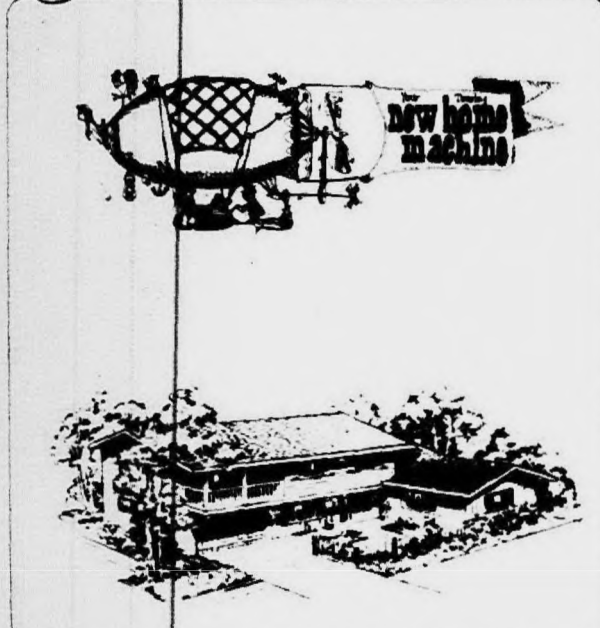

Canton Hearing Probes Cable TV Accountability

A public hearing on possible state regulations for cable television (CATV) operations was held in Canton Township Thursday night — a hearing that came only a few weeks after the Canton board had approved a cable TV franchise.

The hearings were conducted by Rep. Gerrit Hasper (D-Muskegon), chairman of the House public utilities committee.

Hasper told a very small crowd that many cable television operations were parasitic.

"This business is like the development of the wild west. People are coming in and staking claims, and this is a real profitable business."

The hearings, held at the UAW Local 735 Hall on Michigan Ave., drew only a handful of township officials, the press and the Canton CATV developer, Leonard Liss.

Much of the hearing was devoted to pointed exchanges between Liss and Rep. Hasper.

Hasper said the state was seriously considering getting into regulations of CATV operations because of abuses by station owners.

A bill, HB 4551, is currently in committee and would include provisions for DATV permits issued by the state that would be nonexclusive. The current Canton franchise is exclusive.

Hasper was particularly critical of the CATV station now serving greater Muskegon. He said the cable fran-

chise there had "laid dormant" in four communities (Norton Shores, Muskegon Township, Muskegon Heights and Roosevelt) for over six years.

"The developer sold it for \$367,000 and never laid a foot of cable," Hasper said. He said the contracts there were up for renewal and that he had had many complaints about lack of action. "We know nobody is doing anything, and the developer is hijacking us," Hasper said.

Liss said his operation in Canton was in the "preliminary engineering stages" and the Canton franchise would be one of the largest underground CATV setups ever tried. The franchise Liss holds calls for 30 year exclusive rights to CATV hook-ups for a minimum of 20 channels. When asked his feelings on possible state regulations, Liss said that it "would depend on what they are."

"The state must allow the company a profit," Liss said.

Liss was further questioned by Rep. Kirby Holmes (R-Utica), who asked Liss for detailed facts and figures.

Liss said his CATV system would cost about \$2.5 million, and would hopefully serve 20,000 homes or "taps."

"And, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) says we must put out a certain amount of local programs," Liss noted.

Liss also said the Detroit networks and UHF stations represented "honest competition." Liss has an interest in a second cable station in Wooster, Ohio.

Rep. Tom Brown (D-Westland), who announced the meeting this week, said the state "has no laws to regulate cable television. The law must be written. Now we have no control."

The discussion also turned to costs. The Canton contract calls for a \$7 monthly charge for the cable service.

"Underground cable is more expensive," Liss told the audience.

Hasper disagreed, noting that the Traverse City cable television setup is underground and costs \$3.60 a month.

"The people who know about this tell me that in the long run, an underground system is cheaper because you save money in maintenance and storm damage costs," Hasper said.

Hasper also said he doubted the FCC would approve Liss's Canton arrangement for 30 years, as it is written now.

He said the state should look to the CATV ordinance written by the city of Boulder, Colo. There, at the expiration of the franchise, the city may renew or extend the permit, invite additional proposals from other operators, or buy the system, without paying a premium for the rights or the so-called "good will" built up by the station.

Hasper said he hoped no community would give up its rights to the CATV franchises, nor allow a profit to be taken on anything but the land and facilities, less depreciation.

"I want people to get the best possible deal, with the state of the CATV art as it is today. If we can save them \$2 a month, then we should do it."

Hasper said senior citizens and the poor should also be given a rate break if possible.

The entire matter still must await a vote of the Canton residents in an election whose date is still to be set. The first regular election date is August 1974, a primary.

Other provisions, according to Liss, include a \$7 monthly charge to Canton residents — a charge that can't be changed without township board approval.

"And the FCC says we must put out so many local programs, such as high school graduations."

The Canton CATV agreement also calls for free hook-ups to schools, a provision Hasper said he favored.

Liss said his setup would be "two-way," a cable television term that means many more channels are available if a switch is flipped. Liss said 15 channels were planned for Canton to start, but as many as 43 might be possible.

Michigan would become the eighth state to regulate CATV operations if the Legislature passes the laws now being contemplated.

Swing In City Parks, Summer Events Set

The summer program of activities sponsored by the Plymouth Department of Parks and Recreation has been announced.

Broom hockey, hula hoops and frisbees will be among the highlights of several special events during the summer to be offered along with continuing programs in fine arts, crafts, dramatics and sports.

The complete program is as follows:

ARTS AND CRAFTS -- Classes will be held at Hamilton playground on Mondays from 9 a.m. to noon and Wednesdays from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m.; at Elm from 9 a.m. to noon on Tuesdays and 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. on Thursdays; at Sutherland from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. Mondays and 9 a.m. to noon Wednesdays; and at Auburn from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. Tuesdays and 9 a.m. to noon Wednesdays.

VEST POCKET PARK -- Downtown visitors may leave children from three to eight years for free supervision at the park at Harvey and Ann Arbor Trail for up to two hours.

CREATIVE DRAMATICS -- Classes for students from elementary through high school age will be held each weekday at the Cultural Center beginning June 20. The fee for two classes a week will be \$1 for city residents and \$3 for non-residents. Registration will be taken June 19 from 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 3 p.m. at the Cultural Center.

FINE ARTS -- Instruction in oils, water colors and chalk will be included in classes to be offered beginning June 20. Prospective artists may register June 19 at the Cultural Center from 9 a.m. till noon and 1 to 3 p.m.

NOVICE TENNIS TOURNAMENT -- Any and all players are invited to sign up for the contest to be held July 13 through 15. Registration forms for the two divisions, girls and boys 15 and under and men and women 16 and older, are available at the Cultural Center.

PARK CONCERTS -- The Plymouth Community Band will perform at Kellogg Park on five Thursday evenings throughout the summer -- June 28, July 5, 12, 19 and 26.

CITY TENNIS TOURNAMENT -- This tournament will be open only to city or township residents. Registration for the Aug. 13, 14 and 15 contest begins July 9 at the Cultural Center.

BROOM HOCKEY -- Men, women and children may join the league, which plays at the Cultural Center. Register between June 18-22.

WOMEN'S GOLF -- An organizational meeting for a women's league is scheduled for 1 p.m. Tuesday, June 19 at Hilltop Golf Club. League play will begin July 6, after 8 a.m. on Friday mornings. There will be a \$3.50 charge for nine holes, and an additional entry fee.

BOWLING -- Applications may be obtained from the recreation department or Plymouth Bowl. Young people ages 6-13 may join the program scheduled for June 25 through Aug. 28.

DUPLICATE BRIDGE -- Weekly games will begin in early September. Those interested should leave their

name, address and telephone number at the recreation office.

SPECIAL EVENTS -- These include a city-wide hula hoop contest July 6, frisbee contest July 13, playground checker tournament July 18, Greenfield Village tour July 29, 30, state-wide hula hoop contest July 25, junior olympics July 26, Bob-Lo trip Aug. 2, and a Kensington Park trip Aug. 10.

CULTURAL CENTER ARENA PROGRAMS -- Several special concerts and exhibits are scheduled, including rock concerts open only to high school students June 21 and July 19, a judo and karate exhibition June 23, Duke Ellington in concert July 4, a free women's broomball exhibition July 5, men's lacrosse exhibition, also free, on July 5, donkey basketball July 14, the largest flea market ever held in the Plymouth area July 28-29, and a garage, basement and attic sale June 29 and 30.

The ice area arena at the Center will be closed during June and July and open skating will resume Aug. 6. City playgrounds at Hamilton, Auburn, Elm Street and Sutherland Parks will be open weekdays from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., beginning June 19. Crafts, sports and other programs at the parks are free to city residents and available for non-residents for a \$2 yearly fee.

Commission Race Draws Few Candidates

With the school election over, the spotlight shifts to the upcoming City Commission races.

Tuesday is filing deadline for candidates for the four city commission seats up for election this year.

The terms of Mayor James McKeon, William Silvis, Harold Guenther and Norbert Battermann are up, and the city charter provision barring more than two consecutive terms on the commission means McKeon and Silvis cannot run again.

That insures at least two new faces on the commission in November.

There has also been speculation that Guenther, for personal and business reasons, may not seek reelection.

He was out of town this weekend and not available for comment.

The commission race has another unusual flavor.

Battermann has been appointed to fill two unexpired terms in succession, and the city charter prohibits more than two terms — elected or appointed — in succession.

City Attorney Charles Lowe said he has not ruled on the question of Battermann's eligibility as yet and would not do so until Battermann had filed.

Battermann is expected to seek reelection, which means that Lowe will probably have to rule on the question after the commissioner files petitions.

In spite of the facts that four seats are up for election and that two of them can not be sought by incumbents, one

probably won't be and the fourth has some question of eligibility involved, only one person had filed for the race by Wednesday.

Donald Watkins of 660 Burroughs has filed.

Several persons have taken out petitions but it is not yet known whether they will file before the 4 p.m. on Tuesday.

Other persons rumored to be possible candidates include: Marcia Borowski, who lost in her bid for a Plymouth school board seat by 18 votes Monday; Mahlon D. Green; John Cummings; Donald Watkins; Joe Bida; and Bernie Schmitz, city planning commission member.

If nine or more candidates file for the races, a primary will be held on Aug. 7.

The general city election will be Nov. 6.

Will the recent appellate court decision upholding the Roth plan contribute to the growth boom of the Plymouth School District, which is not now included in the suburban school desegregation area?

Probably not, says School Supt. John M. Hoben.

"I'm of the opinion that it's going to be appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court. If the Richmond, Va. (city-suburban school desegregation) case is an indication, it will be turned around at that level," Hoben said.

The U.S. Supreme Court deadlocked 4-4 on the Richmond decision because of one abstention of a justice who is expected to vote conservatively in subsequent cases.

Tuesday's 6-3 decision of the U.S. Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals, to uphold the decision of Federal Judge Stephen J. Roth in the Detroit school desegregation case, is expected to become a landmark decision when appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Hoben said he didn't expect any further "white flight" to the Plymouth School District due to the appellate court decision.

"The general public reaction isn't going to make that much difference now," Hoben said, "but the final decision (the U.S. Supreme Court) might."

Although Plymouth was not included in Roth's suburban plan for cross-district shifting of school populations to desegregate Detroit schools, the appeals court decision may reopen the possibility of its inclusion because the decision said all suburban districts ever included in such a plan must have their day in court.

Roth's decision left open the possibility that the

cross-district school busing area could be expanded at some indefinite point in the future if "white flight" continued.

Hoben was uncertain whether Plymouth would be included now or not.

The Richmond decision of the lower court was to make the city and the suburban school districts into one large "super district" while the Roth decision would not change school districts.

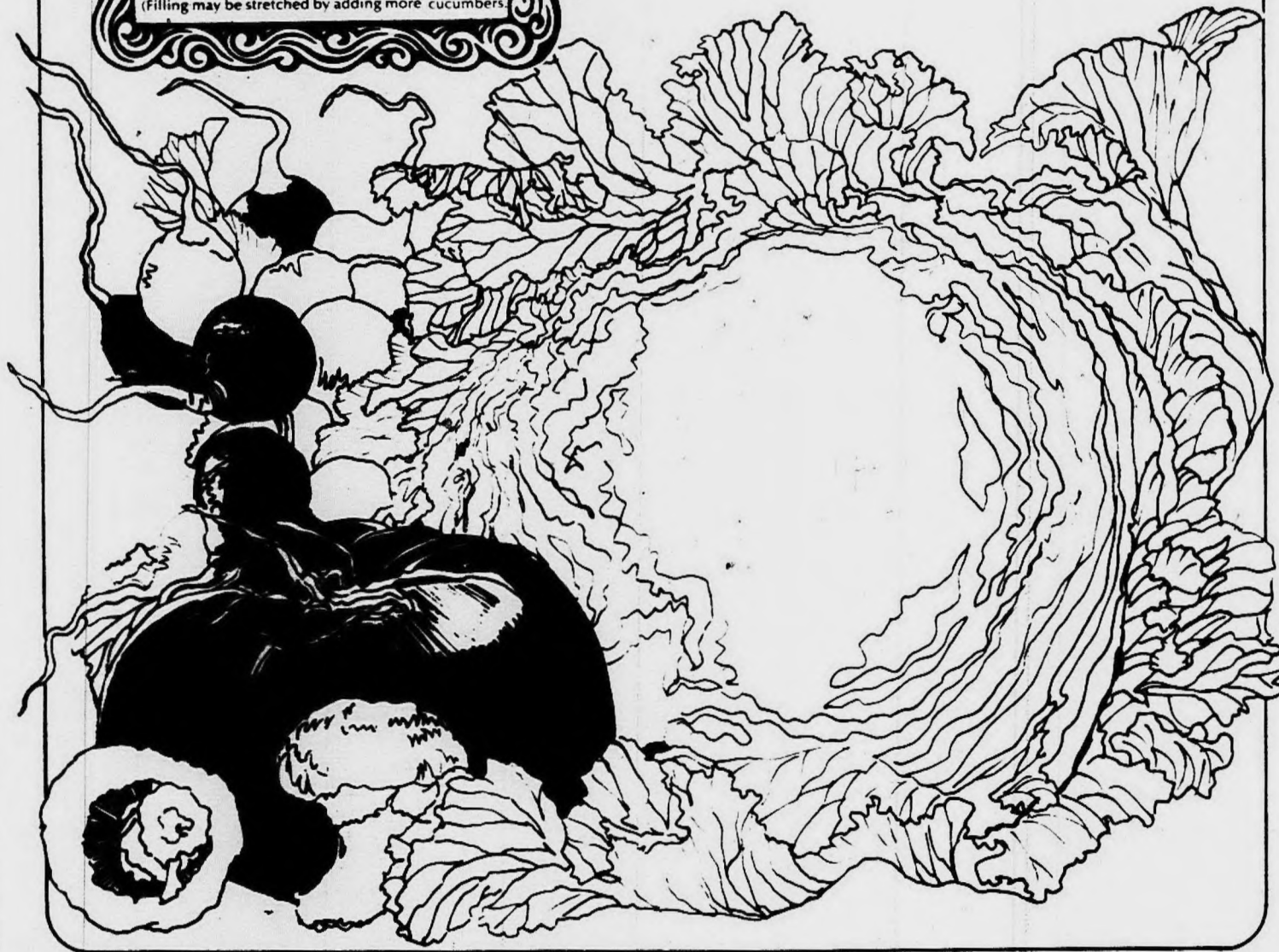

TOMATOES STUFFED WITH SOUR CREAM
Serves 4-8 (Depending on the size of tomatoes used.)
4 medium sized tomatoes
or four large sized tomatoes, cut in half
2/3 cup chopped cucumber, well-drained
3 tablespoons chopped green onion
salt and pepper to taste
1 cup sour cream
Peel the tomatoes. (For easy peeling, pour boiling water over tomatoes, let stand a few seconds, pour off boiling water and cover with cold water. Cut out core then skin will peel off easily.) Scoop out center, invert and chill. Mix filling, put in center of tomatoes, and chill again. Serve on lettuce leaf. Filling may be stretched by adding more cucumbers.

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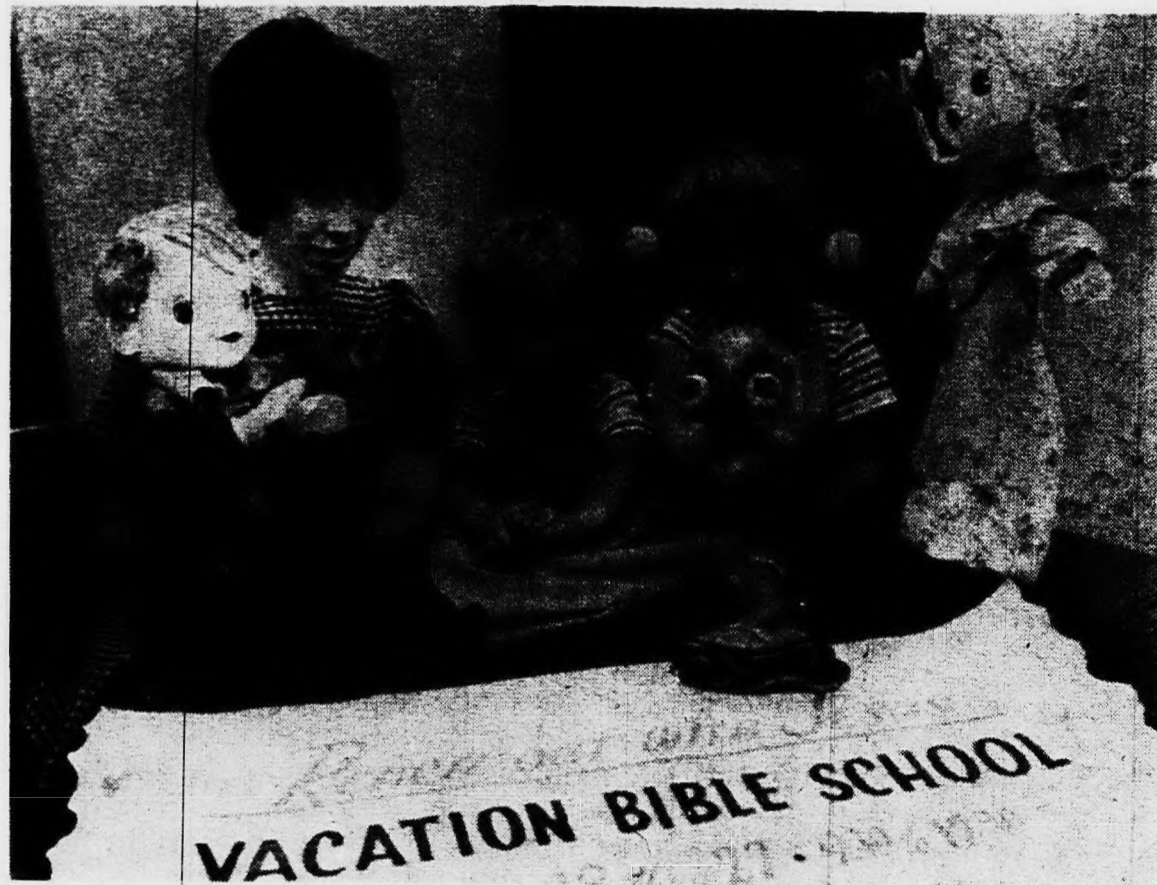

This year there was a set of red luggage - "to Elsie, there isn't any other color," a member of the congregation explained - and a check to be used for a vacation.

"Go and have a good time, but come back," said an attached note.

Last week, at the Detroit Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church at Adrian College, Rev. Johns heard her name read for the 33rd time as the minister appointed to lead Clarenceville UMC.

That is unusual for that

denomination, but so is this minister.

The first time she was appointed in 1951, the church was a tiny white frame building located at Collingham and Grand River, and for the first five Sundays she was pastor she found herself waiting alone at the church.

But she started visiting around in the neighborhood and her efforts paid off. By 1958 the congregation had outgrown the little old church and an 8 1/2 acre site at 20300 Middle Belt was purchased.

Glass, Stone, Study, Work Go Into Class' Mosaic Gift

The congregation of Good Shepherd Evangelical Lutheran Church of Redford Township isn't likely to forget the confirmation class of 1973.

In the church hall is hanging a mosaic, four by four feet, as a substantial reminder of what the nine young people in the class learned from their Bible and study books and from their teacher, Mrs. Win Alberti.

Gravel, charcoal, broken glass, tile, stones - and about 160 hours of loving labor - went into their work.

A lot of study was involved, too, because the mosaic's theme is The Vine and the Branches, with each

branch holding a shield to represent one of the apostles.

Each member of the class, confirmed June 3 in the church located at 26212 W. Six Mile, took charge of a portion of the mosaic. They used ancient symbols from biblical times to represent Christ and the apostles.

Nancy Alden worked on the shield representing Jesus, using the letters IHC, the first three letters of the Greek word for Jesus and placing a crown above the shield.

Lynn Kempeinen symbolized St. Peter by forming a cross with the horizontal bar toward the bottom of the vertical bar. On the cross, she placed two keys, crossed to form the letter X.

Thus, she explained, she symbolized the idea that Peter was given the keys to the church on earth and the story that when he was crucified in Rome he refused to die in the same position in which his Master had died.

For St. Andrew, the fisherman, Larry Cramer fashioned a cross shaped like an X with a fish-hook in the center.

St. James the Greater is symbolized by Jim Rollin with three shells, the symbol of pilgrimage. A cross-hilted sword symbolizes martyrdom, since this apostle died at the hands of Herod.

A serpent was used by Rick Garver to symbolize St. John, because there is a story that an attempt to poison this apostle was unsuccessful because the poison vanished in the form of a serpent.

Two loaves of bread were used by Brian Swan in the symbolism for St. Philip. They refer to his remarks when Jesus fed the multitudes.

St. Bartholomew, also done by Lynn Kempeinen, has three flying knives on his shield because he is said to have been flayed to death.

St. Thomas, a carpenter believed to have died when speared by a pagan priest, is

symbolized by a carpenter's square and a vertical spear. Mark Lauret designed and made the shield.

Nancy Alden used a Tau cross to symbolize St. Matthew, believed to have died on such a cross in Ethiopia, and Brian Swan chose two stones and a saw for St. James the less.

St. Jude has a sailboat with a cross-shaped mast to show his missionary work, and St. Simon's fish symbol shows him as a fisher of men. Both shields were done by Robin Zerbat.

Pastor and Mrs. Alberti are leaving the church this month to take a new pastoral assignment.

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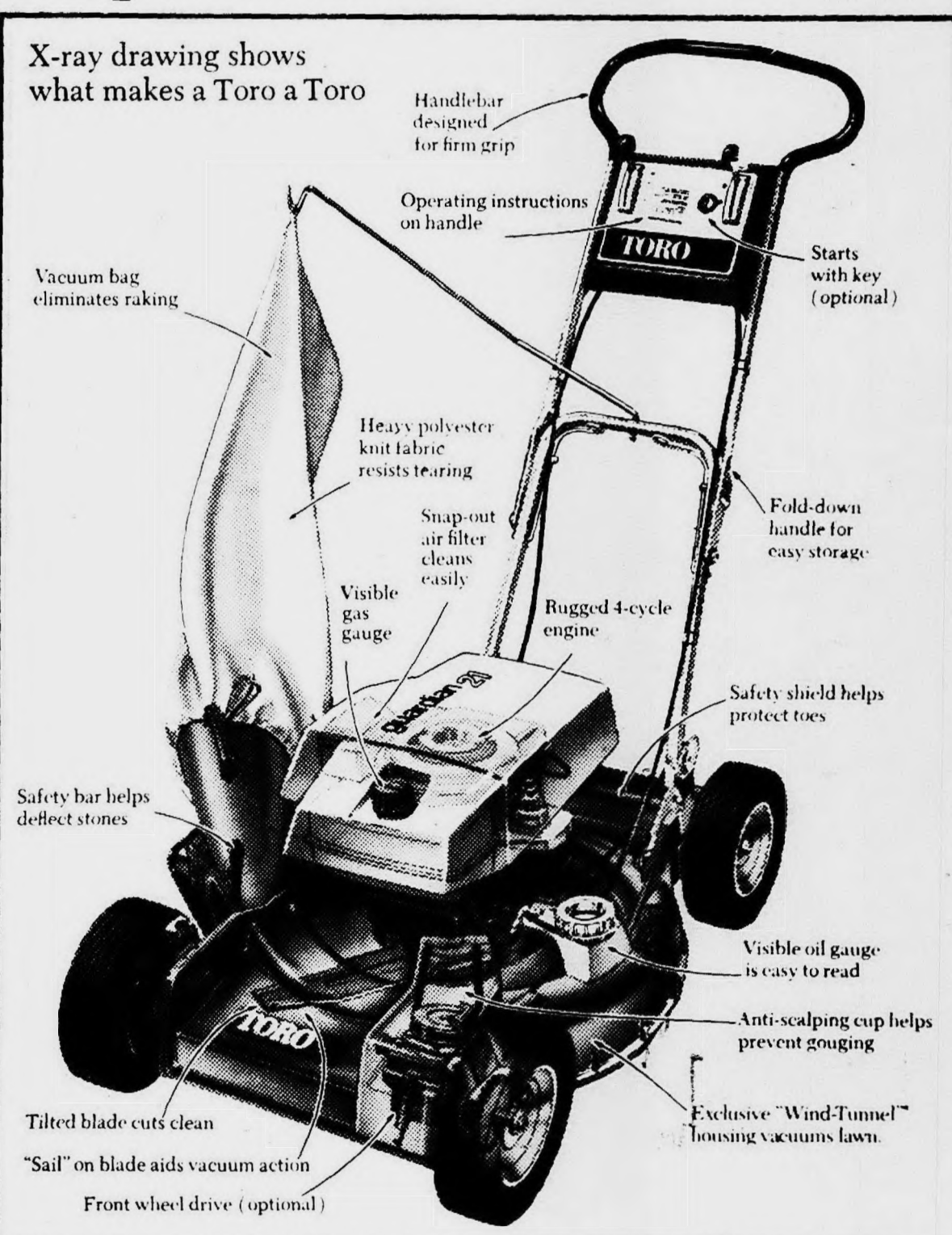
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Turf Tips, Quips

So you are one of those who thought he had viewed the best harness racing program ever presented in the Detroit area a week ago when five miles went in 2:00 and less.

Well you had better change your mind and get out to the big mile track again tonight (Saturday) where Racing Secretary Bill Connors saved the best for the last weekend. There isn't any question in the minds of anyone close to the racing picture that this is the finest card ever in Michigan.

Imagine if you can, a 10-race program with an average purse of \$7,850. You don't have to use your imagination this time. Connors has 10 races carded with total purses of \$78,500. That's the most ever offered for a single program in Michigan with nothing but overnight events scheduled.

One doesn't have to use his imagination to know this is the night when more stand-out horses clash than at any other single event at Wolverine.

Heading the program is Sir Dalrae, the brilliant Australian bred which astonished west coast followers of the pacers and trotters with his tremendous speed.

Sir Dalrae is considered the fastest pacer in competition today and had several miles in 1:58 and better during the winter, winning most of the top events at Hollywood Park and the later meet at Los Alamitos.

He doesn't lack for challengers with no less than six choosing to tangle with him in the \$12,500 invitational.

If the track record of 1:57.4 doesn't go this time, when fans will have to wait until Wolverine has its 1974 meeting for new names and faster horses.

For instance, the six rivals include: Jay Time, from the Gene Riegle barn who was clocked in 1:58.2 a week ago; Mighty Fire, who cracked the 2:00 barrier earlier; Windy Way, with a 1:57.4 mark at Hollywood during the winter; Hal Brunt, Springfield, and Blu Fireball.

To add a bit of zest to the final Saturday offering, Connors has arranged a \$12,500 invitational trot headed by the great Delmonica Hanover from the powerful Del Miller farm.

Delmonica, a top three-year-old filly trotter in 1972 with earnings of \$177,462, has a win and two thirds in four 1973 starts and a bankroll of \$13,444.

Going against her is Dick Buxton's Killbuck Mary, who won in 2:02.4 in her season debut at Wolverine and then came back a week later to beat a fast field in Chicago in 2:02.2.

Speed A Plenty, from the Chris Boring stable, showed plenty of speed in a 2:01.4 second place finish behind Spartan Hanover last Saturday. The Speedster trotter could be the one to make Delmonica scream "uncle".

Others in the field are: Gold Bubble, Yellow Knife and Aiken.

After those appetite whetting events, fans will see Creeder Linbo, Shiaway Lad, Skipper Gene Marx, J.R. Rocky, Prince Knox, Keystone Ponder and Bramble Hall in an \$8,500 preferred.

Shiaway Lester, the Michiganbred three-year-old which won the \$5,000 Michigan colt stake last week in a record making 2:00.3, fastest mile ever in the annual series, tops a field of seven in an \$8,000 preferred pace.

The starters are: Tricky Dale, Adios Rick, Huff N Puff, Count Kef, American Skipper and Run Blue Run.

There's a third preferred valued at \$7,500 with eight going postward. They are: Johnny G. Adco Tux, Track Master, Banner Ranger, Local Time, Tee Cee, Final Decision and Moonlight Express.

And those are just the features. The cheapest race carries a purse of \$4,200... the average purse is \$7,850 and the card almost defies description.

Creativity Flourishing

Creativity is swarming all over University Hills Christian Church in Farmington on Tuesdays and Thursdays when young artists and musicians get together.

They aren't always in tune, but the four and five-year-olds in Artstart think they are the greatest musicians around.

And when they get their tiny fingers into paints or around some clay, their genius really shines through.

Artstart is a pilot program started in Farmington by Nancy Bates and Fran Gunderson. It is designed to nurture creativity in each child.

The pre-school program is modeled after one which started in Pontiac and which has been acclaimed for fostering creativity in children.

Early elementary school sometimes "turns off" creativity in children by pat-

terned them into certain modes of behavior, such as coloring within the lines.

So the Artstart program gives children a chance to develop string, scraps of paper and material, paint and clay and setting their minds free to create their own projects.

Their imagination is also set free when they are confronted with a pile of odds and ends and can play make-believe in front of a large mirror and their peers.

Along the way, the children are learning coordination and good manners as well as to express themselves.

Sarah Heartburn, a hand puppet used by teacher Sally Sawyer, visits the children every day to relate a lesson in manners drawn from a personal experience.

"You know what, children," the puppet asks. "I had just a terrible time at the hospital yesterday when I met a very rude man..."

Before the story is over, the children have learned that it is polite to say "please" and "thank you."

Children work in small groups with one of the three teachers including Mrs. Sawyer, Alice Nichols and Mary Harkless.

"Our teachers are highly creative," Mrs. Gunderson said. "They have more ideas than they have had time to develop."

While one group of children is working on art projects with Mrs. Nichols, another is playing make-believe or putting on a puppet show and another is listening to stories or performing in their "rhythm" band.

"It's really exciting to see the things they come up with," Mrs. Bates said.

The program counters the effect that television has on children, Mrs. Sawyer said.

"I've worked with children for many years and have seen a progressive decline in creativity," she said. "I think it's due to television. We are in agreement here that unsupervised television is an imagination stealer."

Builder Advises Public To Comparison Shop For New Home, Condo

"The family that exercises the discipline of comparative shopping will find it the most effective device to use for a sound buy in a new house or condominium."

So speaks Ivan Frankel, president of the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan. Frankel, a builder in Detroit and its suburbs for the past 25 years, is a staunch and articulate spokesman for the building industry.

Frankel emphatically disputes claims that today's new homes are not built as well as in the past. "Homes today have better engineering, better insulation and are better designed," according to Frankel. "The esthetics inherent in fine architecture are becoming more apparent in the design of new homes."

"MECHANICAL IMPROVEMENTS are finding their way into new homes in terms of better heating, cooling, air cleaning, plumbing and improved equipment. Self-cleaning ovens and better appliances in general can be found in the most recently built homes.

"Perhaps most significant are the influences seen in community planning for environmental advantages. Zoning for density -- as seen in condominiums and cluster housing -- permits the retention of natural areas."

As an example, Frankel used a 100 acre community which in the past might normally be divided into 200 lots in a highly disciplined zoning area -- more, in an area with lesser restrictions. Now, in cluster plans, one part of the area -- 50 acres -- is used for home construction; the other 50 acres will be retained naturally for pleasure.

"It's the nature of American industry -- ingenuity, if you wish -- to explore methods for producing products that offer better living," the Association president said. "We constantly are looking for refinements, better planning and improved use of materials."

Contrary to some theories that tradespeople do not take pride in their work, Frankel said that the plumbers, electricians and construction people he has worked with over the years get a great deal of satisfaction from building "something they can see."

"Often I'll see them on a weekend or after hours bringing their wife or family out to see a house they have worked on or built," Frankel related. "They are constructive people."

ALTHOUGH THE REWARDS reaped by the successful builder are great, the risks run are as great or greater, according to Frankel. He pointed out in Great Britain the highest rate of bankruptcy occurs in

the building industry. "Builders work very close to the line. The markup on a house is considerably less than that on an automobile or in the retail business generally. The buyer is getting a product that is reasonably priced."

"Anyone who bought a house 10 years ago knows what a bargain he got in terms of today's market. The new home buyer today will realize that same bargain as the years go by."



IVAN FRANKEL, president of the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan, firmly believes that the new homes offered by builders today are improved products and good investments.

"Bill, Edna, whoever you are," Frankel advised, "you should have few qualms if you buy from a reputable builder." The Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan is the only professional association of home builders in the Observer area. Members of the Association must have --

- A record of sound financial position.
- A record of fulfilling their commitments.
- A license from the State of Michigan.
- Association homes are marked by the BILDOR SEAL.

Frankel believes that there is little a buyer can do to ascertain the quality of a house in specific terms. "The normal good judgment of an individual in 95 per cent of the cases can be relied upon to determine whether a house is a sound buy."

"The inherent judgment of every family unit is reflected in the purchases it makes," he continued. "The family embarking on the great American pastime of house hunting will usually refer to the newspapers for area locations. Then it wanders

Look into windows thoroughly when you build a house.

Since windows play a major role in its appearance, comfort, convenience, heating costs and maintenance, they should be chosen carefully for meeting qualitative and good design.

Window styles should suit the architecture of the house, and each window should be appropriate for the area in which it is used.

Over a kitchen sink, for example, casement windows are favored because their rotary openers are easy to operate at arm's length. Bay and bow windows add light, a generous view and lots of apparent space to a room; a row of awning windows high on a wall gives light plus privacy and wall space for furniture.

Complete window units, factory-made of ponderosa pine, are precision made, preservative treated and equipped with sturdy hardware and weatherstripping.

Wood, a natural insulating material, helps keep a house warm in winter and heating bills low. Insulating glass avoids annoying condensation, and eliminates the maintenance problems of storm sash.

Here are the basic stock wood window styles to choose from if you're building or remodeling a house:

Double-hung -- two sash, one above the other, that move up and down.

Casement -- sash hinged at the side to swing out. They are opened and closed by rotary operators.

Gliding -- sash that slide in tracks.

Awning -- sash hinged at the top to open out, providing a shield from the rain even when open. Sometimes used stacked, one above the other, sometimes below a fixed window.

Hopper -- similar to awning, but hopper sash are hinged at the bottom to open in. Often used in basements.

Fixed -- glazed sash that does not move. Used to provide light and a view where ventilation is supplied by other means.

These basic styles are used in bay, bow, box and picture windows. **Angle bay** -- a group of window units that angle out from the wall. Double-hung or casement units are usually used in a bay, sometimes combined with a fixed center sash.

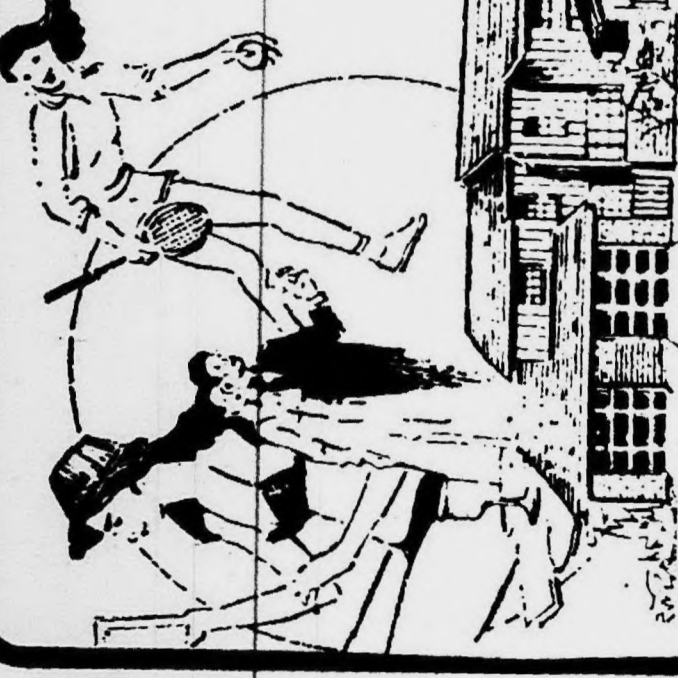
Bow -- similar to a bay, but curved instead of angled out from the wall. Casements or fixed units may be used, combined with a few awning sections for ventilation.

Box -- a flat unit set out from the wall in a box-like frame. May be fixed, double-hung or casement sash, or a combination.

Picture -- large window unit set flush with the wall. Usually consists of a center fixed sash flanked by either casement or double-hung windows.

Ponderosa pine windows are available in all the basic styles and in many stock sizes at building supply centers. Screens, removable grilles and insulating glass or storm panels are also available.

Removable grilles which give wood windows traditional styling, simplify painting and window-washing chores.



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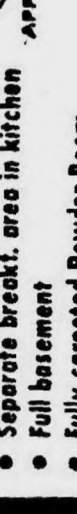
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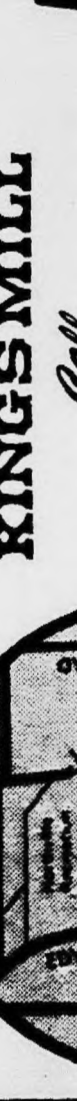
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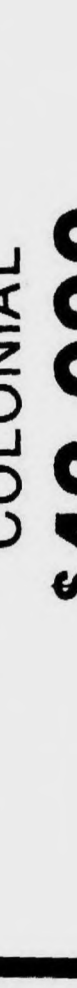
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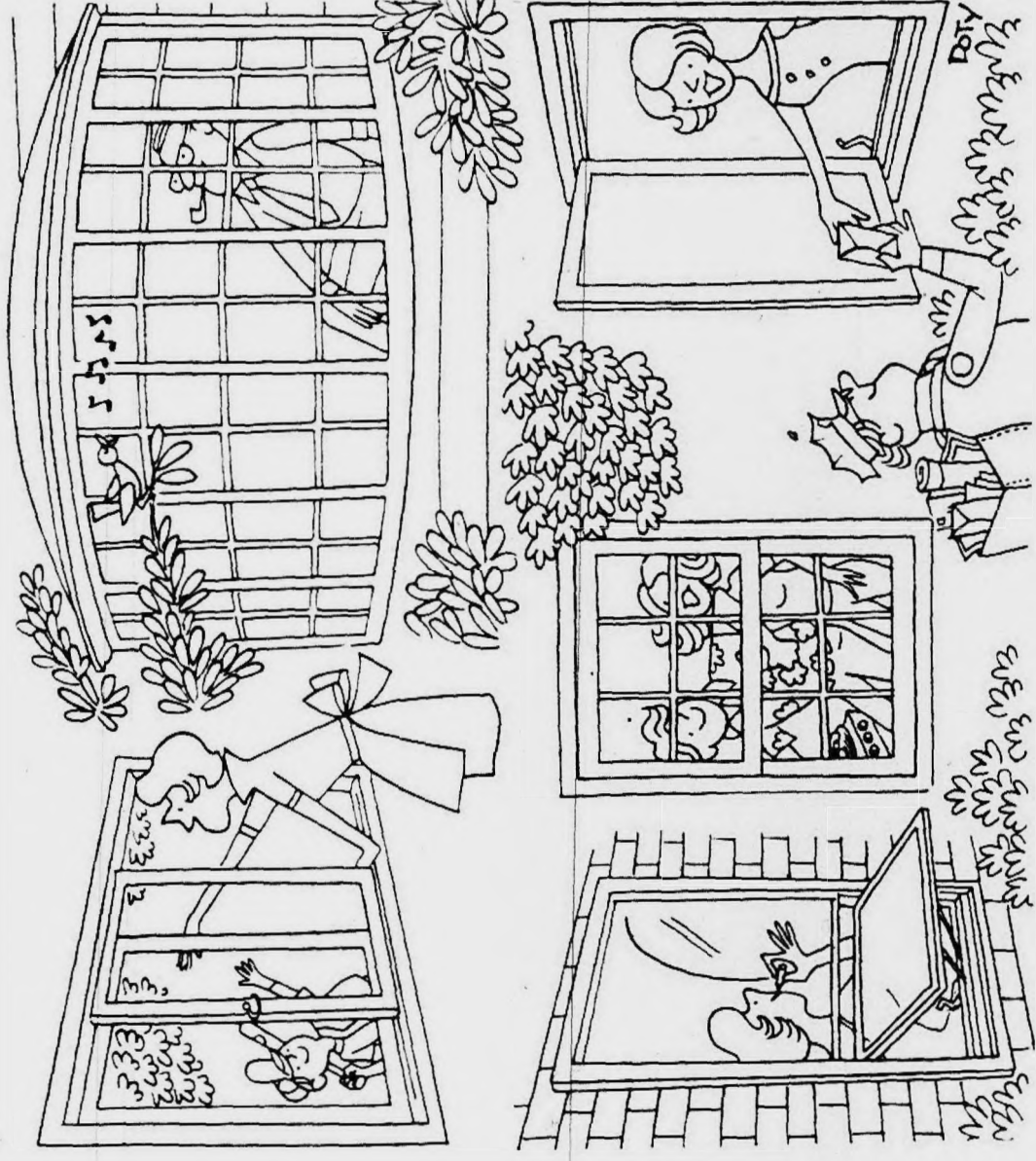

around that area looking for the home products available. "The house a family buys is a matter of its individual requirements -- its personal family objectives."

HE EMPHASIZES THAT municipalities have building departments with sound standards of inspection. If there is any question in a buyer's mind, he should check with that department.

"Fortunately, most buyers and builders are legitimate," Frankel believes. "If there are differences, they invariably find reasonable solutions. A builder loses his license if he commits fraud. And a builder is very zealous about his building license."

On the matter of "allowances," which a builder may give for flooring, wall materials, lighting and other house items, Frankel said they are "strictly a matter of contractual

agreement' and are generally a merchandising tool."

One builder may have a higher allowance for flooring than another. However, his lighting allowance may be less. "Allowances are a decision made by the merchandiser depending on his market, but based on the competitive standards of the industry," Frankel continued. "When all is said and done, the base prices will be compatible."

"Basically, builders are the servants of the people," he added. "They do not overbuild; that would be committing suicide. The successful builder is the builder who most nearly fulfills the market requirements."

"You can't make more of the builder than he is -- he is not God, he is not the zoning board. He's basically a good guy even if he doesn't wear a white hat."

TIPS FOR VIEWING NEW MODEL HOMES

Along with a record number of new home starts this year have come record numbers of crowds to inspect the newest models.

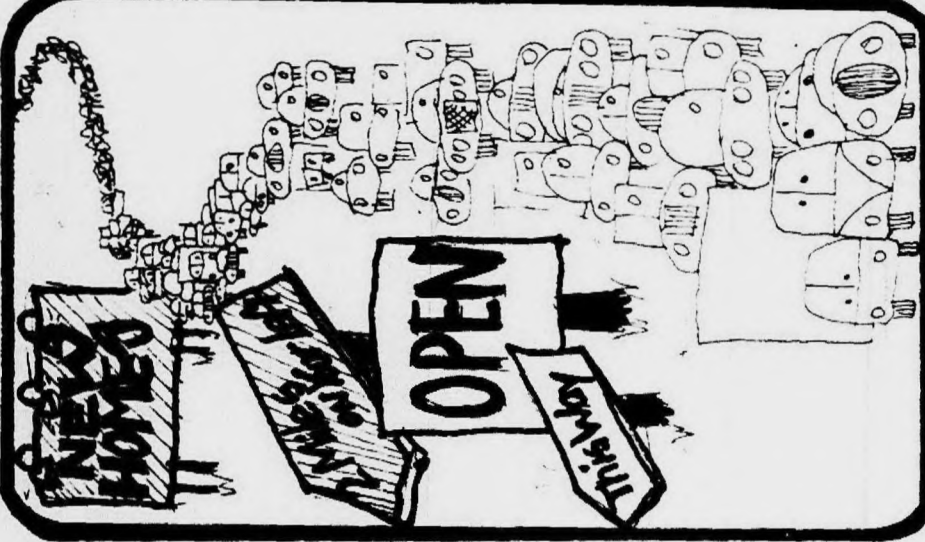
The heavy visitor traffic at model home sites can pose problems, which is why advance planning can make your home tours more rewarding.

This is the advice of the Hoffman Rosner Corporation, a large publicly-traded community developer currently building in the Chicago area and preparing plans for the New York and Philadelphia markets as well.

"Knowing what to do when you go through a model home can help you get the most out of the visit, and also contribute to the comfort and pleasure of those who follow you," states Morton E. Siffen, the company's sales vice president.

Here are the specific suggestions made to help you make your model home inspections pleasurable:

1. Try to schedule your visits to model homes before 2 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays, when the largest crowds show up.
2. Dress comfortably. Women are urged to wear low-heel shoes or flats to avoid fatigue.
3. Use the designated parking space provided by the builder. Avoid parking where you'll block drives, walks, and other cars. Parking in the right place is your assurance that your car won't be blocked when you're ready to leave.
4. Carry small toddlers or else hold them firmly by the hand.
5. You'll have an easier time, your shoes will stay clean, and so will the model homes if you stay on the walks and driveways.
6. Furniture and washroom facilities in the model homes are for show only. Most builders provide facilities for use in the sales office.
7. If you carry a note pad and pencil to jot down questions as you go through a model, you'll remember pertinent points to discuss later on with the salesman.
8. Close the outside doors firmly as you enter and leave the model home. This will keep the model warm in winter when the furnace is operating and cool in the summer when the air conditioning is on.
9. Carrying food such as popcorn, ice cream bars, and soft drinks through a model inevitably leads to mishaps, not only to the model but perhaps to your own clothes. If hunger or thirst suddenly strike, most builders will provide some sort of refreshment in the sales office.
10. During busy periods, salesmen may get tied up with customers and prospects. They'd like to get to you as soon as they can, so be patient. When your turn comes, the salesman will be happy to spend as much time with you as you require.



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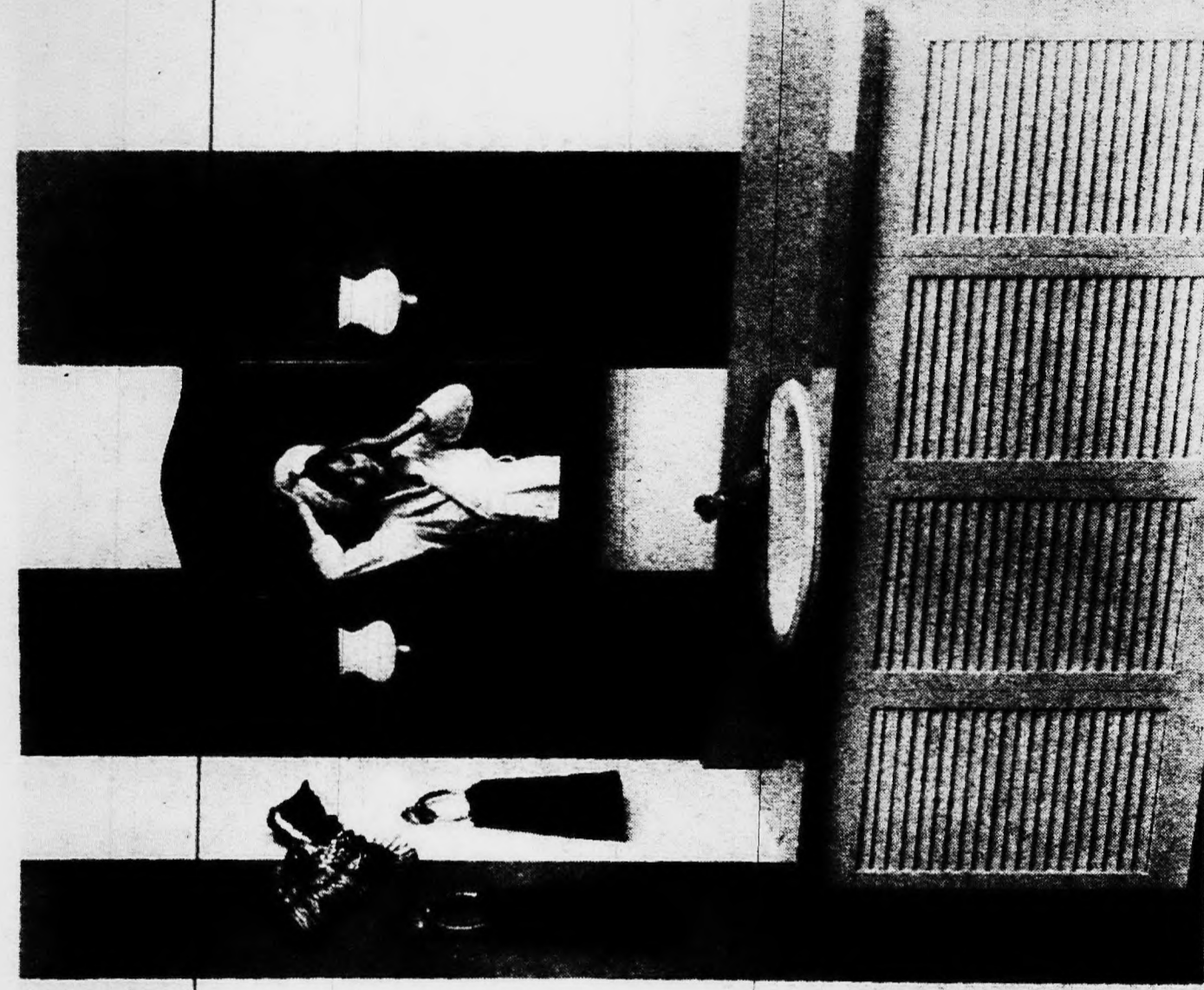
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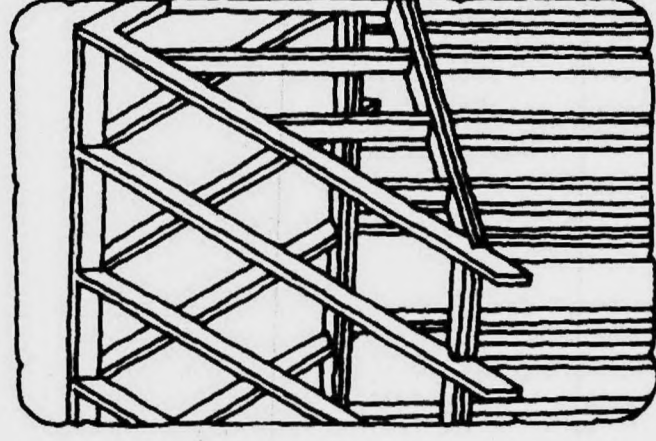
Check Framing and Sheathing

Much attention is given to the exterior and interior walls of the house, but framing and sheathing inside those walls make up the basic structure. Wood framing has been basic to home construction since colonial times. Many wood frame houses are still in perfect condition after a century or more.

Due to its strength and durability wood framing and sheathing are still the predominant choice of quality builders. The flexibility and resilience of this natural material has enabled wood houses to withstand the lashings of hurricanes.

As a natural insulator, wood is six times more effective than brick, 15 times more than concrete and at least 1,000 times more than aluminum.

A recent university-conducted fuel consumption test showed that in two identical houses, one built with wood used 26.2 per cent less fuel than one built of masonry.



Details

The slightly higher cost of wood roofing is usually outweighed by its appearance, durability and insulating value. Wood roofing is also well known for its resistance to hurricane force winds.

FLOORS

The choice is usually between hardwood, carpeting and tile. Remember that hardwood is a permanent floor. Therefore even if you want wall-to-wall carpeting, you might want to install it over hardwood. If you are installing tile or carpeting directly over the subfloor, be sure it is a subfloor material called underlayment, hardboard or particle-board. Panels should be made specifically for underlayment and so stamped, otherwise they may not give proper strength to the floor.

INTERIORS

As with exterior siding, roofing and floors, all materials should be selected on the basis of cost, appearance and performance. For windows, doors, ceilings, moldings, millwork and paneling -- wood is often used for its appearance. Housewives particularly appreciate new easy-care wood paneling, and wood window frames that prevent condensation from forming inside windows even in the coldest weather.

LAYOUT

Find a layout that works best for your family. Be sure the house has enough room -- as well as room to grow if necessary. Sleeping areas should be separated from family areas. Check storage space. Try to find a house that accommodates the interests and activities of all members of the family.

ELECTRICAL POWER

An important question in today's age of appliances is how much electrical power is available -- or how many amperes. Many older houses were wired for 60 amps. Check this with your builder.

Having some solid ideas about what you want and what to look for can help make your dream house some true. A recent American Wood Council survey of 800 homebuying families found that those who told their builder their material preferences most often got what they wanted.

When shopping for a house, it is important to think of it as a long-time purchase. Don't sacrifice quality for short-term savings. You could spend more in the long run.

EXTERIOR SIDING

Choice of exterior siding is largely a matter of personal preference -- wood, brick, stucco, metal. Buyers should select siding on the basis of appearance, maintenance and cost of the material.

Brick or stucco requires little maintenance. But many wood sidings available today blend low maintenance with natural beauty in a variety of styles -- shingles, shakes, clapboard, rough-sawn, random-width boards, panels, board and batten.

Today, many wood sidings can be installed without finishing to weather naturally. Or they can be stained to bring out the natural grain and texture. Others can be painted with acrylic or latex finishes that stay fresh for years.

ROOFING

There are two basic types of roof covering: asphalt and wood. Choose on the basis of cost, appearance and long-range performance. Cedar shingles or shakes are usually first choice on the basis of appearance.

A word that pops up more and more today in the newspapers and magazines and on television is "condominium."

What is a "condominium"? It is a form of property ownership which is of relatively recent origin in the United States. Basically, it is a system where a building is divided up into a number of apartments or units and these apartments or units are sold instead of rented or it is adjacent houses which are purchased singly but maintained on a group basis.

In other words, instead of signing a lease and paying rent to the landlord, you buy the apartment or cluster house just as if you were buying a single family house. You can even pay for it by means of a mortgage.

THE CONDOMINIUM is operated somewhat like a corporation. The owners form an association to run the affairs of the condominium. Each apartment has one vote. The association may appoint someone to manage the day-to-day affairs of the condominium.

The costs of maintenance, insurance and the like are divided among the owners in proportion to the size of their housing unit in relation to the size of the whole condominium. The association also has a set of by-laws

which govern the operation of the condominium. Each individual owner pays the taxes on his own housing unit only. They are not responsible for the taxes of any other owner. The taxes on the commonly-owned parts of the condominium are split among the owners on a proportionate basis.

Secondly, in many urban and resort areas, land is extremely expensive. In order to make buying such land practical and economical, it is necessary to erect large high-rise buildings. By then selling ownership interests in the apartments, the developer makes it practical for people to own property where they might not otherwise have been able to afford it.

CONDOMINIUMS ARE BECOMING more and more popular. There are several reasons for this. Most importantly, it is a way to allow people to own the property in which they live.

Thirdly, a person living in a condominium has the security of owning his own "home" without the responsibility of having to do the maintenance work to keep it up.

What Is A Condo?

- A condominium is a home.
- It is one of the patterns of single family ownership available. It's up to the individual family to decide whether it is a pattern which fits its particular needs.
- Specifically, condominiums tend to conserve land by concentrating density and leaving more open spaces.
- They are a communal solution to conserving land and sharing the cost of maintenance.

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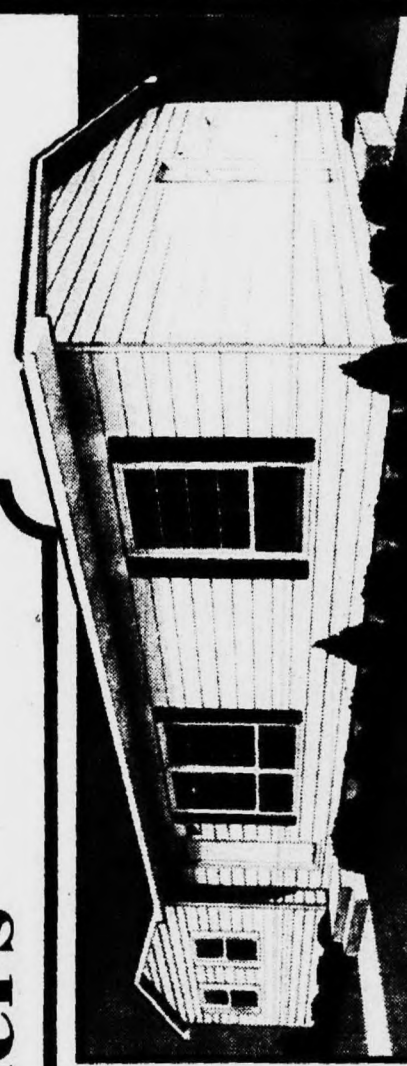

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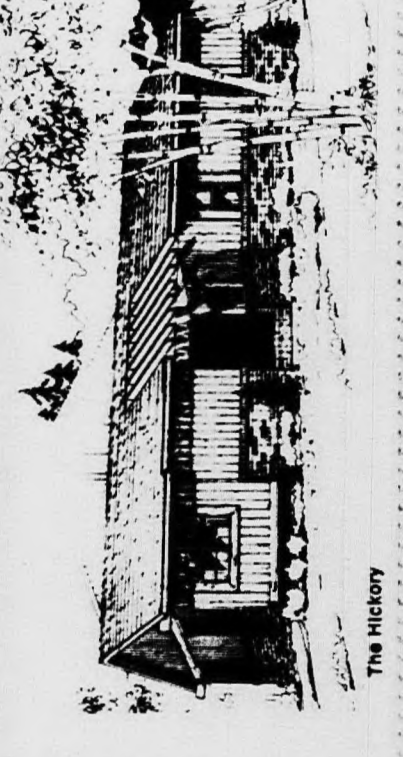
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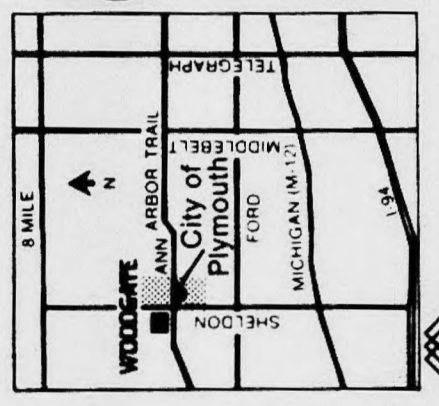

Here's Your Guide To Hardwood Floors

Now that the age of wall-to-wall has been replaced by the bare and the beautiful, it's time to take another look at what's going on underfoot. If you're planning to build a new home or to purchase new flooring for your old one, before making a final choice, consider the benefits of genuine hardwood floors for your house.

The new popularity of wood flooring is coupled with an increasing awareness of the importance of the floor in the decorative room schemes. Genuine hardwood floors, available in pecan, oak, maple, teak, beech, birch, or walnut, are easy to care for and offer extra value in your home at resale time.

Here's a brief guide to the different types of hardwood flooring manufactured today which are readily obtainable at lumber yards, through building supply dealers, flooring distributors and your contractor, builder, or architect:

Strip flooring -- Narrow pieces or "strips" of hardwood are installed on the floor next to each other, creating a striped effect.

Herringbone pattern -- This is created from strip flooring which is laid in a chevron pattern. It can be designed in one color stain or finished in an exciting two-tone combination of alternating darker and lighter brown shades or even in two contrasting colors.

Parquet flooring -- The well-known parquet floor is composed of wood blocks made up of short strips of wood, arranged to form a square. When installed, the parquet tiles are placed so that each tile's wood figure pattern runs in a different direction, some vertically, some horizontally. By staggering the wood grains, the floor gains visual appeal.

Plank flooring -- The plank floor lends an immediate helping of charm and rustic flavor. Planks, or wide strips of wood, can be obtained for installation with heavy nails of brass or iron or wood plugs. Some plank hardwood flooring has been weathered or treated to look like old, weathered wood.

Mosaic patterns -- Tiny squares of wood form an intricate pattern on floors. Their real appeal is for rooms with modern furniture, particularly with pieces made of walnut and teak.

Prefinished flooring -- To cut costs and ease installation, prefinished hardwood floors are available at lumber yards and building supply dealers. These wood blocks are pre-stained and many feature extra surface protection against stains, scuffs, and scratches.

Polyurethane -- This material is one of several designed to protect hardwood floors. Used as a finish, it provides a permanent sheen, eliminating the need for waxing.

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The "most practical" floors for single-family homes and apartments, in terms of yearly cost, long-term cost, wear life, maintenance time, and preference, are hardwood floors, and preference are hardwood floors, according to a study of flooring prepared by a U.S. Government agency.

The Forest Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, made a nine-city survey of flooring costs, and found that when initial and maintenance costs are pro-rated over wear life, hardwood floors have an annual "true cost" per 100 square feet (\$6.67), that is only about half that of composition tile (\$11.87), and considerably less than half that of wall-to-wall carpeting (\$16.09).

What these cost differentials mean to the home owner can be understood by projecting them to an entire room or home. The Forest Service study showed that over the life of a 25-year mortgage, a home owner who has hardwood flooring in a 15x20-foot living room would save \$484 in comparison with the cost of composition tile in that same room, and \$750 in comparison with carpeting.

If this \$484-\$750 saving is projected over an entire home, it is clear that hardwood flooring can save a homeowner a substantial amount of money.
