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# Board Gives In, Won't Split Band For Next Year

The battle of the bands is over at least for a year.

The Plymouth High School marching band will be continued as a single unit through the 1973-74 school year, combining musicians from both the Salem and Canton buildings. It will appear at football games of both schools.

This was the unanimous decision reached Tuesday by the Plymouth Board of Education at the recommendation of the school administration.

Unlike a previous board meeting when concerned band members, friends and relatives jammed the session site, the multi-purpose room at Bird School Tuesday was only half-filled with spectators.

They did not lack in interest, however. At the recommendation of one parent, the matter of the band was moved up to top item in the agenda.

A Plymouth High junior, Phil Star, addressed the board, presenting a case for keeping the band intact.

"The band's morale would be hurt if it was split," the student said.

"It would also hurt instrumentation of the band if it were broken up. One band might end up, for example, with just one trombone player or one trumpet player."

He said there would be no seniors in the Canton group if the bands were split. All seniors-to-be, who will be in the graduating class of 1974, already have been assigned to the Salem building.

"It's the seniors who set the pace for the marching band's routines," said Star. In concluding his speech, the youth said,

"There is no logical reason for splitting the band."

The recommendation adopted by the board says:

"It is the recommendation of the administration that the marching band be allowed to continue as a single unit through school year 1973-74."

"And that additional music personnel -- an instrumental music man -- be hired to assist James Griffith with the marching band, but his job description will be that of an instructor who will work toward the development of separate concert and symphony bands for the new building."

"These concert and symphony bands will be com-

bined to present concerts to the parents. The function of this additional instructor would be to work in a team-teaching situation with Griffith to produce the most effective music program at the park site.

"It is also felt that the vocal music program should follow the same direction and that the orchestra would remain as a singular unit until such time as numbers dictate the splitting of the program into two separate units."

Opposition to the band split was fanned following the group's appearance on national television at the Tournament of Roses Parade New Year's Day.

Griffith had presented a memo to the school board in January citing numerous reasons for not splitting the band.

These included scheduling difficulties and financial situations that would prohibit two separate programs.

He said that \$90,000 would be needed for additional uniforms, instruments, library materials and two more instructors.

Griffith added that "tradition of the band, which at-

# Car Restoration Wins National Award

Studebaker Special Six and was on his way to national acclaim.

It started when the Studebaker was named grand champion in a field of 150 cars in the recent antique car show at Greenfield Village.

"THIS WAS for the vintage cars in the years from 1916 to 1925," he explained, "and it was a real thrill to step up and receive the cup."

Inspired by this triumph, he entered his cars in the antique car convention in Texas several weeks ago and his 1929 Stearns-Knight, an eight cylinder car, took the top prize in the "Best Owner Restored Class."

"There are only eight Stearns-Knight cars left," he said, "and it was a lot of fun restoring this one. It took me about three years -- but it was worth it."

He is especially proud of the Stearns-Knight because he made some of the parts for the restoration job. He confided that he had built the brass carburetor after he was dissatisfied with one he had purchased. He also made the water covers and spun the tail lights.

Besides the Studebaker and the Stearns-Knight, he now is working on two others -- a 1931 Studebaker president and a 1916 Overland.

Asked if he was preparing them for sale, he said he wasn't planning on parting with any of them -- that after he sold the "Tin Lizzie" to the Upjohn family in Kalamazoo several years ago he decided to keep the others.

BORN AND RAISED in Plymouth, Bob, now 47 years old, is a graduate of the Plymouth High School and has owned his own heating business for some time.

As he tells of his antique cars, he also reveals that the old home on Mill Street, that was his birth place, has been torn down. He now lives with his wife and four daughters at 9110 Rocker St.

As he looks around the museum building these winter afternoons, there is a gleam in his eye and for a good reason.

He's anxious to show his handiwork -- the restored cars that brought national acclaim -- to the home town folks and he has his eye on just the right spot.

# Township OKs Budget With 8-10% Raises

Raises of eight to 10 per cent for elected and appointed officials were included in the 1973-74 Plymouth Township budget passed unanimously Tuesday night.

In the general operating budget, which represents an over-all 6.1 per cent increase, the following raises were included:

• Supervisor J.D. McLaren from \$16,450 to \$17,000 -- a 3.3 per cent increase.

• Clerk Helen Richardson from \$13,800 to \$15,000 -- an 8.7 per cent increase.

• Treasurer Elizabeth Holmes from \$13,650 to \$15,000 -- a 9.9 per cent increase.

• Fire Chief James Gignac from \$13,500 to \$14,750 -- a 9.3 per cent increase.

• DPW Director Joe Bida from \$13,100 to \$14,500 -- an increase of 10.7 per cent. In addition Bida will continue to be paid \$900 a year as the township's recreation director under terms of the new budget.

All of those officials -- except McLaren, who did not take office until November -- also received raises in the 1972-73 budget amounting to about four percent.

The 1973-74 budget also includes varying raises for township office workers.

The township board refused to reveal details of the proposed budget before the board had passed it. Copies of the budget were not re-

leased until after the "public hearing" and the board's unanimous action.

One question -- whether the budget included the federal shared revenue -- was asked during the public hearing. (Township officials had said previously that they would postpone their decision on spending the shared revenue.)

The increased costs in the budget will be paid through increased revenues realized through more building in the township, McLaren said.

The township's 1973-74 water and sewer budget was also passed unanimously Tuesday night.

It reflects an 18.5 per cent decrease from 1972-73 which is due to decreased water sales during the wet year last year, McLaren said.

# Canton Taps Padgett For Planning Seat

Robert M. Padgett, 33, former state president of the Michigan Jaycees and one of Michigan's "outstanding young men" of 1968, is the unanimous choice of the Canton Township Board to replace George Lawton on the township planning commission.

The appointment Tuesday returns the commission to its full complement of seven members. Joseph R. Kinick, 39, was named two weeks earlier to replace former Commissioner Lynn Wilson.

Padgett served on the Westland Planning Commission before returning to his Canton Township birthplace two years ago. He also led a successful campaign to make Westland city elections non-partisan.

He is a former board member of the Michigan Kidney Foundation and was a trustee and vice president of the now defunct Michigan Jaycee Foundation.

He served the Jaycees in a number of local and state offices, capped by the presidency in 1968-69.

He was chosen for Westland's distinguished service award in 1968 and is a recipient of a Ford Motor Co. Town Crier award for community service. He also has been active in Goodfellows and PTOs.

Padgett lives at 48236 Geddes Road and has four children, ranging in age from nine to 15. He is employed by Ford Motor Co. on a management level in data processing.

He recently returned to Wayne State University to complete work toward a degree.

Padgett compared Canton's spurring growth to that of Westland about 12 years ago and said that city "still is

suffering" from insufficient growth control at that time.

The new commissioner declined to express an immediate opinion on multiple housing or the township board's denial of a recommendation by the planning commission to rezone 110 acres in the northwest sector.

He said he couldn't "legitimately comment" until he had given "total study to all material at hand" on the propositions.

Both Lawton and Wilson reportedly resigned because of the board decisions to

### BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

A regular meeting of the Board of Education of the Plymouth Community School District, Wayne and Washtenaw Counties, Michigan, was held on Tuesday evening, February 27, 1973, in the multi-purpose room of Gallimore Elementary School, 8755 Sheldon Road, Plymouth, Michigan.

Mr. R. Philip Rodan presented slides illustrating the activities of the 1972 E.S.E.A. Title I summer camp and presented the commentary describing the camp activities.

The meeting was called to order by President Lawton at 8:25 p.m.

Present: Members Benson, Graves, Lawton, Ohio and Penar.

Absent: Members Berry and Minto.

Administrators present: Sup't. Hoben, Deputy Sup't. Hogan, Assistant Sup'ts. Blunk and Gibson, Admin. Assistant-Personnel Keen, Director Page, Supervisor Symonds, Assistant Director Masteller, Principal Dodson and Assistant Principal Brown.

Others present: John E. Thomas, Attorney; Kathy Moran, Plymouth Mail and Telephone; Mrs. Mack and Mrs. Tonda Safety Committee; and interested parents, school employees, students and citizens.

Additions to the agenda were called and made.

Member Graves was appointed Acting Secretary.

It was moved by Member Benson and seconded by Member Ohio to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of February 12, 1973, with the following corrections:

Page 3: The following sentences to be added following the words "President's proposal" in the last paragraph: "Member Ohio stated the importance of revenue sharing with other governmental units on traffic safety problems for the entire district. He called attention to the fact that the Superintendent had already moved toward this goal, citing the March 1, 1973, meeting as an example. Also, consideration is being given to placing mileage for safety purposes on the ballot at the June election."

Page 4: The vote on the motion at that time should indicate that Member Ohio voted "aye."

Ayes: Members Benson, Graves, Lawton, Ohio and Penar.

The motion was carried.

It was moved by Member Graves and seconded by Member Ohio to amend the minutes of the regular meeting held January 23, 1973, by making the following changes:

Page 5: PRECINCT NO. 1 Change: "Central Junior High School" to "Central Middle School."

Page 5: PRECINCT NO. 6 Add the words "and all territory of the school district located in Salem Township."

Ayes: Members Benson, Graves, Lawton, Ohio and Penar.

The motion was carried.

Suggestions from citizens were called. Mr. James Rossman expressed praise for the E.S.E.A. Title I summer camp program and the Continuing Education Recreation program. He questioned the Continuing Education Recreation expenditures for the 1971-72 fiscal year exceeding the Continuing Education Recreation receipts for the 1971-72 fiscal year by \$82,041. Also, he questioned the move of two relocatable classrooms to the Detroit House of Correction inquiring if they were moved, if they were being used and the cost to move the relocatable classrooms.

President Lawton requested Mr. Blunk to investigate and provide replies to Mr. Rossman's inquiries.

President Lawton declared a recess indicating that the Board of Education would reconvene at 9:00 p.m.

The Board of Education returned to regular session at 9:05 p.m. Member Penar absent from this time.

Sup't. Hoben replied to Mr. Rossman's inquiries stating that the transfer of the relocatable classrooms was one of a series of conditions agreed to between the administration of the Detroit House of Correction and the administration of the school district for the continued operation of Parker High School at Detroit.

Mr. Hoben indicated that the electrical work required was the responsibility of Detroit, that it had been done and that the relocatable classrooms were now being used.

Sup't. Hoben explained the shared use of school district vocational facilities with Northville, Livonia and Belleville School Districts.

It was moved by Member Graves and seconded by Member Ohio that the school district share the use of its vocational facilities with Northville, Livonia and Belleville School Districts.

Ayes: Members Benson, Graves, Lawton, Ohio and Penar.

The motion was carried.

Mrs. Mack representing the Safety Committee, presented a report of a meeting held February 28, 1973, for the purpose of reviewing school district safety problems with Mr. Brian Aronson and Mr. Russell Harrison of Wayne County.

Superintendent Hoben presented information relative to having the Plymouth Community School District join the Metropolitan Association for the purpose of gaining information regarding school legislation by joining other districts who have hired a lobbyist to represent them in Lansing.

It was moved by Member Graves and seconded by Member Ohio to approve out-of-state conventions for the following school district personnel:

Member Penar reentered the meeting.

Sup't. Hoben indicated that the Spencer-Ryan Plan and asked if the opinion of the local school district to reduce property tax by replacing not to exceed 13 mills with an income tax option was clearly understood. Mr. Hoben was directed to respond in the affirmative.

Superintendent Hoben announced that Schoolcraft College will have one proposal on the ballot for the June 11, 1973 election and will pay its pro rata share of election costs.

An analysis of the Goals and Objectives of the Plymouth Community School District as prepared by Mr. Ross Marshall, a Doctoral Student of Dr. Wendell Hough, was presented. Dr. Hough was requested to prepare a resolution commending Dr. Hough and his committee.

Deputy Sup't. Hogan reported on the progress made on the campaign for the election to be held June 11, 1973. The report presented a well-organized campaign requiring cooperation of all.

Summer school for 1973 was discussed. It was the consensus of opinion that the Plymouth Community School District should join together with neighboring school districts in order to present a stronger summer school program for all districts.

It was moved by Member Graves and seconded by Member Penar that the following resolution be approved:

WHEREAS it appears that some uncertainty has arisen as to the interpretation of school district boundaries between the Plymouth Community School District of Wayne and Washtenaw Counties and the Northville Public Schools for some residents in the Five Mile Road - Napier Road area; and

WHEREAS it would appear to be in the public interest to detach a land area south of Five Mile Road on both sides of Napier Road from the Northville

An extensive transportation study will be conducted in Plymouth School District, and a report will be issued on bus routes and related areas in late spring.

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH BY AMENDING THE ZONING MAP**

**THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:**

PART I. That the Township Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended by amending the Zoning Map by changing those areas indicated on the Amended Zoning Map, No. 67 attached hereto and made a part of this Ordinance.

PART II. CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED. Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, the School District Attorney has submitted a proposed Memorandum of Agreement creating a Recreation Authority and the Plymouth Community School District having duly and carefully considered the same;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Member Penar and support by Member Ohio, it is

RESOLVED by the Plymouth Community School District pursuant to Act No. 156 of the Public Acts of 1917, that this Board of Education does hereby approve and adopt the said Memorandum of Agreement creating a Recreation Authority to be known as the Plymouth-Canton Recreation Authority, and the Plymouth Community School District hereby agrees to execute a like Memorandum of Agreement by the appropriate bodies of the other parties to this agreement; and

FURTHER IT IS RESOLVED by the Plymouth Community School District Board of Education that the Secretary, Gary A. Mirto, is hereby directed to sign and execute said Memorandum of Agreement in behalf of the Plymouth Community School District.

**MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT**

This Agreement made this 27th day of February, 1973, is by and between the City of Plymouth, the Parts of the First Part, The Charter Township of Canton, the Parts of the Second Part, The Township of Plymouth, the Parts of the Third Part, and the Plymouth Community School District of Wayne and Washtenaw Counties, the Parts of the Fourth Part, all being municipal corporations located in the Southeastern portion of the State of Michigan.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the parties hereto recognize the need to have an area-wide and regional recreation authority to plan, structure and operate recreational facilities and programs within the territorial limits of all the parties hereto; and

WHEREAS, the said parties do further recognize that this purpose could better be accomplished through and by a joint and mutual effort between all of the parties hereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein contained and pursuant to Act No. 156 of the Public Acts of 1917, the parties hereto do agree as follows:

1. That a recreation authority be and is hereby created which shall be known as the Plymouth-Canton Recreation Authority.

2. That said Authority is hereby directed to plan, structure and operate facilities and programs within the territorial limits of all the parties hereto.

3. That said recreation authority shall be directed and governed by a Recreation Board consisting of nine (9) members. Each party to this Agreement shall appoint two (2) members to said Recreation Board. The ninth member of said Board shall be appointed on a rotating basis by the parties to this Agreement before mentioned. The Parties of the First Part shall make the first appointment of the said ninth member of the Board. All of the Board members who are first appointed pursuant to this Agreement shall serve until January 15, 1974. Thereafter, all Board members shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year.

4. That vacancies occurring on the Recreation Board shall be filled by that party to this Agreement which originally appointed the vacant member in the manner and the form as provided in paragraph 3 of this Agreement.

5. That said Recreation Board shall meet and organize within a reasonable time after its appointment and that it shall select one of its members Chairman and such other officers as it deems necessary. It is further understood that the Authority shall make every effort to be operational by May 30, 1973.

6. The said Recreation Board shall adopt By-Laws and other rules of procedure consonant with the provisions of this Agreement and provide thereon for regular meetings.

7. That said Recreation Authority is authorized to conduct its activities on: a.) property under its custody and management, b.) other public property, under the custody of other municipal corporations or boards, with the consent of such corporations or boards; and c.) private property with the consent of the owners.

Mr. J. Gray, inquired as to status of Tanager School principal position due to extended illness of the principal. He suggested that ninth grade counselors should give more guidance to parents as to whether students should enter a traditional or modular scheduling program. Mr. L. Pippin raised questions on his transportation problems on substitute teachers, qualifications and the necessity of language labs at Plymouth-Canton High School.

Supr. Hoben presented a membership and class size survey as of February 23 showing a total gain for K-12 of 75 students with total membership of 11,065. Approximately 1,000 new students are expected by Fall, 1973.

It was moved by Member Penar and seconded by Member Mirto to table the request for substitution leave for Dr. John Jacobs and Donald Frantz.

Liability for accidents involving student teachers was discussed and decision made to check with legal counsel for liability coverage, consensus being that any such injury or accident compensation is the responsibility of the school placing the student teacher.

It was moved by Member Mirto and seconded by Member Benson to approve recommendation of Principal Brown to allow consideration of orchestra trip to Midwest National Band and Orchestra Clinic in Columbus, Ohio, on March 23-25.

Supr. Hoben reported on his and Assistant Supr. Blunk's meetings in Lansing for purpose of discussion on tax status, payment of taxes to individuals and on the Napier Road boundary problem. He reported that they were assured that if a documented list of tax assessments with reduced RV could be provided to the State, the District would receive additional State Aid in the amount of \$75,000. In addition, Senator Purcell agreed to present enabling legislation to settle the Napier Road boundary.

Deputy Supr. Hogan presented a proposal for a transportation study to be conducted by outside sources, regarding scheduling, problems and costs which would allocate data processing setup, a study of contracted bus services, and a method to carry out maintenance to problems. He Hogan answered several questions raised by Board members.

It was moved by Member Penar and seconded by Member Mirto to approve the recommendation for a transportation study in the amount of \$1,000 for services as presented by said institution.

The Board expressed concern that parents of children moving into the area would be apprised of alternatives for adjustment during the school year to alleviate any crowded conditions.

It was moved by Member Mirto and seconded by Member Berry to adopt a resolution that the Safety Committee be made a permanent standing committee of the Board who would report to the Superintendent or an alternative administrative person to be designated by the Superintendent.

# Lenten Devotions Home-Grown

"Wishing to know the Lord's face, we must come to know ourselves. Within each person is the means to approach Him—desire and will. He must choose to do right, then exert his will in that direction."

"We do not lose biases, urges and destructive emotions. We have to overcome them."

"Sometimes God is my diary. Instead of writing down everything that happens to me, I tell God each night before I go to sleep. God is my confidant and I am sure he's not a squealer."

With words like these, members of Newburg United Methodist Church in Livonia have put a personal touch into Lenten devotions.

Daily reading of the Bible, together with a devotional passage and a prayer, is a time-honored custom many Christians try to follow, especially during the church season of Lent.

Many church publications are available to list suggested biblical reading and make a commentary for each day of Lent.

But instead of these, many Newburg members are using this year a 28-page mimeographed booklet that contains their own thoughts and scripture suggestions for the season.

The booklet, "Chords and Echoes of Devotion," was compiled early this year as 44 Newburg members, ranging in age from teen years to more than 80, contributed

their ideas for a daily devotional reading.

The Rev. William A. Ritter, Newburg pastor, commented in an introduction that the church's booklet lacks the "consistency and evenness" to be found in the professionally-produced devotional guides.

"An editor of a formal devotional booklet would not be able to sleep, worrying about how to organize the material into one coherent stream," he wrote.

"This is precisely what we have avoided doing. What follows reflects our congregation—its far from a coherent stream. Inside these pages we meet 44 people for whom the single unifying factor is that they all are part of the Newburg family."

The pages of "Chords and Echoes" definitely reflect a suburban congregation.

One busy couple, shared in the writing of a day's message:

"Why did we agree to be a part of this? We really don't have the time. Working all day, taking classes, doing extra jobs at night to help pay the bills, taking the kids to the school functions or their social activities, driving them to music lessons, attending choir practice, planning activities for the scout meeting, and don't forget the civic meeting and we must prepare our lessons for the Sunday School class."

"This is part of our schedule, but most of our friends have schedules that are just as busy."

"Our prayer, for all of us, is a simple one. Grant us the wisdom to make time in our busy schedule for the impor-



tant little things we have neglected in our lives. Help us make time to call a relative or a friend forgotten over the years or take time to mend a relationship with someone in the family who needs our attention.

"Give us strength to walk away from the television during prime time in the evening to stroll around the block and enjoy the fresh air and gaze at the stars. Move us to write that note we've been thinking about, because we know that person wants to hear from us."

"Now that we have finished, we're glad we took this time, because we're going to do these things and we hope you will too."

They recommended in the second chapter of the New Testament book of James, second to 10th verses.

One woman writer told a shocking story and she recommended that the congregation think again about familiar words in the sixth chapter of Micah.

"One afternoon during the winter, I was on my way home from church," she wrote, "and as I approached the intersection of Joy and Crown I heard the loud honking of an automobile horn. Thinking it must be a wedding party, I hurried toward the corner and saw

two cars speeding along Joy Road.

"In the first car there was a young black girl with a look of fright and terror on her face. In the second car—and it was this one which was blaring its horn—there were a group of men laughing as they sped along forcing her to go faster and faster, tormenting and frightening her more."

"They were not teen-agers, they looked like working men in their 20s or early 30s, and they were deliberately frightening the girl."

"I stood still in shock, my peaceful world crumbling as I thought of the fright of the young girl and the fact she might not be able to drive safely or carefully home."

"And I thought of the men who would go home and laugh about it to their family and of their children who would be listening and learning."

This writer's prayer began "Oh God, we crucify Thy son afresh each day."

One man in the congregation told in his contribution about starting a daily jogging schedule because a friend urged him to get back into shape. He then commented:

"My faith is the same as my running. I didn't come to believing or having faith by accident, but by the help of

others.... Like running, my faith has grown stronger and has helped me physically and mentally by my love of Jesus." His scripture suggestion was Psalm 98.

One Newburg member of more than 50 years' standing recommended the Hebrews passage that "faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things unseen" and told in simple words of her faith in country, home, children and her church.

She added: "I believe in today. It is all that I have. The past is of value only as it can make the life of today better and richer. There is no assurance of tomorrow. I must make the most of today."

A young mother recommended reading the 13th chapter of Corinthians I, saying she had found new meaning there when considering the best gifts she and her husband could give their daughter.

"So we are back to the beginning: the most meaningful and useful gift we can give," she wrote. "These three things last forever—faith, hope and love, but the greatest of these is love, for it brings the gifts of faith and hope. What more precious gift can there be for our daughter?"

"Go Forward in Prayer," "Go Forward in Missions," and "Go Forward in Evangelism" are the themes for the first three evenings.

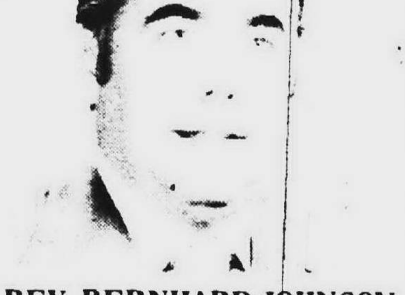
On Saturday, Rev. Johnson will put emphasis on youth and the evening will end with a rap session.

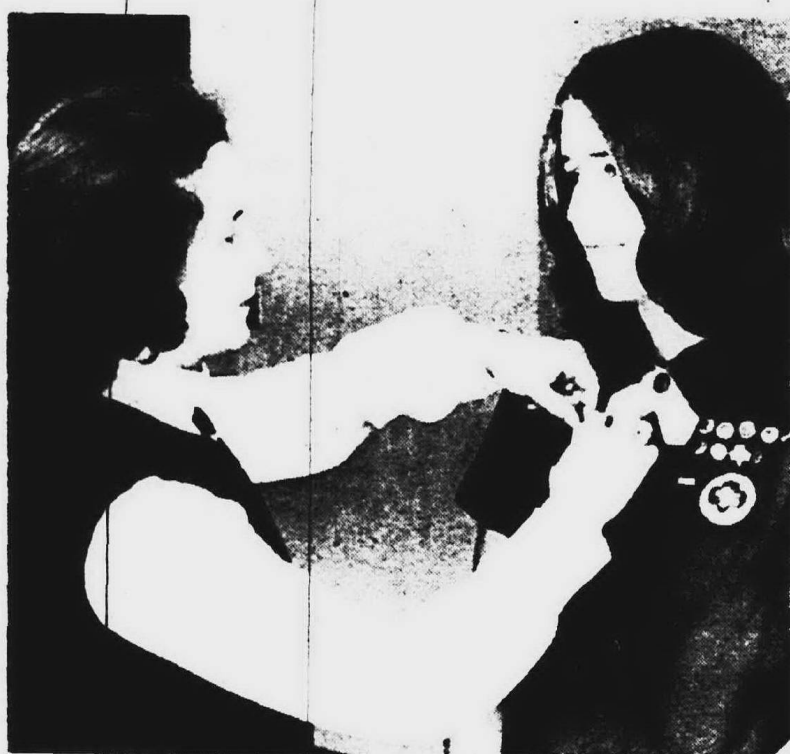
## 'I Am Way' Director Will Speak April 1

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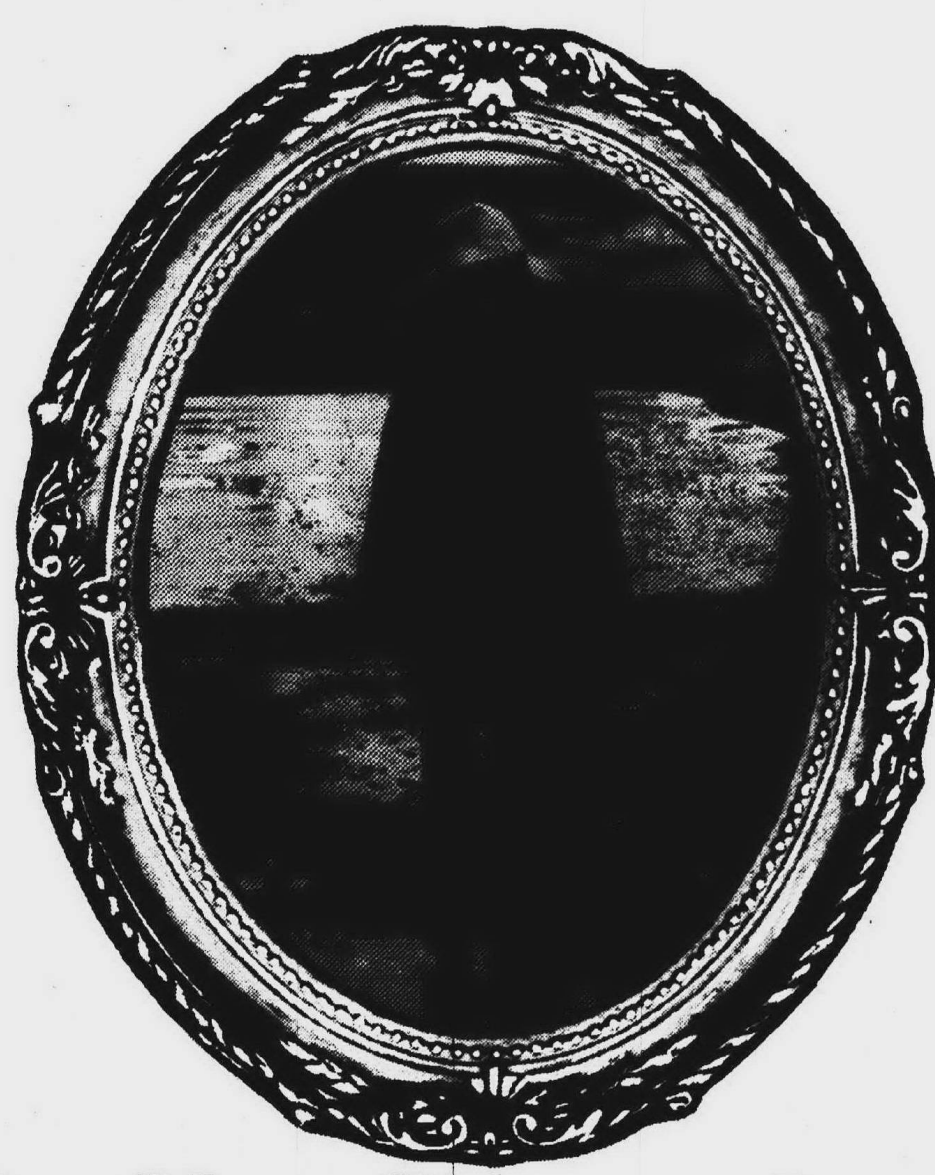
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## Turf Tips, Quips

Co-captained by James Doby and Andris Richters and with Gary Wilkinson in the nets, the Ripples scored 69 goals while holding their opponents to only six.

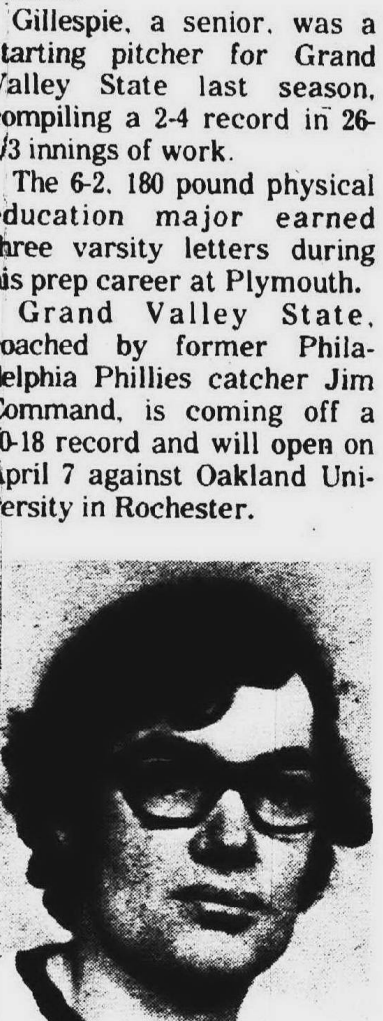

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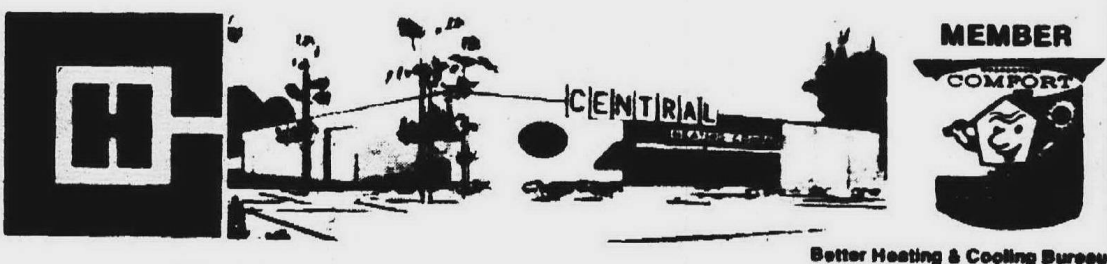
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# IN THE POCKET

It may be due to the fact this is an election year for Mayor Edward McNamara and some members of the Livonia City Council and then again it may be that those in charge of Whispering Willows golf club believe it will have a record year...but the fact is the course will open Sunday with no increase in greens fees.

This in spite of all pay-play links in the area boosting prices as much as 50 cents to 75 cents per round.

In announcing plans for the season, Pro Gary Whitener indicated the Parks and Recreation Commission had decided to follow the price schedule of 1972. Members may decide to review the program later in the year after seeing the response during the early weeks of the season.

The fees for residents -- (Monday through Friday) \$2.75 for nine holes and \$4 for 18 on week days; for Saturdays, Sundays and holidays -- \$3.25 for nine and \$5 for 18 holes.

For non-residents -- (Monday through Friday) \$3 for nine and \$4.50 for 18; (Saturday, Sunday and holidays) \$3.50 for nine and \$5.50 for 18.

Livonia residents must show identification of residency or they will be charged non-resident rates, according to Whitener.

Rates for resident senior citizens only -- (Monday through Friday) \$1 for nine and \$2 for 18 holes, all seniors must tee off before noon.

Twilight rates, effective after 6 p.m., are \$2 for residents and \$2.25 for non-residents.

"We are looking forward to our greatest season," said Whitener. "With daylight time effective as of the end of April, folks will have additional hour or two of daylight after 6 p.m. and we're looking for hundreds to take advantage of the twilight rates."

Starting times are in effect for the weekend and holidays for Livonia residents only. A charge of 25 cents per person will be made and a Livonian may reserve times for as many as four...but only by phone in advance. No times will be reserved for those stopping by the course and making a personal call.

Whitener will be assisted by Tom Sheldon in teaching and operation of the course. Martha Hochenberry will

handle reservations and sales. Two shop assistants will be added later in the season and will also serve as rangers.

A full line of merchandise will be available in the pro shop and lessons will be handled by Whitener and Sheldon. Instruction will cost \$7 with special rates for groups.

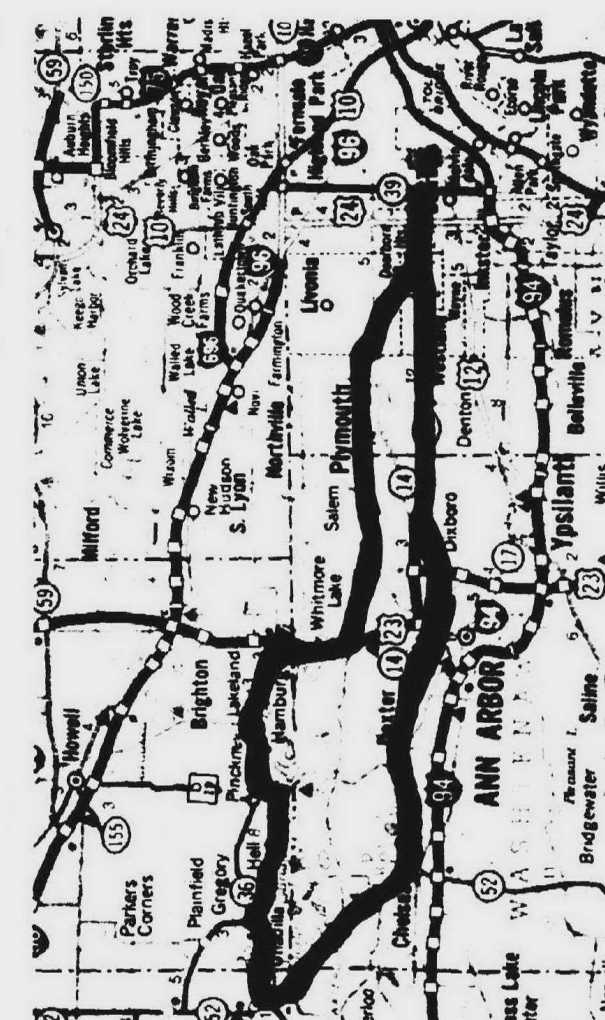
Perhaps summer is not vacation time for you.

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

# THREE AT A DUDE RANCH

TUCSON, ARIZONA --Have you thought of spending your summer vacation at a ranch?

Even if you are not a rider, you can become one as you relax into the ways of the west. With the proper attire--jeans, shirt and cowboy boots and a few days on horseback--nobody could tell you from a genuine wrangler--as long as you go no faster than a walk!

Actually, most of the Arizona ranches close up for the summer because of the intense heat, but the same kind of life style can be found at the more northern ranches of Colorado, Wyoming and Nevada. These ranches are for "dudes" and the whole orientation is to introduce you to the western style of living in the nicest possible way.

They differ from "working" ranches, some of which accept guests but make fewer special provisions for them.

A typical day on a dude ranch begins with a large and early breakfast so that you are well nourished for a morning ride. The children ride at a different time than the adults; both receive full attentions of the wranglers, who are real professionals. Very few missteps can be made by you or your horse that does not come within their scrutiny.

A session or two in the corral usually precedes going out on the trail--exciting for the scenery as well as the actual riding.

As your stay progresses, you will have the option of going on the fast ride when the constant cry of the wrangler is "Let's-lope along now." Loping is the western way of cantering. But if the most you want to do is a slow trot, you will have plenty of company on the slower rides.

After the ride, you are glad to head for the swimming pool where a few laps in the cooling water does a lot to take the dust out of your mouth and to relieve the soreness which just may have hit you as you got out of the saddle.

Lunch is often a buffet of cold cuts or a hot dog and hamburger barbecue served by the pool. Children and adults mingle together so that at the smaller ranches you may become one big and happy family.

A game of shuffleboard, horse-shoes, ping pong or for your little ones, a dig in the sand might follow your repast and precede the afternoon ride. Again, the children ride an hour before the adults, giving mom, dad and an assorted grand-ma or two, time for a snooze before their turn.

Plenty of free time before dinner which very often features a sizzling sirloin or prime ribs of beef with all the trimmings. The evening's entertainment is in keeping with the western environment --a square dance

one night, guitar-playing cowgirl the next, a rip roaring John Wayne movie another evening.

During the couple of free evenings a week, you might go miniature golfing, play cards or take the opportunity to do your laundry.

In general, people go to dude early--most have had an energetic day!

The routine is broken up a couple of times a week by a breakfast ride to a near-by canyon, or a luncheon ride to a not-so-nearby mountain. The younger children and non-riders drive by car to a scenic spot where the riders meet them and the nicest possible way.



time later. A complete breakfast of juice, pancakes, eggs, bacon, coffee and sweet rolls is fed to fifty or more hungry guests and wranglers in the middle of what has to be God's country.

It is not the kind of vacation for you, if all you want to do is lie in the sun or go nightclubbing. It is a great place to go with children. They have enough to do to keep them beautifully occupied and away from parents for part of the day.

Yet the sense of togetherness when the whole family participates in a ride to the mountains is something you can't duplicate by taking them to a movie or other non-participatory activity.

Ranches may vary in their names --Double U, T-Bar M, El Dorado, Tanke Verde. They vary somewhat in the activities they offer, the accommodations they provide and the prices they charge.

All are pretty nearly the same in the terms of the relaxing natural kind of atmosphere they provide where children can be children without having to adjust to the adult world; where adults can be themselves without having to dress up for other people or play roles they do not like; and where city folk like ourselves have a chance to explore the big, wide open west on horse-back and perhaps get some of the feeling of what our country used to be and what it can still become.

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# 2 Soloists To Highlight Concert

Mezzo-soprano Elsie Inselman and tenor Richard Miller will join the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra, directed by Wayne Dunlap, for its next concert.

This will be an event of Sunday, April 8, in Plymouth Salem High School, Canton Center and Joy Roads, beginning at 4 p.m.

Tickets are \$2 for adults and \$1 for students. They are now available at the Tape and Record Center, 770 Pennington; Saxton's Garden Center, 587 W. Ann Arbor Trail; or Heide's Flower Shop, 995 W. Ann Arbor Trail.

The soloists will be featured in Gustav Mahler's "The Song of the Earth," a gigantic song-cycle with or-

chestral accompaniment. Three of the songs are for a tenor soloist and three, for a contralto.

Miss Inselman, a native of North Dakota, recently made her debut with the Detroit Symphony, singing the role of LaAbuela in the concert performance of Falla's opera, "La Vida Breve." She has appeared with many area symphonies, and in Plymouth sang the mezzo-soprano role in the Verdi "Requiem."

A graduate of Concordia College, Moorhead, Minn., and the Eastman School of Music, Rochester, N.Y., where she received her master's degree and performers' certificate, she

studied in Frankfurt, Germany, under a Fulbright Scholarship.

Presently she is a member of the voice faculty at Wayne State University. She has appeared with the Detroit Overture to Opera and the Piccolo Opera Companies, as well as with companies in New York and Germany.

She was twice a district winner in the Metropolitan Opera auditions and was awarded the \$1,000 Elizabeth Hodges Donovan Scholarship by the Detroit Grand Opera Association.

Miller maintains an active performance schedule and is professor of singing at the Conservatory of Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio. For four

years he was a member of the Blossom Music Faculty, and this past summer he was a member of the faculty of the International Summer Academy, Salzburg, Austria.

He, too, was a Fulbright Award recipient and studied in Italy for a year. Following this, he was invited to become leading tenor with the Zurich (Switzerland) Stadttheater, and was there for four years.

In this country, he has appeared with opera companies in California, Texas and Ohio, as well as presenting concerts coast to coast.

He holds bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Michigan and a diploma di canto from the St. Cecilia Academy of Rome.

His successful Town Hall debut in New York City took place in 1967.

Mahler's work reflects his great love of nature, as well as his frequent preoccupation with the ideas of death. The text is from six poems written by the eighth century Chinese poet Li-Tai-Po, and thus some of the music has a certain oriental flavor.

The first song, "The Drinking Song of Earth's Sorrow," is perhaps the most dramatically-orchestrated of the six.

There is a great use of wind color and frequent climax and decline a la Wagner and Richard Strauss.

The second is one of intense loneliness and may be considered as the slow movement of the "symphony."

"Of Youth," the third song, is the happiest of the set, and here are found many of the suggestions of Chinese music.

This is followed by "Of Beauty," a sort of dance-like movement telling of maidens at play. This gives way to

the final contribution by the tenor soloist, "The Drunken One in Springtime," a song which does not tell of gay parties, but of drinking to escape the unhappiness of earth.

The final song is the longest and most melancholy. Here is summed up all of Mahler's feeling of world weariness.

Sunday's program will also include the Debussy Prelude, "The Afternoon of a Faun," and Divertimento from "The Fairy's Kiss" by Stravinsky.

## Schoolcraft Offers \$165 Music Awards
