# Greg--A 'Normal' Kid With A High IQ

Possessed of the typical string-bean physique of a 14-year-old boy, Greg Wellman rocks nervously in the red rocking chair talking about "topological deformations" and Wagner's operas.

Aside from these obvious signs that his intellect is far above "normal," Greg's like any other kid on the block.

You're apt to see him and his friend across the street riding their bikes around town or telling monster stories to neighboring little kids -- where Greg admits he enjoys letting his imagination go.

But besides the things you would expect a 14-year-old boy to be doing, Greg is also apt to be seen at a lecture

in Ann Arbor on medieval art or discussing Nietzsche or DesCartes.

Greg, who is currently attending University of Michigan, will be a sophomore there next year. He's taking courses in German, Great Books and math 399 -- an independent study course where he can work on his own.

"I get things done a lot quicker on my own," Greg admits.

It's been that fact that contributed to Greg's ability to skip grades, take courses at Schoolcraft College while enrolled in junior high school, and attend U of M in its honor program -- all before the age of 15.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Darrell E. Wellman of 1297 Carol, Greg has been commuting to school with his mother, who is also going there.

He'd like to become a resident student there -- to take part in extra-curricular activities -- but, "Not until at least when he's 16," his mother adds protectively.

How has Greg adapted to his unusual intellectual gift that has put him in a different role than that of his peers? Fine.

"I'm going to U of M and learning things which apparently members of my peer group are not interested in," he said, adding that his peer group has simply been expanded to include the older students in his classes at the high school and the university.

Where will his talent lead him? "I hope to be a pure mathematician," Greg said, "but I haven't really decided on a field in math yet."

# Unification: Will Northville's Affect Plymouth?

Is it true that as Northville goes -- so will Plymouth?

That will be the question in the back of the Plymouth community's mind Monday when voters in Northville and Northville Township decide whether or not to become "One Northville."

The similarities between the Northville and Plymouth communities -- the comparable cities and the two townships which were cut from what would be one rectangular township -- makes Monday's election the closest barometer of unification sentiment that Plymouth city and Township residents can watch.

In its ruling favoring the annexation of Northville Township by the City of Northville, the State Boundary Commission said the unification of the two Plymouths "is a distinct possibility."

Perhaps ironically, the question of unification of the Plymouth community was

brought to light in another way in the boundary commission's ruling.

Residents of the Tanger Elementary School area between Five and Six Mile roads in Northville Township had petitioned the commission to be excluded from the Northville annexation because they identified more with the Plymouth community.

That area is served by the Plymouth School District and the Plymouth Post Office and the residents rely primarily on the Plymouth community for shopping and business.

The boundary commission, in denying the Tanger residents' request, said that excluding the area would create a governmental orphan -- a township of perhaps some 500 residents.

The Tanger residents had hoped, their spokesman said, to annex to the Plymouth community.

But such an annexation would probably be blocked until the contiguous area -- now Plymouth Township -- was incorporated as a city.

The sentiment of the Tanger area is thus considered to be predominantly in opposition to the Northville annexation.

It was the boundary commission ruling that led to Monday's separate elections on the annexation question in Northville and Northville Township.

Opponents circulated petitions forcing the issue to be placed on the ballot in each community. It must pass in both communities to be put into effect.

Proponents of the annexation say their strength is growing, and most political observers there see the issue passing strongly in the city and barely in the township.

If it passes, it would be the first time a decision of the State Boundary Commission has been upheld by a vote of the communities involved.

"People are so afraid of change," said Irving Rozian, state boundary commission member and a Plymouth Township resident, "they're afraid of the word 'city'."

Rozian, who favors the Northville annexation and is watching that election closely Monday, admits it could have great impact on the Plymouth community.

He elaborated on one boundary commission's criterion in determining annexation, consolidation and incorporation actions -- the effect on neighboring communities.

# Dunning Memorial Building To Be Dedicated May 20

As one of the highlights of Michigan Week, the Dunning Memorial Building that will house the Plymouth Community Historical Museum will be dedicated on Sunday afternoon, May 20, at 3:30.

A year almost to the day from the ground breaking, the building now is in the final stages of completion and Miss Margaret Dunning, its donor, will dedicate it to the memory of her mother and father, Bessie and Charles Dunning.

Appropriate ceremonies are being arranged with celebrities from all sections of the suburban area in attendance.

While the exterior is in the closing stages of completion, Miss Dunning has let it be known that two major attractions for the front wall on either side of the entrance will not be available for the ceremonies.

These two pieces are un-

usual in that they will be art work done in soft metal depicting scenes of old times when plank roads still were in vogue.

Designed by David Reitzel, a graduate of Plymouth High School who also designed the building, one will depict the old railroad train coming into town and the other will be a replica of "Charlie" Dunning's saw mill, which was located at Plymouth and Telegraph Roads.

"I thought this would be a fitting way to pay tribute to my family," Miss Dunning said, "in that my father produced all the planking for Grand River Avenue back in the old days."

Constructed at a cost estimated in six figures, the building is twice the size it originally was intended to be. After ground was broken and another study made of the exhibits that were possible, Miss Dunning decided to enlarge the original plans in-

stead of adding sections later.

The first floor interior, while not finished, will be unique.

It is a replica of a street in the old days with 19 shops of various design on both sides of what will appear as a cobblestone street, replete with the old touches.

There will be specialty shops with bay windows, others with porches and others with fancy fronts.

With these things as a start, the Historical Commission, which will take care of the exhibits, has many special plans.

The lower floor, or basement, will be set aside to house antique cars, farm machinery of historical value and some of the other larger pieces that would fit there to better advantage.

Among the exhibits being hoped for is the model of the Alter car that was manufactured in Plymouth shortly after the turn of the century.

There is one model available and plans are now afoot to have it as a permanent exhibit.

## Meijer Store Site Plan OK'd

The Meijer's Shopping Center site plan, Ford and Canton Center Rds., was approved this week by the Canton Township Planning Commission.

A recommendation from Canton's planning department that the site be approved so construction could begin was unanimously approved by the commission.

Complete plans for landscaping the area are to be presented by Meijer Co. to the commission at a later date.

The center will be constructed on a 40-acre site located at the southeast corner of Ford and Canton Center.

**EXECUTIVE MEETING** - April 17, 1973. Mr. Burke moved that the minutes of the April 17, 1973 executive meeting be approved as submitted. Supported by Mr. Millington and carried unanimously.

**READING, CORRECTING AND APPROVAL OF BILLS** - Mr. Richardson added by following bills to the General Fund, Michigan Township Association in the amount of \$10.00 and Wayne County Road Commission for Chloride Treatment in the amount of \$8,000.00. Mr. Burke moved that the list of bills in the corrected General Fund amount of \$15,745 and the corrected Grand Total amount of \$45,786.53 be approved. Supported by Mr. Ash and carried unanimously.

**OLD BUSINESS** - Byron Creek Sanitary Sewer Extension. Re: Discussion on current Status. Supervisor McLaren stated that action was taken on this item by the Board of Trustees on February 27, 1973 and that approval was given. Mr. Morgan, Plymouth Township Attorney, appeared before the Board and stated that the original project for \$1,500,000 was initiated in 1971, the contract was approved by the Board of Trustees in October of 1971, the County agreed to the contract and in March of 1972 the proposal was before the Michigan Municipal Finance Commission.

At the February 27, 1973 meeting of the Board of Trustees, the Board approved a Resolution to revise the project description and cut back from Ridge Road to Beck Road. Mr. Morgan advised the members of the Board and the audience that approximately two weeks ago a complaint had been filed in the Circuit Court for the County of Wayne from the Plymouth Court Stewardship Association vs. Township of Plymouth, which included members of the Board and several County officials. Mr. Sharpley stated that he was a breach of Contract at the February, 1973 meeting, and that the action taken by the Board of Trustees was arbitrary and unconstitutional.

The relief sought consisted of a restraining order to the previous or original description, a permanent injunction to this effect and money damages in the amount of \$500,000 and \$500,000 in punitive damages. Mr. Ash moved that the Board rescind and revoke their action taken at the February 27, 1973 meeting and that the Township Engineer and the Bond Consultants should be advised to proceed with the project as originally described. Supported by Mr. Overholt. The question was called and the following roll call vote was taken: Yes: Burke, Millington, Overholt, Ash, No: Holmes, Richardson, McLaren. The motion carried 4 to 3. Mr. Burke moved that Mr. Morgan, Township Attorney, be authorized and directed to enter into a stipulation with Mr. Donaldson, Attorney for the Plymouth Court Stewardship Association, for the dismissal of the litigation. Supported by Mr. Millington. The following roll call vote was taken: Yes: Burke, Millington, Overholt, Ash, No: Holmes, Richardson, McLaren. The motion carried 4 to 3.

**JAMES GIGNAC, FIRE CHIEF** - Re: Recommendation on Purchase of Two Fire Rescue/Ambulance Vehicles. Mr. Overholt moved that the Board accept the recommendation of the Fire Chief for Items 1, 3 and 4, in the amount of \$44,250.00. Supported by Mr. Burke and carried unanimously. Items 1, 3 and 4 would be two complete equipped fire Rescue/Ambulance vehicles, two mobile radios and additional equipment.

**BEAUTIFICATION COUNCIL OF SOUTHEASTERN MICHIGAN** - Mrs. Holmes moved that the Township of Plymouth no longer participate in the Beautification Council of Southeastern Michigan. Supported by Mr. Ash and carried unanimously.

**NEW BUSINESS** - Howard W. Sharpley, President, Alden CATV, Inc. Re: Construction of Cable Television System in Plymouth Township. Mr. Howard Sharpley appeared before the Board and stated that he had recently been given a contract for the City of Plymouth and that he was proceeding with FCC approval for that area. There followed much discussion regarding the cable and how it was to be distributed. Mr. Sharpley stated that he would do what Michigan Bell and the Power Company did. If they used poles, he would use the same poles, if they went underground, he would go underground. In existing subdivisions with underground cables, he would have to trench along the easements. There was also discussion regarding the tower, cost per resident and

programs that would be made available to the users of the program. Mrs. Richardson moved that the Board defer action for 60 days to take this matter under advisement. Supported by Mr. Burke and carried unanimously.

**HERALD HAMILL, BRENNER-HAMILL & ASSOCIATES** - Re: Requesting approval for improvements of Wedgewood Estates. Mrs. Richardson moved acceptance of the recommendation of the Township Engineer to approve the Utility Plans for Wedgewood Estates and authorize the Engineer to submit the plans to the County and State Agencies for construction permits. Supported by Mr. Ash and carried unanimously.

Re: Tentative Preliminary Plat of Beacon Estates Sub. No. 3, located north side of Ann Arbor Trail, immediately east of Beacon Estates No. 2. Mrs. Holmes moved that the Board approve the recommendation of the Plymouth Township Planning Commission on the Tentative Preliminary Plat of Beacon Estates Sub. No. 3. Supported by Mr. Overholt and carried unanimously.

After some discussion it was agreed that the word "unit" be deleted from Dwellings Use Factor under the following type of use headings: Bowling Alleys, Country Clubs, Fraternal Organizations, Hotels and Motels. Also that "Township Board" in Part II, last sentence, be changed to read "Township Supervisor in conjunction with other Department Heads, with final ratification by the Township Board". Also, in Part IV, the words "and to take effect" and be in force from and after the Twenty-eighth day of May, 1973 be added. Mr. Ash moved that the Board approve the recommendation and adopt Amendment XXI-L to Ordinance XXI as amended in the six (6) places as stated previously. Supported by Mrs. Richardson and carried unanimously.

Moved by Russell Ash, supported by Gene Overholt to adjourn the meeting. Supervisor McLaren adjourned the meeting at 10:27 P.M.

locations and socio-economic compositions of the Northville and Plymouth communities exemplify their similarity and thus explain the impact of Monday's election on Plymouth.

Another factor which weighs heavily with boundary commission. Rozian said, is the community's role in a developing area.

"They (Northville and Plymouth) are both on about the same position on the wave front of suburban development," he said.

"The two community centers are far enough apart to be distinct centers," Rozian said, adding they are separated by a belt of institutional land and the proposed expressway.

"So the Plymouth area can be organized into a self-governing community and the Northville area could be organized into a self-governing unit."

"They could be joined together (in one city). But on the other hand, neither is it necessary to join them."

"You can have a reasonable size governing unit with each one separately," Rozian said.

Another factor in determining whether a community should be annexed (joined to an existing city), consolidated (merge two or more communities to make a new city with a new city charter), or incorporated, is its population density.

State law requires a minimum population density of 500 per square mile for a community to become a home rule city.

"In my opinion," Rozian said, "it should be mandatory for an area to become incorporated when it reaches 1,500 persons per square mile."

The difference between township government and city government begins to be illusory at that level" because of special millages, governmental services authorities and so forth. Rozian said.

Plymouth Township, which is approaching a population density of 1,100 per square mile, has joined in support of a recreation authority and a refuse authority for example.

"When you approach the density of a city," Rozian said, "the effect of tax rates will be almost identical."

He added that it has been the pattern of the boundary commission's decisions to reserve entire townships for city incorporation in developing areas.

"We're trying to avoid the proliferation of two-square-mile cities," he said.

The commission's decision on Northville was apparently in keeping with this pattern.

Thus for several reasons, Monday's elections in Northville and Northville Township are important to the Plymouth community.

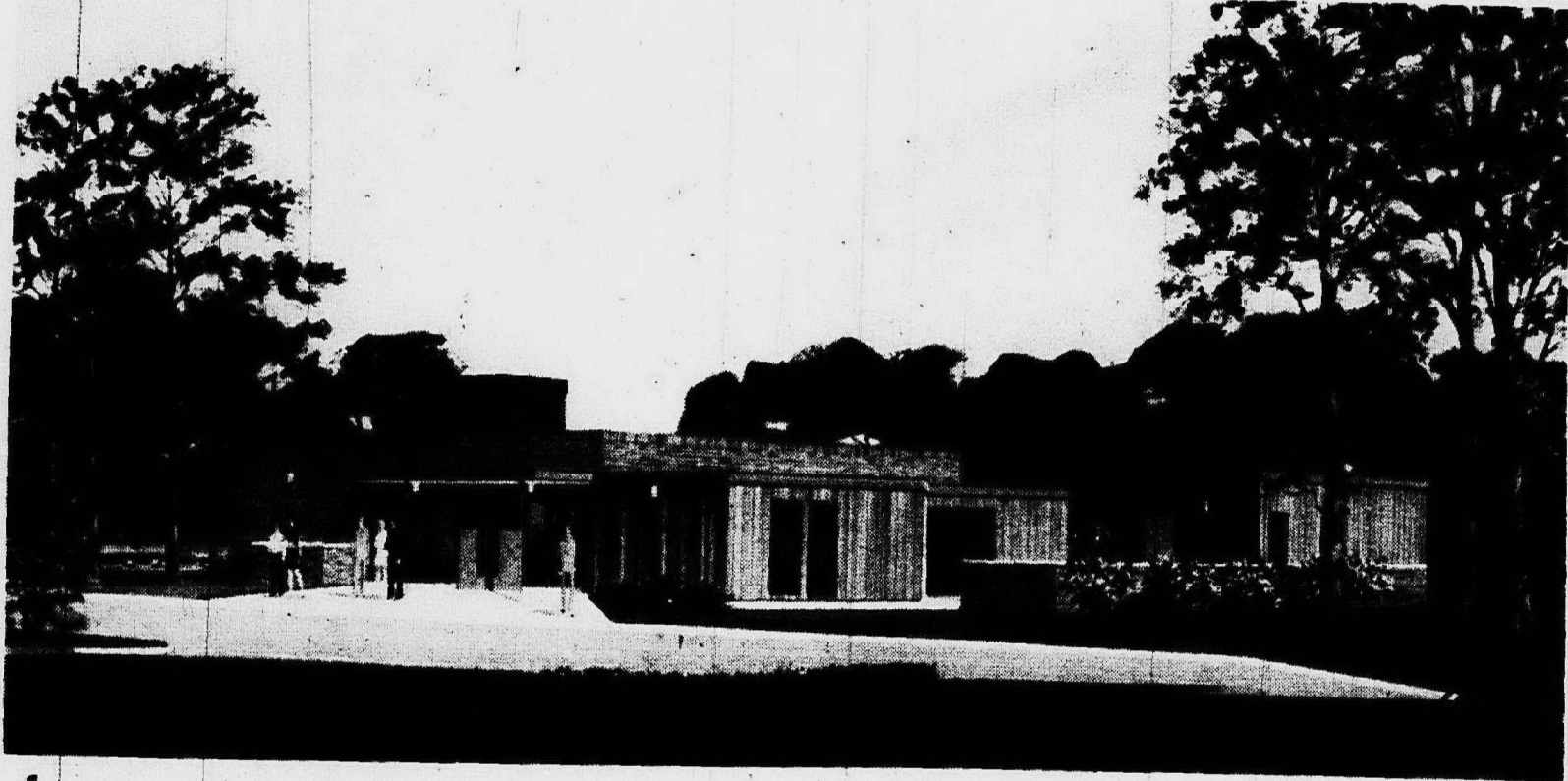

# Unity Opens Livonia Center



THE NEW HOME of Unity of Livonia is located at 28660 Five Mile.

Unity of Livonia, a congregation with a new name, moves into a new sanctuary with services at 11 a.m. Sunday, May 6.

The congregation which, as Unity of West Suburbia, formerly occupied a building on Curtis Avenue in Livonia and for several months has been meeting in Clarenceville High, has invited the public to help dedicate its new home at 28660 Five Mile.

An open house from 12 noon to 1:30 p.m. will follow the services.

He attended St. Ambrose elementary school and St. Paul high school before entering Sacred Heart Seminary. Later he was accepted for major theology education at the Gregorian University in Rome, and he was ordained in Rome Dec. 15, 1956.

His pastoral assignments were at St. Mary's of Redford and St. Charles before he was called to the position as Cardinal Dearden's secretary.

At Our Lady of Sorrows, he said, he is grateful to work with "the good parish team here."

He mentioned particularly Msgr. Thomas Beahan, who retired recently after long service to the parish but still helps in its work; the Rev. Robert Rokusek, associate pastor, and Tim Pelc, deacon from St. John seminary who began work at Sorrows this spring.

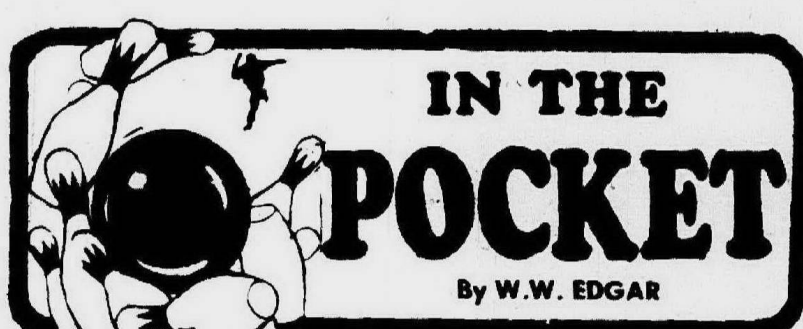

## Turf Tips, Quips

Wolverine Raceway was presented some excellent programs over the past few years, many that had fans literally talking to themselves, but for the best of a long time fans have only to attend tonight's all-pacing card.

Racing Secretary Bill Connors and his aides, Ray McGee and Ron Giehls, have outdone themselves this time. Benefiting from the third purse hike of the meeting, the trio had little trouble getting all of the fastest pacers at the track on the same night.

Tonight's card has a total value of \$48,100, most of the year, and it could well bring the first million dollar night of the meeting... provided the weatherman orders some perfect weather.

Just think... an invitational worth \$7,500; a preferred which carries a purse of \$6,200; two rich conditioned events with purses of \$5,300 and \$5,100; and the remainder of the activities scaled down to a minimum of \$3,300.

Purses like that are responsible for such an outstanding evening, a night that finds every one of the 10 races so evenly matched even the top experts are having trouble predicting winners.

One thing that appears to be certain is that patrons could be treated to as many as four races cracking the 2:00 barrier. Only one horse, Bedford Jet, has been able to better 2:00 and the six-year-old will appear in the invitational in quest of his second win in three weeks.

Strange enough, The Jet, one of six entries in the feature, isn't expected to go postward as the favorite. It broke gait and finished dead last a week earlier and is facing the same company again.

Big Kahuna, speedy veteran from the Gene Riegler stable, is the early choice

this time off his finishes of the past three weeks when clocked in 2:01.3, 2:00 and 2:01.3.

Shiaway Lad, an eight-year-old who won last week in 2:00.4, has to be considered a definite threat. It will be recalled that Shiaway Lad twice bettered 2:00 at Wolverine last spring and his race last Saturday shows he's back in that form again.

Others in the field are: Skipper Gene Marx, who hasn't been worse than third in three invitationals; Dashing Dancer and Mighty Fire. The last mentioned could take it all if the race goes right. Mighty Fire hasn't been farther back than fourth in five Wolverine starts, turned in the fastest mile two weeks back when caught in 2:00.4. That clocking was bettered by Bedford Jet but it doesn't alter the fact that Mighty Fire has the speed to beat all when weather conditions are right.

Then there's the \$6,200 preferred pace that conceivably could turn into one of the tightest finishes of the season.

H. T. Pilot, winner a week ago in a quick 2:02.3, appears near the same form that made it the top performer at the winter Northville Downs meeting.

Shiawassee Squire, fresh from a successful winter in Florida, surprised quite a few with a stunning win a week ago in 2:01.2, clearly demonstrating it had adjusted to the colder weather in Michigan in a hurry.

Take a look at the challengers... Local Time with earnings of \$119,610... Knox Patch with a bankroll of \$116,883... Bramble Hall, \$106,133... Tricky Dale, \$74,800... and Ark Time, the aged Ohio pacer with \$93,485 in the till and making his season debut.

That's only part of the standout program. There are eight other events and as Racing Secretary Connors

put it... "Competition is so keen in each that I'd hate to be a betting man and try to snag some winners. Never have we been able to get so many standout performers on the same card before."

Bea Farber, one of two women drivers at Wolverine, doesn't make many starts but when she does fans know the horse will get a real drive.

Bea brought Easy Irv home an easy victor Thursday in the time of 2:02.2. Just to show what kind of a pilot she is, horses were having trouble breaking 2:05 that same night over a track rated no better than good.

Almost three months have passed since Racing Commissioner Leo Shirley announced an investigation of gimmick wagering during the Jackson-at-Northville meeting showed some signs of occlusion.

Michigan's probe came at the same time the Ontario Harness Racing Commission was conducting a similar investigation at Windsor Raceway.

The Canadian board completed its study several weeks ago, suspending Terry Butler, of Clinton, Mich. for life on charges of occlusion.

To date one hears rumors of criminal warrants being issued by the Attorney General's office and of subpoenas from the Racing Commission being served on seven or eight drivers and trainers.

But that's as far as the case has gone... as usual in Michigan, lots of talk and no action. One wonders if the Commissioner is waiting until the end of the Hazel Park meeting next November before announcing the results.

Hazel Park will present the \$10,000 Fourth Estate Handicap today (Saturday) as the feature of one of the better programs of the meeting.

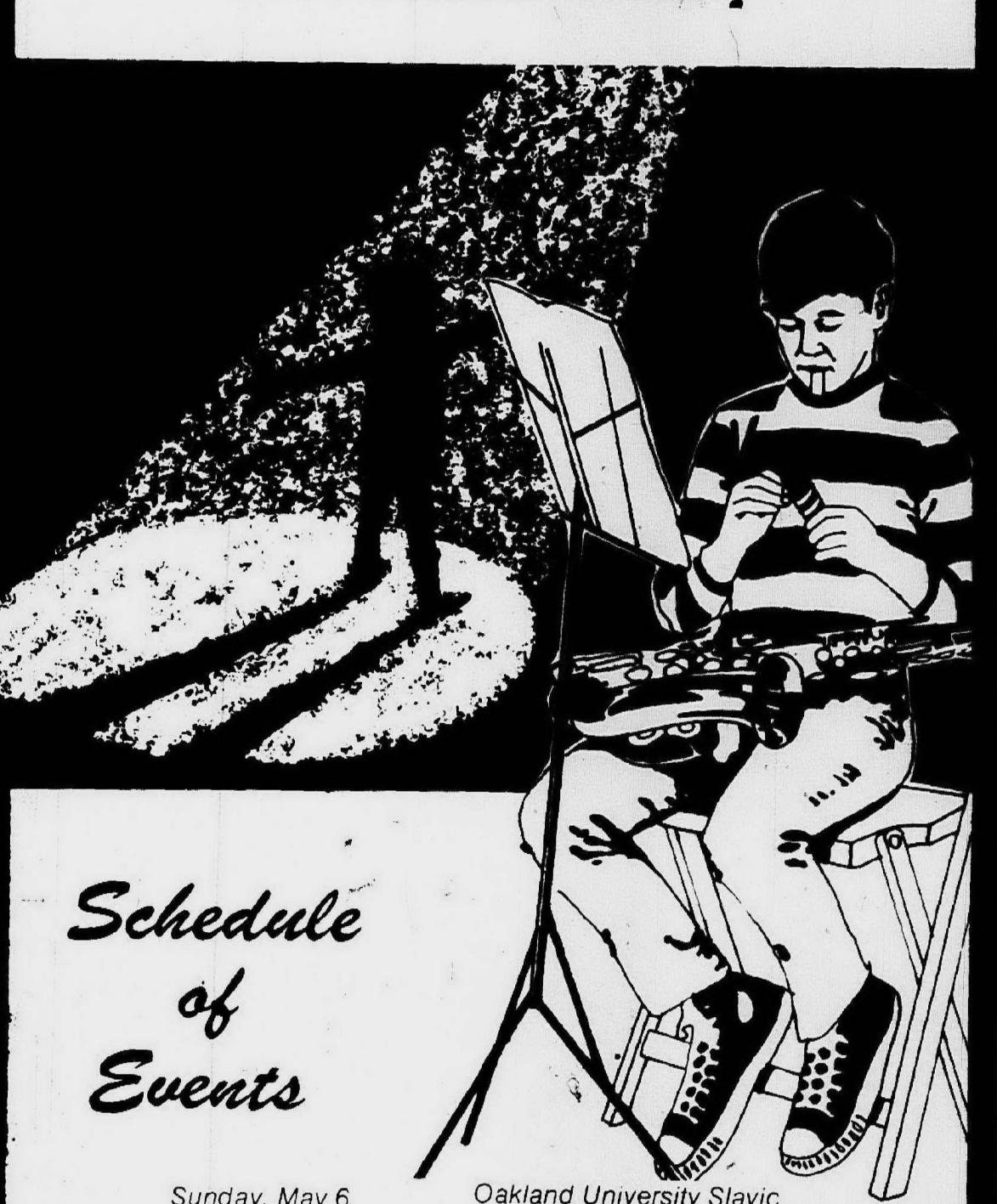

Mother's  
Day

To hear some people talk, "Mother's Day" is strictly a campaign conceived along Madison Avenue to promote the sale of flowers, candy and women's apparel in the month of May.

Actually, Mother's Day was proclaimed a national holiday in the United States by President Woodrow Wilson on May 8, 1914 following a joint resolution by Congress.

The resolution designated the second Sunday in May to be observed as Mother's Day. It authorized government officials to display the United States flag on all government buildings and the people of the United States to display the flag at their homes as "a public expression of love and reverence for the mothers of our country."

Although the original intention may have been partially obscured by the hard-sell advertising which surrounds Mother's Day as we know it now, still in most family groups there is the recognition of a special day for mom.

The idea of Mother's Day is not a modern one. Mother-love antedates the Christian religion; mother-worship with its own rites and ceremonies reaches back into pagan times.

Earliest records of formal mother-worship come from stories of the ceremonies in which Cybele, or Rhea, "the great mother of the gods" was worshiped in Asia Minor. The power and majesty of motherhood rather than its tender maternal spirit was celebrated.

The worship of this superlative

"mother of gods" traveled through Greece into Rome about 250 B.C. It was known as the festival of Hilaria and people made offerings into the temple, which though confiscated by the priests, still served to recognize motherhood.

With the advent of Christianity, the festival changed in spirit and emphasis as it grew into a celebration in honor of the "Mother Church." It became the custom on Mid-Lent Sunday for the faithful to visit the church in which they were baptized and brought up--bringing gifts for the altar.

How this in turn gave rise to the English observance of "Mothering Sunday" is uncertain. It is thought that a custom grew among young men and maidens, who were bound out as apprentices and servants to visit their parents on Mid-Lent Sunday, taking with them some little present, cake or trinket meant primarily for the mother.

A youth engaged in this act of duty was said to "go a-mothering".

We cannot say that our own Mother's Day is directly descended from the old holiday when English apprentices went "a-mothering". However, the presents which we give mothers in our own country are in that tradition as is our idea of making a special visit.

As American families continue to move apart geographically, if not in other ways, the observance of Mother's Day is one more way in which family members reunite--if only by telephone, card or letter.

## Use Lemonade Profits To Buy Mom A Gift

A good way to earn money for a Mother's Day gift for your mom is by selling lemonade.

The lemonade stand business, in which you can make your own hours depending on the benevolence of the weatherman, can net profits which exceed even weekly allowances, according to local vendors.

Since no ceiling exists on the lemonade stand market, you can expect to charge from between a penny to five cents a glass for an order. It all depends on what the market will bear, and everyone seems to agree that the market is wide open.

Overhead is low. A small table, a tablecloth, some paper cups and a brightly lettered sign will put you in business.

Don't forget the lemonade, though, or whatever soft drink you think will sell in your neck of the woods. It's prime requirements are that it be very cold—you'll need lots of ice—and sweet enough to soothe the throat of the thirstiest home runner on the block.

Location can make or break a lemonade stand. If there are lots of kids playing tag in front of your house, you've got a ready-made market. If things from the front window look abandoned, you'd better go where the action is.

Portable stands set up in wagons can take you to new territories around the block or a long ways down your own street. Just be sure

that there aren't a lot of bigger kids around who'll try to wreck your merchandise. Competition, it seems, can really get tough.

And then there's publicity. A sandwich sign which advertises your wares will draw attention nicely.

Or you might try the old town crier method of simply calling out, "Lemonade for sale, fresh lemonade in the shade!" It's the easiest form of advertising, and according to those who've done it, quite effective.

If you have a large and willing staff, you might send some of them out on bikes in order to drum up business.

In such a case, a profit sharing plan should be worked out. It will definitely increase incentive—and, who knows?—you might be able to afford that 10 speed bike in addition to your mother's gift.

A definite pitfall is great thirst among the proprietors themselves. There are unfortunate cases on record which tell the sad story of so much lemonade being consumed by the vendors, that there wasn't enough left over for any of the customers!

Probably the best way to avoid this is to go into business right after filling up on ice water or anything else that will quench your thirst during business hours.

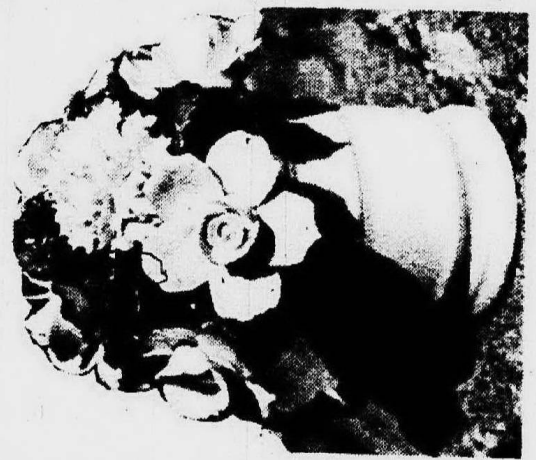

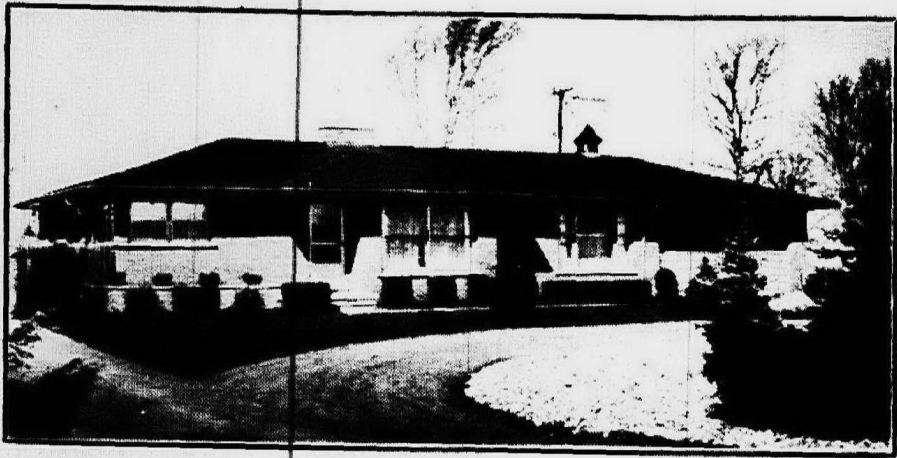

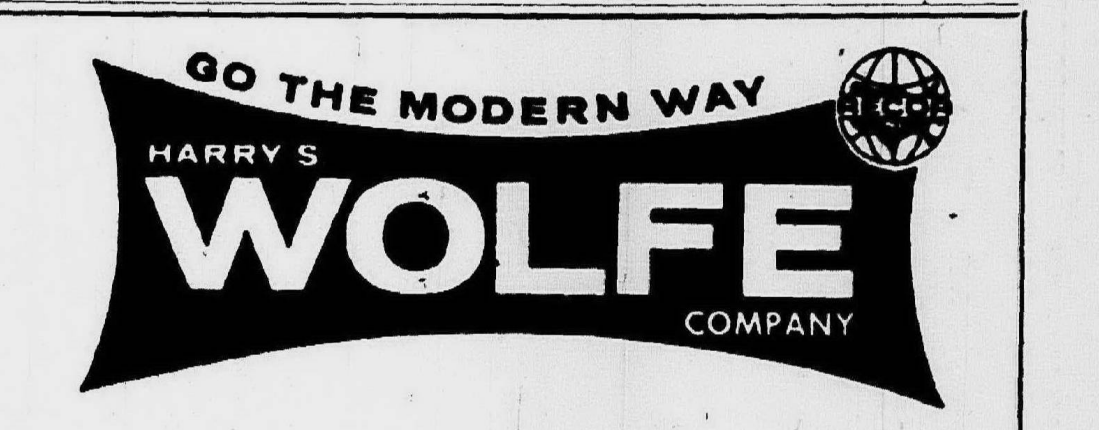
