they read a resume.

Recently we received a letter from a school wishing parents a "hardy" welcome. Now this is creative, colorful and realistic, but the usual phrase is "hearty" welcome.

Or, consider the letter from the distinguished university, advising the parents to write back when their daughter "desides."

I AM A FIRM believer in creativity, color and realism, but realistically speaking, if everyone goes his own way in spelling. there may come a day when we cannot communicate via the written word.

If you don't believe me, get the worst speller in your class to write a paper and try to decipher

Popcorn **Makes The** Yule Scene

By ELLY

Just one weekend left between now and Christmas, a good time to get out the popcorn and let the children join in the creation of an edible centerpeice.

Children are all gone but you are anticipating a Christmas visit from the grandchildren? This crunchy winter scene will be remembered until the holidays roll around next

Turn a cardboard carton on its side with the opening at the front, stage fashion. Cover the outside parts of the box (if unattractive) with white paper. Cover the inside back and sides with sky blue paper. Cover the bottom of the scene with cotton batting or white tissue paper, then cover with waxed paper or plastic wrap.

Place a lollipop pond at one side of the scene. Behind the pond place an artificial tree or a tree shaped from candied popcorn mixture. In one corner build a hill of popcornballs. Fill in around the scene with popcorn. Break small pieces of lollipop candy into icy bits and scatter around the edges of the pond. Pieces of popcorn hanging from strings attached to the inside top of the box look like giant snowflakes. Complete the scene with a small doll dressed in winter togs.



POP CORN

14 c. corn oil 12 c. pop corn

Heat corn in a large heavy skillet or kettle over medium heat about three minutes. Add popcorn. Cover, leaving small air space at edge of cover. Shake frequently over medium heat until popping stops. Turn popcorn into a large bowl; pick out any unpopped kernels. Makes two quarts popped corn. Do not double recipe, pop again for

CANDIED POPCORN

12 c. Karo light corn syrup

12 c. sugar 12 t. salt

2 c. sugar

1 t. vanilla

2 qt. popped corn Mix together in a heavy saucepan corn syrup, sugar and salt and bring to a boil. Cook two minutes over medium heat, stirring constantly. Stir in vanilla. Pour over popcorn in a large bowl and stir until corn is evenly coated with mixture. Spread margarine on hands and form into popcorn balls.

LOLLIPOP MIXTURE

2/3 c. Karo light syrup 12 t. vegetable coloring (optional)

112 t. extract type flavoring In a straight-sided, twoquart saucepan, stir together sugar, syrup and water. Cook over medium heat, stirring, until sugar is completely dissolved. Boil without stirring until temperature reaches 290 degrees on a candy thermometer, or until a small amount of mixture dropped into very cold water
