

The station has a listening radius of 15 miles, according to Jeffrey Cardinal, the station's assistant general manager. He estimates the immediate listening potential at 35,000 and a maximum of about 150,000 "if we're lucky and have a good day.

"We're known to have been heard as far as Telegraph and Eight Mile," Cardinal said, "and we come in particularly well in Northville. We also have gone to North Territorial and I-23

# 8 Plymouth **Seniors Make Merit Finals**

Eight Plymouth High School seniors have achieved the country's most prestigious scholastic honor by being named finalists in the National Merit Scholarship awards.

Five of the winners are young men: Thomas Hastings, John Hopfner, William Vargo, Brad Weage and Greg Wellman.

The young women winners are Christine M. Brzezinski, Mary A. McLennan and Gail L. Van

They are among 14,000 finalists nationwide from whom 1,000 will be selected for one-time \$1,000 scholarships and about 2,000 renewable scholarships.

The five young men already have been offered \$1,500 scholarships, renewable for four years, at Northern Michigan University.

'Based on your outstanding achievement in the National Merit Scholarship competition, you are ranked among the top students in the State of Michigan," Robert Pecotte, NMU's financial aids director, wrote.

"You would certainly be an asset to Northern's continuing efforts to improve the quality of its student body."

# Madonna Offer Vets Programs

As a result of recent amendments to the G.I. Bill increasing education benefits, veterans can now avail themselves of a "scholarship" worth about \$2,000 annually to attend the college or training program of their choice.

Veterans now enrolling in a full-time program at Madonna College, a coeducational institution in Livonia, will receive educational benefits of \$220 monthly. Veterans with dependents receive higher allowances.

All programs at Madonna College are fully approved by the Veterans Administration. The average cost of tuition for one year of full-time study is \$1,000, or \$35 per semester hour. Therefore, veterans in a full-time program would have more than \$1,000 remaining for living expenses. Madonna offers veterans additional financial aid, including loans and work-study programs.

Situated on 49 acres at 36600 Schoolcraft in Livonia, Madonna College offers degree programs for veterans in more than 20 majors. In addition to one, two and four-year programs in liberal arts, occupational and professional programs, continuing education is also available.

Veterans can enroll in professional education programs, which include criminal justice, radiologic technology, medical technology, nursing, social welfare, teacher education, fire protection technology, pre-law, pre-medicine and others. Nine two-year programs in allied health fields are offered.

Madonna gives veterans equivalency credit for education obtained while in military service and up to six hours credit for service experience.

Veterans are eligible for VA educational benefits if they have served at least 181 days of continuous active duty, any part of which occurred after Jan. 31, 1955, or were released from active duty after Jan. 31, 1955 for a service-connected disability. Service must have been terminated under conditions other than dishonorable.

townships. Eldridge said the center would be better located within Canton Township where it could serve "as the nucleus for a town center for the community of Canton."

The planner also criticized a market analysis study prepared on the Moceri Project as "overstating" retail potential and retail dollars available in the market area.

"In conclusion," Eldridge's report said, "We feel that the site is best suited for a planned neighborhood development without any land set aside for commercial use.





# Shelf-Wall Enhances Informal Dining Area



### 'You Didn't **Get Fat** Yesterday'

By ELLY

Fad diets come and fad diets go, but the "The Adjustable Diet Cook Book" by Suzy Chapin suggests gourmet dishes with a limit of 600 calories a day.

Mrs. Chapin says. "You didn't get fat yesterday." so it follows, excess weight cannot be lost overnight.

She has prepared menus and recipes for each of the four seasons, taking advantage of in - season foods. There are six weeks of menus in each section.

Non - dieters in the family can enjoy the same foods simply by doubling or tripling the amount, or by adding to the menus.

For instance, a chart at the front of the book has suggestions for additions. with calories listed.

Add a toasted English muffin and a tablespoon of butter to your breakfast menu -- the muffin adds 150 calories and the butter, 50.

A bran muffin would add 100 calories, a bagel, 110. Two strips of broiled bacon has 95 calories.

Two saltines eaten with soup or salad at lunch adds 34 calories. Two martinis, on the rocks before dinner can account for 200 calories.

For example, here is a winter menu with 593 calories for the day, including 59 calories in snacks:

Salt, peper and MSG to taste Heat the oil in a large. heavy skillet or wok. Saute the garlic, water chestnuts. bamboo shoots, chives and carrot over low heat for 15 minutes. Add the chicken bouillon with water and cook for five minutes. Blend the cornstarch with the sov sauce to dissolve and stir in the skillet. Stir vigorously and cook slowly until thickened. Add the lobster meat and stir into the sauce until heated through. Season to taste.

Mrs. Chapin stresses that you should take multiple vitamins with minerals when dieting. Check with your doctor about using artificial sweetener.

Serve over steamed rice.

"If he says go ahead, step up your intake of vitamin C. That is why whenever I say lemon, even in tea. don't skip it. Lemon contains vitamin C." she writes.

"The food you eat must be high in nutritional quality."

The Farmington study group will continue its work, and I say "Godspeed," since it's by imaginative thinking of this sort that the taxpayers can get a better educational product for their tax dollars.

MY CANDIDATE FOR most confusing issue dealing with the schools this year is the Governor's education-fiscal reform package, which seems to be embodied in part in a revision of the state aid to school formula.

Coming to us pre-packaged with terms like "equal yield formula," "SEV per pupil," "mill equalization," and the like, it seems to be an attempt to equalize within limits the amount of money spent per pupil between all districts in the state.

Some school districts in this area -- Southfield and South Redford notably - look as though

they will lose state aid under this formula, while others – Garden City and Livonia, for example – probably will get more.

Problem is that even the bright guys over in the local school administrative offices can't tell me the answer to the following questions: 1) If the new formula is passed, exactly how much state aid will be lost (gained) by the district? 2) To exactly what extent will local taxpayers have to make up the difference (get a tax reduction) if the formula passes?

Until these questions can be answered clearly and precisely, I don't really see how the state legislature can vote on the new formula that no one seems really to understand.

THE NOTION behind the new formula is praiseworthy, in addition to being legally necessary, now that the state Supreme Court has ruled that it's unconstitutional to have such widely differing per pupil expenditures from district to district through the state.

The basic problem is that as long as local taxes play an impor-

tant role in school financing, and as long as there is a big variation between districts in the value property within them, there will continue to be built-in inequalities.

Consider this range: Garden City schools have \$10,386 in state equalized value of property behind every child in district


schools; Livonia has \$22,374; Plymouth has \$28,374; South Redford has \$38,102; and Dearborn has a princely \$49,599.

You don't have to be an accounting genius to see that with such differences in the value of property from district to district, property taxes to pay for educa-

tion are going to wind up unequal.

Any step away from that is a good one, but I just wish someone — a legislator, a school official, or someone in the governor's office — would tell the public in simple language just what it's gonna do to his pocketbook.

### About Time For Action

A recent story in the Observer Newspapers told of the Western Wayne - Oakland County Board of Realtors adopting a non - discrimination policy for the sale and rental of housing.

Very big of them.

Now that open housing, which prohibits the sale or rental of housing on the basis of race, religion or national origin, has been the law of the land (not from a real estate point of view) for more than four years it's nice of the suburban real estate group to go along with the law.

The foot dragging of the formal adoption of the policy after a fight in opposing it during the summer of 1968 shows once again that the real estate profession (or is it business?) has blown another chance to provide leadership in its own ball park.

The real estate board's announcement prompts two immediate reactions: amazement and a sense of hypocrisy.

The amazement comes from a public endorsement of a state and federal law on the books for more than four years.

If the realtors wanted to be super sure of something before taking a public stand, isn't it about time they as a group endorsed the 10 commandments. Or how about the bill of rights or the social security bill of 1935?

The sense of hypocrisy comes from the persistent efforts of some realtors to circumvent the spirit and the letter of the 1968 open housing laws.

It was just a year ago this writer heard a suburban real estate salesman steer away white customers from the integrated community of Inkster.

Since it happened with two separate realty firms within a short period of time, the sequence of events gives one the obvious marression that they must have been following their own formalized "code of ethics."

The code apparently stipulates that black families are to be persuaded, subtly if at all possible, to stay away from predominantly white subdivisions — which means all communities outside of Detroit.

What the lack of action by the real estate profession means is that someone else -- such as the state or federal government -- will step in and tell it what to do instead of allowing it to act in its own sweet time.

In the meantime, maybe the real estate board in suburban Detroit can think up another goodie to publicly support – such

as the Lord's Prayer or the principle of free enterprise.

# Some Boards Will Never Learn

The ugly head of secret meetings, often described as "executive" sessions, has cropped out again, this time by members of the Livonia dominated Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees.

Just to justify the words "Livenia dominated," it might be smart to enumerate the members and the communities they represent.

From Livonia come: Chairman Jack LaRue, Vice Chairman Mrs. Rosina Raymond, Treasurer Paul Kadish, Erwin Brown and recently appointed Nancie Blatt. Then there are: Lee Bennett, of Northville Township who teaches in the Livonia school system; Floyd Kehrl, recently appointed from Northville Township; and Arch Vallier of Plymouth.

Thus, it doesn't take a lot of counting to see that five of the eight are from Livonia and a sixth resides in Northville Township but earns his living in Livonia.

Perhaps the board doesn't realize it, and perhaps members don't give a hoot, but there is a movement to have secret meetings barred, and fewer and fewer governmental units are calling such sessions.

The matter of "executive" meetings reached a high spot in Flint, where the daily newspaper took the matter to court and won a ruling declaring such meetings illegal.

The court decision is being appealed but as of this moment the Flint City Council is restrained from barring the press or public from meetings.

The point at hand is that the Schoolcraft College board called a meeting a week ago after receiving recommendations from President C. Nelson Grote a night earlier about proposed changes in administration and the addition of at least two more positions.

Nowhere in Dr. Grote's

recommendation was a name mentioned, nowhere was there anything that could be construed as being of the nature of a complaint about the performance of any individual.

Observer Newspapers Inc. reporters who cover all open meetings of the board were unable to find anything in the recommendation that couldn't have been discussed openly.

Be that as it may, the Observer reporters were told the meeting was an "executive session" and they would not be admitted.

It has always been our thought that official actions could not be taken by any governmental board in a secret or "executive" session.

Perhaps the college trustees feel they operate under a differ-

ent code, or perhaps they just feel the public should be informed of only the things the board believes the public is interested in.

Out of the "secret" session came word the board informed the president to hold the line on administration and keep the total to the current level of 31.

Dr. Grote's recommendations were his first since becoming president in June 1971. As president he has the power to rearrange the administration to a structure suitable to him without getting board approval. Any increases in the number of administrative posts have to be funded and approved by the board.

We agree that a board has a right to an "executive" session when discussing personnel

matters which involve individuals and personalities ... these are matters that should be discussed privately. But we can't agree with a policy of closing the doors to the press and public in such a fashion as last week.

We reiterate ... there was nothing in the recommendations that identified individuals by name. There was no reason for secrecy unless some board members wanted to take off on the president for his recommendations and didn't have enough fortitude to do it publicly.

We have stated again and again that there are few reasons for closed sessions, and most certainly the actions of the board in this instance were strange and entirely out of line, to say the least.

# Big Test Ahead For Plymouth

When Fred L. Yockey officially walks into his office in Plymouth City Hall tomorrow morning, it will be the beginning of a test for the elected Plymouth officials and their appointed administrators.

The test will measure whether the criticism leveled against the city commissioners in past about interfering with the administration of city business is valid.

Yockey, who becomes Plymouth's \$26,000 a year city manager tomorrow, is described as a "strong" manager by himself, by Mayor James McKeon and by those who watched him in Midland.

His appointment here will be a test for the commissioners to stay out of the city hall except for policy - making meetings.

In the cases of the two previous Plymouth City Managers, Norman M. Gaffney and Richard Blodgett, (both of whom were strong administrators), a feeling of rivalry seemed apparent when the commissioners stepped into administrating city business.

The commissioners on the other hand say that they had to step in because of inadequacies in administration.

Now this will be a test.

Yockey was fired from his position as Midland City Manager (which paid \$30,000 annually) on Jan. 22.

The reasons given by the three city councilmen who voted for his ouster were "philosophical differences," but a later editorial in the Midland Daily News hints at other problems — ones which

may strike close to Yockey's new home.

"Such councilmen (those who voted to fire Yockey) ought to know the difference between policy and administration," the Midland News editorial said a week ago. "They must realize their role is to set policy and that they are prohibited from trying to run city departments. Administration is the function of the city manager."

Is Yockey jumping out of the frying pan and into the fire?

Only time will tell.

But if the past is repeated again, the people of Plymouth will have many questions to be answered by the city commission.

One in particular might be, "Why not let the people you hire to run the city's business do it?"







# School Busing Called 'Irrelevant'

Can funds from the new gasoline tax hike allocated to the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority be used for cross - district busing of school children?

to our mission. SEMTA General Manager Thomas Lipscomb said in reply to the question from Garden City Mayor James Lowe.

SEMTA is the agency in this six-county region designated to receive a half-cent of the new two - cent tax hike under the public transportation clause of the law.

"Our service is to the general public, through individual fares," said Lipscomb. "You can't get school busing under that."

Moreover, general public buses cost three or four times as much as school buses because they must travel 350.000 in a 10-year life while school buses travel only 60.000 miles in the same time.

Finally, said Lipscomb. SEMTA's general public buses could hardly be used to transport school children because students must travel during almost the same 'peak' hours as their working parents.

Lipscomb added that neither he nor the nine member SEMTA board had taken a position on the Detroit - suburbs school desegregation case decided by Judge Stephen Roth and now before the U.S. Court of Appeals.

# 'Liberation Is Not Imitation'

By MARGARET MILLER

Women will not find liberation by imitating men. although centuries of thinking have suggested this is the only way.

The idea comes from Dr. Margaret Maxey. University of Detroit faculty member. former nun and articulate advocate of a different sort of liberation for her sex.

"The key is affirming one's own self - value." she told the opening session of a self start clinic at the Northwest YWCA. Her topic was "Women: Imitaters or Initiators?

"Women have been told long enough what to do, what to be," she declared. "We should think of ourselves as neither inferior, superior or equal to men. Let's get rid of

"Every woman must assume she already has the power to define her identity. I'm going to be a woman as no one else has been."

Dr. Maxey said she has not become affiliated with liberation movements because "I think there's a silent majority of women who have another kind of liberation in mind.

"They are the ones who can't buy the idea that man is the standard, or norm, for being, but they refused to compete with men because they sense instinctively of child abuse cases should there's far more to true tell us that "for some women, liberation.

But to find it, Dr. Maxey said, women must combat "four myths that the Judeo -Christian culture has visited upon them."

She added that, considering the disparity between salaries for men and women in like circumstances, it comes out that "women place themselves in the marriage market for economic survival.

The myth of motherhood, Dr. Maxey said, involves the idea that "since women are biologically equipped for giving birth, they are therefore psychologically and emotionally endowed."

"It holds that all little girls will grow up to be mothers," she added. "They play with dolls, and get the mistaken impression that babies are like dolls, inert and passive."

Jennie Zingelmann was born in the village of Farmington in 1876. "Pa was working for the post office then," she said.


Moving to the farm when she was three, she attended elementary grades at the Noble School, which later became the Farmington school district's special education headquarters and office home to Mrs. Briggs.
