An ordinance that would give police the authority to close city parks will be recommended to the Plymouth City Commission Monday night.

The proposal, which is a revised version of a controversial ordinance proposed last summer to control city parks, will recommend that police be allowed to close the parks in the event of emergency.

The original proposed ordinance drew unfavorable reaction from several city residents and from the city's Human Relations Commission (HRC). About 100 persons appeared at the Aug. 7 city commission meeting to oppose the ordinance.

According to Police Chief Timothy Ford, who asked for the original ordinance, vandalism and rowdiness had posed an unusual burden on the police force last summer and the ordinance was needed to allow police to control the parks.

But since the original ordinance was recommended, the city learned that a recodification of its ordinances, authorized almost six years ago, was finally complete.

When the updating and

reclassifying of the ordinances was complete, City Atty. Charles Lowe said, it was discovered that the existing ordinances covered all the areas the police felt were needed except the authority to close down the park.

"There's a lot of things in here (the new city code revision) that I wasn't aware of and a lot of things even today that I'm not aware of because I've never had occasion to sit down and read them (the revised ordinances)," Lowe said.

### Canton To Name Trustee Monday

Who will be appointed to Canton's Board of Trustees to fill the unexpired term of Ray Deeds?

That question will be resolved at a special meeting Monday, March 5.

The board had 45 days to make the appointment according to the township charter--and Monday is the last possible day the board has to name a replacement for Deeds, who resigned when he moved from the township.

While township officials are not commenting on any of the candidates for the post, it's been reported that "several interviews" have been held.

But while the ordinances were being updated, the Human Relations Commission was holding hearings and meetings to study the original ordinance.

At the city commission meeting on Feb. 19, members of the HRC presented their report on the park ordinance as it had been originally proposed and it was only then that they learned the recodification had made the original park ordinance unnecessary.

Some members of the HRC were obviously miffed that

they hadn't been told of the change in what the city was going to consider.

But, said Norman Thoburn, chairman of the HRC, "I don't feel the ordinance was particularly important."

"The underlying causes were really our business and whether or not we'd been had was not important," Thoburn said.

The commission is continuing its study of the park situation, particularly in light of the city's recreation program and the communications problem between youth and their elders in the park, Thoburn said.

He added that commission members are "unanimous in feeling uneasy about" the park closing power for police.

Lowe said that under the proposal he was submitting Monday night the police would be required to submit a written report about any action taken to close the park.

He added that he was not going to make a recommendation for a park curfew, which the original ordinance proposal contained and which is not contained in the present ordinance.

"I don't like curfews," Ford said.

## Girls Get New Role In Sports

High School sports used to be the boys' domain.

Not so any more.

While four years ago girls' athletics meant field hockey, synchronized swimming and softball, the age of women's liberation has meant a change in how many girls participate in sports and what their interests are.

John Sandmann, Plymouth schools athletic director, said this change has been felt locally as well as around the country.

AWARENESS OF women's sports has grown considerably in the past few years, Sandmann said.

"It started with basketball interscholastically about three or four years ago, and now includes swimming and tennis in the fall, volleyball and basketball in the winter and track and field in the spring," he said.

"Girls interscholastic athletics is one of the fastest growing programs in our setup," Sandmann said.

In that period, Plymouth added four girls' sports. Meanwhile, one boys' sport -- wrestling -- was added, he said.

Sandmann said interest in girls' sports is nothing new.

Thirty to 40 years ago there was a great interest in girls interscholastic activities, but it waned 20 to 25 years ago and is only just now being rekindled, he said.

MUCH OF THE move throughout the country to provide more comprehensive sports programs for women has come on the heels of court decisions favoring women's rights to participate in sports that had been male domains.

But, Sandmann stressed, "Although we can fill the legal obligation (locally), it doesn't mean it's a sound program."

"I don't think we basically are denying their rights, but we hadn't been fulfilling their needs -- their educational needs," the athletic director said.

Implementing a comprehensive girls' athletic program can't be done overnight.

Several factors enter in, Sandmann said, including the following:

- Need for more qualified girls' sport coaches.
- Need for more trained officials for girls' sports.
- Need for more emphasis on girls' athletics at the higher education level to provide more women athletic teachers with coaching backgrounds.

THE VARSITY GIRLS basketball team at the high school this year is coached by a woman and a man -- "and you might add, on an equal basis," Sandmann said.

And while men are now allowed to coach girls' teams, "we still would like the women to teach them," the athletic director said.

A lot of what the girls' sports programs offers locally, he added, depends on the state and conference views.

This year there are state meets for girls swimming, tennis, track and gymnastics and next year there may be a girls' basketball tournament, he said.

Right now the schools' athletic program within the curriculum framework places equal emphasis on boys' and girls' sports -- having the same physical education requirements, same number of teachers and basically the same course offerings, Sandmann said.

This includes several co-ed classes. Sandmann said the interest in improving the girls' program centers basically on the extra-curricular activities. One problem there -- particularly when the two high schools split their teams next year -- will be the sharing of facilities.

"What we're trying to do is maintain the boys' program while implementing the girls' program," he said. "If we're going to do it, I don't want to cut one group or the other out. That's not going ahead."

But those who want increased athletic opportunities for girls say the boys' program gets more emphasis and subsequently more money.

"We're in the process of building a girls' athletic program, and anything you're comparing now is a little premature," Sandmann said.

# How State Police Help Townships

The problem of adequate law enforcement in Plymouth and Canton Townships has been lessened since last fall when Michigan State Police opened a Plymouth sub-post.

That, according to Lt. Robert H. Robertson of the State Police 2nd District Headquarters, is because of 11 troopers assigned to the Plymouth sub-post have as their "primary responsibility" the coverage of unincorporated areas.

Robertson, who spoke at the last Plymouth Township board meeting on the State Police role in township law enforcement, said the Plymouth sub-post is the only one of its kind in the state.

Presently located in the former Plymouth school board office, 1024 S. Mill, the sub-post and the State Police crime lab housed there, are scheduled to be moved to a location on Seven Mile next to Northville State Hospital after a new facility is built there. The target date of that facility's completion is the summer of 1974.

"We find many people don't really understand the State Police and what their functions are—particularly in the metropolitan area," Robertson said.

He cautioned area residents not to think the Plymouth sub-post was located here purely for Plymouth Township.

The troopers, he explained, are assigned to cover townships where law enforcement is not a local service. The troopers from the Plymouth sub-post cover Plymouth Township, the northern portion of Canton Township (the regular patrol area goes south to Ford

Road), Northville Township and part of Novi Township.

According to Robertson, the men are not assigned to cities although "if they're traveling through cities and they see something happen, they'll act."

The State Police don't handle just "big" crimes, Robertson said.

"We will handle any type of complaint that comes in—from kids stealing watermelons, to homicides, to a suspicious car on your street."

"It was for the people out here that we opened the Plymouth sub-post," Robertson told the Plymouth Township board which has been considering different methods of supplying more police protection for its residents.

Presently the sub-post is manned by eight troopers, a sergeant, a detective and a juvenile officer. Another trooper will be added to the post soon.

That staff handles about 160-170 complaints a month and writes an average of 280 traffic tickets a month. The number of arrests vary.

The sub-post is open from 7 a.m. to 5 or 6 p.m. daily, but a trooper based from there is on patrol in the area at all times, Robertson said.

That patrol car can be reached by calling the State Police Plymouth phone

number 24 hours a day, he said.

In response to a question of whether township residents should call the Wayne County Sheriff Road Patrol or the State Police when they need help, Robertson smiled.

"I don't know," he said.

"We're proud of our organization and we feel we can take care of the problems in Plymouth Township but I'm sure the Road Patrol feels the same way."

Robertson said the State Police and the Road Patrol

would be meeting soon to discuss ways of coordinating their services in the area.

But, the lieutenant said, the State Police do offer more help through their local sub-post.

"It's a new, modern concept of the State Police to

open a sub-post in a community to provide local police protection.

"Police protection is a big thing to the communities and a costly thing to the communities. That's why we opened this sub-post."

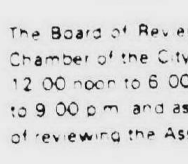

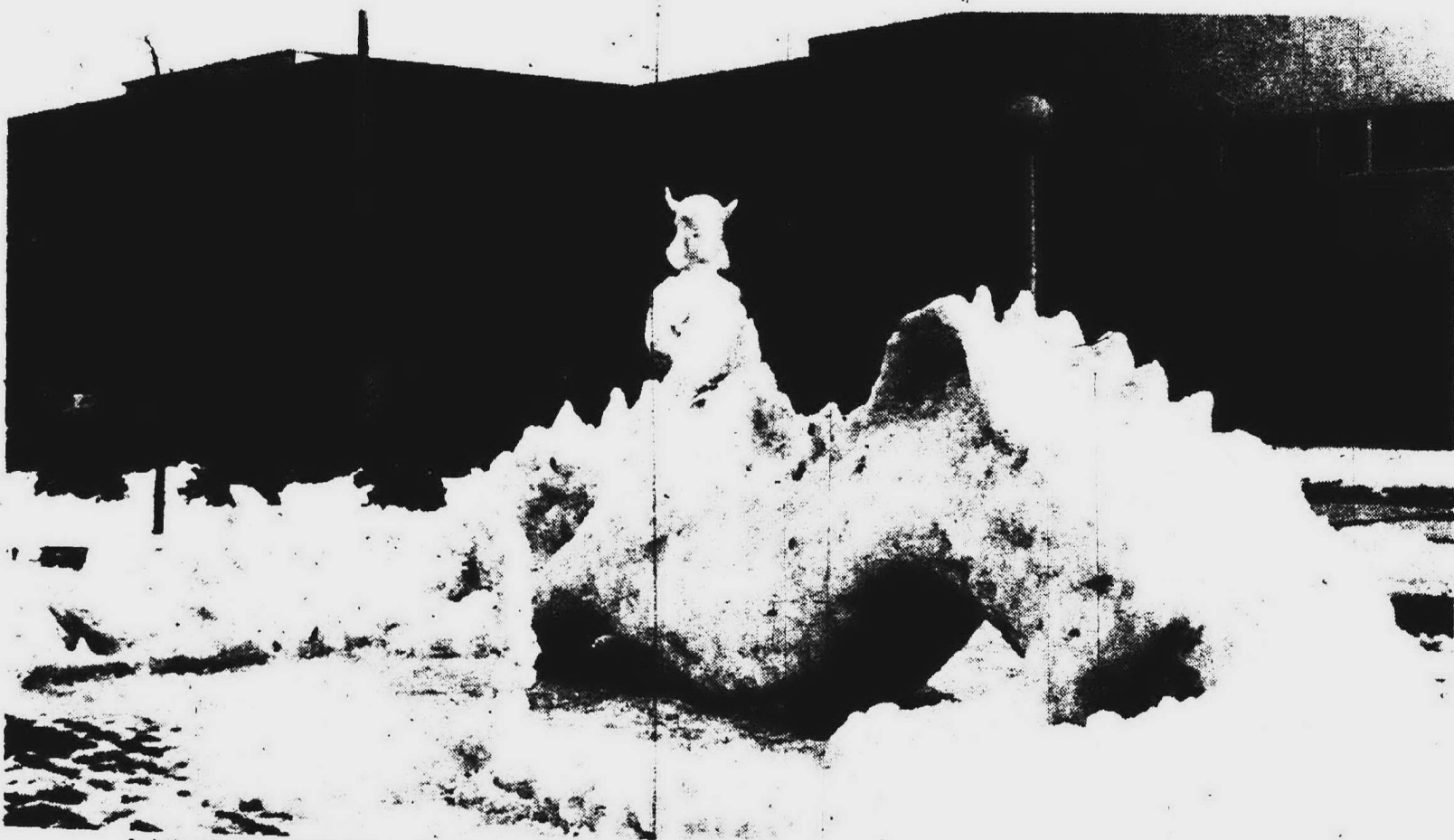

# School Board Moves To Change Boundary

**PLYMOUTH**  
A step toward resolving a boundary problem between the Plymouth and Northville School Districts has been taken by the Plymouth Board of Education.

The Plymouth board resolved to annex a portion of Salem Township south of Five Mile on the west side of Napier Rd. following the recommendation of its legal counsel.

Before the area is officially

added to the school district, Northville's board must adopt a similar resolution and public meetings must be held by the intermediate school districts for Wayne, Oakland and Washtenaw Counties.

Seven houses are involved in the action: M.A. Laughbam, 6845 Napier; L.R. Evans, (no address listed); E.F. Trombley, 6875 Napier; Jim Arnold, 6970 Napier; Edward Terry, 7025 Napier; Donald Mysona, 7105 Napier; and a house at 7105 Napier. The boundary shifts northwest to include the houses.

The houses were previously considered part of the Plymouth School District until Mr. and Mrs. Terry attempted to vote in the Dec. 11 millage election.

An election clerk found a mixup and the Terry's were notified that they actually belong to the Northville School District.

The Terrys had moved into the house in August thinking they would remain in Plymouth schools since the previous owners had sent their children to Plymouth schools.

Once the error was discovered, the Terrys were notified it would cost \$1,700 in tuition to keep their three children in Plymouth schools. The resolution to solve the tangle was drawn up by attorney John Thomas for approval by Plymouth and Northville as well as the three county intermediate school districts.

Public hearings will be scheduled before adoption by the intermediate districts.

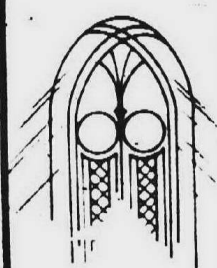

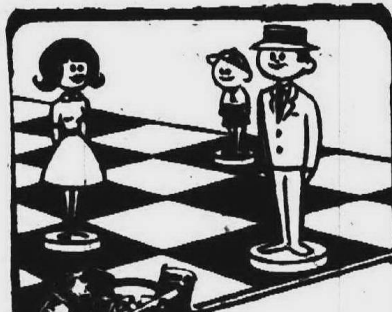

## Turf Tips, Quips

Herb Tyner and Bernie Hartman, the Southfield partners who purchased Hazel Park race track last fall, won't have to wait long to learn if their \$14.5 million gamble is going to pay off.

That's what they paid for the racing plant and they're gambling they can make a go of the suburban track in the face of national declines in attendance and wagering.

It will be recalled that Hazel Park and the Detroit Race Course had their poorest seasons in years in 1972. Thus all track goers will be watching the progress of Hazel Park closely.

The east side plant opens the thoroughbred racing season next Friday, March 9 for 121 days ending on Saturday, July 28.

Tyner and Hartman already have won one gamble. They ordered the track stripped down to the base and a new racing strip installed. All appeared fine until it was learned the new composition hadn't knitted as expected and all was a muddy, sticky mess.

So the partners ordered the job done right and informed horsemen the track would be available for workouts on Feb. 27. It took a lot of doing but the strip was ready for horses on that day. Whether it will stay together during the thaws and the usual spring rains is something else but Hazel Park has a racing strip and horses are using it.

Tyner and Hartman may not be experts in rebuilding tracks but they do know what people like ... accommodations that are clean, attractive and comfortable. During the winter the entire Hazel Park grandstand has been cleaned and painted, additional heating units installed and new, brighter lighting fixtures ordered in.

Present plans call for the track to present nine races on opening day and eight races each weekday through Friday, April 13.

Then beginning on Monday, April 16, the program will be extended to nine races daily with 10 on Saturdays and holidays.

"By then, the worst weather will have passed," said Director of Racing Bud Sears, "and stables shipping in from Louisiana, Florida and Arkansas will be here. We will have 10 races each Saturday and holiday from opening day with trifecta

betting on the third and last races each day."

In addition to the two trifectas, Hazel Park will have the daily double on the first two races and three perfectas, making a total of six gimmicks.

"We believe the most important are the trifectas," explained Sears. "After seeing the way wagering dropped at Northville Downs after the track dropped the trifectas which were so popular at the Jackson meeting there, we knew that we had to give folks what they wanted. It's apparent that they like the trifectas more than any of the other gimmicks."

Hazel Park will have a post time of 3:20 p.m. daily and a 2:10 p.m. post on Saturdays and holidays.

While Hazel Park is busy getting ready for the opening of the thoroughbred activities in Michigan, Wolverine Raceway on the west side of metropolitan Detroit in Livonia is equally as busy with its plans for opening night on Thursday, March 15.

The track crew had to clear the big mile strip of snow for three straight days last week and now faces the battle of the thaw in getting it in top shape for the first of 82 nightly programs.

"We put in the surface for the harness racing meeting last December," said Track Supt. Jim McPhee. "We have tested it several times in the past few weeks and believe it has wintered well."

"The big test comes when the spring thaws start and we hope they begin real quick. As things stand, we hope to have a good racing strip for opening night and know it will become faster and faster as the season progresses."

Clayton Smith, retiring paddock judge who is still handling stall reservations and the barn area, has plans to admit horses next weekend and then open the track for workouts on Monday or Tuesday of that same week.

"We had more than 2,100 applications this year," said Smith. "That's the most ever at Wolverine where we can handle as many as 1,300 horses in the barn area."

Smith has been working with Ray Magee, assistant to Racing Secretary Bill Connors, sending out confirmations of stall allotments to horsemen everywhere.

"We have word that some of the stables will arrive next Saturday and Sunday," stated Smith. "Most will be shipping in from Windsor and many from Northville Downs. We probably won't have all of the horses on the grounds until later in the week but the place surely will be buzzing by Monday."

Connors, currently handling the meet at Pompano Park in Florida, is expected to check in on Sunday and take charge of the drawings for the opening night program next Monday.

Then things will start to settle down for the 82-night season that Vice President and General Manager Richard Wilson believes will better all of the marks set a year ago in the record making meeting.

H.T. Pilot, the five-year-old star of the Grove Stimer stable of Parma, Mich., has sights set on a fourth straight victory in the featured \$3,000 Saline Pace Saturday night at Northville Downs.

The son of Henry T. Adios suddenly reached top form for the first time during the winter racing and shows six wins in eight starts with a second and third.

Contrast this to his record of 1972 when he picked up a scant \$80 to boost his lifetime bankroll to \$1,105. Thus far this year H.T. Pilot has banked more than \$7,000.

It was this sudden peak performance that caused Racing Secretary Tom Smith to move the big bay horse to the preferred class and he hasn't been a bit sorry. The pacer has done nothing but win since.

The competition is a bit more difficult this time since Tricky Dale, speedy ace of the Bob Kalish stable of Southfield, returns to the races after a month's rest.

Tricky Dale may need a race but if he is in top form after the layoff, then he could well end H.T. Pilot's streak.

Others among the six starters are: Erianas Valley, runnerup to H.T. in his three wins; Apparition Hal, victor in three of his last four starts; Knox Abbe and Johnny G.

The Saturday feature is listed as the ninth race on the program with post time for the first at 8 p.m.

be headed and finished 33 of 64 from the field for 52 percent. Farmington wound up 30 of 71 from the floor for 42 percent.

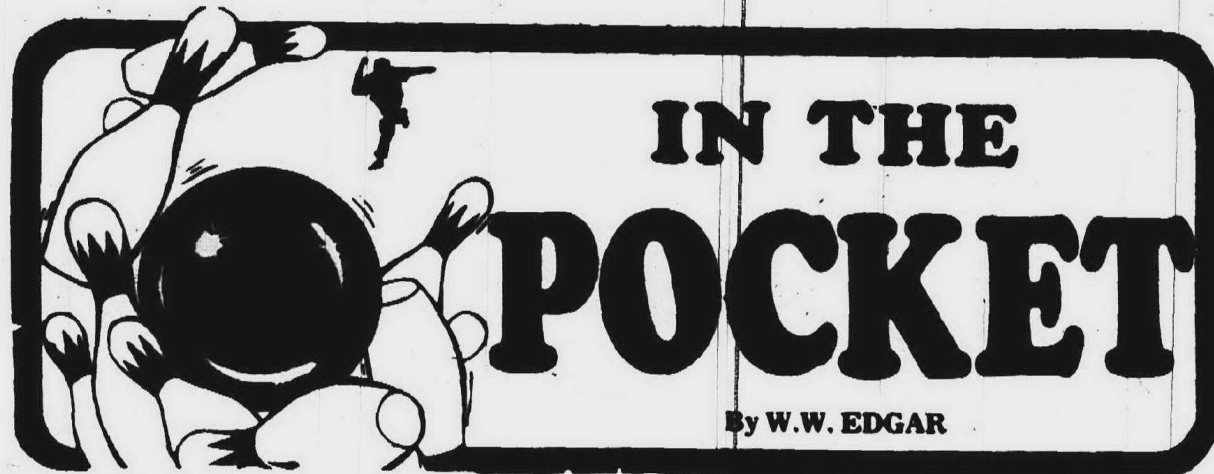
Franklin was called for only 11 fouls and the Falcons made good only two of six at the line.

# Sunglasses Do A Lot More Than Keep Out The Sun

For Spring and for every other season, sunglasses are in as a fashion item.

And what you do with your sunglasses may reveal more of what you are as a person than you know.

Sunglasses worn on top of the hair can mean that you are very concerned with your "image" or merely that you purchased glasses which are too big and that slide down your nose when worn normally.

Those who wear sunglasses slung across their foreheads may feel they are pace-setters for the fashionable look or that four eyes would really become them better than the two they have.

For the sunglass twirler, the world is a busy bustling place and he must be a part of it—even when holding his sunglasses. And for the sunglass holder whose temple is bitten and chewed beyond recognition, well he just doesn't get enough to eat.

The traditionalist who buys sunglasses to wear over his eyes may be a conformist type, but it is he who will reap the benefits of the variety of new features, shapes and colors which mark sunglasses for the spring.

One of the newest features in sunglasses are lenses which self-adjust so that they turn a dark grey in full sunlight and a lighter grey on a cloudy day or when worn indoors.

They are able to do this because of a special chemical embedded in the glass which reacts to ultra-violet rays. This photochromic property never wears out, in fact its efficiency increases with continuous use.

Lenses come in a variety of colors, but certain shades offer varying degrees of protection from the sun's rays, according to our glass manufacturers.

But shape is probably the main feature which you will look for when you buy your sunglasses. And the shape of your face and features should be the determining factor in the shape of your sunglasses.

If you have an OVAL-SHAPED FACE with regular features, you probably can wear almost any sunglasses style whether flamboyant or conservative. Keep in mind, however, that the frames you select should suit the shape of your eyebrows. If eyebrows tend to be low they should not be hidden behind huge sunglasses.

The OBLONG-SHAPED FACE gains width by wearing sunglasses with soft, upturned lines that extend beyond the broadest part of the

face. These designs are also good for keeping out the city grime that seems to collect on a woman's eyelashes. For extra long eyelashes, choose a convex lens, which allows for "flattering space."

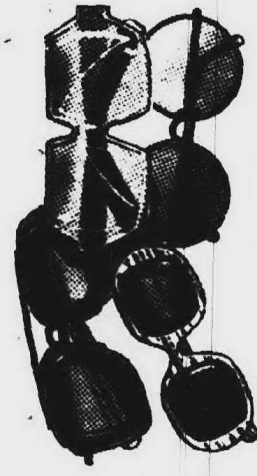

The ROUND OR FULL FACE finds a most flattering focus in large octagonal, square or sweeping wrap-arounds. Wrap-around sunglasses are most effective for general sun protection and provide a total wind and glare shield. They are especially useful for contact lens wearers who beware of flying particles of soot and other irritating foreign bodies.

Belts and watch bands may also be featured.

Speaking of the "pants movement" in general, Mercer believes "it's something that will get stronger before it gets weaker." And he feels his store is versatile enough that if men start wearing skirts, "we'll carry skirts even if we have to change our name."
