



# Lity Reassessment Finished, Notices To Be Mailed Soon

By W. EDWARD WENDOVER

Taxpayers in the city soon will be receiving notice that reassessment of their buildings and property has been completed.

The reassessment, authorized by the city commission in April 1971, will mean a total assessment increase in the city of 15.3 per cent, but changes in individual tax parcel assessments will vary greatly.

EACH TAXPAYER will receive a notice of the change in assessment of his property. Many individual assessments will increase, some decrease.

Generally, all types of assessments will go up. But over all, industry and commerce will pay a greater share of the total load, homeowners a smaller

As a class, industrial assessments will increase 18.8 per cent: commercial 46.7 per cent, and residen-

Purpose of the reassessment is to provide greater equity among taxpayers, said Kenneth Way, city assessor and acting city manager.

IN GENERAL, the changes will mean a slight increase in taxes if present tax rates are not changed.

The new assessment figures will be used for the first time on the municipal July tax bills. It does not affect the current county - school - community college tax bills, but it will next December.

By reassessing the city's tax parcels, the state equalization figure of 1.90, which was applied to Plymouth this past year, will be reduced to 1.0, Way

The equalization rate is multiplied by the assessment figure. The equalized value must be no more than 50 per cent of the property's fair market value.

This equalized assessment is then multiplied by the tax rates to determine the taxes due.

### 'Livonia' Dropped By Bank

Announcement of a change in the name of Livonia National Bank to "Michigan National Bank - West Metro" was made Tuesday by President Elvin D. Dougherty.

### Boating Classes **Offered**

Boating safety youngsters aged 12-15 will be offered in area schools this winter by the marine safety division of the Wayne County Sheriff's Dept.

State law requires that persons from 12-16 years of age must possess a "safe boating certificate" in order to operate a motorboat of more than six horsepower. The certificate can be earned only by successfully completing the state - prescribed course.

To enroll, write to: Sgt. Frederick J. Reiman Jr., 3100 Henry Ruff, Westland, 48185. The free course consists of

three sessions of two hours each, once a week for three weeks.



March 6 from noon to 6 p.m. and on Wednesday, March 7 from 3 to 9 p.m.

TO ILLUSTRATE what the reassessment means. Services Set Way used the assessment on his home and property at 302 N. Holbrook.

In 1972 the state equalized valuation for his home was \$11,704, and under the new assessment it will be \$13,090. Those figures, plus that of the \$1,386 difference, will be shown on the notification he will receive from the city just as other taxpayers will get.

Based on those figures for Way's assessment, his taxes will increase from \$172.05 to the city and \$494.49 to the schools, county and community college in 1972 to \$192.42 to the city and \$553.05 to the others in 1973.

If current tax rates remain the same, this would mean that city-wide, those taxes would increase by the 15.3 per cent, which the total valuation is increas-

### **Bagging Leaves** Lot To Be Desired

By MARIE McGEE

**PLYMOUTH** Around City Hall they will probably refer to it as the "Henry Proposal" -- and Commissioner Ernie Henry will be the first to admit smilingly that it "leaves" a lot to be desired.

But it was the best the brass tacks commissioner could do after his colleagues spent considerable time at a recent meeting discussing a proposed leaf pick-up program, but failed to come to any con-

Henry did it for them. His motion simply states that henceforth the city will use the bag system for leaf collections, based on the recommendation of Ken Vogras, DPW director.

The method of pick - up and costs involved were left undecided until later in the year.

The Vogras report stated it would be far cheaper for the city to have the leaves -bagged in plastic containers sold by the city - picked up by an outside contractor rather than by city crews.

The savings would amount to several thousand dollars. Vogras said.

The DPW chief also said in his report that one contractor had reportedly offered to pick up bagged leaves on a once - a - week basis for six weeks for a sum of 40 cents per stop.

"This 40 cents would include labor, equipment gas, oil and dumping at landfill," Vogras

He recommended asking for bids and purchasing 100 million bags for \$3,650 which he said would be reimbursed by the homeowners. The contractor's fee for the six week period he estimated would be \$7,200, if the winning bid was near the 40 cents per stop level.

### Soup's On As Budget **Gets Tight**

Mid-winter is definitely soup season and we had been thinking, sort of half - heartedly, that we should come up with a soup column.

Then along came some recipes from Detroit Edison and a letter from Mrs. Charles Canfield of Garden City who says:

"With food costs rising, I find myself making my famous hamburger soup more and moré. When people drop in on weekends, and I'm having it, they always ask for the recipe. My mother - in law practically fed a family of seven on it during the depression.

"And surprisingly enough it's delicious."

She was kind enough to share her recipe with us.

#### **HAMBURGER SOUP**

- 1 lb. hamburger
- 1 onion, chopped 4 stalks celery, chopped
- 3 qt. water 1 T. salt
- 12 t. pepper
- 3 carrots
- 4 medium sized potatoes 12 c. uncooked rice

Slightly brown hamburger in Dutch oven. Add chopped celery and onion. After meat is browned, add water, salt and pepper and cut up carrots and potatoes in half-inch cubes. Add uncooked rice. Simmer 30 to 45 minutes or until carrots and potatoes are done. Good served with French bread or soda crackers.

#### **NAVY BEAN SOUP**

2 c. navy beans, soaked I ham bone or small shank end of ham

3 qt. water 1 onion, minced

12 t. sugar

2 stalks celery

Place beans, water, bone and onion in kettle. Add sugar and celery. Bring slowly to boiling point. Cover and simmer four to five hours, until beans are tender and the liquid partially cooked down. For smooth soup, rub through a coarse sieve. Dilute as desired with additional milk or water. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Yields eight servings.

#### **EASY CHICKEN GUMBO**

3 T. butter 112 c. canned okra cut into 12inch pieces

1 qt. consomme or chicken stock

1 small piece bay leaf 1/4 c. chopped onion

212 c. (No. 2 can) tomatoes 1 T. minced parsley 1 c. finely diced chicken

14 c. chopped green pepper Simmer the green pepper, okra, and onion in butter until soft. Stir in the stock, tomatoes and bayleaf. Boil gently for 15 minutes. Season to taste. Add the parsley and chicken. Yields six servings.

### Lyndon Baines Johnson: In Retrospect

By Philip H. Power

**Eyndon Johnson died Monday** afternoon. That night it snowed. which was a good thing, since snow both covers that which we wish not to see and reveals the angularity of the landscape which we so often do not see but wish we did.

My overwhelming reaction to his death was loneliness. There is now no living ex-president, no link to the past, no repository of the wisdom unique to the holders of the most powerful office of our time, no sense of context in which we might imagine ourselves as the heirs of the drive of the experience of our past. Having Harry Truman and Lyndon Johnson around was a deeply comforting feeling, rather like that of having an uncle alive -- crotchety, irascible, but essentially benign and concerned with our welfare.

Judgments of his presidency and his accomplishments and failures will come later, but Lyndon Johnson was surely the most human and the most feudal president of our times. He pulled the beagles' ears, just as he owned the TV station in the largest single-station market in America. He cried at a secretary's wedding, just as he set her husband up in a business politically protected by the vast mantle of his office. He proclaimed the right of the black man to have an equal life on his own southern turf, just as he told raunchy stories to cronies over bourbon and branch in small, private offices up on Capitol Hill.

Lyndon Johnson was so perfectly expressive of all that is good and evil, wondrous and despicable, exalted and wretched that he somehow grabbed the observer and pulled him into his frame of orbit in a way quite unmatched in my experience.

THAT GOES back to spring 1965, when I was an administrative assistant to a congressman in Washington and wound up on the chopper going up to Camp David. the presidential retreat in the Maryland mountains. We landed and the president appeared. looming quite unexpectedly large out of the small trees of the countryside. My God, was he big, and when he leaned over the women to say hello he seemed to devour them as he moved forward.

Nothing would do but to walk the three-quarters of a mile to the cabins, and as we walked the beagles mooned around ahead. Occasionally a rabbit would be sighted in the woods, and the beagles would go off in incompetent short spurts after them. never getting more than 20 feet off the path before giving up in confusion. And Lyndon Johnson, annoyed at such failure at the God-given function of beagles.

would go off, dashing through the scrub, calling out in a loud voice, "Here, dammit, there he goes!" leading the small dogs on the by now hopelessly lost trail.

WE WOUND up on the flagstoned porch of the main cabin, overlooking the lawn and the Dwight D. Eisenhower memorial putting green. There was a lot of aluminum porch furniture there. and as the president threw himself down on a chaise lounge, I saw something that let me understand a bit about the power of the presidency and the nature of Lyndon Johnson.

As he sat back, he flung his right arm behind him without looking. And as, without pause, he brought the arm back forward, there was in his hand a Scotch and soda. Magic!

And then I looked behind the man, and there was a Filipino bus-boy, stiff in starched whites, standing there with a satisfied small smile, knowing that he had played a part.

WE TALKED there on that porch, and I disagreed with someone. The president was wearing deep purple sun glasses, the kind old king Farouk of Egypt used to wear, and as each of us talked, that mammoth head would swivel fully around on that unexpectedly long neck to gaze directly at us through those enormous purple orbs as each said his piece and then sweep back to the other.

He said nothing through the argument...no word, no sign... except that powerful, careful swinging of the head back and forth, as though to pull the essential juices out what was being said for his own knowledge and understanding.

I still was prepared not to like him, being at that time troubled by the war in Vietnam and by his role in it. I expected to be on the receiving end of one of those famous harangues, but instead I got questions.

What about this appointment? The best man is X, the most politically useful is Y. Which do you think I should pick? The State Department just sent me this memorandum (in triplicate) on the war. What do you think of it? Dammit, the hillbillies won't buy the voting rights bill, but I know darn well that once the blacks (he called them Negroes) get the vote it'll change the whole dolgonned system. But how do I get Senator A to change his vote?

It's very difficult to put down in words the extraordinary ability this man had to be vibrant and manipulative, sensitive and vile, pulling, pulling, tugging you into his own emotional plane.

And it wasn't only the power of his office, thickening each small word into an omen; it was the latent power and horrendous need of Lyndon Johnson the man. the product of a small Texas background and the result of countless indignities of the vice presidency under John Kennedy. who was pulling and hauling at your psyche to bring it into his own orbit.

I MADE AS to go, but nothing would do but to attend a meeting of the foreign policy experts in the Cabinet Room, and then -again after an attempt to leave back to his own office.

Still in need, still wanting to pull, he asked me what my reaction had been to the offer of a job in the White House made by an aide (so that I could deny truthfully later that I had been offered a position by the president.)

It was a high compliment, of course, but could not be considered until I had completed my obligations - the same as yours, Mr. President, when you worked for a congressman -- to my boss after his election campaign.

He took off his glasses and rubbed his eyes in the misery of being the right man in the wrong place, the supreme politician in the unexpectedly moral setting, and said "Yes, I suppose that's true. But what to do? What to do?"

I left the White House, very struck, very moved against my instincts, very impressed with a man who could have reached such a high plane of grass roots concern for his country so mixed with the mire of base political instincts.

He is now dead, and I for one mourn his passing. We will not see another like him in our time.

ON A FORGOTTEN bookshelf during the holiday season, I discovered a tome on archeology and climate. Prof. Emeritus Rhys Carpenter of Bryn Mawr was writing about the trade winds, how they created the climate of the Sahara, and how twice in recorded history their desiccating effect had shifted northward.

In 1200 B.C. and 700 A.D., it seems, the trade winds had turned much of Greece and Asia Minor into a desert. There are gaps in the archeological record

suggesting a famine of such mammoth proportions that it could have been caused only by a drastic climactic change. Civilizations literally dried up!

# Schoolcraft Day Care Expands

There's a notable lack of tables and small chairs in the new quarters of the Schoolcraft College Day Care Center.

The walls are pretty bare, too, and teacher Shirley Pollock occasionally wishes she could see around

But no one seems to mind any temporary frustrations of putting a nursery in a whole house, because the change means the center can offer a play place for more children and new convenience for their moth-

THE DAY CARE center, opened a little more than a year ago in the Pilgrim United Church of Christ on Seven Mile, has moved to the ranch house located on Haggerty just north of the Schoolcraft parking lot.

The first week in the new quarters, Mrs. Pollock registered more than 40 three-to five-year-olds whose

mothers dropped them off while taking classes. "Last term the total registration was 30," she added, "but we often didn't have more than 20 here."

Five rooms on the first floor mean more children can be accommodated, but with more space to keep track of Mrs. Pollock is glad to have student assistant Chris Osmer on hand at peak times.

And one mother, picking up a small son, gave an indication why enrollment is up.

"I was taking night classes before," she explained, "but this is so convenient I switched to day

- THE DAY CARE center charges each family a \$5 registration fee and 60 cents an hour per child.

On a year's budget, that accounts for only about \$3,000 of the \$10,600 earmarked for the center. The rest comes from student fees and the college's general operating fund.

Edward V. McNally, Schoolcraft vice president in charge of student affairs, said the move was made possible because the college had acquired the property in land transfer with the state of Michigan.

Money saved because there are no rental fees will be used for some remodeling and furnishings for the house, he added, and may also go towards keeping the center open for the spring semester if interest
