

.45 Mill Tax Hike Included In Budget Proposed For City

The tentative budget proposed for the city of Plymouth's 1973-74 fiscal year contemplates a tax increase of 0.45 mills applied to the recent city-wide reassessment.

The proposed budget includes 5.5 per cent salary increases for all city emploves

According to City Manager Fred L. Yockey, who proposed the budget at Monday night's city commission meeting, a tax increase from 14.70 to 15.15 mills -- as well as some existing capital reserves - would be needed to balance the \$1,791,750 budget.

That increase would be applied against the city's total state equalized assessment which rose about \$6 million to \$76,700,000 in the city-wide reassessment and subsequent adjustments earlier this year.

This would mean an overall increase in revenues of about \$109,000 over last year. Yockey projected.

However, the projected budget shows a spending increase of \$198,000 with the additional \$89,000 coming from ac-

cumulated capital reserves of the city which were mostly realized during the 1972-73 fiscal year.

Under the city charter, the city commission must approve the budget by its first meeting in May. The fiscal year runs from July 1 through June 30.

Monday night the city commission set a public hearing on the budget for its May 7 meeting and set a study meeting on the budget for Tuesday. April 10.

The city commission may decide to change some items in the proposed

One such item may be the \$35,000 in fees for the planning consulting firm recently hired by the city which, under the proposed budget, would come from general operating funds.

The commission had said it would like to use federally shared revenue for the planning fees.

If the commission decides to pay that from the federal revenue sharing fund account - which is not spent under the proposed budget -- it could mean a decrease in the proposed budget by that amount.

If that amount were removed from the proposed budget, it would mean the contemplated tax increase would probably not be necessary since it would generate about \$34,000 based on the recent reassessment.

Among the proposed major expenditure increases are:

• \$64,000 for debt retirement including payments toward the Plymouth Community Cultural Center and the parking fund bonds.

• \$44,000 for the continuation of city employes hired under the federal Emergency Employment Act which runs out this year.

• The \$35,000 for the planners' fees. •\$30,500 for a general 5.5 per cent salary increase for all city employes.

According to Yockey, the contemplated .45 mill increase would put the city's total operating millage levy at 12.525, or roughly 212 mills below the 15-mill limitation defined by the city

In addition to that, there would be a 2.625 mill levy for debt retirement -making a total levy of 15.15 mills.

At that rate, a home with a state equalized valuation would be taxed \$303 for city operating and debt ex-

> The center, established in 1926 as a school for mildly retarded children, is located on a 750 acre campus. It has some 243 students and about 275 employees.

Dr. Joseph C. Denniston, deputy director of the State Department of Mental Health and the task force chairman. outlined the task force findings and recommendations at the start of the meeting.

"There is no question that small group living arrangements are the best program for the vast majority of children, than are individual large institutions where people are regimented and programmed in bulk," he stated.

He also said he is "strongly in favor of" the creation of a central agency to refer families with troubled children to the proper agencies for help, as recommended in the task force report.

Dr. Denniston said most children at the center are properly the responsibility of the state or, in the cases involving delinquency in a child with an IQ of over 70. of the courts.

Dr. Denniston was supported by Dr. Ray Lewis, director of the Detroit-Wayne County Community Mental Health Services Board.

"It is no longer true that the best treatment for disturbed children is in large. centralized, isolated institutions," Lewis stated. "It is our board's recommendation that the entire program be decentralized and that the children be placed in community-based facilities."

However, Dr. Lewis added that the state government "better put its money where its mouth is or it can't be done.

His agency is financed through 75 per cent state funds and 25 per cent county funds.

Samuel Davis, executive director of the Michigan Association for Emotionally Disturbed children, said small-group homes are "not feasible" for severly disturbed children.





Under the bill, South Redford's state aid will drop from \$34 per pupil to nothing from the state.

Southfield would drop from \$48 to \$17 per pupil but industrial expansion will boost local revenue from property taxes. Based on an average 7.5 per cent increase in SEV. Southfield's state and local aid per pupil will increase from \$1,072 to \$1,101 per pupil or more.

Pursell said that South Redford officials claim the district's SEV won't increase by 7.5 per cent but only by about three-quarters of one per cent. Consequently, the district won't gain additional revenue through increased local revenue.

Pursell said that a "grandfather" clause may be added to the bill to give South Redford some state aid next year. A meeting is being set up with school officials to discuss that possibility, he ad-

All other districts will experience an increase in state aid if the bill is approved ir its current form.

Pursell said state aid to Garden City will increase next year from \$507 per pupil to \$607 under the bill: Livonia from \$286-to \$343; Plymouth from \$190 to \$211; Redford Union from \$396 to \$485: Wayne Westland from \$412 to \$503; Farmington from \$313 to \$380 and Clarenceville from \$344 to \$424.

Based on a projected 7.5 per cent increase in SEV for each district, the bill will bring state aid and local funding to a total per pupil rate in Garden City from \$818 to \$925, Livonia from \$932 to \$1,002, Plymouth from \$957 to

A similar provision was vetoed out of last year's appropriations bill, but Pursell said he will "guarantee" that the \$150,000 provision will remain in this bill.

The bill includes provisions for the next two years including \$39 per pupil per mill for the first 25 mills levied in 1974-75 and \$40 per mill regardless of the levy in 1975-76.

Although the bill has been hailed as the first to look at long-range school financing. Pursell said he doesn't agree.

"I don't view it as a threeyear plan," he said. "People are still looking for property tax relief despite the defeat in November."

The tax relief proposal on the November ballot would have dropped property taxes for supporting schools and relied on the income tax to provide the funds.

A Hockey Glance Over The Ocean

I guess the extra long lunch breaks can still be as informative as a hidden "mike" on the pitcher's mound in the ninth inning with two outs and the bases loaded.

Bob Griffin, local sporting goods dealer, had just returned from a 12 day tour to Stockholm, Finland and Leningrad. Russia so I figured it was about time for one of those "extra long lunch breaks."

I couldn't have asked for three hours of more interesting straight talk from a man who is doing so much for sports in Livonia.

Koho Hockey Stick Co. in Forssa, Finland invited dealers from the United States and Canada to be its guests and observe hockey across the ocean and of course to look at its equipment.

"I was just tremendously impressed with the hockey facilities overseas," said Griffin. "And all players are treated like national heroes."

Bob's greatest thrill had to be the opportunity to get behind the Iron Curtain.

"We stayed in Leningrad two days and what a feeling of uneasiness for us," he said. "But we had the chance to see the Russian national team play Finland at the Yubilevnv Ice Palace which seats about 12,000."

At this time Bob shuffled over some colorful post cards of the palace which looked like something out of a Disneyland picture book.

"I couldn't get over how clean it was and of course there is no parking problem because there are hardly any cars.

"Here it was, two national teams playing and the people just didn't seem to show any emotion. They acted like they were all in limbo or something.

The Russians appeared intense but they sure didn't display it. "Except for when they scored a goal, they would

all stand up and applaud and sit back down. "The amazing thing I found was that before you got to your seat, there was a booth with a girl where you checked your coat. There was one of these for about every 100 people. So about some 12,000 people check their coats before entering the arena to watch

"Could you imagine checking your coat to watch a game at Olympia? You have a hard enough time keeping it with you when it's on your back.

There are no vendors in the Russian arena. with a small amount of refreshments sold in the corridors but nothing of an alcoholic nature," added

"You know, you just have to be impressed with their discipline. Even the players stay away from a violent aggressive style of hockey. In the two games I saw in Russia, I didn't see one stick broken.

'The Russians play like a well-oiled machine with limited body contact," added Griffin.

Bob stayed at the Astoria Hotel in Leningrad. the same site where Hitler had planned his victory party after a victory that never came.

Sight-seeing was on a limited basis with the guests told of a radius that they were not to cross so Griffin concentrated on the activities around the ice

The people are so intent on watching the game - there's just no other 'mickey mouse' stuff going on. You go to a game to observe and that's just the

way it is. Bob saw Russia beat Sweden, 5-1, and Finland,

"Now right across the border the entire situation was just the opposite," said Griffin.

"Everything was colorful in Finland. People are hockey crazy and aren't afraid to show it. Little kids even walk around with Boston Bruins jerseys."

The Observerland area was well represented in the Michigan high school state basketball championships at Ann Arbor's Crisler Arena last weekend.

A mis-worded statement, you say. True, Franklin did get upended in regional action, and Churchill and Westland John Glenn both were crushed in state quarter-final bids, each losing in regional finales.

But Observerland was still well represented, and what a job these area athletes did.

The Dearborn Divine Child Falcons captured the state Class B championship with a 58-54 victory over the Hudsonville Unity Christian Crusaders.

And three of the starting five of Divine Child are Livonia athletes, all juniors. Two of them could have been on the Churchill court and one on the Franklin

In fact, five of Divine Child's nine-man team are from Livonia which is fast becoming an important "feeder city" for parochial powers.

The Livonia "starting threesome" is composed of juniors Gary Forystek, Bob Wenson and Ed Kasparek.

Divine Child Coach Bill McCartney, who has compiled a 132-40 record in four years of coaching. also sported two other Livonia athletes in his sixth and seventh men in junior Dave Swoish and sophomore Jim Wenson, brother of starter Bob.

Churchill basketball Coach Pat Montagano and Franklin head mentor Bob Visser know just what they could have had.

Forystek is a 6-2, 189-pound, 16-year-old who attended St. Damians in Westland before making the jump to Divine Child.

In his sophomore stint, Gary was the seventh man on the Falcon court.

This season he averaged seven points a game and 10 rebounds. He scored six points and hauled in seven rebounds in the state finale over Hudsonville. Basketball is not Forystek's only prowess.

In two years of varsity football competition. Gary has tossed for 28 touchdowns, hit on 217 of 329 passes, was selected all-state Class B quarterback and Catholic All-American.

While in eighth grade at St. Damians, Gary once thought of going on to Franklin High but his father changed his thinking. It was on to Divine Child and now a state basketball crown.

Gary is also a shortstop on the baseball squad, and hit .270 his sophomore year.

Bob Wenson is a 6-3, 175-pound junior who attended St. Michaels school in Livonia.

The older of the two Wensons never gave it any thought to switch to the public school and Churchill High, where he would have gone. It was all Divine Child for Bob.

Bob averaged 14 points a game for Divine Child last year along with an average of 12 rebounds a

This year he averaged 17 points a game and scored 10 points in the championship clash against Hudsonville.

Ed Kasparek is another who could have gone to Churchill.

He also attended St. Michaels in Livonia before taking the Divine Child route.

Kasparek started in his sophomore season and averaged 10 points a game and upped his junior mark to 14 points a game, with 14 points in the Hudsonville victory.

The 16-year-old Livonian was another of all-state football acclaim, earning a berth on the Class B first team, catching 60 of Forystek's passes in two years.

Last season, with these three in their sophomore years. Divine Child piled up a 15-5 record which included the Double A Catholic championship.

Now in their junior stints, these starting three paced Divine Child to a 20-5 record and a Class B championship, the first state crown ever for the school which is in its 13th year.

Jim Wenson was the No. 7 man on this year's state champion, another ballplayer that Churchill could have had, and junior Dave Swoish was the No. 6 man, another roundballer Franklin might have

That's five of Divine Child's nine man roster from Livonia, five ball players who will again be wearing the Falcons uniform come the '73-'74 basketball season.

Amaryllis Moves Out For Summer

EAST LANSING Do you have a hippeastrum plant in your home? If you handle it properly, you can enjoy it for a long time, says August De Hertogh, Michigan State University horticulturist.

According to De Hertogh. this plant which is sometimes called amarvilis, should be planted outside after the last spring frost. Sink the entire plant, pot and all in welldrained soil in a sunny area. Remember these are sub-tropical plants.

De Hertogh recommends leaving your hippeastrum outdoors until early September before the first frost. Then take the plant inside and cut off its leaves at the nose of the bulb. Put the plant in a cool (50 degree F), dark area for six to eight weeks. Don't water it at all during this period.

When the time is up, place the plant in a warm, sunny spot in your house and start watering it again. Your plant will normally reflower during the winter months.

De Hertogh says that the hippeastrum can keep up this cycle for years.

Rhubarb--Harbinger Of Spring

By ELLY

The conversation had turned to crocus and hyacinths in bloom, budued tulips and forsythia ready to burst. All this was in spite of the late, heavy snowfall, the remnants of which still remained in blackening drifts.

"And my rhubarb is up that high." said one of the women, measuring a good six to eight inches with her

Now there was the true harbinger of spring. That first batch of rhubarb from the earth, barely frost free. is a promise of all that is to come.

Rhubarb is a native of northern Asia. Of the 25 species, some are grown as ornamentals, some for their medicinal properties.

Garden rhubarb, or "pie plant" should be pulled when young, not cut. It should be used as soon as possible, for it loses its sugar when it stands. Much of the flavor and color is in the skin so it should not be peeled unless very tough.

For sauce, wash and cut in two-inch lengths, sprinkle generously with sugar and let stand two hours. Boil only five minutes in its own juice. Never add water.

A small amount of rhubarb sauce can be "stretched" by making a fruit salad. Just add crushed pineapple and sliced bananas.

For the true rhubarb lover. there is nothing like a good rhubarb pie.

Most cook books have one or two recipes for rhubarb pie: but there is one that contains 17 prize - winning

This is the Blue Ribbon Cookbook of pies and pastries which contains the favorite recipes of home economic teachers.

There's a "Rhubarb-Cherry Pie" from Wisconsin, a "Sour Cream - Rhubarb Pie" from Oregon and a "Tangy Rhubarb Pie" from Arizona. Michigan's contribution is "Quality Rhubarb Pie" from

West Branch. This must be one of the best pie and pastry cook books ever published. Proceeds from the sale of the book aid home economics departments "to add needed, up-todate equipment and to support worthwhile projects within their schools and communities.

Two area teachers have recipes in the book. They are: Alice M. Crossette. O.E. Dunckel Junior High in Farmington. "Fluffy Peppermint Chiffon Pie: and Darlene Marohonic of Churchill High in Livonia. "Orange Layered Pie."

FRESH RHUBARB PIE

1 recipe 2-crust pie pastry 112 c. sugar 2 T. flour

3 eggs, well beaten 4 c. rhubarb, cut in 12-inch

pieces 112 T. butter

Roll out half the pastry: line nine-inch pan. Combine sugar and flour: mix well. Add eggs: blend thoroughly. Stir in rhubarb. Pour into pastry-lined pan: dot with butter. Roll out remaining pastry: cut into half-inch strips. Arrange over filling in lattice fashion. Flute edge. Bake at 400 degrees for 50 minutes or until crust is golden and rhubarb is tender.

FARM FRESH RHUBARB PIE

I recipe 2-crust pastry 3 c. diced rhubarb

1 c. sugar

2 T. cornstarch 1s t. salt

12 t. grated orange rind 2 T. butter

Roll out half the pastry; line nine-inch pie pan. Combine rhubarb with sugar. cornstarch, salt and orange rind; mix well. Pour into pastry-lined pan: dot with butter. Roll out remaining pastry; place over filling. Seal and flute edges: cut vents in top. Bake at 450 degrees for 10 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees. Bake 30 minutes longer or until crust is golden.



Cities Using Double Standards In Judging Movies?

The suburbs, led by Detroit, have gone on a rampage adopting anti - obscenity ordinances to curb undesirable, objectionable portrayal of sex in movies and

Pornography control ordinances have been adopted or revised in Southfield, Livonia, Redford, Garden City and Westland.

Oakland County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson has launched an anti-smut campaign, with the first thrust being banning of the movie "Deep Throat."

Garden City was an early pioneer in this field when a group of concerned citizens attempted to ban "Catcher in the Rye" and "To Kill a Mockingbird" from the school reading lists.

But, now all suburban municipalities are on the bandwagon. The distaste for "dirty" movies, it would seem, is more intense than the fear of cross-district busing.

There is a serious "prior restraint" civil libertarian issue at stake here, but the courts should be capable of reading the First Amendment even though suburban councilmen are unaware of what those protections mean.

Aside from the legal challenges which will soon arise, I suggest consideration ought to be given to the double - standard hypocrisy being practiced by city councils, the movie industry, the media, and movie-goers.

Although "Deep Throat" has been banned across the nation. and maligned by the media, the same attention hasn't been given "Last Tango in Paris" starring Marlon Brando. Indeed. "Last Tango" has received cover-story treatment from Time and Newsweek and over articulate reviews from the New York Times.

I'm against "Ottawa" ever since I read about how Pontiac's forces executed British captives and floated the corpses past beleaguered Fort Detroit. No one can spell "Potawatomi," not even the Potawatomies. "Miami" seems inappropriate, even though that tribe lived in southwestern Michigan along the Sauk route.

Plymouth School Board Gives In To Band Parents... For One Year

Our Observerland readership was left hanging in mid-air last week by an editorial which spoke of high school band problems being weighed by the Plymouth Board of Education. The conflict between the board's meeting date and our press time gave R.T. Thompson the opportunity to pass on some advice to the board, but not the outcome.

To end your suspense. Thompson lost. However, it would seem in order that views from the other side of the coin be presented by one who believes the board acted correctly.

You may have noticed in the past that expressions of Observer editorial writers on issues of the day do not always agree. This right to disagree is something in which we take journalistic pride.

Plymouth is engaged in a unique educational experiment. To begin with you must realize this is a monstrosity of a district which covers 54 square miles. straddles the line between Wayne and Washtenaw Counties, and includes all or parts of six governmental areas.

It bodes well of becoming one of the most populous districts in Michigan, with an enrollment that is expected to double in five vears.

Several years ago, anticipation of this growth led to acquisition of a parcel of land of more than 300 acres three miles from downtown for development as an educational "park."

Purpose was to concentrate all high school activities of the entire district in that acreage on which an educational complex -- not a compound -- would emerge. It was decided to operate each new structure as a separate school with its own identity instead of calling it one big PHS campus.

Behind this decision was the concept of "shared facilities." This means that with schools virtually side by side, students may have classes in any or all buildings. One major suditorium, one stadium, etc., would suffice for all. Yet student identity and loyalty is to be with one school. The Plymouth-Salem building

opened in 1970. The Plymouth-Canton building went into use last fall, but will not have its first senior class until 1974-75. A third high school on the same site (Plymouth-Superior) is now on the drawing board and a fourth is under discussion for the future.

Each will eventually have its own full-fledged status, with its own sports teams, bands, separate leagues, etc., yet continuing to share many facilities ranging from laboratories to the stadium. Quite obviously, many problems

lie ahead which will dwarf the debate which arose over what to do about the 1973-74 marching band.

Plymouth-Canton will begin interscholastic competition next fall in the Western Six, Plymouth-Salem continuing in the Suburban Eight. In simplest terms, the argument which developed within the community was whether Canton should immediately have its own full instrumental music program, even without a full complement of students, or should musicians from both schools combine in a unit that would perform at functions of both institutions.

The latter compromise was accepted -- but just for one year. When Canton is of age, it will boast its own marching troops as it should.

Plymouth long has been proud of its school instrumental music program in particular, and its products starting at the junior high level consistently earn the highest ratings possible.

So great is the participation that the structure includes a symphony band at the top, the concert band and finally varsity band. Membership is determined through personal auditions. The marching band, which functions only through the fall with football games as the showcase, is made up of volunteers from the other three.

Charges of ego-building, selfcentered badgering arose in the Plymouth debate.

The basic desire was that all students be eligible to participate in a unit which would maintain quality. The fact of the two schools standing together made the combination answer possible. under a commitment that this all-Plymouth band will toot just as hard at Canton games next fall as for the Salem gridders.

Sense And Nonsense

Homeowners might also be interested in bringing along soil samples of their lawns or gardens which can be tested for fertilizer requirements. The samples should include random samples of soil taken from various areas of the lawn or garden to a depth of six inches. The samples should be mixed together and a cupful of that material used as a sample. The cost of testing the soil is one dollar per sample and results will be mailed to the homeowner within ten days of receipt.
