Hines Park Bike-Way Plan Told

A \$50,000 price tag has been placed on the bike-way that will parallel the E.N. Hines Parkway drive in western Wayne County.

The bike-way will be six feet wide and four inches thick, according to information supplied by Edwin E. Mika, parks and recreation superintendent for the County Road Commission's parks and forestry division.

Bicycle paths are an "in" thing for the ecology movement. Not only do bicycles not use irreplaceable fossil fuel, but they provide cheap transportation and safe access to public facilities for many persons.

In a memo to State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), Mika said the three-mile bike-way will provide access to picnic areas, ball diamonds, fishing sites, football fields, tennis courts and comfort stations.

Various engineering services are estimated at \$7,000; construction at \$22.120; grading, fill, tree removal, drainage and guard rails at \$16,880; inspection, signs and contingencies at \$4,100.

Financing would be under a project agreement between Wayne County and the state Dept. of Natural Resources.

Hunter Safety **Offered**

Hunter safety training. required of Michigan youth ages 12-16 buying their first hunting license, will be offered at Schoolcraft College later this month.

Classes will be held from 9 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. the Saturdays of Feb. 24 and March 3. They will be taught by Sgt. James Schrot of the Northville Township police and E.F. Petersen, college business manager. Both are certified instructors.

Included in the seven lessons to be covered are "how to live with guns and ammunition;" "privileges and responsibilities of hunting," and "first aid for sportsmen.'

The training is free and open to 30 young persons on a first come, first served basis. Pre registration is necessary and may be completed by calling the college, extension 264. The program is sponsored by Schoolcraft's community services office.

Registration is open through Feb. 17. the first week of spring term continuing education classes Marygrove College, Mc-Nichols at Wyoming, Detroit. There are 57 non-credit courses offered this term, both evenings and Saturdays.

Many Continuing Education courses offered at Marvgrove are career-oriented. Among these special training courses are a course to help prepare child-care assistants; courses in business communications. shorthand and typing refresher courses.

Astrology Tops Occult Book List

anyone can see he's an Aquarian dog, the way he Red Baron from the roof of his dog house," writes Linda Goodman in the foreword of her book "Sun Signs."

This book by Goodman is the steadiest best seller in the occult category at a Livonia book store, the Little Professor, according to its proprietor, Frank Gurskis. "Books on astrology sell well consistently," he explains. "It's the most popular subject within the occult group." "Occult books" are defined

as those dealing with psychological relationships whose reality is accepted by a sizable group of adults but is denied or ignored in the conventional belief systems of the prevailing culture - books about celebrated psychics. mysticism, life after death, astrology, black magic, flying saucers, parapsychology, dream interpretation. dowsing, numerology, ghosts, and the like.

These subjects are rarely discussed in formal schooling, yet interest in them runs high. Ten to 15 per cent of the books at this one store fall into the occult category. Best sellers within this grouping at the book store are:

"Sun Signs," by Linda Goodman. The author takes each astrological sign and gives rather thorough descriptions of each man, woman, child, boss and employe born under it. By giving the reader this knowledge, explains "how to recognize Israel." people's hidden dreams. secret hopes and true characters -- how to understand their deepest needs how to like them better and make them like you - how to really know the people you The reader is equipped to identify birth signs of people, and even animals like Snoopy, that touch their lives.

"Chariots of the Gods," by Erich Von Daniken. Was God an astronaut? In this book, Daniken contends that gods visited primeval earth in fiery chariots or spaceships from a star capable of supporting life long before the Earth was cool. He explores the inconsistencies of the findings by archeologists in ruins of thousands of years ago which cannot be explained by reference to conventional theories of archeology, history and religion.

Among the ruins, Daniken writes, are electric batteries; strange being in perfect space suits with platinum fasteners; and numbers with 15 digits -"something not registered by any computer." Daniken struggles with theories on how primeval people acquired the ability to create them.

"The Late Great Planet Earth," by Hal Lindsey. "This is a book about prophecy," the author confides "--Bible prophecy." And every time the reader passes a biblical passage, one finds a communist conspiracy. At least, that is the way this biblical scholar handles the scrip-



THERE ARE 14 books on Edgar Cayce, one of the better known clairvoyants in modern history. All of these books sell well, says Gurskis. Some of the Cayce books deal with specific subjects such as healing, reincarnation, Jesus and his church, dreams, ESP, prophecy, and diet and health. But the two that are most widely read are:

"Edgar Cayce, The Sleeping Prophet," by Jess Stern. A biography of Edgar Cayce by a journalist who employed a geologist, experts in medicine and varied scientists to examine the technical material left by Edgar Cavce. Stern also explores Cayce's prophecies such as the resurrection of the lost continent of Atlantis: the destruction of most of Los Angeles, San Francisco and New York; and the end of

communism in Russia. "There is a River, the Story of Edgar Cayce," by Thomas Sugrue. Another biography, told by a writer who knew and investigated Cayce while he lived. This book deals more specifically with the medical diagnoses Edgar Cayce made through clairvoyance over a span of 43 years.







In spray literature you often see the term "dormant" green at the tip.

This can be winter or spring. You can buy dormant fruit sprays from your garden center, and they can be helpful in checking mites, aphids and diseases of fruit trees at a time when you don't have to worry about a residue problem.

Most fruit trees benefit from a four or five times before leaves. "pink" spray, and you should spray just before the blossoms open. As a general rule, small plantings of several varieties of fruits will benefit if sprayed in the pink stage, an important time to spray.

STARTING SEEDS indoors: You'll soon be starting seeds of your favorite plants indoors. Some items such as peppers, eggplants, salvia, should be started next month.

To get the best germination possible, remember one point: most seeds like an honest 75 degrees F or more for germination. They don't like 75 degrees F in the day, and a drop to 60 or 65 degrees at night.

Are You An Elitist By Being Professional?

The press today is under attack, perhaps the most intense since the First Amendment guarantéeing the right of freedom of speech was written nearly 200 years ago.

The attack is coming mainly from the federal government, and it goes all the way back to the administrations of Presidents Kennedy and Johnson, although the Nixon administration is currently broadening the scope of the assault.

State government has been less involved, although the State Senate only last week rescinded its tule forbidding reporters on the floor of the Senate Local governments (despite an aggravating penchant for holding secret meetings at certain times) in general have kept out of the fight.

The methods of attack include verbal assaults by Vice President Agnew and other administration figures, threats not to renew local television station licenses if news reporting doesn't meet certain undefined standards, jail terms for reporters who decline to reveal their sources for investigative reporting, and outright aftempts to censor publication of the news (i.e., the Pentagon Papers case.)

The purpose of this column is to react as a local newspaperman to this assault.

I BEGIN WITH the notion that much criticism of the press is accurate. fair and constructive. There is much about our news media that I find biased, silly and unprofessional, and there are many within the profession who are deeply concerned about making it much, much better.

One major charge is that the press is elitist — a phrase used by the president himself — which I understand to mean that the press is unrepresentative of the majority of Americans in its views.

It seems like a reasonable charge.

Most people in journalism have specialized professional training, and many have college degrees — unlike the majority of Americans. Most journalists are trained in a fairly rigid standard of professionalism and their skills include unusual ability to communicate in words and pictures — unlike the majority of Americans.

I could go on for pages enumerating the ways in which, by virtue of their professional skills, training and work patterns journalists are unlike most other folks.

The press IS elitist.

AND SO IS any other profession.

If your baby is sick, you don't go to a doctor because he's representative of the population at large. You go to him because he is by virtue of his professional training an elitist. You entrust your child to him, not because he's like you, but because you want him to make your baby well.

If you get sued and you need a lawyer, you don't choose one because he's liberal or conservative. Republican or Democrat. You get the best lawyer you can find, because his use to you is as a professional, and his elite skills are just exactly what you want.

So why should the press be criticized for elitism, when in fact that is the basis of any professional service offered in our society?

THE REASON, I suspect, is that politicians never tire of seeing everything in strictly political terms.

Here's their line of reasoning (which I saw for two solid years while I was working for a congressman on Capitol Hill):

"I'm elected; I communicate to the voters via the media; the news media should transmit exactly what I say, so that I can maximize my chances for reelection; if the media try to interpret what I say or investigate what's going on, they're against me because they're thwarting my attempts to communicate directly with my voters; because the voters elected me in the first place, any news media person who tries to thwart me is by definition unrepresentative of the voters and therefore elitist."

I submit this is just as silly as it looks.

I submit that the press in this country exists not because it has a place in an election campaign, but because the people at large are guaranteed the right to have free flow of information.

I submit that the obligations of the news media are to the people at large and not to some group of politicians, just as I suspect that the real reason some politicians attack the press is that the press keeps insisting on being independent, tough-minded and professional.

And I guess that if by subscribing to these professional standards I am a convicted elitist ... well ... I'm proud of it.

Northville Unity Effort Provides Lesson To Others

Not so surprising was the decision last week of the Michigan Boundary Commission in favor of a single Northville community. The ruling came almost a year

The ruling means that the township is to be formally annexed to the city on March 31, 1973 unless citizens challenge it by petitioning for an election on annexation.

after petitions signed by 352

residents of the City of Northville

and Northville Township seeking

annexation were presented to the

To secure an election, petitioners must obtain valid signatures of 25 per cent of the registered voters in the city or the township or in both before 5 p.m. on March

Only if the 25 per cent requirement is met in both the city and the township will voters of both be permitted to cast ballots. Thus, it is possible an election could be held only in the city or only in the township.

THE COMMISSION ruling has more than a little interest in such communities as Plymouth, Canton Township, Farmington and even Livonia. Each is suffering growing pains, and this usually results in talk of expansion and annexation.

Especially is this true in Plymouth, where the city and township have been battling over the question of annexation for a good many years. Township officials have successfully held off such moves by holding elections every two or three years on the question of incorporating into a separate city.

What brings the annexation question more to mind is the fact that the Boundary Commission in its decision made note of the fact that unification of the city and township of Plymouth into a single city "is a distinct possibility."

Probably recognition of the Plymouth situation and its mention in the decision were due to the fact that Irving Rozian, of Plymouth Township, is a member of the commission. Rozian has long been an advocate of consolidation of the two communities, dating back to the time when he was a member of the Plymouth Township planning commission.

SHOULD PETITIONERS in Northville fail to get the required numbers of signatures to force an election, annexation would mean present township posts would be dissolved.

The present Northville city council would temporarily be responsible for governing the enlarged city. They and any other qualified residents of the city and township could seek the new city posts at the next council election.

It is the fact that township officials would lose their posts which has brought so much opposition to annexation in Plymouth.

There are several lucrative positions that are being duplicated in the city, such as: supervisor, clerk, treasurer, public works director, director of the water department and fire department chief.

By the same token, there isn't any reason to believe that outstanding township officials couldn't run and be elected to the same posts in a new city government.

THERE ARE SEVERAL things in favor of annexation or consolidation, things that residents of both communities should give more than a casual glance.

A pressing matter in the township is adequate police protection, which isn't all that true today. The city has an excellent police force, a good communication system, a well organized patrol system. It wouldn't cost that much more to expand the force to give coverage to the township and city areas.

The same is true of the fire department. Each community has a well organized group of firefighters. Each could be placed under a single head without a great deal of stress.

If annexation takes place in Northville, then it should be considered in Plymouth. It was considered in Farmington, and there is some talk of extending the Plymouth school system to include all of Canton Township or of making Canton a separate system. All of these matters are bound to come up in the near future, and folks should prepare themselves now to make the proper decisions at the polls.

Suburbs Need Chunk Of County

From the White House down to township halls, public officials are taking up the cry of 'making government more responsive to the people."

President Nixon is trying to accomplish this with revenue sharing so that cities and townships can have more money available to do what their constituents want done.

Mayors and township supervisors are trying to bring municipal services closer and to the people.

NOW IS the time for Wayne County commissioners to do the same.

For some time, we have urged an expansion of county services in the western Wayne County area where about half of the county's population is located.

There are a number of good reasons for the county leaders to build a complex of buildings to house services which affect the suburbs.

The first would be a branch of the county clerk's office so that couples getting married or persons having business to transact with the office could avoid the 1½-two hour trip downtown to get a slip of paper signed.

ANOTHER would be establishment of circuit courts in a suburban outpost so that western Wayne County attorneys wouldn't have to take up their clients time and money in driving downtown to handle a 15-minute chore in the circuit court offices.

This suggestion has been proposed but dropped for the moment.

Wayne County has a majority of its offices in the suburbs, but they are spread out for the convenience of no one.

Since the county has its own financial problems and the board of commissioners doesn't want to buy new land when it already has property, the 320-acre site in Westland would be an ideal spot to try something new in county government.

That would be to make the county services more visible and available to the people paying the bill.

ONE OF the hangups in a proposed complex of county buildings in the suburbs-particularly Westland-- is potential opposition to a new jail.

Most of this is emotional, with residents fearing a mass jailbreak or uprising a few yards from their front doors.

They may not realize that the sheriff's department road patrol office in Westland has a lockup for 70 persons and there have been no escapes.

County commissioners have promised that any new jail-regardless of its location-would have tight security.

If the jail and its related law enforcement services, such as a circuit court, are eventually located in the suburbs, local policemen will be saving considerable time spent in driving downtown to testify or in trans-

porting a prisoner to the county jail.

IF THE jail and/or courts are built in the suburbs, it would trigger private development of nearby law offices, restaurants and other commercial uses which are used by the people who work in the court building.

That would generate more property taxes for Westland (or nearby Wayne or Inkster) to use for local programs and services.

All in all, a county service center on county-owned land in Westland would go a long way in bring the present nearly invisible county government closer to the people.

That's a good way to start the new year.

Sense And Nonsense

Is there a movement to change the name of Schoolcraft Community College to Livonia CC now that Livonians have succeeded in filling all major posts on the board of trustees?

Ordinarily one would think that trustees would give some thought to having someone in the board offices from one or two of the other five school districts backing the college. These include Plymouth, Garden City, Clarenceville and Northville.

But such wasn't the case. Livonians were elected to the chairman, vice chairman and treasurer posts.

Joseph T. Brezze., the Farmington Township attorney who likes authoritarian governments and hates a free flow of public information, responded to an editorial critical of sections governing public meetings and public records of a proposed city charter.

"We recognize the continuing crusade of your newspaper to abolish any kind of executive session by any governmental board and to obtain access to any kind of record whatsoever. You have carried on this crusade against the school district, the city council, the township board,

Perhaps it might be wise to point out to trustees that Livonia may have the largest population and give the college more financial support than any one of the other communities, but band the four together and the story could be different.

One suspected that Livonia would take over once the trustees were selected on an at-large basis. It hasn't taken that long,

Perhaps the Livonians do have the most experience, but it doesn't alter the fact that four other communities are financial backers and should have representation in the executive posts.

community college trustees, etc. and etc."

Foul! In the first place, we have never been as whole-hog as Brennan maintains. In the second place, our moderate campaign has been "for" the public, not "against" government.

Finally, we remind Brennan, other lawyers and elected public officials of our repeated question: How can a legislative body hold an "executive" session? Until we get a reply, we can only conclude that "executive" is a dishonest euphemism for "secret" or "sneak."

These pay lower rents than the \$115 single and \$125 double charged by Trinity and the \$101 to \$155 range in Baptist Manor. The difference in rent is federally subsidized. Otherwise, the two complexes are self-sustaining financially, though non-profit.

Both draw residents from all over the Detroit area. A wide mixture of religious beliefs are represented.

Trinity Park has onebedroom apartments with overhanging roofs that provide a patio. There are open spaces for grass and flowers between the apartments, and a large community room for social gatherings and occasional hymn-sings.

Baptist Manor provides studio or one- or two-bedroom apartments. Besides space for social gatherings, there is a ceramics room, a sewing room and even a wellequipped tool room.

"One of our gentlemen brought the tools with him and spends a great deal of his time here," Rev. Bogar said. "Others are able to use them, too, if they demonstrate their competence in that area."



Student Boosts Work Of Center

Women on the Go

A little boy who sits listlessly in his classroom instead of doing his school work is of special interest to Farmington's Julie Hovanesian these days.

He's one of many youngsters she has helped test in the University of Detroit's Children's Psychodiagnostic Center, where she does volunteer work as she trains to be a school psychologist.

Mrs. Hovanesian, working toward a second master's degree at U-D after 12 years as a teacher at just about every grade level, is finding this aspect of work with children increasing in fascination.

She currently is serving a sort of internship-1,000 hours' volunteer service in the field of school psychology-before being state approved to work in that area.

HER VOLUNTEER time is divided between Southfield schools and the Children's Psychodiagnostic Center--and she thinks more parents should know more about this agency located at 16185 Petoskey in Detroit.

The center, for a fee of \$35, will give a full battery of tests to a child who for some reason is having problems in school that are difficult to define.

"Many parents notice problems exist for the child in some phase of the school experience," she said, "but they do not know that the early

Enjoy **Oysters All Year**

Great piles of oyster shells found along shorelines by the early settlers were evidence that coastal Indians enjoyed this seafood in large quantities.

Today, oysters are more popular than ever, and the old superstition of eating oysters only in the "R" months long has been disproved. Oysters are good to eat any time they are available.

FORTUNATELY for oyster fanciers, they can be enjoyed year around, thanks to modern freezing and canning processes. They are also available fresh, shucked, and ready to use with no waste.

The meat of the oyster is an excellent source of protein, minerals and vitamins, and they are easily digested. Because of the high mineral content, oysters are often recommended by doctors for patients with anemia.

To retain the oyster's delicate flavor and tender texture, never overcook. Oysters should be cooked just long enough to heat through so they will remain plump and tender. A good rule is to cook just until the edges curl.

Oyster mushroom stew, a National Marine Fisheries Service recipe, has all the goodness of the traditional oyster stew but with a modern touch.

1 can (101/2 oz.) cream of mushroom soup

2 c. oyster liquid and milk 1/4 c. butter or margarine 12 t. salt

1 T. sherry Paprika

Thaw frozen oysters. Drain oysters and reserve liquor. Combine all ingredients except oysters and sherry in three - quart saucepan. Heat, stirring occasionally. Add oysters. Heat three to five minutes longer, or until edges of oysters begin to curl. Add sherry. Sprinkle with paprika. Makes six servings.

OYSTERS SAUTE 8 T. butter

1/4 c. finely chopped onion 1 t. dried tarragon 1/4 c. dry wine

Salt and pepper 24 oysters Crisp buttered toast 1/4 c. finely chopped parsley

Melt the butter in a skillet. Add the chopped onion and saute until the onion is just soft. Add the tarragon, wine, and salt and pepper to taste. Add the oysters and cook just long enough to curl the edges, shaking the pan from side to side to bathe all the oysters in the sauce. Serve on toast and sprinkle with parsley. Serve with a dry white wine. Serves four to six.

2 slices halibut about 1-inch

1/8 t. pepper

2 T. lemon juice

Wipe fish. Place one piece in a lightly buttered casserole. Cover with oyster stuffing. Top with a second slice of fish and sprinkle with salt, pepper and lemon juice. Pour wine over fish. Bake in a 375 to 400 degree oven for 30 minutes. This is excellent for a buffet
