

of February 1973. Each applicant must present proof of ownership of the homestead as of December 31, 1972, or prior.

Must show proof of age as being 65 years old or over by Dec. 31. 1972; must have been a resident of Michigan for at least 5 out of the last 10 years and at least 6 months out of each 12 month period of the same 5 years prior to filing; annual income of applicant, including spouse and/or joint owners of the property, must not exceed \$6,000 for the preceding year.

Must show proof of visual disability in compliance with the State law - a current letter from the physician will be acceptable. Disabled Veteran or Unremarried Widow of Veteran:

Veteran must have lived in Michigan at least six months prior to entering service or was a resident of Michigan for at least 5 years prior to filling (5 years prior to veteran's death if widow is applying): annual income must not exceed \$7,500 with the exception of those who are receiving compensation for a service-connected disability: all property owned in Michigan should not exceed a state equalized value of \$10,000 When filing a claim, each person must present a copy of service

discharge papers. Widows must also present a death certificate If the applicant is qualified, the homestead would be exempt from the taxes for at least \$2,500 of the state qualized value of the property; a veteran with pension or service-connected disability or his widow may receive a greater exemption upon presentation of VA Form 20-5455 - Statement of Benefit Payment or a VA letter of adjudication. An application for Homestead Tax Exemption must be filed each year by







THE FUNDAMENTAL issue, however, is the lettuce workers' right to a decent life for themselves and their families.



For example, local property taxes, public services, public transportation ospitals, community facilities. What are the zoning restrictions? Are there any unusual deed restrictions common to the area on how you might ise, alter or expand your property? What are the future prospects for the

A local Realtor can be a quarry of such information. FARMINGTON TOWNSHIP
Township Hall is located at Orchard Lake and 11 Mile. Farmington is a city that cannot be separated from its history.

First settled in 1824 by Arthur Power, one of whose descendants is Philip Power, publisher of Observer Newspapers, many of its streets are dotted by quaint and charming old homes, many bearing historical plaques, and tall, leafy trees. Year-'Round School Feasibility Studied By New Citizens Committee

By MARTHA MAHAN

PLYMOUTH Caught between voter rejection of new school construction and a fast moving wave of incoming students with no classrooms to house them, the Plymouth Board of Education is casting out in three directions to meet what it sees as a housing emergency.

A year-round school study committee has begun investigating the feasibility of a 12-month school year to extend present space.

Voters, who turned down a \$21 million construction bond bid in December, will be asked to approve a lesser \$14 million proposal in June.

The latter would include \$250,000 for revival of socalled "satellite schools."

The satellite concept provides for purchase of houses in areas of rapid pupil growth which can be converted into elementary schools and then resold when a maturing population removes their need.
