

Schools Seek 1.95 Mill Hike For Operating, Safety Use

Plymouth School District voters will be asked to approve additional property taxes of almost two mills this June.

The proposed increase will come in two parts a 1.55 operating millage for a five-year period and a .40 safety millage for one year.

The unanimous action by the school board to seek the two additional millages, adds to the already crowded ballots which will face voters on June 11.

Two seats on the Plymouth School Board - those now held by Dr. John Ohno and Carl Berry - will be up for election.

Ohno's seat is a four-year term, and the seat to

which Berry was appointed, following the resignation of John Hanskat, is for a one-year term.

Thus far, Dr. J. S. Finch of 51259 Murray Hill Drive, Canton Township, and Berry, who lives at Apt. 102, 5941 Sandhurst Court, Canton Township, have filed for the four-year term.

Berry had originally said he would not run but changed his mind.

Petition's have been taken out by several other persons. The deadline for filing is May 15.

The school board had also decided to seek renewal in June of an existing five mill operating levy for another five years.

The ballot will also include a \$14.2 million bond issue for building.

That proposal, a smaller version of the bond issue defeated by voters in December, includes funding for two elementary schools at \$1.7 million each, phase I of the third high school at \$6.5 million, phase III of Plymouth-Canton High School at \$3.5 million, funds to purchase future school sites at \$500,000 and \$250,000 for satellite schools.

In addition to those items from the Plymouth schools, the June 11 ballot will also include the election of several Schoolcraft College trustees.



Section 1 Chapter 31 of the Code of the City of Plymouth is hereby amended by adding a new section, which new section shall be designated as

3.6 Closing. Under circumstances considered by the police to be hazardous to the health, welfare and or safety of the community, they are authorized to temporarily close the parks and public grounds at any hour. No person shall lotter or remain within parks or public grounds after an order to vacate has been given by the Police Department. Each such closing will be documented in reports to be filed with the City Manager and City Commission

Section 2. This ordinance shall become operative and effective on the 24th day of April A D. 1973

Greek Easter Cake lenges Cooks Chal

TSOUREKI

4 cups sugar
1 tablespoon salt
3 tsps. powdered mahlepi* or liquid
vanilla or rum flavoring
2 cups sweet butter, melted
2 cups lukewarm milk Traditional bright red eggs herald Eastertide for the Greek Orthodox communities, this year falling on the 24th of April.

Another old tradition is tsoureki, a rich Easter cake that has whole red eggs hidden in it. This large cake, which is sometimes baked in twisted-bread form, is not for the everyday cook looking for easy reci-

2 cakes or packages yeast 1 cup lukewarm water 10 eggs, well beaten 1-2 eggs, beaten Sesame seeds

But for the person whose hobby is cooking and baking, the pleasure of creating this fragrant and delicious cake is worth a few hours of effort.

On Easter Sunday members of the family crack the red eggs against each other to symbolize the rising of Christ. And then they have a holiday dinner featuring roast baby lamb and cold dilled artichokes.

Sift flour into large bowl, combine with sugar, salt and mahlepi or flavoring. Make a well in center and into well pour 10 beaten eggs, butter, milk and yeast, first softened in lukewarm water. Blend liquids gradually into flour mixture, first with spoon and then with hands.

But the end of the lavish feast is best, offering little cups of delicious, sweet black coffee, snifters of Metaxa and slices of Tsoureki.

Turn dough onto lightly floured board and knead until smooth. Cover and let stand five hours or overnight. Punch down and form dough with floured hands into three long ropes. Press ends together, braid, and fasten opposite ends.
