# Would Mocer's Project Help Create 'Identity' For Canton?

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** This is the fourth article of a series dealing with Canton Township's search for identity and independence.

CANTON

If any one person is going to put Canton Township on the map, it will probably be Dominic Mocer.

Ironically, though, the means with which he would give Canton fame have met considerable opposition.

Mocer has proposed 195 acres at Joy and Sheldon roads as the site for a \$45 million housing and regional shopping complex.

The name Mocer has chosen for the project is "Canton Center Woods."

"WE FEEL this is going to create an identity for Canton," said Gilbert L. Franklin, Mocer's attorney.

He said Mocer's developments never steal the name of nearby communities to use as a selling point. "We feel it would be unfair to the community."

Several developments in Canton Township have included "Plymouth" in their names to be used as a selling point.

Of the five signs at the corner of Ford and Sheldon roads advertising Canton developments, Mocer's "Pickwick Village" is the only one that doesn't have "Plymouth" in the development name.

IDENTITY ASIDE, many of the homeowners in the area near the proposed center don't

want a shopping-multiple housing complex next door.

"Sure there are some disadvantages with having a shopping center three-quarters or half-a-mile from your home," Franklin said.

"I think there are some legitimate complaints, and I can't say they're wholly wrong."

But he and Mocer contend the advantages the proposed complex would provide for the township would far outweigh the disadvantages.

A shopping center has the "same economic advantages as industrial (development) but doesn't have heavy trucks or ugly buildings," Franklin said.

"You get the advantages of the tax base and not the disadvantages of the industrial concept," he said.

FRANKLIN SAID the complex would be much better for the community and schools than single-family homes in the same area would be.

In addition, Mocer and Franklin said, the complex would mean the area roads would be improved, a school site would be dedicated and senior citizen housing would be provided in the area.

"Typically in new areas you don't find this type of housing," Franklin said.

Some homeowners' objections involve complaints about mid-rise apartments and senior citizen housing.

"The trees will hide it," Mocer said.

Franklin explained that as they have proposed it, the buildings would be lower than the trees, and the small homes proposed for senior citizens

would be placed in the wooded section of the area, allowing them to retain most of the trees.

Currently the rezoning request necessary for the project is before the Canton Township Planning Commission which is expected to make a recommendation at its Feb. 20 meeting.

SOME HOMEOWNERS' groups have been lobbying at planning commission meetings to get the rezoning denied.

"They don't know what they're doing," Franklin said. "I'm afraid they feel we don't know what we're doing," Mocer countered.

Franklin said he had indicated a willingness to speak to the homeowners groups, but they have never wanted to hear him out.

"We don't feel the homeowners will stop us, but if they do, they'd be cutting their noses off," Franklin said.

Mocer said that if rezoning is approved, "We can break ground as soon as the engineering is done."

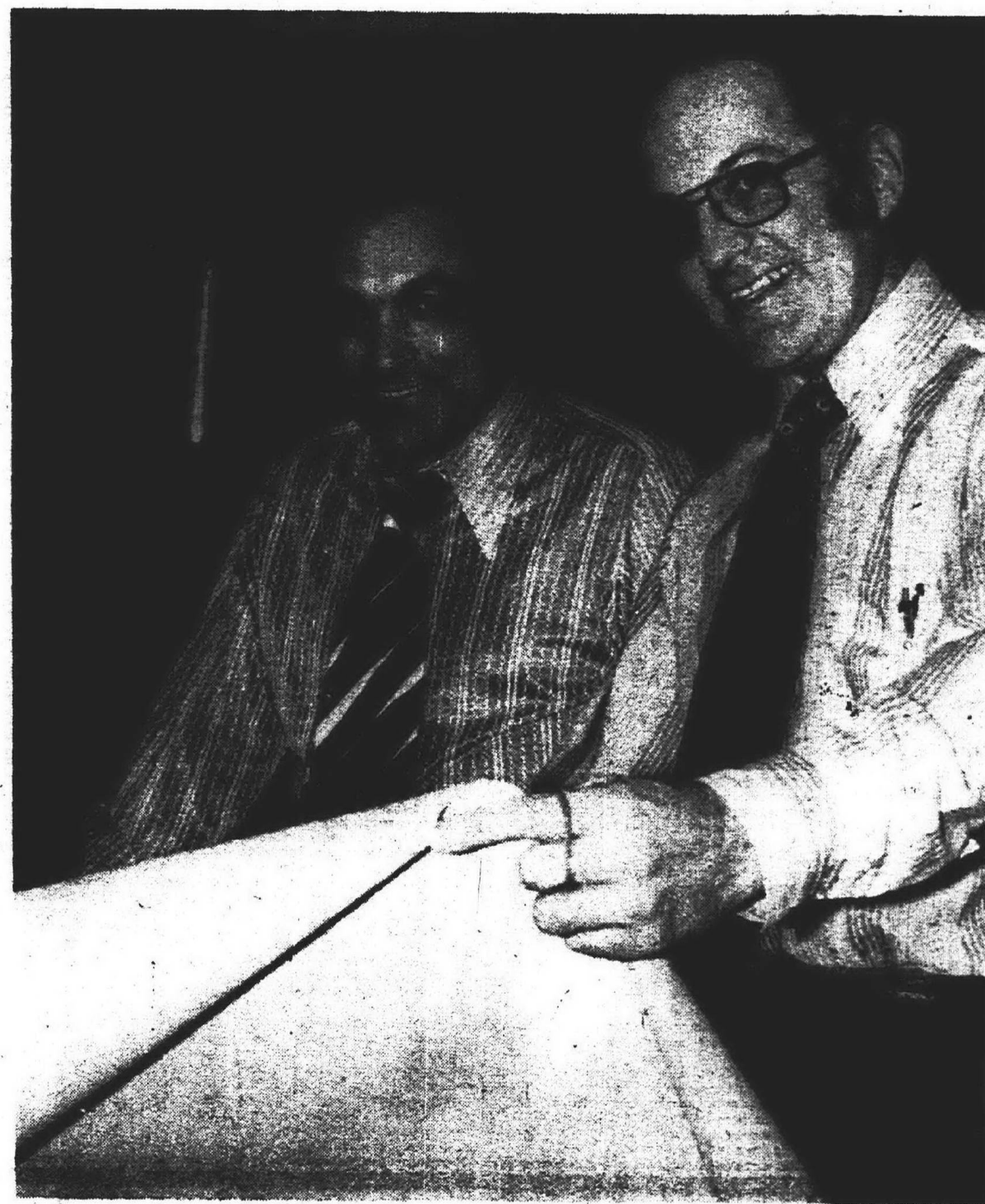
"Our thinking is to start all phases simultaneously," Mocer said.

He said they had decided on this spot in Canton Township because it was ideal, based on the existing shopping available to the residents in Canton Township, Plymouth, Plymouth Township and Westland.

THE GROWTH potential for shopping needs was also a factor, Mocer added.

According to a study which Mocer had prepared, the

# High School Sets New Attendance Policy To Cut Student Absenteeism

In a move to cut student absenteeism which has reached as high as 33 per cent at times, Plymouth High School hereafter will require a note from home before granting an excused absence.

"It is realized that these notes may be forged or fraudulent," conceded Fred Meier, area coordinator. "However, it puts the responsibility back on the student and the parent."

Whether a limit is placed on the number of allowable absences will be left to the individual classroom teacher under the new regulations.

However, the teacher of any student getting into serious grade difficulty is instructed to contact the home and notify the student's area coordinator.

ALTHOUGH THE absence rate averages about 20 per cent, attendance is "much better than last year," Meier said.

One difficulty in computing absence rates is inherent in modular scheduling, administrators said.

A student who may not be scheduled for a class until as late as noon does not show up for first hour homeroom when

attendance normally is taken.

Some students have also intentionally cut their home room so that their names will appear on the day's absence list. This way they can attend the classes they like and skip the ones they don't since those teachers will assume they're absent from school for the day.

THE 20 PER CENT average absence rate is computed on the homeroom attendance, Meier said. He said the schools have no computation of the actual classroom absence rate figure.

"Absence always has been a

problem, no matter what the system," commented Dr. Earl Hogan, deputy superintendent.

He attributed this year's better attendance to student adjustment to the flexible schedule with the result that "they are enjoying subjects more."

"Still there always are some students who, no matter how tempting the subjects may be,

still must have some extrinsic motivation in order to attend school," Dr. Hogan added.

The changes in attendance procedures followed replies to a teacher questionnaire, discussions among area coordinators and consultations with a number of faculty members, Meier said.

Teachers "stressed" the need for notes from home for excused absences, he said.

THE DAILY cut slip process will be eliminated under the new set-up. Home room attendance will continue to be taken but daily cuts based on the homeroom list will not be reported.

Instead, teachers will report, on a five- or six-day cycle, any student they believe to have excessive absences.

# County Planners Nix NW Canton Rezoning

A proposed rezoning of a large section of northwest Canton Township that would increase the population density has been recommended for denial by the Wayne County Planning Commission.

In a unanimous vote Wednesday, the county planners accepted a staff recommendation to deny the proposed rezoning.

The county planning commission's action is only advisory. The Canton Township Planning Commission must now make a recommendation and the Canton Township Board must make the final decision.

Wednesday's meeting of the county planning commission included presentations by several township officials and homeowners.

The county planning staff made the following report:

"THE PROPOSAL contained in (this) case is the rezoning of a substantial acreage frontage on Warren Rd. and Ford Rd. from their

present single family classification (R-1A) which requires a one-acre lot and which has a minimum dwelling unit floor area requirement of 1200 square feet to R-1B or R-1BC (single family) classification. In all cases, the dwelling unit floor area is the same.

"In the case of R-1B, which is proposed to be applied to the frontage on Warren Road, the requirements call for a one acre minimum lot size if there is no water or sewer or for a 20,000 square foot lot size if there is either water or sewer.

"In the case of R-1BC, which is proposed to be applied to the frontage on Ford Rd., the minimum lot size if there is water or sewer is 20,000 square feet, and if there is water and sewer 10,000 square feet.

"The property in question still is substantially agricultural at this time.

Occasional single family homes occupy the boundary lines of the area proposed for change.

"There is rolling

topography in the surrounding areas and generally flat land in the areas where change is proposed.

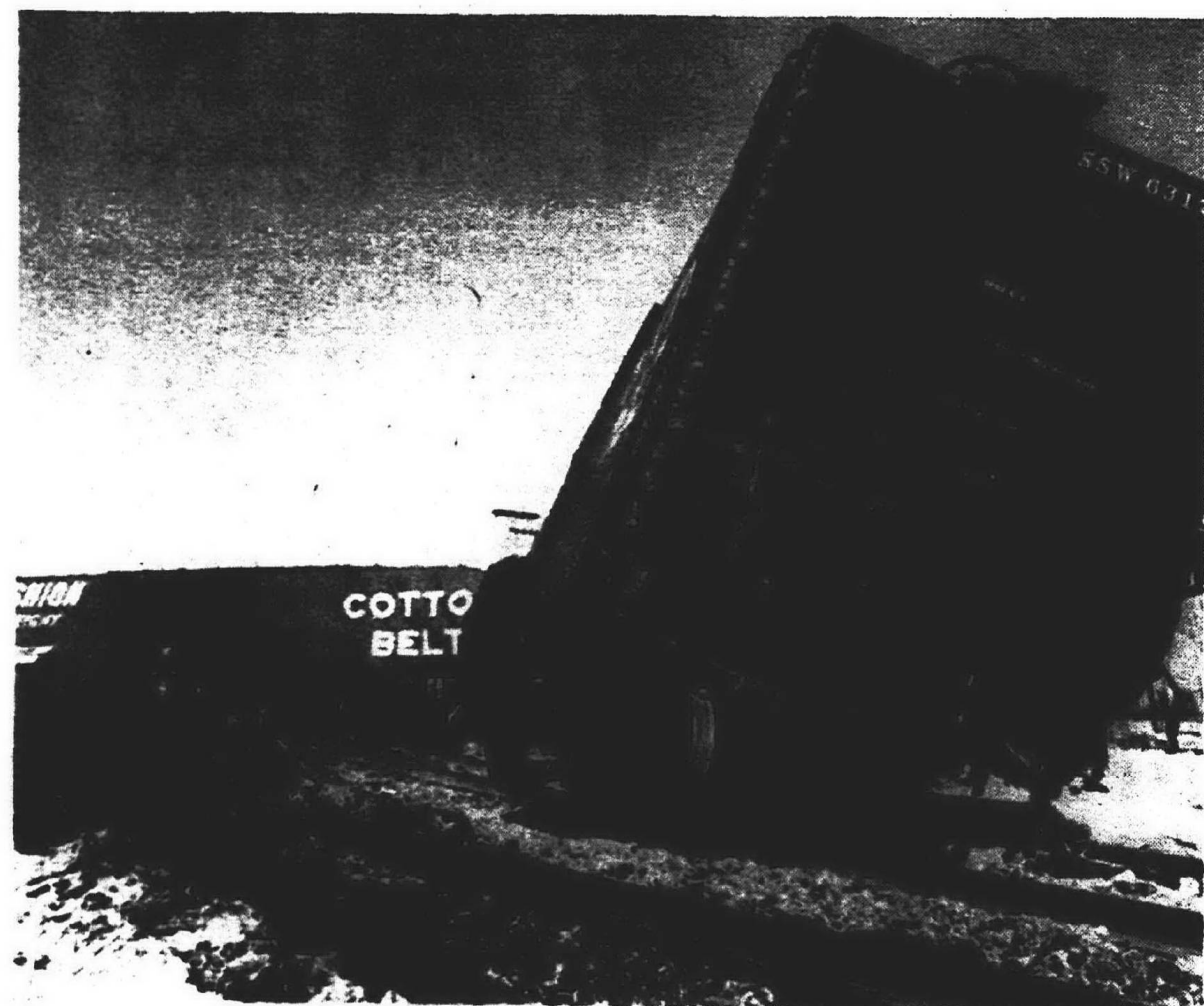
"The consultant, in recommending the change, calls attention to the fact that farmers in the subject area have been approached by developers; and if rezoning proceeds, they will be entitled to a larger payment for their land.

"THE STAFF investigation reveals the following facts: The township has zoned a substantial area, lying south of Ford Rd. and west of Beck Rd. being approximately eight square miles, in its agricultural category.

"This category permits single family residences on five acre minimum lot sizes, so it is not literally confined to farm usage. However, there are a number of existing farms occupying this area.

"The township has extensive areas in its smaller lot size zoning categories and, as we know from recent cases,

# Ruland Asks Multiples Moratorium

**CANTON TOWNSHIP** Canton's fledgling planning commissioner, Mrs. Ellen Ruland, this week took a hefty swipe at township housing patterns by calling for a one-year building moratorium on multiple dwellings, beginning March 1.

She also asked for a detailed study "to determine the impact multiple housing construction is having and will have in the future" of the township.

But at the request of Wes Kaiser, vice chairman, the commission will hold the request in abeyance until after high level meeting with the Wayne County Planning Commission.

That meeting—called by the township board—will probably be an executive—or closed—session. Several crucial

matters are expected to be thrashed out. Tentative date is Monday, Feb. 19. Confirmation will come at the township board meeting next Tuesday.

One agenda item that will undoubtedly be discussed will be the Mocerri proposal involving a regional shopping center at Joy and Sheldon Rds. Another high-priority issue expected to be discussed will be the proposed rezoning of one-acre lots to higher density in the northwest sector.

Both the Mocerri plan and the northwest rezoning were vetoed by the Wayne County Planning Commission in two separate hearings. The Mocerri plan was rejected by the commission several weeks ago. Rejection of the northwest proposal came last Wednesday.

Mrs. Ruland, who has been on the planning commission for only a short time, pointed out in a two-page statement that in the Mocerri decision, Wayne County planners cautioned the township "against excessive rezoning for multiple development."

HER REPORT contained a comparison of the number of multiples and single family units being built in Canton, Taylor, Dearborn Heights and Westland.

The report traced the progress of the apartment boom from the early '60s to its present position in the housing market.

Through research she said took several weeks, Mrs. Ruland reported that the apartment boom appears to have peaked and is on the down-swing with the single-

family home again returning to popularity.

One section of the report states: "The two-year super-abundant mortgage cycle of 1969-70 provided more apartments than people to rent them, according to a housing analysis published in Business Week magazine recently. In fact, the market was so saturated that builders were shifting from rental apartments to condominiums 'in hopes of bringing customers from the single-family home market.'"

Early in the report she said the moratorium was necessary "until the master plan has been completely revised and brought up to date."

"This is necessary," she said, "because the percentage of multiples in Canton is currently 35.5 and climbing..."

The petite commissioner, who was an unsuccessful candidate for township clerk in the November election, was also the only commissioner to

speak out against the proposed one-acre lot rezoning when that issue was aired at a

public hearing held by the planning commission last month.

market area which currently generates \$371 million in retail sales annually would grow to produce \$879 million in sales by 1990.

"We don't think Canton has any kind of shopping identity," Franklin said, adding that this center would provide it.

But, he and Mocerri added,

the complex would give Canton something to be known by—some focal point of identity—in other senses besides shopping, because of its scope and its "Canton" name.

"At this point we would be giving Canton some identity, because right now it doesn't have any," Franklin said.

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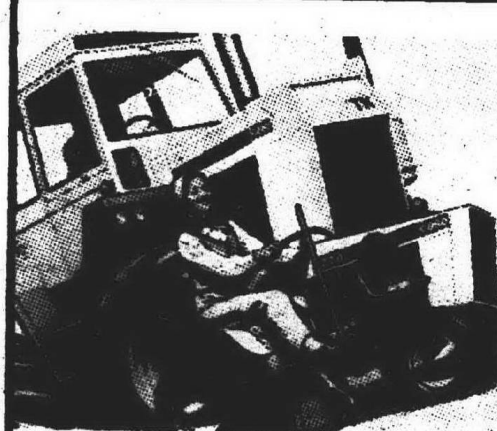

Continued from Page 1A has rezoned substantial areas to permit multiples. From this observation, it appears the township is not engaged in large lot zoning for exclusionary purposes.

"There appears to be logic behind the consultant's recommendation that the areas having rolling topography should remain in acre size parcels, since buildable portions of such lots are generally less than the total parcel.

"Investigation reveals that water and sewer services are not available in the area proposed for change. Thus, until either of these utilities is provided, the proposed zoning change will not affect the one acre lot requirement.

"From the point of view of overall density, traffic service, school load, etc., there would be a modest increase if the zoning amendment is approved.

"The staff has met with officials of the township and outlined its proposals for the retention of some agriculture in Wayne County, and a request has been made to the officials to hold a joint meeting with the township planning commission and the trustees, at which time the full presentation of our report will be made.

"Such a meeting has been promised for the very near future.

"THE STAFF is concerned that the zoning classifications identified as agricultural and R-1A provide virtually no assurance that property will remain in these categories. It would appear that a township decision should be made with respect to what areas it is willing to commit to permanent agricultural uses.

"It may even be possible that the township will strengthen the terms of its agricultural zoning classification to achieve this end.

"The staff recommendation with respect to (this) case is denial."

## Young Woman Minister Asks

# 'Can You Accept Me?'

Seven months as a minister have convinced one young woman that the calling is exciting and rewarding — and one in which women learn the meaning of discrimination.

"I understand now what my friends in the women's liberation movement were talking about," the Rev. Carol Johns told the women's association of Newburg United Methodist Church in Livonia Wednesday.

"There have been specific instances — like the time someone didn't want me to do a funeral because I am a woman — and a general feeling that people are not quite ready to accept a woman as a minister."

"But there's an important difference between the goals of the liberation movement and my quest. The movement asks that women be able to express themselves in a variety of ways — in whatever way they choose."

"I seek the opportunity for responsible service in what I believe to be my God-given calling."

She said she had planned to be a physical education teacher, "but while I was in college I encountered a man called Jesus Christ who changed my life."

She considered the ministry but held back, she said, "and then I wasn't able to get a teaching job but found I could get a scholarship to seminary."

"I really feel God was directing my life, shutting some doors and opening others. I have no doubt that I am where I'm supposed to be."

IN HER POST in Saginaw, Rev. Johns said, she feels grateful for the opportunity to get experience in the full spectrum of ministerial duties — preaching, church school work, ceremonial duties such as weddings, funerals and baptisms, and visiting in homes and hospitals.

"I really enjoy the work," she added. "But still I'm excited about the fact that by next year there will be seven more young women in posts of the Detroit Conference of the United Methodist Church."

"I'm excited because I'm lonely. I'd like to have someone to talk to about how I'm supposed to feel when I'm turned down for a funeral because I'm a woman. My senior pastor is great, and he's helpful and encouraging, but

he never was turned down for any part of his work because he's a man."

REV. JOHNS said there seem to be three categories of objections to women in the ministry — theological, biological and social.

In the first, she mentioned the Old Testament's subjugation of women — "the idea that we're God's afterthought, and if Eve hadn't taken that apple we'd all still be in the Garden of Eden, whatever that means."

She also pointed out that the traditional Jewish belief of the Old Testament places women in an inferior position, and the writings of the apostle Paul did the same.

"Paul's writings are interesting," she added. "He writes with great respect of a number of early Christian women like Priscilla, Lydia and Dorcas, and he's the one who wrote the words:

"There is neither Jew nor Greek; there is neither male nor female — for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

"BUT HE'S quoted often as saying adverse things: that women should keep silent in church, cover their heads, and if they had any questions to

ask their husbands when they got home."

Indicating she didn't worry too much about the theological problems, Rev. Johns said the other two categories involve "practical problems that should be considered seriously by any woman thinking of going into the ministry."

Under biological problems she mentioned husbands' jobs and the possibilities of continuing work during pregnancy, remarking "sometimes I think woman ministers are expected to be celibate — something I'm not very interested in being."

However, she said, if more younger women are to go into the ministry, this is a question the church will have to face.

"The social objections are the hardest to deal with," Rev. Johns said. "The feeling — on the part of both men and women — that they are not sure they really can accept a woman minister."

CAROL JOHNS has found that present-day Christians, perhaps like Paul, can accept her as an individual but still not feel sure about women ministers in general.

"I guess it's something you have to face in any work," she added. "But I feel sure that if God has willed me — as a woman — to be a minister, then I can make it."

"Education must be a life-long learning process for all citizens. Religious education is no exception."

Among the suburban locations are Westland, Redford Township, Dearborn and Dearborn Heights. Most

classes begin the week of Feb. 12 and the fee for each eight-week course is \$10.

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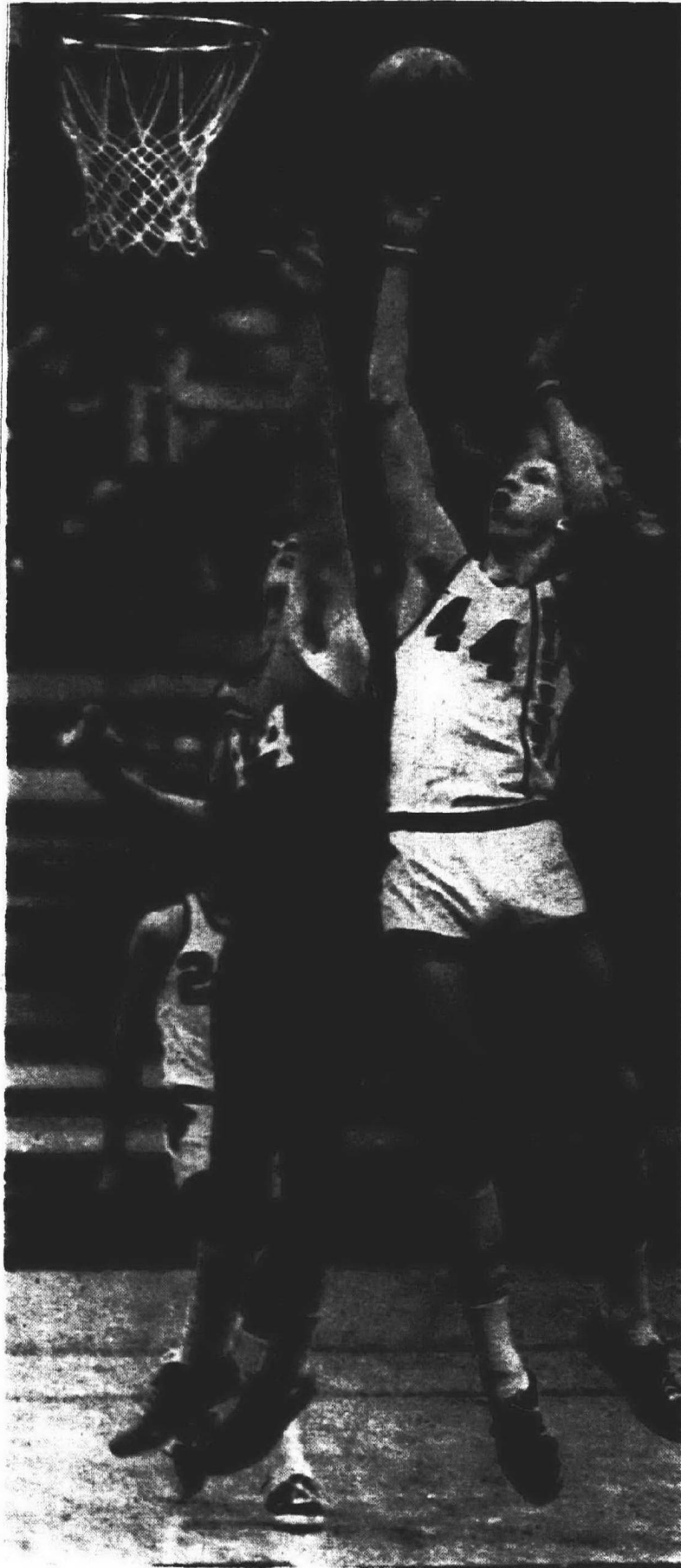

## Turf Tips, Quips

Seems rather strange that during the winter season when most trotters and pacers are far from top form that a six year old pacer should run out of competition.

That's the story of Bedford Jet at Northville Downs where Racing Secretary Tom Smith had to ask Driver-Trainer Gordon Norris to withdraw from the weekly preferred pace. The reason.... Smith couldn't get other owners to enter their horses because of the ease with which The Jet had won on successive Saturdays.

Bedford Jet is an unusual horse. He has long been rated in the preferred class and manages to hold his own during the spring, summer and fall campaigns. But come winter he suddenly blossoms into the best of the lot and this is the second straight year that The Jet has caused racing directors to ask his owners to withdraw or force a change in the race conditions that would automatically disqualify the horse.

It was just a month ago that Norris dropped Bedford Jet's name into the entry box after giving the speedy pacer an early winter rest on the farm to freshen up.

To say that the horse was freshened up is putting it mildly. In his first start of the new year, The Jet took the lead early, turned the first half in a sensational 1:01 and then coasted home to win by lengths and lengths in 2:04.3. That was the fastest mile of the winter.

Just to prove it wasn't a fluke, The Jet came back a week later and turned in the same kind of performance. Once again he took the lead on the backstretch, hit the halfway point in 1:01.2 and sped home in 2:04.4.

That's when the competition decided he was too much and owners started to back off from the preferred class races. This posed a problem to Smith who well knows that a track must have preferred events on Fridays and Saturdays to make the programs more attractive.

THE ONLY ANSWER is to change conditions for the preferred races or ask the big horse to be scratched. That's what happened and Bedford

Jet will not be among the starters Saturday (tonight).

Smith did line up the six fastest pacers on the grounds and the result should be one of the better races of the two week old Northville Downs season.

The big difference is that Erianas Valley, the fleet four year old from Auto Dealer Bill Brown's stable, will step into the role of early favorite over the five challengers.

It will be recalled that Erianas Valley was the surprise victor in the \$10,000 finale of the Jackson-at-Northville late closing pacing series. Since then it has had to play second fiddle to Bedford Jet, always close but never able to win.

ADAKIO, Knox Abbe and Action, all recent winners of preferred events, will be the ones to watch. Each is capable of upsetting Erianas Valley although each has a different style.

Adakio likes to go to the front and stay there as long as it can, often leading all the way to the finish line. Action generally bids in the backstretch on the second lap and closes with a rush. Knox Abbe has the most whip of all in the final quarter.

Erianas Valley is one that gets well placed in the early going and then opens up in the final half mile.

Others in the field are: Scamp Direct and J.R. Rocky.

GERRY BANFIELD, driving champion at each of the last three Jackson meetings including the one which ended two weeks ago, is making a big bid for the Northville Downs crown.

Gerry, who accepts more starts than any other reinsman at the track, has 10 wins to lead in that division. Gordon Norris isn't far behind with eight and Eddie Morgan Jr. is leading in percentages with a .487 mark.

However, considerable attention has been turned on Malcolm Phillips, of Pontiac. Phillips, who sat out most of last year due to an accident in which he broke both wrists, has shown considerable improvement since the start of the meeting.

He had a three bagger earlier in the week and recorded a double on Wednesday. If he matches his mark of last winter when he was rated best at the 'Downs, then look for little Mal to win the title come next March.

margin to 45-27 going into the final eight minutes.

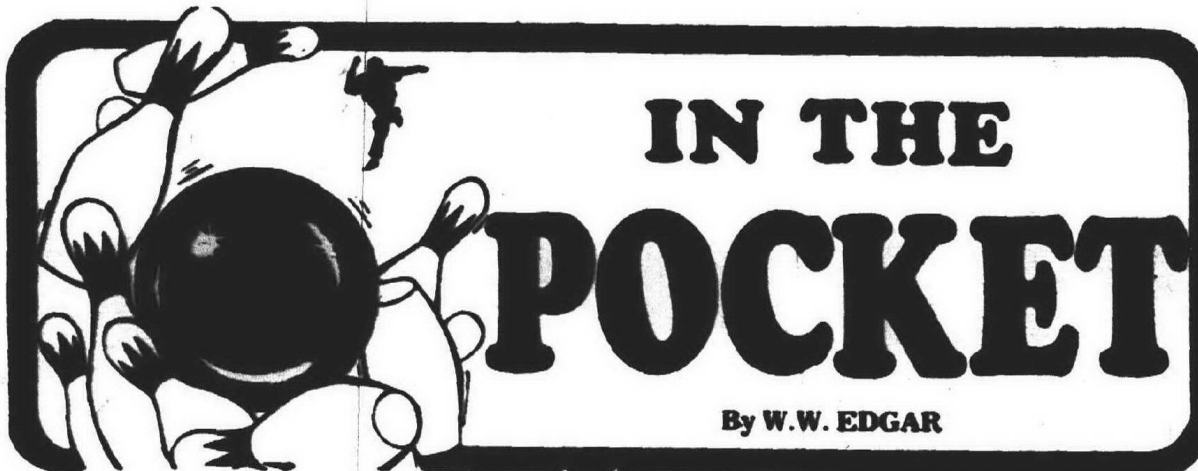
SEAHOLM TIRED the final period, and Harrison outscored the Southeastern crew, 25-16, for a 27 point victory.

## Winning Points In Bridge Brings Hench Trophy, Title

Looking for a leisure time activity that is inexpensive, mentally stimulating and challenging?

Stan Hench, a Livonia art teacher, claims that "serious" bridge playing is all three, and he has the awards to prove it. Hench, who began the transition from "kitchen" to "serious" bridge in 1966, has just been awarded the Mike Cipro Memorial Trophy from the Dearborn Bridge Club. It's awarded to the player who accumulates the most master points over one year. Not only did Hench get the most in 1972, he also garnered the most ever for the club in one year.

HENCH ALSO became a life master in 1972, completing his required 300 master points at a regional tournament in Cobo Hall.

For his accomplishments, he gives much of the credit to his wife, Ailene.

"She's a bridge player. That's why I'm a life master," he said. Acting as his partner most of the time, she has helped him a lot, and is very close to being a life master herself.

Hench explained that master points are those awarded at sessions of any duplicate bridge club and at regional and national tournaments. The points for coming in first, second or third are based on the number of tables playing and a whole evening of bridge might result in only a fraction of a point. Those awarded at regular

club sessions are called "black" and those awarded at regional and national meets, where the competition is much tougher, are called "red."

IN ORDER to become a life master, a player must receive 250 black points and 50 red.

The next steps in bridgedom's hierarchy are national master and international master. They are based on winning national championships.

Mr. and Mrs. Hench belong to four duplicate bridge clubs, including the Livonia Bridge Club which holds its meetings in the Livonia Senior Citizens' Center. They also have their own little duplicate bridge club.

But life doesn't revolve totally around bridge. Hench also finds time for painting, including portraits, reading and the activities of his six children.

In fact, Hench has had to give up meetings of the Dearborn club until after the basketball season, because one of his five sons happens to have basketball practice on the same evening.

For bridge fans contemplating making the transition to duplicate, the Henschs recommend the Schenken or "Big Club" system. If you have 17 points or more, you open one club. The response is 1 diamond if you hold 0 to 6 points; 2 clubs, for 6 to 8 points; and you bid naturally if you hold 9 or over.

THE STORY opens with the kid, played by Charles Grodin, quickly wedding and bedding a nice young Jewish girl, Jeannie Berlin (Miss May's daughter).

But like the song "Is That All There Is?" he quickly becomes disillusioned with marriage when his bride sings off-key, eats candy bars in bed, talks about being married for 50 or 60 years and professes a great fondness for egg salad which she eats untidily.

She caps all this by getting a terrific sunburn the first day of their arrival at Miami Beach.

No lovely image of womanhood here, and one can almost feel sorry for the poor schlock.

BUT HOW CAN he be so stupid? He immediately falls for a rich, blonde Nordic beauty from the wilds of Minnesota (Cybill Shepherd), obvious that she's just a teaser who would enjoy nothing better than maliciously spoiling his honeymoon.

But the poor guy can't see what she's up to, and so on the third day of his honeymoon, he tells his bride he wants a divorce. This scene is one of the best-played in the movie, and Miss Berlin proves that talent can be inherited.

The end is both amusing and bemusing...it leaves you wondering who's been "had" after all.

I'm also left bemused (but not amused) by the logic of the ratings. This one gets a PFG, but the only parts the kids would be interested in are the parts most parents would rather they didn't see.

"School for Scandal" is the kind of play Wayne State University's Hilberry Theater does best.

Rapier wit. Broad comedy. Gaudy costumes. A great variety of rich characters (in contrast to the modern tendency to excessive reliance on a single "star").

Richard Brinsley Sheridan's 196-year-old comedy of English manners opened in repertory last week to the great satisfaction of classic theater lovers, alternating with "The Crucible" and "The Three Musketeers."

THE THEME is gossip. Lady Snervell (Maryellen Clemons) has marvelous eyes and brows for the part) and her social crowd indulge in character assassination for the pure joy of it, and the going gets even rougher when they do it for a purpose.

Central characters are the Surface brothers. Joseph (Dennis Romer) is the cool, controlled, hypocritical elder who attempts an elaborate sex/blackmail plot to win the

hand of the pure Maria (Cheryl Giannini). Charles (Jan Van Sickle) is the wastrel, but he has a family loyalty and inner nobility of character that appeal to Maria, and ultimately to his wealthy Uncle Charles.

Spicing the action are the aged Sir Peter Teazle (John Sterling Arnold, the closest thing to a star in the Hilberry company) and his voluptuous young wife (Kathleen Gaffney).

Dirty—old Joseph attempts to seduce Lady Teazle, who despite her infatuation with the gossip crowd manages to retain her country girl morals.

There is a long, superb scene in the second act in which Joseph's multitudinous plots come apart, publicly, one by one, and he is socially ruined. If one were to fault Robert T. Hazzard's otherwise fine direction, it would be on this point: The intermissions could have been so arranged to let that long, splendid scene of Joseph's ruination stand more nearly alone.

One who has seen the Stratford, Ont., production has a tendency to recall Robin Gamel's tour de force as Joseph, which probably isn't fair to Hilberry's Dennis Romer.

THERE ARE all sorts of side benefits to the local production.

One is Daniel Thomas Field's costuming, particularly of Mrs. Candour, Sir Benjamin Backbite and the Teazles. At first one fears Lady Teazle will pop out of top of her neckline; later, that she won't. (She doesn't.)

Another is the treatment of Sir Benjamin. As written, he's a top; as portrayed here, he has a fairlike quality, accented by a rosy-pink suit. This viewer isn't certain that the hints of homosexuality were really necessary, but they did provide much hilarity.

Best of all, the boisterous quality we've learned to expect from the WSU graduate students was there as usual.

# HOW COME THE BOOM IN RVs?

THE recreational vehicle industry is the number one growth market of the decade. In the past nine years, sales have skyrocketed almost 700 percent. Amazingly, industry leaders state that the recreational vehicle boom is still in its infancy and predict a \$2 billion market by 1980, with seven-and-one-half million units on the road.

Unfortunately, the "image" of recreational vehicles has not grown as fast as industry sales. As a result, many common ideas about the marketing and use of recreational vehicles are incorrect. Many potential owners do not purchase units because they believe in these myths. Similar beliefs keep dealers out of the recreational vehicle market and cause others, who do sell recreational vehicles, to misdirect their advertising and sales promotions.

The three myths most commonly believed by dealers and the buying public are:

**1. Recreational Vehicles Are Used Primarily For Hunting, Fishing, and Camping.** Like many myths about the recreational vehicle market, this statement was true in the early 1950's. At that time, units were limited to travel trailers and homemade campers owned by a mere handful of outdoor enthusiasts. Few units had self-contained water or electrical systems, and campgrounds were scarce and very primitive.

Today, the situation is almost completely reversed. More than two million travel trailers, truck campers, van/camp conversion campers and motorhomes are on the road. Many contain showers, toilets, a wide variety of colored appliances, drapes, and thick-pile carpeting. "Luxury" is also the word for the more than 400 U.S. parks that resemble resorts more than campgrounds. These luxury parks have hookups for water, waste and electricity, and often also feature swimming pools, boat docks, nearby golf courses, and many other recreational facilities.

These changes have occurred because the principal use of recreational vehicles is for family activities. Over one-half of the respondents in a recent Mobile Life Magazine survey indicated they use their recreational vehicles mainly for vacation trips with their families. About one-third listed weekends with their families as their principal use, and one-fifth expressed the greatest interest in saving money when traveling.

The myth picks hunting, fishing and camping as the primary uses of recreational vehicles. Actually, only one-sixth of the survey respondents use their units mainly for these activi-

ties -- and women and children go along on 98 out of 100 trips. Many recreational vehicle owners indicated a strong interest in camping and having their own accommodations. Only one in 10, however, camp off the beaten path where no other facilities are available.

A large proportion of today's recreational vehicle advertising and sales promotions are centered around "men only" hunting and fishing scenes. The Mobile Life survey demonstrates that this is an extremely limited appeal. In addition, the survey suggests that the camping use of recreational vehicles is part of a larger selling point -- using recreational vehicles to/turn weekends into short, inexpensive vacations.

**2. Recreational Vehicles Do Not Appeal To All Segments Of The Population.** This misconception comes from the belief that the vast majority of recreational vehicle owners fall into the 35-45 age group. It is true that this is the period when families need and can afford family wagons as second cars, when the appeal of outdoor recreation is strongest for the total family unit, and when children are old enough to enjoy traveling and camping. The Recreational Vehicle Institute reports, however, that the median age of unit owners is 48.5 years.

Logically, this statistic should not be a surprise. Persons in the 45-55 age group are usually in the highest income years and the need to get away from job pressures is very strong. Then, too, during this period, children leave the home and parents are able to travel and do and see the things they did not have time or money for while raising a family.

The Recreational Vehicle Institute also reveals that many unit owners are in the 55-65 age group. This is America's new class of "young retirees." With their children gone and their incomes reduced, many retirees are trading family-sized homes for the joys of inexpensive travel. Retirees form the biggest market for motorhomes because they want more living and entertaining room, refined interior styling, and luxury flourishes that just are not practical in campers and units designed for dual use as a second car.

The major hurdle in selling recreational vehicles to college and young married prospects is that they rarely need, or can afford, a second car. On the other hand, dealers can hit these selling points: (1) the time for travel and adventure is the period before having children and settling down; (2)

# Industry PROBLEMS

A shortage of recreational vehicle storage facilities is the industry's most pressing problem. Large numbers of travel-oriented people living in apartment complexes and other types of congested housing areas are often unable to own a recreational vehicle because parking and storage are not available.

One solution helping to eliminate the storage problem is the recent development of recreational vehicle parking lots located around major metropolitan centers. These storage areas provide parking convenience, protection, maintenance and repair services. The owner's vehicle is available and ready for immediate use whenever needed. Storage lot rates differ in various regions. A rule of thumb rate would be about \$1.00 per month per foot of space used. Camping trailers and smaller units are usually charged a flat minimum fee. Servicing, repairs and unit delivery services are separate charges.

Development of a recreational vehicle storage lot requires very little cash outlay other than a few improvements such as lighting, fencing and black-topping. The establishment of additional recreational vehicle storage facilities in the nation's major markets will strengthen industry sales.

Another industry problem is the

shortage of recreational vehicle parks and campgrounds. During recent years, a rapidly expanding number of quality camping sites and overnight park facilities have been developed in an effort to meet industry demands. Major motel chains across the country are offering campsite accommodations adjacent to their existing facilities. Restaurants located on major travel routes are utilizing vacant land in their area for overnight camping.

A major shortage of campsites still exists in the popular vacation sections of the country, especially during the peak summer season. It is hoped that private investors will help meet the industry needs by developing available land into camping areas.

Restrictive ordinances prohibiting recreational vehicle parking and storage in residential areas are another problem that continues to confront the industry. The Recreational Vehicle Institute has prepared a model ordinance for recreational vehicle owners which can be applied to their individual situations. A copy of this ordinance is available upon request.

The Recreational Vehicle Institute's Long-Range Planning Committee meets regularly and attempts to find viable solutions to industry-wide problems.

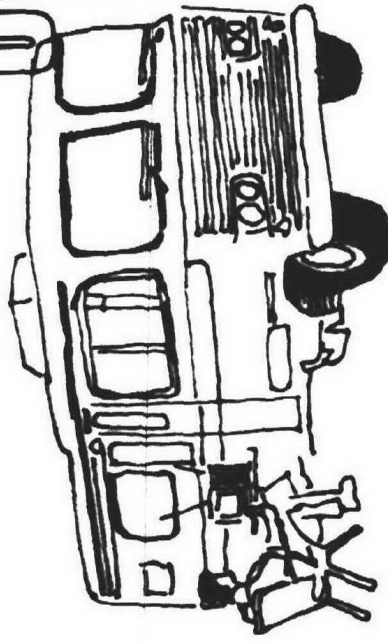

# OWNER PROFILE.



A nationwide survey of 500 camping families conducted by 3M National Advertising Co. during 1971 revealed that the average age of recreational vehicle owners (head of household) is 45 years. Over half the respondents were white collar workers and the average income was in excess of \$12,000.

The average family size was 4.1 people; 2.6 over age 18 and 1.5 under age 18. Their camping vacations can be quite extensive.

The average trip taken by non-retirees involved 15.4 days away from home and was over 2,600 miles in length. Retirees surveyed average 63.3 days away from home and over 4,600 miles of travel. The average recreational vehicle-owning family spent 34 days traveling and camping in 1970; retirees spent nearly 69 days out with their RVs. Camping is no longer a summer only activity. Five out of six respondents have taken camping vacations in the spring and fall while one in two has done so in

the winter. Ski trips and snowmobile outings were the principal factors in winter RV use.

20% of the recreational vehicle owners surveyed had started camping within the last two years, while over 40% have done so for the last five years. 40% of the respondents indicated they plan to add to, or upgrade their present RV equipment.

In a Recreational Vehicle Institute survey, approximately 75% said that industry standards were an important buying influence and that prior to purchase they looked for indications that the unit complied with the Recreational Vehicle Institute's standards covering electrical, gas and plumbing equipment and installations.

Other buying influences included reputation of the manufacturer, the treatment they received from the dealer, unit floor plan and interior equipment, soundness of construction, price and general over-all appearance.

Motel rents can run up to \$30 or more each night for a family. Fees for public or private campgrounds usually are only a couple of dollars a night. If the vehicle is self-contained, with cooking, sleeping and sanitary facilities, the family can also camp in national or state forests or remote areas for nothing.

Practically all recreational vehicles come with cooking facilities today so restaurant eating is unnecessary. This can amount to considerable savings, especially in resort areas. For the camping family, eating on the road is just like eating at home.

couples with small children often cannot get away for long vacations, but can take weekend trips; and (3) recreational vehicles almost pay for themselves because traveling costs little more than staying home.

Recreational vehicles buyers come from almost every income bracket and age group. It is quite proper for dealers to tailor advertising and promotions in order to reach specific audiences. But, it is not profitable to concentrate too much on any single segment of the population.

**3. Recreational Vehicles Are Seasonal Sellers.** This is the most common and most expensive myth of all. Many dealers sell recreational vehicles as seasonal products -- thereby unwittingly discouraging potential owners.

All recreational vehicle dealers promote the vacation traveling, weekend trip, camping and fishing uses of recreational units in the spring and summer. Fall has been partially recognized as a season in which hunting and fishing excursions can be promoted. Most dealers have failed to recognize, however, that fall is also the "new car" season and a very good time for stressing the dual use of recreational vehicles as a second car.

Winter has long been considered a dead period for recreational vehicle sales. But winter sports have become extremely popular and camping is no problem in units with self-contained water, electricity and heat. Winter is also an excellent time for warm climate travel appeals aimed at the young retiree group.

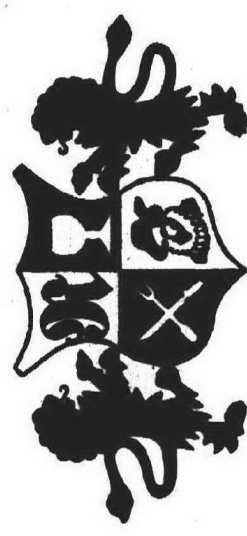

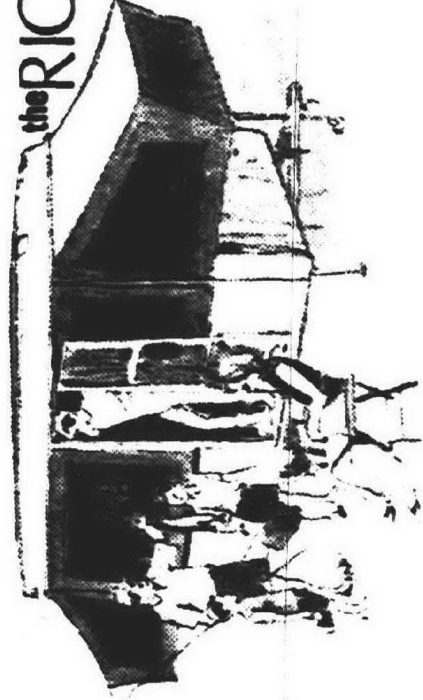
# PARKS and CAMP- GROUNDS

Several publishers offer park and campground guides and directories for recreational vehicle owners. Woodall's 1972 Trailing Parks and Campgrounds lists over 18,000 public and privately operated camping areas in the U.S.A., Canada and Mexico suitable for recreational vehicle camping. Of the total, 7,513 campgrounds listed are public camping areas operated by local, state and federal authorities and 10,684 are operated commercially. This directory lists only those campgrounds where good drinking water is available.

Areas offering the largest number of campsites are: CANADA: Ontario — 70,994 located in 717 campgrounds; Quebec — 52,705 campsites in 562 campgrounds. U.S.A.: California — 64,087 campsites in 1,388 campgrounds; Florida — 54,126 in 693 campgrounds; Ohio — 47,295 in 358 campgrounds; New York — 44,895 in 527 campgrounds; Michigan — 39,652 in 646 campgrounds; Wisconsin — 38,973 in 674 campgrounds; Pennsylvania — 34,581 in 487 campgrounds; Washington — 23,367 in 598 campgrounds; Texas — 21,098 in 581 campgrounds; MEXICO: 7,908 campsites at present offering good drinking water and

authorities are rapidly developing additional camping areas. Overnight parking fees in commercially operated campgrounds vary greatly by geographical location, season and facilities offered. Fees range from about \$1.50 to about \$8.00 per night, with the majority \$5 or less plus \$1 for utilities hookup. Overnight fees may run as high as \$10 in some cases. It is wise to phone or write for a reservation at the commercially operated campgrounds. Overnight fees for recreational vehicles in public campgrounds vary from \$1.00 to \$3.00 or more, depending upon services and facilities provided.

In addition to the public and commercial campgrounds discussed above, additional campsites are provided in various areas by electric utility companies, lumber companies, paper companies, oil companies, and other industrial concerns. One company, Pacific Gas & Electric, offers some 500 campsites along its 450 miles of lake shorelines. The Army Corps of Engineers operates a number of campgrounds in various parts of the country and the National Wildlife Refuge also maintains camping areas and is planning more.



## the RICH & NOT SO RICH, LIKE RV'S

It doesn't seem to make much difference whether a person is a top business executive, doctor, teacher, worker on an assembly line, farmer, television repairman, or carpenter, they all like recreational vehicles. One of the big reasons is that RVs are manufactured in every price range and thus are available to those in all segments of the American public. Another reason is that they provide a convenient and inexpensive way to travel and enjoy the outdoors.

Those owning RVs range from a median age of 44 to retirees in the 60 and over age group. The youngest group, median of 44, own camping trailers. Truck camper owners average 47, travel trailer owners 54 and the motor home owners in the 60s. Retirees own many of the travel trailers and motor homes, pushing up the age bracket. The impact of these RV owners on other segments of the economy is shown in a recent survey by Wheels Afield, a leading industry publication. The study shows that nearly 40 per cent of RV owners have their cars or trucks air conditioned. Nearly 10 per cent have stereo tape systems. After market purchases of car options include air-springs and shocks (25%),

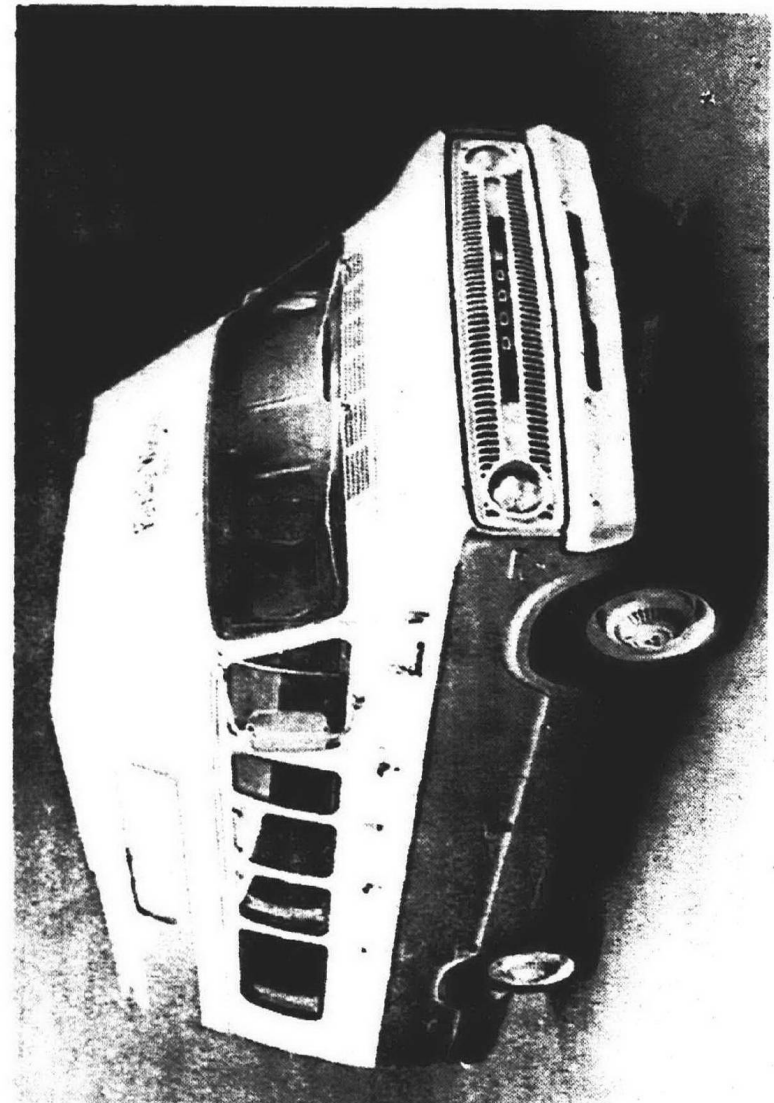
special gauges (22%), suspension equipment (19%) and replacement tires (41%). Nearly 18% of RV owners carry bicycles, motorcycles or trail bikes when they travel. Another 37% take along a boat, usually equipped with an outboard motor. Outdoor equipment includes fishing gear (82%), beach attire (78%), binoculars (77%), guns (62%), hunting knives (60%), insulated clothing (60%), and ski equipment (10%). These are active people.

How much use do they make of their RVs? A total of 33 1/2% traveled from 2,500 to 4,999 miles in the past year. Another 24% traveled 5,000 to 9,999 miles and 7.9% hit the road for more than 10,000 miles.

The study shows that 70.4% used credit cards on their recreational travels. They spent \$500 to \$999 (33 1/2%), or \$1,000 to \$1,999 (24%) or \$2,000 to \$4,999 (7%). Even with RV travel inexpensive, these owners spend money. One thing they don't spend it on is high motel rents.

What are their interests? Mainly camping (97%), fishing (77%) and hunting (43%). Skindiving and skiing and snowmobiling are rising in popularity.

# Camper SHOW Feb. 10-18

With the recreational vehicle industry booming in every section of the land, the question often asked is, "Why have American families made the travel trailer and camper industry the fastest growing in the nation?"

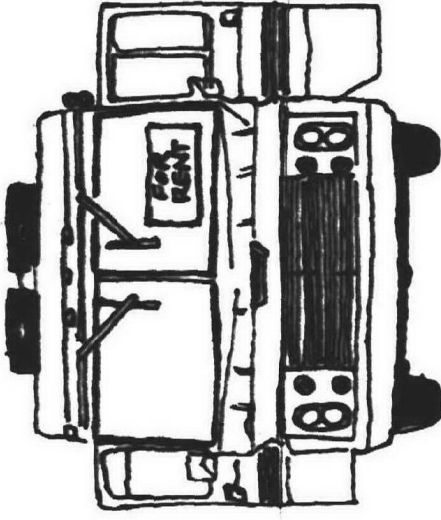
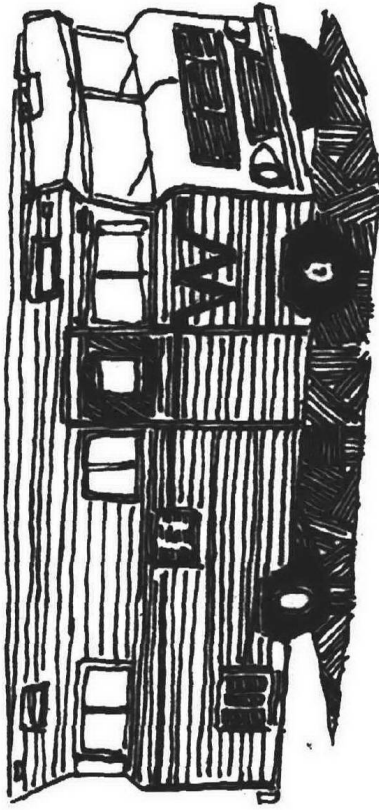
The answer is three-fold: More convenience and luxuries being built into travel trailers, truck campers, motor homes and camping trailers.

They have learned that it is possible to take a long vacation in a recreational vehicle, go most anywhere at a much lower cost than staying in motels and hotels and eating in restaurants.

They have discovered the family can take weekend excursions and thus can enjoy outdoor living during the summer, hunting in the fall, skiing and snowmobiling during the winter, all at a cost one can afford.

Prospective buyers of RVs can see for themselves at the sixth annual Detroit Camper and Travel Trailer show, Feb. 10-18, in the Detroit Artillery Armory on West Eight Mile Road.

On display will be more than 800 vehicles with exhibitors also showing accessories and giving information on campgrounds insurance and financing.



## Now You Can RENT

The rapidly expanding rental market is playing an important role in exposing recreational vehicles to greater numbers of people. Many recreational vehicle and automotive dealers, rental equipment operators, travel and leasing firms are now renting travel trailers, truck campers, motor homes and camping trailers.

Renting enables people to try the fun, economy and convenience of recreational vehicle travel. Some rental customers are people living in apartment complexes, condominiums and places where recreational vehicle parking and storage is not available.

Other rental users are persons financially unable at the present time to purchase their own vehicle. Renting also offers prospective owners an opportunity to determine the size, style and type of unit they want before buying. The latest trend in recreational vehicle rental is the entry of major car leasing companies into the pleasure travel business. National airlines and travel agencies are utilizing recreational vehicles in special camping, vacation packages with planned itineraries and reservations at an all-inclusive price.

Rental rates depend on geographic

location, season, unit size and type and equipment. Some examples of average rental costs are:

CAMPING TRAILERS: 14-ft. unit — \$65 per week, 16-ft. unit — \$90 per week.

TRAVEL TRAILERS: 16-ft. unit — \$110 per week.

TRUCK CAMPERS: 8-ft. camper, plus pickup truck — \$85 per week; plus 10c per mile; 9 1/2 ft. camper, plus pickup truck — \$100 per week, plus 10c per mile.

MOTOR HOMES: 22-ft. model — \$225 per week, plus 10c per mile.

Most rental facilities charge a \$30 deposit on recreational vehicles except motor homes on which the average deposit is \$100.

Bumper-type hitches for use with camping trailers and the smaller travel trailers rent for \$4.50 per week, \$9.00 per month. Axle-type hitches rent for \$5.00 per day, \$15.00 per week, \$30.00 per month. Very few rental agencies require a deposit on the hitch.

In some cases, rental operators who sell units and dealers who rent, will allow the rental cost paid toward the purchase price.

## OWNERSHIP COSTS & EXPENSES

Depending on the purchase price and number of trips taken with a recreational vehicle, it can pay for itself by eliminating expensive room rentals and restaurant meals. Recreational vehicle ownership makes weekend and vacation travel economically feasible for more people.

Projecting all costs over the life of the vehicle, travel in an RV costs little more than living at home. Trips that normally would be too expensive are brought within the most modest travel budget.

The major cost outside of the original purchase price is gasoline. This varies greatly according to type and size. Recreational vehicle maintenance is a minor expense.

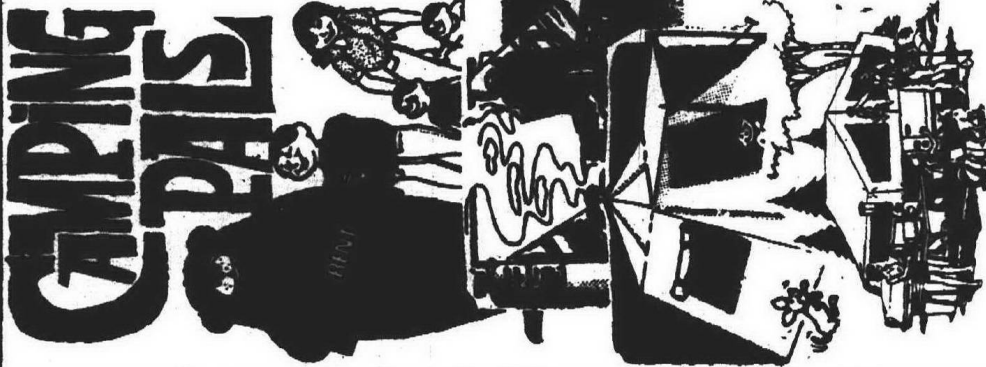
Eight-cylinder cars equipped with special options for trailer towing are recommended to obtain maximum recreational efficiency. Strain and load on the tow vehicle is controlled by the balance of the recreational vehicle and specially designed weight equalizing hitches. Hitch and installation costs are not usually included in the purchase price of a trailer.

Some optional expense items to be considered after vehicle purchase are outdoor folding furniture, awning extensions and screens, high power battery lights, leveling gear, driving mirrors and extensions, first-aid kit and maintenance tools.

Other accessory items might include jacks, additional appliances, hoses, special brake equipment, heaters, air conditioners, portable toilets, electrical extension cords and other items providing greater comfort and convenience.

Depending on the type and price of recreational vehicle purchased, most of the self-containment items will be included. Higher priced luxury options available for motor trailer, truck camper and motor home models are air-conditioning and television installations.

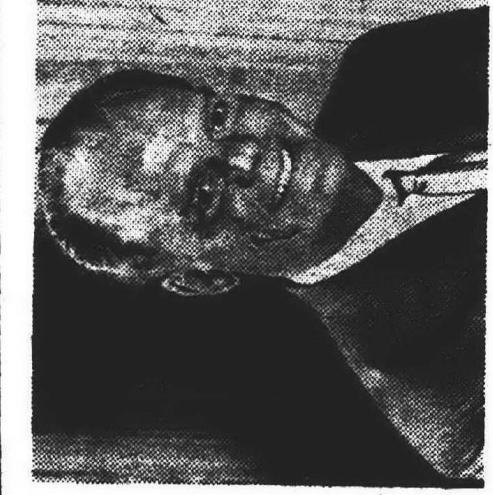
