

# Unification Study Could Start With Consolidation Advisory

Should the Plymouth Township Board study the possibility of unifying with the City of Plymouth?

That, according to two township officials, is the real meaning of the consolidation advisory question which will be on the ballot of the Sept. 4 special election.

According to Supervisor J.D. McLaren and Treasurer Elizabeth Holmes, a "yes" vote on the consolidation advisory question would mean that the township officials then study the options of unification with the city.

Technically, there are two forms of unification. Consolidation is the formation of a new municipality from two or more existing governments. A new city charter is written.

Annexation is the attaching of all or part of one governmental unit (usually a township) to another (usually a city). The city's charter and officers are unchanged, and its boundaries are extended. The governmental unit that is annexed ceases to exist.

The township board used the term "consolidation" in its advisory question.

"We shied away from the word 'annexation,' "

" 'Annexation' isn't a popular word around here," Mrs. Holmes said.

What the township board was trying to determine by putting the question on the ballot, McLaren said, is "how the people in the township feel about a merger of some form with Plymouth."

"If the advisory question shows there is great feeling for some sort of different kind of government, then we'll look into it," Mrs. Holmes said.

In that case, McLaren added, "We're going to have to sit down as a group to determine what's best for the township and look strongly at some form of cooperation with the city.

"We have to look at what the election tells us."

In addition to the consolidation advisory question, there will be three other items on the Sept. 4 Plymouth Township election.

. The first will be a referendum on extending the Byron Creek sewer into the western portion of the

A petition drive on that issue forced the election. The second will be on whether the township should purchase the Hilltop Golf Course for \$390,000.

Township officials have said the purchase would not cost the taxpayers more money. The cost, they said, would be paid from federally shared revenue and other sources.

Also on the ballot will be an advisory question on whether township residents are satisfied with their present local law enforcement.



# C&O Freight House Finds Savior

The Chesapeake and Ohio freight house in Old Village will become the office of a Southfield architect after it has been moved across the tracks and across Starkweather St. to a new site.

The way for the move was cleared this week when the city fathers agreed to sell the land necessary for the move to Robert W. Stine. The new site is immediately north and east of the C&O tracks. The building will only have to be moved a few hundred feet. The Plymouth City Commission voted 6-0 to sell the land to Stine for \$11,500.

The sale of the land came Monday; Tuesday, the city's building appeals board gave tentative approval to Stine to move the structure, which Stine intends to preserve as close to the original as pos-

Stine expects to move the building, whose construction date is lost in history, sometime in the next few weeks. The building was erected before 1900 according to carvings inside the sturdy structure.

All of this is part of a series of events that began several months ago. The freight house was used as a temporary arts center when the Michigan Artrain visited Plymouth in April and May last year.

At that point the local Arts Council had urged that the freight house be saved from the planned razing by the C&O. The fate of the freight

house was further complicated by the Golden Spike



### Library **Funding Boosted**

The provision was overwhelmingly supported by William Faust (D-Westland), Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), Daniel Cooper (D-Oak Park) and David **Plawecki** (D-Dearborn Heights) as well as Reps. John Markes (D-Westland), John Bennett (D-Redford Township), Raymond Baker (R-Farmington), Thomas Brown (D-Westland), William Keith (D-Garden City), Robert Geake (R-Northville), Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park).

The increased appropriations was influenced by a bill sponsored by Markes to give libraries a larger income and guarantee that it will be continued at a higher level.

"The existence of my bill got more money for libraries this year," Markes said.

The increased appropriation was included in the Dept. of Education bill, and Markes was assured by Senate leaders that his bill will be reported out of the appropriations committee in the fall, he said. Markes' bill will guarantee that the increase in library support will be continuous.

"The whole goal in increasing money to libraries is to open the doors to libraries and let people make use of improved services," Markes

"It covers libraries all over the state," he added. "Some of them are in dire need.

Libraries will receive \$2.2 million more from the state than last year, under the provision for a total allocation of \$4.3 million.

The bill also provides that library systems will get an increase of five cents per capita over what they received last year, Markes said. It would mean that most will receive 25 cents per capita.

### New Post Time Draws Only 9,672 For Opener

Although the expected rains never came, the thoroughbreds returned to the **Detroit Race Course Monday** with attendance and wagering a bit disappointing to track management.

The opening program of the 90-day season was to be a test of the new post time, an hour earlier start than the traditional twilight "off time" that has marked the runners in the Detroit area since the start of parimutuel wagering back in the '30s.

For years the Motor City has been the only spot in North America with a 3:30 p.m. post. Originally it was set to give the automotive plant workers a chance to take in the races after finishing the afternoon shift.

It was continued during World War II to give workers a chance for recreation and relaxation. Why it wasn't dropped after the war one will never know but the fact is that attendance and wagering in the Detroit area hasn't progressed as it did in

The house fly is more than a perennial nuisance. It is a transmitter of such diseases as typhoid, cholera, diarrhea, and dysentery.

A female can lay more than 500 eggs in a single season, making their control even more important.

> The occasional wasp or hornet that may find its way indoors can usually be let out of the house without danger. according to entomologists. They also note that these insects do not sting unless they are disturbed and that out-of-the-way nest need not pose a problem.

However, sometimes they will decide to set up housekeeping in a yard area where direct and frequent contact is inevitable.

In such situations it's better to use a residual contact insecticide which can be taken to keep the flies out. sprayed safely from as far as

Here's Cure For Your Ailing Lawn

EAST LANSING

Small purple spots, rings of dead grass and lawn areas speckled with white powder indicate lawn disease, says Joseph Vargas, turfgrass pathologist at Michigan State University.

Tiny purple spots on grass leaves are the first symptom of Helminthosporium leaf spot, a fungus disease that attacks Kentucky bluegrass during cool, moist weather. Grass will thin out in late May or early June when the disease reaches the crown and root system. The disease also attacks red fescue during the warm weather in July and August.

"Circles of dead grass with healthy appearing green grass in the center are a good indication of fusarium blight infection," says Vargas.

This fungus disease often attacks Kentucky bluegrass lawns. Symptoms usually appear during dry

Lawn areas that appear covered with flour or some other white, powdery substance are suffering from powdery mildew. It usually occurs in damp, shaded Kentucky bluegrass lawns. "Merion bluegrass is especially susceptible," says Vargas.

Disease control is essential. Helminthosporium leaf spot can be chemically controlled with Actidione-Thiram, Fore, Daconil 2787 or Dyrene.

"Good management practices also help," Vargas

Mowing at a height of two to three inches and removing the clippings will help check the disease. In the Kentucky bluegrasses, resistant varieties (Merion, Fylking, Pennstar and Nugget) help avoid leaf

For fusarium blight, Vargas recommends Benomyl (Tersan 1991). "Two applications give effective control in most situations," he says. Application should be initiated at 2-week intervals at the first sign of the disease.

Use eight ounces of Benomyl with enough water to cover about 1,000 square feet of lawn. Then drench it into the root zone before it has a chance to dry on the foliage.

Most cucumbers take 60 days or so to bear, so you can still plant a few more seeds for a later crop.

Along our highways we see a lot of bad signs-- leaves turning brown on our trees, and dying. A common disease is leaf scorch (or sun scorch) and you see it on maples as well as other ornamentals.

Symptoms include leaf tips, margins and areas between the veins turn brown. Branches may die back. On conifers, the needles are short, yellow tipped.

Control: Water the trees as much as possible. Quite often you see an entire branch wilted and scorched. This is probably verticillium and the best thing is to cut the branch out flush.

Salt injury along highways cause leaves to be stunted, scorched at margins, tips also scorched. Such trees color up early in autumn, defoliate and may die back.

Control: drench salt-splashed areas liberally with clean water to wash out salt. Feed to stimulate growth.

# What's Wrong With School Board Cutbacks Including Band, Sports?

At least two school boards. among the eight in the seven communities covered by the Observer newspapers, are in trouble not of their own doing but because of the failure of voters to approve additional financial aid when needed most.

Trustees at Plymouth and South Redford are receiving plenty of heat these days after announcing that the two school systems face drastic cuts during the coming school year because there aren't enough dollars to stretch out and continue all services of a normal

Especially is this true in Plymouth where the board ran into a real hassle a few nights back when it voted for program reductions that include elimination of all extracurricular activi-

Word from South Redford is the board there is facing a similar cutback, one that will cut out all varsity sports along with numerous other extracurricular pro-

grams. The Plymouth board didn't beat around the bush in announcing its program reductions. It was known some two weeks before the special meeting that such items as all athletics, music, debating, school newspaper and yearbook and similar programs would go.

Then with the public aware of the plans, the board called a special meeting at a school where there would be plenty of seating capacity to give the public a chance to express its views.

The meeting attracted some 250 irate parents and about 50 worried high schoolers, worried because they finally got the message that the band, football, basketball, baseball, all other sports, cheerleaders, glee clubs and orchestras to mention a few, were

going to be dropped. Let us point out that 250 voters represent less than one per cent of the total registered in the school district. That doesn't appear to represent the feeling of the community in any way. We might say it represents a group with special interests such as children in the band or a member

of one of the varsity teams. With 99 per cent of the elec-

torate showing no interest, it is surprising the board gave so much attention to the group. But it considered this as the only fair way to give all a chance to present views.

'Tis sad to relate that some members of the board and a few in the audience became so infuriated they couldn't contain tempers and it appeared there would be fisticuffs on a couple of

Nothing is to be gained by such tactics, and fortunately cooler heads prevailed. In all such instances it is wise to be cool, calm and collected and to listen to all give their thoughts on the subject

The end product of the Plymouth meeting was that the board, which earlier had set a date for an election on a second request for additional millage. asked the audience to get petitions back to the trustees in less than a month showing 10 per cent of the voters were interested in another poll. If the petitions were not returned, then the election would be dropped and all cuts in programs would become effective with the start of classes in Sep-

One must realize that the voters rejected a request for 1.5 additional mills in June when the board warned folks serious cuts would be made unless it passed. It did not attempt to threaten or blackjack voters on the matter, just a warning that it couldn't continue programs status quo unless more finances were avail-

Barely 10 per cent turned out for the vote, and the issue went down by a one-sided margin.

All of which leads one to wonder what would happen if another vote is taken in late August. It appears as if those who opposed additional millage got to the polls in June. They'll be there again in August and will probably have more of their supporters with

On the other hand, those complaining now about the cuts didn't have the convictions of their thoughts and stayed away from the voting machines in record

And that brings up the question if there is much interest in the extracurricular activities by others than parents and relatives of the voungsters participating.

Although we have been a booster of high school sports for more than 50 years, we are not convinced that the programs are that much important today as in the 1930s, 1940s and 1950s.

More than once we have attended high school football games recently when there were no more than 700 persons in the stands, this from high schools that have average enrollments of around 2,000. We would judge that there are more parents in the stands than students.

Thus, there is an indication that the students themselves aren't that much concerned these days. Most have cars at their disposal and many are too busy with other things to bother about attending high school contests.

Interest in varsity competition has dropped to an extremely low level in recent years. It wasn't too long ago that Livonia Stevenson High only had 29 out for the football team with no juniors on the list. Redford Union ran into a similar situation not so long ago when less than 30 reported for football.

In the year North Farmington won the state football championship, Coach Ron Holland had one of the smallest squads in the school history. True enough, the team was loaded with starters from the year before and there was slight chance of any newcomers making the varsity, but it didn't do anything to aid the situation a year later.

We have attended football contests where there were less than 100 seated in the visiting stands. Does that show interest? We can't


The story in basketball is much the same. If a school has a winner, then it is supported by the student body and fans. If not, one has to look around to find someone to talk to.

A great deal of the grumbling over the proposed cuts is coming from parents of bandsmen who point out the virtues of that organization. Once again, it can be pointed out that 200 parents of 100 bandsmen don't necessarily represent the feelings of the commu-

Certainly they are interested in watching their youngsters perform, and the musicians do an excellent job. But what of those who no longer have children in the schools, who never did have a child interested in sports, band or anything else? They could care less whether such programs are

What of the senior citizens with the stationary incomes who have trouble making ends meet now? With food costs climbing at an astronomical rate, how does one think they can add another \$35 to \$40 to their costs of existing with no additional income?

These are just a few of the questions for all to consider in a cool, calm. collected manner. All should remember the voters spoke in June, and there isn't any good reason why that shouldn't be

### Storm Damage Dangerous

At least once every summer a powerful storm rips through Observerland, doing extensive damage to trees, cars, and buildings.

And, the falling trees often pull power lines down with them, providing the storm with its most lethal punch - exposed, fully charged wires capable of killing in an instant.

"Quite frankly, I wish people would stay inside their houses after one of these electrical storms," George Schoenneman, City of Plymouth fire chief, said after the most recent storm.

"Every wire is alive - that's

the way they should look at it. The wires can look innocent because they are no longer arching or giving off sparks. But it can still be just as deadly. The only safe wire is one where you can easily see both ends."

Schoenneman said homeowners are often too eager to clean up damage and could end up being electrocuted.

Backyard fences hooked up in their normal pattern where neighbors share common fence can be particularly dangerous.

For example, last year in Red-ford Township a storm swept

through the north end, leaving numerous downed wires. Some wires were on metal fences which then became fully charged - and

In Southfield this month after the heavy storm we observed children standing barefoot in wet grass near an arching power line.

"Wet grass and water on a sidewalk or pavement can carry electricity very easily," Schoenneman

In Livonia during the same recent storm we noticed downed power lines and no police or firemen on hand. That presents a new danger - undetected or unguarded power lines.

Sometimes time and manpower are short and not all danger spots are covered.

Aluminum siding is dangerous. A car with wires on it is charged even though the occupant may be safe.

All of which points to the need for extra care during those hours immediately following a storm.

The lesson from what we've seen covering storms over the past summers, and what the firemen and police officers tell us is simple: take every precaution during a storm and during the hours immediately afterwards.

There is no joy for us when we have to report how a storm has brought tragedy in addition to the damage.








# Oakland Leads The Horse Explosion

### Affluence, Suburban Growth Make It Family Fun



By MARTHA MAHAN

Michigan's horse population is expected to more than double by 1985 as more and more families buy horses for pleasure riding and for showing. And Oakland County is leading the

Oakland now counts more than 12,800 mounts, and the number is "growing fantastically," according to Bill Muller of the Cooperative Extension Service.

Muller credits affluence with sparking and maintaining the trend, as families move out of cities to five and 10 acres suburban plots.

More leisure time and an emphasis on family togetherness also are seen as encouraging the interest in horsemanship.

"There's an appreciation of beauty, too," Muller said.
"The horse is a noble animal. Folks look at their nice home in the country and decide that a fence and paddock really will set it off."

Country living also brings riders close to where feed is produced, Muller pointed out, and southern Oakland County is a surplus feed area.

"Horse associations haven't been idle, either." he said. "They've been out promoting their own breeds and competing at horse shows."

A recent five-meeting in-depth seminar sponsored horse enthusiasts, Muller had been attempted before gear and upkeep run high. said.



Katz said. "Once you do know it, you can suggest playing with someone closer to his own age."

He added that among disturbed young people there are such differences in behavior patterns that "there is no way short of a complete psychiatric examination to know for sure if there is dan-

He did have a suggestion for a way society can help.

"It would be good," he stated, "if there were better mental health facilities, with psychiatric personnel in the schools where kids have more contacts.

'Unfortunately, the tendancy now is to cut back on such personnel."

Dr. Claunch agreed there is practically no means of preventing all such incidents, but he suggested that "uncomfortable" feelings on the part of an adult with reference to a child should not be discounted.

"Whenever adults want to know what's going on with children, they sometimes overlook two important sources of information that are right at hand," he said.

"One of these is the child's observable behavior, which is a definite communication about what's going on inside the child.

"When a child persists over an extended time in angry, depressed, frightened, guilty or deceptive behavior, he is communicating a problem that he's not solving and not growing beyond.

"A second source of information is the adult's own feelings and responses to the


The national goal for this special Red Cross campaign is \$6.5 million.
